- 1 A win by the Ragin' Cajuns would make the team bowl eligible for the fifth time in six years under head coach **Mark Hudspeth**.
- 2 Senior receiver **Al Riles** has caught a pass in 27 consecutive games dating back to the 2014 season.
- 3 Senior **Elijah McGuire** is one of two players in school history to rush for over 4,000 yards in a career.
- 4 McGuire needs 82 yards to reach the 1,000-yard mark for the third straight season.
- 5 Sophomore receiver **Keenan Barnes** is tied for the Sun Belt Conference lead with six touch-down receptions.

The **Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns**® is the nickname of the University's athletic teams. We politely ask that you refer to our athletic programs as simply "Louisiana" on first reference, or use the any of the following: Ragin' Cajuns or Cajuns.

- For all electronic sports tickers and TV crawls only (effective Nov. 1, 2016), please use "LA" as the official abbreviation for all athletic programs.
- The Sun Belt Conference has made public its University Reference Guide that is used to reference each member institution's athletic title and nicknames. The publication of the guide comes after all of the conference's presidents and chancellors submitted their preferred reference.
- The Sun Belt Conference will begin to use these references immediately. Sun Belt member institutions and media partners are encouraged to use these references so that there is consistency across all communication platforms.

PRESS BOX MEDIA SERVICES

Pre-game notes, programs, guides and statistics along with other information will be provided to all media members prior to kickoff. Play-by-play and stat sheets are provided at the end of each quarter. Live running stats are also available via monitors throughout press row and on the internet at www.ragincajuns.com during the game.

Members of the Louisiana SID staff will man the press box phone number, (337) 851-2255, which should be used for any questions or information needed during the game.

Louisiana and the Football Writer's Association of America (FWAA) remind you that the Cajun Field press box is a working press facility and that cheering for either team will not be tolerated. Violators will be asked to leave by security personnel.

WORKING PRESS AREA

The entrance to the Cajun Field press box is through the press elevator, located at Gate B adjacent to the elevator tower on the west side of Cajun Field.

The press box opens approximately three hours prior to game time and meals will be served in the press box beginning approximately 90 minutes before kickoff.

Working media credentials are required for admittance to the press box and for meals.

The Level 1 area is reserved for media members as well as game staff and statistical personnel. Broadcast outlets, coaches booths, game management areas and restrooms are located on Level 2. The camera deck is below Level 1.

THE SERIES

- Louisiana continues one of its longest rivalries in school history today when it faces ULM in the regular-season finale at JPS Field at Malone Stadium. The schools meet for the 52nd time in a series that began in 1951.
- The Ragin' Cajuns have an official 26-24 lead in the series and have won five straight games in Monroe dating back to 2005.
- The series is tied at 11-11 in games played in Monroe while the Ragin' Cajuns have officially won six of the last seven contests.

THE LAST MEETING - Louisiana 30, ULM 24, 10/31/2015 at Lafayette

- Jamal Robinson finished with a team-high 92 yards receiving, 64 coming on a late touch-down pass from Brooks Haack, as the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns rallied for a soggy 30-24 victory over ULM in the 70th Homecoming Game.
- Playing in a torrential downpour throughout the game, the Ragin' Cajuns (3-4, 2-1 Sun Belt) began their comeback with a score on the first possession of the second half. A pair of Torrey Pierce runs covering 32 yards put the Cajuns in a goal-line situation and two plays later Elijah McGuire bulldozed his way into the endzone, slicing ULM's lead to 24-16 at the 10:50 mark of the third.
- A series of defensive stops ensued until the Cajuns' special teams came up with blocked punt that was recovered by Montrel Carter at the ULM 16. After failing to get a first down, a roughing the kicker penalty gave the Cajuns new life and they took advantage as Haack later scored on a 13-yard run to make it a 24-22 ballgame.
- ULM (1-7, 0-4 Sun Belt) maintained the lead after Stevie Artigue missed a 37-yard field with 6:18 remaining, but was unable to move the chains and was forced to give the ball back to the Cajuns with 3:20 to play.
- On the next play, Haack connected with Robinson on the 64-yard touchdown play. After McGuire scored on a two-point conversion, the Cajuns led 30-24.
- The Ragin' Cajuns defense made their seventh and final stand of the second half when Mario Osborne forced a fumble on a sack of Garrett Smith, which was recovered by LaDarrus Kidd with 1:38 to play. After ULM called its final two timeouts, McGuire preserved the win running over the right tackle to convert on a third and short.
- Louisiana's defense limited ULM to five first downs and 106 yards of offense in the decisive second stanza. Dominique Tovell led the charge finishing with 12 tackles (10 solo) and two of the team's five sacks. Haack completed 6-of-11 passes for 85 yards during the rally.

