• Junior wide receiver Darrell McNeal has scored four rushing touchdowns this season, mostly out of the "Warhawk Formation." The four rushing touchdowns is the most in ULM history by a wide receiver.

• ULM has never lost a Sun Belt Conference game in the state of Florida. The Warhawks are 3-0 against Florida Atlantic and 1-0 against Florida International in the Sunshine State.

• ULM was the only team in the Sun Belt Conference last year to beat two teams that won a bowl game (Florida Atlantic & Alabama).

• Over the past three seasons, ULM is 7-4 over the final four games of each season. With three of the four losses coming by a combined eight points (42-40 @ Kentucky, 2006; 43-40 v. MTSU, 2007; 24-21 @ MTSU, 2008).

• If Josh Thompson records one tackle on Saturday, he and Cardia Jackson (114) will become the first ULM combo to record over 100 tackles in the same season since Chris Harris (127) and Carlos Hughes (111) in 2002.

As Close As It Gets

The Warhawks have played in three one-point games this season, which is the most of any team in the country. ULM dropped games to Arkansas (28-27) and Florida Atlantic (29-28) and defeated Troy (31-30).

The one-point game against Arkansas was the Warhawks first since a 17-16 loss at Louisiana Tech in 1997. The 31-30 victory over Troy was ULM's first one-point win since a 39-38 victory over Central Florida in 1996.

The last time that ULM had multiple one-point games came in the 1987 when the Warhawks had three including a 43-42 victory over Marshall in the National Championship Game.

Five of ULM's eight losses this season have come by a combined 22 points or 4.4 points per game -- Arkansas, Louisiana-Lafayette, Arkansas State, Florida Atlantic, Middle Tennessee.

Finding The End Zone

The Warhawks had an incredible streak of 18 straight scoring possessions that resulted in a touchdown end with a Radi Jabour career-long 48-yard field goal against Troy.

This is the second straight season that the Warhawks have pieced together such a streak. ULM scored touchdowns on 24-of-27 scoring drives to end the 2007 season.

ULM has scored touchdowns on 22 of its last 23 scoring drives this season.

Channeling Your Inner Quarterback / Running Back

Junior wide receiver Darrell McNeal found his inner quarterback against North Texas completing a 46-yard pass to J.J. McCoy for a touchdown in the Warhawks 35-23 victory.

A quarterback at Neville High School in Monroe, the touchdown pass was the second of his collegiate career and the fourth completion in eight career pass attempts.

McNeal has also had success running the ball this season with four rushing touchdowns out of the "Warhawk Formation".

His four rushing touchdowns is a school record for a wide receiver.

Controlling The Clock

The Warhawks controlled the ball for a remarkable 39:52 against Troy, including 22:25 in the second half.

With their offense on the field and Troy's on the bench, the Warhawks held the Trojans to 221 passing yards -- 45 below their average -- and 386 total yards -- 52 below their average.

The near 40 minutes in time of possession for the Warhawks was the most in Charlie Weatherbie's six seasons at ULM.

The Warhawks continued the trend the following week with 37:13 in time of possession at Middle Tennessee.

Ball Security

The Warhawks rank 11th in the country with just 12 turnovers on the season. ULM turned the ball over twice at Auburn (offensive fumble, fumble on kickoff return), once at Tulane (interception), three times at Arkansas State (two fumbles, interception), twice against FAU (fumble, interception), one against Troy (interception), once at MTSU (interception) and twice at Ole Miss (two interceptions).

ULM entered the Ark. State game as the NCAA leader with just three turnovers on the season.

The Warhawks rank 27th nationally with just seven interceptions thrown on the season, 12th with five lost fumbles and are 43rd in the NCAA with a +0.27 turnover margin.

JAMES EYEING INTERCEPTION RECORD

Junior all-conference safety Greg James is on pace to set the ULM career interception record this season. James finished 2007 tied for 28th nationally after averaging 0.42 per game. MONROE, La.—Darrell McNeal scored three touchdowns and Kinsmon Lancaster threw for 237 yards to lead ULM to a 28-14 victory over Florida International, in Malone Stadium on ULM's Homecoming.

McNeal caught touchdown passes of 14 and three yards and ran in a score from 13 yards out. The sophomore from Monroe had seven catches for a career-high 120 yards.

Lancaster entered the game on the Warhawks' fourth series of the game after red-shirt freshman Trey Revell made his first career start. Lancaster finished 16-of-21 for 257 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He moved into a tie for eighth place on the ULM completions list with 235.

ULM continued to be one of the most effective teams in the nation in the red zone converting on all four of its attempts. The Warhawks had scored on 20-of-21 times in the red zone on the season and scored touchdowns on 15-of-21 attempts.

Florida International opened the scoring with a 23-yard touchdown run by Julian Reams. The drive was set up by 25-yard punt return by Lionell Singleton giving the Golden Panthers the ball on their own 48-yard line.

Lancaster and McNeal hooked up for the first time with 11:55 remaining in the second quarter tying the game 7-7. The duo connected again right before the half with 51 seconds remaining. It gave the Warhawks a halftime lead for the third time in three home games.

Calvin Dawson tied the ULM career rushing touchdown record with his nine-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. The senior tailback pushed his career total to 22 tying him with Greg Robinson.

He finished the game with 128 yards on 19 carries; his 15th career 100 yard rushing game and the 11th in the past 12 outings.

FIU pulled within a touchdown early in the fourth quarter on a 19-yard touchdown pass from Wayne Younger to Zap Hawkins with 13:35 to play in the game.

McNeal sealed the deal with his rushing touchdown late in the fourth quarter. He lined up at quarterback and broke a couple of tackles on his way into the end zone.

