Sun Belt sets win record vs. Non-Conference Foes

The Sun Belt Conference's 21 non-conference wins in the 2013 season eclipsed the previous record mark of 19 set in 2012. Additionally, of note for the league's non-conference win total was that the Sun Belt fared well against its peer opponents in the non-AQ BCS ranks during the 2013 season. The Sun Belt finished the year a combined 8-1 against members of Conference-USA (4-1), the Mid-American Conference (3-0) and the Mountain West Conference (1-0). The Sun Belt also had the best overall non-conference win percentage when comparing the four non-AQ conferences.

Sun Belt Membership

The Sun Belt Conference will contest the 2014 football season with 11 members - Appalachian State, Arkansas State, Georgia Southern, Georgia State, Idaho, UL Lafayette, UL Monroe, New Mexico State, South Alabama, Texas State and Troy. UALR and UT Arlington compete as non-football playing members. The Sun Belt will have four new members in the league this year as Appalachian State and Georgia Southern were added as all-sports members and Idaho and New Mexico State were added as football playing members. Both Appalachian State and Georgia Southern bring with them highly successful football programs and each team will begin the process of transitioning to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) immediately. The 2014 Sun Belt football season will mark the debut of both in the league schedule and standings. Additionally, both the Mountaineers and Eagles will be able to compete for the league championship in football for the 2014 season. Both teams will first be eligible to compete in a spot for a postseason bowl game come the 2015 season. Idaho and New Mexico State are familiar partners of the Sun Belt Conference, having been football members from the league's inaugural year of football in 2001 through the 2004 season. Both members played an integral part of forming the Sun Belt Conference for football and now add strength to the league. Both teams will be immediately eligible to compete for the Sun Belt football championship and also for a spot in postseason bowl games.

SUN BELT IS 6-3 - RECORD FOR MOST FIRST WEEK NON-CONFERENCE WINS

Six Sun Belt teams got the season started on the right foot as Arkansas State, Georgia State, UL Lafayette, UL Monroe, New Mexico State and Texas State were all victors in seasons openers.

The total of six wins marks the best ever non-conference win total for the Sun Belt in the opening weekend of play (2014 - 6; 2013 - 4; 2012 - 4; 2011 - 0; 2010 - 2; 2009 - 3; 2008 - 1; 2007 - 0; 2006 - 3; 2005 - 3; 2004 - 3; 2003 - 0; 2002 - 0; 2001 - 2).

Second week action features two conference matchups as New Mexico State travels to Atlanta to play Georgia State while UL Monroe hosts Idaho. The two games mark the first conference games of the 2014 season. The two contests also mark the first Sun Belt Conference games for Idaho and New Mexico State since the 2004 season. The Aggies and Vandals were both founding members of the Sun Belt's football league in 2001 and both played four seasons before departing for the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). After spending eight seasons in the WAC, both teams

were FBS Independents last season. New Mexico State's last game in a conference was against second year Sun Belt member Texas State (Dec. 1, 2012). Idaho's last conference game took place against now Mountain West Conference member Utah State (Nov. 24, 2012).

Arkansas State and Troy are the only teams slated to take on members from the "Power 5" conferences this week. A-State travels to Knoxville to take on Tennessee. While Troy will host Duke in the second game of a two game series. Duke hosted Troy last season with the Blue Devils winning 38-31.

Elsewhere, UL Lafayette plays an in-state team at home for the second consecutive week as the Cajuns host Louisiana Tech. While Georgia Southern and Appalachian State open their home slates against FCS opponents. South Alabama begins its season with an away contest at Kent State. The Jaguars beat the Golden Flashes by 17 points last season at home.

Tyler Jones (Texas State, So., QB)

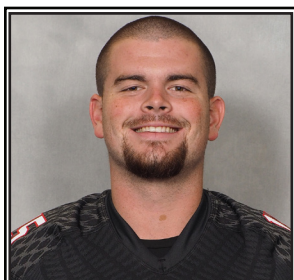
Tyler Jones accounted for 329 yards total offense to lead Texas State to a 65-0 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff. He completed 21 of 25 passes for career-bests of 278 yards and four touchdowns against the Lions. His 21 completions and 84.0 percent completion percentage were also career bests. Jones also rushed for 51 yards on six carries against the Lions. His 329 yards total offense helped Texas State to set a school record and record 697 yards as a team which is the fifth-highest total yards in Sun Belt Conference history.

