QUICK HITS

Twenty-two Eagles will be playing their final home game at Allen E. Paulson Stadium on Saturday... The Eagles are 25-4 in designated "Senior" games and have won the last five straight... With Appalachian State dealing UL Lafayette a loss last Saturday, Georgia Southern is guaranteed a share of the 2014 Sun Belt Conference Championship... Of those schools that began their first year of FBS play with a conference affiliation, Georgia Southern became only the third to win a league title in its inaugural season, joining Nevada (1992) and Marshall (1997)... For Coach Willie Fritz, it is his first conference title in his first year at any school... Two other coaches, Paul Johnson (1997) and Mike Sewak (2002) won conference titles in their first seasons as the head coach at Georgia Southern... With eight wins, the Eagles have recorded the most wins by a Sun Belt Conference team in its inaugural season in the league... Georgia Southern also owns the best-ever start in league play by a team in its first year of membership with a 7-0 mark... Only two other teams have posted better records in their first year in FBS with Marshall (1997) going 10-3 and Florida Atlantic with a 9-3 mark in 2004... In games following an open week, Georgia Southern is 25-10 while Coach Fritz is 11-4 in games following a bye week, including an October 25 win at Georgia State (open week Oct. 18)... The Eagles play their first game at Paulson Stadium in nearly a month with the last home game a win vs. Troy on October 30th... The last time the Eagles played a game on November 29th was in 1997, a home NCAA FCS playoff win over Florida A&M (52-37).

THE COACHES

Georgia Southern Head Coach Willie Fritz began his 22nd year as a head coach in 2014 and has led Georgia Southern Football team into a successful first year as an FBS program. With a perfect 7-0 record in the Sun Belt Conference going into Saturday's final game, the Eagles are guaranteed at least a share of the league championship. The Shawnee Mission, Kansas, native has developed winning programs and cultivated success at each of his head coaching stops. He won two national championships at Blinn College, guided Central Missouri to 11 winning seasons and led Sam Houston State to back-to-back national championship appearances. He was selected as the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year at the FCS level in 2012 and was recognized nationally in 2011 as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coach of the Year. His 97-47 mark in 13 seasons as the Mules' head coach ranked Fritz as the winningest coach in the program's 118-year history where he was the only coach to ever win seven or more games in eight consecutive seasons.

Todd Berry, a 30-year coaching veteran, is in his fifth year as head coach of the ULM Warhawks. He posted the eighth-best record in Illinois State history during his four-year tenure leading the Cardinals. His Illinois State team made back-to-back appearances in the NCAA FCS playoffs and his 1999 team posted an 11-2 record before falling to Georgia Southern, the eventual national champion, in the semifinals at Allen E. Paulson Stadium that season. He became the 32nd head coach at Army in 2000 then the offensive coordinator for the Warhawks for the 2004 and 2005 seasons. A year at Miami as the quarterbacks coach led to a position as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at UNLV before he returned in 2010 as ULM's head coach.

SERIES RECORD VS. ULM

The Warhawks and Eagles meet for the fifth time with the series record tied at 2-2. Each team has won their games at home with ULM upsetting the then-top-ranked Eagles 21-13 at Malone Stadium in 1991. The two teams met in back-to-back years in 1987 and 1988 and 1990 and 1991 with Georgia Southern winning two-straight in the series with wins at Paulson Stadium in 1988 and 1990.

ULM Coach Todd Berry has made one previous visit to Paulson Stadium, in 1999, when he served as the head coach of Illinois State. The Eagles took a 28-17 victory in the NCAA semifinal playoff game over Berry's third-ranked Cardinals en route to a national championship.

BIG HONOR FOR BREIDA - NAMED A DOAK WALKER AWARD SEMIFINALIST

The PwC SMU Athletic Forum Board of Directors announced last week that it had included Georgia Southern's Matt Breida on its list of 10 semifinalists for the 2014 Doak Walker Award. Breida, one of only two sophomores on the list, joins Ameer Abdullah (Sr.), Nebraska; Jay Ajayi (Jr.), Boise State; Javorius Allen (Jr.), USC; Cameron Artis-Payne (Sr.), Auburn; Tevin Coleman (Jr.), Indiana; James Conner (So.), Pittsburgh; Melvin Gordon (Jr.), Wisconsin; Devon Johnson (Jr.), Marshall and Duke Johnson (Jr.), Miami.