FORMER RAGIN' CAJUN PEANUT TILLMAN JOINS CREW AT "FOX NFL KICKOFF"

- After announcing his retirement this summer after a spectacular 13-year career in the NFL, former Ragin' Cajuns star Charles "Peanut" Tillman was announced as a new member on FOX NFL Kickoff.
- Tillman, a member of the UL Athletics Hall of Fame, played for Louisiana from 1999-02 and was the first Ragin' Cajuns player to be named to the All-Sun Belt Conference team (2001).
- An honorable mention AP All-American in 2002, Tillman finished his career at UL with 284 tackles, 12 interceptions and 31 pass breakups in 44 games.
- Tillman, who replaces Randy Moss on the program, joins Charissa Thompson, Colin Cowherd and Dave Wannstedt.

- Louisiana did not leave the state during the month of September, playing games at home against Boise State (Sept. 3), McNeese State (Sept. 10) and South Alabama (Sept. 17) before traveling for the first time in 2016 to face Tulane (Sept. 24) at Yulman Stadium.
- Louisiana's first trip out of state was Oct. 1 when it visited New Mexico State in a Sun Belt Conference game.

- As with most schools, Louisiana has placed a heavy emphasis on recruiting players within its state borders as 56 players on the roster, including 19 from the nine-parish Acadiana region, hail from the state of Louisiana.

SBC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME COMING IN 2018

- The Sun Belt Conference will hold its first ever football championship game as the league's presidents and chancellors, as well as athletic directors, voted unanimously to play the game beginning in 2018. The announcement was made on June 8, 2016.
- Details regarding how the two participants will be selected will be available at a later date. Rules set forward by the Division I Council in January require conferences with fewer than 12 members to hold championship games in football, as long as they meet one of two conditions.
- A conference can choose to either play their championship game between division winners after round-robin competition in each division or between the top two teams in the conference standings following full round-robin, regular-season competition between all members of the conference.

