I was pleased with the play of both the offense and the defense last week and if we can make as much improvement going into this next game then maybe we will get back to being competitive the balance of the conference season.

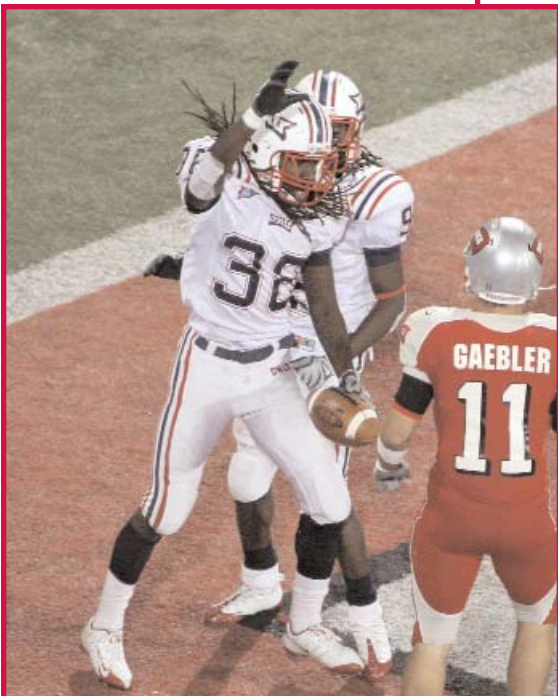
Turnovers

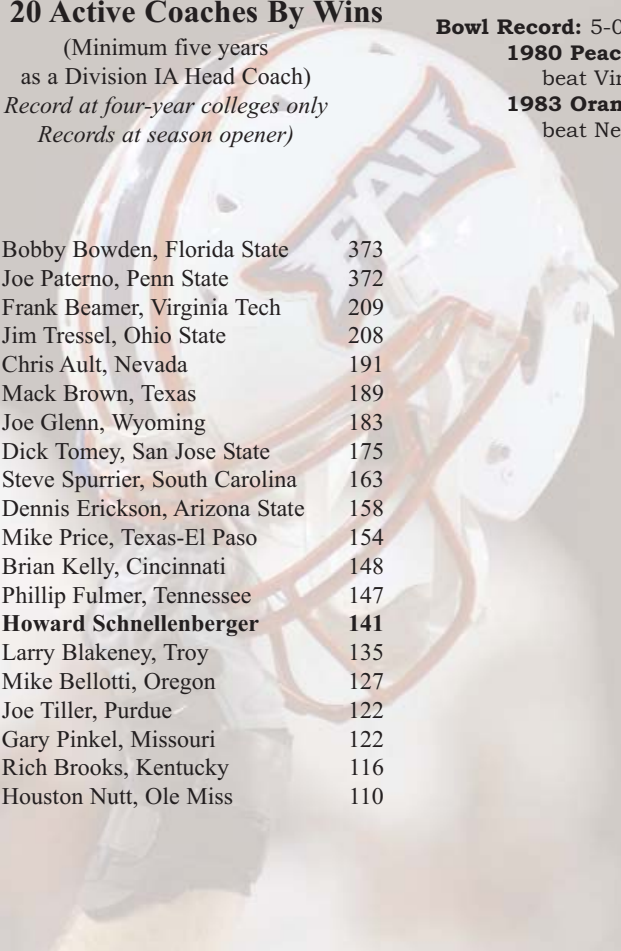

Howard Schnellenberger

At Florida Atlantic

When you consider all the "firsts" that Florida Atlantic University's football team has accomplished, it is hard to believe. What may be even more difficult is that legendary Head Coach Howard Schnellenberger accomplished a "first" as well in 2007. When the 74-year-old program builder was named 2007 Sun Belt Coach of the Year, it marked the first time he had earned a conference award.

Schnellenberger has resurrected two programs from virtual extinction. Neither was affiliated with a conference.

He joined the FAU staff May 1, 1998, with an unheard-of opportunity: build a collegiate football team from scratch. Since then, he has raised more than \$15 million and hosted an FAU football television show, a weekly radio show and has been a regular at luncheons and gatherings. In January of 1999 the Board of Regents approved FAU adding football. Twenty-five recruits signed in his first FAU class. Since that time each recruiting class has been better than the last, each schedule is more difficult than the last and each milestone was one step closer to the program's first bowl appearance.

