Four Non-Conference Games and Three Sun Belt Clashes on tap for Week Five

Four Sun Belt teams will get their first taste of conference play this upcoming Saturday while four teams continue their non-conference slates.

Having completed its non-conference slate, Arkansas State shifts focus to its conference opener as the Red Wolves host Idaho. The Vandals began Sun Belt play this past Saturday with a loss at home to defending Sun Belt champions Georgia Southern. Idaho will now be facing a Red Wolves program that has won at least a share of the conference championship in three of the past four seasons.

Speaking of the reigning Sun Belt champs, Georgia Southern is on the road for the second consecutive week in conference play. This time the Eagles will travel to face UL Monroe. It is the conference opener for the Warhawks, who are faced with the challenge of trying to hand Georgia Southern its first ever Sun Belt loss (9-0 all-time).

Troy and South Alabama meet in their con-

ference openers in what has become a budding rivalry. The two schools, separated by less than a three-hour drive, will meet in Troy where the Trojans came out on the winning end in a tight 34-33 contest the last time they faced-off there. Troy leads the all-time series 2-1 with South Alabama winning last season's game 27-13 in Mobile.

In non-conference play, Appalachian State returns home to face Wyoming after defeating Old Dominion 49-0 last Saturday. The Mountaineers, who are 2-1 on the season, are hosting their first ever non-conference FBS opponent since joining the Sun Belt. Wyoming is winless on the year at 0-4.

Two non-conference games on Saturday's schedule feature in-state rivalries as New Mexico State travels to face New Mexico and UL Lafayette heads north to face Louisiana Tech.

Georgia State, coming off a bye week, hosts Liberty in the Georgia Dome.

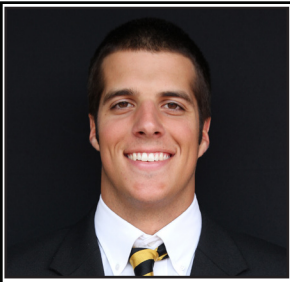
Sun Belt Student-Athlete Experience

The advantages of competing in college sports in the Sun Belt Conference are both immediate and lifelong. **Offensive
Student-Athlete of the Week
(Sept. 28)**

Taylor Lamb (Appalachian State, QB, So., Physical Education)

Was nearly flawless in helping lead Appalachian State to a very impressive 49-0 win at Old Dominion ... despite playing in a steady rain and being lifted from the game before the end of the third quarter, Lamb completed 11-of-15 passes for 187 yards and a career-high four touchdowns (53, 41, 24 and 1 yards) ... his incredible 266.05 pass-efficiency rating is the fifth-best in the nation this season and shattered his previous career high of 206.93, set in the Mountaineers' season-opening victory over Howard ... was especially effective in the Mountaineers' 28-point second quarter, when he went 5-of-7 for 136 yards and three touchdowns to help stake Appalachian to a commanding 35-0 halftime lead.

John Law (Appalachian State, ILB, Jr., Health Promotion)

Law led Appalachian State to its second shutout of the young season with a team-high seven tackles and an interception in the Mountaineers' impressive 49-0 win at Old Dominion ... Law's second interception of the young season set up an Appalachian State touchdown drive early in the third quarter ... the junior also recorded a tackle for loss ... led by Law, Appalachian State limited Old Dominion to just 175 total yards, barely half of its 340.3-yard average coming into the contest ... ODU managed just 42 rushing yards, including just 22 by Ray Lawry, who entered the game as the nation's No. 13 rusher with a 151-yard average.



**Special Teams
Student-Athlete of the Week
(Sept. 28)**

J.D. McKissic (Arkansas State, WR, Sr., Interdisciplinary Studies)

Senior wide receiver J.D. McKissic recorded a school-record 211 kickoff return yards, including a 92-yard return for a touchdown, during Arkansas State's road game against Toledo. His 211 yards were the second most in the nation this season and the fifth most ever by a Sun Belt Conference player. McKissic's 92-yard return was the 10th longest in school history and the first return for a touchdown by an A-State player since he accomplished the feat on a 98-yard return versus Idaho in 2013. He became the 10th player in Sun Belt history to post two kickoff return touchdowns in a career. McKissic increased his career kickoff return yardage total to 1,225 yards, which is the fifth most in school history.