Breida is among the national leaders in rushing yards per game, points per game and touchdowns and owns the best per-carry average in the nation at 9.43 yards per attempt. His 1,434 rushing yards would be good for seventh nationally and ranks in the top 10 on Georgia Southern's single-season list. The sophomore from Brooksville,

Fla., and Nature Coast Technical High School has a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 and is planning on majoring in business.

The Award is named after three-time SMU All-America running back and 1948 Heisman Trophy winner Doak Walker. Walker, who also punted, returned kicks and kicked extra points, led the Mustangs to two Southwest Conference Championships. He was drafted by the Detroit Lions and led the league in scoring his rookie year. During his six years with the Lions, he led the team to two NFL championships and was chosen All-Pro four times. Walker is a member of both the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame.

ON THE ROAD, AGAIN

Georgia Southern's 2014 five-game home schedule did not feature any back-to-back home games this season, a first since the 1999 regular season. The Eagles had back-to-back road trips to Georgia Tech and South Alabama in September and played at Texas State and Navy in back-to-back weeks this month.

HOME SWEET HOME

It's been nearly a full month since the Eagles played at Allen E. Paulson Stadium, topping Troy 42-10 on October 30th. Three other season schedules kept the Eagles away from their home field longer with 35 days between home games. Four weeks went by during the 1987 campaign before Georgia Southern returned home and the fans had to wait 28 days after the season-opening game to see their Eagles play at the newly constructed Paulson Stadium in 1984.

Georgia Southern is 5-0 in "Homecoming" games after an extended leave from their home field.

Georgia Southern owns a 180-33 record in Paulson Stadium for an .845 winning percentage, which currently ranks as the third best in the nation behind Baylor (5-0, 1.000) and Marshall (141-25, .849).

From September 27, 1997 through December 15, 2001, the Eagles recorded 39 straight home victories, which stands as the NCAA FCS record for longest home winning streak. The Eagles also own the second-longest streak, 38 games, from Oct. 5, 1985-Sept. 22, 1990. Beginning with the win over top-ranked and previously undefeated Appalachian State in November 2010 through November 2012, Georgia Southern had the longest home winning streak in the nation in 2012 with 14.

SEVEN STRAIGHT

Georgia Southern is one of only three teams in the Sun Belt (New Mexico State and Idaho are the others, though Idaho's game at Florida was not completed) to have had eight games by Week 9. The Eagles had their first open week Oct. 18th after seven straight games.

SEVEN GAMES IN THE STATE OF GEORGIA

Seven games for the Eagles in the state of Georgia included three in the month of September (2-1) and three in October (3-0). The Eagles are 5-1 in the state so far this year with the lone loss coming at the hands of Georgia Tech.

EAGLES ADD ANOTHER CHAMPIONSHIP

With a 7-0 mark in the Sun Belt Conference, and some help last weekend from an old rival, Georgia Southern won a share of the Sun Belt Conference title, its 11th league title, in 2014. With one game remaining, the Eagles have their best start in league play since 2000 when the Eagles started 7-0 and finished with a 7-1 mark, a Southern Conference title and its sixth national championship. For Coach Willie Fritz, his Sam Houston State team went undefeated (7-0) and unchallenged in the Southland Conference in 2011 en route to the league's crown. To date, the Eagles have won a conference championship in every season in which they have won six or more league games.

STILL NUMBER ONE IN THE RUN

Georgia Southern maintained the highest rushing average in the nation at 385.5 yards per game for the ninth-straight week. Two of the Eagles' opponents, Navy and Georgia Tech, are ranked in the top five with the Midshipmen checking in with a 354.8 average (2nd) while Georgia Tech is fourth (327.9 ypg).

AND SCORES FOR GOOD MEASURE

In addition to claiming the Sun Belt Conference's single-game rushing yards record, the Eagles broke the league's season rushing touchdowns record (previously 34) after only 8 games (40) and now stand at 52 for the 2014 season.

The Eagles were 6-for-6 in third-down conversions with each drive in the first half against Savannah State resulting in six points. Georgia Southern's second possession of the game vs. the Tigers included two third-down conversions for the successful nine-play, 50-yard drive. After a third-down conversion in the first drive of the third quarter, the Eagles did not have another third-down conversion situation for the remainder of the game.

