TONIGHT'S GAME – The Golden Panthers are back in action this evening after their thrilling 22-21 home victory over Arkansas State two weeks ago. Now, 2-1 in FIU Stadium this season, the Golden Panthers have won four of their last six games, outscoring opponents, 173-150, over that span.

While it has been a total-team effort thus far, the defense has made tremendous strides as the season has progressed. In fact, after giving up more than 39 points per game in 2007, the FIU defense has cut that total by 11.9 points per game this season, ranking third nationally among all Division I-A schools in Most Improved Scoring Defenses (1. Florida, 14.2 point improvement; 2. Northern Illinois, 12.1).

FIU and ULM have met four times previously with the Warhawks holding a 3-0 series lead (after FIU's 31-29 victory in Monroe on Nov. 5, 2005 was vacated by the NCAA). Last year in Monroe, ULM's Darrell McNeal scored three touchdowns and Kinsmon Lancaster threw for 237 yards in a 28-14 victory. Julian Reams rushed for 55 yards and Jeremy Dickens caught six passes for 87 yards to lead the Golden Panthers.

Two weeks ago against Arkansas State in FIU Stadium, T.Y. Hilton caught a school record 199 yards and threw the game-deciding touchdown with 2:04 left to lift FIU to a 22-21 win over Arkansas State on Saturday night. Hilton's pass came off a broken play in which he fumbled on a reverse call, picked up the ball, scrambled and launched a wobbly pass to Junior Mertile for a 38-yard touchdown to for the Golden Panthers. Dustin Rivest, who put FIU ahead with the extra point, also set the school's single-game record with five field goals of 42, 33, 43, 35, and 37 yards. He also missed two field goals. Both Hilton and Rivest were named Sun Belt Conference Players of the Week.

Last Saturday, ULM suffered its worse loss of the season with a 59-0 setback at the hands of an Ole Miss team on a mission to become bowl eligible for the first time since 2003.

HILTON NAMED TO CBSSPORTSLINE FRESHMAN WATCH LIST: Freshman wide receiver T.Y. Hilton continues his stellar campaign, being recognized as one of the top five freshmen in the nation by CBSSportsline.com for week 13. The Freshman Watch List tracks the production of the best freshmen in the nation, and at the end of the season will award the Freshman of the Year. Hilton comes into tonight's game ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards, fifth in punt return average, 23rd in receiving yards and 29th in kickoff return yards.

SHULA BOWL NEXT: It is up the road to Dolphin Stadium next Saturday for the seventh annual Shula Bowl against Florida Atlantic. Kick is scheduled for 4:00 p.m. After that, FIU closes out the regular season on Saturday, December 6 with a non-conference tilt against Western Kentucky University. Next season, the Sun Belt Conference will welcome the Hilltoppers as its newest football member.

HEAD COACH MARIO CRISTOBAL (Miami, Fla., 1993) begins his second season as head football coach at FIU with a 5-16 career record...Prior to his appointment at FIU, Cristobal spent three seasons as tight ends/offensive line coach at the University of Miami (Fla.) where the Hurricanes compiled a 24-12 record and appeared in the 2004 and '05 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and the 2006 Micron PC Bowl...Cristobal spent the prior three years as an assistant at Rutgers, helping turn the Scarlet Knights into one of the top programs in the BCS...He was a four-year letterwinner and member of the UM football team from 1988-92, earning All-Big East honors as an offensive tackle in 1992...Cristobal signed with the Denver Broncos as an undrafted rookie in 1994 and played for the Amsterdam Admirals in NFL Europe in 1995 and '06 before beginning his coaching career...Cristobal is the third-youngest head coach at the Football Bowl Subdivision level. Only Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald (33) and Western Kentucky University's David Elson (37) are younger than Cristobal who turns 38 on September 24.

FORMER PURDUE CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR BILL LEGG is FIU's new offensive coordinator...Legg, 45, coached five seasons at Purdue and was co-offensive coordinator for the last two...Last year, the Boilermakers led the Big Ten in total offense (435.92 yards per game) and scoring offense (34.31 points per game)...A four-year starting center at West Virginia University from 1981-84, and was head coach Don Nehlen's first recruit with the Mountaineers...Legg was drafted by the Birmingham Stallions of the United States Football League and subsequently had a brief stint with the Washington Redskins in 1985.

Here is a quick look at the other FIU assistant coaches:

- **Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers - Phil Galiano** (2nd season): A four-year member of the Rutgers staff working with the defensive ends for two seasons, coaching the linebackers in 2004 and working with the defensive line in 2003.

- **Special Teams Coordinator - Apollo Wright** (2nd season): Helped FIU to finish third among Sun Belt Conference teams in kick-off returns, punt returns and punting...Spent six seasons at Villanova as the running backs coach and special teams coordinator and helped with the development of Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro Brian Westbrook.