McCALL MAKES HIS MARK

It took just two games for redshirt freshman Anthony McCall to make his mark on the season. The Montgomery, Ala., native caught six passes for 125 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the game against Arkansas. He caught TD passes of 33 and three yards as the Warhawks came within a point, 28-27, of the victory.

McCall also has touchdown receptions against Alabama A&M, Florida Atlantic and Middle Tennessee giving the rookie five on the season.

He is tied for third in the Sun Belt with those five touchdowns receptions and is tied with Florida International's T.Y. Hilton for the second most by a freshman.

His five receiving touchdowns is tied for the ninth most by a freshman in the NCAA this season.

NUMBERS ON THE BOARD

ULM has scored in 75-of-79 games dating back to Sept. 14, 2002, against McNeese State. The Warhawks were shut out 34-0 in the season opener at No. 10 Auburn snapping a streak of 32 straight games without being shut out. A 59-0 loss to Ole Miss marked the first time that ULM had been shut out multiple times in the same season since 2000 against Memphis (28-0), Middle Tennessee (28-0) and Central Florida (55-0).

Prior to the Auburn game, the last time the Warhawks were shut out came on Sept. 10, 2005, 38-0 at Wyoming. The only other time during the streak came in a season-opening loss at Auburn 31-0 in 2004, the year the Tigers went undefeated.

The 32 game streak passed the previous best mark of 22 which was set from Sept. 14, 2002-Nov. 22, 2003. The next milestone was 82 games; ULM was not shut out from Sept. 9, 1989-Nov. 4, 1995 -- the streak ended at Louisville on Nov. 11, 1995 in a 39-0 defeat.

200 YARD RUSHING GAMES (WEATHERBIE ERA)

During the Charlie Weatherbie era, the Warhawks have rushed for 200 yards or more in 17 games, including a remarkable seven games last season.

BROWN NAMED LOUISIANA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Playing in just his second collegiate game, ULM redshirt freshman Nate Brown recorded 12 tackles and a sack against Arkansas earning him Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) Defensive Player of the Week honors.

The Wichita Falls, Texas, native was the only player in the game to record double-figure tackles. He also broke up a pass as the Warhawks came within a point, 28-27, of their second victory over a Southeastern Conference opponent in their past three tries.

Brown, one of two freshmen who start for the Warhawks, had 11 solo tackles from his cornerback position. His seven-yard sack of Casey Dick set up a blocked punt and a ULM field goal, giving the Warhawks a 10-6 lead heading into halftime.

Brown was the first LSWA honoree for the Warhawks this season after ULM earned six LSWA awards last season.

JACKSON NAMED LOUISIANA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

ULM junior linebacker Cardia Jackson was named Louisiana Defensive Player of the Week by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) after recording 17 tackles in the Warhawks game at Tulane.

Jackson had 14 solo stops against the Green Wave tying him for the seventh most all-time in ULM history. The Monroe, La., native had more than twice as many solo tackles and seven more total tackles than anyone else in the game.

JACKSON NAMED LOUISIANA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK -- TAKE TWO

For the second time this season, ULM junior linebacker Cardia Jackson was named Louisiana Defensive Player of the Week by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) on Oct. 13.

Jackson registered 14 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks in the Warhawks game at Arkansas State this past Saturday. The Monroe, La., native has recorded double-digit tackles in each of ULM's last three games (17, 11, 14).

Both of Jackson's sacks against the Red Wolves came after halftime as the Warhawks rallied from 23 points down in the fourth quarter to pull within eight at the end of the game.

THOMPSON NAMED SUN BELT DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

ULM junior safety Josh Thompson was named Sun Belt Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week, the league announced on Oct. 20 after he recorded 20 tackles in the Warhawks 35-23 victory over North Texas.

Thompson's 20 tackles were the 11th most in Warhawk history and the most in head coach Charlie Weatherbie's six seasons at ULM. The Lafayette, La., native also had a pair of pass breakups and helped hold the high-powered North Texas passing offense to no plays of over 25 yards.

WILLIAMS NAMED SUN BELT SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

ULM freshman kickoff returner Robert Williams was named Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week, the league office announced Nov. 3.

Williams returned three kicks for 87 yards in the Warhawks 31-30 victory over Troy this past Saturday, but none were bigger than his 54-yard return of the opening kickoff to the second half.

After the Trojans had scored 17 unanswered points to take a 17-8 halftime lead, Williams swung the momentum back in ULM's favor with his dazzling return to Troy's 39-yard line. Seven plays later Kinsmon Lancaster hooked up with Mitch Doyle for a 5-yard touchdown pass pulling the Warhawks within two points.

The Warhawks would go on to take a 22-17 lead later in the third quarter before knocking Troy from the ranks of the Sun Belt unbeaten and out of the AP Poll.

COVERING THE KICK

The Warhawks are among the best in the league in limiting opponents to extra yardage on both kickoffs and punts. ULM leads the conference averaging a net of 44.6 yards per kickoff -- 1.6 yards better than Florida Atlantic. The Warhawks are fourth the Sun Belt in net punting averaging 34.5 yards per kick. ULM was second in that category heading into the game at Middle Tennessee, but had a punt partially blocked and only go for 11 yards.

ULM's kickoff specialist Jeremy Gener is averaging 63.3 yards per kickoff, which leads the Sun Belt.

CARDIA IS DEALING

Junior linebacker Cardia Jackson was wheeling and dealing against Tulane as he recorded a career-high 17 total tackles, including 14 solo stops. The 14 solo tackles is tied for the seventh most in ULM history.

He set a new career-high last week at Ole Miss with 18 stops.

Jackson has recorded double-digit tackles in six of the last eight games and is 11th in the NCAA averaging 10.4 tackles per game.

