FIRST AND TEN

• After its first bye week of the 2014 season, the Warhawks will return to the friendly confines of JPS Field at Malone Stadium as it hosts the Troy Trojans at 6 p.m. on Saturday night

• ULM has won three straight games against Troy and four of the last five... Last season, ULM defeated Troy on Halloween night in Troy, Ala., 49-37... Despite winning four of the last five in the series, the Warhawks still trail 6-8-1 in the all-time series; however, in games that have been played in Monroe, ULM leads, 4-2, including three straight wins.

• In last season's meeting, Centarius Donald rushed 22 times for 114 yards and one score while former QB Kolton Browning completed 21 passes for 354 yards and five touchdowns and zero interceptions... Eight different receivers caught a pass and the wide receiver corps was highlighted by Ajalen Holley (4 rec., 74 yds, 2 TDs) and Rashon Ceaser (3 rec., 105 yds, 1 TD)... On the defensive side of the ball, Mitch Lane and Braxton Moore each recovered a Trojan fumble.

• In the preseason Sun Belt Conference coaches' poll, the Trojans were picked just ahead of the Warhawks... Troy was tabbed fourth with 84 points, while ULM was picked fifth with 78 points.

• ULM's home game against Troy is the third home game of the season and the 2014 season marks the third time of the FBS-era (1994-pres.) that the Warhawks have had three home games during its first four games to start a season.... In 1996, ULM hosted Nicholls State, Minnesota and Sam Houston State [road game at UCLA]... In 2001, ULM hosted Sam Houston State, Middle Tennessee and New Mexico State [road game at No. 2 Florida].

• In the Warhawks last outing, ULM traveled to Baton Rouge, La. where it battled No. 10/9 LSU... The Tigers claimed a 31-0 victory at Tiger Stadium... The contest at LSU was the first of three games against teams from the SEC this season... ULM will also travel to Kentucky (Oct. 11) and Texas A&M (Nov. 1).

• ULM's non-conference schedule in 2014 is comprised completely of teams from Power Five conferences... ULM opened the season with Wake Forest (ACC) and made its first road trip of the season to LSU (SEC) on Sept. 13... The Warhawks have two more SEC teams on the docket in 2014 (Kentucky & Texas A&M)... The only other FBS program in the country to have a non-conference schedule full of teams from Power Five conferences is Massachusetts (Boston College [neutral], Colorado [neutral], at Vanderbilt, at Penn State).

• The ULM defense extended its streak to 29 straight games with a turnover as Mitch Lane intercepted LSU's Anthony Jennings with 42 seconds to play in the second quarter... ULM's streak is the longest in the nation.

• Mitch Lane's interception at LSU was the second pick of the season for the junior and the fifth of his career... He also finished with a game-high and career-high 14 tackles.

• Ray Stovall and David Elias, Jr., also set career-highs in tackles at LSU with 10 and three, respectively... Hunter Kissinger recorded his fifth career sack in the road contest in Baton Rouge.

• Rashon Ceaser hauled in a season-high six catches in ULM's road game at LSU... Ceaser also returned a pair of punts in the contest.

• True freshman Kaylon Watson has appeared in all three games for the Warhawks this season... Watson returned one kickoff for 20 yards at LSU.

• Justin Manton currently ranks fourth in program history in scoring... Manton for his career has 186 points (18 FGs, 132 PATs) and is just 13 points shy of passing WR Stepfret Williams who had 198 points (33 rec. TDs) from 1992-95... With 14 more points, Manton would become the third player to tally 200 or more points in a career.

PRACTICE / INTERVIEWS

Media wishing to cover a ULM practice / game must contact assistant athletics director for media relations Alex Edwards. Please contact the media relations office at least 24 hours in advance of a practice and at least 48 hours in advance for a home contest.

ULM coaches and players will be available following practice during the first half of game week. Coaches and players will not be available for interviews from Thursday until the conclusion of that week's game (Game weeks featuring a Thursday night game will not allow interviews beginning Wednesday).

Video and photography (by media) are allowed for the first 30 minutes of practice -- practice will then be closed until the conclusion of that day's practice (Thursday practices and Friday walk-thrus are always closed). Social media updates on player injuries are not allowed during practice.

#ULMvsTroySeries

ULM and Troy will meet for the 16th time Saturday night... The Trojans lead the all-time series, 8-6-1, but the Warhawks have won the last three meetings and four of the last five... ULM's three-game winning streak is the longest in the series for the Warhawks, while Troy's longest streak was four games.... During ULM's recent three-game win streak in the series, the Warhawks are averaging 38.3 points per game and 471 yards of total offense per contest.

