ZACHARIE ON MACKEY WATCH LIST

For the second straight season, tight end Zeek Zacharie was named to the John Mackey Award watch list. The award is presented to the nation's top tight end.

Zacharie has been named Mackey Tight End of the Week twice in his career. The Warhawks selected their team captains for the 2008 season with a representative from the offense, defense and special teams. Two of the three '08 captains were named to the Sun Belt Preseason All-Conference Team. Tight end Zeek Zacharie, bandit James Truxillo and punter Scott Love will serve as the '08 captains -- Zacharie and Love were both named Preseason All-Sun Belt.

THE SERIES

Middle Tennessee Grambling State Alabama

ULM and Arkansas State meet for the 30th time in the series' history on Saturday with the Red Wolves holding a slight three-game advantage, 16-13. Arkansas State has had the upper hand in the recent history winning four of the last six meetings, including the last two at ASU Stadium.

The Warhawks picked up their first league win of the season last year with a 30-13 victory over ASU closing the game with 30-unanswered points. The series generally produces close games as nine of the last 12 games have been decided by 10 points or less.

BALL SECURITY

The Warhawks lead the country with just three turnovers on the season. ULM turned the ball over twice at Auburn (offensive fumble, fumble on kickoff return) and once at Tulane (interception).

ULM entered last weekend tied with Florida, UNLV and Oklahoma for the NCAA lead, but the three other teams all had at least one turnover.

The Warhawks are tied for 20th nationally with a +1.0 turnover margin.

WARHAWK RADIO NETWORK

Longtime "Voice of the Warhawks" Frank Hoffmann returns to the booth for his 32nd season as the play-by-play man for ULM football. Former ULM athletics director Bruce Hanks will serve as Hoffman's color analyst for the season, while former Warhawk and San Diego Charger wide receiver Tag Rome will handle the sideline duties.

WARHAWKS IN FRONT OF BIG CROWDS

The season opener at Auburn saw 87,451 fans watch the Warhawks and Tigers play -- the sixth largest crowd to ever watch a ULM game. The Warhawks set the Malone Stadium record last season as 30,101 packed the stadium to watch the game against Grambling State -- the crowd was also the fifth largest for an on-campus game in Sun Belt history.

Four of the top nine Malone Stadium crowds have come in the past three seasons and five of the top six alltime crowds to watch a ULM game have come in the past six seasons.

Brown Named Louisiana Defensive Player of the Week

Playing in just his second collegiate game, ULM redshirt freshman Nate Brown recorded 12 tackles and a sack against Arkansas earning him Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) Defensive Player of the Week honors.

The Wichita Falls, Texas, native was the only player in the game to record double-figure tackles. He also broke up a pass as the Warhawks came within a point, 28-27, of their second victory over a Southeastern Conference opponent in their past three tries.

Brown, one of two freshmen who start for the Warhawks, had 11 solo tackles from his cornerback position. His seven-yard sack of Casey Dick set up a blocked punt and a ULM field goal, giving the Warhawks a 10-6 lead heading into halftime.

Brown is the first LSWA honoree for the Warhawks this season after ULM earned six LSWA awards last season.

JACKSON NAMED LOUISIANA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

ULM junior linebacker Cardia Jackson was named Louisiana Defensive Player of the Week by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) after recording 17 tackles in the Warhawks game at Tulane.

Jackson had 14 solo stops against the Green Wave tying him for the seventh most all-time in ULM history. The Monroe, La., native had more than twice as many solo tackles and seven more total tackles than anyone else in the game.

Jackson is the second Warhawk to earn LSWA Defensive Player of the Week honors this season. Redshirt freshman Nate Brown received the distinction following ULM's near upset against Arkansas on Sept. 6.

JABOUR FINDS HIS STRIDE

Redshirt freshman kicker Radi Jabour has made four consecutive field goals in the Warhawks past two games after ULM opened the season 2-for-7 on field goal attempts. Jabour has made kicks of 47, 42, 39 and 19 yards in the games against Tulane and Louisiana-Lafayette and is 4-for-6 on the season.

Jabour is tied with three other players in the league for the second longest field goal in the Sun Belt this season with his 47-yarder against Tulane. His three field goals made against Louisiana-Lafayette also ranks second best in the league.

