THE SERIES

- Georgia Southern leads the all-time series with ULM 3-2 after the Eagles hung on for a 22-16 win last season at Paulson Stadium to clinch the outright Sun Belt Conference title.

- Each team has won its games at home with ULM upsetting the then top-ranked Eagles 21-13 at Malone Stadium in 1991. The two teams met in back-to-back years in 1987 and 1988 and then 1990 and 1991 with Georgia Southern winning two straight in the series with wins at Paulson Stadium in 1988 and 1990. GS won last year at home to take the lead in the series.

CONFERENCE WINNING STREAK

- Not counting conference championship games, GS has the third-longest active conference winning streak in the country at 11 games (last nine in the Sun Belt; won final two Southern Conference games in 2013), behind only Ohio State University (24) and Florida State University (22).

IN THE PELICAN STATE

- Georgia Southern is 1-3 in the state of Louisiana, dropping both games at ULM (1987, 1981), falling at McNeese State (2003) and beating Nicholls State (1989).

- The Eagles have a future non-conference game at LSU scheduled for 2019.

2K For Mr. #HeGone

- Matt Breida continues to put up big numbers for the Georgia Southern offense this season and passed a big milestone at Idaho last Saturday. The junior from Brooksville, Florida, became the 16th member of the 2,000-yard rushing club at GS with his 179-yard performance in the Kibbie Dome. He now has 2,089 career yards for his career and sits in 15th place all-time at Georgia Southern, one spot behind junior quarterback Kevin Ellison, who has 2,134 career rushing yards.

- Eleven FBS players have a run of 80 yards or longer this year, but Breida is the only one with two. He also leads the FBS in 70-yard runs (3) and 60-yard runs (4).

- In the past three games, he has racked up 589 yards rushing and eight touchdowns (176 vs. Western Michigan, 164 vs. The Citadel, 179 vs. Idaho). He has scoring runs of 70, 34, 25, 87, 83 and 66 yards.

- Breida is currently seventh in the country, averaging 147.3 rushing yards per game, and is averaging 10.9 yards per carry this season.

- Georgia Southern is one of just three FBS schools to currently boast two 2,000-yard rushers: Kevin Ellison (Jr., QB, 2,134 yards) and Matt Breida (Jr., RB, 2,089 yards). Ohio State features Braxton Miller (Sr., WR, 3,190 yards) and Ezekiel Elliott (Jr., RB, 2,595 yards) while Arkansas has Alex Collins (Jr., RB, 2,628) and Jonathan Williams (Sr., RB, 2,321).

COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

- 10 Georgia Southern is **10-1** under head coach Willie Fritz when leading at halftime.
- 9 The Eagles have won all **nine** of their Sun Belt Conference games since joining the league last season.
- 8 Matt Breida leads the Eagles and the Sun Belt with **eight** rushing touchdowns, averaging 147.2 yards per game.
- 7 Georgia Southern's trip to Idaho last week is the **seventh**-longest in the FBS this year (not including Hawaii).
- 6 The Eagles' **six**-point win last year against ULM sealed the outright Sun Belt Conference Championship for GS.
- 5 Georgia Southern has won all **five** of its Sun Belt Conference road contests.

COACH WILLIE FRITZ

When Coach Willie Fritz arrived in Statesboro in January, 2014 to interview for Georgia Southern's head football coaching position, it may never have crossed his mind that he wasn't going to leave.

The day after Coach Fritz made his presentation to the search committee, Director of Athletics Tom Kleinlein announced the hiring of Fritz as the ninth head football coach in the program's modern history. Bishop Field House, the site of the announcement, was packed with media members, donors, Eagle fans, alumni and students on Jan. 10, 2014, where they were introduced to the man who would lead the Eagle Football program into a new era.

The early returns on Kleinlein's hire are positive as Fritz led the Eagles to a perfect 8-0 record in conference play to earn the Sun Belt Conference title. Fritz was also named the conference's coach of the year for his team's success.

Fritz had the Eagles' bowl eligible with a 9-3 overall record at the season's end but the school's waiver claim to allow Georgia Southern to play in a bowl despite being in the second year of the NCAA's transition period was denied.

The Eagles dominated both sides of the ball and led the Sun Belt in scoring offense, scoring defense, total offense and rushing offense.

