LSU Hosts ULM in Second Game of a Four-Game Home Stand

LSU plays the second game of its four-game home stand on Saturday night, hosting in-state opponent ULM at 6:02 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on ESPNU with Clay Matvick (pxp), Anthony Becht (analyst), and Dawn Davenport (sideline) on the call. LSU climbed to No. 9 in the Amway Top 25 (coaches poll) and No. 10 in the AP Poll this week following its 56-0 win over Sam Houston State. The Tigers are 2-0 overall and have won 47 straight non-conference regular season games. LSU's also won 10 straight overall in Tiger Stadium and 41 in a row in Death Valley against non-conference opponents. ULM, members of the Sun Belt Conference, is 2-0 with its wins coming over Wake Forest (17-10) and Idaho (38-31). LSU is 2-0 all-time against the Warhawks with wins coming in 2003 (49-7) and 2010 (51-0). LSU goes into the ULM game having held opponents without a point on 19 consecutive possessions, a streak that spans 85 minutes and 17 seconds. LSU coach **Les Miles** is now 97-24 in 10 years with the Tigers. He's the second-winningest coach in school history, trailing only Charles McClendon (137 wins in 18 years). Offensively, LSU has scored on 13 of its 27 possessions this year (11 TDs, 2 FGs). The Tigers are averaging 42.0 points and 474.5 total yards (230 rushing, 244.5 passing) per game. QB **Anthony Jennings** is second in the SEC in pass efficiency, having completed 16-of-34 passes for 427 yards and 5 TDs. RB **Kenny Hilliard** leads the Tigers with 165 yards and 2 TDs, while WR **Travin Dural** leads the league in receiving TDs (4) and is second in yards (291). Defensively, LSU is allowing just 12.0 points and 262.0 total yards (159 rushing, 103 passing) per game. The Tigers have yet to allow a passing touchdown and they have limited opponents to just 17 completions on 52 attempts. DE **Danielle Hunter** leads the Tigers with 14 tackles, including 2.5 for losses, while DB **Dwayne Thomas** is second on team with 12 tackles. LSU has racked up seven sacks and four interceptions through the first two games of the season.

STORYLINES

- WR Travin Dural has more yards receiving through the first two games of a season (291) than any player in school history. He's averaging a staggering 48.5 yards per catch as four of his six receptions have gone for touchdowns.
- LSU's defense has gone 19 straight possessions without allowing a point. The streak dates back to Wisconsin's first possession of the second half in the season-opener.
- LSU QBs have combined to complete 20-of-39 passes for 489 yards and six TDs with no interceptions. LSU is averaging 24.5 yards per completion.
- LSU has played 16 true freshmen through the first two weeks of the season, which is the most true freshmen in a class to see action under Les Miles.
- Four true freshmen scored last week against Sam Houston State. LSU has scored 11 TDs this year and freshmen and sophomores have accounted for 9 of the 11.
- LSU currently has the nation's longest regular-season non-conference winning streak at 47 straight games. Les Miles is 37-0 in non-conference regular-season games as head coach of the Tigers.
- With the win over Wisconsin, LSU has won 22 games under Les Miles when trailing in the fourth quarter. Of those 22 wins, 15 have come against teams ranked in the Top 25.
- LSU is 33-3 in games played in September under Les Miles. LSU has won 23 straight September games in Tiger Stadium and the Tigers are 23-1 in September games at home under Miles. The only loss came to Tennessee in 2005. Other two September losses for Miles came at Auburn in 2006 and at Georgia last year.
- LSU hasn't lost a non-conference home game since 2000 when UAB beat the Tigers 13-10. Since then, LSU has reeled off 41 straight wins against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium.
- LSU coach Les Miles is 29-0 in Tiger Stadium against non-conference opponents and he's 42-2 overall against teams from outside the SEC since 2005.
- LSU will be playing its 69th straight game as a Top 25 team on Saturday vs. ULM, a streak that dates back to the season-opener in 2009. LSU has played 119 of 121 games under Les Miles ranked in the Top 25.
- LSU's streak of consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 is now at 84, the second-longest active streak in college football behind Alabama. It's also the longest stretch in school history.

Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • 10TH SEASON

It's called the "Miles Method" and it's the mission of LSU football program under 10th-year head coach Les Miles. The "Miles Method" lays the foundation for the organization and it calls for LSU to run the finest football program in the country, one where players can have an experience that's second to none and gives them every opportunity to compete for championships on the field, earn a degree and grow personally by giving back to the community.

In his 10th year, the "Miles Method" has proved to be a winning formula as the Tigers have won more games than any program in the Southeastern Conference over that span (97), while capturing a pair of SEC titles (2007, 2011), played in nine bowl games, including the BCS National Championship Game twice. LSU won the BCS title in 2007, a year after beating Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

Since Miles took over in 2005, LSU has registered five top 10 finishes with three coming in the top five, won double-figure games seven times, produced 20 first-team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. LSU also leads the SEC with 60 NFL Draft picks during that span, which includes 13 first round selections. LSU led the nation with nine NFL Draft picks in 2014, which tied the school record set in 2013.

Miles has climbed to second in school history in career victories with 97, trailing only Charles McClendon, who won 137 games in 18 years with the Tigers. Miles is also the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and

Alabama in same season - and he's done it now three times - and in 2005, he became the only first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's title game.

In the classroom, 188 football players have earned their degree since Miles took over, and two out of the last three years LSU has ranked No. 2 in the SEC in graduation rates, trailing only Vanderbilt. Under Miles, LSU has produced over 150 players who have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status.

LSU's community service presence is impactful as football players routinely donate time giving back to the Baton Rouge area through a variety of avenues, including appearances at schools, hospitals and many other charitable causes. It's through these community service ventures that Miles and his team get a better understanding of what it means to wear an LSU uniform and the impact that can be made on those who are less fortunate.

As Miles heads into his 10th season with the Tigers and coming off a recruiting class that was ranked No. 2 in the nation, the foundation for LSU football is stronger than ever. With wins coming at a record-setting pace, graduation rates among the best for any public university in the SEC, and with seven-straight recruiting classes rated among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of the premier programs in college football, setting a standard that has the rest of the nation chasing.

LSU Extends FBS Record for Consecutive Non-Conference Regular Season Wins to 47

LSU increased its Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) record for consecutive non-conference regular season wins to 47 after the Tigers defeated Sam Houston State, 56-0, in the home opener on Sept. 6. The streak dates back to the 2002 season and now includes eight wins over ranked opponents. The Tigers broke the FBS record for consecutive non-conference regular season wins in 2012, surpassing the mark of Kansas State who claimed 39 straight from 1993-2003. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular season game since falling at Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va., on Sept. 1. **Les Miles** has accounted for 37 of the 47 wins during the streak, and he is 37-0 all-time in non-conference regular season games in his tenure at LSU. Former coach Nick Saban accounted for the 10 other victories from 2002-04. Under Miles, the Tigers have outscored non-conference regular season opponents a combined 1,894-519. Here is a look at the top four in FBS all-time consecutive non-conference regular season wins:

LSU vs. The Sun Belt Conference

Saturday's game against ULM marks the 35th time that LSU will face a team from the Sun Belt Conference. LSU is 34-0 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt, which includes two wins over ULM (49-7 on Aug. 30, 2003 and 51-0 on Nov. 13, 2010). LSU holds a 22-0 record vs. Louisiana-Lafayette, 3-0 vs. Arkansas State, 2-0 vs. Idaho, Appalachian State, Troy and ULM, and 1-0 vs. New Mexico State. **Les Miles** is 8-0 all-time versus Sun Belt teams.

Tiger Stadium's New Look in 2014

Ranked annually as the top venue in college football, Tiger Stadium is in its 91st year dating back to 1924 when the stadium was built. It's also the 84th year of Saturday night football in Death Valley. LSU has put together an impressive 58-7 home record under **Les Miles**, which includes a 30-0 mark against non-conference foes. With a new capacity of 102,321 starting in 2014, Tiger Stadium ranks sixth nationally in total capacity. LSU owns a 399-144-18 (.727) all-time record in Tiger Stadium. Here are some of the key additions in the Tiger Stadium South End zone expansion:

- 320,000 total square feet
- 66 Premium suites
- 3,000 Club Seats
- Upper Concourse with 1,400 general public seats and space for standing room only patrons
- Two 40' X 70' HD video screens (with two new ribbon boards)
- Construction officially began Sept. 10, 2012, and the contract completion date was Aug. 22, 2014.