J.T. RACKS UP THE TACKLES

Junior safety Josh Thompson recorded 20 tackles in the Warhawks victory over North Texas. The total was the 11th most in ULM history and the most during Charlie Weatherbie's six seasons at ULM (breaking Cardia Jackson's record of 17 set against Tulane earlier this year).

THOMPSON & JACKSON AMONG NATION'S BEST

Junior linebacker Cardia Jackson and junior safety Josh Thompson have been terrorizing opposing offenses all season long.

Jackson currently ranks 11th nationally averaging 10.4 tackles per game and Thompson ranks 26th averaging 9.0 stops per contest.

The pair is even better when it comes to solo tackles as Jackson ranks 6th averaging 6.2 and Thompson checks in at 17th with 5.5 per game.

JUNIOR COLLEGE IMPACT

ULM brought in nine junior college players (seven before spring ball) this season and the group has made an impact.

Four of the nine -- Ryan Dercher, Keating Helms, Otis Stamps and Aaron Williams -- started on either offense and defense, while Jeremy Gener handled the kickoffs, attempted a field goal and had a punt at Auburn.

Troy Giddens, Alex Ford and Rodney Lovett also saw time for the Warhawks in the opener at Auburn.

Defensive tackle Thomas Robinson got in the mix seeing his first Division I action in the Warhawks near upset against Arkansas.

KIN HITS HIS MARK

ULM senior quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster completed 59.2 percent of his passes last season -- second best in the Sun Belt among regular starters. In addition, he completed 63.8 percent of his passes in conference games -- also second best among regular starters in the league. Lancaster finished the '07 season tied for the second fewest interceptions among regular starters in the Sun Belt and was third in the SBC during conference play in pass efficiency among regular starters (100+ pass attempts). This year he is tied for the league lead with just five interceptions and is fourth among regular starters with his 59.7 completion percentage.

Redshirt freshman receiver Anthony McCall caught a pair of touchdown passes, junior running back Gary Frazier scored on a one-yard run and junior college transfer Jeremy Gener booted a pair of field goals and knocked through three extra points.

AIRING IT OUT

The Warhawks took to the air early this season with 105 pass attempts through the first three games of the season. ULM didn't hit the 105 pass attempt mark until the fifth game in 2007.

Kinsmon Lancaster has completed 59.7 percent of his pass attempts this season with 16 touchdowns and just five interceptions.

ULM has had 13 different players record a reception this season. It is the most since 17 players caught a pass in 2005.

MALONE STADIUM OPENERS

78 YEARS STRONG

ULM begins its 78th season of college football this season and eighth as a member of the Sun Belt Conference. The Warhawks began playing in 1931 as a junior college and won the first of the school's two national championships with an 8-0 record in 1935. ULM became a senior college in 1951 and joined the NAIA where it stayed until 1975 when the Warhawks became a Division I independent. The Warhawks joined Division I-AA in 1982 and won the school's second national championship in 1987, going 13-2. ULM made the final step to college football's top stage in 1994 as a I-A independent and then joined the Sun Belt in 2001.

SMITH HAS BIG NIGHT

Sophomore linebacker Theo Smith took advantage of quality playing time against Alabama A&M recording a game-high eight tackles (seven solo), a pass breakup and a safety.

The output doubled his tackle total from the Warhawks first two games of the season.

NO-FLY ZONE

The Warhawk defense turned the air in Jordan-Hare Stadium into a no-fly zone during the season opener holding Auburn to just 85 yards in the air -- 33 of which came on one pass play. The 85 yards is the third fewest allowed by a ULM defense under Charlie Weatherbie and the fewest for Auburn since 2006 when Georgia held them to just 35 yards.

TEAM CAPTAINS SELECTED

The Warhawks selected their team captains for the 2008 season with a representative from the offense, defense and special teams. Two of the three '08 captains were named to the Sun Belt Preseason All-Conference Team. Tight end Zeek Zacharie, bandit James Truxillo and punter Scott Love will serve as the '08 captains -- Zacharie and Love were both named Preseason All-Sun Belt.

THE SERIES

The Warhawks have had good success against the Golden Panthers winning three of the four meetings in the series, including the only one in Miami, 35-0, in 2006.

In fact, the Warahwks are undefeated (4-0) in Sun Belt Conference games in the state of Florida -- vs. Florida Atlantic, 3-0; vs. Florida International, 1-0.

The Warhawks are 3-2 in season finales under head coach Charlie Weatherbie.

ULM HEAD COACH CHARLIE WEATHERBIE



Charlie Weatherbie begins his sixth season at the helm of the ULM football program after leading the Warhawks to one of their most memorable seasons in the program's history.

The 2007 season marked the first year that ULM was bowl eligible since it made the jump to Division I-A in 1994. The Warhawks won five of their last six games on the season including one of the biggest upsets in all of college football, knocking off Alabama 21-14 in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

Weatherbie guided 10 players to Sun Belt All-Conference honors this past season and oversaw ULM running back Calvin Dawson's climb to greatness as he set the ULM career rushing record. Dawson and the rest of the Warhawk offense posted the highest per game scoring average in the ULM Division I-A era.

Under his direction, the Warhawks football program has made significant strides in a short amount of time improving from winning one game in 2003 to winning the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship in just three seasons.

Weatherbie, ULM's 13th head coach, took over the program a little less than three months before kicking off the 2003 season.

The 2006 Warhawks finished the season by winning three of their last four games, including a win over Louisiana-Lafayette for the fourth time in five years, and coming close to upsetting bowl-bound Kentucky. Quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster and Dawson created a high-powered offense for ULM with a league-leading 350.7 yards per game. It was the first time a Warhawk had rushed for over 1,000 yards in the Weatherbie era. Dawson and safety Kevin Payne joined the growing list of all-Sun Belt first team members during Weatherbie's tenure.