2015 SUN BELT CONFERENCE PRESEASON POLL

Eagles Tabbed to Repeat as League Champions in 2015

NEW ORLEANS – Georgia Southern was picked as the favorite to repeat and win the conference championship in the 2015 Sun Belt Conference Football Preseason Poll, voted on by the league’s 11 head coaches.

The Eagles received six of the 11 first-place votes and tallied 110 points, narrowly surpassing the UL Lafayette Ragin’ Cajuns who tallied 108 points and three first-place votes. The Eagles claimed the 2014 Sun Belt regular season title with a perfect 8-0 conference record. The Cajuns finished 7-1 in league play and won their fourth consecutive R+L New Orleans Bowl.

Arkansas State was chosen third with 96 points and one first-place vote and was followed by Appalachian State in fourth with 82 points. The Red Wolves made their fourth consecutive appearance in the GoDaddy Bowl in 2014 as they look for yet another stellar campaign. The Mountaineers closed out 2014 with six consecutive victories – one of the five longest win streaks in the country heading into the 2015 season.

Texas State, with 78 points, was picked to finish fifth to round out the top five. South Alabama was picked to finish sixth and received the final first-place vote; UL Monroe was seventh followed by Troy in eighth. Georgia State was picked ninth, New Mexico State tenth and Idaho 11th.

The Eagles return 13 total starters to the team that finished 9-3 a year ago. A few key returners are dual-threat quarterback Kevin Ellison, All-Conference running back Matt Breida, running back L.A. Ramsby and All-Conference defensive back Matt Dobson.

Sun Belt Membership

The Sun Belt Conference consists of 13 total institutions – two (Idaho and New Mexico State) are football only members and two (Little Rock and UT Arlington) are non-football members. Coastal Carolina accepted an invitation to the Sun Belt on September 1 and will begin competing in all sports, with the exception of football, beginning with the 2016-17 season. The Chanticleer football program will begin a transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision with its first year of full FBS status coming in 2018.

Coastal Carolina to Join Sun Belt Conference

On September 1, Coastal Carolina University accepted an invitation to join the Sun Belt Conference and will begin competing in all sports, with the exception of football, beginning with the 2016-17 season. The Chanticleer football program will begin a transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision with its first year of full FBS status coming in 2018. During the transition, the Chanticleers will compete as a Sun Belt member in 2017 and have the opportunity to compete for the conference football championship, but they will not be eligible to participate in the postseason.

In the last two years alone the Sun Belt Conference has doubled its primary bowl partnerships from two in 2013 to four in 2015. From 2001 to 2009 the Sun Belt Conference had only one bowl partner.

Arkansas State's Knighten Named Candidate for Senior Class Award

Arkansas State senior quarterback Fredi Knighten was one of 30 FBS student-athletes to be selected as a candidate for the 2015 Senior CLASS Award recently. The honor recognizes student-athletes, who excel both on and off the field of competition. In the community, Knighten has assisted with many service efforts. He helped with a tornado relief fund drive by assisting in the recovery process for the geographic regions hit by several tornadoes in the state and region. He has helped with the Life Champs program, which is a football camp held in his hometown of Little Rock, Ark., that helps kids with football and life lessons.

40 NFL Players from Sun Belt Conference Institutions on 2015 Rosters

The Sun Belt Conference has 40 players in the NFL representing its 11 football-playing member institutions for the 2015 season. The conference is represented on 23 of the 32 NFL teams. Appalachian State tops the list of active NFL players with seven, while Arkansas State and Troy have six each.