Mitch Lane (UL Monroe, Jr., LB)

Mitch Lane had six tackles (four solo and two assisted) during ULM's 17-10 victory over Wake Forest on Thursday night. Trailing by a touchdown with four minutes left in the third quarter, Lane turned the game around for the Warhawks as he intercepted the Demon Deacons' pass attempt and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 10-10. This play, featured as #3 on ESPN's SCTop10 Plays, inspired the offense, who marched down the field to capture the game-winning touchdown. Lane and the rest of the Warhawk defense limited the Demon Deacons to just 94 yards of total offense, the fewest yards gained against the Warhawks since 63 yards of offense by Northwestern State on Sept. 1, 2005.

Luke Ferguson (Arkansas State, K/P, Jr.)

Junior punter and kicker Luke Ferguson scored a Sun Belt Conference-best 13 points and averaged 48.5 yards per punt in Arkansas State's 37-10 victory over No. 19 FCS-ranked Montana State. Handling place-kicking duties for the first time with the Red Wolves, Ferguson was a perfect 3-of-3 on his field goal attempts and made all four of his extra point tries. He was successful from 23, 29 and 41 yards out, helping A-State build a 16-10 lead before the Red Wolves pulled away in the fourth quarter. His three field goals not only tied the most in the Sun Belt Conference, they also tied the fourth most in the nation as of Saturday's games. Ferguson punted four times, and all four times pinned Montana State inside its own 20-yard line. His four punts inside the 20 were also a Sun Belt Conference high. His longest punt covered 61 yards, which was just two shy of his career long, and his 48.5 yards per attempt was just 0.5 yards shy of his career best.

2014 SUN BELT CONFERENCE PRESEASON POLL

UL Lafayette Picked as Unanimous Choice to Win Sun Belt

NEW ORLEANS – After tying for the regular season championship last year, UL Lafayette and Arkansas State have been picked to finish first and second in the 2014 Sun Belt Football Preseason Coaches' Poll.

UL Lafayette is picked to repeat as they garnered all 11 first place votes from Sun Belt head coaches and the maximum 121 points. Arkansas State will look to grab a share of their fourth straight Sun Belt title as they earned 102 points and second place in the poll. South Alabama was tabbed for a third place finish with 98 points after concluding last season with three straight wins to earn bowl eligibility in only their second year as a Sun Belt member.

Five time Sun Belt Champion, Troy finished fourth in the preseason poll with 84 points. The league's coaches predicted a fifth place finish for UL Monroe, edging out Texas State, 78-70. Football Bowl Subdivision newcomers Appalachian State and Georgia Southern took seventh and eighth in the poll. The two schools begin their first season as Sun Belt members after ranking first and third in NCAA FCS Championships with nine titles between them.

The poll is rounded out by Idaho (9), Georgia State (10), and New Mexico State (11). Idaho and New Mexico State will be making their return to the Sun Belt Conference as football only members having last played in the Sun Belt during the 2004 season.

Last season, seven of the eight Sun Belt teams reached six wins and bowl eligibility and the conference was undefeated in bowl games.

2014 SUN BELT CONFERENCE PRESEASON TEAM

UL Lafayette's Broadway, A-State's Lee Highlight Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Teams

NEW ORLEANS – UL Lafayette's Terrance Broadway and Arkansas State's Qushaun Lee helped lead their teams to Sun Belt Championships last season and expectations will be high for the two this season as they were respectively named the Sun Belt Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year. The announcement came along with the release of the Preseason All-Sun Belt teams on Monday.

Broadway, a senior quarterback from Baton Rouge, La. completed 62.4% of his passes for 2,419 yards and 19 touchdowns in 2013. He also added 442 yards and eight touchdowns rushing while leading UL Lafayette to a share of the conference championship. Broadway finished with a 153.3 efficiency which was the best mark in the Sun Belt. He ranked tenth in the nation in yards per completion (14.6), 18th in passing efficiency, 39th in completion percentage, 47th in passing touchdowns and 50th in total offense.