JUNIOR COLLEGE IMPACT

ULM brought in nine junior college players (seven before spring ball) this season and the group has already made an impact. Four of the nine -- Ryan Dercher, Keating Helms, Otis Stamps and Aaron Williams -- started on either offense and defense, while Jeremy Gener handled the kickoffs, attempted a field goal and had a punt at Auburn. Troy Giddens, Alex Ford and Rodney Lovett also saw time for the Warhawks in the opener at Auburn.

Defensive tackle Thomas Robinson got in the mix seeing his first Division I action in the Warhawks near upset against Arkansas.

CARDIA IS DEALING

Junior linebacker Cardia Jackson was wheeling and dealing against Tulane as he recorded a career-high 17 total tackles, including 14 solo stops. The 14 solo tackles is tied for the seventh most in ULM history.

SUN BELT OPENERS

ULM is 1-7 in its opening conference game of the season, with the win coming 28-21 over Florida Atlantic in 2005.

To take it even further, this season marked the third straight season the ULM opened SBC play following a bye week and the Warhawks are 0-3 in such contests.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

In an almost unprecedented move, ULM played its game against Alabama A&M on Friday, Sept. 12, instead of Saturday, Sept. 13. What makes the date unique, the game was scheduled to be played on Saturday night until 11 a.m. Friday when ULM decided to move the game because of the imposing threat of Hurricane Ike.

The Warhawk players were at Malone Stadium by 12:30 that afternoon and taken to the team hotel for a normal game day procedure, while the ULM athletics department staff worked to put a game on in a mere eight hours.

It is believed to be the first Friday night game for ULM in its history and it is confirmed that it is the only Friday night game since at least 1979.

McCall Makes His Mark

It took just two games for redshirt freshman Anthony McCall to make his mark on the season. The Montgomery, Ala., native caught six passes for 125 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the game against Arkansas. He caught TD passes of 33 and three yards as the Warhawks came within a point, 28-27, of the victory.

He followed up with another touchdown in the Warhawks 37-15 victory over Alabama A&M.

KIN HITS HIS MARK

ULM senior quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster completed 59.2 percent of his passes last season -- second best in the Sun Belt among regular starters. In addition, he completed 63.8 percent of his passes in conference games -- also second best among regular starters in the league. Lancaster finished the '07 season tied for the second fewest interceptions among regular starters in the Sun Belt and was third in the SBC during conference play in pass efficiency among regular starters (100+ pass attempts).

UNCHARTED TERRITORY

All 27 of the Warhawks points against Arkansas came from players who had not scored a point prior to the game.

Redshirt freshman receiver Anthony McCall caught a pair of touchdown passes, junior running back Gary Frazier scored on a one-yard run and junior college transfer Jeremy Gener booted a pair of field goals and knocked through three extra points.

AIRING IT OUT

The Warhawks took to the air early this season with 105 pass attempts through the first three games of the season. ULM didn't hit the 105 pass attempt mark until the fifth game in 2007.

Kinsmon Lancaster has completed 58.0 percent of his pass attempts this season with five touchdowns and just one interception.

Eleven different Warhawks have already recorded a reception this season tied with last year's total of 11 (which included a catch by Lancaster on a deflected ball).

MALONE STADIUM OPENERS

ULM has traditionally been tough on opponents in their home openers, posting a 24-7 (.774) record in such contests over the last 31 years. ULM picked up victories in its home opener in 22 of the first 23 seasons at Malone Stadium.

LOVE NAMED TO RAY GUY WATCH LIST

ULM junior punter Scott Love was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List, which is awarded to the nation's top collegiate punter.

Love, who was a first team All-Sun Belt selection last year and Preseason All-Sun Belt selection this year, led the conference averaging 42.1 yards per punt last year. The West Monroe, La., native set the ULM school record with 23 punts inside the 20-yard line and was a two-time Sun Belt and Louisiana Player of the Week honoree.

So far this season Love is averaging 39.9 yards per kick and has placed seven of his 33 kicks inside the 20-yard line.

YOUTH IN ACTION

The ULM coaches have hit the recruiting path hard and have found a lot of success over the past couple of years. The season opener at Auburn proved it as 14 freshmen (redshirt & true) saw action against the 10th-ranked Tigers.

