Sun Belt Football Teams Jockeying for Position in Conference Standings

Appalachian State and Arkansas State earned key conference victories to stay undefeated and atop the league standings this past week while Idaho, Texas State, and Troy all saw their stock rise.

Appalachian State (6-1, 3-0 Sun Belt) began a three-game homestand with its biggest win of the season to date, a 31-13 win over longtime rival Georgia Southern last Thursday night. With the victory over Georgia Southern, the Mountaineers became the first Sun Belt team to reach the bowl eligible mark this season and also became the first team to ever defeat the Eagles in a Sun Belt Conference game. Georgia Southern (5-2, 3-1 Sun Belt) was 11-0 in Sun Belt play since joining the league in 2014.

For the first time in eight years, Appalachian State received votes in this week's Associated Press College Football Top 25 poll. The Mountaineers received a total of six points in this week's AP poll, good for eighth in the "also receiving votes" category (33rd overall).

The Mountaineers host Troy this Saturday with the Trojans coming off of an impressive 52-7 road victory over New Mexico State this past Saturday.

Meanwhile, Arkansas State has won three consecutive games and is 4-3 after seven games for the fourth time over the last five seasons (2011, 2012, 2014, 2015). The win this past Tuesday against rivals UL Lafayette pushed the Red Wolves to Arkansas State is 3-0 in Sun Belt Conference play for the first time since the 2011 season. Headed into this Saturday, Arkansas State holds a 2-0 all-time record against Georgia State after picking up a 35-33 win in Jonesboro in 2013 and a 52-10 win in Atlanta last season.

Georgia Southern will look to bounce back after its loss to Appalachian State when it hosts Texas State Thursday night in a primetime ESPN3 matchup. Texas State is coming off a convincing 36-18 win over South Alabama.

Georgia State, Idaho, UL Lafayette, and Texas State are currently stuck in a four-way logjam for fourth place in the conference standings.

Sun Belt Student-Athlete Experience

The advantages of competing in college sports in the Sun Belt Conference are both immediate and lifelong. Sun Belt student-athletes are provided with unique opportunities to learn, compete and succeed. Sun Belt student-athletes have access to career services counselors assisting with writing resumes and identifying internships and summer jobs, career workshops, preparation for interviews/mock interviews, and etiquette classes. Sun Belt student-athletes have life experiences such as team building, domestic and foreign travel, community service, mentoring, and recognition through honors and awards.

Robert Lowe (Texas State, RB, Sr., Criminal Justice)

Robert Lowe rushed for a career-high of 248 yards and scored three touchdowns to lead Texas State to a 36-18 victory over South Alabama. It is his first 200-yard rushing game this season and second of his career. He gained 207 yards and scored two of his touchdowns on 17 carries in the second half, including a 54-yard TD run for Texas State's final touchdown in the game. He also scored on a two-yard TD run and a 16-yard TD rush.

Cody Brown (Arkansas State, DB, Jr., Communications)

Junior safety Cody Brown tied his career high with seven tackles, posted one pass break-up and returned his third interception of the season 30 yards for a touchdown during Arkansas State's 37-27 victory over Louisiana-Lafayette. Brown, who has now picked off a pass in three consecutive games, led an A-State defense that limited Ragin' Cajuns quarterback Jalen Nixon to just 17-of-44 passing on the night. His pick-six came early in the second quarter and gave the Red Wolves a 27-0 lead. His final tackle of the night came at a crucial moment in the game as well. Trailing by just 10 points with over seven minutes to play, Louisiana-Lafayette drove all the way to the A-State 33 yard line before Brown came up with a fourth-down tackle of running back Elijah McGuire to preserve the Red Wolves' lead.

Lumi Kaba (Texas State, PK/P, Jr., Exploratory Professional Studies)

Lumi Kaba averaged 47.7 yards on seven punts, 65.0 yards on six kickoffs and scored five points on a field goal and two extra-point attempts against South Alabama. Kaba had a season-long 69-yard punt and placed five inside the 20-yard line. He had three punts downed inside the 10-yard line, including two on the one-yard line. Kaba had four of his six kickoffs result in a touchback. He also kicked a 36-yard field goal and made both of his two extra-point attempts.

2015 SUN BELT CONFERENCE PRESEASON POLL

Eagles Tabbed to Repeat as League Champions in 2015

NEW ORLEANS – Georgia Southern was picked as the favorite to repeat and win the conference championship in the 2015 Sun Belt Conference Football Preseason Poll, voted on by the league’s 11 head coaches.

