THE PARTICULARS

North Texas is back on the road as they travel to Monroe to face ULM. North Texas is coming off a 59-30 loss to Louisiana-Lafayette. ULM returns home to begin a three-game homestand after falling to Arkansas State on the road 37-29. The game can be heard on the Mean Green Radio Network. Kickoff is at 6 p.m.

THE PRINCIPALS

Both teams enter the game struggling as the Warhawks have the only win between the two teams. North Texas is 0-6 and looking for its first win of the season while ULM is 1-5 with its only win coming over Alabama A&M. The Mean Green is coming off its best offensive performance of the year against Louisiana-Lafayette, scoring 30 points. Both teams are 0-2 in Sun Belt Conference play.

THE SERIES

A long series between North Texas and ULM has the two teams tied at 12-12. More times than not it has been the home team that has the advantage. In Monroe ULM has the advantage over North Texas 8-4. Last season the Mean Green captured a 31-21 win over the Warhawks at Fouts Field. The last time the Mean Green was in Monroe it was the final game of the 2006 season, a 23-3 ULM victory. North Texas last won in Monroe in 2003 when the Mean Green escaped with a 28-26 win.

NEXT GAME

North Texas is back at home for a homecoming game against Troy. ULM is also at home as they host defending conference champion Florida Atlantic.

A CLOSER LOOK AT ULM

Head Coach Charlie Weatherbie – Weatherbie begins his sixth season at the helm of the ULM football program. The 2007 season marked the first year that ULM was bowl eligible since it made the jump to Division I-A in 1994. The Warhawks won five of their last six games on the season including one of the biggest upsets in all of college football, knocking off Alabama 21-14 in Tuscaloosa, Ala. Under his direction, the Warhawks football program went from winning one game in 2003 to winning the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship in iust three seasons.

The Matchup – The two teams have similar looking offenses and and the same struggles on defense. The North Texas offense is starting to find its stride and wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald is piling up the yards. He is the nation's leading receiving when it comes to receptions per game and seventh in the country in yards per game. The North Texas offense is second in the Sun Belt in passing. ULM has a balanced attack on offense and is led by duel threat quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster. Through the first six game Lancaster has passed for 1,140 yards and run for another 201 yards. Running back Frank Goodin is the leading ground gainer for ULM, averaging just under 70 yards a game. The Mean Green is coming off one of its better game running the ball and ULM has had problems defending the run as they are 118 in the nation against the run.

Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands

Weekly Media Luncheon

Coach Dodge will hold his weekly press conference every Tuesday throughout the season at 12 p.m. in the North Texas Athletic Center. The press conferences are held in the team meeting room of the Athletic Center and all media are encouraged to attend. The press conference in its entirety will also be available on-demand on MeanGreenSports. com, which can be accessed via a username and password provided by the media relations office.

Media Availability for Players

All player interviews will be conducted following Dodge's Tuesday press conference in the team meeting room of the Athletic Center. Requests for players should be made by 3 p.m. Monday afternoon. If a player requested is not available at the luncheon they will be made available after Tuesday's practice. Monday is an off-day for North Texas players, no practice is scheduled and no interviews will be granted. Special exceptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific studentathlete before practice at the discretion of the media relations office.

Sun Belt Teleconference

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday and Wednesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

Louisiana-Monroe Quick Hitters – The Warhawks rank last in the Sun Belt Conference in rushing defense, allowing opponents an average of 261.8 yards per game. North Texas has rushed for over 200 yards just once this season (203 vs. Tulsa)... Louisiana-Monroe is second in the conference in passing defense, holding opponents to an average of 207.8 yards per game... Louisiana-Monroe and North Texas rank seventh and eighth respectively in total defense, with the Warhawks giving up an average of 469.7 and the Mean Green giving up an average of 481.7... North Texas has the league's top punter in Truman Spencer, but Louisiana-Monroe leads the conference in net punting with an average of 36.5 yards per punt... The two teams have struggle converting third downs, with North Texas converting 33 percent of its chances and Louisiana-Monroe converting just 24 percent.

