Pair of Sun Belt Rivalries Ready for ESPN Prime Time

Two of the Sun Belt's top rivalries are set for midweek action with both being nationally televised on the ESPN family of networks.

Up first, UL Lafayette travels to Arkansas State on Tuesday, October 20 - kickoff is set for 7 p.m. (CT) and the game will air on ESPN2. UL Lafayette holds an all-time record of 23-19-1 against Arkansas State in the series that dates back to the 1953 season. As Sun Belt Conference opponents, UL Lafayette leads the series 8-5 after picking up wins the last two seasons, including a 55-40 victory in Lafayette a year ago. While the Ragin' Cajuns won in Jonesboro in 2013, the home team has prevailed in 11 of the last 14 meetings. Tuesday's game will be the 44th meeting all-time in the series. The Red Wolves and Ragin' Cajuns are both inaugural Sun Belt football members and both have been to four consecutive bowl games.

Georgia Southern will head to Appalachian State for an ESPNU clash on Thursday, October 22 - kickoff will be at 6:30 p.m. (CT). Both teams boast the best overall records in the leagues as they each stand at 5-1 - meaning the winner will advance to 6-1 and become the first bowl eligible team from the Sun Belt this season. Thursday's meeting is the 30th all-time between heated rivals Appalachian State and Georgia Southern. Appalachian holds a 15-13-1 advantage in the all-time series, including a 11-3-1 edge in games played in Boone. Appalachian State has won five of the last seven matchups against Georgia Southern, including three-straight wins over the Eagles at Kidd Brewer Stadium. Six of the last nine Appalachian State-Georgia Southern games have been decided by a touchdown or less, including two overtime contests (a 27-20 App State win in 2006 and a 21-14 GS win in 2010).

Sun Belt Student-Athlete Experience

The advantages of competing in college sports in the Sun Belt Conference are both immediate and lifelong. Sun Belt student-athletes are provided with unique opportunities to learn, compete and succeed. Sun Belt student-athletes have access to career services counselors assisting with writing resumes and identifying internships and summer jobs, career workshops, preparation for interviews/mock interviews, and etiquette classes. Sun Belt members have on average over 20 tutors for academic support and employ full-time academic advisors. During the 2014-15 academic year, Sun Belt member institutions awarded \$48,393,375.06 in scholarships to over 3,084 student-athletes. Sun Belt student-athletes have life experiences such as team building, domestic and foreign travel, community service, mentoring, and recognition through honors and awards.

Offensive Student-Athlete of the Week (Oct. 19)

Nick Arbuckle (Georgia State, QB, Sr., History)

Quarterback Nick Arbuckle passed for 412 yards and accounted for three touchdowns to lead Georgia State to a 31-19 victory at Ball State. Arbuckle completed 28 of 38 passes with one touchdown and no interceptions while scoring twice on 1-yard runs. With Georgia State clinging to a 24-19 lead and less than three minutes to play, Arbuckle connected with Donovan Harden for a 68-yard completion down to the 1-yard line. Two plays later, Arbuckle snuck over for the clinching touchdown. He also scored on a 1-yard plunge in the second quarter. Arbuckle's 412 yards are just two shy of his school record of 414 yards. The senior leads the Sun Belt and ranks ninth in FBS in passing with 326.8 yards per game. He also leads the conference in completion percentage and total offense while ranking second in pass efficiency and touchdown passes. In 18 games in a GSU uniform, Arbuckle is averaging 291.3 yards passing per game. That ranks second among all active FBS quarterbacks, trailing only Cal's Jared Goff.



Defensive Student-Athlete of the Week (Oct. 19)

Eric Boggs (Appalachian State, LB, So., Physical Education)

Boggs had two interceptions, a team-high 11 tackles and a pass breakup in Appalachian State's 59-14 win at UL Monroe ... the interceptions were the first of his career ... he became the first Mountain-eer with two interceptions in a game since Latrell Gibbs had two at Troy on Oct. 18, 2014 and the first Appalachian State linebacker with two interceptions in a game since John Law had two at Elon on Sept. 21, 2013 ... Boggs returned the first interception of his career 16 yards to the two yard line, setting up a touchdown on the very next play that tied the score at 7-7 early in the ballgame ... his second interception helped Appalachian State protect a tenuous 24-14 lead late in the first half ... his 11 tackles matched a career high set in last season's win over ULM.



