WARHAWK QUICK HITS

- ULM is in its 61st season of basketball. The Warhawks have won 10 regular season conference championships, eight conference tournament championships and have made seven NCAA Tournament appearances.
- The Warhawks have led or been tied in the second half with three teams from power six conferences this season, including against a pair of ranked opponents (Texas A&M and Mississippi State).
- ULM used a 19-3 run to rally back from a 19-point deficit in the second half. The Warhawks closed to within 52-49 with just over seven minutes left, but that was as close they would get.
- Sophomore guard Marcelis Hansberry led the Warhawks with 18 points, while senior center Fabio Ribeiro chipped in 13 points -- both off the bench. The ULM bench outscored Arkansas State's 46-23.
- ULM's two leading scorers -- Fred Brown and Charles Winborne -- combined for just five against the Red Wolves and went a combined 1 of 10 from the field. Brown leads the team with 12.0 points a game while Winborne ranks second with 11.0 points per game.
- The Warhawks and Trojans are meeting for the second time this season as UALR won the first meeting 72-51 in Monroe back on Jan. 12. UALR has won three straight in the series.
- The Warhawks ranks fourth in the Sun Belt with an average of 6.2 3-pointers per game.

ULM is back in action Saturday at UALR. The game is set to tip off at 7 p.m. inside the Jack Stephens Center. The game can also be heard on 105.3 FM in Monroe or online at ulmwarhawks. com, with Nick White calling the action. Live stats are available by visiting ulmwarhawks.com.

UPDATING THE WARHAWKS

- ULM rallied back from a 19-point deficit in the second half, but it was not enough as Arkansas State held on for a 72-64 win on Thursday. The Warhawks used a 19-3 run to cut the Red Wolves lead to 52-49 with 7:16 remaining, but that is as close as they would get.
- ULM shot 41.7 percent from the field in the second half and took 14 more shots than Arkansas State in the half. The Warhawks also held a 13-7 advantage in offensive rebounds in the name.
- The Warhawks made just 16 of 25 attempts from the freethrow line, including six crucial misses down the stretch.
- Head coach Keith Richard handed the game over to his underclassmen in the final 12 minutes and the group -- which consisted of sophomores Marcelis Hansberry, R.J. McCray and Steven McClellan and freshmen Trent Mackey and Trey Lindsey -- responded by outscoring the Red Wolves by 11 during that span. ULM finished with a dominating 46-23 advantage in bench points.
- Hansberry led the Warhawks with 15 points on 5-of-9 shooting in just 14 minutes of action against Arkansas State. The 15 points were a season high and tied a career high for Hansberry.
- Senior Fabio Ribeiro came off the bench to score a season-high 13 points to go with six rebounds. It marked Ribeiro's second double-figure scoring game of the season and just the third of his career (he had 15 last season at UL-Lafayette).
- ULM's two leading scorers -- senior Fred Brown and sophomore Charles Winborne -- combined for just five points while going a combined 1 of 10 from the field. Brown leads the Warhawks in scoring with 12.0 points per game while Winborne ranks second on the team with 11.0 points per outing.
- ULM has a pair of players in the top 10 in the Sun Belt in 3-point percentage as Mackey ranks fourth in the conference (.444) and Winborne ranks sixth (.426).
- Brown ranks second in the Sun Belt in free-throw percentage, shooting 86.4 percent on the season. Brown is 21 of 24 from the free-throw line during conference play.
- The Warhawks rank 10th in the Sun Belt in field-goal percentage (.402), fourth in 3-point percentage (.353) and seventh in free-throw percentage (.665). ULM also ranks fourth in the conference with 6.2 3-pointers made per game.

- The Warhawks' 76-71 overtime loss to Western Kentucky (Dec. 29) was their first overtime game since Dec. 31, 2008 at UALR.
- ULM is 1-5 this season in games decided by five points or less, including 1-2 in Sun Belt play.
- ULM shot a season-best 62 percent from the field against Nicholls State (Nov. 28). It was the Warhawks' highest shooting percentage in a game since December of 2009.
- ULM has hung tough with some of the best teams in the country this season. The Warhawks led then No. 25 Mississippi State by two points with 14:13 remaining (Nov. 21) and most recently were tied 43-all at No. 22 Texas A&M with 13:20 to play (Dec. 10). In addition, ULM also had a second-half lead at Tennessee on Nov. 16.
- The Warhawks made at least 10 3-pointers in back-to-back games earlier this season. ULM had 11 3s against Harding (Nov. 26) and followed it up with 12 3s against Nicholls State (Nov. 28).
- The Warhawks are playing the 2011-12 season with just nine active scholarship players and are banned from participating in postseason play due to NCAA APR sanctions.