Facing Another Top Returner – For the third straight week, North Texas will face one of the top special teams player in the Sun Belt Conference. Louisiana-Monroe freshman Luther Ambrose leads the Sun Belt in kickoff return average, coming into this game at 25.1 yards per return. He has a 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown this season and the Mean Green is coming off of a game where it allowed a 97-yard kickoff returned for a score. The last two weeks, North Texas has faced T.Y Hilton of Florida International and Jason Chery of Louisiana-Lafayette, who rank second and fourth respectively in kickoff returns in the league.

Short Lead – North Texas took a 3-0 lead and also held a 10-7 lead against Louisiana-Lafayette last week, marking the only time this season that the Mean Green has held a lead in a game. The first lead for North Texas lasted only 57 seconds while the second lead lasted 7:02 of game time. Both leads came in the first quarter, but Louisiana-Lafayette was able to answer before the end of that quarter so the Mean Green still has not led after any quarter this year. The four-point deficit against the Ragin' Cajuns was the closest North Texas has been following the first 15 minutes this season.

Stringing Drives Together – The last three weeks, the North Texas offense has had some success sustaining lengthy drives. In the first three games of the year, the Mean Green had a total of seven drives that carried 40 yards or more. In the last three games, North Texas has mounted 18 drives that have gone 40 or more yards. The Mean Green is cutting down on its three-and-out possessions, having only two in the last two games. Below is a look at the average North Texas offensive drives in each game.

Stop the Second Quarter Surge – The second quarter has been the Achilles heel for North Texas through the first half of the season, with the Mean Green offense not being able to score and the Mean Green defense not being able to get stops. North Texas has allowed more yards and more points in the second quarter than any other quarter this season. North Texas has allowed 976 yards of offense in the second quarter, compared to 822 in the first, 651 in the third and 441 in the fourth. Opponents have scored 129 points in the second quarter, compared to 87 in the first, 73 in the third and 31 in the fourth.

Playing From Behind – North Texas has let its opponents get out to big first-half leads this season, making it difficult to mount a second-half comeback. The Mean Green has been outscored 87-30 in the first quarter and 129-23 in the second quarter, leading to the insurmountable leads. It has been a lethal combination of inefficient drives by the North Texas offense and a Mean Green defense that has had a hard time keeping the opponent out of the end zone. Under second year head coach Todd Dodge, North Texas is 1-13 when trailing at the half. Below is a breakdown of first-half scoring drives for North Texas and its opponents.

Turnover Tornado – In the first three games of the year, North Texas held its own in the turnover battle. The Mean Green only committed three turnovers in the first three games and its turnover margin was even (three giveaways and three takeaways). In the last three games, North Texas has been bitten by the turnover bug, committing 13 while gaining just two. The Mean Green was a minus six in the turnover margin against Rice and minus four against Florida International. North Texas dropped from being ranked 57th nationally in turnover margin to 117th. North Texas has a 1-11 record under Todd Dodge when it commits more turnovers than its opponent.

Points off Turnovers – While the number of turnovers is important, what a team does with those turnovers becomes critical. North Texas opponents are having tremendous success turning takeaways into points, creating 16 turnovers and scoring on 13 of the ensuing possessions (12 touchdowns and one field goal) for a success rate of 81 percent. North Texas has scored just twice off of its five takeaways for a success rate of 40 percent. The Mean Green has 10 points off turnovers, while its opponents have scored 87 points off turnovers.

Winning First Down – The success on first down plays will set the tone for a drive according to North Texas head coach Todd Dodge. Dodge has set a team goal of averaging a gain of at least three yards on first down this year, in an effort to stay ahead of the chains and make for manageable second and third down situations. Below is a game-by-game breakdown of North Texas and its opponent's success on first down plays.

Roster Required – Of the 67 players that have seen action for North Texas this year, 25 have never played for the Mean Green prior to this year (37 percent). Those 25 new faces are made up of 12 true freshmen, eight transfers and five redshirt freshmen. Six of the 11 offensive starters in the last two games are in their first year of action with the Mean Green. On defense, three of the 11 starters are in their first year at North Texas – all of which are in the defensive secondary.

Green Movement – North Texas is fielding a very young team in 2008 with a total of 17 freshmen (12 true and five redshirt) playing this season. There are 11 true or redshirt freshmen in the two-deep and a total of 24 freshmen and sophomores in the offensive and defensive depth chart. Only one position (middle linebacker) doesn't have either a freshman or sophomore in the two deep. Only seven schools have played more true freshmen than North Texas this season, led by Florida State which has played 22.