Now in his second season in Statesboro, Fritz carries a 12-4 record as the head man of the Eagles.

A proven winner with more than 30 years of coaching experience, Fritz led Sam Houston State to back-to-back Southland Conference titles, NCAA FCS championship appearances in 2011 and 2012, and a third-straight playoff berth in 2013. In 22-plus years as a head coach, Fritz owns a 72.5 winning percentage with a record of 185-70-1 and more than a few trophies for his accomplishments at the national, regional and conference levels.

The Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year at the FCS level in 2012, Fritz was recognized nationally in 2011 as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Coach of the Year. Honored as the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2012, Fritz was selected by the media and his peers in the Southland Conference as the league's Coach of the Year in 2011 after his team went a perfect 7-0 in conference play.

In 2011 and 2012, Sam Houston State posted the two highest single-season win totals in program history with marks of 14-1 (2011) and 11-4 (2012) and Bearkat players were showered with accolades. More than 50 earned All-Southland Conference honors under Fritz in the last four years, not including additional "Player of the Year," "Offensive Player of the Year," "Defensive Player of the Year," and "Newcomer of the Year" awards. All-America status from national coaching and media outlets were bestowed on 11 Sam Houston State players during his tenure.

Fritz came to Georgia Southern after four years as the head coach of the Bearkats and his most recent of three total tours in Huntsville. His resume includes a wealth of experience across the board, notably as a coach with an innate ability to connect with his players, demand accountability and build winning programs.

After a highly successful tenure at Blinn College, averaging nearly 10 wins a season during his four years there, Fritz left to revitalize a Central Missouri program

and guided it to 11 winning seasons. The NCAA Division II program's ledger included two 10-win seasons with the 2001 Mule squad earning its first postseason trip in more than 30 years. In 2002, Central Missouri made its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division II playoffs and was the Mid-America Athletic Association (MIAA) co-champion a year later. A 97-47 mark in 13 seasons ranks Fritz as the winningest coach in the program's century-long history. He was the only coach to ever win seven or more games in eight consecutive seasons and his victory total ranked him 15th among active Division II coaches at the time.

In addition to his impressive .674 winning percentage with the Mules, Fritz coached his student-athletes to achieve their potential both on the field and in the classroom. More than 150 Mules were recognized with All-MIAA honors with 41 first-team selections and 24 All-Americans. Under Fritz, Central Missouri recorded a graduation rate of 84 percent with 144 MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll recipients, 14 Academic All-Region and three Academic All-Americans.

Serving as a graduate assistant for the Bearkat program during the 1984 and 1985 seasons, Fritz earned a master's degree in kinesiology while Sam Houston State posted a 16-6 record and won the 1985 Gulf Star Conference championship. He returned to Huntsville in 1991 after spending two years at Coffeyville College in Kansas under legendary Coach Dick Foster, earning a promotion to defensive coordinator after one year. He stayed another two years to work for Coach Skip Foster and the Red Ravens.

Coach Ron Randleman brought Fritz back to the state of Texas and Sam Houston State as secondary and special teams coach in 1991, instilling an attitude of excellence on special teams that would last more than a decade. The Bearkats' "block party" racked up 80 blocked punts, field goals and extra points beginning with Fritz in 1991 and lasting through 2004. In Fritz's first year as a full-time assistant coach at Sam Houston State in 1991, the Bearkats won the Southland Conference. That league title and eight-win season launched SHSU to the program's second-ever appearance in the NCAA playoffs.

Fritz would leave Huntsville again, this time for an opportunity to be the head coach at Blinn College, where he would turn around a program that had only five wins in its previous three seasons. From 1993-96, Fritz and the Buccaneers would rack up 39 victories against only five losses with a tie and claim two national junior college championships. He was inducted into the NJCAA Football Hall of Fame for the environment of success he created at Blinn.

One of seven children, Fritz is the son of the late Harry Fritz, who coached the Central Missouri football team in 1952 before continuing his career as the Executive Director at the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) in Kansas City. The elder Fritz also served at several colleges and universities in administration as an athletics director.