Odds and Ends After Two Games in 2014

- After recording two interceptions on defense versus Iowa in the Outback Bowl, against Wisconsin in the season opener and against Sam Houston State last week, LSU now has multiple INTs in three straight games for the second time under **Les Miles**. The previous time was the final four games of the 2010 season.
- LSU senior running back **Kenny Hilliard** scored on a two-point conversion against Sam Houston State, and freshman wide receiver **Trey Quinn** caught a two-point conversion against Wisconsin. It is the first time LSU has made 2-point conversions in consecutive games since 2007 (Arkansas, Tennessee).
- LSU's 58 rush attempts against Sam Houston State were the most by the Tigers since Sept. 25, 2004 when they rushed 58 times against Mississippi State. The last time the Tigers' rushed more than 58 times was Nov. 28, 1997 vs. Arkansas (62 rushes).
- Since 1960, LSU is 198-28-2 (.873) in Tiger Stadium when scoring first, including a 173-18-1 record at night. **Les Miles** is 67-4 at LSU when his team jumps ahead first.
- Four Tigers rushed for a touchdown against Sam Houston State. It's the first time four players scored a rushing TD in the same game since Nov. 19, 2011 at Ole Miss.

LSU Defense Stout Against the Pass; Ranks First Nationally in Pass Defense Efficiency

Through two games LSU has only allowed 206 passing yards, a total that ranks second in the Southeastern Conference and ninth nationally. What's more impressive is that the Tigers lead the nation in pass defense efficiency with a rating of 50.6. LSU opponents have only completed 17-of-52 passes and have thrown four interceptions.

Here are some notes on the defense after two games:

- LSU ranks second in the SEC and seventh nationally with four interceptions on defense.
- LSU's seven sacks against Sam Houston State are the most in a game since Nov. 3, 2007 at Alabama when the Tigers recorded seven. The last time LSU had more than seven sacks in a game was Nov. 19, 1994 when LSU had nine vs. Tulane.
- LSU's 56-0 victory against Sam Houston State was the first shutout since beating ULM 51-0 on Nov. 13, 2010.
- The shutout marked the 257th all-time (including eight ties) and the seventh under **Les Miles**.
- In the opener, LSU held Wisconsin to 8-for-24 passing for 50 yards, no touchdowns and two interceptions. It is the first time LSU allowed 50 or fewer passing yards since Nov. 19, 2011 when the Tigers limited Ole Miss to 47 passing yards, and it ranks as the second-fewest total allowed since Sept. 11, 1999 when North Texas only had 10 yards passing.
- LSU only allowed 2.1 yards per pass attempt (50 yards on 24 attempts) against the Badgers, and that figure ranks as the lowest allowed during the **Les Miles** era at LSU and third lowest by the Tigers dating back to 1992.

Travin Dural: Explosive Playmaker With the Most Receiving Yards Thru 2 Games in LSU History

Sophomore wide receiver **Travin Dural** has opened the 2014 season as one of the most explosive players in the country. Dural has caught six passes for 291 yards and four touchdowns this season for an average of 48.5 yards per reception. All 13 of his career catches, including the six in 2014, have resulted in a first down or touchdown.

- His 94-yard touchdown reception on the first play from scrimmage for LSU is a school record, breaking the previous long pass of 82 yards by Steve Ensminger to Carlos Carson in 1982 versus Georgia. The 94-yard TD pass tied LSU's longest offensive play from scrimmage as well as it matched a 94-yard rushing touchdown by Sal Nicolo at Rice on Oct. 4, 1952 and a 94-yard run by Jesse Fatheree at Georgia on Nov. 16, 1935.
- His 80-yard TD reception against Wisconsin in the opener ranks as the fourth-longest passing play in LSU history.
- He is only the second LSU player in history to score a touchdown on his first three receptions in a game. Dural caught three balls for three TDs against Sam Houston State. Carlos Carson had five catches for five TDs against Rice in 1977.
- He currently ranks first in the SEC and second nationally with four touchdown receptions, and he is second in the league and fourth nationally in receiving yards (291) and receiving yards per game (145.5).
- Dural became the first Tiger to go over 100 receiving yards in his first career start since Dwayne Bowe hauled in five catches for 103 yards and one touchdown in his first start against Oregon State on Sept. 4, 2004.
- His 291 receiving yards are the most through the first two games of a season by any player in LSU history.