- **Recruiting Coordinator/Running Backs - Mike Cussano** (2nd season): Sent three years at the University of Miami as a volunteer coach and offensive graduate assistant, coaching in the 2004 and '05 Peach Bowls and 2006 Micron PC Bowl with the Hurricanes.

- **Defensive Line - Bernard Clark** (4th season): Served as FIU's defensive coordinator in 2004 and '05 before moving on as defensive line coach at the University of South Florida in 2006...His USF defensive line helped the Bulls defense rank 14th nationally in sacks, 21st in scoring defense and 26th in total defense.

- **Offensive Line - Greg Laffere** (2nd season): Spent two season at FCS power Illinois State where his offensive line paved the way for Redbird All-American running back Pierre Rembert in 2006 set the ISU record for rushing in a season with 1,743 yards and 16 rushing touchdowns.

- **Tight Ends - Alex Mirabel** (2nd season): Coached on the South Florida high school scene for 13 years prior to joining the FIU staff...Helped Miami Christopher Columbus High School to three district championships in four years as the Explorers offensive line coach and run game coordinator.

- **Wide Receivers - Frank Ponce** (2nd season): Another local career high school head coach, and FIU alumnus, who was a five-time assistant coach in the Miami-Dade/Broward All-Star Game and an assistant on the USA Team of the 2007 NFL Junior Global Football Tournament.

- **Defensive Backs - Jeff Popovich** (2nd season): A two-year defensive graduate assistant at the University of Miami, working primarily with the secondary and assisting with special teams...letter four years after walking on at UM.

HOMEGROWN TALENT: Of the 103 players listed on the most updated FIU football roster, 88 (85.4-percent) come from the home state of Florida. The roster also includes a pair players from California, Georgia and New York, plus each from Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Nebraska, New Jersey, Tennessee and Virginia.

SERINI NAMED TO RIMINGTON WATCH LIST – Sophomore center **Brad Serini** was named to the Rimington Trophy 2008 spring watch list this past summer, and is one of just six sophomores on the 42-man list. Serini started all 12 games at center at FIU as a true freshman in 2007 and he played all but a handful of snaps during the season. Rimington, the award's namesake, was a consensus first-team All-America center at Nebraska in 1981 and '82, during which time he became the John Outland Trophy's only double winner as the nation's finest interior lineman.

REAMS JOINS THE 1,000-YARD RUSHING CLUB – Senior running back **Julian Reams**' second TD run of the game against Toledo on Sept. 27 gave him 1,025 yards for his career and made him just the third player in school history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a career. Reams would later go on to score a third rushing TD in that game (first time since Ben West vs. Florida Atlantic, 11/26/05).

YOUNG PANTHERS CONTINUE BAPTISM OF FIRE – The Golden Panthers had six true freshmen see playing time in the season opener against Kansas and over the first five games this season, FIU head coach **Mario Cristobal** has played 13 true and six redshirt freshmen. Only two schools have equalled or played more true freshmen than FIU this season, Florida State (22) and SMU (13). Last season, FIU played 11 true freshmen when the team was recognized as the second-youngest in the FBS, behind only Temple.

Not only that, but FIU's top two pass receivers this season are true freshmen **T.Y. Hilton** (27) and **Junior Mertile** (18) and it was **Franklin Brown's** interception two weeks ago against Arkansas State that sealed the victory for the Golden Panthers against the Red Wolves.

MCCALL GRABS LEAD IN QB RACE – For the first three games of the campaign, junior **Paul McCall** and sophomore **Wayne Younger** shared playing time at quarterback. But since then, it has been McCall who has become entrenched at the position. And why not? Over his first three Sun Belt Conference games, McCall completed 46-of-81 passes for 723 yards, seven TD passes, two interceptions and a league-leading 155.3 pass efficiency rating. On October 4 at North Texas, his four touchdown passes equalling the school record for most in a game, established in 2002 by Jamie Burke against Albany. And last time out against Arkansas State, he became the first FIU quarterback since Josh Padrick in 2005 to throw for 300-plus yards in a game when McCall completed passes totaling 321 yards against Arkansas State.

HILTON CONTINUES IMPRESSIVE FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN – After being named the Sun Belt Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week on September 29, freshman **T.Y. Hilton** took it out on North Texas on October 4 in Denton. Hilton scored on touchdown passes of 65 and 73 yards, becoming the 21st 100-yard receiver for FIU, and his 145 receiving yards for the game ranked third most in school history.