Fritz played on two conference title teams and was a four-starter at defensive back for Coach Randleman at Pittsburg State and remained at his alma mater as a student assistant coach for his alma mater in 1982. Early coaching stops included a year at Shawnee Mission Northwest High School (Kansas) in 1983 and Willis High

FROM ONE CARRY TO 1,000 YARDS

• With a single rushing attempt in 2013 for a gain of 15 yards in the Elon game to a 1,000-yard season in 2014, **Matt Breida** now has 10 games with 100 yards or more rushing and 10 rushing scores of 50 yards or more. He became the first Eagle to put up 200 yards in a single game since 2012 when he ran for 201 with no lost yardage at Georgia State last year. He had 17 rushing touchdowns last season with just 10 yards total lost on 171 carries.

• His 8.68 yards per carry average last season (171-1,485) ranked first nationally (FBS) and set a new Eagles' single-season record ahead of Adrian Peterson's 7.52 average (257-1,932) during the 1998 season.

• Breida's 1,485 rushing yards in 2014 ranked sixth on the Georgia Southern single-season list.

• Breida led both the nation and Sun Belt in rushing yards per carry at 8.7 last year and ranked at the top of the Sun Belt rushing chart at 123.8 yards per game last season. He had more rushing touchdowns of 50 yards or more than anyone in the nation (7) and had the second-highest rushing touchdowns in the league with 17. He finished with 1,485 yards en route to earning first-team All-Sun Belt accolades.

• The junior checked in at sixth on the 2015 list of College Football's 15 most explosive athletes, compiled by Mike Huguenin of NFL.com. He was named a preseason first team All-Sun Belt selection in Phil Steele's and Athlon Sports college football previews and was named to the Maxwell Award and Doak Walker Award Watch Lists.

A THOUSAND HERE, ONE THOUSAND THERE

• **Kevin Ellison** crossed the career 1,000-yard marks with 67 passing yards against Savannah State and 34 yards on the ground against the Tigers last year. He logged his 10th career game with more than 100 yards rushing with 104 yards in a win over UL Monroe to help GS clinch the outright Sun Belt Conference title.

• He had 1,096 yards on the ground in 2014 and 1,001 through the air, making him one of four FBS quarterbacks last year to reach that plateau. His 1,096 yards rushing rank 17th on the school's single-season rushing list.

• He now has 2,000 career rushing yards and 1,942 career passing yards. His 6.56 career yards per attempt for his career currently rank fourth all-time in school history with Ricky Harris (6.75 ypc) first, Jayson Foster (6.74 ypc) second and Adrian Peterson third (6.59 ypc).

• Ellison is on the Manning Award Watch list, which includes 30 of the top quarterbacks in the nation heading into the 2015 season.

• A second-team All-Sun Belt selection a season ago, Ellison, who was twice named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week, registered 1,096 rushing yards to go along with 1,001 passing yards. He rushed for a season-high 159 yards at New Mexico State and rushed for 151 yards against Appalachian State. He totaled 300 yards (184 passing, 116 rushing) at NC State and had 271 (164 passing, 107 rushing) at Georgia Tech.

• Ellison was named preseason second-team All-Sun Belt in the league's coaches' poll and the junior is seeking to become the sixth Eagle to rush (2,000) and pass (1,942) for over 2,000 career yards.

DOBSON A DEFENSIVE TD LEADER

• Georgia Southern senior safety **Matt Dobson** was one of 14 players in the nation who scored multiple defensive touchdowns last season. Dobson returned an Idaho interception 26 yards for a touchdown in October and then recorded Georgia Southern's longest play and longest interception return in history with his 100-yard return at Texas State earlier in November.

• Dobson, who also had a career-best 12 tackles in that game, earned Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week honors for his efforts.

• Dobson is one of 197 football players across all divisions to be up for the 2015 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, is one of 80 FBS players on the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List, both awards given for exemplary off-the-field work, is one of 30 up for the Senior CLASS Award, and is one of 135 semifinalists for the Campbell Trophy, which awards postgraduate scholarships.

• Dobson finished his junior campaign with 62 tackles and three interceptions to earn second-team All-Sun Belt honors. He helped the Eagles preserve the victory and win the Sun Belt title with a pass break up inside the 1-yard line the final seconds against ULM in last year's finale.

• A second-team Capital One Academic All-America selection by CoSIDA in 2014, Dobson carries a 3.70 grade point average and was named to the Georgia Southern President's List for posting a 4.0 in the 2015 spring semester.