COVERING THE KICK

The Warhawks have been among the best in the league in limiting opponents to extra yardage on both kickoffs and punts. ULM leads the Sun Belt in net punting averaging 35.8 yards per kick and is third in kickoff coverage averaging a net of 45.2 yards per kick, just 0.7 of a yard behind Troy and 0.1 behind Middle Tennessee.

ULM's kickoff specialist Jeremy Gener is averaging 64.4 yards per kickoff, second best in the SBC only 0.2 behind Matt King of Middle Tennessee.

SMITH HAS BIG NIGHT

Sophomore linebacker Theo Smith took advantage of quality playing time against Alabama A&M recording a game-high eight tackles (seven solo), a pass breakup and a safety.

The output doubled his tackle total from the Warhawks first two games of the season

HOMETOWN TALENT

Eight players on the Warhawks two deep are from either Monroe or West Monroe. If you expand the search area out 90 miles to Shreveport, the number jumps to 12 players on the two deep.

The Warhawks have 13 total players from the Twin Cities and eight from Shreveport-Bossier City.

No-FLY ZONE

The Warhawk defense turned the air in Jordan-Hare Stadium into a no-fly zone during the season opener holding Auburn to just 85 yards in the air -- 33 of which came on one pass play. The 85 yards is the third fewest allowed by a ULM defense under Charlie Weatherbie and the fewest for Auburn since 2006 when Georgia held them to just 35 yards.

DISCIPLINED PLAY

In addition to the Warhawks taking care of the ball (rank 1st in the NCAA with just three turnovers), ULM leads the Sun Belt Conference in fewest penalties, total penalty yards and penalty yards per game.

The Warhawks have committed just 30 penalties this season (six per game) for 232 yards (46.4 per game).

MONROE, La.—ULM scored 30-unanswered points to defeat Arkansas State 30-13 and pick up its first win of the season. Warhawk running back Calvin Dawson extended his consecutive 100-yard rushing streak to an NCAA-best 10 games with 114 yards on 26 carries, despite missing all but five plays of the first quarter.

Kinsmon Lancaster completed 15-of-22 for 195 yards and two touchdowns to lead ULM. The junior signal caller now has five touchdown passes on the season and moved into 10th place all-time in Warhawk history with 213 pass completions, passing Bubby Brister.

Arkansas State jumped out to a 13-0 lead with a pair of Josh Arauco field goals (33 and 29 yards) and a 21-yard pass from Corey Leonard to Chris Miller. Arauco would go on to miss his next two attempts (38, 43) breaking a streak of eight straight.

Leonard finished just 14-of-35 for 206 yards and a pair of interceptions, both by ULM safety Greg James, giving him nine picks just five games into his sophomore season.

Trailing 13-10 late in the first quarter, Lancaster completed two huge pass plays setting up the Warhawks on the one-yard line. First he hit Darrell McNeal for 30 yards, then found LaGregory Sapp for 29 yards. A 10-yard scramble by Lancaster separated the two plays.

Dawson had no problems crossing the goal line from that point, putting ULM up 17-13; a lead it would never relinquish. It was Dawson's 21st career touchdown tying him for second all-time in ULM history.

Cole Wilson put the Warhawks on the board at the 9:35 mark of the second quarter with a 21-yard field goal. It was Wilson's first field goal since week two at Clemson.

McNeal brought the Warhawks within three points, 13-10, with a

four-yard touchdown reception from Lancaster capping an eight-play, 79-yard drive with 4:17 to play in the second quarter.

ULM head coach Charlie Weatherbie opened his bag of tricks calling a fake punt with the ball on ULM's 44-yard line. Darrius Battles took the ball from punter Scott Love on a reverse and went 11 yards on a fourth-and-two play.

ULM capitalized on the play when Wilson nailed a 20-yard field goal with 3:49 to play in the third quarter extending the lead to 20-13. He would hit another kick late in the game from 20 yards out; Wilson made 17-consecutive field goals tying him for second-best in the nation.

McNeal caught his second touchdown of the day on a 26-yard completion from Lancaster with 9:32 to play in the game.