McGUIRE SETS UL ALL-PURPOSE YARDS RECORD; 4TH AMONG ACTIVE PLAYERS

- With 53 all-purpose yards on Oct. 12 against Appalachian State, Elijah McGuire moved past Tyrell Fenroy as the Ragin' Cajuns all-time leader with 5,236 yards.
- McGuire set the record in the third quarter with a 13-yard run that surpassed Fenroy's total of 5,231 yards set from 2005-08.
- McGuire, who is one of nine active NCAA players with 5,000 all-purpose yards, recorded 223 yards of total offense in a 28-23 win against South Alabama and passed **Darryl Surgent** for second-place on the school's all-time list.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- Senior transfer **Anthony Jennings** notched his third multi-passing touchdown game of the season in the win over Arkansas State throwing for 242 yards and two touchdowns. He had back-to-back games with multiple passing TDs against South Alabama and Tulane. He had just one multi-passing TD game in his three years at LSU.
- Jennings became the first Louisiana quarterback to rush for three touchdowns in a game since 2009 with his performance at Georgia rushing for 93 yards and three scores on 16 carries. Brad McGuire was the last quarterback to post three rushing TDs against FAU on Oct. 24, 2009.
- Jennings had a streak of three straight games with a rushing TD snapped against Arkansas State. He has set a new season-high for rushing TDs with seven on the year and moved into the team lead in rushing TDs. He previous best came at LSU where he rushed for two touchdowns as a freshman.
- Jennings also set a season-best for passing yards with 2,083 yards on 183 completions through 11 games. He had 1,611 yards on 111 completions as a sophomore at LSU.
- Jennings has thrown for 200-plus yards in four games this season. He posted a career-best 256 passing yards going 18-for-26 in the win over the Jaguars. His previous career-high for passing was 239 yards against 14th-ranked Wisconsin in the 2014 season opener for LSU.
- Jennings has passed for a touchdown in all but four games this season. He is tied for seventh in the Sun Belt with 11 passing TDs.
- Jennings is averaging 11 carries per game on the season and is one of five Cajuns on the season to post 100-plus yards on the ground. He is second on the squad with 300 rushing yards.
- Jennings has been sacked 28 times on the season accounting for 193 of the 230 yards he has lost on the ground.
- Jennings tied a career-high with three passing touchdowns against South Alabama to lead the Ragin' Cajuns to a 28-23 victory. He passed for three touchdowns as a sophomore at LSU against Sam Houston State in 2014.
- Jennings saw his first career action for the Ragin' Cajuns in the season opener against Boise State. He threw for 186 yards and a touchdown against the Broncos.
- Jennings spent three seasons at LSU seeing action in 24 games including 13 starts. He passed for 1,611 yards and 11 touchdowns as a sophomore for the Tigers.
- Jennings rushed for 310 yards and two touchdowns in his career at LSU.
- Jennings earned his degree from LSU in August.
- Redshirt-freshman **Dion Ray** played a big part in the win at Georgia Southern rushing for 71 yards on eight carries with a touchdown. He has rushed at least three times in each of the last three games.
- Ray was one of four Cajuns to lineup at quarterback for the Cajuns against the Eagles.
- Senior **Jalen Nixon** will miss the rest of the season after suffering a season-ending ankle injury during the first overtime period at New Mexico State.
- Nixon had the second most experience among the quarterbacks coming into the year passing for 937 yards and eight touchdowns in three seasons.
- Nixon started in four games for the Cajuns in 2016 including road games at Louisiana Tech and Arkansas State and home games Texas State and ULM.
- Nixon was one of only two Cajuns quarterbacks in program history joining Brian Mitchell to record 200 yards rushing and passing in a single-game after passing for 253 yards and two TDs while rushing for 201 yards and adding a 75-yard TD run at Arkansas State in 2015.
- Sophomore **Jordan Davis** made a brief appearance in the Appalachian State contest completing two of three passes for eight yards. He also made a short appearance at Georgia Southern.
- Davis saw limited action in three games as a freshman completing 26 of 41 passes for 256 yards and a touchdown.
- Davis' longest outing came in the series finale against Troy going 19-for-33 through the air for 196 yards and a touchdown.
- Davis recorded his only rushing touchdown of the season on the final drive of the game at Appalachian State. He went 7-for-7 through the air before capping the drive with a 20-yard TD run.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- Senior **Elijah McGuire** became the second player in program history to amass 4,000-plus yards on the ground in a career at Georgia rushing for 129 yards on 19 carries. He ranks ninth nationally in active career rushing yards (4,103). McGuire is second on the school's all-time rushing list and is 543 yards back of **Tyrell Fenroy** for the school record of 4,646.
- McGuire has moved past **Tyrell Fenroy** for the school career touchdown record with 51 combined touchdowns in over three seasons with the Cajuns. He is seven TDs back of Fenroy (48) for the rushing TD career record with 41. McGuire ranks sixth in the nation in active career touchdowns.
- McGuire's two TDs at Texas State crowned him as the all-time scoring champion for the Ragin' Cajuns passing up **Tyrell Fenroy** for the school record in points. He currently has scored 312 points in over three seasons. Fenroy posted 294 points in four seasons.
- McGuire also owns the program career record for all-purpose yards with 5,727 in over three seasons with the Ragin' Cajuns. He passed up **Tyrell Fenroy** for the record against Appalachian State after picking up 53 yards on 11 touches. McGuire ranks fourth among the active career leaders in all-purpose yards nationally.
- McGuire has posted seven multi-rushing touchdown games in his career after rushing for a pair of TDs at Texas State. McGuire also had two rushing TDs at Tulane. He has 13 multi-TD games four years at Louisiana.
- McGuire is joined by San Diego State's **Donnel Pumphrey** and Appalachian State's **Marcus Cox** as the only active players in the nation to have 4,000 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving in their career.
- McGuire ranks third in the Sun Belt Conference in rushing yards (918) and rushing yards per game (83.5). He is fourth in all-purpose yards (1,155) and fifth in touchdowns (9).
- McGuire had a team-best 11 carries at Georgia Southern rushing for 35 yards and a touchdown. He also led the team with six receptions for 66 yards including a season-long 28-yard grab.
- McGuire bounced back to post 112 yards on 20 carries at Texas State after seeing limited action against New Mexico State and Appalachian State from an injury suffered at Tulane earlier this year.
- McGuire had a career-high 38 carries for 89 yards and two TDs in the overtime loss at Tulane.
- McGuire has passed up **Darren Brister** (594) for fourth place all-time with 666 career rushing attempts. He is 12 carries back of **Brian Mitchell** (678) for third. **Tyrell Fenroy** holds the record with 808 carries.
- McGuire became the first running back in school history to post multiple 200-yard rushing performances in a career after rushing for 223 yards on 23 carries against South Alabama. **Brian Mitchell** is the only other player in program history to record more than one 200-yard game for the Ragin' Cajuns with three in four seasons. The 200-yard performance is just the tenth in school history including McGuire's 265-yard game at Arkansas State in 2014.
- McGuire has 16 career 100-yard games including four this season.
- McGuire holds the school career record for both receptions (127) and receiving yards (1,376) by a running back. He has the second most career receiving yards by an active running back in the nation behind **Taquan Mizzell** of Virginia (1,562).
- McGuire is one of five players in program history to score five touchdowns in a game against Northwestern State on Sept. 12, 2015.
- McGuire was tabbed to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Second Team.
- McGuire was named one of 400 players on the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List.
- McGuire was also named to the Paul Hornung and Doak Walker Award watch lists.
- Freshman **Jordan Wright** found the endzone for the first time in his Ragin' Cajuns career at New Mexico State rushing for 26 yards on 11 carries. He also had a season-best 29 yards on nine carries against Appalachian State.
- Wright has made at least one carry in 10 of the 11 of the Cajuns games in 2016.
- Junior **Darius Hoggins** ranks third on the squad in rushing yards with 203 yards on 39 carries.
- True freshman **Raymond Calais** posted his first career touchdown on his only carry of the game against McNeese running it in from seven yards out. He joins Alonzo Harris and McGuire as the only true freshmen running backs to find the endzone during the Mark Hudspeth era.
- Calais will miss the rest of the 2016 season due to an injury suffered at practice.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