The Eagles received six of the 11 first-place votes and tallied 110 points, narrowly surpassing the UL Lafayette Ragin’ Cajuns who tallied 108 points and three first-place votes. The Eagles claimed the 2014 Sun Belt regular season title with a perfect 8-0 conference record. The Cajuns finished 7-1 in league play and won their fourth consecutive R+L New Orleans Bowl.

Arkansas State was chosen third with 96 points and one first-place vote and was followed by Appalachian State in fourth with 82 points. The Red Wolves made their fourth consecutive appearance in the GoDaddy Bowl in 2014 as they look for yet another stellar campaign. The Mountaineers closed out 2014 with six consecutive victories – one of the five longest win streaks in the country heading into the 2015 season.

Texas State, with 78 points, was picked to finish fifth to round out the top five. South Alabama was picked to finish sixth and received the final first-place vote; UL Monroe was seventh followed by Troy in eighth. Georgia State was picked ninth, New Mexico State tenth and Idaho 11th.

The Eagles return 13 total starters to the team that finished 9-3 a year ago. A few key returners are dual-threat quarterback Kevin Ellison, All-Conference running back Matt Breida, running back L.A. Ramsby and All-Conference defensive back Matt Dobson.

2015 SUN BELT NEWS AND NOTES

Sun Belt Membership

The Sun Belt Conference consists of 13 total institutions – two (Idaho and New Mexico State) are football only members and two (Little Rock and UT Arlington) are non-football members. Coastal Carolina accepted an invitation to the Sun Belt on September 1 and will begin competing in all sports, with the exception of football, beginning with the 2016-17 season. The Chanticleer football program will begin a transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision with its first year of full FBS status coming in 2018.

Coastal Carolina to Join Sun Belt Conference

On September 1, Coastal Carolina University accepted an invitation to join the Sun Belt Conference and will begin competing in all sports, with the exception of football, beginning with the 2016-17 season. The Chanticleer football program will begin a transition to the Football Bowl Subdivision with its first year of full FBS status coming in 2018. During the transition, the Chanticleers will compete as a Sun Belt member in 2017 and have the opportunity to compete for the conference football championship, but they will not be eligible to participate in the postseason.

Arkansas State's Knighten Named Candidate for Senior Class Award

Arkansas State senior quarterback Fredi Knighten was one of 30 FBS student-athletes to be selected as a candidate for the 2015 Senior CLASS Award recently. The honor recognizes student-athletes, who excel both on and off the field of competition. In the community, Knighten has assisted with many service efforts. He helped with a tornado relief fund drive by assisting in the recovery process for the geographic regions hit by several tornadoes in the state and region. He has helped with the Life Champs program, which is a football camp held in his hometown of Little Rock, Ark., that helps kids with football and life lessons.

40 NFL Players from Sun Belt Conference Institutions on 2015 Rosters

The Sun Belt Conference has 40 players in the NFL representing its 11 football-playing member institutions for the 2015 season. The conference is represented on 23 of the 32 NFL teams. Appalachian State tops the list of active NFL players with seven, while Arkansas State and Troy have six each.

Sun Belt Conference Part of NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl

The Arizona Sports and Entertainment Commission recently announced the creation of the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl. The bowl game will debut on Dec. 29, 2015 and will match two teams from the Mountain West Conference, Conference USA and the Sun Belt Conference. The game will be played at the University of Arizona's stadium in Tucson, Ariz. The NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl is the first-ever bowl game to have a digitally-focused broadcast strategy to be orchestrated by primary digital media partner Campus Insiders. Details and technology partnerships along with the television broadcast partner will be announced at a later date.

Mountaineer News and Notes

Red-hot Appalachian State continues a three-game homestand Saturday afternoon when it hosts its annual Family Weekend contest versus Sun Belt Conference foe Troy.

Appalachian State (6-1, 3-0 Sun Belt) began its the three-game homestand with its biggest win of the season to date, a 31-13 rout over longtime rival Georgia Southern in a nationally televised Sun Belt showdown last Thursday night.

With the victory over Georgia Southern, the Mountaineers became the first team to ever defeat the Eagles in a Sun Belt Conference game. Georgia Southern (5-2, 3-1 Sun Belt) was 11-0 in Sun Belt play since joining the league in 2014.