Lee is the 2014 preseason defensive player of the year after being named to the All-Sun Belt Conference First Team last season. The senior from Prattville, Ala. earned GoDaddy Bowl Defensive MVP as he recorded 15 tackles in Arkansas State's Bowl win. Lee led conference in tackles with 134, which was the sixth most tackles in conference history and most by an Arkansas State player since 1991. Lee also posted six tackles for loss, two forced fumbles, five quarterback hurries, three pass breakups and one interception.

Broadway headlined the first team offense along with four UL Lafayette teammates. Running backs Alonzo Harris and Elijah McGuire were both named to the team after earning All-Sun Belt first team honors last season. They were joined by offensive lineman Daniel Quave and wide receiver Jamal Robinson. Robinson was one of three receivers named to the first team along with J.D. McKissic (Arkansas State) and Rashon Ceaser (UL Monroe). Wes Saxton earned the spot as the first team tight end. Quave's fellow lineman on the Preseason All-Sun Belt first team are Terrence Jones (Troy), Mike Marboe (Idaho), Chris May (South Alabama), and Ucambre Williams (South Alabama).

Lee was one of four Arkansas State player named to the first team defense along with defensive lineman Chris Stone, and defensive backs Rocky Hayes and Sterling Young. UL Lafayette and Texas State each added three defenders to the preseason All-Sun Belt first team. The Ragin' Cajuns were represented by defensive lineman Justin Hamilton, linebacker Dominique Tovell, and defensive back Trevence Patt. Linebackers Michael Orakpo and David Mayo and defensive back Craig Mager were the Texas State honorees. Defensive linemen Tyler Roberts (Troy) and Gerrand Johnson (UL Monroe) round out the first team defense.

The special teams unit was led by Idaho punter Austin Rehkow who led the nation with a 47.8 average as well as breaking a record for a freshman punter. Texas State place kicker Jason Dann was the first team kicker after making nine of 10 field goals last season. In addition to being named a first team receiver, J.D. McKissic was tabbed as the first team Return Specialist. McKissic ranked third in the country in kickoff returns with 30.0 yards per game.

Sun Belt Undeclared in 2013 Bowl Games

The 2013 football season saw two teams take home bowl championship trophies, as UL Lafayette won its third consecutive R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl and Arkansas State won its second consecutive GoDaddy Bowl. The Red Wolves won their second consecutive GoDaddy Bowl by defeating Ball State 23-20. The previous season the Red Wolves defeated Kent State in the annual bowl game played in Mobile. The Red Wolves have made three consecutive appearances in the game, having lost to Northern Illinois in their first appearance. Sun Belt Bowl Games

The Sun Belt Conference maintains primary bowl tie-ins with the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, the GoDaddy Bowl and the Raycom Media Camellia Bowl. A team from the Sun Belt Conference has played in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl since its inception in 2001. The SBC has won five consecutive R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl games and seven out of the last eight. The GoDaddy bowl matches teams from the Sun Belt Conference and Mid-American Conference. Arkansas State has helped lead the Sun Belt to two consecutive wins in the GoDaddy Bowl. The Camellia Bowl will match-up the Sun Belt Conference against the Mid-American Conference beginning in December. The game will be played yearly at the Cramton Bowl in Montgomery, Ala.

Come 2015, the Cure Bowl will feature a team from the Sun Belt Conference against the American Athletic Conference. The game will be played yearly at the newly renovated Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Fla., the weekend before the Christmas holiday. The Cure Bowl is the first of its kind to combine the passions of college football with the goal of supporting breast cancer research.

The Sun Belt Conference will also be part of the rotation for the newly created Bahamas Bowl and Miami Beach Bowl.

With the 2014-15 year marking the debut of the College Football Playoff (CFP) the Sun Belt continues to find itself among the 10 premier college football conferences and the new system is guaranteed universal access based on performance – there are no automatic qualifiers for the play-off system. Additionally, the CFP will mean that a spot among the premier bowl games of college football will be guaranteed to the highest-ranked champion from the “Group of Five” conferences: the Sun Belt Conference, American Athletic Conference, Mountain West Conference, Mid-American Conference and Conference USA.