PREVIEWING THE TROJANS

- UALR defeated Denver 64-57 in its last outing on Jan. 28. The Trojans lead the Sun Belt's Western Division with a 7-2 conference record. UALR's two conference losses came at home to UL-Lafayette (68-49) and at Western Kentucky (65-53).
- D'Andre Williams leads the Trojans with 11.6 points per game. Williams also ranks fourth in the Sun Belt with 4.1 assists per game. Will Neighbour contributes 10.4 points and Chuck Guy adds 10.1 points for UALR.
- Steve Shields is in his ninth season as the coach at UALR and has compiled a record of 142-125. Shields guided the Trojans to Sun Belt Tournament championship last season and a trip to the NCAA Tournament the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1990. Shields was the Sun Belt's Coach of the Year in 2004.

SERIES HISTORY

• UALR owns an 11-8 advantage in the all-time series with ULM, including three straight wins in the series. The Trojans defeated the Warhawks 72-51 in Monroe back on Jan. 12. ULM has a 4-6 record against UALR in games played in Little Rock.

THE LAST TIME THE TWO TEAMS MET...

- UALR held ULM to just 18 points in the second half to pull away for a 72-51 victory on Jan. 12 inside Fant-Ewing Coliseum. The Trojans shot 50.0 percent from the field while holding the Warhawks to just 36.2 percent, including 24.1 percent in the second half. ULM trailed by just five points at the break.
- Courtney Jackson had 20 points to lead the Trojans, while D'Andre Williams and Chuck Guy each tallied 10 points. Four Warhawks reached double figures in scoring, paced by 15 points and seven rebounds from sophomore Steven McClellan. Senior Fred Brown registered 11 points, and Charles Winborne and Christian Bibi Ndongo chipped in 10 points each.

UP NFXT

The Warhawks have a week off before hosting South Alabama Feb. 11 at 2 p.m. The game will highlight the 30th anniversary reunion of the 1981-82 Warhawks, the first in school history to reach the NCAA Tournament. Most of the former players, coaches and staff members off that team will be back on campus, including ULM head coach Keith Richard, who was a senior point guard on the team, and the team's leading scorer, Donald Wilson.

BROWN REACHES 1,000 POINTS

Senior guard Fred Brown topped the 1,000-point milestone for his career with 16 points against FIU (Feb. 7). Brown, who scored 380 points in two seasons with Kansas State, has been the leading scorer for ULM the past two years. He has notched double figures in scoring 49 times in his career, including 14 times this season.

ULM CLOSING IN ON 900 WINS

In its 61st season of men's basketball, ULM is just five wins shy of reaching 900 in its history. The men's basketball program has been one of the finest at ULM over the years as the Warhawks have captured 10 regular season conference titles, eight conference tournament championships and have appeared in the NCAA Tournament seven times and the NIT twice.

MCCLELLAN MAKES SEASON DEBUT

Sophomore Steven McClellan saw his first action of the season Dec. 3 against Louisiana Tech. McClellan came off the bench with six points, seven rebounds and a blocked shot in 21 minutes of action. The 6-foot-7 center was slated to redshirt this season, but adds much needed height to the ULM frontcourt.

WARHAWK INK TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

ULM men's basketball head coach Keith Richard announced Thursday the signing of high school seniors Kyle Koszuta and Taylor Birchett to national letters of intent. Koszuta and Birchett are the first two players to sign with the Warhawks for the 2012-13 season.

"We are excited about Kyle and Taylor joining our team next season," Richard said. "They're great kids that come from great families and will help us move this program forward."

Koszuta, a 6-1 point guard, attends Niceville High School in Niceville, Fla. Koszuta averaged 16.1 points and 1.5 assists as a junior, helping the Eagles to a 15-9 record. He scored a season-best 31 points on 12-of-23 shooting against Bainbridge (Ga.) last season.

Birchett, a 6-4 shooting guard, attends Roswell High School in Roswell, Ga. He led his team in scoring with 16.5 points as a junior and helped Roswell to its first Georgia 'Sweet 16' appearance in 14 years. He shot 43.2 percent from the field (118-of-273) and 40.3 percent from 3-point range (54-of-134) as a junior and was named to the 6-5A all-region team and the All-North Fulton Prep Rally first team.

EKE TO REDSHIRT IN 2011-12

ULM men's basketball head coach Keith Richard announced Tuesday that sophomore life Eke will redshirt during the 2011-12 season and will have three years of eligibility remaining starting next season. The Warhawks will play the season with nine scholarship players.

Eke suffered a season-ending injury by tearing his anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in practice last week and is expected to have surgery in the near future.

FAMILIAR FOES

ULM will renew in-state rivalries against former Southland Conference foes Northwestern State, Southeastern Louisiana and Nicholls State in 2011-12. The Warhawks will also face Louisiana Tech for the fourth consecutive season.



the Warhawks will meet Southeastern Louisiana for the 91st time and Nicholls State for the 71st time in school history.