The true freshman outdid himself two weeks ago against Arkansas State when he set a new school record with 199 receiving yards and recorded his fourth-straight game of 200-plus all-purpose yards against Arkansas State. But the Coup De Gras for Hilton against the Red Wolves was his 38-yard touchdown pass that clinched a 22-21 FIU victory. Afterwards, he not only earned Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week accolades, but he also was given an ESPN.com Helmet Sticker.

Hilton enters tonight's game ranked in several national categories. He ranks second in all-purpose yards among all FBS players (198.67), is fifth in punt return average (17.79) and 23rd in receiving yards (86.33) per game.

NOTES FROM THE ARKANSAS STATE GAME

• **Dustin Rivest**, who would later earn Sun Belt Conference Special Team Player of the Week honors, set a new FIU school record with his five field goals against the Red Wolves. Rivest erased the mark of four field goals in a single game set by **Adam Moss** on Nov. 15, 2003 at Gardner-Webb.

• It was also a record-breaking night in several other areas with WR **T.Y. Hilton's** 199 receiving yards (old record, 192 yards by Harold Leath at Georgia Southern on Oct. 4, 2003) and QB **Paul McCall's** 321 yards passing was the fourth-most in FIU school history and the first 300-plus yard passing game since Dec. 3, 2005.

• FIU racked up 407 yards in total offense for the game, the first time this season that the Golden Panthers offense generated more than 400 yards in a game this season.

FIU MEDIA RELATIONS POLICIES

General Statement: Credentials for FIU home football games are for working media only. Spouses, dates, children under 18 and other non-workers are not permitted in working media areas in compliance with the working codes of the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

Press Policies: Working space in the press box is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Credentials will be issued according to the following criteria:

- 1.) Local and state newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area and student newspapers from FIU and opponent's schools.
- 2.) Other daily newspapers with preference to those that regularly cover FIU.
- 3.) Radio and television personnel not broadcasting but considered reporting (seats may be provided in the stands).
- 4.) Non-daily newspapers with preference to those that regularly cover FIU.
- 5.) Scouts.

Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be requested as verification of a writer's status.

Photo credentials will be issued on a game-by-game basis. FIU adheres to all NCAA guidelines regarding sideline photography that limits shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard line.

Practice Attendance: Working media may only attend the first 20 minutes of week-day practice sessions. During the season, the team's day off is Monday. Media planning on attending practices should first check in with Assistant Athletic Director/Media Relations Rich Kelch. THE FIU LOCKER AND ATHLETIC TRAINING ROOMS ARE OFF LIMITS TO THE MEDIA.

WE'RE NUMBER 1: The Golden Panthers opened their Sun Belt Conference schedule with a win for the first time since joining the league in 2005. Currently, Arkansas State stands in third place in the Sun Belt Conference standings with a 2-1 league mark while FIU is a half-game back in fourth place with a 2-2 SBC record.

HONOR ROLL: The Golden Panthers had 162 student-athletes named to the Sun Belt Conference Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0-or-high GPA. That number represented 46% of FIU's total number of student-athletes. Head coach **Mario Cristobal's** football squad earned a solid 2.63 grade point average, the highest average in the seven year history of the program. Overall, 30 football players, or 31-percent of the team, finished the Spring 2007 semester earning academic honors of 3.0 GPAs or higher.

THE GRADUATES: Quarterback **Paul McCall**, tight end **Moses Hinton** and defensive back **Marshall McDuffie** enter the 2008 college football season with degrees already in hand. McCall, who earned his bachelor's degree in electrical engineering, Hinton in sports management and McDuffie in business management received their diplomas in graduation ceremonies over last summer.

LARGE CROWDS THE NORM: FIU has opened the 2008 football season playing in front of some of the largest crowds in their brief history. The Golden Panthers opened the campaign playing before 52,112 at the University of Kansas--a record number for 88-year old Memorial Stadium and then performed in front of 70,585 the next week at Iowa. On Nov. 1 at Louisiana-Lafayette, the crowd of 29,031 was the largest ever to view a Sun Belt Conference regular-season contest.

BUZZSAW BRYANT – Junior linebacker **Scott Bryant** is tied as the FIU leader with 63 total tackles and his 175 career stops now puts him in sixth place on the program's all-time career list. Next in sight for the Lakeland, Fla., native is Baltimore Ravens' linebacker **Antwan Barnes** who recorded 224 stops from 2003-06.

GAITOR GRABS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS – Sophomore defensive back **Anthony Gaitor** was named the Sun Belt Conference's Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 13 after intercepting two passes during FIU's 31-21 win over Middle Tennessee. With Middle Tennessee holding a 3-0 lead and driving, Gaitor returned his first interception 71 yards to the MT 12, setting up FIU's first touchdown of the game. Later, with FIU holding a 10-3 lead, Gaitor picked off the SBC's leading passer, **Joe Craddock**, a second time, this time for a 27-yard touchdown return--the first for FIU Oct. 2006.