Anthony Jennings Leads the Nation in Passing Yards Per Attempt and Completion

Sophomore quarterback **Anthony Jennings** has completed 16-of-34 passes for 427 yards and five touchdowns, and he has made the most of his throws. Jennings ranks first nationally in passing yards per completion at 26.7 and first nationally in passing yards per attempt at 12.6. This continues a trend started last season under LSU offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron**. In 2013, Zach Mettenberger ranked second nationally in both passing yards per completion (16.1) and passing yards per attempt (10.4).

Anthony Jennings Orchestrates a Second Fourth-Quarter Comeback in His Young Career

- Sophomore quarterback **Anthony Jennings**, making only his second career start, calmly led LSU to victory after facing an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit to Wisconsin in the opener. It's the second time in his young career that he has guided LSU to a comeback win in the game's last stanza.
- Jennings finished the game 9-for-21 passing for 239 yards and two touchdowns, and he was 2-for-3 passing for 63 yards, including a 36-yard TD pass to **John Diarse** in the fourth quarter.

LSU Streak of Consecutive Weeks In AP Top 25 Reaches 84 Straight

LSU's streak of consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 has reached 84, which ranks second to only Alabama in terms of current streaks. This marked the 14th consecutive season that the Tigers were ranked in the preseason polls as LSU came in at No. 13 in both the Associated Press and the Amway Coaches Top 25 polls. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and Amway Coaches' Poll 145 of the 148 weeks. The exception came during the final three polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 154 of 158 games ranked in the top 25, including 119 of 121 games under Miles. LSU has a 95-22 record in games played as a Top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 against Arkansas in the regular-season finale and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU finished the 2013 season ranked No. 14 in the AP and Coaches polls. It was the fifth straight season the Tigers finished the year ranked. LSU Is 43-2 In Non-Conference Games Under Les Miles

LSU brings a 43-2 record in non-conference games into the contest against ULM. LSU's only two non-conference losses under **Les Miles** came against Penn State in the Capital One Bowl to end the 2009 season and to Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31, 2012. Of the 43 wins under Miles against non-conference opponents, 13 have come against Top 25 teams, 35 have come by double-digits and LSU has scored 40 or more points in 26 of the 43 games.

LSU's 52-7 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 52-7 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 22-5 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. LSU defeated No. 14 Wisconsin, 28-24, and forced two Badgers' turnovers while only committing one. The only seven losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005. In Miles' tenure at LSU, the Tigers have a combined turnover margin of +62. LSU was +20 in 2011 and +16 in 2012.

Colby Delahoussaye Picks Up in 2014 Where He Left Off

Sophomore placekicker **Colby Delahoussaye**, a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award as a redshirt freshman in 2013, continued his outstanding accuracy to open the 2014 season. He nailed both field goal attempts in the opener against Wisconsin, a 30-yarder midway through the third quarter and a 47-yarder with 2:11 left in the third. For his career, he is now 15-of-16 in field goals, including a perfect 4-for-4 mark on attempts from 40-49 yards. Last year as a freshman, Delahoussaye shattered the LSU record for most consecutive field goals to start a career by converting his first nine attempts. The previous record was seven straight by David Browndyke in 1986.

The Aussie Punting Connection

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. Junior **Jamie Keehn** took over punting duties in 2013 and will retain the starting position this season. Keehn, a native of Queensland, is the second-oldest player on the LSU team after turning 25 on August 4. Only walk-on senior defensive back **Luke Boyd** is older at 27. Keehn did not play high school football and did not start punting until August 2011. Wing and Keehn did not know each other until both arrived at LSU. Keehn, a preseason third team All-SEC selection, is averaging 42.9 yards per punt and has placed eight of his 12 punts inside the 20-yard line through the first two games of the 2014 season.