BROWN TABBED PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT

Senior guard Fred Brown has picked up plenty of preseason accolades as he was named to virtually everyone's preseason All-Sun Belt team. Brown was chosen to All-Sun Belt Third Team by the conference coaches and College Sports Madness. Brown was also picked as one of the top five players in the Sun Belt by Jon Teitel of collegehoops.net.

BROWN, MINGO NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

Head Coach Keith Richard named seniors Fred Brown and Hugh Mingo team captains for the 2011-12 season. Brown and Mingo are the two leading returning scorers from last season. They combined to make 58 starts and averaged over 32 minutes per game a year ago.

WARHAWKS PICKED SIXTH IN SUN BELT WEST DIVISION

ULM was picked to finish sixth in the West Division of the Sun Belt by its conference coaches. Arkansas State received 64 points and was picked to win the West, followed by UL-Lafayette (60), North Texas (50), Denver (40), UALR (26) and ULM (12).

Florida Atlantic got all but one first-place vote to earn the top spot in the East Division. The Owls were followed by Middle Tennessee (59), Western Kentucky (41), South Alabama (33), FIU (31) and Troy (17).

FANT-EWING COURT GETS NEW LOOK

The court inside Fant-Ewing Coliseum will have a new look to it when the ULM men's and women's basketball teams begin play in November.

The court has been redesigned and repainted with a fresh look, which includes the primary ULM logo at center court and "Warhawks" on each baseline. It is the first major renovation to the court since the fall of 2006.

The redesign also accommodates the new women's 3-point line, which moves back a foot to 20 feet, 9 inches (the same as the men) and the addition of the charge circle underneath each basket.

Fant-Ewing Coliseum has received several upgrades since 2009, including a new scoreboard and new scorer's tables

HEAD COACH KEITH RICHARD

Keith Richard returned to his alma mater to become ULM's seventh men's basketball head coach on April 22, 2010. Now in his second season, Richard seeks to restore the rich tradition of the ULM men's basketball program — something he knows very well.

Richard became the second ULM men's basketball coach – joining Mike Vining – to have also been a studentathlete and an assistant coach for the program. He was with the Warhawks in both capacities for six of the program's seven NCAA Tournament appearances in the 80s and 90s.

The Warhawks finished 7-24 in Richard's first season that was plagued by scholarship limits and youth. Despite the record, the Warhawks were competitive, losing seven games by six points or less. The season highlight came in an 82-75 victory at North Texas in the final week of the regular season. The Warhawks also took down Big Sky Tournament champion Northern Colorado 78-75 in Fant-Ewing Coliseum on Dec. 22.

As a student-athlete, Richard bridged the transition from Lenny Fant to Benny Hollis to Vining. He played on Fant's final team, played two seasons for Hollis and then completed his playing career on Vining's first team. ULM won three Trans-America Athletic Conference championships during his four years and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1982, the school's first-ever appearance, and the NIT in 1979. He twice led the team in assists and was team captain in 1980-81 and 1981-82.

Following his playing career, Richard spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at ULM (1984-86), assisting as his alma mater won the Southland Conference regular season and tournament titles in 1985, earning a trip to the

Richard moved on to Marshall University for three years from 1986-89, helping the Thundering Herd win two Southern Conference cournament title. Marshall participated in the 1987 NCAA Tournament and the 1988 NIT while Richard was on staff.

He returned to ULM for the 1989-90 season, spending five seasons as an assistant coach. In those five years, ULM won four Southland Conference regular season championships, four Southland Conference tournaments and made four appearances in the NCAA Tournament (1990, 1991, 1993, 1994). He departed in 1994 to join the staff at Louisiana Tech.

In his first season at Louisiana Tech, Richard helped the Bulldogs to the second biggest turnaround in the nation as they won 14 games after winning just two in the season prior to his arrival.

The following year Richard was promoted from assistant coach to associate head coach, spending three seasons in that capacity. He helped the Bulldogs reach the championship game of the Sun Belt Tournament in 1997, the school's first appearance in five seasons.

Richard became the head coach at Louisiana Tech prior to the 1998-99 season, guiding the Bulldogs for nine seasons. In his time at the helm of Louisiana Tech, Richard compiled a record of 150-117, the third-most wins in school history. In nine seasons, Richard had 11 players named all-conference, including three-time NCAA rebounding champion Paul Millsap, who went on to be drafted by the Utah Jazz. This season, Millsap will begin his fifth year with the Jazz.

During Richard's tenure at Louisiana Tech, the Bulldogs went on the road and won money games against the likes of Auburn, Baylor, Memphis (coached by John Calipari) and Texas Tech (coached by Bob Knight).