After knocking off Georgia Southern, Appalachian now owns the Sun Belt's longest conference winning streak with nine-straight league wins. The Mountaineers have also won five-straight games and 11 of their last 12 contests overall.

For the first time in eight years, Appalachian State received votes in this week's Associated Press College Football Top 25 poll. The Mountaineers received a total of six points in this week's AP poll, good for eighth in the "also receiving votes" category (33rd overall).

Appalachian State is the first Sun Belt Conference team to receive votes for the AP poll this season.

When still a member of NCAA Division I FCS in 2007, the Mountaineers' historic 34-32 victory over No. 5 Michigan prompted the AP to make all NCAA Division I teams (FCS and FBS) eligible to receive votes in its Top 25 poll. Prior to Appalachian's historic win at Michigan, voters could only include FBS teams on their ballots. The new policy was dubbed the "Appalachian State Rule" by some. Following the policy shift, App State went on to receive votes in the AP Top 25 poll on three occasions in 2007, including seven points in the season's final poll, good for a tie for ninth in the "also receiving votes" listing.

Appalachian State continues to lead the Sun Belt Conference in both total defense (277.0 ypg) and total offense (482.0 ypg). The Mountaineers are the only team to rank among the top 20 nationally in both total defense (7th) and total offense (20th).

In the latest of a string of ultra-impressive performances by its defense, Appalachian State limited Georgia Southern (the nation's top rushing team at 399.0 ypg coming into last Thursday's game) to a season-low 188 yards on the ground.

Eagle News and Notes

Georgia Southern and Texas State have met just twice on the gridiron with both teams capturing a win.

Last season, safety Matt Dobson returned an interception 100 yards on the last play of the third quarter to give the Eagles a 28-10 lead, but then GS had to hold on late as the Bobcats scored twice, but an onside kick failed and GS ran out the clock to escape with a 28-25 road win.

In the only other meeting between the two teams, No. 6 GS traveled to No. 4 TSU for a first-round FCS playoff game in 2005, with the Bobcats rallying to win 50-35.

This will be the first meeting between the two teams in Statesboro.

Georgia Southern head Coach Willie Fritz and Texas State head coach Dennis Franchione are both natives of Kansas and graduates of Pittsburg State University in Pittsburg, Kansas. The two Gorilla alumni have met twice as head coaches previously: in 2011 with Fritz's Sam Houston State Bearkats taking a 36-14 victory in San Marcos, and last year with the Eagles winning 28-25 in San Marcos, as well.

Franchione is third among active FBS head coaches in career wins with 212, while Fritz is tied for 12th with 151 NCAA wins, although he has 190 career wins if you count the 39 wins in four seasons at Blinn, a junior college.

The Eagles are 4-2 all-time in games played on Thursdays, including 3-0 at Paulson Stadium on that weeknight. Georgia Southern defeated Appalachian State and Troy last season and battled the elements for the victory over Middle Tennessee State in the 1989 "Hugo Bowl." Coach Willie Fritz is 17-3 as a head coach in Thursday night games.

Panther News and Notes

After an open week, Georgia State returns to Sun Belt play at Arkansas State, beginning a stretch of six conference games in six weeks.

The Panthers' last game was a 31-19 victory at Mid-American Conference foe Ball State. Nick Arbuckle passed for 412 yards and accounted for three touchdowns and Robert Davis had career highs with nine catches for 125 yards to back a strong performance by the Georgia State defense.

The GSU defense held Ball State to 19 points, the fewest points allowed under head coach Trent Miles. Ball State managed no run longer than 13 yards and no pass longer than 19 yards.

Quarterback Nick Arbuckle leads the Sun Belt and ranks eighth in FBS in passing with 326.8 yards per game. He also leads the conference in completion percentage (66.2 percent) and total offense (317.3) while ranking second in pass efficiency (150.2) and third in touchdown passes (11).

In 18 games in a GSU uniform, Arbuckle is averaging 291.3 yards passing per game. That ranks second among all FBS quarterbacks, trailing only Cal's Jared Goff.

After nine receptions for 125 yards and one touchdown vs. Ball State, Robert Davis now ranks second in Georgia State history in career receptions (125), yards (1,878) and touchdowns (9, tied with Danny Williams), trailing only current NFL receiver Albert Wilson in all three categories.