LSU Has Scored 20 Special Teams TDs In Les Miles Era

LSU has recorded 20 special teams touchdown under **Les Miles**, including the most recent one when **Odell Beckham Jr.** became the first player in school history to return a missed field goal for a touchdown in 2013. Beckham caught a missed 59-yard field goal in the third quarter of the UAB game and raced a school-record 109 yards (statistically 100 yards) for the score. Under Miles, LSU has returned 11 punts for touchdowns, 3 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, 1 on a fake field goal and 1 on a

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 121 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 92-9 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 55-4. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 54-0. LSU is 41-4 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2014 roster, LSU has seven career 100-yard games to its credit. **Kenny Hilliard** has four, and **Terrence Magee** has three. Hilliard ran for 110 yards in LSU's 28-24 victory over Wisconsin in the opener. LSU's only four losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came vs. Clemson in 2012 (Jeremy Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards); Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Terrence Magee

A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior running back **Terrence Magee** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2014 season. Magee was presented the jersey by coach **Les Miles** following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp on Sunday, Aug. 3. Magee is LSU's leading returning rusher after running for 626 yards and eight touchdowns a year ago. Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

Les Miles Becomes Quickest LSU Coach To Reach 90 Wins

The following is a quick look at **Les Miles'** notable accomplishments during his nine-plus years and 121 games (97-24 record) as head coach of the Tigers:

- With the win over Mississippi State in 2013, Miles became the quickest LSU coach to reach 90 victories doing so in 112 games. It took Charles McClendon 124 games to reach that milestone.
- Also the fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), 70 wins (87 games), and 80 wins (98 games) in school history
- With 10 or more wins seven times at LSU, Miles joined Bear Bryant (13 at Alabama), Steve Spurrier (9 at Florida), Philip Fulmer (9 at Tennessee), Mark Richt (8 at Georgia) and Vince Dooley (7 at Georgia) as the only coaches in SEC history to have seven or more 10-win seasons at the same school.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011...Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it three times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year, doing it twice (2010, '11).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005).
- Has 15 wins over coaches who have won national titles.
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in four straight seasons - a first at the school - and to seven overall (the most at the school).
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007).

Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL Draft with 12. Alabama is the next closest with 11. The Tigers have produced a defensive back selection in seven of the last eight drafts. A total of 12 former LSU defensive backs are on current NFL rosters, including 11 of those who played for **Les Miles**.

LSU: The SEC's Winningest Team Since 2005

LSU is the winningest program in the SEC since the start of **Les Miles'** tenure as head coach in 2005 as the Tigers have posted a 97-24 mark during that span. The 97 victories for LSU are nine better than Florida, while the Tigers are also tops in final poll rankings. LSU is also second nationally in wins since 2005 behind only Boise State (102) and tied with Ohio State (97).

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 232-61-4 (.784) at night under the lights compared to a 32-25-3 (.558) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 88-12 (.879) overall at home, which includes a 66-6 (.915) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 22-6 (.786) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Defense Leads Tigers to 51-0 Homecoming Win Over ULM

The LSU defense scored two touchdowns and the Tigers pitched their first shutout of the year in a 51-0 homecoming victory over Louisiana-Monroe. The win extended LSU's regular season non-conference streak to a nation's best 33 straight and in the process improved LSU coach Les Miles' record in non-SEC games to 27-1. The game was never in doubt as the Tigers scored 13 points in the first quarter and led 23-0 at halftime. Ron Brooks scored all the points the Tigers would need, returning an interception 32 yards for a 7-0 LSU lead at the 7:05 mark in the first quarter. Josh Jasper kicked three first half field goals, including a career-long of 53 yards, to run his season total to 20. Patrick Peterson setup LSU's other first half TD, making an acrobatic interception at the LSU 3-yard line and returning it 85 yards to the ULM 12. Stevan Ridley scored on a 1-yard run five plays later for a 20-0 Tiger advantage. Ridley added a 7-yard run on LSU's first possession of the second half and then defensive end Lavar Edwards picked up a fumble and raced 29 yards for a score just 15 seconds later for a 37-0 LSU advantage. Freshmen Spencer Ware and Michael Ford closed our the scoring with TD runs. For the game, LSU held the Warhawks to just 191 total yards, including just 67 passing yards, and the Tigers forced five turnovers. Ridley led the Tigers with 67 rushing yards and a pair of TDs, while Richard Murphy added 44 yards on five carries. LSU quarterbacks Jordan Jefferson and Jarret Lee combined to complete 8-of-22 passes for 95 yards.