#ScoutingTheTrojans

Troy will open the conference portion of its schedule on Saturday night as it travels to Monroe for a 6:04 p.m. contest at ULM... The Trojans concluded their non-conference schedule last Saturday with a road contest at Georgia... Troy opened the season against UAB, followed by home contests against Duke and Abilene Christian.

Four different players have netted rushing TDs this season with quarterback Brandon Silvers leading the way with three rushing scores... Jordan Chunn has two rushing TDs, followed by Brandon Burks and Khary Franklin with one each... Burks is the team's leading rusher at 110 yards on 30 carries.

Brandon Silvers and Dontrel Pruitt have split the majority of snaps as the Trojans' quarterback this season... Silvers is 48-of-72 for 509 yards with one TD and zero interceptions... Pruitt is 32-of-57 for 374 yards with one interception.

Brandon Burks is also the team's leading receiver in receptions (15) and is second in receiving yards (133)... Chandler Worthy is the squad's leader in receiving yards (184) and ranks second in receptions (14).

On defense, Montres Kitchens leads the team in total tackles with 32 and he has one interception (28-yard return)... Femi Obadibo is the only other Trojan to have intercepted a pass this season and he leads Troy with two picks.

Ryan Kay is a perfect 8-for-8 on PATs this year and he is 2-of-4 on field goals this season, with a long of 47... Kay also handles punting duties and has 26 punts for 39.8 yards... Jed Solomon handles kickoff duties for Troy and he has kicked off 12 times with a 62.9 average and seven touchbacks.

#LookingForNumberTwo

With a win over Troy on Saturday night, the Warhawks would improve to 2-0 in the Sun Belt Conference... Should the Warhawks move to 2-0 in league play it would mark the second time in three seasons that ULM started a conference season with back-to-back wins... The Warhawks won their first four conference games of the 2012 season and entered the month of November with an overall record of 6-2 and a 4-0 SBC mark.

#2013Rewind

TROY, Ala. -- ULM endured a late rally by Troy, but Kolton Browning spun out of a sack and found Tre' Perrier for a 29-yard touchdown with 3:01 remaining to seal the 49-37 victory on Thursday evening at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

Browning tied his career high for both passing touchdowns and total touchdowns, racking up five through the air and another on the ground. The senior finished 21-of-31 for 354 yards with the five scores. Browning has now thrown nine touchdowns with no interceptions in his two games since returning from injury.

Perrier and Ajalen Holley each hauled in a pair of touchdown catches on the night, while Rashon Ceaser added the final reception; Perrier's touchdowns also doubled as his first career receptions. Ceaser finished with four catches for 105 yards, Holley had four for 74 yards, Perrier's pair went for 52 yards and Kenzee Jackson made a game-high six catches for 47 yards.

Centarius Donald had his second consecutive 100-yard game, going for 114 yards on 22 carries with his power running style. The junior also picked up a three-yard score in the first quarter.

WACO, Texas-- For the sixth year in a row, college football coaches nationwide will join together in support of the Coach To Cure MD program, which will be held during games of Saturday, September 27, 2014. More than 60 of those games will recognize a local Duchenne family on the field before or during the game.

Last year, more than 10,000 college coaches at more than 600 different institutions participated in Coach To Cure MD events. Both those figures are higher than in any of the program's first six years (2008-13). The five-year fundraising total is just over \$1 million.

#RunRunRun

In the season opener Centarius Donald set a new career-high as he carried the ball 26 times and finished with 117 rushing yards (long of 39)... Donald also moved the chains of total eight times during the 17-10 over the Demon Deacons (Aug. 28)... Donald wasn't the only one to carry the load for the Warhawk run game as Tyler Cain registered 11 carries for 46 yards including a long of 16... In all the Warhawk offense rushed for 163 yards on 44 carries in the season opening win... Donald again went over the 100-yard plateau as he recorded 111 rushing yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns in the win over Idaho on Sept. 6.

#ClimbingTheCharts

Senior Justin Manton connected on his 17th career field goal in the third quarter to put ULM on the board in the season opener against Wake Forest (Aug. 28)... His 30-yard field goal closed the deficit to 10-3 with 4:50 to play in the quarter... Manton added two extra points in the win over the Demon Deacons to give him five points on the night.

In the conference opener against Idaho (Sept. 6), Manton was successful on all five PATs and he connected on one of his two field goal attempts in the 38-31 win over the Vandals... With his eight points in the Sun Belt opener, Manton now has 184 career points and he is now fourth in program-history.