BLOCK PARTY -- **O'Darius D'Haiti's** blocked punt at North Texas on Oct. 4, the first of his career, was FIU's third of the season (the most in a year since three in 2005). **Alonzo Phillips'** 11-yard return of that block for a TD marked the first time FIU had returned a blocked punt for a TD since **Cory Fleming's** 22-yard return vs. Troy on Dec. 2, 2006.

COMING FROM BEHIND – Down 13-0 after one quarter against Toledo on September 27, FIU climbed out of its biggest first-quarter deficit to win since trailing Middle Tennessee, 14-0, and winning a vacated 35-31 game on December 3, 2005.

The Golden Panthers did it again two weeks ago against Arkansas State. Down 21-12 in the fourth quarter, FIU came back for a 22-21 Sun Belt Conference win.

MUNERA GETTING HIS KICKS – Senior punter **Carlos Munera** continues to show punting progress this season, currently ranking second among all Sun Belt Conference punters with an average of 41.3 yards per kick. His 2,311 punt yards this season is already the second most in the history of the FIU program, behind only **Chris Cook** who punted for 3,040 yards in 2007.

GETTING INTO THE OPPONENTS BACKFIELD – The FIU defense has continued to excel in is tackling for losses. The Golden Panthers rank 15th nationally with an average of 7.33 tackles for loss per game. Twenty-five different FIU players have recorded tackles for loss, led by DE **Quentin Newman** who ranks tied for 52rd nationally with 1.13 tackles per loss per contest.

MID-TERM GRADES – FIU players might have been afterthoughts on most preseason All-Sun Belt Conference teams. But eight Golden Panthers were named to **Phil Steele's** midseason All-Sun Belt team. Freshman **T.Y. Hilton** was selected as a first-team receiver, kick returner and punt returner. Defensive end **Quentin Newman**, defensive back **Robert Mitchell** and punter **Carlos Munera** also were named to the first team. Offensive guard **Joe Alajajian**, linebacker **Scott Bryant** and defensive back **Anthony Gaitor** made the second team and center **Brad Serini** was named to the third team.

NEW FIU STADIUM OPENS TO RAVE REVIEWS

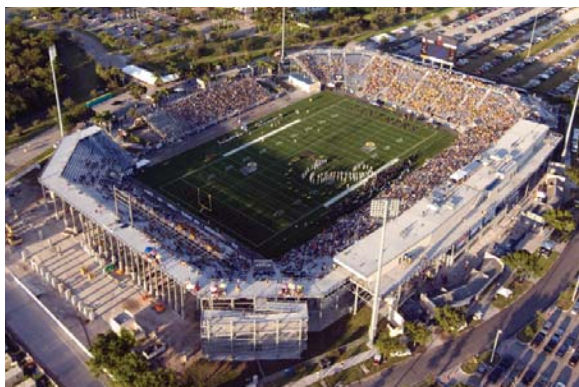
A new era for FIU football began Saturday, September 20 when FIU hosted the No. 12-ranked University of South Florida Bulls in brand-new FIU Stadium. All along, the Golden Panthers have set aggressive goals and have been committed to competing at the highest level. FIU is building this tradition of excellence with Athletic Director Pete Garcia, Head Football Coach Mario Cristobal and this new on-campus stadium.

The stadium's first phase includes a capacity of 18,000 and features 1,440 club seats, a 6,500 square foot Stadium Club, an upper concourse and 19 premium suites. Seating includes both chair back and bench seating with backrests for fan convenience. Additional phases of construction will include a student support complex and will bring the stadium's seating capacity to approximately 45,000.

FIU's new stadium became the only Division I on-campus football stadium south of Orlando in Florida.

Nearly two-thirds of the stadium project will be funded from existing sources like athletic fees, game guarantees and existing vendor contributions. In addition, ticket sales will be applied toward financing improvements. The new stadium complex also opens the door to other sources of revenue like corporate sponsorship packages and naming rights, in addition to concerts, non-intercollegiate sporting events and other community activities that will take place at the stadium.

Future phases for the stadium include an adjacent 100,000 square-foot student center that will house undergraduate advising, admissions, financial aid and an alumni welcome center. Most of these services have been located on University Park in the Charles Perry Building.



Odebrecht Construction, which has been operating in Florida for nearly 20 years, has been responsible for building another Miami sports icon—the American Airlines Arena—and the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts of Miami-Dade County.

The stadium will also be the home of the brain trust of the FIU Football program with the completion of a two-story, 50,000-square foot fieldhouse scheduled for spring of 2009.