Unfamiliar Point Production – Of the 95 points that North Texas has scored this season, 65 of those (68 percent) have been scored by players that are in their first season at North Texas. Transfer kicker Jeremy Knott has scored 29 points with seven field goals and eight extra points, while transfer running back Cam Montgomery and true freshman running back Lance Dunbar each have two touchdowns. Transfer wide receiver Alex Lott has one touchdown to round out the newcomer scoring. Senior wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald (12 points), is the only returning letterman of the top five scorers on the team.

Behind the Chains – North Texas is 30-of-91 (33 percent) on third down conversions this season, ranking 95th nationally. A big reason for the third down struggles this year is because the Mean Green has been working from behind the chains. The average distance to gain on third down for North Texas this year has been 7.4 yards. Of the total 91 third down plays for the Mean Green this year, only 29 have been short yardage situations (three yards or less), 16 have been middle yardage situations (4-6 yards) and 46 have been long yardage (seven yards or more).

Holding Third and Long – The North Texas defense has put opposing teams in third and long situations this year, but has struggled stopping them from converting those situations into first downs. Mean Green opponents have been faced with a total of 31 third down plays where the distance to gain was seven yards or more... and they have converted 14 of those. North Texas opponents are converting third and long situations at a 45 percent success rate, which is only slightly below the 51 percent success rate on all third down conversions for opponents. The 51 percent conversion percentage by North Texas opponents, ranks fifth best in the nation.

Scoring Drive Disparity – The North Texas offense has not had a lot of quick strike touchdown drives this season like it did last year. In 12 games last year, the Mean Green had nine touchdown drives that carried more than 50 yards in five plays or less. This year, North Texas doesn't have any touchdown drives that fit into that category. North Texas opponents have 14 touchdown drives that have taken five plays or less and carried more than 50 yards. The Mean Green has two touchdown drives that have taken two minutes or less this year, while its opponents have 22 that have come in two minutes or less.

First Time Without a Touchdown – North Texas was held without a touchdown against LSU, which was the first time the Mean Green has been kept out of the end zone under second-year head coach Todd Dodge. In the other 16 games under Dodge, North Texas had averaged over three touchdowns per game.

It Starts Up Front – North Texas has had a difficult time putting pressure on opposing quarterbacks through the first part of this season. The Mean Green has just four quarterback sacks so far and that is spread among four different defenders. The four sacks for North Texas this season rank 117th in the nation with only Washington, having fewer. This week's opponent Louisiana-Monroe ranks last in the Sun Belt Conference and 110th nationally in sacks allowed, giving up 17 so far this year. Last season, North Texas had 14 quarterback sacks in 12 games, but 11 of those came from players who exhausted their eligibility in 2007. The only defensive player on this year's roster who had a sack last season was Joseph Miller, who had four.

Red Zone Success – The North Texas offense has been very successful inside the red zone this season, scoring on 13 of its 15 trips. The Mean Green has been perfect inside the red zone in five of its six games, with Florida International being the only exception (2-for-4). The 87 percent success rate for North Texas in the red zone ranks 35th nationally. The problem for North Texas is that it has only made 15 trips inside the red zone, which is tied for the second fewest in the NCAA FBS.

Strong Ending and Beginning- One of the focal points this year for the North Texas defense is ending the first half and starting the second half without allowing points. Last season North Texas allowed three opponents to score touchdowns on both the last drive of the first half and the first drive of the second half. The Mean Green lost all three games. In four games last year the Mean Green allowed a touchdown on either the last drive of the half or the first drive of the second half, all of which were losses. In all North Texas allowed points to be scored on the last drive of the first half or first drive of the second half in nine of its 12 games. The Mean Green's record was 2-7 in those games. This year, North Texas has allowed just two touchdowns on the last drive of the first half (Tulsa and FIU) and just one touchdown on the first possession of the second half (Kansas State). North Texas did not allow LSU, Rice or Louisiana-Lafayette a touchdown on either of those key possessions.