Mountaineer News & Notes

Appalachian State University football makes its NCAA Division I FBS home debut on Saturday when it hosts in-state foe Campbell. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. at Kidd Brewer Stadium. Appalachian State and Campbell are squaring off for the first time in 83 years. In the institutions' only previous matchup, Appalachian State Teachers College defeated Campbell Junior College, 20-6, on Sept. 19, 1931 in Boone.

Appalachian State (0-1) opened the 2014 campaign last Saturday with a 52-14 defeat at Michigan. The Mountaineers trailed 14-0 with four minutes to go in the first half but the Wolverines scored three touchdowns in a 3:11 span before halftime to break the game open.

A bright spot in the loss to Michigan was the play of redshirt freshman running back Terrence Upshaw. Upshaw had 109 rushing yards on just 18 carries (6.1-yard average) against the Wolverines to become the first Appalachian State player in 40 years to rush for 100 yards in his collegiate debut (Robbie Price was the last Mountaineer to accomplish the feat with 140 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries in his first varsity game against East Tennessee State on Sept. 7, 1974).

Appalachian State is 61-20-2 (.747) all-time in home openers. The Mountaineers have won 10 of their last 12 openers at Kidd Brewer Stadium but dropped last year's home lid-lifter to North Carolina A&T, 24-21.

Appalachian has won 33 of its last 34 home games against in-state opponents. Last season's home-opening loss to N.C. A&T snapped the Mountaineers' 32-game home winning streak against North Carolina opponents and was its first home defeat to an in-state foe since a 34-7 loss to Western Carolina on Oct. 6, 1984 at then-Conrad Stadium.

Members of the NCAA Division I FCS Pioneer Football League, Campbell reinstated its football program in 2008 after a 57-year hiatus from the gridiron. The Camels are 14-42 in seven seasons since reviving the program, including a 3-9 record last season. Campbell (0-1) opened the 2014 campaign in similar fashion to App State, trailing soon-to-be-FBS Charlotte just 6-3 at halftime before the 49ers scored three touchdowns in a 4:55 span midway through the third quarter en route to a 33-9 win over the Camels.

Eagle News & Notes

Georgia Southern (0-1) opens its 2014 campaign in a newly expanded Paulson Stadium against Savannah State on Saturday, September 6th with a 6 p.m. kickoff. The game will be available on ESPN3. Prior to the game, Georgia Southern will honor and recognize its six national championship teams and relocate the championship flags that have flown at the west side of the stadium to the east side. There's a lot that is new at Georgia Southern – a new head coach, coaching staff, new offensive scheme, new conference and new facilities. The addition of a new mid-deck and expansion of club seating in the North Stands, and new 50,000-square foot Football Operations Center with a 852-square foot HD video board and sound system at the east end has completely changed the look of the 30-year old-stadium.

A late score by N.C. State with 1:37 left in the game put the Wolfpack ahead 24-23 for the eventual final Saturday. Georgia Southern took a 17-3 halftime advantage with only Duke and Florida State holding N.C. State to a lower first-half total (0) in the Dave Doeren-era. The Eagles scored three times in the first half, beginning with a career first rushing touchdown for sophomore Matt Breida as his 61-yard score was the first in the ballgame.

Quarterback Kevin Ellison had a career day passing with 184 yards and a touchdown, going 9-for-16 against N.C. State, while adding 116 yards on the ground. It was Ellison's third career game with at least 100 yards rushing and 100 passing. The sophomore has the top averages in the Sun Belt Conference for passing yards per completion (20.4) and per attempt (11.5) and the Eagles' 19.20 yards per catch average is good for fourth among the nation's leaders in that category.

Junior placekicker Alex Hanks also had a career day, scoring 11 points by going 3-3 on field goals and adding two PATs. No returns were attempted on his six kickoffs. Senior wide receiver Zach Walker, who was Ellison's favorite target Saturday, had a career-best five receptions against the Wolfpack, three in the first half alone. That total which tied the high mark for an Eagle in both 2013 and 2012 and was the highest single-game total since Kentrellis Showers had five at North Dakota State in 2011.

The Eagles' leading tackler last season, senior linebacker Edwin Jackson posted a game-high and career-best 13 against N.C. State with six total tackles in the third quarter. It was his sixth game with double-digit tackles and his eighth career game as the top Eagles' defender.