ULM HEAD COACH CHARLIE WEATHERBIE



Charlie Weatherbie begins his sixth season at the helm of the ULM football program after leading the Warhawks to one of their most memorable seasons in the program's history.

The 2007 season marked the first year that ULM was bowl eligible since it made the jump to Division I-A in 1994. The Warhawks won five of their last six games on the season including one of the biggest upsets in all of college football, knocking off Alabama 21-14 in Tuscaloosa. Ala.

Weatherbie guided 10 players to Sun Belt All-Conference honors this past season and oversaw ULM running back Cal-

vin Dawson's climb to greatness as he set the ULM career rushing record. Dawson and the rest of the Warhawk offense posted the highest per game scoring average in the ULM Division I-A era.

Under his direction, the Warhawks football program has made significant strides in a short amount of time improving from winning one game in 2003 to winning the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship in just three seasons.

Weatherbie, ULM's 13th head coach, took over the program a little less than three months before kicking off the 2003 season.

The 2006 Warhawks finished the season by winning three of their last four games, including a win over Louisiana-Lafayette for the fourth time in five years, and coming close to upsetting bowl-bound Kentucky. Quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster and Dawson created a high-powered offense for ULM with a league-leading 350.7 yards per game. It was the first time a Warhawk had rushed for over 1,000 yards in the Weatherbie era. Dawson and safety Kevin Payne joined the growing list of all-Sun Belt first team members during Weatherbie's tenure.

The 2005 squad made its mark by winning ULM's first conference title since 1992. The Warhawks finished the season with a 5-2 Sun Belt record and had 10 players receive all-Sun Belt honors, including Sun Belt Player of the Year Steven Jyles. Jyles re-wrote the ULM passing and total offense records book and has gone on to play for the Edmonton Eskimos and the Saskatchewan Rough Riders in the Canadian Football League.

The 2004 squad won five of their last seven games, including four wins in Sun Belt play. ULM's 4-3 Sun Belt record put Weatherbie's squad in a tie for third place. The season also saw ULM beat intrastate rival Louisiana-Lafayette for the third season in a row.

In 2003, his first season at the helm, ULM lost seven games by seven points or less and highlighted the season with a win over Louisiana-Lafayette.

Weatherbie has twice proven that he can take over sub .500 football programs and transform them into winning teams. At Utah State University, he inherited a program that had not had a winning season in 12 years and took the Aggies to their first Big West Conference championship in 15 years, their first bowl game in 32 years and their first bowl victory ever, beating Ball State 42-33 in the 1993 Las Vegas Bowl. He was 13-10 after his first two seasons, 1992-93, leaving after the third season to take the same position at the United States Naval Academy. The Aggies' 1993 win over Brigham Young still stands as Utah State's only win in the last 18 meetings with their in-state rival.

At Navy, Weatherbie had similar success. He took the Midshipmen, who had suffered through 12 consecutive losing seasons prior to his arrival, to a 9-3 record and the championship of the 1996 Aloha Bowl in his second season. The nine wins were the most by a Navy team in 18 years. At the time, he was just the third coach in academy history to win a bowl game.

In 1997, Weatherbie led Navy to a 7-4 mark, the first time since the 1981-82 seasons that the Midshipmen had compiled back-to-back winning seasons. The 16 wins over two years tied for the third most in academy history. He was named ECAC Coach of the Year and was the head defensive coach at the Kelly Tire Blue/Gray Classic.

Weatherbie's first team at Annapolis went 5-6 in 1995, after Navy had won just nine games the previous four seasons combined.

Weatherbie entered the coaching ranks in 1977 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oklahoma State.

After three years playing professionally, Weatherbie was hired as an assistant coach at Wyoming. Serving as the quarterbacks coach, Wyoming led the nation in fewest interceptions in 1981.

He left Wyoming after the 1983 season to be an assistant coach at the United States Air Force Academy. During his six seasons on legendary head coach Fisher DeBerry's staff, Air Force was an overall 48-25-1 and participated in four bowl games. The Falcons had five winning seasons during his tenure, finishing 8-4 and winning the Independence Bowl in 1984. The next season the Falcons went 12-1, finished the year ranked No. 5 nationally, and were Bluebonnet Bowl champions.