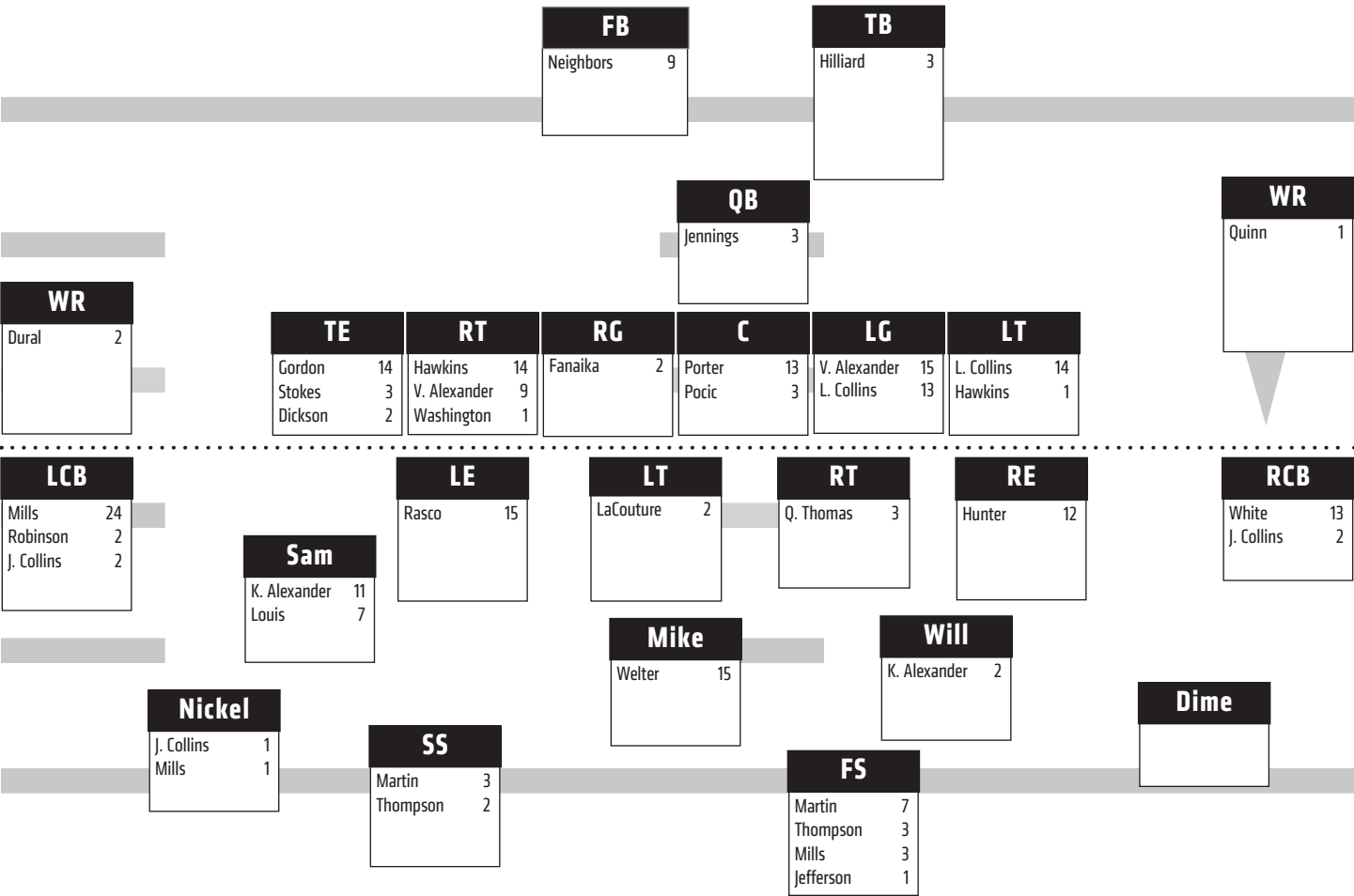

Hilliard Along with Fake Punt Helps LSU Rally Past No. 14 Wisconsin, 28-24

Kenny Hilliard, with his powerful running, helped ignite a second-half rally that helped 13th-ranked LSU erase a 24-7 deficit as the Tigers posted one of the biggest comebacks in school history in the 28-24 win over 14th-ranked Wisconsin in the Advocare Texas Kickoff in Houston. Hilliard rushed for 110 yards and scored the game-winning touchdown on a 28-yard run in the fourth quarter. Wisconsin led 17-7 at halftime and then stretched the lead to 24-7 on the opening possession of the third quarter. The Badgers appeared to have the game in hand, stuffing LSU on its first possession of the second half, forcing the Tigers punt. Instead, LSU faked the punt and extended the drive that ultimately led to a 30-yard field goal **Colby Delahoussaye**, pulling the Tigers to within 24-10. The fake punt served as a momentum boost for LSU as from that point on the LSU defense held Wisconsin to only 32 total yards and forced two turnovers on the Badgers' final five possessions of the game. Meanwhile, the LSU offense got on track, scoring on four straight possessions to erase the 17-point deficit. Another Delahoussaye field goal pulled LSU to within 24-13 late in the third quarter before **Anthony Jennings** connected with **John Diarse** on a 36-yard TD and, along with a two-point conversion, got the Tigers within a field goal at 24-21. LSU took the lead for good on its next possession after a **Jalen Mills** interception set up the Tigers at their own 47-yard line. Hilliard ran for 17, 8 and then 28 yards on three straight plays to score the go-ahead TD with 9:41 to go in the contest. A **Ronald Martin** interception ended Wisconsin's next drive and then the Tigers forced the Badgers to a three-and-out on their final possession of the game, allowing LSU to run out the clock. Jennings connected on 9-of-21 passes for 239 yards and a pair of TDs in his second career start. **Travin Dural** led all receivers with three catches for 151 yards, including an 80-yard TD in the first quarter. LB **Kwon Alexander** (8 tackles, 2 TFL) and DE **Danielle Hunter** (7 tackles, 1.0 TFL) led the LSU defense as the Tigers won their 12th straight season opener and won a non-conference regular-season contest for the 46th consecutive time dating back to the 2002 season.