When the team took the field for its first practice, Aug. 12, 2000, 164 players were dressed. FAU played its first scrimmage Sept. 23, 2000, and took to the field Sept. 1, 2001. It only took two games for FAU to have its first upset, defeating the No. 22 ranked team in the country, 31-28. FAU holds the record for the fastest start-up program to earn a Division I-A victory, and is the fastest program to reach the Division I-AA playoffs. Schnellenberger was named the Sports Network South Coach of the Year following the 2003 season. The 2004 season was more of the same. The Owls stormed into Hawaii, with a hurricane hitting Florida's coastline at game time, and handed the Warriors their only home-field loss in 2004, defeating a bowl participant in just the 36th game of the program's existence. Proving it was not a fluke, the team defeated perennial Sun Belt power North Texas the next week. FAU then rattled off five-consecutive road victories to enter the 2004 home schedule 5-0. The Owls finished their first transitional season 9-3, and bid farewell to the senior class with a third-consecutive "Shula Bowl" victory over FIU. 2005 was the first full season of Division I-A play, facing Kansas and at home Oklahoma State. Minnesota and Louisville, along with a full Sun Belt schedule. The young squad put together several outstanding per-

formances sending Kansas into the locker room with a 9-7 lead, Oklahoma State with a 13-3 margin at the half, and Louisville, who entered the game ranked no. 14 at game time, with a 10-point cushion, 20-10. Florida Atlantic began 2006 picked as the second worst team in the country. With this as motivation, the Owls used what Schnellenberger calls advanced training, its non-conference schedule, to finish with a 4-3 Sun Belt record and were in the hunt for the Sun Belt title deep into the season. The jump from a preseason eighth place finish to third in the Sun Belt was not as drastic as the prediction to finish last in the country to defeating the last team in the country 31-0. Both the offense and defense came together with one goal in 2007: win the SBC.

From January to December the focus remained constant and the accolades continued to role in culminating with a bowl game invitation, becoming not only the youngest program to receive a bowl invitation, but the youngest to win a bowl game, and the Owls did it with a decisive 44-27 win over Memphis in the New Orleans Bowl.

For the National Title

Schnellenberger has been part of four collegiate national championships. His 1983 Miami Hurricanes won the school's first title, defeating Nebraska in the 50th Orange Bowl. He was offensive coordinator for Paul "Bear" Bryant at Alabama when the Crimson Tide won championships in 1961, 1964 and 1965.

In the NFL

Schnellenberger has been part of seven NFL playoff teams and was part of two Super Bowl championship staffs. He helped the 1972 Miami Dolphins to the NFL's only undefeated (17-0) season. Schnellenberger has recruited and/or coached such current and former pros as quarterbacks Jim Kelly, Bernie Kosar, Vinny Testaverde, Browning Nagle, and Jeff Brohm, and stars such as Michael Irvin, Brian and Bennie Blades, offensive tackles Bruce Armstrong and Jerry Crafts; fullback Carwell Gardner; wide receiver Earnest Givins; defensive end Joe Johnson, defensive tackle Ted Washington; cornerback Ray Buchanan; and defensive tackle Mike Flores.

Schnellenberger's former offensive coordinator, Gary Stevens, and defensive coordinator Tom Olivadotti have had similar roles in the NFL. Three of his former assistants were on the staff of the Dallas Cowboys during their rise to consecutive Super Bowl Titles.

Bowl Games

Schnellenberger's Miami teams defeated Virginia Tech in the Peach Bowl and Nebraska in the Orange Bowl. At Louisville, he led the Cardinals to wins over Alabama (34-7) in the Fiesta Bowl and over Michigan State (18-7) in

the Liberty Bowl. FAU has defeated Memphis (44-27). Overall, he has been part of 10 bowl games.