#SBCOffensivePOW

Ajalen Holley shattered his previous career high of 74 receiving yards as he caught three passes (one touchdown) for 114 yards in the opening quarter of Saturday's 38-31 win over Idaho... Holley went on to finish the game with 175 receiving yards on just six grabs (29.1 ypc)... His 175 receiving yards are the most in the Sun Belt this season and he is the first SBC wide receiver to tally 100+ receiving yards against a FBS opponent...

Holley caught two passes on ULM's first scoring drive including a 54-yard pass from Pete Thomas that set up the first score for the Warhawks... Less than three minutes later, Holley beat the Idaho secondary and hauled in a 58-yard TD reception to put ULM ahead 14-7... Late in the fourth quarter, Holley caught a 20-yard pass from Thomas giving the sophomore four receptions of 20 or more yards on the night.

#DominatingD

The ULM defense limited Wake Forest to just 94 yards of total offense -- 97 through the air and -3 on the ground... The Warhawk defense also stood tall and allowed the Demon Deacons to run just six of their 49 plays (12.2%) on the ULM side of the 50 -- all six of those plays came on the same drive and it led to a Wake Forest field goal late in the first half... The attacking Warhawk defense also tallied eight tackles, including six sacks, and one pick six... Redshirt-Freshman Jacob Tyson led the way with two sacks (the first of his career)... Mitch Lane also came up big for the Warhawks as his 31-yard interception return for a score evened the game at 10-10 with 4:02 to play in the 3rd quarter... The interception by Lane pushed ULM's forced turnover streak to 27 straight games, a mark that ranks second nationally.

#FacingWakeForestAgain

Pete Thomas made his Warhawk debut against Wake Forest... The transfer from North Carolina State lined up under center against Wake Forest for the second consecutive season... Thomas completed 23 passes for 189 yards and rushed four times for 15 yards... Thomas' nine-yard run up the middle put ULM ahead 17-10 with 3:37 to play and the Warhawks went on to claim the contest by the same margin.

#ThomasTheEngineer

Pete Thomas engineered a 12-play, 66-yard touchdown drive over a span of 5:47 to put ULM ahead 17-10 in the home opener against Wake Forest... It was Thomas' run of nine yards that capped the drive and put the Warhawks ahead by seven... The game-winning drive by Thomas was the fifth of his collegiate career... Thomas was at it again in the Sun Belt opener against Idaho... He led ULM on a six-play, 73 yard drive lasting 62 seconds that resulted in a one-yard Centarius Donald TD run with nine seconds to play.

#NewTurfNewName

Thanks to a generous donation of \$450,000, the largest single gift in ULM athletics history, the Warhawk football team is playing on brand new turf during the 2014 season... The donation from JPS Aviation/JPS Equipment Rental covered the cost of the new FieldTurf Revolution and for the donation, the name of the field will now be JPS Field at Malone Stadium... The length of the naming rights was set at a minimum of eight years... The new FieldTurf stretches wall-to-wall and totals 78,000 square feet... It is the same playing surface the Warhawks played on at Wake Forest in 2013 and other notable FBS schools that have the FieldTurf Revolution are: Louisville, Michigan, Nebraska, Ohio State, Ole Miss, Oregon, Texas, Texas Tech and Wisconsin... There are also 23 NFL football teams that have the FieldTurf Revolution.

#DeepInTheHeartOfTexas

Among FBS programs that reside outside of the state of Texas, the Warhawks, with 33 players from Texas, rank third nationally... Oklahoma State leads the way with 69 players from Texas, followed by Oklahoma with 42... The list was compiled by Gavin Lang, Asst. AD / Media Relations at Oklahoma State.

#ForcingTurnovers

Mitch Lane recorded his second interception of the season in the road contest at LSU... Lane's interception pushed the defense's streak to 29 straight games with at least one forced turnover... Missouri had a streak of 47 straight that ended against Iowa State (Sept. 20), giving ULM the lead.

#ComprehensiveKickers

ULM senior Justin Manton is responsible for all three phases of the team's kicking duties as he handles kickoffs, punts and FGs/PATs... Manton is just one of four NCAA FBS players that handles all of the team's kicking duties... Joining Manton on the list are: Daniel Carlson (RS-Fr., Auburn), Austin Rehkow (So., Idaho), Tyler Wedel (Sr., Northern Illinois) and Matt Wogan (So., Oregon).