Big Plays Help LSU To 56-0 Win Over Sam Houston State

Travin Dural scored three touchdowns, including a school-record 94-yard reception on the first offensive play of the game for LSU as the 12th-ranked Tigers pitched their first shutout since 2010 with a 56-0 win over Sam Houston State. LSU had little trouble with the Bearkats, limiting Sam Houston State to just 14 first downs and 206 total yards of offense. Sam Houston State came into the game averaging over 600 yards and 43 points a game. LSU scored touchdowns on its first five possessions of the game, building a 35-0 lead at halftime. Dural scored on a 28-yard TD reception from **Anthony Jennings** on LSU's second possession, then freshman **Leonard Fournette** scored his first career TD on a 4-yard run to give the Tigers a 20-0 first quarter advantage. Dural's third TD reception came early in the second quarter on an 18-yard pass from Jennings, running the score to 27-0. Rookie quarterback **Brandon Harris** scampered 46 yards for a TD midway through the second quarter to extend the advantage to 35-0. Four true freshmen scored TDs for LSU as **Darrel Williams** and **Malachi Dupre** each found the endzone in the second half. For the game, LSU racked up 584 total yards of offense with 334 yards coming on the ground. Fournette led LSU with 92 yards and a TD on 13 carries, while Williams added 65 yards and a score, and **Kenny Hilliard** had 55 yards and a touchdown. Jennings connected on 7-of-13 passes for 188 yards and 3 TDs, while Harris came off the bench to complete 4-of-5 passes for 62 yards and a score. Dural led LSU with three catches for 140 yard and three TDs. **Danielle Hunter**, **Kendell Beckwith** and **Dwayne Thomas** all had seven tackles for the Tiger defense, while **Rickey Jefferson** and Thomas each intercepted passes as LSU ran its home winning streak to 10 straight. Nine of Sam Houston's 14 possessions ended with a punt and three were stopped with a turnover, including the Jefferson interception that halted a drive at the LSU 5-yard line.
