Fenroy is First Cajun with 4,000 yards...

RB Tyrell Fenroy, the Cajuns career leader in rushing yards and combined rushing & receiving yards, has totaled 4,182 yards in his career.

Fenroy Enjoys Huge Nights...

Over the past two games, Fenroy has 43 rushes for 377 yards and six TD's. He also has three receptions for 80 yards. Fenroy had a career-best 194 rushing yards vs. Kent State (tied for the 7th most in school history) and 183 rushing yards at Kansas State. He owns 19 career 100-yard games (school record).

Running Game Success...

The Cajuns ranked 7th in the nation in rushing in 2005, 11th in 2006 and 7th in 2007. Over that span, UL has accumulated 8,080 yards and 77 TD's on the ground for an average of 231 yards and two scores per game. The Cajuns have 1,099 rushing yards (274.8ypg) and 12 TD's on the ground this season. Over the past two games UL has 1,176 yards of total offense, of which 749 has come via the ground game.

Desormeaux (2,244 rushing) sits in 5th place on the Cajuns career list. He is 67 rushing yards from 4th all-time. Desormeaux (2,704 passing) is 6th on the Cajuns career list, 1,952 passing yards from 5th all-time.

Spreading the field...

The Cajuns have already seen 15 different players make at least one reception. Only wide receivers Ross Goodlett, Jawanza Mitchell and Caleb Rubin and fullbacks Chancellor Roberson and Phillip Walker have appeared on offense without making a reception. The Cajuns are third nationally in number of players with a reception behind Troy (17) and Oklahoma (16).

Sun Belt Conference Enters Agreements with St. Petersburg Bowl, Papajohns.com Bowl, and Independence Bowl

NEW ORLEANS – The Sun Belt Conference signed agreements with the St. Petersburg Bowl, the Papajohns.com Bowl and the Independence Bowl. The agreements, which are effective immediately and will impact the 2008 and 2009 bowl games, call for bowl-eligible teams from the Sun Belt Conference to be the first available teams in these bowls should the contracted parties not be able to fulfill their requirements.

While the Sun Belt Conference champion will still play in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, the St. Petersburg Bowl or the Papajohns.com Bowl will have second choice to select one of the Sun Belt's bowl-eligible teams if the contracted parties are not be able to fulfill their requirements.

The St. Petersburg Bowl will play its inaugural game Dec. 20 at Tropicana Field and is scheduled to pit teams from the Big East and Conference USA. The 2008 Papajohns.com Bowl is scheduled to feature teams from the Big East and Southeastern Conference and will be played Dec. 29 at Legion Field in Birmingham, Ala. Both games are owned and operated by ESPN Regional Television, Inc., a subsidiary of ESPN.





The agreement signed with the Independence Bowl calls for that bowl game to receive the third choice to select one of the Sun Belt's bowl eligible teams if the contracted parties are not able to fulfill their requirements. The Independence Bowl would also receive the second choice to select a Sun Belt bowl eligible team should the St. Petersburg Bowl or the Papajohns.com Bowl not have an opening. The

game is scheduled to have a team from the Southeastern Conference and Big XII and will be played Dec. 28 at Independence Stadium in Shreveport, La.

The agreements with the St. Petersburg Bowl, the Papajohns.com Bowl, and the Independence Bowl are for two years, beginning with the 2008 bowl games. Should there be any ties in the Sun Belt standings, those three bowl games have the right to select the team of their choice.

FENROY AND KEYES WIN SUN BELT PLAYER OF THE WEEK

NEW ORLEANS – Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns senior running back Tyrell Fenroy and safety Derik Keyes were named Sun Belt Conference Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week, respectively, as announced by the conference office Monday.

Fenroy blasted Big XII Kansas State with 183 yards on only 20 carries (9.1ypc) and scored three touchdowns (1, 15, 69) in the Cajuns near upset victory. He also added a 12-yard reception to total 195 yards. Fenroy's first TD, a 15-yard run, capped a 10-play, 90-yard drive that saw the Cajuns score with 43 seconds remaining in the first half. His other two touchdowns were scored on back-to-back offensive possessions that took a 42-23 KSU lead and chopped it down to 42-37 with 8:49 remaining.

