FIRST AND TEN

• ULM will step out of conference for the final time this season as it travels to College Station, Texas this weekend for a road tilt at Texas A&M... Saturday's contest between the Warhawks and the Aggies will be the third meeting all-time... Texas A&M leads the all-time series 2-0.

• When ULM lines up against Texas A&M this weekend it will be the squad's third game against an SEC team this season... ULM and SEC member Florida have the same number of road SEC games this season (three).

• ULM will also be facing its fourth Power Five teams as it battles Texas A&M at Kyle Field on Oct. 25... ULM has also lined up against Wake Forest (ACC), LSU (SEC) and Kentucky (SEC)... The Warhawks are one of two FBS teams to have a non-conference schedule comprised completely of Power Five teams (UMass is the other).

• Following the Nov. 1 game at Texas A&M, the Warhawks will close the season with four straight Sun Belt games as they face Appalachian State (Boone, N.C.; Nov. 8), UL-Lafayette (Monroe, La.; Nov. 15), New Mexico State (Las Cruces, N.M.; Nov. 22) and Georgia Southern (Statesboro, Ga.; Nov. 29).

• ULM dropped its first home game of the season last Saturday night as Texas State claimed a 22-18 win at JPS Field at Malone Stadium... With the loss, the Warhawks fell to 3-4 overall and 2-2 in the Sun Belt Conference.

• ULM QB Pete Thomas was 22-for-36 for 236 yards with one interception against the Bobcats... He also rushed for 29 yards in the Sun Belt tilt against Texas State.

• Centarius Donald lead the ground attack as he finished with 21 carries for 86 yards and one touchdown against Texas State

• Ajalen Holley finished the Oct. 25 contest with game-highs in both receiving yards (89) and receptions (eight).

• For the second consecutive game, Tyler Cain racked up 169 all-purpose yards (career-best)... Against the Bobcats, Cain registered 66 kickoff return yards, 64 receiving yards and 39 rushing yards.

• The Warhawk defense saw its active streak of forcing at least one turnover come to an end as ULM failed to force a turnover against the Bobcats... The Warhawks' active streak had reached 32 straight games and was the longest active streak entering last week's games.

• Michael Johnson and Gerrard Johnson tied for the team-high with eight total tackles against Texas State... Michael Johnson also recorded a safety on his sack of Bobcat QB Tyler Jones in the endzone in the third quarter.

• Lorenzo Jackson finished Saturday's game against Texas State with career-highs in both tackles (six) and sacks (1.5)... Jackson assisted on a tackle for loss as the junior finished with two tackles for loss.

• In all, the Warhawk defense tallied nine tackles for loss (30 yards) and five sacks (26 yards)... With the five sacks against the Bobcats, ULM now has 26 sacks on the season and the defense needs just two more sacks to set a Sun Belt era (2001-pres.) high for a season... The 2009 squad, with 27 sacks, recorded the most sacks in a season during ULM's Sun Belt era.

• Justin Manton drilled a career-long 51-yard field goal in the opening quarter of the Texas State game... Manton's 51-yarder is also the longest field goal made by a Warhawk during the Sun Belt era (2001-pres.).

• Justin Manton finished the Texas State contest with three field goals (51, 43, 28) as he matched his career-high (three, vs. Troy, Sept. 27, 2014)... The 43-yarder in the second quarter marked the first time in his career that he hit two field goals of 40 or more yards in the same game.

• With his 10 total points against the Bobcats (three field goals, one PAT) he increased his career scoring total to 210 points and needs just 23 points to move into second place in ULM history in scoring... With two PATs at Kentucky on Oct. 11, he broke a tie for third between himself and WR Stepfret Williams (1992-95).

The event will be streamed live via ULMWarhawks.com and the press conference will be posted later in the afternoon. Specific player requests must be made by 12 p.m. on Monday.

PRACTICE / INTERVIEWS

Media wishing to cover a ULM practice / game must contact assistant athletics director for media relations Alex Edwards. Please contact the media relations office at least 24 hours in advance of a practice and at least 48 hours in advance for a home contest.

ULM coaches and players will be available following practice during the first half of game week. Coaches and players will not be available for interviews from Thursday until the conclusion of that week's game (Game weeks featuring a Thursday night game will not allow interviews beginning Wednesday).

Video and photography (by media) are allowed for the first 30 minutes of practice -- practice will then be closed until the conclusion of that day's practice (Thursday practices and Friday walk-thrus are always closed). Social media updates on player injuries are not allowed during practice.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS (HOME GAMES)

Coaches and players will be available following a NCAA mandated cooling off period. ULM postgame interviews will take place in the Scogin Room at Malone Stadium. Visiting team interviews will take place outside the visiting team locker room (accessed via ramp near the south endzone).