The University of Arkansas would be the next stop on Weatherbie's coaching journey. He spent two seasons on the Razorback staff before being named the head coach at Utah State in 1992.

During Weatherbie's years as a head coach, he has had numerous current NCAA Bowl Subdivision head coaches and NFL coaches work under his tutelage, including Gary Patterson (TCU), Brent Guy (Utah State), Paul Johnson (Naval Academy), and Jim Zorn (Seattle Seahawks).

Weatherbie graduated from Fort Scott High School in Kansas in 1973. He was a quarterback during his scholastic playing days, earning all-state and honorable mention All-America honors in football. He also participated in basketball and track, serving as team captain in all three sports.

The native of Sedan, Kan., continued his playing career at Oklahoma State, where he was a three-year starter and a team captain from 1974-76. He earned a bachelor's degree in health, physi-

ONE OF THE BEST IN "THE ZONE"

The Warhawks converted in the red zone 86 percent of the time last season to rank second in the Sun Belt and 34th in the nation. The Warhawks scored on 37 of their 43 red zone possessions, including 6-of-6 against Arkansas State and 6-of-7 at Florida Atlantic (blocked field goal). ULM scored touchdowns in 65 percent of their red zone opportunities, second-best in the Sun Belt and 32nd in the nation.

78 YEARS STRONG

ULM begins its 78th season of college football this season and eighth as a member of the Sun Belt Conference. The Warhawks began playing in 1931 as a junior college and won the first of the school's two national championships with an 8-0 record in 1935. ULM became a senior college in 1951 and joined the NAIA where it stayed until 1975 when the Warhawks became a Division I independent. The Warhawks joined Division I-AA in 1982 and won the school's second national championship in 1987, going 13-2. ULM made the final step to college football's top stage in 1994 as a I-A independent and then joined the Sun Belt in 2001.

OFFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

In just his first year as the offensive coordinator, Steve Farmer directed the ULM offense to its highest yards per game average since the Warhawks moved to Division I-A in 1994. ULM averaged 385.7 yards per game last season, ranking sixth best all-time in school history and the most since the 1993 squad set the school record with 473.8 yards per game.

What is more remarkable about the total offense output from last season, is that it is just one of two seasons in the top 10 that came when the Warhawks were Division I-A.

WARHAWKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

ULM is 0-16 all-time against ranked opponents (since 1994) and 0-3 in season openers against a ranked opponent. The Warhawks closest upset bid against a ranked foe came at No. 22 Auburn in a 28-24 loss in 1996.

The Warhawks played a pair of ranked teams last season (No. 25 Clemson, No. 15 Texas A&M) in back-to-back weeks.

The highest ranked team that ULM has ever squared off against was No. 2 Florida in 2001.

The Warhawks have opened the season four times against a raked foe: 1994 at #8 Colorado (L, 13-48), 2003 at #13 LSU (L, 7-49), 2004 at #17 Auburn (L, 0-31), 2008 at #10 Auburn (L, 0-34).

Undefeated in Overtime

ULM's overtime game at Florida Atlantic last season was its first game to go into extra time since 2002. The Warhawks are now 5-0 all-time in overtime games, with three of the five going to multiple overtime periods.

STATE-OF-THE-ART PLAYING SURFACE

The latest addition to Malone Stadium features a ProPlay monofiliment fiber "grass" with a shock and drain pad and Envirofill clear coated sand infill. In addition to looking more like natural grass, ULM's new playing surface has measures in place to help prevent injuries and drain water at a rate of 10 inches per hour. The clear-coated sand used has obvious benefits over its predecessor (ground-up black rubber) in that it does not absorb as much heat, does not compact over time, and does not migrate during use. The first game played on the new surface was the 2007 season opener against Tulsa on ESPN2 HD.

NUMBERS ON THE BOARD

ULM has scored in 70-of-73 games dating back to Sept. 14, 2002, against McNeese State. The Warhawks were shut out 34-0 in the season opener at No. 10 Auburn snapping a streak of 32 straight games without being shut out.

Prior to the Auburn game, the last time the Warhawks were shut out came on Sept. 10, 2005, 38-0 at Wyoming. The only other time during the streak came in a season-opening loss at Auburn 31-0 in 2004, the year the Tigers went undefeated.