Highlights of the new fieldhouse include a 12,500-square foot clean span weight room that will be used not only by Golden Panther football players but all FIU student-athletes for their strength and conditioning needs.

Visitors will be greeted in a reception area that will also include a Hall of Fame area. The first floor will also contain an equipment room, athletic training complex, ticket office and 8,500-square feet of locker rooms for players and coaches.

The fieldhouse's second floor will feature coaches' offices, a theater-style team meeting room and six breakout rooms, which overlook the field, for smaller gatherings. Those rooms also open to a deck that will be used for recruiting and game-day entertainment.

• The Warhawks rank 11th in the country with just 12 turnovers on the season. ULM turned the ball over twice at Auburn (offensive fumble, fumble on kickoff return), once at Tulane (interception), three times at Arkansas State (two fumbles, interception), twice against FAU (fumble, interception), one against Troy (interception), once at MTSU (interception) and twice at Ole Miss (two interceptions).

• It took just two games for redshirt freshman Anthony McCall to make his mark on the season. The Montgomery, Ala., native caught six passes for 125 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the game against Arkansas. He caught TD passes of 33 and three yards as the Warhawks came within a point, 28-27, of the victory. McCall also has touchdown receptions against Alabama A&M, Florida Atlantic and Middle Tennessee giving the rookie five on the season. He is tied for third in the Sun Belt with those five touchdowns receptions and is tied with FIU's T.Y. Hilton for the second most by a freshman.

• ULM has scored in 75-of-79 games dating back to Sept. 14, 2002, against McNeese State. The Warhawks were shut out 34-0 in the season opener at No. 10 Auburn snapping a streak of 32 straight games without being shut out. A 59-0 loss to Ole Miss marked the first time that ULM had been shut out multiple times in the same season since 2000 against Memphis (28-0), Middle Tennessee (28-0) and Central Florida (55-0). The 32 game streak passed the previous best mark of 22 which was set from Sept. 14, 2002-Nov. 22, 2003. The next milestone was 82 games; ULM was not shut out from Sept. 9, 1989-Nov. 4, 1995 -- the streak ended at Louisville on Nov. 11, 1995 in a 39-0 defeat.

• ULM junior linebacker Cardia Jackson was named Louisiana Defensive Player of the Week by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) after recording 17 tackles in the Warhawks game at Tulane. Jackson had 14 solo stops against the Green Wave tying him for the seventh most all-time in ULM history. The Monroe, La., native had more than twice as many solo tackles and seven more total tackles than anyone else in the game.

• The Warhawks are among the best in the league in limiting opponents to extra yardage on both kickoffs and punts. ULM leads the conference averaging a net of 44.6 yards per kickoff -- 1.6 yards better than Florida Atlantic. The Warhawks are fourth the Sun Belt in net punting averaging 34.5 yards per kick. ULM was second in that category heading into the game at Middle Tennessee, but had a punt partially blocked and only go for 11 yards.

• ULM junior punter Scott Love was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List, which is awarded to the nation's top collegiate punter. Love, who was a first team All-Sun Belt selection last year and Preseason All-Sun Belt selection this year, is averaging 39.7 yards per kick and has placed 13 of his 63 kicks inside the 20-yard line.

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) - Todd Reesing threw three touchdown passes to Dezmon Briscoe and No. 14 Kansas, coming off the greatest season in its history, opened with a 40-10 victory Saturday over FIU before a record-breaking home crowd.

Reesing, who rewrote the Kansas record book last year during a 12-1 season that vaulted the Jayhawks into national contention, was 37-for-52 for 256 yards. Briscoe, a sophomore and Reesing's third-leading receiver in 2007, had touchdown catches of 3, 4 and 3 yards against a Sun Belt team the Jayhawks smacked 55-3 a year ago.

Briscoe's third TD, on fourth-and-goal from the 3, was a leaping grab in the corner of the end zone after Reesing appeared to have overthrown his wide-open target.

The game was played before a school-record crowd of 52,112, breaking the mark of 51,910 which watched the resurgent Jayhawks beat long-time nemesis Nebraska 76-39 last year. It also broke by 4,000 the Memorial Stadium record for a non-conference game.

Kansas took a commanding lead with a 23-point second quarter that made it 30-10 at the half.

Reesing also threw an interception which Jeremiah Weatherspoon returned 20 yards to the Kansas 27 in the fourth quarter. A year ago, he had only seven interceptions. But a few minutes after the interception, Phillip Strozier made his second interception for the Jayhawks. His first was returned 30 yards and set up Briscoe's third touchdown.

The Golden Panthers, 1-11 last season, were playing the highest-ranked team they have seen since becoming a major college program in 2006. They got their only touchdown in two games against Kansas when T.Y. Hilton took a punt and sped 74 yards into the end zone in the second quarter. Dustin Rivest had a 43-yard field goal for FIU at the end of the half.