Special Teams Student-Athlete of the Week (Oct. 19)

Austin Rehow (Idaho, Jr., PK/P, Exercise Science & Health)

Rehow had his biggest night as a Vandal with four field goals (34, 31, 40, 10) and one PAT as well as an average of 42.5 yards per punt in Idaho's victory over Troy. His lone miss was a 52-yarder that was long enough but slightly left. His long punt of the night was a 61-yarder and the Trojans had just one return of his six punts.

2015 SUN BELT CONFERENCE PRESEASON POLL

Eagles Tabbed to Repeat as League Champions in 2015

NEW ORLEANS – Georgia Southern was picked as the favorite to repeat and win the conference championship in the 2015 Sun Belt Conference Football Preseason Poll, voted on by the league’s 11 head coaches.

The Eagles received six of the 11 first-place votes and tallied 110 points, narrowly surpassing the UL Lafayette Ragin’ Cajuns who tallied 108 points and three first-place votes. The Eagles claimed the 2014 Sun Belt regular season title with a perfect 8-0 conference record. The Cajuns finished 7-1 in league play and won their fourth consecutive R+L New Orleans Bowl.

Arkansas State was chosen third with 96 points and one first-place vote and was followed by Appalachian State in fourth with 82 points. The Red Wolves made their fourth consecutive appearance in the GoDaddy Bowl in 2014 as they look for yet another stellar campaign. The Mountaineers closed out 2014 with six consecutive victories – one of the five longest win streaks in the country heading into the 2015 season.

Texas State, with 78 points, was picked to finish fifth to round out the top five. South Alabama was picked to finish sixth and received the final first-place vote; UL Monroe was seventh followed by Troy in eighth. Georgia State was picked ninth, New Mexico State tenth and Idaho 11th.

The Eagles return 13 total starters to the team that finished 9-3 a year ago. A few key returners are dual-threat quarterback Kevin Ellison, All-Conference running back Matt Breida, running back L.A. Ramsby and All-Conference defensive back Matt Dobson.

2015 SUN BELT NEWS AND NOTES

Sun Belt Membership

The Sun Belt Conference consists of 13 total institutions – two (Idaho and New Mexico State) are football only members and two (Little Rock and UT Arlington) are non-football members. Coastal Carolina accepted an invitation to the Sun Belt on September 1 and will begin competing in all sports, with the exception of football, beginning with the 2016-17 season. The Chanticleer football program will begin a transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision with its first year of full FBS status coming in 2018.

Coastal Carolina to Join Sun Belt Conference

On September 1, Coastal Carolina University accepted an invitation to join the Sun Belt Conference and will begin competing in all sports, with the exception of football, beginning with the 2016-17 season. The Chanticleer football program will begin a transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision with its first year of full FBS status coming in 2018. During the transition, the Chanticleers will compete as a Sun Belt member in 2017 and have the opportunity to compete for the conference football championship, but they will not be eligible to participate in the postseason.

Arkansas State's Knighten Named Candidate for Senior Class Award

Arkansas State senior quarterback Fredi Knighten was one of 30 FBS student-athletes to be selected as a candidate for the 2015 Senior CLASS Award recently. The honor recognizes student-athletes, who excel both on and off the field of competition. In the community, Knighten has assisted with many service efforts. He helped with a tornado relief fund drive by assisting in the recovery process for the geographic regions hit by several tornadoes in the state and region. He has helped with the Life Champs program, which is a football camp held in his hometown of Little Rock, Ark., that helps kids with football and life lessons.

40 NFL Players from Sun Belt Conference Institutions on 2015 Rosters

The Sun Belt Conference has 40 players in the NFL representing its 11 football-playing member institutions for the 2015 season. The conference is represented on 23 of the 32 NFL teams. Appalachian State tops the list of active NFL players with seven, while Arkansas State and Troy have six each.