A LOT MORE ON THIRD DOWN

The Eagles' next best effort in third-down conversions came against Troy where they went 8-9 in the first half and 10-13 (76.9%) for the game. Georgia Southern converted eight-straight third-down situations against the Trojans (1Q-1, 2Q-5, 3Q-2) to tally its highest number of conversions (10) on the year. The previous high was nine vs. Idaho.

On the year, the Eagles are 65-130 for 50.8% for eighth in the nation.

FIVE FOR FIVE

Sophomore running back Matt Breida scored the first touchdown for the Eagles in the first five games of the season, all coming in the first quarter.

FROM ONE CARRY TO 1,000 YARDS

With a single rushing attempt in 2013 for a gain of 15 yards in the Elon game to a 1,000-yard season in 2014, Breida now has seven games with 100-yards or more rushing. He became the first Eagle to put up 200 yards in a single game since 2012 when he ran for 201 with no lost yardage at Georgia State. He has 16 rushing touchdowns this season.

His 9.43 yards per carry average this season would rank first nationally and would top the Eagles' single-season list ahead of Adrian Peterson's 7.52 average (257-1,932) during the 1998 season.

Breida's 1,434 rushing yards so far in 2014 ranks ninth on the Georgia Southern single-season list with Adrian Peterson's 2001 season ahead in eighth (1,459), Jermaine Austin in seventh (1,461-2003) and Jayson Forster (1,481-2005) in the spots above him.

Add two more touchdown receptions to wide receiver Kentrellis Showers' totals for nine for his career. The senior from Dublin, Ga., is extremely efficient with two touchdowns on three catches for a career-best 91 yards against Savannah State. He pulled in a touchdown catch from Kevin Ellison and Favian Upshaw vs. the Tigers to put himself in a tie for sixth place on the Georgia Southern career list with Raja Andrews.

A THOUSAND HERE, A THOUSAND THERE

Kevin Ellison crossed the career 1,000-yard marks with 67 passing yards against Savannah State and 34 yards on the ground against the Tigers. He logged his ninth career game with more than 100-yards rushing with 115 at Georgia State. He has 992 yards on the ground in 2014 and 865 through the air.

He now has 1,878 career rushing yards and 1,562 career passing yards. The minimum for the Eagles' career yards per rush average is 300 with Ellison needing just 21 more attempts to be ranked. If he qualified now, his 6.73 career yards per attempt would rank third with Ricky Harris (6.75 ypc) first, Jayson Foster (6.74 ypc) second and Adrian Peterson fourth (6.59 ypc).

DEFENSE STEPPING UP BY QUARTER

In 10 quarters this year Georgia Southern has allowed its opponent 50 or less yards of total offense, three of those were against the Trojans with the latest, only 29 yards allowed, at Texas State.

Troy failed to obtain 100 yards of total offense in either of its halves (64-90) with Savannah State (42-1st) and South Alabama (97-2nd) falling short of that mark this season.

DOBSON A DEFENSIVE TD LEADER

Georgia Southern junior safety Matt Dobson is one of 14 players in the nation who has scored multiple defensive touchdowns this season. Dobson returned an Idaho interception 26 yards for a touchdown in October and then recorded Georgia Southern's longest play and longest interception return in history with his 100-yard return at Texas State earlier this month.

With 182 years of combined full-time coaching experience, this Georgia Southern coaching staff is the most experienced in the history of the program. Fritz and both his coordinators, Jack Curtis (Defense) and Doug Ruse (Offense), have more than two decades on the sidelines.

A LITTLE CHANGEUP

Georgia Southern's game at South Alabama marked the first time the Eagles' lineup had changed this season with Valdon Cooper returning to the starting lineup, Jeff Ward replacing Nardo Govan at tight end and Justice Ejike starting in place of Jonathan Battle. In the game at Georgia State, Jamal Johnson started in place of Jonathan Battle. Through 10 games in 2014, 15 of the 22 positions have remained consistent with all five offensive linemen starting every game this season.

OPENING SCORES

In the last three years, Georgia Southern's season-opening scores have been among the longest plays of the year. Matt Breida opened the 2014 scoring with a 61-yard rushing touchdown. Last year, Jerick McKinnon had a 66-yard touchdown against Savannah State and the year before, Ezayi Youyoute ran for a 79-yard score vs. Jacksonville.