Panther News & Notes

Georgia State's 38-37 victory over Abilene Christian is the Panthers' first win as an FBS program. Georgia State twice rallied from nine points down in the fourth quarter before winning on Wil Lutz's 26-yard field with 4 seconds left. Quarterback Nick Arbuckle engineered the winning drive after GSU took over on its own 19 with 2:41 to play.

Georgia State set a school record for total offense with 566 yards (413 passing, 153 rushing). The previous high was 514 yards vs. Campbell in 2012, the only other game in which the Panthers have topped 500 yards.

Georgia State won on a last-second field goal for the third time in its brief history. Both other games came in the Panthers' inaugural season of 2010.

Georgia State overcame a fourth-quarter deficit to win for the third time in school history.

In his first game in a Georgia State uniform, quarterback Nick Arbuckle tied the school record with four touchdown passes, joining Ronnie Bell, Kelton Hill and Drew Little (twice); Passed for 413 yards, one shy of the school record of 414 yards by Drew Little vs. Old Dominion in 2010; Set the Georgia State record with 438 yards of total offense; Converted two fourth downs on the game-winning drive, connecting with Joel Ruiz for 12 yards on 4th-and-5 from the GSU 24 and with LynQuez Blair for 24 yards on 4th-and-19 from the GSU 27; Covered the final 30 yards of the game-winning drive with his legs, rushing 13 yards to the ACU 26 and then 17 yards down to the ACU 9-yard line.

Also playing his first game for Georgia State, tight end Joel Ruiz: Tied the school record with two touchdown receptions, equalling Albert Wilson (seven times), Kelton Hill, Jordan Giles and Arthur Williams; Caught touchdowns of 34 yards and nine yards and added a 12-yard reception to convert on 4th-and-5 on the game-winning drive; Totalled seven receptions for 111 yards in his first game since November 2012 at Presbyterian

Senior wide receiver LynQuez Blair caught eight passes for 118 yards, including his first career touchdown. He totalled 16 receptions for 145 yards in his first three seasons.

Sophomore Robert Davis had a career-best eight receptions.

Junior linebacker Joseph Peterson recorded 11 tackles and his first career interception.

Senior linebacker Jarrell Robinson tied the school records with two sacks and four tackles for loss.

Vandal News & Notes

For the third time in school history, a game involving the Vandals was canceled on the day it was scheduled to be played. All three were for different reasons.

The first was Nov. 11, 1978 when one of the charter planes bringing Idaho State to Moscow developed mechanical problems. That game was canceled and the Vandals were awarded a forfeit victory. The second time was in 2001 when all college football was canceled the Saturday following the Sept. 11 terrorists attack on the World Trade Center. That game against Montana was rescheduled for the end of the season with the Vandals losing at Missoula in overtime.

Idaho's series with Louisiana-Monroe dates their the Division I-AA days when the Vandals played ULM - known at the time as Northwestern Louisiana, in a playoff game. Idaho won that first encounter 34-31. The series resumed with both as members of the Sun Belt Conference in 2001. During that four-year span, each team won twice - once at home and once on the road. Their last meeting was in 2004 with ULM prevailing 16-14.

Steven Matlock knows pretty much how Jordan Rose feels. Matlock was pressed into a starting role on the offensive line as a true freshman in 2013. Rose, a true freshman this year, was scheduled to start in the Vandals' opener at Florida. Sophomore Mason Woods, a Canadian and one of four foreign players on Idaho's roster, earned a starting role late last season and also was scheduled to start last Saturday. The others scheduled to start were senior center Mike Marboe (more about him below) and senior Nick Von Rotz, a junior college transfer who started all of 2013.

Ragin' Cajun News & Notes

The Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns opened their 113th season of football before the third-largest crowd in school history with a dominant 45-6 victory over in-state opponent Southern University on Saturday at Cajun Field.

Terrance Broadway threw for three touchdowns and ran for another as UL Lafayette (1-0) accumulated 512 yards of total offense and built a 24-0 lead at halftime. Jamal Robinson caught five passes for 112 yards and a pair of touchdowns while Elijah McGuire rushed for 129 yards on 13 carries with a touchdown.