The 2005 squad made its mark by winning ULM's first conference title since 1992. The Warhawks finished the season with a 5-2 Sun Belt record and had 10 players receive all-Sun Belt honors, including Sun Belt Player of the Year Steven Jyles. Jyles re-wrote the ULM passing and total offense records book and has gone on to play for the Edmonton Eskimos and the Saskatchewan Rough Riders in the Canadian Football League.

The 2004 squad won five of their last seven games, including four wins in Sun Belt play. ULM's 4-3 Sun Belt record put Weatherbie's squad in a tie for third place. The season also saw ULM beat intrastate rival Louisiana-Lafayette for the third season in a row.

In 2003, his first season at the helm, ULM lost seven games by seven points or less and highlighted the season with a win over Louisiana-Lafayette.

Weatherbie has twice proven that he can take over sub .500 football programs and transform them into winning teams. At Utah State University, he inherited a program that had not had a winning season in 12 years and took the Aggies to their first Big West Conference championship in 15 years, their first bowl game in 32 years and their first bowl victory ever, beating Ball State 42-33 in the 1993 Las Vegas Bowl. He was 13-10 after his first two seasons, 1992-93, leaving after the third season to take the same position at the United States Naval Academy. The Aggies' 1993 win over Brigham Young still stands as Utah State's only win in the last 18 meetings with their in-state rival.

At Navy, Weatherbie had similar success. He took the Midshipmen, who had suffered through 12 consecutive losing seasons prior to his arrival, to a 9-3 record and the championship of the 1996 Aloha Bowl in his second season. The nine wins were the most by a Navy team in 18 years. At the time, he was just the third coach in academy history to win a bowl game.

In 1997, Weatherbie led Navy to a 7-4 mark, the first time since the 1981-82 seasons that the Midshipmen had compiled back-to-back winning seasons. The 16 wins over two years tied for the third most in academy history. He was named ECAC Coach of the Year and was the head defensive coach at the Kelly Tire Blue/Gray Classic.

Weatherbie's first team at Annapolis went 5-6 in 1995, after Navy had won just nine games the previous four seasons combined.

Weatherbie entered the coaching ranks in 1977 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oklahoma State.

After three years playing professionally, Weatherbie was hired as an assistant coach at Wyoming. Serving as the quarterbacks coach, Wyoming led the nation in fewest interceptions in 1981.

He left Wyoming after the 1983 season to be an assistant coach at the United States Air Force Academy. During his six seasons on legendary head coach Fisher DeBerry's staff, Air Force was an overall 48-25-1 and participated in four bowl games. The Falcons had five winning seasons during his tenure, finishing 8-4 and winning the Independence Bowl in 1984. The next season the Falcons went 12-1, finished the year ranked No. 5 nationally, and were Bluebonnet Bowl champions.

The University of Arkansas would be the next stop on Weatherbie's coaching journey. He spent two seasons on the Razorback staff before being named the head coach at Utah State in 1992.

During Weatherbie's years as a head coach, he has had numerous current NCAA Bowl Subdivision head coaches and NFL coaches work under his tutelage, including Gary Patterson (TCU), Brent Guy (Utah State), Paul Johnson (Naval Academy), and Jim Zorn (Seattle Seahawks).

Weatherbie graduated from Fort Scott High School in Kansas in 1973. He was a quarterback during his scholastic playing days, earning all-state and honorable mention All-America honors in football. He also participated in basketball and track, serving as team captain in all three sports.

The native of Sedan, Kan., continued his playing career at Oklahoma State, where he was a three-year starter and a team captain from 1974-76. He earned a bachelor's degree in health, physi-

cal education and recreation from OSU in 1977. He was a member of the Dean's Honor Roll.

Weatherbie signed with the Houston Oilers in 1978 and the San Diego Chargers in 1979 before spending his final two playing seasons in the Canadian Football League. He played for the Hamilton Tiger Cats and Ottawa Rough Riders in 1979 and 1980.

Weatherbie, 53, is married to the former Leann Jonas of Stillwater, Okla. They have two sons, Lance and Jonas, a daughter-in-law Brittany, a granddaughter, Hannah, and a grandson, Jonas, Jr.

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OFFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

In just his first year as the offensive coordinator, Steve Farmer directed the ULM offense to its highest yards per game average since the Warhawks moved to Division I-A in 1994. ULM averaged 385.7 yards per game last season, ranking sixth best all-time in school history and the most since the 1993 squad set the school record with 473.8 yards per game.

What is more remarkable about the total offense output from last season, is that it is just one of two seasons in the top 10 that came when the Warhawks were Division I-A.

WARHAWKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

ULM is 0-16 all-time against ranked opponents (since 1994) and 0-3 in season openers against a ranked opponent. The Warhawks closest upset bid against a ranked foe came at No. 22 Auburn in a 28-24 loss in 1996.

The Warhawks played a pair of ranked teams last season (No. 25 Clemson, No. 15 Texas A&M) in back-to-back weeks.

The highest ranked team that ULM has ever squared off against was No. 2 Florida in 2001.

The Warhawks have opened the season four times against a ranked foe: 1994 at #8 Colorado (L, 13-48), 2003 at #13 LSU (L, 7-49), 2004 at #17 Auburn (L, 0-31), 2008 at #10 Auburn (L, 0-34).

Troy was receiving votes in the AP Poll when the Warhawks handed it a 31-30 setback this season.

UNDEFEATED IN OVERTIME

ULM's overtime game at Florida Atlantic last season was its first game to go into extra time since 2002. The Warhawks are now 5-0 all-time in overtime games, with three of the five going to multiple overtime periods.