• A four-year member of Georgia Southern's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, Dobson is very active in the community. He volunteers at the Boys and Girls Club and for Special Olympics and has participated in Relay for Life and Walk a Mile in Her Shoes in addition to Real Men Read and Red Ribbon Week at William James Middle School.

• Dobson's 100-yard interception return for a touchdown at Texas State not only helped him earn Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week honors - the first Eagle to receive that distinction - but it also etched his name in a number of places in both the Georgia Southern and Sun Belt Conference record books.

HELMET TECHNOLOGY

When Georgia Southern started preseason camp in 2013, it joined an elite group of collegiate football teams employing the Helmet Impact Telemetry System (HITS), which measures and records every hit to the head during practices and games.

"We want to do everything we can to prevent our student athletes from suffering a head injury," said former Georgia Southern President Brooks Keel, Ph.D.

"After the University received a \$385,000 National Institutes of Health grant in 2011 to study concussions, we wanted to do more to get a better understanding of these injuries. The addition of this monitoring equipment will hopefully reduce the risks our Eagle players face on the field."

With funding from the Office of the Vice President for Research and Economic Development, Georgia Southern has equipped 40 helmets with the Riddell HITS system. There are six sensors inside each helmet that measures the severity of a hit to the head.

A typical impact in football lasts about 15 milliseconds, and in that instant, measurements from the sensors will be transmitted in nearly real-time to a laptop computer being monitored on the sidelines of all practices and games.

If a hit reaches a certain threshold, a pager worn by a graduate research student and the head athletics trainer will receive a notification and will follow with appropriate action with attention and, if they display any unusual behavior, a clinical evaluation to see if it is safe for him to continue playing or not.

Each impact is time stamped and can be synchronized with game video so coaches, athletics trainers and researchers can better evaluate the hits.

Less than two dozen schools are using the system around the country. Other schools to use the HITS system in their football programs include Virginia Tech, North Carolina and Oklahoma, putting GS at the forefront of concussion prevention in college football.

THIS IS GEORGIA SOUTHERN FOOTBALL

After a debut season in the FBS that Georgia Southern could only dream of, the Eagles look to defend their 2014 Sun Belt Conference Title in 2015. Here's a snapshot of the Eagles' program:

- Georgia Southern finished with a bowl eligible 9-3 record in the regular season but had its bowl waiver request denied by the NCAA. The Eagles will be bowl eligible this season after completing the two-year transition period.
- GS joined only Nevada (1992) and Marshall (1997) to win a conference title in their first year of FBS play, and became the first to go undefeated in conference play.
- Only Marshall (10-3) posted a better record in its first year in the FBS, but went 7-1 in the MAC.
- Head Coach Willie Fritz is in his 23rd career season and second at the helm of the Eagles.
- He has posted a career record of 188-71-1 (.725).
- Fritz led the Eagles to a 9-3 record and a perfect 8-0 mark in Sun Belt Conference play last season.
- The Eagle head man was named the 2014 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year.
- GS led the Sun Belt in both scoring offense and scoring defense in 2014.
- The Georgia Southern defense returns eight starters from a squad that led the Sun Belt Conference with just 23.4 points allowed per game in 2014.
- The Georgia Southern offensive line returns just one starter from a year ago but will start a front five that consists of three upper classmen, a sophomore and a redshirt freshman.
- The Eagles return their top four rushers from a year ago. Those four runners accounted for 80 percent of the Eagles' 4,769 rushing yards and 43 of their 55 rushing touchdowns.

EXPERIENCED COACHING STAFF

• With 192 years of combined full-time coaching experience, this Georgia Southern coaching staff is the most experienced in the history of the program. Fritz and both his coordinators, Jack Curtis (Defense) and Doug Ruse (Offense), have more than two decades on the sidelines.

LEADER ON THE LINE

• **Darien Foreman** is the lone returning starting from an offensive line that helped pave the way to Georgia Southern's ground success last season. Foreman has had plenty of preseason accolades tossed at him, including being named to the Lombardi Watch List in late August.

#PACKPAULSON

• Georgia Southern's exceptional home field advantage - and home record - is due in large part to the vocal and spirited Eagle Nation. The 24,872 for the Sept. 19 game was the largest regular-season attendance in history and second-best of all-time. Five of the top eight regular-season attendances have been recorded since 2014.