Sun Belt Participates in Coach to Cure MD

Sun Belt head football coaches will participate in Coach To Cure MD this weekend, the AFCA's way to educate the country about Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy and raise money to fight this deadly opponent. The AFCA started Coach To Cure MD eight years ago, and now over 10,000 coaches participate every year. Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy affects one in 3,500 boys and with no treatment or cure, most don't live to see their 30th birthday. The AFCA's work in Coach To Cure MD is a partnership with the Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (PPMD), the largest nonprofit organization in the United States focused entirely on Duchenne.

Mountaineer News and Notes

Appalachian State moved to 2-1 with Saturday's impressive 49-0 win at Old Dominion.

The Mountaineers' win at ODU (2-2) was the first for a Sun Belt Conference program over a member of Conference USA since UL Lafayette defeated Tulane in the 2013 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

The shutout was Appalachian State's second of the season and fourth in its last 14 games.

After the opening month of the season, Appalachian leads the Sun Belt in scoring offense (36.0 ppg), scoring defense (13.7 ppg), total offense (487.0 ypg) and total defense (246.3 ypg).

Appalachian State's defense ranks among the nation's top 10 in several statistical categories, including red-zone defense (1st - .000), first downs allowed (3rd - 35), total defense (5th - 246.3 ypg), rushing defense (6th - 72.7 ypg) and scoring defense (14th - 13.7 ppg).

Individually, sophomore cornerback Latrell Gibbs ranks among the top 10 nationally in both interceptions (3rd - 1.0 pg) and passes defended (8th - 2.0 pg).

Sophomore quarterback Taylor Lamb completed 11-of-15 passes for 187 yards and four touchdowns in a steady rain and less than three quarters of work last Saturday at Old Dominion. Lamb's 266.05 pass-efficiency rating is the fifth-highest single-game performance in NCAA Division I FBS this season.

Junior running back Marcus Cox is just 24 yards shy of becoming the sixth student-athlete in Appalachian State history with 3,000 career rushing yards. He has rushed for 100 yards or more in six-straight games.

Red Wolf News and Notes

Arkansas State holds a 9-5 all-time record in Sun Belt Conference openers after picking up a 28-14 win over ULM in their first league game last year. The Red Wolves have won their last two Sun Belt openers for the first time since 2005 and 2006, and the last time they won three consecutive league openers was 2004-06 . . . A-State defeated Idaho each of the last two seasons and holds an all-time 6-4 record against the Vandals, including four meetings as Sun Belt Conference opponents (2001-04, 2014) and two as Big West Conference foes (1999-2000) . . . Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State holds an 11-2 record over its last 13 games played in the month of October . . . Arkansas State is hosting Idaho in its 2015 Homecoming game, and the Red Wolves hold a 59-27-1 all-time record in such contests. The Red Wolves have won 11 of their last 12 Homecoming games, including their last four in a row, dating back to the 2003 season . . . A-State will begin Sun Belt play this week after winning the league three of the last four years and producing a 25-6 league record since 2011 . . . A-State has 47 victories to just 11 losses at Centennial Bank Stadium since 2005 and has won 22 of its last 26 games at the stadium . . . Senior WR J.D. McKissic will enter the Idaho game needing 3 catches to break the Sun Belt Conference record for career receptions . . . The A-State defense has produced at least one interception in each of the last three games, giving it seven for the season that ranks as the eighth most in the nation.

Eagle News and Notes

Georgia Southern leads the all-time series with ULM 3-2 after the Eagles hung on for a 22-16 win last season at Paulson Stadium to clinch the outright Sun Belt Conference title. Each team has won its games at home with ULM upsetting the then-top-ranked Eagles 21-13 at Malone Stadium in 1991. The two teams met in back-to-back years in 1987 and 1988 and 1990 and 1991 with Georgia Southern winning two straight in the series with wins at Paulson Stadium in 1988 and 1990. GS won last year at home to take the lead in the series.