STATE-OF-THE-ART PLAYING SURFACE

The latest addition to Malone Stadium features a ProPlay monofilament fiber "grass" with a shock and drain pad and Envirofill clear coated sand infill. In addition to looking more like natural grass, ULM's new playing surface has measures in place to help prevent injuries and drain water at a rate of 10 inches per hour. The clear-coated sand used has obvious benefits over its predecessor (ground-up black rubber) in that it does not absorb as much heat, does not compact over time, and does not migrate during use. The first game played on the new surface was the 2007 season opener against Tulsa on ESPN2 HD.

The Warhawks are 6-4 at Malone Stadium playing on the new turf.

MALONE IS HOME FOR 31 YEARS

The 2008 season marks the 31st consecutive year that the Warhawks have called Malone Stadium on the campus of ULM home. Dedicated to legendary football head coach James L. Malone (1934-52) on Sept. 27, 1980, Malone Stadium has seen ULM teams post a combined 100-53-1 (.653) record.

The grounds of Malone Stadium have been the home to ULM's National Championship team in 1987, four Southland Conference Championships, and most recently a Sun Belt Conference championship in 2005.

ULM IN SEASON OPENERS

The Warhawks are 15-18-1 in season openers since 1975 (first year in NCAA).

Ken turned to his dad and said this is where I want to go to school.

PRESEASON HONORS

Three Warhawks were named to the Sun Belt Preseason All-Conference Team -- the SBC only releases a first team.

Tight end Zeek Zacharie, safety Greg James and punter Scott Love were named to the preseason list, tying the Warhawks for the third most selections. ULM was the only school in the conference to have an offensive, defensive and special teams representative on the all-conference team.

PRESEASON PRAISE

After recording its best season in 14 years in 2007, ULM was picked to finish third in the Sun Belt by the league's coaches. It is the highest the Warhawks have ever been picked to finish in the SBC in the preseason poll, including the 2005 season when they won a share of the conference title.

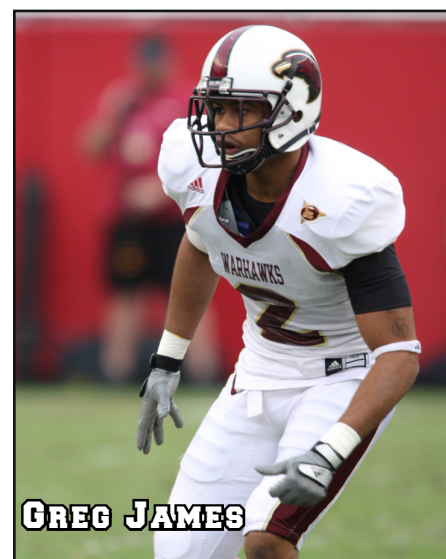

AUBURN, Ala.—No. 10 Auburn scored touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams to defeat ULM 34-0 Saturday night in front of 87,451 fans in Jordan-Hare Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

Both defenses dominated the opening half of play with the teams combining for only 245 yards of total offense. Auburn (1-0) finished sixth in the nation last season in both overall and scoring defense, while the Warhawks (0-1) led the Sun Belt in rush defense.

ULM held Auburn without an offensive touchdown in the first half; however the Tigers were able to find the end zone twice in the first quarter on a nine-yard fumble return by Michael Goggins and a 66-yard punt return by Robert Dunn – Auburn's first punt return for a touchdown since 1996.

The strong defensive play for both teams carried into the second half with the only touchdown of the third quarter coming after ULM fumbled the opening kickoff of half. Brad Lester scored from three yards out after the Tigers started the possession on the ULM 30-yard line.

The Warhawks held Auburn to just 85 passing yards -- the third fewest allowed by a ULM defense under head coach Charlie Weatherbie.

ULM tight end Zeek Zacharie caught a career-high eight passes for 61 yards to lead the offensive attack. Sophomore Frank Goodin carried the ball 15 times for 39 yards in his first start.

Quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster completed 20-of-32 for 136 yards moving into sixth place all-time on the ULM pass attempts list passing Super Bowl quarterback Stan Humphries with 606.

Auburn's pair of quarterbacks struggled in their first game in the spread offense as Chris Todd completed 9-of-18 for just 70 yards and Cody Burns completed only 4-of-9 for 15 yards. Ben Tate rushed for 115 yards on 13 carries.

LITTLE ROCK, Ark.—D.J. Williams scored with just over one minute remaining to lift Arkansas to a 28-27 come-from-behind victory over upset-minded ULM Saturday night in front of 55,048 fans at War Memorial Stadium in Little Rock, Ark.

In search of its second victory over a Southeastern Conference opponent in four games, ULM took a 24-6 lead with 6:11 remaining in the third quarter on a one-yard plunge by Gray Frazier – the first touchdown of his career. The Warhawks defeated Alabama 21-14 in the second to last game of the 2007 season.

Arkansas (2-0) scored three touchdowns, including two by Williams, over the final 17 minutes of the game to complete its second comeback win in as many weeks.

Casey Dick found Williams from eight yards out for the game winner. The touchdown capped an 11-play 79-yard drive that included a dramatic fourth-down conversion that would have ended the game.

After Williams scored the eventual game winner, the Warhawks (0-2) had a chance to win the game, but a 45-yard field goal attempt by Jeremy Gener sailed wide right to preserve the victory for the Razorbacks.

ULM redshirt freshman receiver Anthony McCall caught a pair of touchdown passes and finished the game with six receptions for 125 yards, while Kinsmon Lancaster finished the game 23-of-39 for 270 yards and the pair of touchdown strikes.

Lancaster moves into fifth place on the ULM all-time completions list with 366 and into sole possession of ninth place on the career touchdown passes list with 22.