At Miami

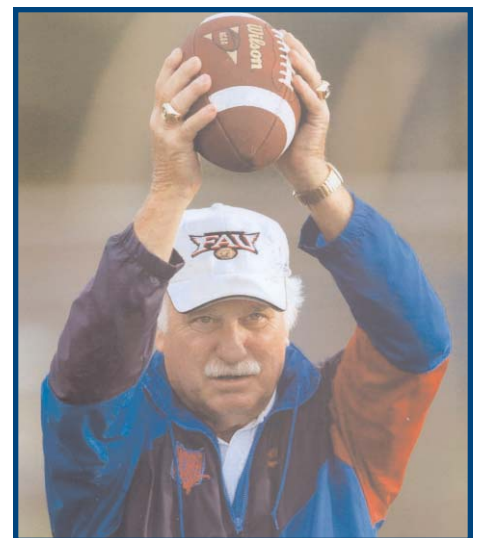
Schnellenberger took over a University of Miami program that was nearing extinction in 1979. He installed a pro-style attack with quarterback Jim Kelly and led Miami to an Orange Bowl bid and the national championship four years later. His teams' lost only two home games in five years while laying the groundwork for a program that went on to win three more national titles in the next seven seasons.

At Louisville

A native of Louisville, Schnellenberger returned in 1985 to build a college football contender. His top team finished 10-1-1 and defeated Alabama in the Fiesta Bowl, the highlight of the most successful decade in Louisville football history. His teams played a coast-to-coast schedule against the top conferences in the nation and produced victories over such teams as Texas (1), Alabama (1), Michigan State (1), North Carolina (1), Virginia (1), NC State (1), West Virginia (1), Boston College (1), Arizona State (2), and Pittsburgh (4). The Schnellenberger Era also generated support for the University's 42,000-seat, on-campus stadium.

Personal

Howard Schnellenberger learned his football tactics as a player for "Bear" Bryant and Blanton Collier at the University of Kentucky. He served as an assistant to Collier at Kentucky and Bryant at Alabama. Schnellenberger then moved on to pro ball as an assistant to George Allen (Rams) and Don Shula (Dolphins). He was head coach of the Baltimore Colts from 1973 to 74. He and his wife, Beverlee, have two sons: Stuart and Tim. Stuart was a tight end/center on his father's 1983 national championship team. His eldest son, Stephen, passed away March 9, 2008. Grandchildren are Teather Ann, a Miami Dolphins cheerleader, and Joey and Marcus.

Pierre Runs into the Record Books

Charles Pierre solidified the FAU victory over UAB with a 73-yard touchdown run. The rush is the longest from the line of scrimmage for the Owls and was a personal best for the senior. The UAB game also marked the second time in his career he has scored two touchdowns in a game. Pierre scored two TDs once again at WKU. He also tallied 194 yards a new individual game rushing high and bettered his single rush record to 74 yards.

Dilvory Edgecomb records 2nd 100-yard Game

Dilvory Edgecomb recorded 103 yards on 16 carries against Middle Tennessee. It marked the senior's second career 100-yard game. The first was against North Texas (118) November 12, 2005.

70% on Third Down Conversions

FAU was 7-of-10 in third down conversions for the Owls against UAB. The conversion rate is the highest single-game rate for FAU. The two teams also combined for 52 first downs which is also a program single-game record.

Florida Atlantic 10 No. 10 Texas 52



AUSTIN, Texas (AP) - FAU tried to capitalize on a young Texas defense, but the No. 11 Longhorns used a powerful veteran offense to defeat the Owls 52-10 in the season opener for both teams.

Texas quarterback Colt McCoy never wavered as Texas ran up a 28-10 halftime lead. His third touchdown pass made it 42-10 and he left early in the fourth quarter with 222 yards on 24-of-29 passing. He also had 103 yards rushing on 12 carries.

McCoy moved the Longhorns with ease, completing his first 13 passes, tossing TDs of 2 and 9 yards to Chris Ogbannaya and Jordan Shipley in the first quarter. Twice he was hit hard late on the drive that ended with Shipley's TD and his 2-yard TD run in the second quarter made it 28-3.

The Texas defense still has plenty to work

out.