#ULMvsTexasA&MSeries

ULM and Texas A&M will meet for the third time on the gridiron on Saturday morning... The Aggies have claimed both prior meetings as they won 31-17 in College Station on Sept. 21, 1985 and 54-14 on Sept. 15, 2007... Texas A&M held a ranking of No. 18 in the 2007 meeting... This week they are receiving votes in the coaches' poll and are unranked in the AP poll.

#ScoutingTheAggies

Texas A&M had its first bye week of the season last week... The Aggies played eight straight games, including four games against ranked foes, before its week off... Texas A&M opened the season with a 5-0 mark and a 2-0 mark in SEC play, but the Aggies have dropped their last three games (at No. 12 Mississippi State, L, 31-48; No. 3 Ole Miss, L, 20-35; at No. 7 Alabama, L, 0-59).

QB Kenny Hill is averaging 331.1 yards per game through the air as he has amassed 2,649 passing yards through eight games with 23 touchdowns and eight interceptions... He has also rushed for 156 yards on the season (52 attempts, 19.5 avg)... Trey Williams and Tra Carson rank first and second on the team in rushing... Williams leads the team in both rushing yards (313) and touchdowns (five), while Carson sits second with 279 yards and four touchdowns... Five different wide receivers have tallied 300 or more receiving yards this season... Josh Reynolds leads the Aggies in both receiving yards (518) and touchdown receptions (eight).

On defense, Deshaun Everett leads the team in both solo tackles (32) and total tackles (53)... He is also one of two Aggies to have recorded an interception this season (Armani Watts is the other)... Myles Garrett leads the team in both tackles for loss (9.0) and sacks (7.5)... As a unit, the defense has tallied 44 tackles for loss (161 yards) and 23 sacks (113 yards)... In addition to their two interceptions, the Aggies have recovered four fumbles this season.

Josh Lambo has attempted eight field goals on the year (seven makes) with a long of 50... His only miss of the season was a 40 yard attempt against Arkansas... He is also 40-of-40 on PATs and leads the team with 61 total points.

#2007Rewind

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (Sept. 15, 2007) -- No. 18 Texas A&M used a consistent offensive attack and forced key turnovers in a 54-14 victory over visiting ULM Saturday evening in front of 77,309 fans at Kyle Field.

ULM (0-3) running back Calvin Dawson extended his consecutive game streak with at least 100 yards rushing to eight with 126 yards on the ground. He moved into third place on the both the career rushing list with 2,361 yards and the career rushing touchdown list with 22. Dawson also caught five passes for a career-high 42 yards; he finished with 168 all-purpose yards.

Texas A&M (3-0) quarterback Stephen McGee finished the game 19-of-33 for 237 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Mike Goodson led the ground attack rushing for 113 yards on 11 carries and a touchdown. Jorvorskie Lane ran for just 34 yards, but had two touchdowns.

The L Club and the Alumni Association presented the induction ceremony at the ULM Conference Center in the library. The 2014 class brings total membership to more than 130 individuals, along with the entire 1987 national championship football team. Hall of Fame plaques are displayed in the entryway of Fant-Ewing Coliseum.

2014 L Club Hall of Fame Inductee capsules:

STEPFRET WILLIAMS (1992-95)

Holds career records in receiving yards (3,177) and touchdown receptions (33). Named first team all-conference in 1993 (Southland), 1994 (1-A Independent) and 1995 (1-A Independent)... The Minden, La., product finished his four-year career with 16 100-yard receiving games, including six during the 1994 season... Tallied 264 receiving yards against Nevada in 1995, a record that still stands... Also holds five other spots in the top-50 all-time receiving games... Third-round draft pick of the Dallas Cowboys in 1995.