Sun Belt Conference Part of NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl

The Arizona Sports and Entertainment Commission recently announced the creation of the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl. The bowl game will debut on Dec. 29, 2015 and will match two teams from the Mountain West Conference, Conference USA and the Sun Belt Conference. The game will be played at the University of Arizona's stadium in Tucson, Ariz. The NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl is the first-ever bowl game to have a digitally-focused broadcast strategy to be orchestrated by primary digital media partner Campus Insiders. Details and technology partnerships along with the television broadcast partner will be announced at a later date.

Mountaineer News and Notes

Appalachian State (5-1, 2-0 Sun Belt) claimed its eighth-straight Sun Belt Conference victory with a 59-14 rout at UL Monroe on Saturday.

The victory over ULM sets up a mammoth Sun Belt Conference matchup versus longtime rival Georgia Southern (5-1, 3-0 Sun Belt) on Thursday night at Kidd Brewer Stadium. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. and the game will be televised nationally on ESPNU.

Appalachian State has won 11 of its last 12 games overall. The Mountaineers' only blemish during that span is a 41-10 loss at then-No. 12 Clemson on Sept. 12 (Clemson is now ranked No. 5 nationally).

Appalachian State's 59 points and 654 yards of total offense at ULM were its most ever in Sun Belt Conference play while its 45-point margin of victory was its largest in a Sun Belt game.

Appalachian State also set records for the most points scored (prev.: 55 by Southeastern Louisiana in 1980) and largest margin of victory (prev. 43 by Tulane in 2002) by a visiting team in the 38-season history of ULM's Malone Stadium.

Finally, the 59 points were the most ever scored against ULM in its 15 seasons in the Sun Belt and were the most scored by any opponent against the Warhawks since No. 2 Texas beat ULM, 59-20, in 2009.

Thursday's meeting is the 30th all-time between heated rivals Appalachian State and Georgia Southern. Appalachian holds a 15-13-1 advantage in the all-time series, including a commanding 11-3-1 edge in games played in Boone.

Appalachian State has won five of the last seven matchups against Georgia Southern, including three-straight wins over the Eagles at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Six of the last nine Appalachian State-Georgia Southern games have been decided by a touchdown or less, including two overtime contests (a 27-20 App State win in 2006 and a 21-14 GS win in 2010).

Red Wolf News and Notes

Arkansas State is off to a 2-0 Sun Belt Conference start and continues league play Oct. 20 with a Tuesday night ESPN2 game against Louisiana at Centennial Bank Stadium . . . Coming off a 49-31 road victory at South Alabama, the Red Wolves have won back-to-back games and achieved a .500 or better record for the first time this season . . . Arkansas State holds an all-time on-field record of 19-23-1 against Louisiana in the series that dates back to the 1953 season. As Sun Belt Conference opponents, Louisiana leads the series 8-5 after picking up wins the last two seasons, including a 55-40 victory in Lafayette a year ago. While the Ragin' Cajuns won in Jonesboro in 2013, the home team has prevailed in 11 of the last 14 meetings. Tuesday's game will be the 44th meeting all-time in the series. A-State's 43 games played against the Ragin' Cajuns are the second most against any opponent in school history behind only its 57 played versus Memphis . . . While Arkansas State and Louisiana have both played as members of the Sun Belt Conference since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, it is not the first time the two teams have shared a conference. The Red Wolves and Ragin' Cajuns were both members of the Big West Conference from 1993 to 1995 and the Southland Conference from 1971 to 1981 . . . Arkansas State has three players on its roster from the state of Louisiana, including redshirt freshman QB James Tabary (New Orleans), freshman defensive back Jai Knight (Boutte) and freshman linebacker Kirk Louis (Baton Rouge) . . . Arkansas State has won 27 of its last 33 Sun Belt Conference games (.814 winning percentage) to run its all-time record in the conference to 60-42. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against ULM with 23. With the exception of Appalachian State and Georgia Southern, which A-State has never faced as an SBC opponent, the Red Wolves have defeated every team in the conference since the football league was formed in 2001. Along with ULM and Louisiana-Lafayette, A-State is one of three teams that have been a part of the conference since it was formed . . . Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State holds a 13-2 record over its last 15 games played in the month of October. The Red Wolves went undefeated in the month during both the 2011 and 2012 seasons, 1-1 in 2013, 2-1 last year and are 2-0 this season . . . Historically, A-State has performed well in midweek games since joining the Sun Belt Conference. The Red Wolves hold a 12-6 record in all midweek games since its 2001 inaugural year in the league and has won eight of their last 11 midweek contests . . . Arkansas State has strung together 10 consecutive years with a winning record at Centennial Bank Stadium dating back to 2005. The Red Wolves are now 48-11 (.814 winning percentage) since the 2005 season and have won 23 of their last 27 home games. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at Centennial Bank Stadium is 140-74-1 since it opened in 1974. A-State's six home wins in 2011 were its most since 1985 . . . Including back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2011 and 2012, eight more in 2013, seven last year and three this season, the Red Wolves have recorded 38 victories that are tied for the 31st most in the nation over the last five years.