Williams led Arkansas with five catches for 124 yards, while Dick was 22-of-34 for 323 yards and two touchdowns. Back from a suspension, Michael Smith carried the ball 22 times for 157 yards and a pair of scores.

McCall also got into the action on special teams by blocking a punt on the possession following his first touchdown catch.

Arkansas opened the scoring with a Smith touchdown run early in the second quarter, but Alex Tejada missed the extra point, after missing two field goals earlier.

Gener made field goals of 20 and 40 yards in the second and fourth quarter, respectively.

Nate Brown had a game-high 12 tackles for the Warhawks and also had a sack – ULM finished the game with four sacks as a team.

MONROE, La. – Senior quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster did it through the air and on the ground Friday night in the ULM football team's 37-15 win over Alabama A&M at Malone Stadium in the 2008 home opener.

The game was moved to Friday night earlier in the day as Hurricane Ike prepared to make landfall. It is the first Friday night game for ULM since at least 1979.

Lancaster connected on three touchdown passes and rushed for another to account for nearly 300 yards of total offense. The Shreveport, La., native connected with junior receiver Darrell McNeal eight times for a total of 131 yards and a pair of scores.

ULM (1-2) opened the scoring quickly when Lancaster connected with McNeal for the combo's first score following the opening kickoff. The seven play drive took 3:07 off the clock.

Alabama A&M (0-3) would get on the scoreboard early in the second quarter after a 37-yard drive stalled and Jeremy Licea converted on a 24 yard field goal.

The Warhawks would extend their lead on the next drive after Lancaster hit freshman Anthony McCall in the corner of the end zone for a 20 yard touchdown. His only catch of the game, the score for McCall marked his third touchdown over the last two games.

The Bulldogs would not go away as Ulysses Banks rushed for a three-yard touchdown with 6:38 remaining in the half to make it a 14-10 game.

Lancaster would strike again, barreling over the defenders and rushing into the end zone for his third touchdown of the game. The 22 yard scamper extended the lead to 21-10.

Just before the half, AAMU added one final score, a 21 yard field goal, to register their final points of the game.

In the second half it was more of Lancaster to McNeal as the duo combined on a 25 yard touchdown on wide receiver screen to make it a 28-13 lead. McNeal finished the game with eight catches for 131 yards and a pair of scores.

Sophomore Frank Goodin added a 21-yard run up the gut to give the Warhawks a 35-13 advantage. The West Monroe, La., native became the first 100 yard rusher for ULM on the season after passing the mark in the fourth quarter. Goodin finished with 17 carries for 114 yards. Lancaster added 81 yards on nine carries.

The Bulldogs lone points of the second half came at the beginning of the fourth quarter when an errant snap sailed through the back of the end zone for a safety. The Warhawks would get the two points back when sophomore Theo Smith recorded a safety with 5:12 remaining in the game for the final tally of the contest.

After allowing 262 yards of offense in the first half, the ULM defense buckled down and limited Alabama A&M to 71 in the second stanza.

The Green Wave (1-2) scored a pair of first quarter touchdowns on runs of nine yards by Andre Anderson and 37 yards by Jeremy Williams.

The Green Wave controlled the ball for nearly 36 minutes and ran 33 more plays than the Warhawks keeping an already short handed ULM defense on the field for the majority of the game. ULM's 42 offensive plays was the fewest under head coach Charlie Weatherbie.

Kevin Moore completed 19-of-32 passes for 272 yards and a 19-yard touchdown pass to Williams for Tulane.

ULM's Kinsmon Lancaster finished the game 13-for-18 for 118 yards. The senior signal caller broke the ULM record for pass attempts without an interception reaching 173 consecutive passes before a third quarter interception by Charles Harris ended the streak.

Radi Jabour put the Warhawks on the board with a 47-yard field goal midway through the third quarter. It was the first career field goal for the redshirt freshman and is tied for the 23rd longest in ULM history.

Darrell McNeal scored his third touchdown in the past two games running in from four yards out after lining up as the quarterback late in the fourth quarter.

MONROE, La.—Tyrell Fenroy rushed for a school-record 297 yards and Louisiana-Lafayette took advantage of the big play in a 44-35 victory over ULM in the Sun Belt opener for both clubs in front of a crowd of 21,929 in Malone Stadium Saturday night.

The Ragin' Cajuns had six touchdowns of 52 yards or more and finished the game with 728 yards of total offense. Fenroy had touchdown runs of 89, 80 and 52 yards, Jason Chery ran for an 89-yard score and caught a 74-yard touchdown pass, and Michael Desormeaux ran in a 64-yard touchdown.

ULL (2-3, 1-0 Sun Belt) finished game with 556 yards on the ground on 37 carries for a 15.0 yards-per-carry average. The Warhawks ran for 241 yards on 40 carries and finished the game with 383 yards of total offense.

The Warhawks did not turn the ball over in the game and have just three on the season, which is tops in the nation. ULM entered the game tied with Florida, Oklahoma and UNLV for the fewest in the NCAA, but all three other teams had at least one turnover on the day.

The crowd was the seventh-largest in Malone Stadium history and the largest crowd for a Sun Belt Conference game in stadium history.

After falling behind 34-16 midway through the third quarter, ULM mounted a furious rally to get within two, 37-35, late in the fourth quarter. Greg James jump-started the charge with a 55-yard interception return for a touchdown — his second pick of the game. The junior safety now ranks third on the ULM career list and fourth on the Sun Belt career chart with 13 picks.

Drew Edmiston pushed the lead out to 37-29 with a 25-yard field goal two possessions later.

Frank Goodin pulled the Warhawks within a two-point conversion of tying the game with his second touchdown of the game, but Trey Revell's pass to Zeek Zacharie in the end zone was just out of reach.