- After missing three games and seeing limited action at Georgia, freshman **Ja'Marcus Bradley** had a team-best 113 yards on four catches against Arkansas State.
- Bradley ranks third on the squad in yards with 358 yards in eight games. He is averaging 17.9 yards per catch.
- Bradley led the Ragin' Cajuns in receptions the first two weeks of the season and notched his first career touchdown against McNeese hauling in six catches for 97 yards.
- Senior **Al Riles** recorded his second TD of the season in the win over Arkansas State with three grabs for 47 yards and a TD.
- Riles registered his third 100-yard receiving game of the season and fourth of his career at Georgia posting 105 yards on seven catches. He also had 29 yards on the ground on two carries.
- Sophomore **Keenan Barnes** is tied for the Sun Belt lead in receiving touchdowns with six on the season after hauling in a 48-yard TD grab at Georgia Southern. He has posted a touchdown reception in six of the Cajuns 11 contests in 2016.
- After making just one catch a year ago, Barnes has reached paydirt on six of his 30 receptions this year.
- Barnes ranks second on the squad in receiving yards with 406 through 11 games.
- Riles recorded his first ever passing touchdown at Georgia Southern with a 48-yard connection to Barnes out of the wildcat formation. It was Riles' only passing attempt of his career.
- Riles ranks second in the Sun Belt Conference in receiving yards per game (60.5). He is also third in receptions (54), receptions per game (4.9) and receiving yards (665).
- Riles became the second player on the Cajuns squad to post 1,000 career receiving yards joining **Elijah McGuire** after his season-best 139-yard effort against South Alabama. He currently has 1,496 career yards and is averaging 11.2 yards per catch. He is 146 yards back of **Darryl Surgent** (1,642) for tenth place on the all-time receiving yards list.
- With his eight catches at NMSU, Riles has notched 100 career catches for the Cajuns despite starting his career with the Cajuns on the defensive side of the ball in 2013. He currently has 134 catches since he made the switch over to receiver as a sophomore. Riles needs 21 catches to crack the top 5 list for career receptions.
- Riles had a career game against South Alabama posting a career-best 139 yards receiving on eight catches and a touchdown. His touchdown came on a career-long reception of 71 yards.
- Riles has caught at least one pass in all 21 games that he has played in the last two seasons.
- Riles recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game with 103 yards on eight receptions and a touchdown at Georgia State in 2015.
- Redshirt freshmen **Michael Jacquet** failed to post a reception in the last three contests after leading the Cajuns in receiving against Texas State and Idaho. He missed the Arkansas State contest due to an injury suffered at Georgia.
- Jacquet registered his first career touchdown against South Alabama on his only catch of the game. He posted two catches for 17 yards in his first action as a Cajun against Boise State.
- Jacquet joins Bradley and **Gabe Fuselier** as the only freshmen to catch a touchdown pass in the Hudspeth era.
- Former Ragin' Cajuns quarterback **Michael Desormeaux** takes over as the new wide receivers coach in 2016. Desormeaux ranks fifth all-time in career rushing yards and ninth in passing yards in school history.
- Junior **Jared Johnson** saw his first action in over a year against McNeese after missing the 2015 season with a torn ACL. He recorded 161 yards and three touchdowns on 16 catches in two seasons.
- All three of Johnson's touchdowns came during his sophomore campaign.
- The Ragin' Cajuns will be without the services of senior **Devin Scott** after suffering a season-ending injury during summer workouts. Scott has posted 326 yards receiving over three seasons on 18 catches.

TIGHT END NOTEBOOK

- Senior **Nick Byrne** has posted a career-best for yards in a season with 135 on 14 catches in 2016. He had 83 yards on 10 grabs a year ago.
- Byrne posted a career-long catch of 37 yards at New Mexico State.
- Byrne has accounted for 30 of the 36 catches among returning players at the position. He

- Byrne recorded a career-high four receptions for 38 yards in the Cajuns' non-conference game against Akron a year ago.
- Sophomore **Matt Barnes** equaled a career high with two catches for a career-best 17 yards at Tulane.
- Barnes returns after missing the 2015 season due to a knee injury suffered during spring practice.
- Barnes played in 10 games as a reserve tight end and special teams member in 2014.
- Freshmen **Carlos Robinson** adds depth at the position.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- The Ragin' Cajuns offensive line has had its struggles this season having given up five sacks in a game five times this year after allowing five in the win over Arkansas State. Boise State, Tulane, Appalachian State and Idaho also notched five sacks against the Cajuns.
- The Louisiana offensive line paved the way for 276 yards on the ground at Georgia, out-gaining the Bulldogs in rushing yards.

- **Anthony Jennings'** 18-yard TD pass to **Keenan Barnes** in fourth quarter was his first since the first quarter at New Mexico State (5-yard pass to Barnes on 10/1).
- DB **Kamar Greenhouse** makes his debut in fourth quarter on special teams. **Cole Prudhomme** (OL), **Ken Marks** (OL) and **Gunner Hudspeth** (QB) each play on final drive for Cajuns to become 31st, 32nd and 33rd rush players to see first action for Louisiana.