Fenroy has put up some big numbers over his last two games with 43 rushes for 377 yards and six TD's, as well as three receptions for 80 yards. His 3,724 career rushing yards make him the NCAA's leader among active running backs. He is the first player is school history to top 4,000 career combined rushing & receiving yards, as he currently has 4,182. Fenroy is now just 327 rushing yards away from passing North Texas' Patrick Cobbs and becoming the new all-time leader in rushing in Sun Belt Conference history. With seven rushing touchdowns already this season, Fenroy has tied Cobbs for second on the career list. Fenroy is five behind SBC career leader Eugene Gross (Middle Tennessee).

Keyes had a career-high 18 tackles at Kansas State, including 11 solo tackles. It marked the most tackles by any Cajuns defender since Kyries Hebert had 20 tackles at Minnesota on Sept. 8, 2001. Keyes also made a tackle-for-loss late in the fourth quarter on a KSU first-and-goal play. The TFL helped the Cajuns defense hold the Wildcats out of the end zone, forcing a field goal, which gave the ball back to the offense with 1:37 to play in a one possession game.

The Cajuns begin Sun Belt Conference play on Saturday with a trip to in-state rival ULM.

Head Coach Rickey Bustle...

Louisiana head coach Rickey Bustle has guided the Cajuns for six seasons and enters his seventh year in 2008.



Coach Bustle won 23 games in his first five seasons with the Cajuns from 2002-06, including 11 of the last 17 games. UL won only nine games in the five seasons prior to Bustle's arrival from 1997-2001.

Bustle saw his winning percentage increase each of the first four seasons since taking the job in 2002, but regressed to .500 in 2006. His 6-6 record in 2006 was only deemed a regression because of the high standards and raised levels of expectations by the Cajuns and their fans. In fact, Bustle's 12 wins from 2005-06 were the most in a two-year period since 1994-95.

Louisiana went 3-3 at home in 2006, marking the fifth straight season – all under Bustle - that the Cajuns had been .500 or better at home. Bustle boasts a 17-17 (.500) career record at Cajun Field. By comparison, UL was 6-19 (.240) at home from 1997-01.

In addition to raised expectations, Bustle has brought professionalism and discipline to the program. In addition to raised expectations, Bustle has brought professionalism and discipline to the program. From 2002-07, the Cajuns 440 penalties are the fewest in the Sun Belt Conference and UL boasts the fewest penalties per game over that span.

The Cajuns went 6-5 (.546) in 2005 to mark UL's first winning record since 1995.

Along with a winning season in 2005 came a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship thanks to five straight wins to end the season. After starting 1-5 (0-2), Louisiana roared back into the SBC race with a come-from-behind road win at Middle Tennessee. From there came a homecoming win over Troy in overtime and a second comeback road win, this time at North Texas. A Senior Day victory over Florida International set-up the season finale at Louisiana-Monroe. The Cajuns rocked the Indians 54-21, claiming the first school title since the 1994 Big West crown.

Bustle was given a two-year contract extension following the 2005 campaign, which lengthens his contract through 2010.

QUICK NOTES ABOUT COACH BUSTLE

Coach Bustle won 23 games in his first five seasons with the Cajuns from 2002-06, including 11 of the last 17 games. UL won only nine games in the five seasons prior to Bustle's arrival from 1997-2001.

- UL is 12-9 under coach Bustle one week after a victory. Conversely, UL is 13-27 one week after a loss. Note: The Cajuns are 1-3 two weeks after a win and 0-2 two weeks after a loss when there is an open date (two full weeks) in between games. (The results of season openers are not reflected)
- © Coach Bustle is 1-6 in coach's challenges, while opponents are 1-2 against the Cajuns in challenges. UL had an official's video review at #24 Illinois overturn a call on the field to give the Cajuns a rushing touchdown. UL had two fumble recoveries overturned by a video review (at Troy 2006, vs. FAU 2007). Bustle won his first challenge on Oct. 13, 2007 at Arkansas State. The ruling on the field of an Indians reception was overturned.
- Louisiana's non-conference road victory at Houston last season was Rickey Bustle's second non-conference road win (2-21) and was the second non-conference road win for UL since the Sun Belt started football in 2001.