#PACKPAULSON

Georgia Southern's exceptional home field advantage -and home record- is due in large part to the vocal and spirited Eagle Nation. The 24,535 for the Sept. 25th game was the largest regular-season attendance in history and second-best of all-time. Three of the top six regular-season attendances were recorded in 2014.

DOBSON & FRYE SELECTED CAPITAL ONE/COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Matt Dobson and Garrett Frye were named to the 2014 Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-District Team, representing the states of Alabama, Florida, Georgia and South Carolina. Individuals must have had a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale and be a starter or key reserve to be nominated. The selections from eight districts advance to a national ballot for voting for Academic All-America honors.

The Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-America program recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances athletically and in the classroom.

Frye, a two-time pick to the Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-District Team is also a two-time selection as Georgia Southern University's Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He has a 3.77 GPA in Exercise Science. From Monticello, Fla., Dobson, a two-year starter at safety, has a 3.73 GPA in History and makes his first appearance on the Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-District Team this year.

FRYE NAMED SENIOR CLASS CANDIDATE

Georgia Southern offensive tackle Garrett Frye has been selected as one of 30 candidates for the 2014 Senior CLASS Award. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS Senior and have notable achievements in the four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

Frye, from Cumming, Ga., and South Forsyth High School, has started in every game the last three years consecutive games for the Eagles and contributed to the Eagles' top rankings

for their rushing attack in each of the last two seasons. Georgia Southern University's Male Student-Athlete for both the 2012-13 and 2013-14 academic years as well as earning first-team All-America honors, Frye was a 2013 CoSIDA/Capital One Division I Academic All-District selection. He owns a 3.77 cumulative grade point average in the Exercise Science curriculum.

Ten finalists' names will be placed on the official ballot and distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one candidate who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

SAINT-AMOUR RECOGNIZED AS ONE OF NATION'S MOST IMPRESSIVE CENTERS

Manrey Saint-Amour was added to the watch list for the Rimington Trophy to honor the nation's most impressive FBS center. Saint-Amour, a three-year starter for the Eagles at that position, is the anchor of an offensive line that owns the top rushing average in the nation. Saint-Amour has not only helped the Eagles to the top team average in rushing for the seventh-straight week, but also to top-10 averages in scoring and redzone offense and a top-20 average in total offense.

Finalists for the Rimington Trophy will be announced on December 8th with the winner revealed on December 11th at the Home Depot College Football Awards Show broadcast on ESPNU. The trophy will formally be presented on January 17 at the Rocco Theatre in Lincoln, Nebraska. Former Florida State Coach Bobby Bowden is the program's featured speaker.

The Rimington Trophy, first awarded in 2000, is named after former Bengals' starting center Dave Rimington, the only two-time winner of the Outland Trophy, two-time All-American, Lombardi Award winner and member of the College Football Hall of Fame.

JACKSON ONE OF 55 NOMINEES FOR BURLSWORTH TROPHY

Senior linebacker Edwin Jackson was been nominated for the Burlsworth Trophy, presented by the Springdale (Ark.) Rotary Club, to honor the collegiate player who began their career as a walk-on and who has shown outstanding performance on the field. The Trophy is named in honor of Brandon Burlsworth, former University of Arkansas walk-on and All-America offensive lineman. Jackson was one of 55 student-athletes nationally on the list for consideration.

Jackson, a two-year starter for the Eagles, has led the team in tackles in each of the last two seasons. The Atlanta, Ga., native from Westlake High School, chose Georgia Southern at the recommendation of his older brother and he decided to try out for the Eagle Football team. He joined the Eagles as a scout team member in 2010 and was invited to preseason camp in 2011. He made a statement in 2013 as with a game-high 10 tackles in the Eagles' win over Florida in "The Swamp."

JACKSON NOMINATED FOR AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Allstate Insurance Company and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) announced a record-breaking 182 nominees for the 2014 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®, the most-ever in the award's 22-year history. The award recognizes a select group of college football players who have made a commitment to enriching the lives of others while contributing to the greater good of their communities. Senior linebacker Edwin Jackson planned and organized a trip to Costa Rica where he and one of his fellow Eagle student-athletes held a clinic to teach children about American Football.