Coaches Up/Coaches Down – North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with running backs coach Shelton Gandy, and defensive ends coach David Rausch. On the sideline with Dodge will be defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach, defensive tackles coach Robert Drake, wide receivers coach Clayton George, safeties coach Chuck Petersen, cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels, offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich and graduate Scott Vestal. Graduate assistant coaches Jeff Bryant, and Craig Moore will also be in the press box.

Captains Named – Four North Texas players will serve as team captains throughout the entire 2008 season. Junior defensive back Antoine Bush, senior wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald, junior linebacker Craig Robertson and sophomore quarterback Giovanni Vizza were all voted on by teammates to serve in the honorary capacity.

TV Time- North Texas is scheduled to play on television five times in 2008. The Mean Green was shown in the Dallas/Fort Worth market on KTXA 21 for the Tulsa and Rice games as part of two-game deal with the station. The LSU game was shown on COX Sports and ESPN GAmePlan and the Florida International game and the Western Kentucky game will both be shown as part of the Sun Belt Conference package with ESPN Regional. KTXA 21 will also air the North Texas games that are being broadcast as part of the Sun Belt package.

Well Represented in the NFL – North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

Early Season Recognition -Wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald and offensive lineman Kelvin Drake were named to the 2008 Sun Belt Conference Preseason All-Conference Team, Fitzgerald was a 2007 All-American last season after leading the league in receptions and yards. Drake was a second-team all-conference selection last season and the anchor of the Mean Green's offensive line after starting all 12 games at center. The Mean Green was picked to finish seventh this season in the preseason poll as voted on by the leagues head coaches. North Texas finished 2007 with a 1-6 mark in league play.

Did You Know - North Texas has its share of players on the roster that have great genes of their own but some have even better bloodlines. Wide receiver Alex Lott is the son of former Oklahoma All Big 8 quarterback Thomas Lott. His older brother just finished up his college career at Rice. Freshman wide receiver Desmond Brigham is the nephew of current Arizona Cardinals wide receiver Jamaica Rector. And if that wasn't enough freshman defensive back Jeremy Phillips is the younger brother of Jason Phillips, Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a linebacker at TCU.

Following In Footsteps - North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Riley Dodge was recruited as a quarterback, but is currently seeing time at wide receiver. If Riley plays quarterback, it would make him and his father only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

Lack of Senioritis - The North Texas roster has only 15 seniors and only five of those are currently in the starting lineup. Only 12 teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only five of those teams are non-BCS teams. Of the six seniors currently in the starting lineup, none have started more than 16 games in their career (wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald). Seven of the 15 seniors are offensive players, seven are defensive players and one is punter Truman Spencer.

Home Grown - Of the 102 players on the North Texas roster in 2008, 92, or 90.2 percent, came from the state of Texas. Only four teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have more teams from their home state, including San Jose State (96.1 percent), Florida Atlantic (94.7 percent), Fresno State (93.9 percent) and Texas A&M (91.3 percent). The player farthest from home on the North Texas roster is Jacob Kaiser who hails from Greensburg, Pa.

MEAN GREEN OFFENSIVE NOTES

National Leader - North Texas senior wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald leads the nation in receptions, with an average of 9.2 per game. His 14 catches last week against Louisiana-Lafayette is the third-best single-game performance in North Texas history and the secondbest performance by any receiver in the NCAA this year. He has had 11 or more receptions in five of the last 17 games, including three of the top four performances in school history. His 104.7 receiving yards per game also ranks seventh nationally.

Vizza Leading League - Sophomore quarterback Giovanni Vizza leads the Sun Belt Conference in passing yards with an average of 230.3 yards per game. Vizza is currently on pace to have a season that would rank him in the top five single-season passing performances in North Texas history.

Offensive Production Down - The North Texas offense has struggled to find its rhythm during the early part of the season. Statistically speaking, there are some glaring areas where North Texas must improve to equal last year's numbers. Through the first six games, scoring average is 15.8 points per game compared to 24.8 points per game last season. The passing game has averaged 238.2 yards this season, compared to 289.7 last year. Total offense in the first six games this year has averaged 370.3 yards, while it averaged 408.4 yards last season.

Nothing Long – The Mean Green passing game has not had success going down the field this year like it did during the 2007 season. North Texas has only converted three pass plays for greater than 30 yards this season, and those were of 43, 32 and 31 yards. Last year North Texas had a total of 21 pass plays that carried more than 30 yards, including nine that went for more than 40 yards. After the first six games of the 2007 season, North Texas had 13 pass plays of more than 30 yards.