#CONTINUE THE JOURNEY

- Georgia Southern, the FCS's winningest team with more than 50 games played, posted a .718 winning percentage and 294 all-time wins to go along with its unprecedented six national championships.
- The University announced its acceptance of an invitation to join the Sun Belt for the 2014-2015 academic year on March 27, 2013 and began its transition with the 2013 season. In 2014, the Eagles won the Sun Belt Conference championship with an 8-0 conference mark, but were denied their appeal for a bowl due to being in the final transitional year. GS is eligible for a bowl this season.

GETTIN' IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

- Of the 19 seniors on the 2015 roster, two Eagles will be playing this fall as graduates of GS, with three others slated to graduate in December, four more in May, 2016 and another two scheduled to finish next summer.
- **Lennie Richardson** and **Antwione Williams** have both graduated from GS while **Cody Rediger**, **Jake Banta** and **Maurice Hunt** are scheduled to graduate at the end of this semester.
- In addition, four juniors - **Nardo Govan**, **Sean Gaddy**, **James Dean** and **Montay Crockett** - are slated to graduate in May.
- Five other juniors - **BJ Johnson**, **Da'Quan Heard**, **Tre Griffin**, **Cliff Saggus** and **Jake Abraham** are scheduled to graduate next summer.

CONFERENCE WINNING STREAK

- GS has the third-longest active conference winning streak in the country* at 11 games (9-0 in the Sun Belt; won final two Southern Conference games in 2013), behind only Ohio State University (24) and Florida State University (22).

SERVING OUR COUNTRY

• Senior defensive lineman **Lennie Richardson** hasn't taken a usual path to his final season as the Ashburn, Georgia, native first enrolled in college in 2007. After a year at Troy in which he didn't play and took a redshirt season, Richardson transferred to Georgia Southern for the 2008 season and played in 11 games while recording 24 tackles.

• After the season, he enlisted in U.S. Army and achieved rank of sergeant in his nearly four years of service. He served as a gunner on the M1A1 tanks and spent one year in Korea before finishing his three and a half years of military service at Ft. Benning in Georgia. He returned to the Eagles last year and is a vital key along the defensive line in this, his final season.

• At nearly 27-years-old, Richardson is the father to three children, Malaysia La'Nay, and sons Jayden and Damoni, who live with their mother Audrianna Gray in California. He has also graduated from Georgia Southern with a degree in general studies.

I LOVE L.A.

• While a lot of the attention is thrust on **Matt Breida** and his numbers, **L.A. Ramsby** teams up with Breida to help form one of the top rushing duos in the country.

• Originally recruited as an option quarterback, the redshirt sophomore was moved to running back and ran for 691 yards and 12 touchdowns last season as the Eagles led the FBS last year, averaging 381.1 yards per game average on the ground.

• In wins over New Mexico State and Idaho last year, Ramsby and Breida combined for 485 rushing yards.

• His legal name is Alfred Ramsby, Jr., but is nicknamed L.A. - for Little Al (his father is Alfred Ramsby, Sr.). He played in all 12 games last year and ran for a season-best 136 yards in the win at New Mexico State.

• The Cincinnati, Ohio, native scored at least one touchdown in the final 10 games of the 2014 season,

including a pair of touchdowns against Georgia State and Troy.

BYRD LEADS HANDFUL OF TRANSFERS

• Senior offensive lineman **Roscoe Byrd** had several offers for his services after UAB elected to discontinue football following the 2013 season. In the end, Byrd chose Georgia Southern, where he is slated to start at guard. The Albany, Georgia, native started all 12 games for the Blazers in 2014, helping the UAB offense rush for 300 or more yards on twice last season.

• Byrd is one of 17 transfers on the 2015 GS roster. In addition to Byrd, others who have transferred from FBS schools include **Favian Upshaw** (FIU), **Andre Sims** (Michigan State), **Ryan Nowicki** (Ole Miss), **Ukeme Eligwe** (Florida State), **Riyahd Jones** (Tennessee), **Lennie Richardson** (Troy) and **Jake Banta** (UAB).

HOME-GROWN TALENT

• There are 74 players on the Georgia Southern roster who are from the state of Georgia.