Davis has caught at least one pass in every game he has played (30 consecutive games).

Quarterback Nick Arbuckle and wide receiver Donovan Harden hooked up for a 68-yard pass play down to the 2-yard line to set up the game-clinching touchdown vs. Ball State. That is GSU's eighth pass play of the season of 50 yards or longer. Four different receivers have been involved: Harden (76 vs. Liberty, 57 vs. Liberty, 68 vs. Ball State); Robert Davis (75 vs. Oregon, 61 vs. Liberty); Penny Hart (58 vs. Liberty, 53 vs. Charlotte), and Nyiakki Height (51 vs. New Mexico State).

Senior linebacker Joseph Peterson, who had a game-high 14 tackles vs. Ball State, leads the Sun Belt with 10.7 tackles per game, good for 10th in FBS.

Peterson ranks fourth among all active FBS players in career tackles with 325, the GSU record.

Senior safety Tarris Batiste is second on the team and third in the Sun Belt with 9.0 tackles per game. He is also second to Joseph Peterson in Georgia State annals with 217 career tackles.

Vandal News and Notes

Idaho's victory over Louisiana-Monroe marked its fourth successive Homecoming game win in one of the most balanced games the Vandals have played this season. It also was the first time Idaho won back-to-back since 2009 when it won five successive games and advanced to – and won, the Humanitarian Bowl.

Senior Elijah Penny followed the lead of his line en route to 184 yards on 36 carries. His 36 carries are the best in the Sun Belt this season and fourth-best in all of the FBS at the midpoint of the 2015 campaign. The 36 carries tie for fifth all-time at Idaho and the 184 yards as the 16th best in the Vandals' 121 years of football.

Balance was provided sophomore quarterback Matt Linehan, who completed 23 of 39 passes. He threw three touchdown strikes for the third time in his career as he notched his sixth game of 300 or more yards with his 315. With that effort, he moved into 10th on Idaho's all-time passing yards list.

Senior Dezmon Epps neared the 100-yard mark again but was just shy with nine catches for 98 yards. With those nine catches, he moves into a tie for seventh with Yo Murphy on Idaho's all-time list with 140. He is on the verge of breaking one of Idaho's oldest receiving record – average per catch. His average of 7.78 is just .11 ahead of Jerry Hendren's mark set from 1967-69.

Linehan's three touchdown tosses went to the tight ends – Buck Cowan for 36 yards and Deon Watson for 34 and 23.

Freshman linebacker Kaden Elliss had one of the best games by a first-year player with nine total tackles and three tackles-for-loss. He and senior defensive end Quinton Bradley are two of just a handful of players to record three tackles-for-loss in a single game. Elliss was honored this weekend by College Football Madness as the Sun Belt's Defensive Player of the Week.

Speaking of Bradley, he continues to be the Sun Belt Conference leader in tackles for loss and sacks. His 1.6 tackles-for-loss per game are 13th nationally and his .86 sacks per game are 18th nationally.

Ragin' Cajun News and Notes

The Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns will return to action on Saturday after an 11-day layoff when it plays host to in-state rival ULM in the 70th annual Homecoming game at Cajun Field. Kickoff is scheduled for 4 p.m. and will be televised on ESPN3.

UL Lafayette (2-4, 1-1 SBC) looks to rebound after a 37-27 loss at Arkansas State on Oct. 20 in a nationally-televised contest.

The Ragin' Cajuns lead the all-time series against ULM (1-6, 0-3 SBC), 26-24, and have won six of last seven meetings, including 34-27 victory in last year's contest in Monroe. ULM rallied for a 31-28 win in the last meeting at Cajun Field (Nov. 30, 2013).

Junior Jalen Nixon became the second quarterback in school history to record both 200 yards rushing and passing in a single game. Nixon completed 17 of 44 passes for a career-high 253 yards and two TDs while rushing for 201 yards on 19 carries. The Carencro native joined Brian Mitchell, who rushed for 271 yards and passed for 205 yards against Colorado State in 1987, as the lone players in Ragin' Cajuns to record 200 yards rushing and passing in the same game.

Nixon's 201 yards on the ground were the ninth-most in school history and fourth all-time among Ragin' Cajuns quarterbacks.