Juggling the Uglies – The North Texas offensive line has performed admirably despite the juggling that has gone on in the first half of the season. Returning all-conference performer Kelvin Drake has missed all six games with a nagging ankle injury and has been replaced by redshirt freshman J.J. Johnson. Sophomore Victor Gill has only been playing offensive line for one year and is now starting at left tackle. Junior college transfer Gabe Hollivay is still learning the system, but has started every game at left guard. True freshman Coleman Feeley has been splitting time at right guard with Tyler Bailey. Despite the all the moving parts, the Big Uglies did not give up any sacks against nationally-ranked LSU or against Louisiana-Lafayette last week.

Cam Coming On - Running back Cam Montgomery was forced to miss the entire 2007 with an injury after transferring to North Texas from Northeast Mississippi JC. He is finally making his North Texas debut and is making the most of his opportunity. He led all running backs with a career-high 116 yards last week and is averaging 5.8 yards per carry with 336 yards on 58 attempts. He has three of the team's five rushing touchdowns this season.

We're Back- Record setting quarterback Giovanni Vizza and wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald have reunited in 2008 after breakout seasons in 2007. North Texas hasn't returned a quarterback who passed for more than 2,000 yards or a receiver who had over 1,000 yards in the same season since 1969. That year the duo of Steve Ramsey and Barry Moore returned after Ramsey threw for over 2,500 yards in 1968 and Moore had over 1,000 yards receiver. If Vizza and Fitzgerald are looking for any inspiration for how good they can be in 2008, look no farther than 1969 and the success Ramsey and Moore had. Ramsey had 2,828 yards passing and threw for 24 TD's while Moore had 1,130 yards receiving.

Fitzgerald Moving up Career List -Despite having played only 29 career games entering this week's contest, senior wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald has already established himself among the top pass catchers in North Texas history. In just over one year as a starter, Fitzgerald ranks third on the Mean Green's career receptions list with 171, trailing Johnny Quinn (187) and David Brown (182). He also ranks seventh in career receiving yards with 2,042 and his 16 career touchdowns ranks sixth in North Texas history. Fitzgerald has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has been a starter – which stands at 17 straight heading into this week.

Vizza's Valiant Unveiling – Quarterback Giovanni Vizza had the sixth-most passing yards in a single-season ever by a North Texas quarterback with 2,388 in 2007. It was also the most passing yards ever by a Mean Green freshman. Not since 1994 had a North Texas quarterback thrown for more yards, when Mitch Maher had 3,103. His average of 238.8 yards per game ranked as the third-best performance by all freshmen in the NCAA last year and ranks as the 24th-best among all 2008 returning quarterbacks. Vizza earned Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year honors for his 2007 performance.

MEAN GREEN DEFENSIVE/SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

Sack Attack – The North Texas defense will look to move out of the Sun Belt cellar in quarter-back sacks this week against a team that has allowed a bunch. The Mean Green only has four quarterback sacks this season and ranks 117th nationally. Louisiana-Monroe has given up a league-high 17 sacks this year, including 11 in the last three games.

Facing Top Quarterbacks – The defensive struggles for North Texas this season can be partly contributed to the quarterbacks that the Mean Green has faced. Kansas State quarterback Josh Freeman is an All-America candidate who is ranked among the top three NFL quarterback prospects by The Sporting News. Freeman also ranks 10th in the NCAA in passing efficiency so far this year. Tulsa quarterback David Johnson will be a strong candidate for Conference USA Player of the Year Honors and leads the nation in passing efficiency and ranks fifth in passing yards per game. Rice quarterback Chase Clement ranks 10th in passing yards per game and 22nd in passing efficiency.

Nwigwe Serving Notice – Junior linebacker Tobe Nwigwe is having the kind of season that many thought he could when he came highly-touted to North Texas. After starting 11 games as a freshman in 2006, Nwigwe missed most of the 2007 season while dealing with off-the-field issues. Back to his old form, Nwigwe now leads the team and ranks 15th in the nation and third in the Sun Belt Conference in tackles with an average of 10.0 per game. He has led the team in tackles in three of the six games, including a career-best 13 against Tulsa. His 60 tackles in six games are already more than he had in his previous two seasons combined.