Eagle News and Notes

Georgia Southern and Appalachian State have met 30 previous times with the Mountaineers holding a 16-13-1 lead in a series that dates back to 1932. Appalachian State holds a 13-11 advantage in games played in the modern era (since 1982 when Georgia Southern re-started its program).

Last season, in both team's first year in the Sun Belt Conference, the Eagles rolled past the Mountaineers 34-14 as Matt Breida (151), Kevin Ellison (135) and L.A. Ramsby (51) combined for 337 yards on the ground. The win broke a three-game losing skid against Appalachian State.

The prior season, Appalachian State put up 515 yards of total offense at it downed Georgia Southern 38-14.

Prior to the past two season's lopsided wins, six of the previous seven games in the Georgia Southern-Appalachian State series were decided by seven points or less.

Tight ends coach Chad Lunsford spent two seasons on the staff at App State as tight ends coach (2001-2002).

The Eagles are 4-1 all-time in games played on Thursdays, 1-1 on the road. Georgia Southern defeated Appalachian State and Troy last season and battled the elements for the victory over Middle Tennessee State in the 1989 "Hugo Bowl," all on Thursdays. GS coach Willie Fritz is 17-2 as a head coach in Thursday night games.

Georgia Southern hasn't fared well at Kidd Brewer Stadium over the years, entering Thursday's game on a three-game losing streak. The Eagles haven't won at "The Rock" since 2007 and have been outscored 111-47 during that span. GS is just 4-9 all-time at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Kidd Brewer Stadium sits at 3,333 feet above sea level, making it the highest-elevated FBS stadium east of the Mississippi State, easily topping Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium (2,057 feet). Georgia Southern already played in Idaho's Kibbie Dome earlier this season, which sports an elevation of 2,610 feet above season level. App State boasts a 226-72-5 (.754) all-time home record at Kidd Brewer Stadium, 72-14 in past 86 games.

Georgia State enters an open week after a 31-19 victory at Mid-American Conference foe Ball State. Nick Arbuckle passed for 412 yards and accounted for three touchdowns and Robert Davis had career highs with nine catches for 125 yards to back a strong performance by the Georgia State defense.

Quarterback Nick Arbuckle leads the Sun Belt and ranks ninth in FBS in passing with 326.8 yards per game. He also leads the conference in completion percentage (66.2 percent) and total offense (317.3) while ranking second in pass efficiency (150.2) and touchdown passes (11). In 18 games in a GSU uniform, Arbuckle is averaging 291.3 yards passing per game. That ranks second among all FBS quarterbacks, trailing only Cal's Jared Goff.

After nine receptions for 125 yards and one touchdown vs. Ball State, Robert Davis now ranks second in Georgia State history in career receptions (125), yards (1,878) and touchdowns (9, tied with Danny Williams), trailing only current NFL receiver Albert Wilson in all three categories. Davis has caught at least one pass in every game he has played (30 consecutive games).

Arbuckle and wide receiver Donovan Harden hooked up for a 68-yard pass play down to the 2-yard line to set up the game-clinching touchdown vs. Ball State. That is GSU's eighth pass play of the season of 50 yards or longer. Four different receivers have been involved: Harden (76 vs. Liberty, 57 vs. Liberty, 68 vs. Ball State); Robert Davis (75 vs. Oregon, 61 vs. Liberty); Penny Hart (58 vs. Liberty, 53 vs. Charlotte), and Nyiakki Height (51 vs. New Mexico State).