#PowerFive

ULM has defeated at least one power five team in each of the last three seasons... The Warhawks stunned No. 8 Arkansas, 34-31 in overtime, to start the 2012 season... In 2013, the Warhawks traveled to Winston-Salem, N.C., and claimed a 21-19 win over Wake Forest... To kick-off the 2014 campaign, the Warhawks again took down Wake Forest, this time by a score of 17-10 in Monroe... ULM's streak of three straight seasons is tied for the longest active streak as fellow non-power five member Colorado State has also won at least one game vs. a power five team in each of the last three seasons (Colorado, 2012; Washington State, 2013; Colorado, 2014)... Navy's streak stands at two and the Midshipmen have two more games against Power Five programs remaining (Rutgers and Notre Dame)... Navy defeated Indiana in 2012 and claimed wins over Indiana and Pittsburgh in 2013.

#SBCDefensivePOW

Mitch Lane was honored as the Sun Belt Conference's Defensive Player of the Week thanks to his strong play in the season opener against Wake Forest... Lane finished the game with six total tackles (four solo, two assist) and one interception... Lane's fourth interception of his career came with just over four minutes to play in the third quarter and he was able to return the interception 31 yards for a touchdown to even the contest at 10-all... The junior's pick six was highlighted on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 and it came in at the number three spot... Lane's pick six was also the first interception returned for a score of the FBS season.

#PickSix

Each season there is always a first "something" of the season and for ULM junior Mitch Lane he is the first FBS player to record an interception for a touchdown... His 31-yard return with 4:02 to play in the third quarter against Wake Forest on Aug. 28, even the contest at 10-all... Lane's interception was the fourth of his career and his first career score... Lane's interception earned him a spot on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 and his #PickSix claimed the No. 3 spot... The interception also extended the ULM's forced turnover streak to 27 straight games.

#FirstSince2007

When ULM and Wake Forest battled on Thurs., Aug. 28 on ESPN2, it marked the first time ULM opened the season at home since 2007 when the Warhawks hosted Tulsa (Aug. 30; ESPN2)... Since moving up to the FBS ranks to start the 1994 season, the Warhawks have had eight season openers take place at home and ULM is 6-3 in those games... During the Todd Berry era, the Warhawks are 4-1 in their first game at home with the only loss coming to Baylor (L, 42-27; Sept. 21, 2012)... ULM set a new single-game attendance record as 31,175 fans made their way through the gates to watch the Warhawks and the Bears battle.

#KB15

Former ULM quarterback Kolton Browning (2010-13) broke nearly every major passing and total offense category in the ULM record book during his four years in Monroe... The Mabank, Texas, native also did something that just five other FBS quarterbacks have accomplished -- Throw for 10,000+ yards and rush for 1,500+ yards in a career... Below is a breakdown of the six FBS quarterbacks to accomplish that feat:

#DroughtEnds

In the final non-conference game of 2013, ULM punt returner Rashon Ceaser became the first Warhawk since the 2001 season to return a punt for a touchdown... In the third quarter against Tulane, Ceaser recorded a career-long return of 88 yards as he made his way through the Tulane defense to put ULM on the board... Ceaser is the first Warhawk to record a punt return for a touchdown since Mikkal Henry returned a punt 53 yards for a score against Troy on Nov. 10, 2001... Ceaser finished the night with three punt returns for 97 yards... He also caught four passes for 45 yards... Ceaser's 88-yard return is the fifth longest punt return in SBC history.

#CareerBoot

ULM punter Justin Manton recorded a career-long 77-yard punt in ULM's road contest at Baylor... His booming third-quarter punt is tied for the second longest punt in ULM history... He is tied with John Kelly who had a 77-yard punt at McNeese State on Oct. 13, 1962... Chick Childress holds the ULM record with an 88-yard punt (at Western Kentucky, 1952).

Manton also recorded a 69-yard punt in the fourth-quarter at Baylor, which places him in a tie for eighth in program history... In all, Manton punted nine times for 479 yards (53.2 avg) with five punts of 50 or more yards, three touchbacks, one inside the 20... He also kicked off twice for 130 yards (65.0 avg) and two touchbacks.

Manton was named one of College Football Performance Awards' Honorable Mention Punters of the Week (Sept. 23), Louisiana Sports Writers Association Special Teams Player of the Week (Sept. 23) and Warhawk of the Week (Sept. 24).

#PutEmOnTheBoard

Since the Warhawks joined the Sun Belt Conference to begin the 2001 season, the club has scored in 147 of its 156 games (dating back to Sept. 1, 2001 vs. Sam Houston State)... ULM was shutout in the 2008 season opener at No. 10 Auburn, snapping a streak of 32 consecutive games of re-cording at least one score... A 59-0 loss at Ole Miss later that season marked the first time that ULM had been shutout multiple times in the same season since 2000 (Memphis; Middle Tennessee; Central Florida)... The squad was shutout in its road tilt at LSU (Sept. 13, 2014) and it snapped a streak of 13 straight games with a score.