The game, played before an announced crowd of 36,170, was the third-largest in school history behind the Cajuns' 2009 game against Southern (41,357) and 1996 victory over nationally-ranked Texas A&M (38,783).

UL Lafayette took a 10-0 lead after the first quarter when Hunter Stover kicked a 31-yard field goal with 6:12 remaining before McGuire capped off a six-play, 80-yard drive with an 8-yard touchdown.

Broadway, who completed 20 of 32 passes for 237 yards, hit a wide-open Robinson for a 32-yard TD strike in the second quarter before finding Jared Johnson for a 13-yard scoring pass and a 24-0 lead with 7:35 remaining in the half.

Broadway, who moved past former Cajun Brian Mitchell for fourth-place in pass completions, added a 7-yard scoring pass to Robinson in the third quarter before rushing for an 8-yard touchdown in the fourth.

Trae Johnson recorded eight tackles to lead the Ragin' Cajuns with Boris Anyama and Kevin Fouquier adding five stops each.

UL Lafayette will return to action on Saturday at 6 p.m. when it plays host to in-state opponent Louisiana Tech in a game that will be televised on ESPN3.

ULM will open up Sun Belt Conference play as it welcomes Idaho to JPS Field at Malone Stadium for a 6 p.m. contest on Saturday night... Idaho and ULM have played a total of five times on the gridiron with the Vandals leading the series, 3-2... Saturday's showdown will be the first meeting between the two schools since a 16-14 ULM win on Oct. 9, 2004 in Moscow, Idaho.

Idaho is one of four "new" members in the Sun Belt Conference season... Idaho and New Mexico State rejoined the league as football only members on July 1, 2014... Appalachian State and Georgia Southern are new to the league and they are full members of the Sun Belt Conference after making the jump from the FCS Level (Southern Conference).

On Saturday night, the Warhawks will look to go to 2-0 for the first time in the FBS-era (1994-pres.)... ULM defeated Wake Forest, 17-10, on Aug. 28 and a win over Idaho would be the first 2-0 start for ULM since 1993 (the program's last season at the 1-AA [FCS] level)... ULM nearly started the 2012 season 2-0 as the Warhawks defeated No. 8 Arkansas, 34-31, in the season opener, but fell in overtime, 31-28, at Auburn the following week.

Saturday's contest will mark the first time since the 1996 season that the Warhawks will open the season with back-to-back home games... In 1996, ULM hosted Nicholls State in the season opener (Aug. 29) and welcomed Minnesota to Monroe the following week (Sept. 7).

The Warhawks do not have to leave the state of Louisiana until the month of October when they travel to Arkansas State for an Oct. 4 contest in Jonesboro, Ark... ULM still has September home games against Idaho (Sept. 6) and Troy (Sept. 27) and a road tilt at LSU (Sept. 13).

Centarius Donald set a new career-high with 26 rushing attempts over the Demon Deacons... Donald accounted for eight first downs on the night and racked up 117 rushing yards (long of 39)... Donald was not the only Warhawk to rack up yards on the ground as Tyler Cain rushed 11 times for 46 yards (long of 16)... In all, ULM rushed 44 times for 163 yards in the win over Wake Forest.

Aggie News & Notes

The New Mexico State football team began the 2014 season with a nice win, defeating the Cal-Poly Mustangs, 28-10, in its home opener Thursday night.

The Aggies gained 315 total yards while allowing Cal-Poly 265 yards. Sophomore quarterback Tyler Rogers looked comfortable in the pocket during his first start, going 18-of-27 for 118 yards, two touch-down throws and one interception. The NM State ground attack also looked in midseason form as the Aggies almost rushed for 200 total yards, finishing with 197 yards on the ground.

Freshman Larry Rose III led the way for the NM State running back core, finishing with 150 yards on the ground on 30 carries during his first game as an Aggie. Rose III scored twice, once on the ground and another on a touchdown catch. Redshirt sophomore Teldrick Morgan led the receivers with six catches for 51 yards and a touchdown.