On ULL's next possession, Fenroy went straight up the middle on the first play of the drive for 80 yards and his third score of the game.

ULM's Radi Jabour kicked field goals of 42, 19 and 39 yards in the first half and has now made four consecutive kicks after the Warhawks opened the season just 2-for-7 on field goal attempts.

Chery's two touchdowns came on ULL's first two drives of the second half after the Warhawks (1-4, 0-1) seemed to grab a little momentum with a pair of field goals in the final three minutes of the first half.

Lancaster took control of the Warhawks next drive rushing three times for 71 times setting up a three-yard touchdown run by Darrell McNeal.

The Cajuns responded five plays later as Fenroy popped his 52-yard run straight up the middle stretching the lead out to 34-16.

ULM turned the tables on its ensuing drive as Revell kept the ball on an option for 57 yards down to the ULL eight-yard line. A personal foul penalty moved the ball to the four and Goodin took it in for his first score of the night.

JONESBORO, Ark.—Arkansas State jumped out to a big second-half lead and held off a late ULM rally to defeat the Warhawks 37-29 Saturday night in front of a crowd of 22,745 at ASU Stadium in a Sun Belt Conference showdown.

The Red Wolves (4-2, 2-0 Sun Belt) took a 37-14 lead on the first play of the fourth quarter, but the Warhawks charged back with 15-unanswered points and had the ball at midfield late in the fourth quarter before coming up just short on a fourth-down conversion.

Arkansas State forced ULM into uncharacteristic mistakes throughout the game. The Warhawks turned the ball over three times, which led to 13 ASU points, and committed seven penalties for 77 yards. ULM (1-5, 0-2) entered the game leading the conference in fewest penalty yards per game and leading the nation with just three turnovers on the season.

ULM quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster threw for 303 yards and three touchdowns on the night. His go-to target was Darrell McNeal, who hauled in eight catches for 149 yards — including a 29-yard score in the first quarter.

Lancaster also had touchdown strikes to Frank Goodin (25 yards) and Zeek Zacharie (one yard) pushing his career total out to 28, just one behind Stan Humphries and Robert Cobb for fifth all-time in ULM history.

McNeal moved into a tie for ninth place on the ULM career receptions list with 105 over his three-year career.

Alex Carrington delivered what appeared to be a knockout blow sacking Lancaster and forcing a fumble which Marcus Brown scooped up and ran back 71 yards for a touchdown with just over five minutes to play in the third quarter.

The Warhawks had just picked up a first down on the Red Wolves' 24-yard line after moving the ball 51 yards in just six plays.

On the ensuing possession, ULM took the ball back into Arkansas State territory, but another Warhawk fumble led to three more Red Wolves points.

The Warhawk defense buckled down the in the second half holding Arkansas State to just 122 yards after ASU accumulated 269 yards in the opening half of play.

ASU quarterback Corey Leonard completed just seven passes for 129 yards on the night. The seven completions are tied with New Mexico in 2003 for the fewest in a game by a ULM opponent.

Arkansas State entered the game with the Sun Belt's best rush defense allowing just 134.8 yards per game and improved on those numbers holding the Warhawks to just 87 yards on the ground.

ULM true freshman Luther Ambrose showed off his much heralded speed returning a kickoff 91 yards down the sideline for a touchdown midway through the second quarter pulling the Warhawks within three, 17-14. Ambrose is the two-time defending Louisiana 2A 100-meter dash champion.

It was ULM's first kickoff return for a touchdown since an 82-yard score by Charles Estes against New Mexico State in 2003 and the first kickoff return for a touchdown allowed by Arkansas State since 1998 against Minnesota.

MONROE, La.—ULM hit on three big play touchdowns in the first quarter and scored 28-unanswered points to open the game in a 35-23 victory over North Texas in Sun Belt Conference action at Malone Stadium.

Kinsmon Lancaster opened the barrage of points after keeping the ball on an option and taking it 54 yards to end zone. On the Warhawks (2-5, 1-2 Sun Belt) next possession, Luther Ambrose caught a screen pass from Lancaster and went 69 yards for the score.

The play was the longest of the season for the Warhawks and the freshman's second score in the past two games – he returned a kickoff 91 yards last week at Arkansas State.

Lancaster finished the game 12-for-21 for 171 yards through the air and carried the ball 10 times for 95 yards with a pair of scores. Frank Goodin rushed 18 times for 95 yards pushing himself past the 1,000 yard mark for his career – he has 1,037.

ULM kept the foot on the accelerator on its next drive and Rodney Lovett ran right up the middle of the defense for 49 yards and his first career touchdown. Facing a third-and-nine on the Warhawks next possession, Lancaster hit Anthony McCall on a 40-yard strike to set up his five-yard touchdown run three plays later.

A 27-yard field goal by Jeremy Knott put North Texas (0-7, 0-3) on the board before ULM wide receiver Darrell McNeal's touchdown pass made it a 35-3 Warhawk advantage. McNeal took a pass from Lancaster on the sideline and threw it to a streaking J.J. McCoy for the 46-yard score.

The Warhawks converted five plays of 40 yards or more in the first half after entering the game with three such plays in the first six games of the season.

ULM carried a 35-6 lead into halftime only to see North Texas score 17-unanswered points in the second half – two coming on Giovanni Vizza touchdown passes. Vizza finished the game 37-for-61 for 362 yards – his 37 completions set a new Malone Stadium record.

Josh Thompson recorded a game-high 20 tackles for the Warhawks – the 11th most all-time in ULM history and the most in the Charlie Weatherbie era. Cardia Jackson finished the game with 10 stops to mark the fourth straight game he tallied double-digit tackles.