#RareFeat

Against Texas State (Oct. 12, 2013), Isaiah Newsome became just the fourth player in NCAA FBS history to return two interceptions for touchdowns (both of 70 or more yards) in a single game... Newsome returned his first interception of the game 71 yards to give the Warhawks a 7-0 lead with 6:09 to play in the first quarter... In the third quarter, Newsome returned his second interception 75 yards for a touchdown to push ULM's lead to 14-0 with 11:07 to play in the quarter... Below is a breakdown of NCAA FBS players to record two interceptions for TDs (both of 70 or more yards):

Newsome became just the second player in ULM history to record two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game (Karlton Washington; vs. Northwestern State; Sept. 25, 1999)... He is also just the second player in Sun Belt history to accomplish the feat (Tony Lukins [New Mexico State]; at Tulsa; Oct. 6, 2001).

He finished the game with 146 interception return yards which are the most in ULM and Sun Belt Conference history... In the ULM record books, he passed Karlton Washington who had 142 interception return yards against Northwestern State on Sept. 25, 1999... In the Sun Belt record books, he surpassed Darin Davis (Middle Tennessee) who had 101 interception return yards against Florida Atlantic on Nov. 27, 2010... He also set new ULM and Sun Belt records in return average (min. 2 interceptions) with 73.0 yards per return. His 75 yard interception return is the sixth longest in school history (scoring or non-scoring), while his 71 yard return ranks seventh.

Aside from his #5CTop10 highlight (No. 5), Newsome earned 11 other honors for the week: Beyond Sports Network Defensive Player of the Week, Capital One Impact Performance of the Week Nominee, CFPA National Defensive Back of the Week, CFPA National Defensive Performer of the Week, College Sports Madness Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week, FWAA / Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week, Jim Thorpe Defensive Back of the Week, Louisiana Sports Writer's Association Defensive Player of the Week, Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and Warhawk of the Week.

#TwoYearsRunning

For the second season in a row, the ULM defense recorded two scores as Isaiah Newsome returned two interceptions for scores in the Warhawks' 21-14 win at Texas State on Oct. 12... Newsome returned his first interception of the game 71 yards to give the Warhawks a 7-0 lead with 6:09 to play in the first quarter... In the third quarter, Newsome returned his second interception 75 yards for a touchdown to push ULM's lead to 14-0 with 11:07 to play in the quarter.

In the 2012, the Warhawk defense found the endzone on two different occasions in a 63-10 win at Tulane (Sept. 29)... The two defensive scores marked the first time ULM had two or more touchdowns on the defensive side of the ball since the 1999 season... In 1999, ULM intercepted Northwestern State QB Brad Spangler three times and returned all three for touchdowns as ULM claimed a 38-7 win (Sept. 25).

In the first quarter at Tulane, R.J. Young returned a D.J. Ponder interception 49 yards to the Tulane six-yard line before fumbling into the endzone where it was recovered by Ray Stovall... Young was credited with 55 return yards on the play... The second defensive score of the game came in the third quarter when Darius Lively snagged Ponder's pass attempt out of the air and returned it six yards for a score.

MONROE, La. — Tied 10-10 with 3:27 left in the fourth quarter, Pete Thomas ran in a nine-yard go-ahead touchdown to lift the ULM football program to a 17-10 victory over Wake Forest on a muggy Thursday night at JPS Field in Malone Stadium. The defense came through for the Warhawks in the first game of the season as they garnered 49 tackles, seven sacks, eight tackles for loss totaling 57 yards, one interception, four pass break-ups and seven quarterback hurries.

POSTGAME NOTES

- ULM Captains: WR Rashon Ceaser (Offense), LB Ray Stovall (Defense) and SP Justin Manton (Special Teams)
- Thursday's game against Wake Forest marked the first time since 2007 that ULM opened the season at home... The Warhawks hosted Tulsa on Aug. 30, 2007 in a nationally-televised contest (ESPN2).
- ULM forced a turnover in the third quarter (interception of John Wolford)... With the turnover, the Warhawks have now forced a turnover in 27 straight games (third longest active streak in the country).
- Centarius Donald set a new career-high with 26 carries... He also went over the 100-yard mark with 117 rushing yards.
- The ULM defense limited Wake Forest to 94 total yards... The last time the Warhawks' defense limited an opponent to fewer than 100 yards was on Sept. 1, 2005 when Northwestern8 State tallied 63 total yards of offense... The defense held Wake Forest to -3 yards rushing and it is the first time since 2012 (-9, Sept. 29 at Tulane) that the Warhawks allowed 0 or fewer rushing yards.

Quarterback Pete Thomas completed 16 of 30 passes, with Rashon Ceaser catching six of those passes.