ROGER MANN (1965-68)

Won eight Gulf States Conference titles including three in the 120-yard hurdles, three as a member of the 400m relay team, one in the 330-yard hurdles and one in the 400m hurdles... Three-time NAIA All-American... Set the GSC record in the 120-yard hurdles at 13.7 seconds and the 400m relay at 40.3 seconds... Placed second in the NAIA National College Championships in the 120-yard hurdles and tied for the fifth-fastest time in the world in the 120-yard hurdles at 13.4 seconds... Holds the school record in the 330-yard hurdles at 36.6 seconds... Competed in the 1968 Olympic trials... Named co-captain his senior year... His team finished second in the Gulf States Conference all three years he was there... Coached by the legendary Bob Groseclose

MIKE GRANTHAM (1981-84)

Versatile four-year letter winner for the football program played offensive line at both the guard and tackle... Named First-Team All-American by the Associated Press in 1983 and 1984... Also earned First-Team All-Southland Conference and All-Louisiana honors as a senior in 1984... Teams he played for posted a combined win total of 28 games... The 1982 team, in its first season in the Southland Conference, finished in second place and the 1983 squad claimed a share of the SLC crown with a 5-1 league mark.

#50Plus

ULM senior specialist Justin Manton drilled a 51-yard field goal in the opening quarter of the Texas State game on Oct. 25... Not only was it a career-long for Manton, but it was the first 50-plus yard field goal made by ULM since it joined the Sun Belt Conference (2001-pres.)... His 51-yard FG is the longest in the Sun Belt this season.

In the second quarter, Manton hit a 43-yard field goal and it marked the first time in his career that he made two field goals of 40 or more yards in the same contest... Manton added a 28-yard field goal in the third quarter as he tied career-highs in both makes (three) and attempts (three)... Manton was also 3-for-3 on field goals in the 22-20 win over Troy on Sept. 27, 2014.

#SunBeltEraFirst

After 30 minutes of play in Jonesboro, Ark. on Oct. 4, ULM and Arkansas State were locked in a scoreless battle... With neither team putting any points on the board in the opening half, it marked the first time in ULM's Sun Belt era (2001-pres.) that it was involved in a game (conference or non-conference) that was tied 0-0 at intermission.

ULM's shutout of Arkansas State in the first 30 minutes was the first time that the Warhawk defense held a team off the scoreboard in the opening half since it held Florida Atlantic scoreless for the first 30 minutes on Dec. 3, 2011.

#GameWinningFieldGoal

Senior Justin Manton connected on a 29-yard field goal with 2:08 to play in the 22-20 win over Troy... Manton finished the game with career highs in both field goal makes (three) as well as attempts (three)... He also hit one extra point to give him 10 points on the night... Manton's big night concluded with the 29-yard winner and it marked the first time since the 2004 season that the Warhawks recorded a game-winning field goal... In the 2004 finale against UL-Lafayette (Nov. 20), Ragan Walters connected on a 37-yard field goal with seven seconds remaining to give the Warhawks a 13-10 win over the Ragin' Cajuns.

#AirtOut

ULM quarterback Pete Thomas completed 28 passes for 328 yards and two touchdowns in the win over Troy... Thomas finished the game against the Trojans with five passes of 20 or more yards, including a 64-yard pitch-and-catch with Ajalen Holley that put ULM ahead 10-0 with 5:54 to play in the opening quarter... Holley tied his career high with two receiving scores... Rashon Ceaser also got in on the action against Troy as the junior finished the game with a career-best 12 receptions and a season-high 121 yards.

#TrojanTrouble

Sophomore Ajalen Holley has enjoyed playing against Troy during the first half of his ULM career as he has tallied 183 receiving yards on just nine catches (20.3 ypc) and four touchdowns in two career games against the Trojans.

In the 49-37 win at Troy on Oct. 31, 2013, Holley finished the game with four grabs for 74 yards and two scores, including, a then-career-long TD reception of 60 yards, that gave ULM a 7-0 lead... In the 2014 meeting against Troy (Sept. 27), Holley caught five passes for 109 yards and two touchdown receptions... His career-long reception of 64 yards gave ULM a 10-0 lead with just under six minutes to play in the opening quarter.

#ClimbingTheCharts

Senior Justin Manton connected on his 17th career field goal in the third quarter to put ULM on the board in the season opener against Wake Forest (Aug. 28)... His 30-yard field goal closed the deficit to 10-3 with 4:50 to play in the quarter... Manton added two extra points in the win over the Demon Deacons to give him five points on the night.

In the conference opener against Idaho (Sept. 6), Manton was successful on all five PATs and he connected on one of his two field goal attempts in the 38-31 win over the Vandals... Against Troy, Manton was responsible for 10 points, including the game-winning field goal with 2:08 to play in the 22-20 win over Troy... With his two PATs at Kentucky, Manton broke a tie for third place (Stepfret Williams, 198, 1992-95) as he became the third player in ULM history to tally 200 or more points in a career.