- The announced attendance of 92,746 was tied for the third-largest game Louisiana has participated in school history (equaling the 92,746 at Georgia on Sept. 4, 2010).
- Louisiana's 276 rushing yards in the game marked a season-high (previous high 256 vs. South Alabama, 10/17).
- Louisiana won the coin toss (now 5-5 on the season) and elected to defer to the second half.

- Louisiana's 99-yard drive in the second quarter was the longest of the season by the Ragin' Cajuns and second of 90 yards or more in 2016 (previous high was 92-yard drive at Georgia Southern).
- **Anthony Jennings'** 242 yards passing was the second-highest total of his career. His two passing TDs were his first since the Texas State game (10/22) and equaled his total in the last six games dating back to New Mexico State (10/1).
- **Elijah McGuire's** 14-yard TD reception that gave Louisiana a 14-7 lead in the second quarter was the 10th TD reception of his career and his school-record 51st overall TD.

BOISE STATE 45, LOUISIANA 10

LAFAYETTE – Jeremy McNichols rushed for a pair of first-half touchdowns and added a 48-yard scoring pass in the second quarter as Boise State built a 35-3 lead at halftime and defeated the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns, 45-10, in the season-opener for both teams on Saturday at Cajun Field.

Brett Rypien completed 22 of 33 passes for 347 yards and a pair of TD passes as Boise State (1-0) scored touchdowns on four of its first five possessions while gaining 387 of its 584 yards of total offense in the first half.

With 17 players seeing their first action in a Ragin' Cajuns uniform, Louisiana (0-1) finished with 267 yards of total offense with graduate transfer quarterback Anthony Jennings completing 21 of 33 passes for 186 yards and a TD pass. Elijah McGuire led the Ragin' Cajuns with 46 yards rushing while catching a team-high six passes. Ja'Marcus Bradley caught three passes in his debut while Keenan Barnes caught an 11-yard scoring pass from Jennings for his first career TD.

Boise State scored on its first two possessions as McNichols scored on a 1-yard TD run before Rypien connected with Cedric Wilson on a 42-yard scoring pass. The Broncos increased their lead to 21-0 in the second quarter as McNichols caught a 48-yard TD pass from receiver Thomas Sperbeck before McNichols added a 7-yard scoring run with 12:35 remaining in the second quarter.

Rypien tossed his second TD for Boise State as he connected with Sperbeck on a 35-yard scoring pass for a 35-0 lead with 1:29 remaining in the half before Louisiana closed out the half with Stevie Artigue connecting on a 44-yard field goal.

Jennings, making his first start since 2014 when he was at LSU, and Jalen Nixon combined to engineer a 15-play, 75-yard drive that was aided by a pass interference penalty by Boise State on fourth-and-8 at the BSU 38. Five plays later, Jennings hit Barnes on a slant pass in the left side of the end zone that cut the lead to 38-10 with 12:53 remaining.

Travis Crawford recorded a career-high 10 tackles to lead Louisiana with Otha Peters adding eight tackles with two stops for loss.

LAFAYETTE – A pair of scoring plays over a three-minute span in the third quarter carried Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns Football past McNeese and to a 30-22 triumph Saturday evening at Cajun Field.

Freshman Raymond Calais' first career touchdown run came at 7:18 of the third quarter and vaulted the Ragin' Cajuns (1-1) back into the lead at 21-15.

After forcing the Cowboys (1-1) into a three-and-out, Anthony Jennings connected with Al Riles for a 34-yard gain to the McNeese 16. After a roughing the passer penalty brought the Ragin' Cajuns into a goal line situation, Jennings scored two plays later on a five-yard scamper at 4:02 that increased the lead to 27-15.

Louisiana's defense cornered the Cowboys their next three possessions, forcing a punt each time to protect the lead. McNeese added a touchdown in the waning moments of the fourth quarter on a Dylan Long rush with 12 seconds remaining.

Jennings completed 15-of-21 passes for 170 yards and a touchdown. His two touchdown runs, the latter which opened a two-score lead in the third quarter, were his first rushing scores since the 2013 Outback Bowl appearance at LSU.

Elijah McGuire gained 139 yards on 19 attempts, increasing his career rushing total to 3,370. McGuire moved past Alonzo Harris (3,330) and Brian Mitchell (3,335) into second place on the school's career rushing yards list.

Ja'Marcus Bradley led all receivers with 97 yards. He hauled in a 17-yard touchdown pass from Jennings at 4:11 of the first quarter which gave Louisiana the lead for the remainder of the opening stanza.

On their first possession of the second half, the Cowboys moved the ball to the UL 11 before settling for a 28-yard field goal by Trent Manuel that provided a 15-14 lead.