North Texas ran 92 plays on the game to the Warhawks 55, but the teams had nearly identical total yards (ULM – 461, UNT – 463) and time of possession (ULM – 28:51, UNT – 31:09).

ULM continues to be one of the best in the nation in taking care of the football as it didn't turn the ball over for the fourth time this season. The Warhawks entered the game fourth in the nation with just six turnovers this year.

MONROE, La.—Rusty Smith hit Cortez Gent in the middle of the end zone from 22 yards out with 20 seconds to play to lift Florida Atlantic to a 29-28 come-from-behind victory over ULM at Malone Stadium in Sun Belt Conference action.

Smith completed seven-of-eight passes for 72 yards on the game-winning drive after ULM missed a 45-yard field goal that would have given the Warhawks an eight-point lead with just under two minutes to play.

The Warhawks (2-6, 1-3 Sun Belt) jumped out to a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter, but Florida Atlantic (3-5, 1-2) stormed back with 20-unanswered points.

Kinsmon Lancaster gave ULM a 28-20 lead with just under 12 minutes to play in the game with his third touchdown pass of the night – an eight-yard strike to Zeek Zacharie.

Lancaster finished the game 22-of-28 for 216 yards and the three touchdowns. He moved into sole possession of fifth place on the ULM career touchdown passes list with 32, just one behind Doug Pederson for fourth. He also carried the ball 14 times for 86 yards.

Smith completed 28-of-39 for 267 yards and a pair of scores. Gent finished the game with five catches for 73 yards and two touchdowns.

The Owls began their fourth-quarter comeback with a Warley Leroy 22-yard field goal with 5:41 remaining in the game.

On the ensuing possession, the Warhawks marched the ball 50 yards on nine plays, but a holding call on a second-down play on the Florida Atlantic 30-yard line pushed ULM back to the 36. After a one-yard loss, Lancaster hit Darrell McNeal for a nine-yard completion on third down to set up the 45-yard field goal attempt, which sailed wide left.

ULM found the end zone twice in the first quarter on a six-yard touchdown pass from Lancaster to Anthony McCall and a four-yard run by McNeal. In the opening minutes of the second quarter, Lancaster hit McNeal for a 13-yard touchdown to push the lead to 21-0.

Smith put the Owls on the board with a one-yard run with just under two minutes left in the second quarter. Following an interception on ULM's next possession, Smith threw a 13-yard score to Gent in the waning seconds of the first half.

ULM had an early opportunity in the second half to extend its lead back out to 14, but a fumble on the Florida Atlantic 13-yard line halted the drive. The Owls took advantage of the mistake four minutes later with a 37-yard field goal by Leroy.

Levi Brown completed 1-of-3 attempts on the drive to set up a Sam Glusman 56-yard field goal attempt to win the game. The kick, which caught the entire stadium off guard, bounced off the crossbar and fell just short to preserve the Warhawk victory.

The game was a wild back-and-forth affair that featured seven lead changes, five of which came in the final 19 minutes of the game.

After the Trojans (5-3, 4-1 Sun Belt) rattled off 17 unanswered points to close out the first half, ULM (3-6, 2-3) stormed back with a pair of Lancaster touchdown passes. He struck first on a five-yard pass to tight end Mitch Doyle and then found running back Frank Goodin from 13-yards out – the senior signal caller now has 34 career touchdown passes, fourth best in school history.

Lancaster was 15-for-26 for 125 yards before suffering an injury around the 10-minute mark of the fourth quarter.

This was ULM's third game this season decided by one point. The Warhawks suffered heartbreaking losses to Arkansas (28-27) and Florida Atlantic (29-28).

DuJuan Harris broke off a 45-yard touchdown run in the waning minutes of the third quarter to give the Trojans a 24-22 advantage.

The Warhawks came right back down the field and regained the lead on a career-long 48-yard field goal by Radi Jabour.

After each team failed to score on their next possession, Troy marched the ball 84 yards on nine plays to take a 30-25 lead on a Brown 29-yard touchdown pass to Harris. Brown's two-point conversion attempt was intercepted by Greg James leaving the margin at five and setting up Revell's heroics.

MURFREESBORO, Tenn.—ULM quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster put the Warhawks on his back over the final three quarters of the game, but Middle Tennessee built a big enough lead to survive for a 24-21 victory Saturday afternoon in Sun Belt Conference action at Floyd Stadium.

After sitting out the first quarter, Lancaster completed 16-of-25 attempts for 202 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran the ball 14 times for 126 yards – taking out five sacks, Lancaster would have totaled 149 yards on the ground.

Trailing 17-14, ULM (3-7, 2-4 Sun Belt) had a chance to tie the game with a 32-yard field goal with 9:19 remaining in the third quarter, but a high snap led to a miss and spoiled a 74-yard run by Lancaster – tied for the 13th longest in ULM history.

Lancaster responded on ULM's next possession by leading the Warhawks on 12-play, 72-yard drive culminating with a 17-yard touchdown pass to Zeek Zacharie to pull the Warhawks within three, 24-21, with just under six minutes remaining in the game.

Zacharie finished the game with 5 catches for 77 yards and a touchdown – he put his name on the career receptions list by moving into 10th place with 106 career receptions.

Middle Tennessee jumped out to a 17-0 lead over the first 18 minutes of the game. Joe Craddock and Dwight Dasher had touchdown passes and Alan Gendreau hit a 44-yard field goal. Craddock was 13-of-20 for 216 yards on the game.

ULM began its comeback with a 15-yard touchdown run by Frank Goodin with just under five minutes to play in the game. The Warhawks had a chance to pull within 17-10 at the half, but Radi Jabour missed a 35-yard field goal in the final seconds.

The Warhawks outgained the Blue Raiders 448-368 on the game, including a dominating 236-90 on the ground.