Manton, like he did against Troy, registered 10 total points against Texas State on Oct. 25... Manton hit field goals of 51-yards, 43-yards and 28-yards and connected on one extra point against the Bobcats... With five games remaining in the regular season, he is just 23 points shy of moving into sole possession of second place.

#SBCSpecialTeamsPOW

Justin Manton was named the conference's Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 29... Manton tallied 10 total points including the game-winning field goal with 2:08 to play as ULM defeated Troy, 22-20, Saturday night... Manton was 3-for-3 on field goals against the Trojans (37, 34, 29)... His three attempts and makes were both career-highs and it was his first multi FG game since Sept. 7, 2013 (Grambling State)... Manton who handles all kicking duties also punted six times (48.3 avg.) with a long of 56 and kicked off six times (64.0 avg) with three touchbacks... Of his six punts, three landed inside the 10, all of which were downed (two yard line, seven yard line, one yard line).

#RunRunRun

In the season opener Centarius Donald set a new career-high as he carried the ball 26 times and finished with 117 rushing yards (long of 39)... Donald also moved the chains of total eight times during the 17-10 over the Demon Deacons (Aug. 28)... Donald wasn't the only one to carry the load for the Warhawk run game as Tyler Cain registered 11 carries for 46 yards including a long of 16... In all the Warhawk offense rushed for 163 yards on 44 carries in the season opening win... Donald again went over the 100-yard plateau as he recorded 111 rushing yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns in the win over Idaho on Sept. 6.

#SBCOffensivePOW

Ajalen Holley was named the SBC's Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 8... Holley shattered his previous career high of 74 receiving yards as he caught three passes (one touchdown) for 114 yards in the opening quarter of the 38-31 win over Idaho... Holley went on to finish the game with 175 receiving yards on just six grabs (29.1 ypc)... His 175 receiving yards are the most in the Sun Belt this season and he is the first SBC wide receiver to tally 100+ receiving yards against a FBS opponent... Holley caught two passes on ULM's first scoring drive including a 54-yard pass from Pete Thomas that set up the first score for the Warhawks... Less than three minutes later, Holley beat the Idaho secondary and hauled in a 58-yard TD reception to put ULM ahead 14-7... Late in the fourth quarter, Holley caught a 20-yard pass from Thomas giving the sophomore four receptions of 20 or more yards on the night.

#DominatingD

The ULM defense limited Wake Forest to just 94 yards of total offense -- 97 through the air and -3 on the ground... The Warhawk defense also stood tall and allowed the Demon Deacons to run just six of their 49 plays (12.2%) on the ULM side of the 50 -- all six of those plays came on the same drive and it led to a Wake Forest field goal late in the first half... The attacking Warhawk defense also tallied eight tackles, including six sacks, and one pick six... Redshirt-Freshman Jacob Tyson led the way with two sacks (the first of his career)... Mitch Lane also came up big for the Warhawks as his 31-yard interception return for a score evened the game at 10-10 with 4:02 to play in the 3rd quarter.

#FacingWakeForestAgain

Pete Thomas made his Warhawk debut against Wake Forest... The transfer from North Carolina State lined up under center against Wake Forest for the second consecutive season... Thomas completed 23 passes for 189 yards and rushed four times for 15 yards... Thomas' nine-yard run up the middle put ULM ahead 17-10 with 3:37 to play and the Warhawks went on to claim the contest by the same margin.

#ThomasTheEngineer

Pete Thomas engineered a 12-play, 66-yard touchdown drive over a span of 5:47 to put ULM ahead 17-10 in the home opener against Wake Forest... It was Thomas' run of nine yards that capped the drive and put the Warhawks ahead by seven... The game-winning drive by Thomas was the fifth of his collegiate career... Thomas was at it again in the Sun Belt opener against Idaho... He led ULM on a six-play, 73 yard drive lasting 62 seconds that resulted in a one-yard Centarius Donald TD run with nine seconds to play... Thomas added his third game-winning drive of the season as he guided the Warhawks on a 13-play, 57-yard drive that resulted in a 29-yard game-winning field goal with 2:08 to play as ULM claimed a 22-20 win over Troy on Homecoming.

#NewTurfNewName

Thanks to a generous donation of \$450,000, the largest single gift in ULM athletics history, the Warhawk football team is playing on brand new turf during the 2014 season... The donation from JPS Aviation/JPS Equipment Rental covered the cost of the new FieldTurf Revolution and for the donation, the name of the field will now be JPS Field at Malone Stadium... The length of the naming rights was set at a minimum of eight years... The new FieldTurf stretches wall-to-wall and totals 78,000 square feet... It is the same playing surface the Warhawks played on at Wake Forest in 2013 and other notable FBS schools that have the FieldTurf Revolution are: Louisville, Michigan, Nebraska, Ohio State, Ole Miss, Oregon, Texas, Texas Tech and Wisconsin... There are also 23 NFL football teams that have the FieldTurf Revolution.