In his first season as head coach, Louisiana Tech won the Sun Belt regular season championship. Richard was named Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year and two players, Lonnie Cooper and Craig Jackson, earned all-conference accolades.

The next year, Richard guided Louisiana Tech to a 21-win season, the school's first of three 20-plus win seasons under Richard. Gerrod Henderson and Jackson earned All-Sun Belt honors that year, with Henderson named the Sun Belt's Most Valuable Player.

In 2001-02, Louisiana Tech moved from the Sun Belt into the Western Athletic Conference, where Richard immediately turned the Bulldogs into a contender for the conference crown, posting a 22-10 overall record, 14-4 in conference play. Led by Henderon, who earned All-WAC honors, Richard's Bulldogs earned a berth in the NIT, where they defeated Louisiana-Lafayette and Vanderbilt before falling to Villanova.

Richard took the Bulldogs to the postseason again during the 2005-06 season as Louisiana Tech won 20 games and earned a trip to the NIT. That year, Millsap was named as an All-WAC performer for the third consective season while also leading the nation in rebounding for the third-straight season.

In nine years as the head coach at Louisiana Tech, Richard's teams posted a conference record of 90-60, going 32-14 in three seasons in Sun Belt and 58-46 in six years in the WAC. At ULM, Richard returns to the Sun Belt where he currently stands as the league's 10th winningest coach in conference games, with a .696 winning percentage.

Prior to returning to guide his alma mater, Richard spent the past two seasons as an assistant coach at LSU, where he helped the Tigers win the 2008-09 SEC regular season championship and reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament before losing to eventual national champion North Carolina.

MONROE, La. - Fred Brown scored a game-high 21 points and Hugh Mingo added 18 to lead ULM to a 67-63 exhibition win over Lubbock Christian Tuesday night inside Fant-Ewing Coliseum.

ULM converted 50 percent of its field goals in the second half (15-30) and made 10 of its 14 free throws to spark the victory after the teams were tied 26-all

Fabio Ribeiro connected on 4-of-6 field goals to finish with 12 points and seven rebounds, while Charles Winborne added five points and two rebounds in his first ULM action after sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. Brown and Mingo were co-leaders in rebounds with eight boards a piece.

ULM went on a 14-6 spurt, powered by a Winborne jumper and a pair of Brown baskets to claim a 46-42 advantage. Then Ribeiro found an offensive groove, scoring nine of the next 12 Warhawk points to give the hosts a 58-53 lead.

Jumpers by Brown and Ribeiro would push the Warhawks in front 62-57. A late 6-3 run by the Chaps was not enough, as three Mingo free throws down the stretch would close the game for ULM

The Warhawks opened the contest on a 6-1 run highlighted by 3-pointers from Mingo and Brown The Chans responded with a quick 10-0 run of their own. capped by two Douglas Williams field goals from beyond the arc to jump in front 11-6.

A Brown free throw and a Mingo jumper pulled ULM within two (11-9) at the under-16 timeout. Then a Mingo jumper bookended a Brown 3-pointer to pull the Warhawks back on top 14-11.

Two free throws from Marcelis Hansberry ended a 9-0 Lubbock Christian run and vaulted the Warhawks on an explosive 10-0 surge. A 3-pointer from Brown, an and-one from Mingo and a layup from Ribeiro gave the hosts their biggest advantage of the first half 26-20.

The Chaps battled back, closing a 6-0 swing to send the game to the break tied 26-26. Brown paced the Warhawk attack with 10 points, followed by Mingo with nine. Hansberry added five points and four assists for ULM.

Lubbock Christian (0-1) hit its first five shots of the second half to open the game's biggest lead, 36-28. The Warhawks countered with a jumper from Christian Bibi Ndongo and a swish from Winborne to draw within four 36-32.

Anthony Brancato led Lubbock Christian with 19 points and eight rebounds, while Rashad Sample chipped in 18, all of which came in the second half.

OXFORD, Miss - ULM put forth a valiant second-half effort, but it was not enough as Ole Miss powered to a 60-38 victory Friday night in the season opener for both squads. The Warhawks shot just 28.6 percent for the game and struggled at the free-throw line, going 7-of-18.

Senior guard Fred Brown led the Warhawks with seven points on 2-of-12 shooting. It was the first time ULM failed to have a player score in double figures since 2006 against Iowa State. Freshman Trent Mackey came off the bench to notch five points and five rebounds in his first collegiate game.

ULM put on a spectacular defense display in the second half as Ole Miss shot just 23.3 percent in the half. The Warhawks cut the lead to as low as 16 in the second half, but that is as close as they would get.

After the two teams traded baskets for the first 10 minute of the second half, the Warhawks embarked on a 6-0 run - fueled by a pair of Fabio Ribeiro layups - to get within 49-33 with 5:14 remaining. ULM held Ole Miss scoreless for over three minutes during that stretch.