FIRST SUN BELT DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR GOES TO DOBSON

Junior safety Matt Dobson, who returned an interception 100+ yards for a touchdown in the Georgia Southern win over Texas State, was named the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week for games on the weekend of November 8th. From Monticello, Fla., the two-year starter broke both the Georgia Southern and Sun Belt record for longest interception return with his 100-yard play, the previous records were 98 and 99 yards, respectively. Dobson, one of only three players to accomplish this feat in the FBS this season to that point, becomes the first Eagle to be named a Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week.

The touchdown-saving interception in the Eagles' endzone, and subsequent points, made the difference in Saturday's win over the Bobcats, keeping the Eagles undefeated in the Sun Belt at 7-0 and with their seventh-straight win. Georgia Southern is tied for the league lead with 13 interceptions on the year and have the most touchdowns (2) and return yards (277) in the Sun Belt.

For Dobson, it was his third interception of the year and second interception return for a touchdown this season. The total of two returns for TDs ties Laron Scott and Lavar Rainey for Georgia Southern's single-season and career-mark for interception returns for scores. His first was a 26-yard return for a score against Idaho. He recorded a game-high and career-best 12 tackles with nine solo tackles in the win over Texas State.

ELLISON EARNS SUN BELT OFFENSIVE POTW HONORS-AGAIN (Week 5)

Kevin Ellison earned his second Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week honor after leading the Eagles to a 34-14 win over Appalachian State on September 25th.

Ellison was responsible for two touchdowns, one rushing, one passing, and ran for a season-best 151 yards, rushing for his third 100-yard plus game in 2014. He averaged 7.2 rushing yards per play and his long run of 25 yards from midfield set up an efficient four-play drive and 17-point lead midway through the first half.

The Cornelia, Ga., native added a 6-10 passing performance in the victory, which included a 17-yard touchdown toss, his fourth of the year, to junior wide receiver B.J. Johnson. The Eagles rank at the top of the Sun Belt Conference statistical categories for scoring offense, total offense, rushing offense and passing efficiency.

BREIDA EARNS SBC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS (Week 4)

Matt Breida was named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week for Week 4. The sophomore from Brooksville, Fla., rushed for a career-best 187 yards against South Alabama as Georgia Southern picked up its first-ever conference win. Breida added two touchdowns against the Jaguars.

Breida led off the scoring to give the Eagles' a 7-0 lead with a 64-yard touchdown run in the first quarter at South Alabama. He punched it in from one yard out in the third quarter for his second

touchdown of the night for his third-straight game with two touchdowns.

ELLISON GARNERS SUN BELT OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS (Week 3)

Georgia Southern quarterback Kevin Ellison earned Sun Belt Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors after directing the Eagles' comeback attempt with 28 unanswered points at Georgia Tech September 13th. The sophomore from Cornelia, Georgia, shared honors with Georgia State's Nick Arbuckle. He is the first Eagle to be recognized for a Sun Belt Conference award.

Ellison started Georgia Southern's scoring spree with a 32-yard touchdown dash on fourth and one in the third quarter. The Eagles posted 228 yards of total offense in the third period, with Ellison accounting for 77 rushing and 128 passing yards. He connected with B.J. Johnson for a 68-yard touchdown pass for Georgia Southern's third touchdown of the quarter. In the second half, Ellison ran for 102 of his total 107 yards and was 7-8 passing for 164 yards. His passing yards total ranked as the second-highest of his career.

TECHNOLOGY IN EAGLES' HELMETS

Georgia Southern Football employed a new technology with the start of practice in 2013. Members of the media interviewed Director of Sports Medicine and Head Athletic Trainer Brandy Clouse and biomechanics professor Barry Munkasy, Ph.D., about the Helmet Impact Telemetry System (HITS). Georgia Southern is the only collegiate program in the state of Georgia with this system, designed to provide immediate feedback for athletic trainers and researchers on the severity of impacts to the head during practices and games. Forty helmets will be equipped with this technology with six sensors transmitting data wirelessly to a laptop with software that records and measures the impacts while being monitored by staff. The initiative from Georgia Southern University President Brooks Keel made possible the addition of the equipment after Georgia Southern University received a \$385,000 grant from the National Institutes of Health in 2011 to study concussions.

