DEACONS OPEN THE SEASON ON THE ROAD AT ULM

- Wake Forest will kickoff the 2014 season on the road when it travels to Monroe, La., to face ULM.
- Game time is scheduled for 7 p.m. ET and will be broadcast on ESPN. The game can also be heard on the Wake Forest Sports Network and online at WakeForestSports.com.

WAKE FOREST STORYLINES

- Thursday night's game will mark the beginning of the Dave Clawson era at Wake Forest. Clawson came to Wake Forest after a five-year stint at Bowling Green where he guided the Falcons to the 2013 MAC Championship and back-to-back bowl games in 2012 and 2013.
- True-freshman John Wolford is slated to take the first snap of the season at quarterback for the Deacs. He would be the first Demon Deacon true-freshman quarterback to start his first game on campus.
- Head coach Dave Clawson has indicated that a total of nine true-freshman could make their collegiate debuts Thursday night.
- The Demon Deacons have a 53-56-3 record in the program's previous 112 season-openers.
- For the first time since 2010, Wake Forest has named permanent captains for the season. Senior fullback Jordan Garside, senior defensive back Merrill Noel, junior linebackers Brandon Chubb and Hunter Williams as well as sophomore safety Ryan Janvion were all selected by their teammates to lead the squad this season.

THE OPPOSITION & SERIES HISTORY

- This will be just the second all-time meeting between Wake Forest and ULM.
- The Warhawks defeated Wake Forest last season 21-19 at BB&T Field.
- ULM is coming off a 6-6 campaign a year ago which included a 4-3 mark in the Sun Belt.
- The Warhawks return 17 starters in 2014 including nine on the defensive side of the ball.

NEXT UP...

- Wake Forest will host Gardner-Webb in its home-opener on Saturday, Sept. 6.
- The game is set to kickoff at 6:30 p.m. and will be aired on ESPN3.
- The Deacs topped GWU 48-5 in the 2011 season-opener at BB&T Field.

Weekly Press Conference

Wake Forest's weekly press conference begins each Tuesday at 11 a.m. in the Miller Center on campus. Selected players are available first to the electronic media in the Team Meeting Room on the first floor. The players will then meet the print media in the Rovere Room immediately following. Lunch will then be served and Dave Clawson will meet with the media at 11:45 a.m. in the team meeting room followed by lunch with the print media in the Rovere Room. Any specific player requests must be made before noon on Monday. Quotes and video of the press conference will be posted on WakeForestSports.com.

ACC Weekly Teleconference

Dave Clawson participates in the ACC's weekly teleconference every Wednesday at 11:10 a.m. For the media access number, contact the ACC Media Relations Office or the Wake Forest Athletic Communications Office. The teleconference is archived online at theACC.com.

Covering Practice

Wake Forest typically conducts its practices on campus at the Doc Martin Practice Complex adjacent to the Pruitt Football Center. Please contact the Athletic Communications Office when you'd like to attend. Coach Clawson is available in person every day of the week and players are available Monday through Wednesday after practice.

The Dave Clawson Show

Coach Clawson's weekly radio show with the Voice of the Deacons Stan Cotten airs on the Wake Forest IMG Sports Network and online at WakeForestSports.com. The show will be held live on location at Bib's Downtown through Oct. 10 and then held at the IMG College studios in downtown Winston-Salem.

Aside from the previously mentioned Tuesday press conference, Wednesday teleconference and radio show, Dave Clawson is available for phone interviews on Wednesday mornings by appointment only. Please schedule those with the Athletic Communications Office.

PRESS CREDENTIALS

Media credentials for all Wake Forest home games can be obtained by emailing a written request to Steve Shutt in the Athletic Communications Office.

All requests are screened to ensure a working pressbox with priority given to daily newspapers, radio/TV sports directors and other media who cover the Deacons and their opponents on a regular basis.

Guests are not permitted in any working media area. If you wish to bring a guest to any game, contact Steve Shutt regarding the availability of tickets.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Credentials will be mailed for all requests received seven days in advance of the specified game. All other credentials should be picked up in the Athletic Communications office the day before the game, or at the Media Will Call window no earlier than two and a half hours prior to kickoff. Media Will Call is located at Gate 1 of Deacon Tower at BB&T Field.