A Terrance Henry free throw and a layup from Murphy Holloway catapulted the Rebels back in front 52-33 with 4:21 left.

Henry, a Monroe, La. native, led three Rebels in double figures with 15 points. Nick Williams added 13 points and Dundrecous Nelson chipped in 12 points for the Rebels. Holloway pulled down a game-high 17 rebounds.

The Warhawks shot just 16.7 percent in the first half as Ole Miss stormed out to a 33-11 advantage at halftime. ULM converted 4 of 24 from the field and 1 of 7 from 3-point range. The Rebels countered by shooting 44.4 percent and outgaining ULM 26-12 on the boards.

Ole Miss broke the game open with a 24-6 run over the final 13:18 of the first half. Leading 18-8, Williams scored nine straight points for the Rebels, capped a by an old-fashioned three-point play that gave Ole Miss a 24-10 advantage with 7:00 remaining.

The Rebels continued the run spearheaded by an aggressive defense which blocked six shots and forced nine ULM turnovers in the half. The Warhawks managed just one point - a Christian Bibi Ndongo free throw - in the last 7:26 of the

Winborne hit 3-pointers on back-to-back possessions, and senior guard Hugh Mingo added a layup as ULM cut the Indiana State lead to 50-48 with 11:14 remaining. ULM got to within one (52-51) on Winborne's fourth 3-pointer of the night. The Warhawks hit seven of their nine 3-pointers in the second half.

Indiana State hit seven of its first 13 shots, including three 3-pointers, to build an early 17-8 lead. Another 3 by Lucas Ettel gave the Sycamores a 20-10 advantage - its largest lead of the half - with 11:34 before the break. The Sycamores had a 34-26 lead at the break.

The Vols scored nine straight points - five from Golden - to take a 55-48 advantage. Richardson added a dunk and a 3-pointer to extend the Tennessee to 62-51 with 9:30 left in the game. Tatum added 3-pointers on back-to-back possessions to build the Vols lead to 75-57.

Tennessee finished with a 46-27 rebounding edge and took advantage of it by outscoring ULM 15-4 on second-chance points.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - No. 24 Mississippi State used a pair of big runs to defeat ULM 78-63 Monday evening inside Humphrey Coliseum. It marked the end to a tough start to the season for the Warhawks (0-5) in which they played five games in 11 days - four on the road.

The Bulldogs had runs of 14-0 (first half) and 18-1 (second half) to win their fourth straight and improve to 5-1 on the season. The Warhawks did not make it easy though as they led by as many as eight in the first half and trailed just 31-26 at the break.

Senior guard Fred Brown turned in another stellar performance for the Warhawks with a season-high 21 points on 7-of-12 shooting. Brown connected on 3-of-5 from 3-point range while also tallying two assists and two steals.

ULM upped its shooting for the fifth straight game and finished the contest shooting 49.0 percent from the field. Mississippi State countered by shooting 50.8 percent from the field and knocking in 10 3-pointers.

With the Warhawks leading by two, Mississippi State used an 18-1 run to take a 57-42 advantage with 10:10 remaining in the game. The run spanned 5:57 and was capped by a 3-pointer by Dee Bost. Bost led the Bulldogs with 21 points and five assists in the game, including four 3-pointers.

Rodney Hood chipped in 20 points and eight assists and Brian Bryant finished with 17 points, 10 rebounds and four assists for the Bulldogs.

Mississippi State took advantage of its size with a 36-16 advantage in the paint and a 17-3 edge in second-chance points. ULM hung in on the boards against the Bulldogs with just a 32-26 deficit.

Sophomore guard Marcelis Hansberry also had a season-best night with 13 points, while senior guard Hugh Mingo and sophomore guard Charles Winborne each contributed nine points for ULM.

ULM hit four of its first five shots of the game, including a pair of 3-pointers by Brown, to take an early 11-5 advantage. Hansberry scored on a layup with 13:51 to give the Warhawks a 15-10 lead.

Mississippi State reeled off five straight points - all from Jalen Steele -- to tie the score at 15-all with 12:13 remaining in the first half before ULM used an 8-0 run to build its largest lead of the game.

Freshman Trey Lindsey hit a jumper just inside in the 3-point line and R.J. McCray followed with a jumper of his own to vault the Warhawks in front 19-15 at the 9:08 mark of the first half. Hugh Mingo connected on a layup and Hansberry scored in transition to give ULM its largest lead at 23-15 with 7:49 remaining before halftime.

Mississippi State quickly responded, embarking on a 14-0 run spanning over seven minutes, to take a 29-23 advantage. Brown broke the run with a 3-pointer at the 1:18mark to null the Warhawks within three points

The Warhawks opened the second half on 9-4 run to knot the score at 35-all with 16:03 remaining. A jumper by Hansberry gave ULM its final lead at 41-39 with 14:31 left in the game.