Not counting conference championship games, GS has the third-longest active conference winning streak in the country at 11 games (last nine in the Sun Belt; won final two Southern Conference games in 2013), behind only Ohio State University (24) and Florida State University (22).

Georgia Southern is 1-3 in the state of Louisiana, dropping both games at ULM (1987, 1981), falling at McNeese State (2003) and beating Nicholls State (1989). The Eagles have a future non-conference game at LSU scheduled for 2019.

Matt Breida continues to put up big numbers for the Georgia Southern offense this season and passed a big milestone at Idaho last Saturday. The junior from Brooksville, Florida, became the 16th member of the 2,000-yard rushing club at GS with his 179-yard performance in the Kibbie Dome. He now has 2,089 career yards for his career and sits in 15th place all-time at Georgia Southern.

Eleven FBS players have a run of 80 yards or longer this year, but Breida is the only one with two. He also leads the FBS in 70-yard runs (3) and 60-yard runs (4). Breida is currently seventh in the country, averaging 147.3 rushing yards per game, and is averaging 10.9 yards per carry this season.

In the past three games, he has racked up 589 yards rushing and eight touchdowns (176 vs. Western Michigan, 164 vs. The Citadel, 179 vs. Idaho). He has scoring runs of 70, 34, 25, 87, 83 and 66 yards.

Georgia Southern is one of just three FBS schools to currently boast two 2,000-yard rushers: Kevin Ellison (Jr., QB, 2,134 yards) and Matt Breida (Jr., RB, 2,089 yards). Ohio State features Braxton Miller (Sr., WR, 3,190 yards) and Ezekiel Elliott (Jr., RB, 2,595 yards) while Arkansas has Alex Collins (Jr., RB, 2,628) and Jonathan Williams (Sr., RB, 2,321).

After an open date, Georgia State returns to action this week by hosting Liberty (2-2) Saturday at 3:30 p.m. at the Georgia Dome.

Quarterback Nick Arbuckle leads the Sun Belt in passing (329.7 ypg) and total offense (325.7) and is second with seven TD passes. He is 10th in the FBS in passing yards per game.

Freshman receiver Penny Hart had another big game at Oregon with nine receptions for 128 yards, giving him 20 catches for 278 yards over the last two games.

Hart leads the Sun Belt with three touchdown receptions and is second in receiving yards (110.3 pg) and third in receptions (7.0 pg).

Hart is second among all FBS freshmen in the nation in receptions (7.0 pg, T-14th overall) and receiving yards (110.3 pg, 16th overall).

Robert Davis caught a 75-yard touchdown pass vs. Oregon, his sixth career reception of over 50 yards. Davis moved into second place in GSU history with 1,671 career receiving yards, trailing only Albert Wilson (3,190). He ranks third with

With four points vs. Oregon, senior placekicker Wil Lutz raised his career total to 157 points to eclipse Albert Wilson's GSU scoring record of 156 points.

Lutz is averaging 47.3 yards per punt to lead the Sun Belt and rank 10th in FBS. Georgia State leads the Sun Belt and is third nationally with a 44.07 net.

Linebacker Alonzo McGee leads the Sun Belt with six tackles for loss, safety Bobby Baker is first with three fumble recoveries, and cornerback Bruce Dukes is first with six pass breakups.

The Georgia State defense leads the Sun Belt in sacks (2.67 pg) and tackles for loss (6.7 pg).

Senior linebacker Joseph Peterson is leading the Panthers in tackles for fourth straight year. With a GSU-record 290 career tackles, he ranks fifth among all active FBS players.

Vandal News and Notes

University of Idaho receiver Dezmon Epps is the national leader in receiving yards per game after totaling more than 100 yards for the third time in as many games.

Epps, who had eight catches for 165 yards in the Vandals' loss to defending Sun Belt champ Georgia Southern Saturday night, is averaging 154.7 receiving yards per game to lead the country. He added that 100-yard-plus game to two others already this season - 15 catches for 160 against Ohio University and 10 catches for 139 vs. Wofford.