#DeepInTheHeartOfTexas

Among FBS programs that reside outside of the state of Texas, the Warhawks, with 33 players from Texas, rank third nationally... Oklahoma State leads the way with 69 players from Texas, followed by Oklahoma with 42... The list was compiled by Gavin Lang, Asst. AD / Media Relations at Oklahoma State.

#ComprehensiveKickers

ULM senior Justin Manton is responsible for all three phases of the team's kicking duties as he handles kickoffs, punts and FGs/PATs... Manton is just one of six NCAA FBS players that handles all of the team's kicking duties... Joining Manton on the list are: Daniel Carlson (RS-Fr., Auburn), Luke Ferguson (Arkansas State), Austin Rehkow (So., Idaho), Tyler Wedel (Sr., Northern Illinois) and Matt Wogan (So., Oregon).

#PowerFive

start the 2012 season... In 2013, the Warhawks traveled to Winston-Salem, N.C., and claimed a 21-19 win over Wake Forest... To kick-off the 2014 campaign, the Warhawks again took down Wake Forest, this time by a score of 17-10 in Monroe... ULM's streak of three straight seasons is tied for the second longest active streak as fellow non-power five members Colorado State and Northern Illinois have also won at least one game vs. a power five team in each of the last three seasons... BYU leads the way with nine straight seasons of at least one win over a Power Five team... Navy's streak stands at two and the Midshipmen have one more game against a Power Five program remaining (Notre Dame)... East Carolina owns a streak of two straight years (2013 and 2014).

#SBCDefensivePOW

Mitch Lane was honored as the Sun Belt Conference's Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 1) thanks to his strong play in the season opener against Wake Forest... Lane finished the game with six total tackles (four solo, two assist) and one interception... Lane's fourth interception of his career came with just over four minutes to play in the third quarter and he was able to return the interception 31 yards for a touchdown to even the contest at 10-all... The junior's pick six was highlighted on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 and it came in at the number three spot... Lane's pick six was also the first interception returned for a score of the FBS season.

#PickSix

Each season there is always a first "something" of the season and for ULM junior Mitch Lane he is the first FBS player to record an interception for a touchdown... His 31-yard return with 4:02 to play in the third quarter against Wake Forest on Aug. 28, even the contest at 10-all... Lane's interception was the fourth of his career and his first career score... Lane's interception earned him a spot on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 and his #PickSix claimed the No. 3 spot... The interception also extended the ULM's forced turnover streak to 27 straight games.

#FirstSince2007

When ULM and Wake Forest battled on Thurs., Aug. 28 on ESPNU, it marked the first time ULM opened the season at home since 2007 when the Warhawks hosted Tulsa (Aug. 30; ESPN2)... Since moving up to the FBS ranks to start the 1994 season, the Warhawks have had eight season openers take place at home and ULM is 6-3 in those games... During the Todd Berry era, the Warhawks are 4-1 in their first game at home with the only loss coming to Baylor (L, 42-27; Sept. 21, 2012)... ULM set a new single-game attendance record as 31,175 fans made their way through the gates to watch the Warhawks and the Bears battle.

#KB15

Former ULM quarterback Kolton Browning (2010-13) broke nearly every major passing and total offense category in the ULM record book during his four years in Monroe... The Mabank, Texas, native also did something that just five other FBS quarterbacks have accomplished -- Throw for 10,000+ yards and rush for 1,500+ yards in a career... Below is a breakdown of the six FBS quarterbacks to accomplish that feat:

#DroughtEnds

In the final non-conference game of 2013, ULM punt returner Rashon Ceaser became the first Warhawk since the 2001 season to return a punt for a touchdown... In the third quarter against Tulane, Ceaser recorded a career-long return of 88 yards as he made his way through the Tulane defense to put ULM on the board... Ceaser is the first Warhawk to record a punt return for a touchdown since Mikkal Henry returned a punt 53 yards for a score against Troy on Nov. 10, 2001... Ceaser finished the night with three punt returns for 97 yards... He also caught four passes for 45 yards... Ceaser's 88-yard return is the fifth longest punt return in SBC history.