- Senior Michael Desormeaux sits in 5th place (2,244 rushing) on the Cajuns career list for rushing. He is 67 yards from 4th all-time. Desormeaux moved into sixth place (2,704 passing) on the career list for passing yards.
- Desormeaux ranks 18th nationally in rushing yards averaging 109 per game. He ranks 20th in the FCS for total offense averaging 280.8 per game.
- Desormeaux posted a season-high 20 rush attempts at Kansas State. He scored a rushing TD for the third straight game.
- Desormeaux continues to move up the charts for UL in both passing and rushing categories. Desormeaux is now 5th all-time on the career list in total offense, passing Roy Henry at Kansas State. Desormeaux needs only 52 yards of total offense to become the 5th player in school history to amass 5,000 yards total offense. Desormeaux now has 2,244 rushing yards and 2,704 yards for a career mark of 4,948 yards of total offense. His next target to pass is Jon Van Cleave (5,269 total offense).
- Desormeaux posted his third career 150 yards passing-150 yards rushing game (253 pass, 150 rush vs. Kent State). He tied **Brian Mitchell** for the school record for 150 pass-150 rush games in a career.

- Wide receiver Richie Falgout tossed a 27-yard touchdown pass to fellow receiver Jason Chery at Kansas State. It was not the first time the duo strike last season vs. Ohio.



- True freshman **Derreck Dean** collected three tackles at KSU. His total was second amongst defensive linemen and equaled his output from the previous three games.
- Hall Davis leads the defensive line with 11 total tackles this season. Terrell Richardson is second with 10 tackles, while Nate Douglas and Jeremy Cook are close behind with nine tackles.
- Against Kent State, five defensive linemen combined for four tackles-forloss. For the season, the DL has posted 10.0 tackles-for-loss.
- Defensive line helped keep Illinois QB Juice Williams at bay. Williams was held to 35 yards rushing after collecting 174 in the Illini's home opener the previous week.



Secondary

- Derik Keyes had a career-high 18 tackles at Kansas State, including 11 solo tackles. It marked the most tackles by a Cajuns defender since Kyries Hebert had 20 tackles at Minnesota on Sept. 8, 2001.
- Keyes now leads all UL defensive personnel with 32 tackles this season. His 18 solo stops are a team-best. He is now up to 83 career tackles.
- Keyes leads the Cajuns with three pass breakups.
- Orkeys Auriene and Dwight Bentley each registered four tackles at Kansas State. The duo also posted one pass breakup apiece. Auriene has nine tackles in the last two games.
- Sophomore FS **Maurice Rolle** forced two fumbles against Southern Miss

Linebacker

- Jason Chery leads the team with 12 kickoff returns for 214 yards (17.8 per return).
- Punter **Spencer Ortego** has placed four punts inside the 20.
- Orkeys Auriene recorded a 64-yard punt return in the 4th quarter vs. Kent State to set up Tyrell Fenroy's third touchdown of the contest. The punt return was the longest since 2002 (Nick Dugas).
- Since the arrival of Coach Bustle in 2002, the Cajuns have blocked more kicks (32) than anybody in the nation with the exception of Texas (39) and Fresno State (38).

Blocking the Opposition

Since Coach Bustle's arrival, the Cajuns have blocked 32 kicks ('02 – 7, '03 – 5, '04 – 4, '05 – 7, '06 – 6, '07 – 3). Scoring on special team's blocks has been special for the Cajuns, accumulating six touchdowns and one safety. **Under Coach Bustle, the Cajuns have never gone more than five games without blocking a kick.** Jason Chery blocked a punt vs. North Carolina A&T and Johnny Felders returned the ball 18 yards for a touchdown – the second longest blocked punt return in school history. In 2004, Michael Adams blocked a field goal vs. Arkansas State which was returned 80 yards for a touchdown by Terryl Fenton. It was the Cajuns' third blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in the last two seasons. In 2003, the Cajuns returned two blocked field goals for touchdowns to set a NCAA single-season record. Pat Lamy secured a Michael Adams block in the season opener at South Carolina and raced 89 yards for the score and Antwain Spann ran for a 45-yard touchdown vs. Florida International following a Derace James block. In 2002, Charles Tillman blocked a Minnesota punt out of the end zone for a safety. Tillman later stuffed two punts at Arkansas, with the latter returned 18 yards for a touchdown by Wendall Williams.