The 32 game streak passed the previous best mark of 22 which was set from Sept. 14, 2002-Nov. 22, 2003. The next milestone was 82 games; ULM was not shut out from Sept. 9, 1989-Nov. 4, 1995 -- the steak ended at Louisville on Nov. 11, 1995 in a 39-0 defeat.

MALONE IS HOME FOR 31 YEARS

The 2008 season marks the 31st consecutive year that the Warhawks have called Malone Stadium on the campus of ULM home. Dedicated to legendary football head coach James L. Malone (1934-52) on Sept. 27, 1980, Malone Stadium has seen ULM teams post a combined 98-52-1 (.652) record.

The grounds of Malone Stadium have been the home to ULM's National Championship team in 1987, four Southland Conference Championships, and most recently a Sun Belt Conference championship in 2005.

ULM IN SEASON OPENERS

The Warhawks are 15-18-1 in season openers since 1975 (first year in NCAA).

DORSEY ON THE MOVE

Redshirt freshman Ken Dorsey was forced to evacuate his home not once, but twice due to hurricanes.

He was first forced out of his New Orleans home by Hurricane Katrina. His family was staying in Lake Charles, La., when not even a month later Hurricane Rita blew threw Louisiana once again and forced the Dorseys to move once again.

Ken and his father loaded up the car and drove until they found a hotel with a vacancy. That happened to be in Homewood, Ala., (suburb of Birmingham) where Ken and his dad watched the Homewood Patriots pound Shades Valley 40-2 on local television. Ken turned to his dad and said this is where I want to go to school.

PRESEASON HONORS

Three Warhawks were named to the Sun Belt Preseason All-Conference Team -- the SBC only releases a first team.

Tight end Zeek Zacharie, safety Greg James and punter Scott Love were named to the preseason list, tying the Warhawks for the third most selections. ULM was the only school in the conference to have an offensive, defensive and special teams representative on the all-conference team.

PRESEASON PRAISE

After recording its best season in 14 years in 2007, ULM was picked to finish third in the Sun Belt by the league's coaches. It is the highest the Warhawks have ever been picked to finish in the SBC in the preseason poll, including the 2005 season when they won a share of the conference title.







Jordan-Hare Stadium (87,451) -- Auburn, Ala. Aug. 30, 2008

AUBURN, Ala.—No. 10 Auburn scored touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams to defeat ULM 34-0 Saturday night in front of 87,451 fans in Jordan-Hare Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

Both defenses dominated the opening half of play with the teams combining for only 245 yards of total offense. Auburn (1-0) finished sixth in the nation last season in both overall and scoring defense, while the Warhawks (0-1) led the Sun Belt in rush defense.

ULM held Auburn without an offensive touchdown in the first half; however the Tigers were able to find the end zone twice in the first quarter on a nine-yard fumble return by Michael Goggins and a 66-yard punt return by Robert Dunn – Auburn's first punt return for a touchdown since 1996.

The strong defensive play for both teams carried into the second half with the only touchdown of the third quarter coming after ULM fumbled the opening kickoff of half. Brad Lester scored from three yards out after the Tigers started the possession on the ULM 30-yard line.

The Warhawks held Auburn to just 85 passing yards -- the third fewest allowed by a ULM defense under head coach Charlie Weatherbie.

ULM tight end Zeek Zacharie caught a career-high eight passes for 61 yards to lead the offensive attack. Sophomore Frank Goodin carried the ball 15 times for 39 yards in his first start.

Quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster completed 20-of-32 for 136 yards moving into sixth place all-time on the ULM pass attempts list passing Super Bowl quarterback Stan Humphries with 606.

Auburn's pair of quarterbacks struggled in their first game in the spread offense as Chris Todd completed 9-of-18 for just 70 yards and Cody Burns completed only 4-of-9 for 15 yards. Ben Tate rushed for 115 yards on 13 carries.

War Memorial Stadium (55,048) -- Little Rock, Ark. Sept. 6, 2008

LITTLE ROCK, Ark.—D.J. Williams scored with just over one minute remaining to lift Arkansas to a 28-27 come-from-behind victory over upset-minded ULM Saturday night in front of 55,048 fans at War Memorial Stadium in Little Rock, Ark.