STATE-OF-THE-ART FACILITIES

• The new headquarters for the Georgia Southern Football program, the Ted Smith Family Football Center, encloses the eastern end zone of Paulson Stadium and provides a state-of-the-art facility for the day-to-day functions of the Eagles.

• Groundbreaking on the 50,000-square-foot facility took place in June 2013 and the landmark project was completed in July 2014.

• The Bill W. Nelson Hall of Fame atrium connects both wings of the building on the upper floor. Coaches' offices, conference rooms, and position meeting rooms, as well as an expansive team room with stadium seating for more than 120, is on this level.

• Spanning the majority of the field level, the athletic performance area is nearly four times the size of the old

facility contains nearly \$500,000 of equipment.

• Flanking the new strength and conditioning space are the athletic training and equipment areas.

• The locker room features 132 lockers branded with the GS logo and feature a custom name plate for each player. Compartments for hanging clothes, storing player's helmet, shoulder pads and shoes are integrated into the design of the cherry wood veneer lockers.

• Designed to maximize efficiency and storage, the new equipment room includes pass-through lockers for laundry service, space for travel trunks and a rail-based shelving system.

• The athletic training space includes more than a dozen treatment areas and eight taping stations, as well as offices for staff and a physicians' exam room. A large hydrotherapy room features both hot and cold tubs and an underwater treadmill with video monitoring system for therapy and rehabilitation.

• Blair will be replaced by Reed after the season. Reed has most recently served as broadcast/media relations manager for the Bowling Green Hot Rods and also spent three seasons as radio play-by-play announcer for The Citadel's football, men's basketball and baseball teams.

• Games will be broadcast on 12 affiliates across the state and can also be heard free of charge on the Internet through GS All-Access.

• In addition to game broadcasts, the network will air Inside Georgia Southern Football with Head Coach Willie Fritz live from Gnat's Landing in Statesboro across the state on all 12 network affiliates. The weekly show allows fans to call in, email or tweet questions for Coach Fritz.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN FOOTBALL TRADITIONS

- Georgia Southern has a rich tradition in the college football world, winning an unprecedented six Division I-AA national titles. Below are some of the traditions that have made the program so unique.

Freedom's Flight

- In what has become one of the most popular traditions at GS, "Freedom," a male American Bald Eagle, takes flight before each home football game. Launching from high above the field, Freedom lands at midfield to the roar of thousands of Eagle students and fans. Freedom is a male Southern Bald Eagle that



was found knocked out of the nest in Maitland, Florida. Only weeks old and appearing like a "brown ball of fuzz", it was discovered that the young eagle had an injury to its beak and suffered from an infection. Rushed to the Florida Audubon Center for Birds of Prey, Freedom made a complete recovery from the infection but the injury to the beak was permanent, preventing his release into the wild.

- With the permission of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, Georgia Southern acquired Freedom in 2004. Through the Georgia Southern University Center for Wildlife Education and Lamar Q Ball, Jr. Raptor Center, thousands of visitors young and old are embraced by the Power of Freedom.
- Under the supervision of Steve Hein, Director of the Center for Wildlife Education, Freedom is on the sidelines of all GS home games, and select road games.

Yellow School Buses

- When the football program was resurrected in 1981, the team needed a way to travel to practices and games. Operating on a shoestring budget didn't allow for transportation back then, let alone any luxurious travel. The Bulloch County Board of Education stepped in with a deal the University couldn't refuse: Georgia Southern would only pay \$1 each for two yellow school buses. The football team still uses the buses to this day, taking them to practices and using them on game day, as well.

Beautiful Eagle Creek

- When Georgia Southern resurrected the football program in 1981, traditions and spirit needed resurrection as well. So legendary head football coach Erk Russell

created his own. Inspired by the gnat-infested drainage ditch that cut across the field between what was then the team's locker room and practice fields, Russell convinced his players that its stagnant water was actually "Beautiful Eagle Creek," a source of "magical" waters.

- With the team now dressing at the Ted Smith Family Football Center, the yellow school buses now drop the team off and the players and staff run across a bridge that crosses Beautiful Eagle Creek to the practice field.
- Coach Willie Fritz has his seniors participate in a "baptism" each preseason, which this year included new interim school president, Dr. Jean Bartels (bar-TELLS). The video and pictures (above) of Dr. Bartels and the team generated nearly 60,000 social media hits alone.