His average of 11 receptions per game is tops in the Sun Belt and second nationally, while his total yardage of 464 also leads the Sun Belt and is sixth nationally.

A large reason for his success catching the ball is the ability of sophomore quarterback Matt Linehan. Linehan is the Sun Belt leader in total passing yards (1,109), which is 19th nationally. He is third in the league and 28th nationally in passing yards per game (277.3), and third in the league and 23rd nationally in total offense per game (302.3).

Austin Rehkow, the Vandals' two-time Ray Guy Award Watch List punter, is adding to his reputation but as a kicker this year. He is one of 17 kickers nationally who has not missed a field goal this season, and he's the Sun Belt leader and 15th nationally in field goals per game with 1.75. He still remains among the country's elite punters, with an average of 44.7 yards per kick - third in the Sun Belt and 24th nationally.

As a team, Idaho is the Sun Belt leader in fewest penalties (13) and fewest penalties per game, as well as fumble recoveries with four on the season.

Idaho is on the road next Saturday at Arkansas State. Kickoff is 6 p.m. at Jonesboro and 4 p.m. at Moscow, where there is a free Watch Party scheduled at the Kibbie Dome. Doors to the Watch Party open at 3:45 p.m.

Ragin' Cajun News and Notes

The Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns football team returns to action on Saturday, Oct. 3, when it travels north to Ruston to face in-state rival Louisiana Tech in a 6 p.m. contest at Joe Aillet Stadium.

The game will be televised on the American Sports Network with Ron Thulin (pbp) and Keith Moreland (color) providing the commentary. The game will also be broadcast statewide on the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns Radio Network with Jay Walker (pbp), Richie Falgout (color) and Travis Webb (sideline) handling the call.

UL Lafayette (1-2) looks to rebound from a 35-14 setback to Mid-American Conference opponent Akron on Saturday at Cajun Field after being held to 285 yards of total offense while committing four turnovers. The Ragin' Cajuns were stopped inside the Akron 1 on a potential game-tying touchdown in the second quarter before being outscored, 21-7, in the second half. The 14 points by the Ragin' Cajuns were the fewest scored at home in 24 games under head coach Mark Hudspeth.

Elijah McGuire, who moved into fifth-place on the school's all-time rushing list with 2,458 yards, gained 83 yards and added a touchdown for the Ragin' Cajuns. Jalen Nixon came off the bench to set career-highs in pass attempts (20), completions (11) and yards (96) while tossing his second career touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Jamal Robinson caught a pair of passes for the Ragin' Cajuns and moved past Willie Culpepper into seventh-place on the school's all-time list for receiving yards with 1,980. The senior enters Saturday's game with Louisiana Tech (2-2, 1-1 C-USA) nine yards shy of passing Bill Sampy (2002-05) for sixth place on the career list.

On the season, McGuire ranks second in the Sun Belt Conference in rushing (110.3 yards per game) and is fourth overall in all-purpose yards, averaging 137.0 yards per game.

UL Lafayette's 37 wins since 2011 is tied for sixth among all schools in the Group of 5.

Fifth-year senior Zachary DeGrange continued his impressive start for the Ragin' Cajuns collecting three tackles, a pass breakup, a quarterback hurry and his first career interception.

Warhawk News and Notes

ULM and Georgia Southern played a tight one in Statesboro in the 2014 finale, the first meeting between the schools since each were FCS members in 1991. Two fourth-quarter touchdowns gave the Eagles the lead and they went on to claim a 22-16 win.

Georgia Southern enters the matchup with a nation-best 358 rushing yards per game. The Warhawks held No. 9 Georgia and No. 12 Alabama, ranked 14th and 40th in that category, respectively, to below their season averages.

The Warhawks held Alabama to 303 yards of total offense after the No. 12 Crimson Tide entered the game averaging 512.3 per game, including two games against ranked teams. It was the fewest Alabama was held to in a contest since Oct. 11, 2014 (12 games). Alabama had just 166 yards passing. The Warhawks have not yielded 200 yards to a team through the air since the Nov. 8, 2014 game against Appalachian State.