Backend Carrying the Load – North Texas linebackers and defensive secondary are leading the way as the team's top tacklers through the first part of the season. The team's top six tacklers are all linebackers and defensive backs and three of them are in their first year at North Texas. Senior defensive lineman Isaac Thomas is the top tackler among defensive linemen with 20. Last season, three of the team's top six tacklers were defensive lineman, led by Jeramiah Chapman who led the team with 78 tackles and five quarterback sacks.

Old Dependable- Junior cornerback Antoine Bush has been a fixture in the Mean Green secondary since stepping on the field in his first game in 2006. Bush has started 28 of 30 games since his freshman year and missed his first game ever last week against Louisiana-Lafayette when he had a strained groin. While he hasn't led the team in interceptions or tackles, you could guess what he would do each year. His freshman season Bush recorded 42 tackles and one interception and he followed that up with 42 tackles and one interception his sophomore season. This season Bush has 16 tackles and is still looking for his first interception. Bush has started more games than any other current Mean Green defender.

True Debut – There are two true freshmen in the Mean Green defensive secondary that are holding their own this season. Safety Darien Williams and cornerback Royce Hill have both been in the starting lineup the last five games and both rank among the team's top five tacklers. Williams had a career-high and led all defenders with 12 tackles last week against Louisiana-Lafayette and ranks third on the team with 32 stops. Hill is fifth on the team with 23 tackles and has two pass breakups.

Return Drought Continues - It has been 115 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss against Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current streaks ranks as the ninth-longest without a kickoff return for a score.

Oh So True- Senior punter Truman Spencer has quietly put together one of the most consistent career's at North Texas. He has had back-to-back seasons of averaging over 40 yards per kick and has improved his average each year since his freshman season. Since 2002 North Texas has averaged at least 40 yards a kick or more from its punters in every year but one, 2005, which was Spencer's freshman season. He notched a career-best 41.6 yards a kick last season and currently leads the Sun Belt Conference and ranks 24th nationally with an average of 42.7 yards per attempt this season.

Welcome Back- The Mean Green defense this season is being be led by an old but familiar face in Gary DeLoach. An assistant coach at North Texas from 1998-2002, he returns after spending the last five seasons as the defensive secondary coach at UCLA. DeLoach was the North Texas defensive coordinator from 2000-02. During his time at North Texas, DeLoach directed some of the best defenses in school history. His 2001 and 2002 defensive units led the Sun Belt Conference in both scoring defense and total defense. In fact, during his three years leading the defense, North Texas ranked in the top three in the conference every year in total defense, scoring defense, rushing defense and passing defense. The 2002 North Texas ranked third in the nation in scoring (14.8) and ninth in the country in total defense (288.7) under DeLoach.



HEAD COACH TODD DODGE

Todd Dodge knew when he took the job at North Texas a year ago that there would be

a transitional period. He knew that it would take some time to implement his philosophies and his schemes and he knew that there would be some difficulties along the way. Dodge also knew that he and his staff would be a factor in the learning curve.

From the first team meeting until the season finale, the first year under Dodge was a season of continuous evaluation and adjustment. Dodge and his staff spent the entire 2007 spring practice season assessing his personnel, while trying to completely overhaul the offensive system. His primary goal was to convert a run-based offense that featured two tight ends into a high-powered spread attack that used four and five wide receiver sets. The conversion for Dodge's new offense would also have to come with just five returning starters and no returning all-conference performers.



The offensive development continued throughout the 2007 season, and despite being in a transitional period, the Mean Green broke single-season school records for total offense (4,901) and passing yards (3,476). With Dodge's teaching, three offensive players earned all-conference honors, including Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year Giovanni Vizza who took over as the starting quarterback five games into his inaugural year. Former walk-on receiver Casey Fitzgerald also found a home in Dodge's offense, breaking every single-season receiving record and earning honorable mention All-America honors.

Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to



its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Part of the attraction to North Texas for Dodge was the history of success. The Mean Green dominated the Sun Belt Conference from 2001-2004, winning four straight championships and posting an amazing 25-1 conference record during that time. After fleeting success in 2005 and 2006 Dodge was hired to help secure the foundation and restore the program to its winning ways.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Manhattan, Kan. (8/30/08) – The North Texas football team opened its 2008 season with a 45-6 loss to Kansas State on Saturday night at Wildcat Stadium. The Mean Green (0-1) is now 36-54-3 all-time in season-opening games. The Wildcats (1-0) extend their series record against the Mean Green to 4-1.

Wildcats quarterback Josh Freeman threw three touchdown passes and rushed for two of his own. He went 18-for-24 for 232 yards in two-plus quarters of work. Kansas State scored two touchdowns in each of the first three quar-



ters. The Wildcats special teams were crucial in setting up K-State in good field position on nearly every drive. K-State capped the scoring with a 28-yard field goal with eight seconds left in the game.

North Texas' lone scoring drive came at the end of the third quarter, aided by a pair of newcomers. John Shorter came up with an interception at the Kansas State 25-yard line and carried it 10 yards to the 15. Alex Lott caught a 9-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Giovanni Vizza to put North Texas on the scoreboard. NT had its extra-point kick attempt blocked.

The four-yard run was Valentine's first collegiate carry. A Brooks Rossman extra-point kick gave Kansas State a 7-0 lead at 13:03 in the first quarter.

Kansas State would go on to score three more times in the first half on drives of 80, 71 and 73 yards. Freeman scored the second touchdown on a one-yard touchdown run and then threw TD passes to Brandon Banks (30 yards) and Lamark Brown (six yards).



DENTON (9/6/08) – Quarterback David Johnson threw for 418 yards and six touchdowns to lead the Tulsa football team to a 56-26 win against North Texas on Saturday at Fouts Field in a front of a crowd of 22,785.

The Mean Green goes to 0-2 on the season, while Tulsa improves to 2-0. The announced crowd of 22,785 was the eighth largest in school history.

As a team, Tulsa combined for 555 yards of total offense, including 418 passing yards. The Golden Hurricane scored six touchdowns in the first half to jump out to a 42-10 halftime lead. The Mean Green out-

scored Tulsa, 16-14, in the second half, but NT was unable to make up ground lost in the first period.



Tulsa jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter before North Texas got on the scoreboard with two minutes left in the first period. Lance Dunbar ran the ball into the endzone from two yards for his first career touchdown. Dunbar led the Mean


Green with 74 yards on 10 carries.

BATON ROUGE, La. (9/13/08) – The defending national champion Louisiana State Tigers proved too quick for the North Texas football team in a 41-3 win over the Mean Green on Saturday night.

The North Texas offense played crisp and efficient against the defending SEC champions, but big plays from the Tigers broke the back of the Mean Green. LSU posted eight plays of 20 yards or greater which ignited the crowd of 91,602, the largest to ever see a North Texas team play.

"We focused well on the things that could keep us in the hunt, and I'm

really proud of my team tonight," said North Texas head coach Todd Dodge. "We allowed the ball to get into the hands of some explosive players, but overall I'm extremely happy with the way we played."

The NT offensive line gave Giovanni Vizza ample time to complete 22-of-40 attempts for 149 yards, including 16-of-26 for 110 yards in the first half. The vaunted LSU defensive line failed to reach Vizza, who has yet to throw an interception in three games this season.

The LSU big plays came early courtesy of tailback Charles Scott. He sliced his way to scoring runs of 38 and 43 yards, the longest rushes given up by the Mean Green defense this season. Scott finished the contest

with 102 yards on seven carries.

Trindon Holliday was electric as the Tigers return man. He put LSU on top 24-3 with a 92-yard punt return for a touchdown. That was the second longest punt return in LSU history, and was the longest play given up by the Mean Green this year. He also tallied a punt return of 59 yards and a kick return of 38.

Royce Hill set up the Mean Green offense with its best field position of the day when he intercepted an Andrew Hatch pass and returned it to the LSU 25-yard line.


Jeremy Knott got the Mean Green on the scoreboard five plays later with a 33-yard field goal to bring North Texas back to within a touchdown, at 10-3, just inside the second quarter.



HOUSTON, Texas (9/27/08) – Chase Clement threw five touchdown passes and rushed for two of his own to lead the Rice football team to a 77-20 win against North Texas on Saturday night at Rice Stadium.

