THE RECORDS

Idaho is 2-4 overall and 1-2 in the Sun Belt, while ULM is 1-5 overall and 0-2 in league play. Their common opponent is Georgia Southern, which topped Idaho 44-20 and ULM 51-31.

THE COACHES

PAUL PETRINO is in his third season at Idaho. While it is his first head coaching job, it is not Petrino's first stint at Idaho. His coaching career began at Carroll College (his alma mater, 1989). From Carroll, he went to Idaho where he coached running back, receivers and special teams from 1992-94. From Idaho it was on to Utah State (1995-97), Louisville (1998-99), Southern Mississippi (2000-02), Louisville (2003-06), Atlanta Falcons (2007), Arkansas (2008-09), Illinois (2010-11) and Arkansas (2012).

TODD BERRY is 28-39 at ULM (57-98 overall) and is in his fifth season as head coach of the Warhawks. He graduated from Tulsa in 1983 and began his coaching career at Tennessee the same year. From Tennessee, he had assistantships at Tulsa (1984), Oklahoma State (1985), Tennessee-Martin (1986-88), Mississippi State (1989-90), Southeast Missouri State (1991) and East Carolina (1992-95) before head coaching stops at Illinois State (1996-99) and Army (2000-03). He served as ULM's offensive coordinator from 2004-05 before heading to the University of Miami (2006) and UNLV (2007-09).

THE SERIES

The series is tied 3-3, which includes last season's ULM victory at home. The two teams first played in 1993 in a I-AA (now FCS) playoff game at Monroe. Idaho won 34-31.

PAUL PETRINO'S RADIO SHOW

THEY'RE #1

Idaho is atop the Sun Belt rankings in seven individual and four team categories.

Individuals who are No. 1 in the league are:

- Austin Rehkow in field goals per game (1.83, eighth nationally)
- Dezmon Epps in receiving yards (659, 16th nationally)
- Dezmon Epps in receiving yards per game (131.8, fourth nationally)
- Dezmon Epps in receptions per game (10.4, second nationally)
- Quinton Bradley in sacks (1.00, 10th nationally)
- Chris Edwards in solo tackles (5.7, 19th nationally)
- Quinton Bradley in tackles for loss (1.7, 15th nationally)

As a team, the Vandals are No. 1 in:

- Fewest penalties with 30 (17th nationally)
- Fewest penalty yards per game with 5.00 (24th nationally)
- Fumbles lost with one (second nationally)
- Red zone offense at 1.000 (first nationally)

KIBBIE DOME EARNS MENTION

Not only are the Vandals gaining national attention because of their on-field prowess, their home stadium – the Kibbie Dome, was recognized last Saturday by USA Today. The national newspaper – in its College Football Fan Index, rated the Dome 10th among on its “10 stadiums with the best atmosphere in college football” list. LSU’s Tiger Stadium is No. 1 followed by Ohio State, UCLA, Michigan, Texas A&M, Georgia, Penn State, Clemson and Army.

MAKING A MARK

Matt Linehan has climbed to 11th on the all-time passing yards list with 3,838 yards 16 games into his career. Doug Nussmeier is the Vandals' all-time leader with 10,824; Matt's dad Scott is sixth at 7,018. He's tied for fifth in completion percentage at .603 and is third in average yards per game at 239.9.

Dezmon Epps is making a similar mark in the receiving records. His 15 catches in the Vandals' opener against Ohio tie for second-best all-time for a single game. He now is one of six players with seven or more games of 100 or more yards. Kasey Dunn is Idaho's all-time leader with 19 games of 100 or more yards.

Epps moved into 10th in career receptions with 131 and, for the



Junior Austin Rehkow's four field goals, which includes the game-winning 19-yarder with 3:01 left in the game, helped the Vandals win on the road for the first time since 2011 with their 19-16 victory over Troy University. His efforts led to his being honored as the Sun Belt Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week. From Spokane Valley, Wash., Rehkow's perfect string this fall was broken when a 52-yarder was just outside the left upright. Nevertheless, he is the Sun Belt's leader in field goals per game (1.83 - eighth nationally) and is second in the league and eighth nationally in field goal percentage at .917. Also last Saturday, he was good on his lone PAT attempt and continued his dependable double-duty as the Vandals' punter. One of just three FBS players to fill that dual role, he punted six times for an average of 42.5 yards Saturday night. His long was 61 yards. He is second in the league and 20th nationally in punting with an average of 44.4 yards per kick.

time being, has taken over the top spot in average receptions per game with 7.71 – just .04 Jerry Hendren, who set the standard when he played for the Vandals from 1967-69.

WATCHING THE NUMBERS

Matt Linehan's **36 completions** against Ohio University were the best in the nation on opening weekend. The same was true for Dezmon Epps' **15 receptions**. Epps turned those catches into **160 yards**, which ranked seventh opening weekend.

Linehan's 36 completions continue to be among the best in the country. He's tied for eighth with Bowling Green's Matt Johnson and East Carolina's Blake Kemp.

Epps' 15 catches against Ohio now are third-best for a single game this fall. He's tied with Bowling Green's Roger Lewis and Massachusetts's Tajae Sharpe.

DOUBLE DUTY SPECIALIST

Vandal junior kicker Austin Rehkow (Spokane Valley, Wash.) is one of just three FBS players who both kicks and punts for his team. He is joined in the group by Hawai'i's Rigoberto Sanchez and Old Dominion's Satchel Ziffer.

Rehkow, however, owns the best numbers. He's 20th in punting average and tied for second in field goal percentage after making 11 of 12 of his attempts. Additionally, he has made 15 of 16 PATs. Sanchez is 18th in punting and has made nine-of-10 PATs and six-of-eight field goals, while Ziffer is 79th in punting and has made five-of-five PATs and one-of-three field goals.