Elijah McGuire tied a career-high with 10 receptions for UL Lafayette (2-4, 1-1 SBC) while setting a career-best with 134 yards receiving. The junior, who entered the game with 999 yards receiving in his career, took a swing pass from Nixon and gained 21 yards to become the first player in school history to record 2,000 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving in a career.

McGuire became the third player in school history to record 4,000 all-purpose yards in his career following Tyrell Fenroy (5,231 yards from 2005-08) and Darryl Surgent (4,945 from 2010-13).

McGuire's 32 yards rushing marked the seventh-fewest yards gained in a game and the second-lowest in a Sun Belt Conference contest (three carries, 13 yards at South Alabama, 12/7/2013).

Marcus Green had his second straight six-catch game, tying his career-high.

De'Vonte Haggerty's 16-yard catch was his first of the season after sitting out due to injury for the first five games and making an appearance the previous week.

Aggie News and Notes

The NM State football team is ready to host Idaho on Saturday at 6 p.m. MT in Aggie Memorial Stadium. This Halloween game will be both a black out and the school's annual Ag Day and will air on AggieVision and ESPN3. The game will be broadcast on AM 570.

Last Saturday, the Aggies dropped to 0-7 on the season and 0-3 in conference play as they fell 52-7 to Troy in the combination homecoming and Tough Enough to Wear Pink game. After falling behind by 35, the home team's bright spot of the evening, Larry Rose III, received a 13-yard pass from Andrew Allen to put NM State on the board.

Rose III rushed his way into the record books as he amassed 180 yards on the ground against Troy. With these 180 yards, the sophomore now has 1,973 career rushing yards, which ranks ninth all-time for the Aggies. Rose III currently has 871 rushing yards for the season as he is only 129 yards away from his second 1,000-yard rushing season.

Additionally, Rose III led the team in receiving with five catches for a career-high 67 yards and one touchdown. The receiving touchdown is the first he has had since his first game in an Aggie uniform, the 2014 season opener against Cal Poly. Rose III now has 180 receiving yards on 20 catches for 2015. Rose III also led the team in all-purpose yards with a game-high 247 yards.

Andrew Allen went 13-of-33 for 161 yards, one touchdown and had no interceptions. The sophomore quarterback is 43-of-84 for 469 yards and four touchdowns in his two games this season.

Derek Ibekwe and Dalton Herrington both racked up eight tackles, and Herrington added 1.0 tackles for loss. Ibekwe leads the team with 65 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss through seven games. The sophomore also has a forced fumble on the season. Herrington has 34 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss and an interception.

This week's opponent, Idaho, is coming off its second-straight conference win after topping ULM 27-13 in the Kibbie Dome. Quarterback Matt Linehan led the team as he went 23-of-39 for 315 yards, three touchdowns and an interception. Elijah Penny led the Vandals' rushing efforts as he amassed 184 yards on 34 carries.

NM State and Idaho have met 21 times before, with the Vandals holding a 15-6 series advantage. The two teams last met on Oct. 18, 2014 in Moscow, Idaho as the home team captured a 29-17 victory.

Jaguar News and Notes

South Alabama dropped a 36-18 decision at Texas State Saturday, marking the first time this season that the Jaguars have dropped back-to-back contests ... Blake Dees recorded a career- and South Alabama season-high 15 stops to lead all players in the game, a total that included a school-record-tying 12 solo tackles. The senior was credited with five stops in the opening quarter to help the Jaguar defense limit the Bobcats to just 24 yards, and had 11 tackles in the opening half as USA allowed Texas State 166 yards before the break. It's the second time this season that Dees has posted a double-figure total in the category and the team-leading third occasion he has paced the Jags in stops. ... After crossing the goal line on a two-yard run early in the fourth quarter — the second straight outing he has recorded a rushing touchdown — Gerald Everett has now scored in five straight contests, tying the fourth-longest streak in program history first set by Demetre Baker from Sept. 10-Oct. 15, 2011. The effort also helped the junior enter the top 10 on USA's season scoring list as he has a team-high 48 points after seven games. ... Senior DL DeMarion Harper was credited with multiple tackles behind the line of scrimmage for the third time in the last five contests with two against the Bobcats, taking over the team lead in the category with seven on the season. That total included the Jaguars' lone sack of the night, tying for the most on the squad as well. ... In addition to intercepting the first pass of his career in the opening quarter of the TXST game, Jalen Thompson equaled a career high with five total tackles. The freshman — who also broke up a pass, and is now tied for the team lead with five total passes defended — has been credited with multiple tackles in each of the last three contests. ... Aleem Sunanon became the first individual in program history to kick 10 or more field goals in three different seasons when he converted a 32-yard attempt midway through the opening quarter to give the Jags their only lead of night. The junior is 10-of-13 on the season having made at least one field goal in each of USA's first seven outings, rankings second on the team in scoring with 46 points. ... After collecting a team-best 93 yards on just nine carries against the Bobcats, Xavier Johnson is now the sixth player in school history to rush for 500 yards in a season. It was the second time this fall that Johnson has averaged better than 10 yards per carry, while the sophomore's 61-yard run that set up the Jaguars' first points of the game was his first offensive play of 20 or more yards since USA defeated San Diego State on Sept. 19.