DEACON TOWER MEDIA ENTRANCE

To access the pressbox in Deacon Tower, media members should use the South elevators, also known as the Black Lobby. The pressbox is located on the sixth floor.

Bags will be searched prior to entering the stadium. No outside food or drinks are allowed into BB&T Field. Also, no food or drink can be carried onto the elevators once inside Deacon Tower.

SIDELINE REGULATIONS

In order to access the sidelines, photographers must have a Photo credential and an arm band. Arm bands are available on the sixth floor of Deacon Tower.

Tripods are allowed on the field but must be at least five yards away from the sideline or end line.

No photographers or media personnel are permitted within the team areas (midfield between the 25-yard lines) at any time. Please work from either side of the team area and move quickly behind the benches when changing ends of the field.

MEDIA SERVICES

Pregame notes, rosters and programs are provided to working media in the pressbox prior to kickoff. Quickie stats will be distributed in the press box after each quarter and in the Boyette Media Room in Bridger Field House after the game.

Final game packets will be available in the pressbox following interviews.

Coach Dave Clawson will be available for comments and questions in the Boyette Media Room on the ground floor of Bridger Field House approximately 10 minutes following the conclusion of the game.

The Athletic Communications office will transcribe a portion of the postgame comments from Grobe, the visiting head coach and selected Demon Deacon players.

After Coach Clawson's 10-minute session, requested Wake Forest players will be made available in the Boyette Media Room. Requests for specific players should be submitted to the Wake Forest Athletic Communications staff in the pressbox before or during the fourth quarter.

The Wake Forest locker room is closed to the media at all times. The visiting coach will be available in the Helms Conference Room on the third floor of Bridger Field House after the game. Visiting player availability will be announced in the press box.

HEY ROOKIE

- Wake Forest is expected to start true freshman John Wolford at quarterback in the season-opener at ULM on August 28.
- Wolford will be the first true freshman quarterback in school history to start a season-opener.
- Over the years, a number of true freshmen quarterbacks have earned starts, most recently Tanner Price in Week 3 in 2010.
- But none have earned the starting job during preseason camp and started the opener.

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTERS AT QB

- While John Wolford will be the first true freshman quarterback to start a season-opener at Wake Forest, he's not the only true frosh signal-caller to become a starter.
- Tanner Price started nine games as a freshman in 2010, earning his first start in Week 3 at Stanford.
- In 2000, Anthony Young started five games for the Demon Deacons, earning his first start in Week 4.
- David Webber started seven games as a rookie in 1978, starting in Week 5.
- During the 1974 season, Wake Forest started a pair of true freshmen in Mike McGlamry (Weeks 3-6) and Solomon Everett in Weeks 7-9.
- Bill Armstrong, who would become an All-America at safety, started the final two games of his freshman season in 1973 at quarterback.
- Andy Carlton was the first Deacon true freshman to earn a start in 1972, starting Weeks 5-8.

MAKING THE MOST OF THAT FIRST PASS

- Plenty of eyes will be on John Wolford when he takes the field against ULM and particularly on his first pass attempt.
- Three Wake Forest quarterbacks have thrown a touchdown pass on their first collegiate pass attempt.
- In 1972, Andy Carlton tossed a 49-yard TD pass to Richard Carter vs. NC State.
- In 1974, Mike McGlamry hit Tom Fehring with a 67-yard strike on his first collegiate attempt.
- And recently, Ben Mauk connected with Jason Anderson on an 85-yard touchdown against Clemson in 2004.

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING OPENING NIGHT

- Last year, center Cory Helms became the first Wake Forest true freshman to start a season-opener since 1987 when DT Marvin Mitchell drew a start against Richmond.
- It appears that the Demon Deacons will extend that streak to two-in-a-row when true freshmen John Wolford (quarterback) and A'Lique Terry (center) start vs. ULM.

NOT AN AUTOMATIC REDSHIRT ANYMORE

- After more than a decade of redshirting nearly every true freshman, the trend has turned in the last two years for the Deacs.
- In 2013, 11 first-year Demon Deacons saw action and a similar number may see time in 2014.
- Between 2001 and 2012, Wake Forest never played more than three rookies.
- This season, head coach Dave Clawson has indicated that nine rookies could play in the season-opener and six more could be ready if called on due to injury.