OT FACTS

Since the NCAA adopted the overtime format in 1996, the Cajuns are 3-4 in OT games. UL fell in four overtimes to North Alabama, 48-42, on Oct. 11, 1997, and then in one overtime the very next game versus UL Monroe, 28-21, on Oct. 25, 1997. Playing in back-to-back overtime games was only the second occurrence in NCAA history at that time. There have been a total of 26 times in which a school has played in consecutive overtime games, with only UNLV playing in back-to-back OT games this season. Just six teams have lost back-to-back OT contests (the Cajuns and Oklahoma State in 1997, Washington State in 2000, Temple in 2003, Clemson in 2005 and Washington in 2007).

The Cajuns are 3-2 in the extra session since losing those two overtime games, needing one OT to top Wofford, 37-34, on Nov. 20, 1999. The following season, Louisiana played its first road overtime game, falling in double OT at Middle Tennessee, 41-38. Rickey Bustle's squad avenged that road overtime loss in Murfreesboro in 2000 with a heart-stopping 57-51 4OT win at MT on Nov. 15, 2003. Bustle won again in overtime, this time at Cajun Field on Oct. 29, 2005, topping Troy 31-28 in single OT. Bustle's first OT loss came on Oct. 20, 2007, falling to Florida Atlantic in the first OT, 39-32. **Bustle is 2-1 in overtime games.**

LAFAYETTE - Louisiana made a valiant effort in its final home game of the season, but the Louisiana-Monroe Warhawks were able to turn back the Ragin' Cajuns 17-11 Saturday night on Senior Day at Cajun Field.

The loss dropped Louisiana to 3-9 overall (3-4 Sun Belt) as the Cajuns suffered their first losing season since the 2004 campaign. ULM became bowl-eligible, earning its sixth win of the season

Tyrell Fenroy led all rushers with 19 carries for 118 yards and a touchdown. Late in the third quarter, Fenroy broke the 1,000-yard barrier – his third consecutive 1,000-yard campaign. He became one of only two juniors in the nation with three straight 1,000-yard seasons, joining Arkansas' Darren McFadden.

Senior quarterback Connor Morel posted a solid performance in his last game as a Cajun. Morel completed 19-of-37 passes for 240 yards. Jason Chery caught a game-high seven catches for 107 yards, while Verlin Morra added five catches for 79 yards.

Moore added five catches for 79 yards.

ULM took the opening drive of the second half 71 yards into the end zone. Lancaster scored on a three-yard run to give the visitors a 14-3 lead.

The Cajuris scored near the end of the third quarter with a three-play, 72-yard drive, to make it a 14-11 game.

After gaining just one yard on first down, Morel hit Moore for 29 yards to move the chains. On first-and-10 from the 42 yard line, Fenroy broke around the left tackle and raced into the end zone.

Following the touchdown, UL opted to go for two. Morel connected with a diving Erik Jones to pull the Cajuns within three points heading into the final stanza.

Early Deficit Deepens, Derails Cajuns

UL was handed a tough 51-21 loss at Southern Miss on Saturday. The Cajuns fell into an early hole and could not dig themselves out.



Southern Miss extended its 20-point halftime lead up to 30 points in the third thanks to a 25-yard field goal by Britt Barefoot and a three-yard run by Bubba Kirksey. The score by Kirksey capped a 10-play, 82-yard drive for the Golden Eagles.

Michael Desormeaux paced the offense with 16 carries for 146 yards. It is his eighth career 100-yard rushing performance. He finished the night 9-of-20 passing for 98 yards. Desormeaux moved into sixth place on the Cajuns' career rushing list and is 25 yards shy of fifth all-time.

Redshirt freshman QB Brad McGuire entered the game midway through the fourth quarter and directed a five-play. 49-yard scoring drive. McGuire hit Pierre Hill with a 21-yard pass in the corner of the end zone.

It's safe to assume that most people in Louisiana on Saturday afternoon had their focus on the impending arrival of Hurricane Gustav. The same may be true for the Cajuns, who seemed to be collectively focused somewhere other than football.

The Cajuns committed three penalties and had a pair of turnovers in the first quarter en route to a 14-0 deficit.



Oh So Close!

Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns gave No. 24 Illinois all they could handle on Saturday afternoon, falling to the 25-point favorite by a final score of 20-17.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Cajuns struck first in the final stanza when Michael Desormeaux scampered in from 34 yards to close the score to 17-10 in favor of the Illini. The play was initially ruled out of bounds at the two-yard line, but an official's video review overturned the call.