Bobcat News and Notes

Texas State will be looking to win its second straight game when the Bobcats play at Georgia Southern just five days after defeating South Alabama 36-18 in San Marcos. The win evens Texas State's conference record to 1-1 this season.

Texas State's game at Georgia Southern will match a pair of former Pittsburg State graduates against each other as head coaches Dennis Franchione and Willie Fritz both graduated from the school.

Senior running back Robert Lowe rushed for a career-best 248 yards on 30 carries against South Alabama. It marks the second 200-yard game of Lowe's career and his 248 yards rushing are the second-highest single game rushing total by a Sun Belt Conference player this season. The game also marks the second 100-yard game this season. He also ran for 236 yards against Arkansas State last season.

Lowe enters the Georgia Southern game ranked fifth among the Sun Belt Conference rushing leaders after finishing last season among the top five rushing leaders in the Sun Belt. He ranks sixth among Texas State's career rushing leaders with 2650 yards on 445 carries during his career. He moved past former NFL players Ricky Sanders and Reggie Rivers on the career rushing yards list with his 248 yards against South Alabama.

Tyler Jones added 71 yards rushing against South Alabama with 56 yards coming on Texas State's first touchdown drive against South Alabama. He scored his sixth touchdown of the season on a two-yard run and that equals his single-season best in his career. He also ran for six touchdowns last season.

Lumi Kaba averaged 47.7 yards on seven punts against South Alabama after recording a pair of 50-yard punts and placing five punts inside the 20 yard line, including three boots inside the 10. He had a season-long 69-yard punt and had a 59-yard kick against the Jaguars. His 69-yard punt is the longest punt by a Sun Belt Conference player this season.

Kaba placed two punts on the one-yard line and another on the six. He enters the Georgia Southern game averaging 43.0 yards on 32 punts this season. He has six 50-yard punts overall and placed 10 inside the 20 this season.

Brandon McDowell returned a missed field goal 100 yards at the end of the first half for a touchdown and it was his second return for a touchdown this season. McDowell also set a school record with a 95-yard punt return for a touchdown against Prairie View earlier this year.

Texas State forced a punt on South Alabama's opening drive and it marks the first opponent who has punted their opening drive. The first five opponents opened a game with a touchdown three times, a fumble and a turnover on downs.

Trojan News and Notes

Troy's 52 points are the most the Trojans have scored in a Sun Belt game and against an FBS opponent ... Troy scored 21 points against New Mexico State in the first quarter. The last time the Trojans scored 21 points in the first quarter was on Oct. 20, 2007, vs. North Texas ... Troy's 45 points in the first half were the most points in a first half since the Trojans put up 52 points on Alcorn State in 2008 ... Troy improved to 53-32 in Sun Belt play since joining the conference in 2004, which is the second most wins in the league over that time period ... Troy ranks third in Sun Belt wins overall (53) ... Troy scored on seven straight drives to close out the first half ... Redshirt freshman Jay Dye and junior Xavier Fields made their first career starts on the offensive line ... This season Troy has scored in less than two minutes on 13-of-19 (4-of-6 tonight) touchdown drives; Troy entered the game with 69.2 percent of its touchdown drives under two minutes .. Senior Tommy Blevins made his first appearance of the season, after battling an injury in the beginning of the season .. Senior K.D. Edenfield caught his first career touchdown pass on an 4-yard pass from Brandon Silvers in the first quarter ... Senior Brandon Burks took off for a 92-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, the longest touchdown run of his career; the 92-yard rush tied the school record for longest run, which was set by Jerry Reeves against Louisiana College in 1964 ..