North Texas falls to 0-4, while the Owls improve to 3-2. Rice ties the series at 1-1. The 77 points is the second-most points given up by a North Texas football team. The Mean Green gave up 79 points last year to Oklahoma.

The Rice Owls combined for 502 yards of total offense, including 328 passing yards. Clement threw for 298 yards, completing 22-of-28 passes.



Rice forced six turnovers, resulting in five Owls touchdowns. The six Mean Green turnovers are the most since North Texas joined the Sun Belt Conference.

North Texas had a good early start offensively, scoring three times in the first half to stay within eight points of Rice, 28-20. The Owls scored the next 28 points of the half, including 14 off two NT fumbles, to enter half ahead, 56-20. Rice shutout the Mean Green in the second half, 21-0.

Back-to-back defensive touchdowns by Rice in the third quarter put the game out of reach for the Mean Green. Giovanni Vizza threw three interceptions in the game, all in the third quarter. The North Texas quarterback had not thrown an interception in the first three games of the season. Vizza completed 25-of-39 passes for 251 yards.

Vizza distributed the ball to seven different receivers. Casey Fitzgerald and Sam Dibrell led the receiving unit with seven catches each. Riley Dodge caught a personal-best four passes.

Cam Montgomery ran for two touchdowns in the first quarter. The touchdowns were the first two of the season for the running back. His first touchdown was a one-yard run, answering the Owls' first scoring drive. The second was a 15-yard scamper, cutting Rice's lead to 21-13.

A 50-yard pass from Clement to Toren Dixon put Rice on the scoreboard just two minutes into the game. After the first Montgomery TD, the second Rice drive found Clement connecting with Jarett Dillard for a three-yard touchdown to give Rice a 14-6 lead.



The Golden Panthers improve to 2-3 overall and 1-0 in the Sun Belt Conference, while the Mean Green (0-5, 0-1 Sun Belt) is still winless through its first five games. FIU ties the series at 2-2.

Although North Texas held the edge in many of the statistical categories, the Mean Green was hurt

by big plays and turnovers. FIU took a 28-0 halftime, and NT was unable to make up the lost ground.



Hilton finished the game with three catches for 145 yards. Two of his catches were for touchdown receptions of 65 and 73 yards. FIU also blocked a North Texas punt, which was returned for seven points. The three plays gave FIU an early 21-0 lead. A Mean Green interception led to another FIU touchdown with 17 seconds left in the opening half.

North Texas quarterback Giovanni Vizza completed 32-of-46 passes for 274 yards. He also threw three interceptions, which led to two FIU scores. Casey Fitzgerald caught 10 passes for 120 yards, his first 100-yard game of the season and the seventh of his career.

The Mean Green compiled 428 yards of total offense, compared to FIU's 347. North Texas also held the edge in passing yards (309 to 237) and possession time (34:42 to 25:18). FIU did not turn over the ball, while the Mean Green fumbled once and threw three interceptions.

Jeremy Knott hit a 28-yard field goal in the third quarter. He went 1-for-2 on the night, missing a 34-yard attempt in the second quarter. Micah Mosley rushed for a one-yard touchdown run late in the fourth quarter to add to NT's score.



North Texas wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald had another career night. He caught 14 passes for 231 yards. His 231 receiving yards are the second most in school history. Fitzgerald holds the single-game receiving record, set at SMU last year with 327 yards. His 14 receptions are

the most in the Sun Belt this year and ties for third in school history.

Cam Montgomery had his first career 100-yard rushing game, making him the first 100-yard rusher of the season for North Texas. The running back rushed 20 times for 116 yards. Giovanni Vizza completed 29 of 44 passes for 361 yards. His 43-yard touchdown pass to Fitzgerald in the third quarter was the longest play of the year for North Texas.

Tobe Nwigwe forced two turnovers, intercepting a pass and recovering a fumble, but the Mean Green was unable to put any points on the board on the resulting drives. For his first score, Chery took a reverse on the Ragin' Cajuns' second play of its second series and ran 81 yards to give ULL its first lead, 7-3. The senior helped ULL regain its lead with a 17-yard touchdown reception, 14-10. In the second quarter, Chery scored on a 49-yard touchdown reception, a 97-yard kickoff and a 57-yard TD catch.