Briscoe capped a 56-yard scoring drive with his first TD catch on the first play of the second quarter. A few minutes later, Daymond Patterson, a freshman, broke loose for a 75-yard punt return, jumping over one would-be tackler near the 20 who had been blocked to the ground.

Alonso Rojas, replacing departed Scott Webb, kicked a 47-yard field goal in the second quarter for a 17-0 lead and added a 37-yarder in the third as the Jayhawks won for the 16th time in their last 18 games overall.

McCall was 10-for-28 for 73 yards, with two interceptions.

IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) - Ricky Stanzi threw three touchdown passes in his first start, Shonn Greene ran for 130 yards and Iowa pounded FIU 42-0 for its second straight blowout win.

The Hawkeyes, who routed Maine 46-3 last week, looked even better against the Golden Panthers. Stanzi, who got the start over Jake Christensen, was 8-of-10 for 162 yards in less than a half as the Hawkeyes (2-0) racked up 512 yards and led 35-0 at halftime.

Christensen came on and was 8-of-12 for 99 yards and one touchdown. But it was clear Stanzi has taken the lead in the competition to be Iowa's starter the rest of the season.

FIU (0-2) had no answer for Iowa's defensive front, which stopped the Golden Panthers all day. The Hawkeyes had six sacks, and when they weren't slamming quarterbacks Paul McCall and Wayne Younger to the turf they were stuffing running lanes and forcing both to hurry throws.

Younger came off the bench and was 11-of-20 for 107 yards to lead FIU, which lost for the 25th time in 26 games dating back to 2006. The Golden Panthers have now been outscored 82-10 this season.

The Hawkeyes rolled up 209 yards of total offense and a 21-0 lead in the first quarter.

Iowa scored on its opening drive for the second straight week, after failing to get any points on opening possessions last season. Greene capped that drive with a bruising 11-yard TD run, bouncing off a number of defenders before stretching the ball over the goal line.

Stanzi made it 14-0 with a 59-yard touchdown pass to Derrell Johnson-Koulianos. Stanzi hit Johnson-Koulianos in stride about 40 yards downfield, and Johnson-Koulianos used some nifty footwork to sidestep defenders near the out-of-bounds line and reach the end zone.

Christensen came in for Stanzi and threw a third-down pass into the turf on his first attempt, drawing a chorus of boos from the Kinnick Stadium faithful.

MIAMI (AP) - Mike Ford ran for two short touchdowns and South Florida spoiled FIU's debut in its new on-campus stadium.

Matt Grothe completed 14 of 22 passes for 137 yards for South Florida (4-0), but was held without a passing or rushing touchdown for just the second time in his 30-game career.

FIU (0-3), which came in ranked last among all FBS schools in total offense (178.5 yards per game) and scoring (5.0), got a 61-yard catch-and-run from Wayne Younger to T.Y. Hilton with 2:03 remaining, setting up Julian Reams' 1-yard TD run - the Golden Panthers' first offensive touchdown this season.

USF linebacker Brouce Mompremier was injured after colliding with teammate Carlton Williams while attempting a tackle with 6:43 left in the third quarter. USF officials said Mompremier - a Miami native who had family at the game - was moving his arms and legs and was expected to remain hospitalized overnight for tests and observation.

The Bulls fumbled the ball away on their first possession, started their second series on the USF 1, and needed 13 plays before Ford rushed in from 2 yards out for first points ever recorded at the stadium. FIU safety Jeremiah Weatherspoon forced the turnover on the opening drive and knocked the ball loose twice on the next drive as well, but USF kept possession and took the early lead.

From there, though, FIU's defense held tough, keeping the upset hope alive.

"We played with a lot of passion, a lot of energy that helped us out," Weatherspoon said. "We just made a few mistakes that cost us."

The stadium is on the same site as FIU's previous football home, a 7,000-seat facility that was more suited for high school games than big-time college football. The current structure - which still lacks a scoreboard on one end, isn't yet enclosed on the visitors' side and will eventually have

a massive field house attached to it - was built in 16 months.

Building FIU into a winner is taking a bit longer.

The Golden Panthers have lost 26 of 27 games since the start of the 2006 season, but have long pointed to the opening of the stadium as the first significant step toward a turnaround. And recruits in talent-rich South Florida are quickly taking notice; a slew of players from the Miami area have already committed to enroll at FIU next fall, and plenty more attended the stadium's debut.

Hanging close to a nationally ranked team wasn't a consolation prize, Cristobal said.

"Our guys are as down as they can possibly be," Cristobal said. "But it does say something. It does say that we can do some things that can make us have a successful season."