#CareerBoot

ULM punter Justin Manton recorded a career-long 77-yard punt in ULM's road contest at Baylor... His booming third-quarter punt is tied for the second longest punt in ULM history... He is tied with John Kelly who had a 77-yard punt at McNeese State on Oct. 13, 1962... Chick Childress holds the ULM record with an 88-yard punt (at Western Kentucky, 1952).

Manton also recorded a 69-yard punt in the fourth-quarter at Baylor, which places him in a tie for eighth in program history... In all, Manton punted nine times for 479 yards (53.2 avg) with five punts of 50 or more yards, three touchbacks, one inside the 20... He also kicked off twice for 130 yards (65.0 avg) and two touchbacks.

Manton was named one of College Football Performance Awards' Honorable Mention Punters of the Week (Sept. 23), Louisiana Sports Writers Association Special Teams Player of the Week (Sept. 23) and Warhawk of the Week (Sept. 24).

2001 vs. Sam Houston State)... ULM was shutout in the 2008 season opener at No. 10 Auburn, snapping a streak of 32 consecutive games of recording at least one score... A 59-0 loss at Ole Miss later that season marked the first time that ULM had been shutout multiple times in the same season since 2000 (Memphis; Middle Tennessee; Central Florida)... The squad was shutout in its road tilt at LSU (Sept. 13, 2014) and it snapped a streak of 13 straight games with a score.

#RareFeat

Against Texas State (Oct. 12, 2013), Isaiah Newsome became just the fourth player in NCAA FBS history to return two interceptions for touchdowns (both of 70 or more yards) in a single game... Newsome returned his first interception of the game 71 yards to give the Warhawks a 7-0 lead with 6:09 to play in the first quarter... In the third quarter, Newsome returned his second interception 75 yards for a touchdown to push ULM's lead to 14-0 with 11:07 to play in the quarter... Newsome became just the second player in ULM history to record two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game (Karlton Washington; vs. Northwestern State; Sept. 25, 1999)... He is also just the second player in Sun Belt history to accomplish the feat (Tony Lukins [New Mexico State]; at Tulsa; Oct. 6, 2001).

He finished the game with 146 interception return yards which are the most in ULM and Sun Belt Conference history... In the ULM record books, he passed Karlton Washington who had 142 interception return yards against Northwestern State on Sept. 25, 1999... In the Sun Belt record books, he surpassed Darin Davis (Middle Tennessee) who had 101 interception return yards against Florida Atlantic on Nov. 27, 2010... He also set new ULM and Sun Belt records in return average (min. 2 interceptions) with 73.0 yards per return. His 75 yard interception return is the sixth longest in school history (scoring or non-scoring), while his 71 yard return ranks seventh.

Aside from his #SCTop10 highlight (No. 5), Newsome earned 11 other honors for the week: Beyond Sports Network Defensive Player of the Week, Capital One Impact Performance of the Week Nominee, CFPA National Defensive Back of the Week, CFPA National Defensive Performer of the Week, College Sports Madness Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week, FWAA / Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week, Jim Thorpe Defensive Back of the Week, Louisiana Sports Writer's Association Defensive Player of the Week, Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and Warhawk of the Week.

#TwoYearsRunning

For the second season in a row, the ULM defense recorded two scores as Isaiah Newsome returned two interceptions for scores in the Warhawks' 21-14 win at Texas State on Oct. 12, 2013... Newsome returned his first interception of the game 71 yards to give the Warhawks a 7-0 lead with 6:09 to play in the first quarter... In the third quarter, Newsome returned his second interception 75 yards for a touchdown to push ULM's lead to 14-0 with 11:07 to play in the quarter.

In the 2012, the Warhawk defense found the endzone on two different occasions in a 63-10 win at Tulane (Sept. 29)... The two defensive scores marked the first time ULM had two or more touchdowns on the defensive side of the ball since the 1999 season... In 1999, ULM intercepted Northwestern State QB Brad Spangler three times and returned all three for touchdowns as ULM claimed a 38-7 win (Sept. 25).

In the first quarter at Tulane, R.J. Young returned a D.J. Ponder interception 49 yards to the Tulane six-yard line before fumbling into the endzone where it was recovered by Ray Stovall... Young was credited with 55 return yards on the play... The second defensive score of the game came in the third quarter when Darius Lively snagged Ponder's pass attempt out of the air and returned it six yards for a score.

- Justin Manton recorded a career-long 51-yard FG in the opening quarter to give the Warhawks a 3-0 lead with 8:37 to play in the first quarter... Manton's 51-yard FG is the longest for the Warhawks since joining the Sun Belt to start the 2001 season.