As impressive as the offense was, perhaps more dominating was the young NM State defense, especially in the second half. The Aggies shutout the Mustangs in the second half, making play after play, while only allowing a total of 27 yards in the final half. After allowing 236 rushing yards to the run-oriented Cal-Poly offense in the first half, NM State only allowed 23 rushing yards in the second half.

Freshman linebacker Derek Ibekwe led the defense with a total of 14 tackles and half a sack in the game. Fellow linebacker Rodney Butler also had double-digits tackles, 11, and also had a sack on the quarterback.

The Aggies will now head out on the road for the first time this season as they travel to Atlanta, Ga., to face their first Sun Belt Conference foe of the season, Georgia State. Game time is set for 1 p.m. (CT) on Saturday, Sept. 6, inside the Georgia Dome. It will be the first meeting between the Aggies and the Panthers.

Jaguar News & Notes

With the Jaguars off on the opening weekend of the season for the first time since making the transition to the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision, this marks the latest USA is beginning a campaign in the program's six-year history. ... The Jags open the year at Kent State, another first for the squad — USA has never started a season away from home. ... The Jaguars are 3-2 on opening day all-time, although they have dropped the last two on field goals by the opposition — Texas-San Antonio in 2013, Southern Utah a year ago — in the final seconds. ... USA went 1-2 in non-conference road games last season, winning their first of the fall at Tulane on Sept. 7 while dropping decisions at Tennessee and Navy. ... It will be the third match-up between the Jags and Kent State, with both winning on their home fields. The Golden Flashes held off a furious Jaguar rally in Kent on Sept. 24, 2011, scoring the first 33 points before claiming a 33-25 victory, while USA defeated KSU, 38-21, on Oct. 19 a year ago. ... This is the last scheduled contest for the Jags with a Mid-American Conference school until they begin a two-year, home-and-homer series with Bowling Green on Sept. 11, 2021. ... In last fall's win over the Golden Flashes, Jay Jones collected 99 yards and a score on the ground to help the Jaguars gain a season-best 257 rushing yards while Ross Metheny accounted for two scores — one rushing, one passing — and 245 yards of total offense. ... Kendall Houston also had his best day of the season against KSU, running for 43 yards on seven carries while supplying a pair of scores in the second half. Defensively, Maleki Harris posted a career-high 10 stops, including 1½ behind the line of scrimmage to pace USA in tackles for the second time on the year. ... The Jaguars return six of their 10 all-Sun Belt Conference selections from 2013, highlighted by first-team members TE Wes Saxton and OL Chris May. Three of the other four honorees coming back are also from the USA offensive unit, including Jones in the backfield, WR Shavarez Smith and OL Ucambre Williams. PK Aleem Sunanon is the other all-league representative returning for the Jags.

Bobcat News & Notes

Texas State will be looking to open a season with 2-0 record for the second straight year when the Bobcats play host to Navy on Sept. 13 at 7:00 p.m.

This marks the first time that the Bobcats open a season with two straight home games since 2007 when Texas State played host to Cal Poly and Abilene Christian in its first two games.

Texas State is in its second season as a member of the Sun Belt Conference and is playing an NCAA Division I FBS schedule for the third straight year.

The victory against Arkansas-Pine Bluff was Texas State's third straight victory in season openers. The Bobcats also beat Houston, 30-12, in 2012 and Southern Miss, 22-15, in 2013.

Texas State head coach Dennis Franchione improved to 20-8-1 in season openers during his career. Franchione also is 5-1 in season-openers at Texas State.

Texas State set a school single-game record and tied Troy for the fifth-highest total with 697 yards of total offense against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Texas State's 39 first downs against Arkansas-Pine Bluff also set a single-game school record and tied a Sun Belt Conference record. Idaho also had 39 first downs at Middle Tennessee in 2001.

The 42 points Texas State scored in the first half against UAPB was the most points in any half since scoring 49 points in the first half against New Mexico State in 2012.

Texas State's 697 yards marked the first time the Bobcats have put up 600+ yards under Dennis Franchione during his current tenure.

Texas State's 65 points were the most since scoring 66 in the season finale against New Mexico State in 2012. The 65 points also was the seventh-highest total by any Sun Belt Conference team in history.

Defensively, it marked the team's first shutout since 2005 when it shutout Southern Utah 34-0.