Game #1: Eagles Shut Out on the Road By Mountaineers

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. — Karl Joseph picked off three passes, and Skyler Howard threw for 359 yards and a pair of touchdowns to lead West Virginia to a 44-0 victory over Georgia Southern before 55,182 fans Saturday night at Milan Puskar Stadium.

It was Georgia Southern's first meeting against West Virginia on the gridiron and first game against a Big 12 opponent.

Matt Breida led Georgia Southern with 70 rushing yards on 17 carries, and Favian Upshaw gained 64 yards on 16 carries.

Howard completed 16-of-25 passes, and two Mountaineers had over 100 receiving yards. Shelton Gibson caught three passes for 130 yards and a touchdown, and Javon Durante had three receptions for 121 yards and a score. Wendell Smallwood finished with 11 carries for 96 yards and a touchdown, and Joseph tallied with eight tackles.

Five turnovers and chunk plays over the top doomed the Eagles. The Mountaineers had four pass plays over 40 yards, including a 57-yard completion to Durante and a 57-yard reception by Gibson. Four interceptions and a fumble put the Eagle defense on its heels most of the night — Georgia Southern's average field position was its own 20-yard line while West Virginia's was its 37.

Despite giving up some big pass plays, the Eagle defense held strong for the first 32 minutes of the contest before wearing down. West Virginia moved the ball inside the Eagle 20-yard line four times in the first half and came away with just nine points. In addition, the Mountaineers took over inside the Eagle 45-yard line twice and were forced to punt. Matt Dobson, Antwone Williams and Ironhead Gallon all posted eight tackles on the night, and Bernard Dawson collected 1.5 sacks.

Trailing 16-0 at halftime, the Eagles turned it over on their first two possessions of the second half, and West Virginia made Georgia Southern pay on the second. After Joseph picked off an Upshaw pass at the West Virginia 28-yard line, Howard hit Daikiel Shorts for a 19-yard completing to set up a 6-yard TD run by Rushel Shell and a 23-0 lead.

After the Eagles turned it over on downs at the Mountaineer 30-yard-line, West Virginia went the distance in four plays to open an insurmountable 30-0 cushion with 4:19 to go in the third quarter. Howard hit Durante with a 23-yard pass to start the drive and capped it with a 26-yard strike to Gibson in the corner of the end zone. A 19-yard run by Smallwood 1:37 into the fourth quarter put the game away.

It was the first time the Eagles were kept off the scoreboard since a 45-0 loss at Montana in the 1995 I-AA playoffs, a streak of 242 games. The Eagles did not move the ball into West Virginia territory until their third possession of the second half.

Game #2: Breida, Glover Star in Home Opener

STATESBORO, Ga. — A week after getting shut out for the first time in nearly two decades, Georgia Southern rolled past Western Michigan with a 43-17 win in the Eagles' home opener in Paulson Stadium.

Matt Breida rushed for 176 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 16 yards a clip, and the offensive line helped the Eagles roll up 413 yards and five touchdowns on the ground, including 103 yards from quarterback Favian Upshaw, 82 from Wesley Fields and 43 yards and a core from L.A. Ramsby.

The defense and special teams turned in an excellent performances as well, and two interceptions by Antonio Glover in Bronco territory turned into 10 points for Georgia Southern. The senior safety added a third for good measure, tying the Paulson Stadium record for interceptions by an Eagle, and made seven tackles. Matt Dobson led the Eagles with nine stops and a breakup, and Georgia Southern gave up just 25 rushing yards.

Zach Terrell threw for 227 yards and two touchdowns and connected with Daniel Braveman 13 times for 122 yards and a score to lead Western Michigan (0-2).

After Western Michigan scored late in the first half, Breida put a damper on any thoughts of a comeback on the second play of the third quarter when he took a handoff, veered right and raced down the sideline for a 70-yard touchdown. It was the eighth time in the junior's career that he has rushed for a touchdown of 50 yards or more and put the Eagles on top 30-9.

Upshaw closed the door for good in the fourth quarter after Western Michigan scored a touchdown and added a two-point conversion to cut the margin to 33-17. The junior's 40-yard scamper set up a 1-yard touchdown run for Ramsby, extending the cushion to 40-17 with 6:32 left in the game.