A FEW SPECIAL GUESTS

Members of the inaugural 1982 Georgia Southern Football team and Eagles representing all six national championship teams were recognized and took part in a special ceremony prior to the season opener. The ceremony honored the six national championship teams and the flags, representing the most Division I-AA titles by any program, and relocated them on a flag pole next to the Ted Smith Family Football Center.

"WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS"

Georgia Southern, with an unprecedented six NCAA Division I-AA national titles, is part of the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame exhibit "We are the Champions," on display through December in Macon, Georgia. Items from the Eagles' national championships, including a 1985 championship ring, are included in the exhibit that features the state's football national champions.

GEORGIA TECH ADDED TO 2016 SLATE

Georgia Southern and Georgia Tech have contractually agreed to extend the series between the two schools for another game with the contest set for Atlanta on November 19, 2016. The in-state rival programs met for the first time on the football field earlier this year as more than 12,000 Eagle fans attended the thrilling game at Grant Field. The 53,173 attendance was the highest for the Yellow Jackets this season and that figure was the highest for a non-conference, non-Georgia game since 2006 against Notre Dame.

"Playing a high-quality opponent within just a few hours of campus benefits both programs and scheduling this game is a win-win situation," said Georgia Southern Director of Athletics Tom Kleinlein. "For us, with such a large number of our alumni living in the Atlanta area, we have the opportunity to bring their team to them."

Two other FBS games have already been locked in for 2016. An October 8, 2016, game at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, announced earlier this year, sets up the first-ever meeting between the Eagles and Ole Miss. A September return trip to Western Michigan is also on the 2016 slate.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN POINTS OF PRIDE

▪ Georgia Southern University has been named a military friendly school for the third year in a row by Military Advanced Education in its 2014 Guide to Military-Friendly Colleges and Universities.

▪ The University's College of Business Administration (COBA) was recognized as one of the best business schools for U.S. veterans by *Military Times*.

▪ Georgia Southern's Master of Business Administration (MBA) program was ranked in the top 10 as one of the nation's Top Online MBA programs by M magazine (mbaonline.com), the number-one online MBA magazine for students.

▪ After a nearly two-year construction, the \$41 million Biological Sciences Building opened in August 2013 — a 155,000-plus-square foot facility with labs, supporting research areas and classrooms.

▪ A major expansion project at Allen E. Paulson Stadium added more than 6,000 seats and the privately funded \$10 million Ted Smith Family Football Center is the new headquarters for the Eagle Football team. The 50,000-square foot facility features state-of-the-art offices, locker rooms, a strength & conditioning area with \$500,000 of equipment, a team room with stadium seating, position rooms and a Hall of Fame atrium.

▪ Georgia Southern is building a \$5.8 million Shooting Sports Education Center, which will have indoor archery and firing ranges and an outdoor archery range.

▪ Dining Commons, a new 1100-seat facility, opened with specialty stations for guests. Another location, Lakeside, recently completed a year-long renovation and opened with expanded dining options as well as the capacity to seat 500 diners.

▪ Georgia Southern established a new institute for interdisciplinary STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) Education (I2STEMe) that supports thematic grant writing, research and outreach. The Institute is committed to excellence in primary, secondary and higher education STEM teaching and learning with a focus on rural and diverse populations.

▪ Georgia Southern University's Herty Advanced Materials Development Center has opened the first fully-integrated pilot pellet mill in the United States. The new production line, located in Savannah, includes a nearly \$2 million investment in process equipment. The facility will provide a much-needed platform for innovation in process technology and pellet design in the U.S. and will help rising global demand for biomass pellets in Europe and North America.

▪ The University expanded its research activities with the addition of the new asphalt research lab within the Allen E. Paulson College of Engineering and Information Technology (CEIT). The new lab will provide research services to a variety of state and private companies, including the Georgia Department of Transportation.

▪ Georgia Southern has entered into a cooperative partnership with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to promote research, teaching, outreach, career development, and stewardship in environmental sciences, sustainability and engineering. The new partnership is designed to provide additional opportunities for student training and internships, faculty research support and environmental and public health initiatives.

▪ Georgia Southern was named to the 2013 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll from the Corporation for National and Community Service. During the 2011-12 academic year, more than 3,900 students engaged in nearly 369,000 hours (more than 15,000 days) of community service.