After a 37-yard kickoff return by Calais and 29 yard rush by McGuire, the Ragin' Cajuns were deep inside McNeese territory at the 25 yard line. Two Darius Hoggins rushes that totaled 15 yards set up Louisiana with first-and-goal, then two plays later Calais bowled over a McNeese defender to the go-ahead score.

LAFAYETTE – The offense came alive in the second half, fueled by 168 yards rushing from Elijah McGuire and 135 yards receiving by Al Riles, as the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns topped South Alabama 28-23 in the squad's 2016 Sun Belt Conference opener.

Riles was on the receiving end of a 71-yard touchdown pass from Anthony Jennings at 10:39 of the third quarter as Louisiana (2-1, 1-0 Sun Belt) began to extend its lead over South Alabama (1-2, 0-2 Sun Belt), opening a 15-7 lead.

On the team's next possession, Jennings found Keenan Barnes on a 38-yard hookup for a score that stretched the lead to 22-7 with 4:46 remaining in the third quarter.

Just as he sealed the win over the Jaguars in the 2014 meeting at Cajun Field with a touchdown run in the fourth quarter, McGuire came through again. The senior running back broke through the USA defensive line for a 68-yard score with 7:05 remaining to end a string of 10 unanswered points by the Jaguars and increase the lead to 28-17.

After Dallas Davis connected with Gerald Everett for a touchdown with 3:17 left to play, Riles and McGuire made the plays which allowed the Ragin' Cajuns to run out the clock. Riles gained 22 yards on a reception that brought Louisiana near midfield, then McGuire provided another first down with a 24 yard scamper down to the Jaguars 28 yard line.

McGuire ended the night with a season-high 223 yards rushing, his second-highest career total and the 14th 100-plus effort of his career.

Riles' final tally of 139 yards receiving marked a career-high amount for the senior receiver. Jennings completed 18-of-26 passes for his season-best total of 256 yards. He tossed three touchdown passes tying his career-high.

The Ragin' Cajuns outgained the Jaguars 512-338, with an even split of 256 yards between rushing and passing, and exploded for 378 yards in the decisive second half.

After stopping the Jaguars on a fourth-down conversion on the game's opening drive, Louisiana drove 75 yards capped by a 13-yard Jennings touchdown pass to Michael Jacquet at 4:22 for an early 6-0 lead.

USA gained the lead at the onset of the second quarter on a Tyreis Thomas touchdown run and remained ahead until a 31-yard field goal by Stevie Artigue with 37 seconds remaining before halftime gave the Ragin' Cajuns a 9-7 lead.

NEW ORLEANS – Glen Cuiellette threw four touchdown passes, including a go-ahead 7-yard pass to Terren Encalade and Tulane stopped a potential game-tying two-point conversion in the fourth overtime to claim a 41-39 win over the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns at Yulman Stadium.

Elijah McGuire scored three TDs for Louisiana, including a 22-yard scoring pass from Anthony Jennings in the fourth overtime, but Al Riles was stopped short of the goal line on the two-point conversion to lift Tulane to the win.

Louisiana trailed 16-9 in the fourth quarter before going on a 16-play, 53-yard drive to tie the score with 5:55 remaining. The Ragin' Cajuns converted three four-down attempts on the drive with McGuire scoring on a 1-yard plunge to tie the game at 16-16.

The game was a defensive slugfest for much of regulation with the Ragin' Cajuns taking a 6-0 lead on field goals of 40 and 39 yards by Artigue. Tulane answered with field goals of 22, 35 and 20 yards by DiRocco before Cuiellette connected with Encalade on a 34-yard TD pass for a 16-9 lead with 1:07 remaining in the third quarter.

McGuire finished with 89 yards rushing, 48 yards receiving and six yards on returns to increase his career all-purpose yards total to 5,163 yards – 68 shy of tying Tyrell Fenroy for the school's all-time lead.

Riles caught a team-high six passes for 70 yards for the Ragin' Cajuns while Jennings finished 19-for-38 for 240 yards and a pair of TDs

Cuiellette finished 10-for-23 for 165 yards and four TDs for Tulane, which had not thrown a touchdown pass entering the game. Encalade caught seven passes for 103 yards for the Green Wave.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. – Right tackle Sebastian Anderson recovered a Larry Rose III fumble in the end zone, helping New Mexico State to a 37-31 double overtime victory over the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns in a Sun Belt Conference game at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

Stevie Artigue connected on a game-tying 47-yard field goal with 2:58 remaining in regulation for Louisiana (2-3, 1-1 SBC) before the game went to overtime at 24-24 when Parker Davidson missed a 20-yarder at the buzzer.

LAFAYETTE – Jalin Moore rushed for 106 yards on 14 carries with a pair of touchdowns and Appalachian State scored on its first four possessions of the game in defeating the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns, 24-0, in a Sun Belt Conference game at Cajun Field.

Taylor Lamb completed 15 of 26 passes for 201 yards and a score as Appalachian State (4-2, 2-0 SBC) handed Louisiana (2-4, 1-2 SBC) its first shutout at home since a 27-0 loss to North Texas on Oct. 26, 2002.