Ajalen Holley had nine grabs against the Crimson Tide on the heels of having eight for 155 yards against Nicholls State, all in the first half. Holley had more than twice the amount of catches as the next-closest player on either team in the Alabama game.

Tre' Hunter intercepted a Jake Coker pass in the second quarter and returned it 12 yards. The interception by Hunter was the first of his career.

Midway through the second quarter, ULM ran a fake punt as Chris Qualls completed a five-yard pass to Harley Scioneaux to give the Warhawks a first down (ULM faced fourth down and three yards).

LB Hunter Kissinger, a second-team All-Sun Belt performer in 2014, made his first start (and appearance) of the season on Saturday.

In the opening half, the Warhawks limited the Crimson Tide to a mark of 2-for-9 on third down attempts. ULM also held Alabama to just 175 yards of total offense in those first 30 minutes.

Trey Caldwell's seven tackles tied for a game-high. Mitch Lane also had six stops.

Aggie News and Notes

The NM State football team will have a week off to prepare for before they travel to Albuquerque to take on Rio Grande Rival New Mexico on Oct. 3 at 7 p.m. (CT). The contest will air on ROOT Sports and will be broadcast on AM 570 in Las Cruces.

The Aggies dropped a heartbreaking 50-47 overtime loss to Battle of I-10 rival UTEP on Sept. 19. After NM State took an early lead on its first drive, the two teams traded touchdowns often for a regulation score that was knotted at 44-44. The Aggies began overtime with the ball and freshman Parker Davidson hit his second career field goal, this time a 44-yard score, to give the home team the lead. On UTEP's drive, Miners quarterback Ryan Metz found Cedrick Lang in the end zone for a 6-yard pass and the win.

NM State led the game in passing yards with 285 yards compared to UTEP's 273 yards and in total offense with 551 yards to the Miners' 542 yards. The Aggies scored on all six red zone chances with five touchdowns and one field goal from inside the 20-yard line. Davidson also went 2-for-2 on field goals.

Larry Rose III continues to lead the Aggies' rushing efforts as he amassed 196 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries. The sophomore averaged 9.8 yards per carry and had a long rush of 82 yards. Rose III now has 329 total rushing yards and three touchdowns. He averages 109.7 yards per game and 6.6 yards per carry.

Teldrick Morgan racked up 151 yards and a touchdown on four receptions. The Hanover, Md. native had a long reception of 78 yards against the Miners. He also collected 45 return yards and nine rushing yards for a game-high 205 all-purpose yards. Morgan is second on the team in receiving yards with 249 on 13 catches. He averages 83.0 yards per game and 19.2 yards per catch. Tyrian Taylor leads the team in receiving with 264 yards and three touchdowns on 14 catches. The junior chipped in 39 receiving yards and a touchdown on two catches against UTEP.

Tyler Rogers completed 14 of his 28 pass attempts for 285 yards and three touchdowns. Rogers has seven touchdowns on the season and has thrown for 866 yards through the first three games. Overall, the junior has completed 60-of-111 pass attempts for a 54.1 percent completion rate.