ACROSS THE COUNTRY - LITERALLY

When calculating air miles, Central Florida had the longest trip of any FBS school this all when it traveled to Stanford. The Vandals make the list twice - #13 at Troy (Alabama, 1,937 miles) and #15 at Auburn (Alabama, 2,079 miles). Two of the Vandals' opponents - Georgia Southern and Appalachian State, made the list when they come to Idaho. Georgia Southern's trip is #7 (2,098 miles) and Appalachian State's is #12 (1,925).

BIG IMPROVEMENT

One of the areas where the Vandals are most improved over one year ago is in penalties. Last year, they were 59th in the NCAA and sixth in the Sun Belt in total penalties; this year they're 17th and first. In fewest penalties per game, they went from 97 in the NCAA and eighth in the league to 24th and first; in fewest penalty yards per game they went from 88th and eighth to 31st and second, and in fewest penalty yards per game, they went from 109th and eighth to 41st and second.

► The Vandals snapped a road losing streak that extended back to their Nov. 5, 2011 victory at San Jose State.

► They also held an opponent scoreless in the first half for the first time since Sept. 18, 2010 when they led UNLV 24-0 en route to a 30-7 victory.

► Austin Rehkow made four field goals in a single game for the second time in his career. His game-winner came with 3:01 left.

► Dezmon Epps tallied his seventh career game of 100 or more yards receiving and he did it with his third double-digit receiving game - he had 10. He has had 100 or more yards in four of the five games he's played this season and has had double-figure receptions in three of five. He also spent some time on the other side of the ball and had two solo tackles as he helped out the injury-depleted secondary.

► The Vandals forced four turnovers with Russell Siavii and Marc Millan each grabbing an interception, and Tueni Lupeamanu and Armond Hawkins each with a fumble recovery. Kaylyn Ayers had both forced fumbles.

► Perhaps most impressive was Idaho managed it all after spending just 20 hours away from the Pacific Northwest because of travel adjustments made necessary because of repairs

to their plane. They left the Spokane, Wash., airport at 3:30 a.m. (PT, which is 5:30 a.m. CT) Saturday. They touched down at Montgomery, Ala., at 9:09 a.m. CT (7:09 a.m. PT) before heading to their hotel for breakfast and taping. They were back in Idaho when they touched down at the Lewiston airport at approximately 11:35 p.m. Saturday.

NOTABLES VS. ARKANSAS STATE

- ▶ Redshirt freshman Jake Luton made his first collegiate start and became just the second quarterback in school history to score three rushing touchdowns in a single game. His total matched that of Doug Nussmeier, who accomplished the feat in 1992.
- ▶ Senior linebacker Chris Edwards had his first interception of the season and third of his career. This one he ran back 20 yards to score – the first for Idaho since 2011.
- ▶ Broc Westlake, another senior linebacker, has his best game as a Vandal with 12 tackles with true freshman Kaden Ellis right behind with 11.
- ▶ Senior defensive end Quinton Bradley, the Sun Belt's sack leader, had two sacks.

NOTABLES VS. GEORGIA SOUTHERN

- ▶ Dezmon Epps notched his sixth career game of 100 or more receiving yards. His 165 were the second-best of his career and his third game of 100 or more yards in as many games this season.
- ▶ Jordan Grabski and Armond Hawkins had 10 solo tackles apiece. It wasn't Grabski's career best but it was for Hawkins, who added two tackles for loss for -10 yards to his day.
- ▶ Dorian Clark had the Vandals' first interception of the season.

▶ Austin Rehkow continued to be perfect on field goals this fall with two more against the Eagles.

NOTABLES VS. WOFFORD

- ▶ Russell Siavii's return of a fumble for a touchdown was the first for the Vandals since 2011. The 10-yard return was Idaho's first TD of the game.
- ▶ With Dezmon Epps tallying 139 yards and Trent Cowan added 107, it was the first time since 2009 that the Vandals had two receivers with 100 or more yards in a game.
- ▶ Aaron Duckworth's three rushing TDs marked the first time since 2009 to score at least three rushing TDs in a game. He's one of just 15 Vandals in history to score three in one game.
- ▶ Matt Linehan had his sixth 300-plus passing game and Dezmon Epps had his fifth 100-plus receiving game.
- ▶ The Vandals had eight tackles-for-loss with four of them in the crucial fourth quarter. Quinton Bradley had a career high of three for -14 yards.

NOTABLES VS. USC

- ▶ Jordan Grabski and Chris Edwards had nine tackles each to lead the Vandals with Dorian Clark adding another eight. Edwards was responsible for one of Idaho's two tackles for loss. Kaylyn Ayers had the other.
- ▶ Five Vandals – defensive backs Garren Jackson and D.J. Hampton, and receivers Calvary Pugh, Kareem Coles and Jante Boston, all saw action for the first time. Three of them – Pugh, Coles and Boston, all are true freshmen.

Brian Lindgren has the record with 49 at Middle Tennessee in 2001 with Ken Hobart's 37 against Southern Colorado in 1983 second best. Linehan is tied with Ryan Fien, who threw his against Wyoming in 1996.

► Dezmon Epps' was a big part of that total as his 15 receptions put him in a four-way tie for second on the Idaho all-time list. Epps' 15 are the most catches by a Vandal since Chris Lacy caught 15 at Middle Tennessee in 2001. Also at 15 are Scott Dahlquist (1990) and Jerry Hendren (1968). Hendren is the all-time single-game leader with 17 at Southern Mississippi in 1969.

► Elijahaa Penny had a career day in terms of all-purpose rushing with 69 rushing, 32 receiving and 66 on kickoff returns.

► Linehan used nine receivers with seven of them catching at least two passes.