NEW COACH, FIRST GAME

- Wake Forest's previous 31 head coaches have combined for a 17-14 record in their first game at the helm of the Demon Deacons.
- In fact, seven of the last nine head coaches have won in their debut.
- Since World War II, only Jim Caldwell in 1993 and Al Groh in 1981 started their Wake Forest careers at 0-1.

WAKE FOREST IN SEASON-OPENERS

- Wake Forest is 53-56-3 in 112 prior season openers.
- The Deacons have won each of their last two season openers, defeating Liberty 20-17 in 2012 and Presbyterian, 31-7, in 2013.
- Wake Forest has not opened the year with an FBS opponent since suffering a 36-29 overtime loss at Syracuse in the first game of the 2011 season.
- On the road, the Deacons are 15-32-3 in the first game of the year while going 34-18 when playing the opener at home.

GETTING BACK OUT THERE AGAINST THE WARHAWKS

- Redshirt-sophomore linebacker Steve Donatell was having a great start to his 2013 season before it abruptly ended with a hyperextension torn PCL in the game against ULM on Sept. 14.
- After redshirting in 2012, Donatell claimed one of the starting linebacker spots at the start of 2013.
- He recorded three tackles and his first-career sack over the first three contest but then suffered the knee injury in the second quarter and would miss the rest of the season.
- Donatell had a tremendous spring rehabbing his knee and would love nothing more than to get back out on the first for the first time against ULM.

WAKE FOREST - ULM CONNECTIONS

- Wake Forest secondary coach Derrick Jackson was the defensive ends coach at Army in 2001 and 2002 while Todd Berry was the head coach. ULM DL coach John Mumford was also DL coach at Army in 2000-03. Travis Niekamp, LB/ST coach at ULM was TE coach at Army 2000-03.
- ULM tight ends coach Jerry McManus is a 1976 graduate of Wake Forest and a former Demon Deacon quarterback. He is also the father of current Wake Forest graduate assistant coach Ryan McManus.
- Junior defensive tackle Tylor Harris is Wake Forest's only Louisiana product. He is one of just four all-time Demon Deacon lettermen to hail from Louisiana, however, all have made a name for themselves. Most recently, Boo Robinson (Monroe, La.) lettered at defensive tackle from 2006-2009 and was a part of three consecutive bowl teams. Felix Blanchard, from White Castle, La., was a starter for the Deacons from 1917-1919. He is best known as the father of former Army Heisman Trophy winner "Doc" Blanchard. Harry Rabenhorst, from Baton Rouge, was a legendary player for Wake Forest who would go on to coach the LSU Tigers in baseball and basketball and earn a spot in the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame. Rabenhorst was 3-8 as the player-coach of the Deacons in 1918-19 and is best known for his legendary 110-yard punt against NC State in 1919. The kick soared 89 yards in the air and rolled 21 yards.

DAVE CLAWSON IN SEASON-OPENERS

- Head coach Dave Clawson is beginning his 15th season as a head coach.
- He owns an even 7-7 record in season openers in his career.
- He is 1-2 in his debut at each of his first three stops, losing at Fordham and Richmond while winning his first game at Bowling Green.

WAKE FOREST IN AUGUST

- All-time Wake Forest is 4-3 in games played in August but have currently won three straight.
- Those three victories came at home vs. Presbyterian in 2013 (31-7), at Baylor in 2008 (41-13), and at Boston College in 2003 (32-28).
- The Deacons are 2-1 in road August games, with a 42-41 overtime loss at Northern Illinois in 2002 as the lone blemish.

OFF AND RUNNING

- The Demon Deacons have a stable of runners in the backfield and head coach Dave Clawson has said he would like to use a number of running backs this season.
- Senior Orville Reynolds is slated to be the starter but he will be backed-up by a bevy of first-timers.
- Fellow senior Jordan Garside is listed as the backup and will carry a large part of the load. But through three seasons, Garside has yet to record a carry.
- Redshirt-freshman Dezmond Wortham along with true-freshmen Isaiah Robinson and Tyler Henderson are also all chomping at the bit to get their first carries.
- The school-record for most rushing yards in a player's first game is 125 by Micah Andrews vs. NC A&T in 2004.
- Andrews, who was a redshirt-freshman, also rushed for three touchdowns on his 17 carries.