Senior linebacker Joseph Peterson, who had a game-high 14 tackles vs. Ball State, leads the Sun Belt with 10.7 tackles per game, good for 10th in FBS. Peterson ranks fourth among all active FBS players in career tackles with 325, the GSU record.

Senior safety Tarris Batiste is second on the team and third in the Sun Belt with 9.0 tackles per game. He is also second to Joseph Peterson in Georgia State annals with 217 career tackles.

Freshman receiver Penny Hart, who had five catches for 73 yards vs. Ball State, ranks second in the Sun Belt in receiving yards (85.5 pg) and touchdowns (4) and third in receptions (5.7 per game). Among all freshmen in the nation, Hart ranks third in receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns.

Wil Lutz booted a 50-yard field goal at Ball State, his third career field goal of 50 yards or longer. He is now 8-for-11 on field goals this season and 27-for-38 in his career. Lutz leads the Sun Belt in punting at 45.2 yards per kick. Georgia State leads the conference and ranks ninth in FBS with a net of 41.65.

Vandal News and Notes

The Idaho Vandals made the most of the 20 hours they spent away from the Pacific Northwest Saturday when they snapped a 24-game road losing streak that stretched back to Nov. 5, 2011 when they won at San Jose State.

Last Saturday's 19-16 victory over Troy University came on a day when the Vandals left Spokane, Wash., at about 3:30 a.m. Saturday and were back at Lewiston, Idaho, by 11:30 p.m. that night. The highlights were plenty for the Vandals but tops among them would be:

Junior Austin Rehkow's four field goals, which includes the game-winning 19-yarder with 3:01 left in the game. He did miss once that evening but the 52-yarder was just outside the left upright. He was good on his lone PAT attempt and continued his dependable double-duty as the Vandals punter. One of just three FBS players to fill that dual role, he punted six times for an average of 42.5 Saturday night. His long was 61 yards.

Senior Dezmon Epps displayed even more dependability and durability. He caught 10 passes for 131 yards to mark his seventh game of more than 100-yards receiving and his third double-digit reception total. Of those seven 100-plus games, four have been in the five contests he has played this fall. But that wasn't his only contribution to the victory. He had one punt returns for six yards and he spent time in the Idaho secondary where he had two tackles.

Senior defensive end Quinton Bradley added two more sacks to his total as he led a balanced defensive unit that allowed just two plays longer than 40 yards – one 43-yard run and one 51-yard pass. For the evening, the Trojans covered more than 10 yards on just 13 other plays on the night as the Vandals had four sacks and totaled nine tackles for loss. They also forced (Kaylyn Ayers) and recovered (Tuani Lupeamanu and Armond Hawkins) two fumbles, and intercepted two (Russell Siavii and Marc Millan) passes.

Ragin' Cajun News and Notes

The Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns football team used a 28-point third quarter to break free from a halftime tie and claim a 49-27 victory over Texas State in front of 21,377 Saturday evening at Cajun Field in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams.

UL Lafayette (2-3, 1-0 Sun Belt) won its Sun Belt opener for the eighth straight season. The 49 points scored by the Cajuns were a season-high and 526 yards of offense marked the highest output since the Northwestern State contest (Sept. 12).

Junior running back Elijah McGuire piled up a season-high 170 yards on a career-high 28 carries. As a team, the Cajuns rushed for 288 yards surpassing 200-plus for the third time in five outings.

Junior quarterback Jalen Nixon had a career night finishing 22-of-29 for 238 yards and four touchdowns, including three through the air.

Jamal Robinson posted his fifth multiple-touchdown game of his career hauling in two scores, the latter which proved to be the winning score in the third quarter. Robinson finished four catches and a season-high 67 yards – increasing his career total to 2,074 yards and two shy of tying Wayne Butler (1989-92) for sixth-place on the school's all-time list.

Al Riles led all receivers with nine catches for 98 yards. Torrey Pierce's 13 carries for 56 yards and Nixon's seven carries totaling 45 yards boosted the Cajuns rushing totals.