In search of its second victory over a Southeastern Conference opponent in four games, ULM took a 24-6 lead with 6:11 remaining in the third quarter on a one-yard plunge by Gray Frazier – the first touchdown of his career. The Warhawks defeated Alabama 21-14 in the second to last game of the 2007 season

Arkansas (2-0) scored three touchdowns, including two by Williams, over the final 17 minutes of the game to complete its second comeback win in as many weeks.

Casey Dick found Williams from eight yards out for the game winner. The touchdown capped an 11-play 79-yard drive that included a dramatic fourth-down conversion that would have ended the game.

After Williams scored the eventual game winner, the Warhawks (0-2) had a chance to win the game, but a 45-yard field goal attempt by Jeremy Gener sailed wide right to preserve the victory for the Razorbacks.

ULM redshirt freshman receiver Anthony McCall caught a pair of touchdown passes and finished the game with six receptions for 125 yards, while Kinsmon Lancaster finished the game 23-of-39 for 270 yards and the pair of touchdown strikes.

Lancaster moves into fifth place on the ULM all-time completions list with 366 and into sole possession of ninth place on the career touchdown passes list with 22.

Williams led Arkansas with five catches for 124 yards, while Dick was 22-of-34 for 323 yards and two touchdowns. Back from a suspension, Michael Smith carried the ball 22 times for 157 yards and a pair of scores.

McCall also got into the action on special teams by blocking a punt on the possession following his first touchdown catch.

Arkansas opened the scoring with a Smith touchdown run early in the second quarter, but Alex Tejada missed the extra point, after missing two field goals earlier.

Gener made field goals of 20 and 40 yards in the second and four quarter, respectively.

Nate Brown had a game-high 12 tackles for the Warhawks and also had a sack – ULM finished the game with four sacks as a team.

Lancaster connected on three touchdown passes and rushed for another to account for nearly 300 yards of total offense. The Shreveport, La., native connected with junior receiver Darrell McNeal eight times for a total of 131 yards and a pair of scores.

ULM (1-2) opened the scoring quickly when Lancaster connected with McNeal for the combo's first score following the opening kickoff. The seven play drive took 3:07 off the clock

Alabama A&M (0-3) would get on the scoreboard early in the second quarter after a 37-yard drive stalled and Jeremy Licea converted on a 24 yard field goal.

The Warhawks would extend their lead on the next drive after Lancaster hit freshman Anthony McCall in the corner of the end zone for a 20 yard touchdown. His only catch of the game, the score for McCall marked his third touchdown over the last two games.

The Bulldogs would not go away as Ulysses Banks rushed for a three-yard touchdown with 6:38 remaining in the half to make it a 14-10 game.

Lancaster would strike again, barreling over the defenders and rushing into the end zone for his third touchdown of the game. The 22 yard scamper extended the lead to 21-10.

Just before the half, AAMU added one final score, a 21 yard field goal, to register their final points of the game.

In the second half it was more of Lancaster to McNeal as the duo combined on a 25 yard touchdown on wide receiver screen to make it a 28-13 lead. McNeal finished the game with eight catches for 131 yards and a pair of scores.

Sophomore Frank Goodin added a 21-yard run up the gut to give the Warhawks a 35-13 advantage. The West Monroe, La., native became the first 100 yard rusher for ULM on the season after passing the mark in the fourth quarter. Goodin finished with 17 carries for 114 yards. Lancaster added 81 yards on nine carries.

The Bulldogs lone points of the second half came at the beginning of the fourth quarter when an errant snap sailed through the back of the end zone for a safety. The Warhawks would get the two points back when sophomore Theo Smith recorded a safety with 5:12 remaining in the game for the final tally of the contest.

After allowing 262 yards of offense in the first half, the ULM defense buckled down and limited Alabama A&M to 71 in the second stanza.

NEW ORLEANS, La.—Tulane jumped out to an early lead and used a solid defensive effort to hold off visiting ULM 24-10 Saturday afternoon in front of an announced crowd of 23,419 in the Louisiana Superdome.