Reams finished with 75 yards on 19 carries. Hilton caught a 37-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.

"Every day, this coaching staff and this team works its tails off to be a better program because they believe in what's going to happen here at FIU," Cristobal said after the school's first road victory against a non-conference Football Bowl Subdivision team. "Last week, we got closer, fighting toe-to-toe with USF. It was time to punch through on the road against a non-conference opponent.

"We realize we're miles away, but we came out on an emotional high, executed well and won the football game."

After scoring only one touchdown in its first three games combined, FIU generated 239 yards of offense and five scores. With the defense limiting Toledo to just 146 yards after the first quarter and the special teams making numerous big plays, FIU had more than enough firepower for Toledo.

The Rockets (1-3) jumped out to a 13-0 lead and led 16-14 at the half, but couldn't score after the break. They gained FIU 302 yards of total offense, but committed four turnovers, three of which led to Golden Panther touchdowns.

"I was a little bit alarmed [when they led 13-0] because we had such a great performance against South Florida," Cristobal said. "We felt we had a good week of practice on defense, and we were so sharp -- we felt we had a bead on what they were doing."

DENTON, Texas (AP) -Paul McCall threw for 234 yards and four touchdowns to lead FIU to a 42-10 victory over North Texas in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both schools.

T.Y. Hilton caught two touchdowns and had 145 yards receiving for FIU (2-3), which had entered the game ranked last in the nation in total offense.

But facing the fourth-worst defense in the country, McCall went 11-of-19 to notch career highs in both yardage and TDs. His four TD throws tied a school record that had stood since 2002, the program's opening season. In his first four games combined this season, McCall had thrown one touchdown and 272 yards passing.

McCall's 65-yard TD pass to T.Y. Hilton was the freshman's third touchdown of the season giving FIU a 7-0 lead and marked the first time the Golden Panthers had led in the first quarter of a game since last Nov. 17 against Louisiana-Lafayette (6-0), seven games ago.

And his second TD reception, for 74 yards was the second-longest touchdown pass in the history of the program (89 yards vs. Maryland, 9/23/06). His two TD receptions tied the mark for most in a game, accomplished five other times in the history of the program.

Giovanni Vizza passed for 274 yards and threw three interceptions for North Texas (0-5), which has yet to lead in a game this season.

FIU running back A'mod Ned broke through for a 26-yard touchdown run, and O'Darius D'Haiti blocked a punt, that was picked up by Alonzo Phillips who returned it 11 yards for a TD, marked the first time FIU had returned a blocked punt in nearly two years.

"We're young and we still have a long way to go, but we're building," summed up head coach Mario Cristobal. "We could have scored more tonight and we didn't. We could have shut them out and we didn't. But we're getting better, one game at a time."

MIAMI (AP) -Paul McCall threw for one touchdown and ran for another to lead FIU to a 31-21 win against Middle Tennessee on Saturday night.

McCall completed 13 of 29 passes for 223 yards with one touchdown and one interception, running for another score and 53 yards on nine carries for the Golden Panthers (3-3, 2-0 Sun Belt Conference).

Phillip Tanner rushed 18 times for 86 yards and two touchdowns for the Blue Raiders (2-4, 1-3).

FIU reached the .500 mark for the first time since 2002, and tied a school record with its third consecutive win.

McCall's 9-yard touchdown run gave FIU a 7-3 lead with 4:12 before the half, and Dustin Rivest's 20-yard field goal extended the lead to 10-3 at halftime.

"[McCall] hurt us more on scrambles than designated runs," said Middle Tennessee head coach Rick Stockstill. "I thought we got some good pressure on him, but give him credit. He did a nice job of buying some time, getting in the seams and making something happen. What he did is about what we expected him to do. We didn't think he would do some predesigned quarterback runs, but we knew he was a scrambler out of the pocket."

Anthony Gaitor opened the second half with a 27-yard interception return for the Golden Panthers, and A'mod Ned's 1-yard touchdown run gave FIU a 24-6 lead at the 3:29 mark in the third quarter. Tanner's 3-yard touchdown run cut Middle Tennessee's deficit to 11 points at the end of the third.

But McCall hit T.Y. Hilton on a 63-yard touchdown pass to make it 31-13, and Tanner's 3-yard run with 4:41 left wouldn't be enough for the Blue Raiders.

"We're getting better," said FIU head coach Mario Cristobal. "We're playing hard and we're playing physical but we are still making mistakes,

too. I definitely think Middle Tennessee is a good football team. They beat Maryland and were about to beat Kentucky. After last year (a 47-6 Middle Tennessee win in Murfreesboro), we knew they were a good team. But we're also on a roll right now."