Jeryl Brazil's 100-yard kickoff return against Texas State – the first TD of his career – tied the school-record and was the first by a Ragin' Cajun since Darryl Surgent's 100-yard kick return at Kansas State in 2013. The Loranger, La., native is currently ranked eighth among FBS players in kick return average (32.0).

Robinson's 17-yard TD reception near the end of the first half against Texas State was his first since Oct. 4, 2014 when he caught two TDs in the Sun Belt Conference opener against Georgia State.

Warhawk News and Notes

The Warhawks return to a state near and dear to their hearts. The program's 1987 I-AA national championship was won in Pocatello, also in a dome, against Marshall.

The matchup kicks off three consecutive road games for ULM, its first since 2009 (Kentucky, Troy, North Texas). ULM returns to the bayou for a Halloween game at UL Lafayette before a trip to Troy. That 2009 season also marked the Warhawks' last game in the Pacific time zone, a September contest at Arizona State (due to Arizona's daylight savings time rule).

ULM's contest with Idaho in 2014 was a wild one. A two-hour, six-minute lightning delay in the first quarter was accompanied by rain throughout the night. Centarius Donald's one-yard touchdown run with nine seconds left gave the Warhawks the victory.

Saturday marks ULM's first contest in Moscow since 2004, during Idaho's first stint with the Sun Belt. The Warhawks pulled out a 16-14 victory.

The Warhawks have averaged 166 rushing yards per game the last two weeks. It's the first time they've averaged over 150 in back-to-back games since the first two contests in 2014 (156.5 against Wake Forest and Idaho).

Fifth-year senior Hunter Kissinger has been on a tear since coming back from an injury that kept him out at the start of the season. His career-high 18 tackles came on the heels of having 13 against Tulsa and 12 versus Georgia Southern.

Aggie News and Notes

The NM State football team returns home on Saturday after a three-game road stint to host Troy in a combination homecoming and Tough Enough to Wear Pink game.

The Aggies (0-6, 0-2) are coming off a tough 56-26 defeat at the hands of last year's Sun Belt Conference champions, the Georgia Southern Eagles. After falling behind 28-0, quarterback Andrew Allen found wide receiver Jordan Bergstrom for a three-yard pass and the touchdown to put NM State on the board before the half.

The visiting team added another touchdown, this time a three-yard pass from Allen to wide receiver Joshua Bowen, to trail 35-14 in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, Allen and Bowen connected again, this time on an eight-yard pass in the end zone. Robert Wagner then had his first career forced fumble, which was picked up and returned for a 74-yard touchdown by Will Clement.

The two touchdowns by Bowen were a career-high for the senior. He also racked up 15 yards on four receptions against the Eagles.

This was Allen's second career start and just his first this season. The sophomore was 20-of-37 for 253 yards, three touchdowns and only one interception. After stepping in for quarterback Nick Jeanty against then-No. 13 Ole Miss, Allen is now 30-of-51 for 308 yards this season.

Larry Rose III led NM State in both rushing and receiving. The sophomore ran 13 times for 83 yards and had five receptions for 31 yards to amass 113 all-purpose yards. Rose III now has 687 rushing yards on 93 carries through six games to rank first on the team. He is also third on the team in receptions with 15 for 113 yards. Rose III has six rushing touchdowns.

Royce Caldwell led the Aggies in all-purpose yards with 130. The freshman has played in just four games after recovering from an injury prior to the season. He racked up 67 yards on only two catches, which included a 61-yard catch. Caldwell has 87 receiving yards this season. Additionally, Caldwell chipped in 63 kickoff return yards on four returns.

Derek Ibekwe continues to lead NM State in tackles after he tied a career-high 14 against Georgia Southern. He chipped in 1.0 tackles for loss and now has 4.5 tackles for loss this season. Overall, the sophomore has 57 tackles.