After Western Michigan capped its first drive of the game with an Andrew Haldeman 34-yard field goal, Georgia Southern got on the scoreboard when Breida ran up the middle for a 9-yard touchdown with 3:21 left in the first quarter.

The Terrell to Braveman show took over right before the end of the half as the two connected on pass plays six times for 68 yards. The last completion was a 7-yard touchdown with 28 seconds left, but the Broncos missed the extra point, making the margin 23-9 at halftime.

It was the Eagles' first home game against a non-conference FBS opponent and their first contest against any team from the state of Michigan.

STATESBORO, Ga. – Matt Breida rushed for 164 yards, including an 87-yard touchdown in the second quarter, and Georgia Southern forced five Citadel turnovers as the Eagles topped the Bulldogs 48-13 before a record crowd on Military Appreciation Day in Paulson Stadium Saturday night.

Breida took the handoff on the first play after a Bulldog punt in the second quarter and was untouched as he went straight up the middle. The Eagle receivers locked their men up on the outside for the junior to breeze up the field all alone to tie to fourth-longest touchdown run in school history.

Kevin Ellison also made a little history, becoming the 14th Eagle to rush for over 2,000 career yards with a 9-yard touchdown scamper in the second quarter. Breida and Ellison each rushed for two scores, while L.A. Ramsby and Wesley Fields added touchdown runs.

Fields finished with 62 yards on 10 carries, and Ramsby added 60 yards on 10 carries. Chaz Thornton also ripped off a 66-yard run. The Eagle offense unleashed a bit of an aerial attack with 12 completions for 101 yards between Ellison and Favian Upshaw. Ryan Longoria had five receptions for 43 yards.

Ross Alexander and Darius White each picked off passes, and Antwone Williams led the Eagles with nine tackles. Thomas Banks had a forced fumble on special teams, and Logan Hunt added a forced fumble and five tackles.

Evan McField led The Citadel with 163 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries. The attendance of 24,872 was the largest regular-season crowd in Paulson Stadium history.

The Eagles scored on their first five possessions of the night and tallied 13 points off of turnovers in the game. Alexander set the Eagles up deep in Bulldog territory with his first career interception on the third play of the contest, and Alex Hanks nailed a 22-yard field goal to give the Eagles an early 3-0 cushion.

Georgia Southern took seven minutes off the clock with a 16-play drive on its next possession, and Ellison plunged into the end zone from a yard out for a 10-0 lead at the end of the first quarter. Fields ripped off a 25-yard run and three plays later, Breida found daylight for a 35-yard touchdown run and a 17-0 lead early in the second.

Breida's long run put the Eagles on top 24-0 midway through the second, and Darius White's interception and return set the Eagles up at the Bulldog 35-yard line. Ellison scrambled 13 yards to The Citadel 9-yard line and found a seam for a touchdown run on the next play for a 31-0 lead at halftime.

Ironhead Gallon blocked the third kick of his career, while Jay Ellison and Caleb Williams each had interceptions. Chris DeLaRosa and Antwone Williams each had nine tackles.

Matt Linehan completed 20-of-35 passes for 284 yards and two scores for Idaho (1-3, 0-1), and Dezmon Epps caught eight passes for 165 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

After clinging to a three-point lead at halftime, Georgia Southern scored touchdowns on its first two possessions of the second half to open a 30-13 cushion. Breida sparked the Eagles with a 66-yard touchdown run on the third play from scrimmage of the third quarter.

The junior took a pitch from Ellison and ran down the right sideline, got a block from Ryan Longoria, cut back to the left, avoided two Vandals and turned on the jets, running all the way to the left sideline and diving into the end zone, where he laid on the carpet for a breather. It was the 11th touchdown run of 50-plus yards in his career.

Ellison keyed the next scoring drive with a 53-yard run as the junior faked a pitch to the right and scampered through a big hole and down the right sideline. Ramsby kept the drive alive with a 10-yard run on 4th-and-3 from the Idaho 12-yard line, and Wesley Fields finished it off with a 2-yard touchdown run two plays later.

Alex Hanks connected on all three field goal attempts and the Eagles churned out 568 yards of total offense in the game.