Troy, Ala. (AP) -Levi Brown and Jerrel Jernigan each scored two touchdowns to help Troy beat FIU 33-23 on Saturday night.

Brown completed 18 of 28 passes for 253 yards with two touchdowns in his first start for the Trojans (4-2, 3-0 Sun Belt Conference), which moved into a first-place tie with UL-Lafayette in the conference. Jernigan added 131 yards receiving and a touchdown, rushed for 88 yards on 10 carries and completed his only pass for a 2-yard touchdown.

Paul McCall completed 22 of 33 passes for 266 yards with two touchdowns and an interception for the Golden Panthers (3-4, 2-1), which saw its three-game winning streak snapped.

Brown threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to Cornelius Williams on Troy's first drive, and an 86-yard touchdown pass to Jernigan on the next to give Troy a 13-0 lead. McCall's 8-yard touchdown pass to Junior Mertile cut the Trojans' lead to 13-9 at the end of the first and, after Troy's Sam Glusman hit field goals of 20 and 44 yards, Daunte Owens' 1-yard run left the Golden Panthers trailing 19-16 at halftime.

But Jernigan's 2-yard pass to Justin Bray in the third and Dan Parker's 1-yard rush in the fourth put the game out of reach.

"We played against a good football team," FIU coach Mario Cristobal said. "And against a good football team you cannot make mistakes. . . . It's a tough lesson learned for a bunch of guys who worked their butts off."

Down 10 midway through the fourth quarter, McCall led an FIU drive that was capped by a one-handed grab by freshman T.Y. Hilton that would have given the Golden Panthers a first-and-10 at the Troy 25. But offsetting penalties nullified the play and the drive ultimately stalled.

Another reason the Golden Panthers could not get closer was the ferocious Trojans' pass rush that sacked McCall seven times.

With running back Julian Reams sidelined with a calf injury for the Golden Panthers, Owens was FIU's top runner on the game with a career-high 69 yards on 14 rushes.

"Mistakes that you're going to be sick tomorrow when you watch film," Cristobal said. "It's stuff that is correctable, but this game isn't and that's what hurts."

LAFAYETTE, La. (AP) -Tyrell Fenroy scored three touchdowns and broke 1,000 yards rushing for the fourth consecutive season to help Louisiana-Lafayette beat FIU 49-20 on Saturday.

Fenroy ran for 81 yards on 22 carries, which put him over 1,000 yards on the year for the fourth straight time - a feat only six other players in Division I-A history have done. The Louisiana-Lafayette tailback now leads all active NCAA players with 4,322 career rushing yards.

The Golden Panthers (3-5, 2-2 Sun Belt Conference) jumped out to a 7-0 lead on T.Y. Hilton's opening kickoff that went 90 yards for a touchdown. After Michael Desormeaux, who was 13 of 19 for 216 yards and two touchdowns, connected with Ladarius Green on a 6-yard score, Julian Reams' 1-yard run put FIU up 14-7 after the first.

"We started out fast. We started out like we wanted to. Then the team that we prepared to be, the team we pride ourselves on being, disappeared after the first quarter," said FIU head coach Mario Cristobal.

Fenroy scored from 3 and 4 yards away in the second, and LaLaf Gerren Blount returned a fumble for a score to help the Ragin' Cajuns (5-3, 4-0) build a 35-14 lead at halftime. The record-setting tailback would score again on a 1-yard run to put UL ahead 49-14 after three quarters.

"We have got to become more consistent," said FIU quarterback Paul McCall, who was 9 of 21 for 85 yards and one interception. "I had some bad throws. The line was picking up the blitz, I just got to put the ball on the guys and do a better job than that. Good teams react positively no matter what gets thrown their way. We need to get back to doing things right. We can't let things snowball like they did tonight."

"Paul pulled out early on the handoff," Hilton said. "When I recovered the fumble and saw Junior wide open, all I thought was 'I've got to get him the ball.' When Junior caught it and I heard the crowd go crazy, I started going crazy too."

Dustin Rivest, who put FIU ahead with the extra point, also set the school's single-game record with five field goals of 42, 33, 43, 35, and 37 yards. He also missed two field goals.

The Red Wolves (4-5, 2-2) drove down to the FIU 42-yard line on their final drive of the game, but Franklin Brown intercepted Arkansas State quarterback Corey Leonard with 1:13 in the fourth quarter to seal the victory.

Arkansas pulled ahead 21-12 early in the fourth on a 12-yard touchdown run by Derek Lawson with 13:31 on the clock that capped off a nine-play, 75-yard drive.

Leonard's only touchdown pass of the game -- 18 yards to Vernon Catlin with 8:50 left in the third quarter -- gave ASU a 14-9 lead. Leonard scored the game's first touchdown on a 1-yard run just before halftime.