DEACONS NAME FIVE CAPTAINS FOR 2014 SEASON

- For the first time since 2010, the Demon Deacons will have permanent captains for the season.
- The team elected five players as captains for the 2014 campaign.
- Senior fullback Jordan Garside is the lone representative on the offensive side of the ball while senior cornerback Merrill Noel, junior linebackers Brandon Chubb and Hunter Williams as well as sophomore safety Ryan Janvion are all on the defensive side.
- In each of the last three seasons, different captains were appointed each game.

BIG BLOW

- Senior defensive lineman Johnny Garcia suffered a torn right ACL in the second preseason practice and will miss the entire season.
- This came after Garcia suffered a torn left ACL as a true freshman in 2010.
- On the surface, Garcia's injury doesn't seem to be a big impact as he had made just three tackles over the last two seasons. But he had played in all 12 games each of the last two years and was playing behind three linemen - Nikita Whitlock, Zach Thompson and Kris Redding - who were all in NFL camps this fall.

- Garcia brought a veteran presence and was going to be a leader up front this season.
- Garcia had surgery on August 15 to repair his ACL and he will remain close to the team as a student assistant coach.
- Garcia, who graduated in May with a degree in communications/entrepreneurship, is currently pursuing a master's in liberal arts.

ONE OF THE YOUNGEST

- Wake Forest starts the season with 74 of its 105 players as either freshmen or sophomores.
- That number represents just over 70 percent of the Demon Deacons' roster which is tied for the third-youngest roster in division I.
- Pitt has 81 of its 103 players (78.6 percent) and Penn State 76 of its 105 (72.4 percent) as the two youngest squads in the country.
- Wake Forest is tied for ACC rival NC State for third at 70.5 percent.

WINNING RIGHT AWAY

- Wake Forest's 12 head coaches since World War II have combined for just three winning seasons in their first year at the helm.
- Tom Rogers debuted with a 6-4 mark in 1951, Bill Dooley went 7-4 in 1987 and Jim Grobe posted a 6-5 mark in 2001.

- Wake Forest's 2014 football schedule breaks down into three precise segments.
- The Demon Deacons open the season with four non-conference opponents and then play all six ACC Atlantic Division rivals.

Wide receiver Chip Brinkman caught a pair of touchdown passes from Skinner.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - With Wake Forest trailing by eight, Orville Reynolds caught a 23-yard touchdown pass from Tanner Price with four seconds left in the game to cap a 97-yard drive, but the Demon Deacons were unable to convert the two-point conversion and

ULM held on for a 21-19 victory on Saturday afternoon at BB&T Field.

The Deacons drop to 1-2 on the season, while the Warhawks are now 2-1.

Price was 8-for-10 on the final drive of the game and accounted for all 97 yards through the air. Michael Campanaro caught four balls on the drive, and Reynolds and Jonathan Williams each caught two. The Warhawks recovered the ensuing onside kick and ran out the clock for the win.

Campanaro tied a career and ACC record by catching 16 passes. His 177 receiving yards also set a new career-high.

ULM's quarterback Kolton Browning went 43-for-68 through the air and threw for 315 yards and three touchdowns. His play was a key reason that the Warhawks maintained possession for nearly 39 minutes and converted 15-of-28 third downs. In total, ULM outgained Wake Forest 424 to 325 in total yards.

Price finished the game 28-for-47 for 310 yards and two touchdowns. Reynolds caught three passes for 101 yards and was the recipient of both touchdown passes, which were the first two of his career.

On the defensive side of the football, Mike Olson led the way with 12 tackles. Ryan Janvion and Brandon Chubb both made 10 tackles, and Merrill Noel and Kevis Jones both intercepted passes for the Demon Deacons.

After ULM took an initial 7-0 lead in the first quarter, Wake Forest tied the game up with 5:16 left in the quarter on a 65-yard touchdown pass from Price to Reynolds. The touchdown catch was the first for Reynolds and was the longest catch of his career.

The Demon Deacons took a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter off a Chad Hedlund 28-yard field goal, but Kenzee Jackson caught a five-yard touchdown pass with 41 seconds left in the half to put ULM up 14-10.