Jaguar News and Notes

The Jaguars play for just the second time in the last 20 days when they face Texas State Saturday in San Marcos. ... Since beginning Sun Belt Conference play in 2012, USA is 2-3 when coming off an open weekend after earning a 30-27 victory over Georgia State last weekend with an extra week of preparation. ... The home team has won each of the first two meetings in the series, with both contests decided by four points or less; in fact, the outcome of both match-ups hasn't been determined until the final seconds. ... The Jags are 2-2 all-time in games played in Texas, though the last victory came in a 30-27, double-overtime decision at Texas-San Antonio on Oct. 8, 2011. ... First, junior Gerald Everett caught a 10-yard touchdown pass to open the scoring for the Jaguars last time out against Arkansas State, his program record fourth straight contest he has reached the end zone with a reception. Later, in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter, he supplied USA's final points with a three yard touchdown run, marking the second straight outing that he has scored and second time this fall a Jag has crossed the goal line with both a run and a reception. On Wednesday, Everett was named to the John Mackey Award Midseason Watch List, making him 35 individuals in consideration for the award presented to the most outstanding collegiate tight end. ... Kalen Jackson led South Alabama for the first time this season with a career-best 12 total stops against Arkansas State last Tuesday, recording a pair of tackles behind the line of scrimmage for the second time in as many games. The junior's 10 solo tackles were the most recorded by a Jaguar this fall, while he became the first player from the USA defensive unit this year to collect multiple stops for loss in consecutive contests. Jackson was credited with a pair of stops on ASU's opening possession of the game to help end a drive that began in Jaguar territory without giving up any points, as his efforts helped the Jags limit the Red Wolves below their season averages entering play in passing and total offense as well as yards per snap. ... Sunanon didn't miss a kick, connecting on a 37-yard field goal and making all four point-after-touchdown tries, and he also averaged 45.2 yards per punt against Arkansas State last time out. His field goal midway through the third quarter — the sixth time in as many outings this fall that he has converted at least one — not only pushed the USA lead back to a touchdown, it made him the first individual in program history to record 200 points in a career. And after punting just once in his first 30 games with the program, the junior took over those duties in the middle of the second quarter and proceeded to hit five kicks of 40 or more yards including a 52-yard effort that was the longest in the game for either team.

Bobcat News and Notes

Texas State will have its second bye week in a span of three weeks as the Bobcats prepare to play South Alabama on Oct. 24. The Bobcats enter the game with a 1-4 record after suffering a 49-27 loss at UL Lafayette last Saturday night.

Texas State leads the Sun Belt Conference and ranks 28th nationally in total offense with an average of 458.4 yards per game this season. The Bobcats had 351 yards on offense at UL Lafayette after accumulating 401 yards at Houston after gaining 591 yards against Southern Miss, 649 yards versus Prairie View A&M and 300 yards at No. 10-ranked Florida State.

Texas State ranks 42nd nationally and is third among Sun Belt Conference teams in scoring offense after averaging 34.0 points per game through the first five contests. The Bobcats scored a season-best 63 points against Prairie View A&M and tallied 50 points versus Southern Miss. Texas State netted 27 points at UL Lafayette, 16 points at No. 10-ranked Florida State and 14 points at Houston.

Texas State is one of nine teams in the nation to rank among the NCAA's top 40 teams in both passing and rushing offenses this season. The other eight teams are Baylor, Houston, Notre Dame, TCU, West Virginia, Memphis, Cincinnati and Tulsa. The Bobcats also are the only Sun Belt Conference team to rank among the top four league leaders in both offensive categories.

The Bobcats scored a touchdown on their first drive in a game for just the second time this season at UL Lafayette when Tyler Jones hit Robert Lowe for a 37-yard touchdown pass. The other time came against Prairie View A&M.

Tyler Jones is the only Sun Belt Conference player ranked among the top 10 conference rushing and passing leaders this season. Jones rushed for 347 yards and five touchdowns on 58 carries the season to rank ninth among Sun Belt rushing leaders. He also ranks among the top four passing leaders with 230.8 passing yards per game.

Jones averages 300.2 yards per game in total offense ranks 20th nationally and is second among Sun Belt Conference leaders. He also is third in the SBC in passing efficiency with a rating of 134.0. He has completed 101 of 162 passes for 1,154 yards and seven touchdowns.

Tyler Jones is tied for fourth among the scoring leaders in the Sun Belt Conference with an average at 6.0 points per game. Jones scored his fifth rushing touchdown of the season at UL Lafayette. He also ran for a TD at Houston and rushed for three TD's against Southern Miss.