App State opened the game with a 56-yard pass from Lamb to Shaedon Meadors to the UL 2 before Moore scored on the following play.

SAN MARCOS, Texas – Elijah McGuire rushed for a game-high 112 yards on 20 carries, while scoring a pair of touchdowns to become the school's all-time leader in points scored, and the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns erased an early deficit to record a convincing 27-3 win over Texas State at Bobcat Stadium.

Anthony Jennings completed 18 of 22 passes for 165 yards and a touchdown as Louisiana (3-4, 2-2 SBC) snapped a three-game losing streak and did not allow a touchdown for the first time since a 16-3 win over Nevada in the 2014 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

McGuire, who became the fourth player in Louisiana history to record 40 rushing touchdowns, gave the Ragin' Cajuns a 10-3 lead in the second quarter when he scored on a 4-yard run with 8:53 remaining in the second quarter. The senior capped an eight-play, 56-yard drive in the third quarter when he scored on a 1-yard plunge, giving him 300 career points and passing Tyrell Fenroy (294) as the school's all-time leader.

Stevie Artigue tied the game at 3-3 in the first quarter when he booted a 36-yard field goal and gave Louisiana a 13-3 lead at halftime when he drilled a 42-yard kick at the buzzer.

Jennings overcame an early interception on the Ragin' Cajuns first drive to pick apart the Bobcat defense. His 18-yard scoring pass to Keenan Barnes with 8:17 remaining in the fourth quarter gave Louisiana a 27-3 lead, and the Ragin' Cajuns would unload the bench the rest of the night.

Al Riles caught four passes to lead the Ragin' Cajuns with Barnes and Gabe Fuselier catching three passes each. Simeon Thomas picked off a Tyler Jones pass in the third quarter to set up McGuire's touchdown while Travis Crawford recovered a second-quarter fumble that set up Louisiana's first touchdown.

Texas State (2-5, 0-3 SBC) took a 3-0 lead in the first quarter after a 29-yard field goal by Marcus Ripley capped a 12-play, 63-yard drive. Jones finished 20-for-28 for 142 yards for Texas State while Stedman Mayberry led the Bobcats with 54 yards rushing.

Tre'maine Lightfoot led Louisiana with eight tackles with Denarius Howard adding seven. Joe Dillon added a sack and four tackles for loss for the Ragin' Cajuns who held Texas State to 221 yards of total offense, including 100 after the first quarter.

LAFAYETTE – Led by 227 yards passing from Matt Linehan and 86 yards gained on the ground by Isaiah Saunders the Idaho Vandals came away with a 23-13 win over the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns on Homecoming Day at Cajun Field.

The Vandals (5-4, 3-2 Sun Belt) scored on the game's opening drive and wouldn't relinquish the lead. The Ragin' Cajuns (3-5, 2-3 Sun Belt) forged a 10-all tie at 13:31 of the second quarter, but a touchdown run by Saunders at 8:57 returned the lead to Idaho for good.

The Ragin' Cajuns defense did not allow a touchdown in the second half for the third straight game.

Linehan completed four passes and had a key 21-yard scramble during the Vandals 12-play march that covered 75 yards on the opening drive and ended with a touchdown run by Denzal Brantley for a 7-0 lead.

Jennings connected with Jacquet for a 52-yard completion on the Ragin' Cajuns first play from scrimmage. That led to a 37-yard field goal make by Stevie Artigue.

After holding the Vandals to a field goal, Louisiana converted three times on third down and once on fourth down during a 17-play scoring drive to pull even at 10-all.

The Vandals took advantage of a short field, after a 39-yard punt by Steve Couetts rolled out-of-bounds at the Idaho 49, to snap the tie. The visitors entered the red zone after converting on third down with a 12-yard pass from Linehan to Alfonso Onunwor, moved to the UL 5 with an 11-yard completion and scored on Saunders' touchdown run at 8:57.

Jennings marched the Ragin' Cajuns into Idaho territory with a 17-yard scamper and a facemask penalty moved the squad deeper, but Louisiana had to settle for a field goal with 28 seconds remaining before halftime.

A pair of second-half field goals by Austin Rehkow was the only scoring by either team the remainder of the contest.

LAFAYETTE – Anthony Jennings completed 17-of-28 passes and added 96 yards rushing with a touchdown as the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns scored 17 unanswered points and recorded a 33-26 victory over Georgia Southern in a nationally-televised game at Paulson Stadium.

Otha Peters recorded a team-high eight tackles and helped lead a defensive effort for Louisiana (4-5, 3-3 SBC) that held a potent Georgia Southern (4-6, 3-3 SBC) rushing attack to 52 yards on 28 carries.

The Ragin' Cajuns outgained Georgia Southern, 482-306, while holding the Eagles to 99 yards of total offense in the second half.