The secondary that ranked No. 109 against the pass last season started two freshmen at safety and the inexperience showed as Owls quarterback Rusty Smith passed for 226 yards in the first half. Florida Atlantic's first two drives got inside the Texas 20 before both ended in turnovers with a fumbled snap and an interception.

One of the freshmen, Earl Thomas, was burned for several big plays and a touchdown, but also caused the interception with a tipped pass and blocked a punt in the third quarter to set up another touchdown.

Smith, last season's Sun Belt Conference player of the year, finished with 253 yards passing and a touchdown pass to Rob Housler, but was pulled in the third quarter.

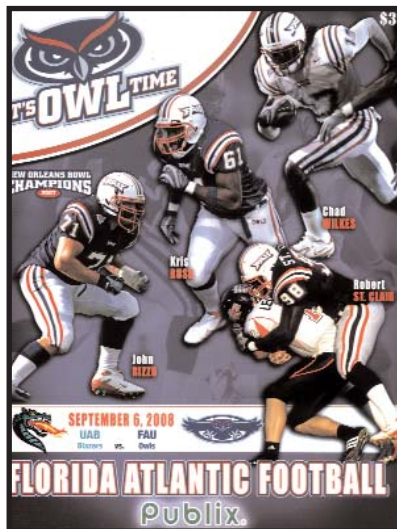

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) -Michigan State's Javon Ringer posted a career-high 282 yards rushing and scored two touchdowns Saturday to lead Michigan State past Florida Atlantic 17-0 in a nearly constant rain.

Ringer, who had a career-high 43 carries, gave Michigan State a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter on a 21-yard run.

Ringer's running set up the Spartans' second score, a 22-yard field goal by Brett Swenson midway through the third quarter to give Michigan State a 10-0 lead. Ringer's 11-yard TD run early in the fourth put the Spartans ahead 17-0.

Ringer's previous record was 203, set last year against Indiana. His 282-yard day ranks fourth in school history.

The Owls are in their eighth football season - all under 74-year-old coach Howard Schnellenberger. The program's biggest wins came last year over Big Ten member Minnesota in the

regular season and against Memphis in the New Orleans Bowl.

But the Owls' bid for an upset Saturday never materialized.

Trailing 17-0 midway through the fourth quarter, Florida Atlantic quarterback Rusty Smith lost his grip on a snap inside the Michigan State 5-yard line. The fumble was recovered by Spartans safety Danny Fortener.

Smith was 8-for-34 for 143 yards.

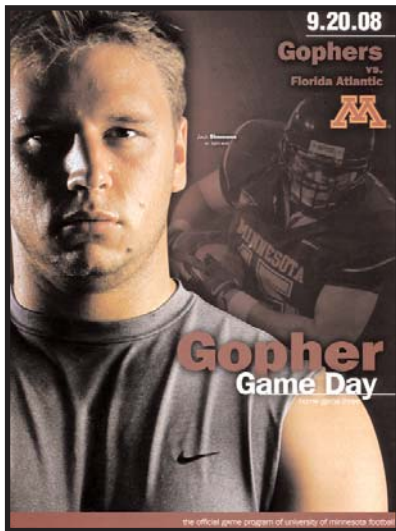

Florida Atlantic 3 Michigan State 37



MINNEAPOLIS (AP) -Four interceptions by the vastly improved Minnesota defense, including a 50-yard return for a touchdown by Simoni Lawrence, helped the Gophers top Florida Atlantic 37-3 on Saturday and take an unbeaten record into the Big Ten season.

Rusty Smith was picked off once in each quarter after dismantling Minnesota last year for 463 yards and five touchdowns. After giving the ball away seven times in last season's loss to Florida Atlantic, the Gophers (4-0) have a 13-2 advantage in turnovers this year.

Adam Weber threw his first interception of the season, in the end zone in the second quarter, but finished 19-for-24 for 235 yards and a 31-yard touchdown to Eric Decker - who caught seven passes for 122 yards. DeLeon Eskridge rushed for 78 yards and two scores and Shady Salamon also had a short TD run for the Gophers. The Owls (1-3) were glad to be playing inside after losing 17-0

in monsoon-like weather at Michigan State last week.