Jaguar News and Notes

South Alabama closed out play prior to the start of Sun Belt Conference action with a home game against North Carolina State Saturday at Ladd-Peebles Stadium. After scoring on the opening possession for a 7-0 lead less than two minutes into the contest, the Wolfpack answered with five straight touchdown drives en route to a 63-13 victory in the third and final match-up in the series. NCSU set opponent records for the most points and total yards (586) as well as handing the Jags their largest margin of defeat. ... USA meets Troy in its conference opener for the second time in four years, although this is the first matchup in the series in which both schools will begin league action. ... This is the first time that the Jags will play their first conference contest in October, marking their latest start to league competition. ... It will be the second time in as many trips to Troy that the Trojans will be the Jaguars' initial SBC opponent on the road. ... The 471 passing yards and 630 total that the Jags racked up in their 2013 visit to Troy still remain school game records. ... South Alabama has never opened conference play with a win, dropping its initial league decision in each of the last three years — after falling in their first two meetings with Troy, the Jags were defeated by Georgia Southern, 28-6, in Mobile on Sept. 20 a year ago. USA has surrendered an average of 31 points per contest in its Sun Belt opener, including a high of 34 points the only time the Jaguars have played their first conference game on the road at Troy in 2013. ... One trend that has developed since the Jags joined the Sun Belt is that both the team's scoring and total offense averages increase in league competition when compared to the entire's season's figures. Last fall, USA recorded an average of 22.5 points and 376 yards per outing over 13 contests, but posted 23.4 points and nearly 385 yards against conference foes. Conversely, in the last two years the Jag defense has surrendered significantly less in both categories in the SBC; in 2013, they allowed 25.2 points and 384.2 yards per game overall but just 21 and 356.1, respectively, in the league, while last year those averages dropped from 26.4 to 22.9 and 398.9 to 376.4 once the Jaguars faced Sun Belt opponents. ... For the third time in four contests this season, PK Aleem Sunanon converted multiple field goals after making both his attempts against North Carolina State. That included a career-long 49-yard field goal late in the third quarter, the third-longest make in program history, which improved his numbers to 7-of-8 on the year. The junior — who enters this contest ranked in the top 10 in the SBC in both field goals and scoring per game, is also tied for 17th in the country with an average of 1.75 field goals per outing. Dating back to last season, Sunanon has made 15 of his last 16 tries (93.8 percent). ... Sophomore Jeremy Reaves led all players last time out against the Wolfpack with 10 stops, the third week in a row he has recorded a double-digit figure in the category. Not only was it the first occasion this season that a Jaguar has paced the defense in tackles in consecutive outings, it marked the first time since Oct. 26-Nov. 16, 2013 — when former LB Enrique Williams turned the trick — that an individual in the program has finished with 10 or more stops in three games in a row. With the effort, the defensive back — who paces USA with four tackles for loss, having picked up one in each of the first four contests — now stands second in the conference with an average of 8.75 stops per outing.

Bobcat News and Notes

Texas State will be looking to win its first road game in the 2015 season when the Bobcats play their first Sun Belt Conference game at UL Lafayette on Oct. 10. It marks the third straight season that Texas State will play their first Sun Belt game against the Ragin' Cajuns.

The Bobcats have one of the Top 25 offenses in the nation after averaging 485.3 yards in the first four games of the season. Texas State ranks second among SBC teams in total offense.

The Bobcats also have one of the top 40 scoring teams in the nation with an average of 35.8 points per game. Their scoring offense also ranks second in the Sun Belt.

Texas State has the most balanced offense in the Sun Belt Conference, as the Bobcats are the only SBC team to rank among the top four passing and rushing teams in the league. Texas State has one of the top 35 passing teams in the nation with 278.3 yards passing per game and has one of the Top 41 rushing offenses in the nation with 207 yards per game.

Brandon McDowell ranks second nationally and leads the Sun Belt in punt returns after averaging 26.0 yards on five punt returns this season. McDowell set a new school record when he had a 95-yard punt return against Prairie View A&M.

Tyler Jones is the only player in the Sun Belt Conference to rank among the Top 10 rushing and passing leaders in the league. Jones ranks eighth among Sun Belt leaders with 70.5 yards rushing per game and is fourth in passing yards with an average of 244 yards passing per contest.

Jones ranks among the top 19 national leaders and is second among league leaders in total offense with an average of 314.5 yards per game. He also is responsible for 60 points this season and that ranks 19th nationally and leads the Sun Belt.

His favorite target is senior wide receiver Jafus Gaines, who ranks seventh among SBC leaders with 4.8 receptions per game after catching 19 passes for 233 yards and a touchdown in the first four game.