FRITZ A PERFECT FIT AS EAGLES MOVE TO FBS

Veteran head coach brings successful track record to Statesboro

When Coach Willie Fritz arrived in Statesboro in January to interview for Georgia Southern's head football coaching position, it may never have crossed his mind that he wasn't going to leave.

The day after Coach Fritz made his presentation to the search committee, Director of Athletics Tom Kleinlein announced the hiring of Fritz as the ninth head football coach in the program's modern history. Bishop Field House, the site of the announcement, was packed with media members, donors, Eagle fans, alumni and students on January 10, 2014, where they were introduced to the man who would

lead the Eagle Football program into a new era.

A proven winner with more than 30 years of coaching experience, Fritz led Sam Houston State to back-to-back Southland Conference titles, NCAA FCS championship appearances in 2011 and 2012, and a third-straight playoff berth in 2013. In 21 years as a head coach, Fritz owns a 72.3 winning percentage with a record of 176-67-1 and more than a few trophies for his accomplishments at the national, regional and conference levels.

identify and evaluate candidates who would come to Georgia Southern, embrace what we are about, understand what we’re about, put his own stamp on the institution’s football program and lead us into the Sun Belt Conference with relentless expectation,” Kleinlein said at the press announcement. “Coach Fritz has won at a lot of different levels. Not only does he win, but he comes in and changes the culture, academically and socially, and he’s made young people better men when they’ve left their institutions.”

The Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year at the FCS level in 2012, Fritz was recognized nationally in 2011 as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coach of the Year. Honored as the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2012, Fritz was selected by the media and his peers in the Southland Conference as the league’s Coach of the Year in 2011 after his team went a perfect 7-0 in conference play.

In 2011 and 2012, Sam Houston State posted the two highest single-season win totals in program history with marks of 14-1 (2011) and 11-4 (2012) and Bearkat players were showered with accolades. More than 50 earned All-Southland Conference honors under Fritz in the last four years, not including additional “Player of the Year,” “Offensive Player of the Year,” “Defensive Player of the Year,” and “Newcomer of the Year” awards. All-America status from national coaching and media outlets were bestowed on 11 Sam Houston State players during his tenure.

“Georgia Southern hit a home run hiring Willie Fritz,” said Dennis Hickey, longtime NFL executive and current general manager of the Miami Dolphins. “I have known Coach Fritz for over 20 years having played for him, coached with him, and scouted his players for the NFL.

“Willie is a special coach and person with a unique gift for developing and bringing out the best in young men both on and off the field. He has a

track record of developing NFL-ready players at every level that he has coached. He is a “winner” who has always done it the right way and has a proven track record of success at every level at which he has coached. I’m excited to see him continue that success at such a proud program as Georgia Southern.”

Fritz comes to Georgia Southern after four years as the head coach of the Bearkats and his most recent of three total tours in Huntsville. His resume includes a wealth of experience across the board, notably as a coach with an innate ability to connect with his players, demand accountability and build winning programs.

After a highly successful tenure at Blinn College, averaging nearly 10 wins a season during his four years there, Fritz left to revitalize a Central Missouri program and guided it to 11 winning seasons. The NCAA Division II program’s ledger included two 10-win seasons with the 2001 Mule squad earning its first postseason trip in more than 30 years. In 2002, Central Missouri made its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division II playoffs and was the Mid-America Athletic Association (MIAA) co-champion a year later. A 97-47 mark in 13 seasons ranks Fritz as the winningest coach in the program’s 118-year history. He was the only coach to ever win seven or more games in eight consecutive seasons and his victory total ranked him 15th among active Division II coaches at the time.

In addition to his impressive 67.4 winning percentage

with the Mules, Fritz coached his student-athletes to achieve their potential both on the field and in the classroom. More than 150 Mules were recognized with All-MIAA honors with 41 first-team selections and 24 All-Americans. Under Fritz, Central Missouri recorded a graduation

rate of 84 percent with 144 MIAA Commissioner’s Academic Honor Roll recipients, 14 Academic All-Region and three Academic All-Americans.

Serving as a graduate assistant for the Bearkat program during the 1984 and 1985 seasons, Fritz earned a master’s degree in kinesiology while Sam Houston State posted a 16-6 record and won the 1985 Gulf Star Conference championship. He returned to Huntsville in 1991 after spending two years at Coffeyville College in Kansas under legendary Coach Dick Foster, earning a promotion to defensive coordinator after one year. He stayed another two years to work for Coach Skip Foster and the Red Ravens.