Deantra Scott scored a game-high 24 points to lead four Harding (1-1) players in double figures. Zach Roddenberry contributed 13 points and seven rebounds, while Hayden Johnson and Bradley Spencer each had 10 points.

Harding shot 56 percent in the first half en route to a 40-24 advantage at the break. The Bisons led by as many as 19 (38-19) with 2:08 remaining in the half.



MONROE, La. - Sophomore Marcelis Hansberry missed a 3-point attempt from half court with time expiring as Louisiana Tech held on to defeat ULM 73-71 Saturday in a wild game inside Fant-Ewing Coliseum.

The Bulldogs looked to be in control of the game when Raheem Appleby hit a pair of free throws to give Tech a 65-57 advantage with 2:36 remaining, but ULM responded by scoring 14 points in the final two and half minutes and getting as close as one in the final seconds.

The Warhawks (1-7) shot 54.5 percent in the second half and finished at 40.4 percent for the game. ULM knocked in six 3-pointers and made a season-best 19-of-23 from the free-throw line. Louisiana Tech (3-4) shot 42.6 percent for the game, including 8-of-24 shooting from beyond the arc.

Senior guard Fred Brown led the way for the Warhawks with 17 points - all in the second half - on 4-of-10 shooting. Brown tied a season high with four 3-pointers in the game, including two in the final minute.

Winborne finished in double figures for the third straight game with 15 points and a team-high five assists. Senior Christian Bibi Ndongo recorded a career-high 10 points and five rebounds off the bench for the Warhawks.

Appleby scored a career-best 19 points on 7-of-15 shooting to lead the way for Louisiana Tech, while Johnson registered 14 points and finished with four 3-pointers. Johnson hit a pair of big 3-pointers as part of a 9-0 run as Louisiana Tech grabbed a 65-57 lead with 2:36 remaining.

The Bulldogs held a 28-24 advantage in the paint and a pivotal 23-9 edge in points off turnovers. The Warhawks, who entered the game as one of the best teams in the Sun Belt at holding onto the ball, finished with 17 turnovers.

ULM scored the final six points of the first half to close within 32-29 at the break. The Warhawks struggled to shoot in the half, converting just 31.4 percent from the field.

The Warhawks (1-8) battled back from an 11-point halftime deficit to tie the score at 43-all with just over 14 minutes remaining in the game. It marked the third time this season that ULM has either led or been tied with a team in one of the power six conferences.

The Aggies (8-1) answered with an 11-0 run to take the lead for good at 54-43 with 8:08 to play. The Warhawks got to within as close as five (54-49) on a layup senior Fabio Ribeiro with 5:42 remaining before Chris Middleton took over for the Aogies.

Middleton, who was playing in just his second game of the season due to injury, paced Texas A&M with 24 points on 8-of-14 shooting. He scored eight points in the final five and a half minutes - including a pair of 3-pointers - that kept Texas A&M comfortably in control.

ULM and Texas A&M each with finished with 22 made baskets and five 3-pointers with the difference coming at the free-throw line. The Aggies made 18-of-23 from the charity stripe while ULM made it to the line just five times.

Senior guard Fred Brown failed to score in double figures for the first time in seven games as he finished with seven points on 3-of-13 shooting. Ribeiro contributed six points and seven rebounds, while freshman forward Trey Lindsey hit a pair of 3-pointer for six points.

ULM opened the second half on fire, hitting five of its first seven shots, to cut the Texas A&M lead to 43-41 with 15:52 to play. A pair of free throws from Ribeiro on the next possession tied the score with 14:51 remaining.

The Aggies scored the final four points of the first half, including a three-point play by Middleton in the final seconds, to build a 38-27 advantage at the break. Texas A&M came into the game giving up an average of just 16.7 points in the first half at home


ULM got as close as 62-54 with 5:20 remaining in the game, but Nicholls State responded by scoring seven straight points to put the game out of reach.



MONROE, La. — ULM rallied back from a 15-point deficit in the second half to force overtime, but Western Kentucky survived with a 76-71 victory in the Sun Belt opener for both teams Thursday inside Fant-Ewing Coliseum.

The Hilltoppers (5-9, 1-0 SBC) scored the first four points of the overtime period and sealed the victory by going 8 of 13 from the free-throw line in the extra session. Western Kentucky finished the game 28 of 39 from the charity stripe, its most makes this season.

It marked the first overtime game for the Warhawks since Dec. 31, 2008 when they defeated UALR 95-87.

Senior guard Hugh Mingo gave the Warhawks a chance with a game-tying 3-pointer to make the score 64-all with 2.5 seconds remaining in regulation. ULM scored the final six points of the half after trailing 64-58 with 46 seconds remaining.