Wake Forest narrowed the Warhawks lead in the waning seconds of the half as Price hit Campanaro three times on the ensuing drive. Hedlund then made the game 14-13 with a 38-yard field goal as the time expired.

ULM went up by eight when Tavares Maye scored on a nine-yard screen with 9:22 left in the third quarter to put the Warhawks up 21-13.

DAVE CLAWSON

Head Coach

1st Year • Williams, 1989



Dave Clawson heads into his first season as head football coach at Wake Forest in 2014.

The head coach at Bowling Green State University for the past five seasons, Clawson led the Falcons to the 2013 Mid-American Conference championship on Dec. 6, 2013 with a 47-27 win over No. 16 Northern Illinois.

Clawson built the Falcons to be explosive both offensively and defensively. The 2013 Bowling Green team was eighth in the nation in total defense and 23rd in total offense. The Falcons were one of just six teams to rank in the top-30 nationally in both total offense and defense. In 2012, BGSU was ranked sixth in the nation in total defense in and 10th nationally in scoring defense, yielding just 16.8 points per game. The Falcons are the only non-power conference team to rank in the top 25 statistically in both total offense and total defense in 2013.

Bowling Green's 2013 team went 10-3 overall and won the MAC East title with a 7-1 record. The Falcons received a bid to the Little Caesar's Bowl in Detroit which marked the third bowl appearance in five seasons for Clawson's team.

In his 14 years as a head coach, Clawson has delivered a conference championship at every stop. Prior to the 2013 Mid-American Conference title at Bowling Green, Clawson helped Richmond to an Atlantic 10 Championship in 2005 and a Colonial Athletic Association title in 2007. His first championship as a head coach came in 2002 when he led Fordham to the Patriot League title.

He has also earned numerous Coach of the Year Awards. He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2002 and was awarded the 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year award in just his second year in the league. Clawson earned CAA Coach of the Year honors in 2007, giving him four Coach of the Year honors in his first seven years as a head coach.

In 2002, Clawson was the Schutt Sports/American Football Monthly I-AA Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award. In 2005, Clawson earned National Coach of the Year from I-AA.org and was again a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award.

A 1989 graduate of Williams College in Massachusetts, Clawson earned a degree in political economy. A native of Youngstown, NY, Clawson was a defensive back for Williams and went on to serve as a graduate assistant coach at Albany in 1989 and 1990. He moved to Buffalo for the 1991 and 1992 seasons, tutoring the secondary his first year and the quarterbacks and running backs his second.

In 1993, Clawson was named the running backs coach at Lehigh and helped the Mountain Hawks to a 7-4 record and the Patriot League championship. He was promoted

to offensive coordinator in 1994 and spent two years in that role, adding another Patriot League title in 1995.

Villanova hired Clawson as offensive coordinator in 1996 and his offense helped the Wildcats to NCAA FCS playoff appearances in 1996 and 1997. During his tenure at Villanova, Clawson's offense established 70 program records, held the No. 1 ranking in the nation for six weeks in 1997 and won the 1997 Atlantic 10 championship. He tutored Brian Westbrook, who became the first player in college football history to gain 1,000 yards both rushing and receiving.

Following the 1998 season, Clawson became the nation's youngest Division I head coach when he was named head coach at Fordham. Inheriting a team that had won just 22 games in the previous 10 years, Clawson turned the Rams into the Patriot League champions in his fourth season at the helm. He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002. Clawson helped the Rams 2002 FCS Playoffs where they defeated fourth seed Northeastern in the opening round before falling to Villanova.

Clawson was named the head coach at Richmond prior to the 2004 season. He guided the Spiders to the biggest two-year turnaround in school history, improving from 3-8 in 2004 to 9-4 in 2005. In 2007, his final year with the Spiders, Clawson guided Richmond to an 11-3 record, the Colonial South title and the FCS national semifinals.

He left Richmond in 2008 to replace David Cutcliffe as the offensive coordinator under Phillip Fulmer at Tennessee. Following that season, Clawson was named the head coach at Bowling Green in time for the 2009 season.

Clawson and his wife, Catherine, are the parents of two children, Courtney and Eric.