“I knew immediately when I interviewed him that I wanted to hire Willie,” said Coach Dick Foster, a charter member of the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Football Hall of Fame. “He’s a talented person and I’ve followed his career closely, from Central Missouri and to Blinn where he coached two national championships, to what he has done at Sam Houston State. He has all the qualities needed for the challenge in front of him – he’s an excellent technician, an outstanding recruiter, very organized with his coaching and support staff and his student-athletes enjoy playing for him.”

of Texas and Sam Houston State as secondary and special teams coach in 1991, instilling an attitude of excellence on special teams that would last more than a decade. The Bearkats' "block party" racked up 80 blocked punts, field goals and extra points beginning with Fritz in 1991 and lasting through 2004. In Fritz's first year as a full-time assistant coach at Sam Houston State in 1991, the Bearkats won the Southland Conference. That league title and eight-win season launched SHSU to the program's second-ever appearance in the NCAA playoffs.

"Willie was like a coach on the field for me as a four-year starter at Pittsburg State," Coach Randleman said. "I just think the world of him and am proud that he was on my coaching staff not once, but twice. He has a tremendous work ethic, he played hard, and he coaches the same way. Willie has a great rapport with his players and they respect him."

Fritz would leave Huntsville again, this time for an opportunity to be the head coach at Blinn College, where he would turn around a program that had only five wins in its previous three seasons. From 1993-96, Fritz and the Buccaneers would rack up 39 victories against only five losses with a tie and claim two national junior college championships. He was inducted into the NJCAA Football Hall of Fame for the environment of success he created at Blinn.

One of seven children, Fritz is the son of the late Harry Fritz, who coached the Central Missouri football team in 1952 before continuing his career as the Executive Director at the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) in

Kansas City. The elder Fritz also served at several colleges and universities in administration as an athletics director.

Fritz played on two conference title teams and was a four-starter at defensive back for Coach Randleman at Pittsburg State and remained at his alma mater as a student assistant coach for his alma mater in 1982. Early coaching stops included a year at Shawnee Mission Northwest High School

(Kansas) in 1983 and Willis High School (Texas) in 1986, with his return to Sam Houston State for graduate school in between those years.

Fritz and his wife Susan have three children, Wesley, a graduate student at Georgia Southern, Elaine, a recent Sam Houston State graduate, and Brooke, a senior in high school in Statesboro.

- Junior safety Matt Dobson set a Georgia Southern and Sun Belt Conference record with his 100-yard interception return from the Eagles' endzone for a touchdown. It is the longest interception return in school and conference history and ties the mark for longest Georgia Southern play (100 yard kickoff return in 1997).
- Dobson's second interception return for TD ties him for second on the Eagles' single-season and career list in that statistical category.
- In addition to his interception return, Dobson tallied 12 tackles, a game and career-high, with senior linebacker Edwin Jackson adding 11. The Eagles tied their season-best with four sacks in the game.
- Matt Breida ran for two touchdowns -- his league-leading 13th and 14th of the season -- and had 120 yards rushing with no lost yardage for his sixth 100-yard rushing game and fifth multiple-touchdown game.
- The three rushing TDs brought the season total to 49, adding to the Sun Belt single-season record established by Georgia Southern with 40 after eight games.
- With its seven conference wins, Georgia Southern has the most since 2011 (7-1) and matches a streak of seven-straight league wins in 2002.
- The 15 points scored by Texas State were the most scored by an Eagle opponent in the fourth quarter this year while Saturday's game was the first time Georgia Southern had not scored in that period.
- With their eight overall wins, the Eagles have recorded the most victories of any Sun Belt Conference team in its inaugural season with the exception of the league's first year in 2001.

- Georgia Southern's seven-game win streak, the fifth-longest in the nation at the time, was snapped by Navy in only the second-ever meeting between the two teams.
- Navy had three takeaways against the Eagles and was not flagged for a penalty in the game while Georgia Southern tied its season high with seven for 65 yards.
- Matt Breida topped the 200-yard rushing mark for the second time this season with 210 yards against Navy, including an 88-yard touchdown run, third-longest in Georgia Southern history and longest against Navy this year.