Mingo scored a season-high 23 points on 9-of-15 shooting from the field. He also contributed four rebounds, two assists and two steals in a career-high 41 minutes. Sophomore center Steven McClellan had 15 points, eight rebounds and a block, while senior guard Fred Brown chipped in 13 points and a team-high five assists for the Warhawks.

George Fant finished with 17 points while going 9 of 12 from the free-throw line to lead the scoring effort for the Hilltoppers. Derrick Gordon had 13 points, and Kevin Kaspar contributed 11 points – all in the second half and overtime – for Western Kentucky

Western Kentucky led by as many as 15 points early in the second half before ULM rallied back. The Warhawks scored 11 straight points to pull within one at 53-52 with 7:26 remaining. After five straight points from Western Kentucky, ULM used a 6-0 run to tie the score at 58 at the 4:53 mark.

ULM (1-13, 0-1 SBC) made five of its first nine shots of the game to build an 11-3 advantage at the 15:50 mark of the first half. The Warhawks extended their lead to as large as 18-8 on a pair of free throws from McClellan at the 13:28 mark.

The Hilltoppers responded by scoring nine straight points and they took their first lead of the game at 23-22 with 5:45 remaining in the first half. George Fant scored on a tip-in to cap the run for Western Kentucky.

Western Kentucky led 34-29 at halftime.

Senior guard Fred Brown had his game-winning 3-pointer come up short as time expired for the Warhawks, who led for all but 1:30 in the game. ULM shot 50 percent from the field and converted on 8-of-17 from 3-point range. Arkansas State benefited from the charity stripe, where they held a 19-5 advantage in the game.

Brown led the way for the Warhawks with 20 points on 8-of-16 shooting. It marked Brown's second 20-point game of the season and the 11th time he has scored in double figures. Sophomore Charles Winborne notched 11 points and five rebounds, and senior Hugh Mingo chipped in 10 points.

Brandon Peterson led four Red Wolves in double figures with 18 points, including an 8-of-10 effort from the free-throw line. Hooten had 16 points, while Ed Townsel contributed 14 points and Malcoln Kirkland finished with 10 points.

ULM looked in control when Winborne knocked in a 3-pointer with 10:20 remaining to give the Warhawks a 50-41 advantage. Arkansas State responded with a 12-2 run to take a one-point lead - its first lead since the opening minute of the game.

Sophomore Steven McClellan and Winborne hit back-to-back 3-pointers to pull the Warhawks back in front 58-53.



MIAMI - ULM picked up its first conference victory of the season with a 54-50 victory at FIU Saturday evening inside U.S. Century Bank Arena. The Warhawks (2-15, 1-3 SBC) led by as many as 13 points in the second half, but had to hang on as the Panthers rallied to within one in the final minute.

Senior guard Fred Brown hit 3 of 4 free throws down the stretch to clinch the victory for the Warhawks. Brown led ULM with 16 points on 4-of-12 shooting from the field. Brown also contributed three rebounds and two assists in 39 minutes of action

With ULM clinging to a 51-50 lead with 9.8 seconds remaining, Brown sank 1 of 2 from the charity stripe. FIU's Deric Hill threw the ensuing inbounds pass right to ULM's Hugh Mingo who stole the ball and passed it quickly to Brown with 2 seconds remaining on the clock. Brown sealed the victory for the Warhawks by hitting both free throw attempts.

Sophomore Steven McClellan came up a rebound shy of a double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds, while Mingo finished a point shy of a double-double with nine points and a career-high 12 boards. Sophomore Charles Winborne notched 10 points and freshman Trent Mackey contributed nine points and a career-high seven assists.

The Warhawks, who shot 34.6 percent from the field, finished with a 40-38 advantage on the boards.

ULM went on a 7-0 run midway through the second half — capped by a 3-pointer from Winborne — to take a 43-30 advantage. The Panthers responded with 12-1 run spanning just over four minutes to close within 44-42 with 5:19 remaining.

The Panthers (4-11, 1-2 SBC) did not go away though, scoring six straight points -- capped by a dunk from Dominique Ferguson -- to close to within 51-50. Phil Taylor led three FIU players in double figures with 19 points, while Fergu-

son chipped in 12 points and nine rebounds, and Jeremy Allen added 10 points. Two days after scoring just 30 points in a loss at Florida Atlantic, the Warhawks netted 31 in the first half to take a 10-point halftime advantage against FIU. ULM shot 40 percent in the first half and knocked in six 3-pointers.

Brown hit back-to-back 3-pointers to spark an 11-0 run that gave the War-hawks a 23-12 advantage with 7:17 remaining before halftime. After FIU closed the gap to five with six straight points, ULM answered with back-to-back 3s from Mackey to give the Warhawks a 29-18 lead with just over three minutes to play before the break.