The Green Wave (1-2) scored a pair of first quarter touchdowns on runs of nine yards by Andre Anderson and 37 yards by Jeremy Williams.

The Green Wave controlled the ball for nearly 36 minutes and ran 33 more plays than the Warhawks keeping an already short handed ULM defense on the field for the majority of the game. ULM's 42 offensive plays was the fewest under head coach Charlie Weatherbie.

Tulane converted on 11-of-18 third down attempts and held the Warhawks (1-3) to just 1-of-10 on third down leading to the discrepancy in plays and time of possession.

ULM linebacker Cardia Jackson recorded a game-high and career-high 17 stops, including 14 solo tackles. The 14 solo stops is tied for the seventh most in Warhawk history

Anderson finished the game with 157 yards on 38 carries, while his counterpart Frank Goodin rushed for 87 yards on 14 carries.

Kevin Moore completed 19-of-32 passes for 272 yards and a 19-yard touchdown pass to Williams for Tulane.

ULM's Kinsmon Lancaster finished the game 13-for-18 for 118 yards. The senior signal caller broke the ULM record for pass attempts without an interception reaching 173 consecutive passes before a third quarter interception by Charles Harris ended the streak.

Radi Jabour put the Warhawks on the board with a 47-yard field goal midway through the third quarter. It was the first career field goal for the redshirt freshman and is tied for the 23rd longest in ULM history.

Darrell McNeal scored his third touchdown in the past two games running in from four yards out after lining up as the quarterback late in the fourth quarter.

MONROE, La.—Tyrell Fenroy rushed for a school-record 297 yards and Louisiana-Lafayette took advantage of the big play in a 44-35 victory over ULM in the Sun Belt opener for both clubs in front of a crowd of 21,929 in Malone Stadium Saturday night.

The Ragin' Cajuns had six touchdowns of 52 yards or more and finished the game with 728 yards of total offense. Fenroy had touchdown runs of 89, 80 and 52 yards, Jason Chery ran for an 89-yard score and caught a 74-yard touchdown pass, and Michael Desormeaux ran in a 64-yard touchdown.

ULL (2-3, 1-0 Sun Belt) finished game with 556 yards on the ground on 37 carries for a 15.0 yards-per-carry average. The Warhawks ran for 241 yards on 40 carries and finished the game with 383 yards of total offense.

The Warhawks did not turn the ball over in the game and have just three on the season, which is tops in the nation. ULM entered the game tied with Florida, Oklahoma and UNLV for the fewest in the NCAA, but all three other teams had at least one turnover on the day.

The crowd was the seventh-largest in Malone Stadium history and the largest crowd for a Sun Belt Conference game in stadium history.

After falling behind 34-16 midway through the third quarter, ULM mounted a furious rally to get within two, 37-35, late in the fourth quarter. Greg James jump-started the charge with a 55-yard interception return for a touchdown – his second pick of the game. The junior safety now ranks third on the ULM career list and fourth on the Sun Belt career chart with 13 picks.

Drew Edmiston pushed the lead out to 37-29 with a 25-yard field goal two possessions later.

Frank Goodin pulled the Warhawks within a two-point conversion of tying the game with his second touchdown of the game, but Trey Revell's pass to Zeek Zacharie in the end zone was just out of reach.

On ULL's next possession, Fenroy went straight up the middle on the first play of the drive for 80 yards and his third score of the game.

ULM's Radi Jabour kicked field goals of $4\overset{?}{2}$, 19 and 39 yards in the first half and has now made four consecutive kicks after the Warhawks opened the season just 2-for-7 on field goal attempts.

Chery's two touchdowns came on ULL's first two drives of the second half after the Warhawks (1-4, 0-1) seemed to grab a little momentum with a pair of field goals in the final three minutes of the first half.

Lancaster took control of the Warhawks next drive rushing three times for 71 times setting up a three-yard touchdown run by Darrell McNeal.

The Cajuns responded five plays later as Fenroy popped his 52-yard run straight up the middle stretching the lead out to 34-16.

ULM turned the tables on its ensuing drive as Revell kept the ball on an option for 57 yards down to the ULL eight-yard line. A personal foul penalty moved the ball to the four and Goodin took it in for his first score of the night.
