Series History: The Bulldogs hold a 3-0 edge in the series history with University of Louisiana at Monroe, winning 70-6 in 1994, 42-3 in 1997 and 44-7 in 2005 as all three meetings were in Athens.

Raising The Curtain On 2015

Georgia begins the 122nd season in Bulldog history with the University of Louisiana at Monroe visiting Sanford Stadium. Georgia owns a 91-27-3 record in season openers. The Bulldogs have won 15 of their past 18 season openers including 11-3 under coach **Mark Richt**.

The Warhawks, formerly known as Northeast Louisiana, have competed in the Sun Belt Conference since July 1, 2006 after playing in the Southland Conference. Football fans may recall in 2007 when the Warhawks posted a 21-14 upset over Alabama in Tuscaloosa. In 2012, ULM shocked No. 8 Arkansas 34-31 in overtime to become the first Sun Belt Conference team to register a win over a top 10 team.

Non-Conference Success

Under the direction of Mark Richt, Georgia owns a 56-11 record against teams from outside the Southeastern Conference. They are 39-2 at home since 2001. The Bulldogs completed 2014 with a 4-1 non-conference mark, including their 37-14 win over #20 Louisville in the Belk Bowl.

In 2015, three of Georgia's four regular season non-conference foes will come to Sanford Stadium. The slate features ULM at home for the season opener, Southern University and Georgia Southern in Athens and a meeting with Georgia Tech in Atlanta in the regular season finale.

New Leader & Signal Caller On Offense

Georgia led the SEC and was eighth nationally in Scoring at 41.3 points/game in 2014. With the departure of offensive coordinator Mike Bobo to become the head coach at Colorado State, the Bulldogs hired **Brian Schottenheimer** from the St. Louis Rams in January 2015 to lead the offense. After 2014 starter Hutson Mason graduated, the quarterback candidates for 2015 are juniors **Faton Bauta** and **Greyson Lambert** and redshirt sophomore **Brice Ramsey**. The last time three UGA quarterbacks played in the same game and all had at least one completion was in the 55-9 win over Charleston Southern (Bauta, Ramsey, Mason).

Veteran Offensive Line, New Coach

The Bulldogs return four starters on the offensive line from a squad that won 10 games and averaged 257.8 rushing yards per game, which led the SEC and ranked 11th nationally last year. Senior LT **John Theus**, junior LG/C **Brandon Kublanow**, junior RG **Greg Pyke** and senior RT **Kolton Houston** are all expected in Georgia's lineup after only three-year starting C David Andrews graduated. Sophomore **Isaiah Wynn** is slated to start at LG this season. The unit will be led by new offensive line coach **Rob Sale**. Sale replaces Will Friend who joined Mike Bobo at Colorado State. Friend is now the offensive coordinator for the Rams.

Rushing Attack

The Bulldogs finished with 38 rushing touchdowns last season, which ranked second in school history. The 1971 team holds the mark with 39. Georgia returns four out of its top five rushers from 2014, including **Nick Chubb**. Chubb started the Bulldogs' last eight games and finished with 1,547 yards and 14 rushing touchdowns to help Georgia tally 70 touchdowns (10th nationally). Chubb was named a Freshman All-American and the consensus SEC Freshman of the Year. In addition, sophomore **Sony Michel** ended his first year with 410 yards and five scores.

Year Two Under Pruitt

The 2015 season will mark the second year under defensive coordinator **Jeremy Pruitt**. The Bulldogs ranked fifth in the SEC in Scoring Defense at 20.7 points a game. Georgia finished with a +16 turnover margin and that ranked fourth nationally. Pruitt will have six starters back from a defense that posted two shutouts and held #23 Missouri and #9 Auburn to a combined seven points.

Senior OLB **Jordan Jenkins** is the top returning tackler (70 stops, 9.5 TFLs, 5 sacks) while junior OLB **Leonard Floyd** had a team-high six sacks, 8.5 TFLs and 55 tackles. Jenkins and Floyd are among the captains for Saturday.

ON DECK: VANDERBILT 3:30 p.m. ET (CBS)

The Bulldogs hold a 54-19-2 edge on the Commodores, including a 24-12-2 advantage in Nashville. Vanderbilt bested Georgia 31-27 in Nashville in 2013. The Bulldogs routed the Commodores 44-17 last year in Athens.

The Bulldogs had 15 first-time starters in 2014. Georgia had six first-timers in the season opener with #16 Clemson. Against #24 South Carolina, senior DT Toby Johnson and freshman receiver Isaiah McKenzie got the first starting nod of their careers. During the 66-0 victory over Troy, freshman TE Jeb Blazeovich started the first game of his career. Freshman Isaiah Wynn lined up at TE and sophomore Reggie Davis got the nod at receiver versus the Vols. Freshman TB Nick Chubb got his first career start during the win at #23 Missouri. Freshman OLB Lorenzo Carter started for the first time at Kentucky and responded with a career-high nine tackles, including 2.5 sacks. CB Malkom Parrish got the starting nod against Charleston Southern. Versus #15 Georgia Tech, Christian Payne started at FB.

The True Freshman Experience

A total of 13 true freshmen played in 2014, and 32 Bulldogs earned a snap for the first time in their careers last season.

The most true freshmen to play in a season opener during the Mark Richt era was 13 coming back in 2012. In last year's opener, nine played in the 45-21 win over #16 Clemson. Fourteen true freshmen played overall in 2013.

UGA IX THE MASCOT

Current Record: 44-19

The University of Georgia will introduce its newest mascot, Uga X, at a yet-to-be announced date during this season. The new mascot will be succeeding Uga IX, affectionately known as "Russ," who recently turned 11 years old.

"We look forward to celebrating the reign of Russ who has served the University and our sports program in magnificent fashion," said UGA President Jere W. Morehead. "He has truly endeared himself to fans all over the country. At the same time we anxiously await the arrival of the newest in our long-standing line of mascots, Uga X."

The half-brother of Uga VII, Russ has compiled an overall record of 44-19. He served as an interim Bulldog mascot for a total of 25 games (16-9). He worked nine games during the 2009 and 2010 seasons after Uga VII and VIII passed away. Russ roamed the sidelines at all 14 games during the 2011 season. He then served for two wins at the beginning of the 2012 season before being promoted as Uga IX prior to the Florida Atlantic game on Sept. 15, 2012.

His time as mascot has included the 2011 and 2012 SEC Eastern Division championships, three road wins at Georgia Tech and a victory over Texas A&M in the 2009 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. He completed 2012 with a 12-2 record and a win over Nebraska in the Capital One Bowl. In 2013, he finished with an 8-5 record before the Bulldogs completed the 2014 season with a 10-3 mark, capped by a victory over 20th-ranked Louisville in the Belk Bowl.