The Mean Green (11-8, 4-2 SBC) led by as many as 23 points in the second half before ULM made a late run and cut the margin to as close as 66-55 with 3:07 remaining. Roger Franklin answered for North Texas with a layup in transition and the Mean Green held the Warhawks scoreless over the final three minutes to hang on for the victory.

Sophomore guard Charles Winborne led ULM with 15 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the field. Sophomore guard Marcelis Hansberry added eight points and sophomore center Steven McClellan chipped in seven points and a career-high 13 rebounds for the Warhawks.

Brandon Walton led all scorers with 18 points, including five 3-pointer, to lead the Mean Green. Franklin tallied 16 points and 15 rebounds and Tony Mitchell chipped in 15 points and nine rebounds.

ULM (2-17, 1-5 SBC) trailed 61-49 with 5:09 remaining when Walton hit a deep 3-pointer as the shot clock expired to extend the Mean Green lead back to 15.

Winborne knocked in a pair of free throws for the Warhawks, then hit a jumper in the lane to cut the North Texas advantage to 66-53 with 3:56 left. Sophomore guard R.J. McCray stole the ball on the ensuing North Texas possession and finished with a layup to get the Warhawks within 11.

ULM finished with a season-high 44 rebounds while holding North Texas to 35.5 percent shooting from the field. The Warhawks limited the Mean Green to just 27.6 percent in the second half.

The Warhawks shot 22.2 percent in the first half and trailed the Mean Green 37-18 at the break.

The Pioneers (15-4, 5-1 SBC) shot 50 percent from the field while holding the Warhawks to 36.5 percent from the field. Denver entered the night ranked No. 2 in the Sun Belt in scoring defense, allowing just 60.7 points per game.

Sophomore guard Charles Winborne led the Warhawks with 18 points and five rebounds. It marked the fourth straight game that Winborne has reached double figures in scoring. He has led the Warhawks in scoring in two straight contests.

ULM (2-18, 1-6 SBC) got as close as 11 at 57-46 with 4:33 to play before Denver scored four straight points to put the game away. Leading 11-9 early, the Pioneers held the Warhawks scoreless for just under eight minutes, embarking on a 12-0 run, to build a 23-9 advantage. A 3-pointer by Winborne ended the ULM drought at the 6:33 mark of the half.

Denver held ULM to just 29.2 percent shooting in the first half and held a 36-18 lead at the break.

Winborne scored 13 points in the second half, including eight straight to open the half. His 3-pointer with 17:11 remaining cut the Denver lead to 38-26. After a layup from Stafford, freshman forward Trey Lindsey knocked home a 3-pointer to get the Warhawks within 11 at 40-29 with 16:12 to play.

Denver answered with an 11-3 spurt, capped by a 3-pointer from O'Neale with 11:15 remaining, to stretch its lead to 51-35.

Troy scored 12 straight points to build an early 18-7 advantage with 13:44 remaining in the opening half. ULM answered to cut the lead to 20-15 on eight straight points from senior quard Hugh Mingo, but that is as close as it would get.

The Trojans used a 15-2 run to take a 35-17 lead with 6:19 remaining before halftime. Troy capped the half with a 3-pointer at the buzzer by Jones to take a 42-26 lead into intermission.

JONESBORO, Ark. — ULM battled back from a 19-point deficit in the second half, but it was not enough as Arkansas State held on for a 72-64 victory over the Warhawks Thursday evening inside the Convocation Center.

With its starters on the bench, ULM used a 19-3 run to pull within three points midway through the second half, but Arkansas State shot lights out down the stretch to put the game away. The Red Wolves (10-14, 4-6 SBC) finished the game at 46.9 percent from the field, while the Warhawks shot 37.9 percent.

Sophomore guard came off the bench to tie a career high with 15 points and senior center Fabio Ribeiro chipped in a season-high 13 points to lead the way for the Warhawks. ULM had a balanced scoring attack as eight different players scored at least five points.

Hansberry scored on a putback layup with 7:16 remaining to cap the 19-3 spurt and pull the Warhawks within 52-49. The Red Wolves answered with eight straight points from Adam Sterrenberg, including a pair of 3-pointers, to push its lead back to double figures at 60-50 with 5:08 to play.

Sterrenberg and Ed Townsel each scored 18 points to lead the Red Wolves, while Rakeem Dickerson chipped in 12 points and Marcus Hooten added 10 points.

ULM (2-21, 1-9 SBC) missed six free throws down the stretch and went just 16 of 25 from the charity stripe in the game. After a slow start, Arkansas State made its final 10 free-throw attempts to seal the victory.

The Warhawks held a 28-18 advantage in points in the paint and a commanding 46-23 edge in bench points.

Arkansas State made six 3-pointers in the first half and led 34-22 at the break.