IU marched back with a nine-play, 52-yard drive that ended in a 27-yard field goal by Matt Eller.

The Cajuns answered 1:18 later with an 11-yard touchdown pass from Desormeaux to tight end Erik Jones. The score came with only 18 seconds remaining.

An onsides kick by the Cajuns was unsuccessful and the Illini were able to run out the clock.

Despite the loss, the story of the game for the Cajuns was Tyrell Fenroy. On his first carry of the game (14th carry of the season), Fenroy passed Cajuns legend Brian Mitchell to become the school's all-time leader in rushing yards.

Fenroy rumbled nine yards up the middle on his first carry to give the senior 3,336 career rushing yards - one yard more than Mitchell.

Fenroy ended the game with 20 yards rushing and 52 yards receiving. He is only 36 yards behind Brandon Stokley's school mark of 3,761 combined rushing and receiving

The Caiuns had excellent field position in the first half. The team trailed by 14 points after two quarters, but if not for a handful of plays, the outcome would have been different.

Cajuns Pile Up School Record

Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns earned their first victory of the season by topping Kent State 44-27 on Saturday night at Cajun Field. The Cajuns rolled up a school record 667 yards of total offense in the win.



Both scores by UL came on big plays. After Tyrell Fenroy gained 20 yards on a rush, Michael Desormeaux hit Ladarius Green with a deep ball over the defense for a 55-yard touchdown to start the scoring.

After Desormeaux gained 19 yards on a rush, wide receiver Jason Chery took a pitch on the left side and bolted down the sidelines 47 yards to extend the Cajuns lead to 37-21 with 6:28 to play in the third quarter.

Fenroy's third touchdown of the game sealed the win early in the fourth quarter. Fenroy punched the ball in from the one-yard line after Orkeys Auriene's 64-yard punt return put the Cajuns inside the Kent State red zone.

One week after passing Brian Mitchell to become the alltime leading rusher in school history, Fenroy passed Brandon Stokley on Saturday to gain sole possession of the career combined rushing and receiving record.

Fenroy finished the game with 194 yards rushing and 68 receiving upping his career total to 3,987 yards rushing and receiving. Stokley had held the record with 3,761 combined rushing and receiving yards.

Fenroy rushed for 100-plus yards in a Cajuns' home opener for the fourth straight season. His game-ending tally established a new career-high and ranks as the seventh-best rushing performance in school history.



MANHATTAN, Kan. - Louisiana's Ragin' Cajuns continue to play well, unfortunately it did not translate into a win on Saturday afternoon, as UL fell 45-37 at Kansas State.



Lanier Coleman forced a fumble that was recovered by Antwyne Zanders at the Kansas State 27-yard line. Wide receiver Richie Falgout took a handoff and ran to the right, but stopped to throw a perfect pass to Jason Chery for a touchdown with 14:42 left in the third quarter.

Kansas State came back with a 12-play, 85-yard scoring drive to get their 18-point lead back.

The Cajuns answered with a 15-play, 86-yard scoring drive in 6:27. Michael Desormeaux was injured during the drive, but returned on fourth-and-goal from the one-yard line and took the sneak into the end zone. Drew Edmiston's extra point missed to keep the score 35-23 in favor of Kansas State.

A 53-vard touchdown strike from Josh Freeman to Brandon Banks finished an 82-yard drive for the hosts.

UL needed four plays to score next. Desormeaux hit Pierre Hill for 10 yards on third-and-nine and then Tyrell Fenroy tied a career long with a 69-yard touchdown rush.

The Cajuns entered the fourth quarter trailing 42-30, but after a defensive stand moved the ball 83 yards in 12 plays, scoring on a one-yard run by Fenroy. The Wildcats lead was just 42-37 with 8:49 remaining.

KSU built their lead to eight following a 26-yard field goal with 1:37 remaining after a 17-play, 73-yard drive that consumed 7:12. The Wildcats converted three third downs on the drive and a fourth-andtwo on a fake punt.

Fenroy had his second monster game in a row. The senior totaled 183 yards rushing on 20 carries and scored three touchdowns for the second straight week. Over the past two weeks, Fenroy has 43 carries for 377 vards and six scores.

Desormeaux, who took a physical pounding all game, finished with 98 yards rushing and 136 yards passing. He did not commit a turnover.