Elijah McGuire, who tied a season-high with six receptions for a season-high 66 yards, put the Ragin' Cajuns up for good at the 3:15 mark in the first quarter with his 1-yard touchdown that gave Louisiana a 7-3 edge. Louisiana quickly drove the length of the field with Jennings scoring on a 10-yard touchdown run with six seconds remaining in the half, capping a six-play, 92-yard drive and giving the Ragin' Cajuns a 21-13 at halftime.

Jennings' score opened a 17-point run for the Ragin' Cajuns that extended into the third quarter. Stevie Artigue booted a 34-yard field goal and Al Riles took an end-around and connected with Keenan Barnes on a 48-yard scoring pass for a 31-13 lead.

ATHENS, Ga. — Isaiah McKenzie registered a pair of first-quarter touchdowns and Georgia used four turnovers in the first half by the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns to take a 21-7 lead and earn a 35-21 victory before an announced crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium.

Nick Chubb rushed for 108 yards and scored on a 1-yard TD run before catching a 49-yard TD pass in the fourth quarter as Georgia (7-4) held off a late rally by Louisiana (4-6).

Anthony Jennings, who threw three first-half interceptions for the Ragin' Cajuns, finished 14-for-24 in the air for 189 yards while rushing for 98 yards and a career-high three TDs.

McKenzie scored on the game's first play for the Bulldogs when he took a handoff and raced 55 yards for an early 7-0 lead. The junior gave Georgia a quick 14-0 lead when he took a Steven Coutts punt at the UGA 18, broke a couple of tackles and raced 82 yards for a TD with 8:30 remaining in the first quarter.

Jacob Eason, who completed 13 of 19 passes for 165 yards, connected with Isaac Nauta on a 9-yard TD pass that gave the Bulldogs a 21-0 lead. Louisiana settled down after that to cut the deficit to 21-7 as Jennings connected with Al Riles on a 64-yard pass to the UGA 9 before scoring on a quarterback draw on the next play.

Chubb capped an 11-play, 93-yard drive for Georgia when scored on a 1-yard TD run in the third quarter for a 28-7 lead before he slipped behind the UL defense, caught a pass from Eason and raced 49 yards for his second TD of the day.

Louisiana added a pair of TDs in the fourth quarter as Jennings scored on a 13-yard run with 4:50 remaining before his 1-yard scamper along the left side with 1:34 remaining.

Elijah McGuire rushed for 129 yards to record his 16th career 100-yard rushing game for Louisiana, which finished with a season-high 276 yards on the ground against the No. 13-ranked defense in the country. McGuire also became the second Ragin' Cajuns player to eclipse 4,000 yards on the ground in the contest.

LAFAYETTE — The Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns withstood a late push from Arkansas State, which included the reversal of a backwards pass recovered for a touchdown, and claimed a 24-19 win over the Sun Belt-leading Red Wolves at Cajun Field.

Down to their final play on fourth-and-goal from the Cajuns 11-yard line with nine seconds remaining, ASU quarterback Justice Hansen scrambled toward the sideline and appeared to toss the ball backwards at the 7-yard line where right tackle Joseph Bacchus scooped it up and crossed the goal line for an apparent winning score. However, the replay review revealed that Hansen's knee was down before the toss, voiding the score.

Anthony Jennings threw for 242 yards and Ja'Marcus Bradley hauled in 113 yards receiving (first career 100-yard game) to lead the Ragin' Cajuns offense.

The Ragin' Cajuns defense held the Red Wolves in check in the first half, limiting the visitors to 157 yards, allowing the offense time to build its lead. The unit provided the squad's first score when Taboris Lee intercepted a Hansen pass and returned it for a touchdown at 4:52 of the first quarter to even the score at 7-all.

After stuffing ASU on fourth-and-goal in the opening minutes of the second quarter, Louisiana embarked on an 11-play, 99-yard drive, highlighted by a 30-yard reception from Bradley and 14-yard touchdown reception from Elijah McGuire, to pull ahead 14-7 at 8:29.

The Ragin' Cajuns defense would hold again in a goal-to-go situation, forcing the Red Wolves into a field goal on their first possession of the second stanza.

A quick, two-play strike followed and increased Louisiana's lead to 21-10 at 8:08 of the third quarter. Jennings lofted a pass to Bradley for a 42-yard gain down to the ASU 34, then connected with Al Riles for a 34-yard score.

ASU started the fourth quarter with a 30-yard field goal make by J.D. Houston to draw within a score at 21-13. Jennings and Bradley teamed up to navigate Louisiana to an answering field goal that returned the lead to double digits.

ASU picked up the final 143 yards of its 521 total yards of offense over the game's final 10:24 as the visitors attempted to erase a 24-13 deficit.

Hansen completed a 38-yard pass to Chris Murray to the UL 1 and Warren Wand reached his arms across the goal line for a score at 9:07 which trimmed the Louisiana lead to 24-19. The Ragin' Cajuns defense would deliver fourth down stops on the additional two drives that the Red Wolves conducted.