Smith lost a fumble and completed only eight of his 34 passes for 143 yards in that game, but improved conditions didn't give him or his receivers much of a lift.

Lester Jean dropped a long one late in the first quarter, and Chris Bonner let a touchdown slip out of his fingers in the second after he beat Kyle Theret to the end zone.

After setting the Florida Atlantic career record with 32 scoring passes last season, Smith has struggled in three losses to BCS teams. He finished 17-for-34 for 153 yards, and was picked off by Traye Simmons, Lee Campbell, Theret and then Lawrence - who also had a sack. In 28 previous starts, Smith threw only 18 interceptions and no more than two in one game.

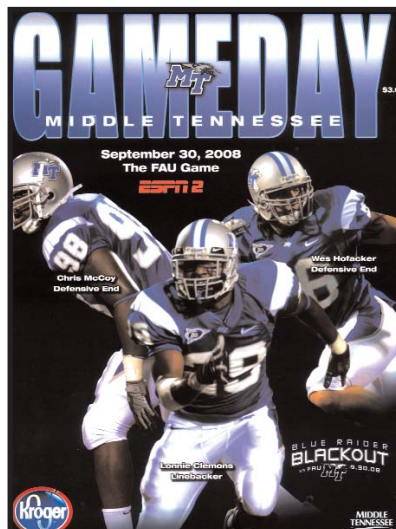

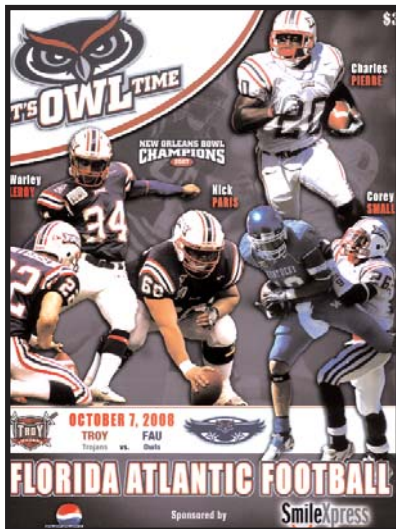

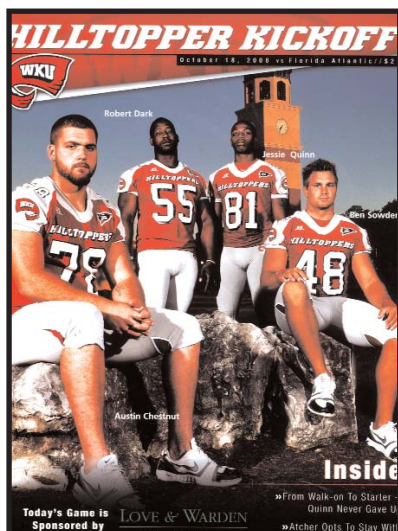

Game 7 Florida Atlantic 24 Western Kentucky20



BOWLING GREEN, Ky. (AP) -Charles Pierre rushed for 192 yards and two touchdowns to lead Florida Atlantic to a 24-20 victory over Western Kentucky on Saturday night.

Pierre averaged 8 yards a carry on his 24 attempts and scored on a school-record 74-yard touchdown run to cut Western Kentucky's lead to 17-14 with 6:38 left in the second quarter. Pierre also scored on an 8-yard run early in the second quarter.

The Owls (2-5) racked up 399 yards of offense, 225 yards coming on the ground. The Hilltoppers (2-6) totaled 317, with 240 on the ground.

The teams combined for 35 points in the second quarter, with Florida Atlantic taking a 21-17 lead into halftime.

Tanner Stewart's 22-yard field goal cut the lead to 21-20 with 8:22 remaining in the third

quarter, but Warley Leroy kicked a 23-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to give Florida Atlantic a 24-20 lead with 11:12 remaining.

Tyrell Hayden paced Western Kentucky with 84 yards on 10 carries, including a 64-yard touchdown run.

Rusty Smith went 15-for-23 for 174 yards and a touchdown for Florida Atlantic.

David Wolke and Dexter Taylor combined to go 9-for-17 for 77 yards and an interception for Western Kentucky.
