ON TAP: Arkansas State returns to Sun Belt Conference play Oct. 13, traveling to Monroe, La. for a nationally televised game on ESPN2 against ULM at Malone Stadium. Every Arkansas State game can be heard live on 107.9 FM in the Jonesboro area and the live radio broadcast can be accessed through the Arkansas State athletic Web site (AStateRedWolves.com).

THE PRINCIPALS: ASU will play its second consecutive road game when it catches ULM on Oct. 13 in the first of back-to-back Sun Belt Conference games. The Red Wolves, coming off a narrow 24-21 setback at No. 13 Iowa last week, have dropped their last three games, while ULM brings a two-game winning streak and undefeated SBC record into the upcoming game.

HEAD COACH STEVE ROBERTS: Arkansas State head coach **Steve Roberts** is in his eighth year at Arkansas State after leading the Red Wolves to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and to bowl eligible seasons three of the last four years. During his first seven seasons as the Red Wolves' head coach, he guided ASU to 37 wins for its most over a seven-year span at the school since 1985-1992. Roberts was named the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. Under Roberts, the Red Wolves have had 64 All-Sun Belt Conference selections, an Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, SBC Offensive Player of the Year, two SBC Defensive Players of the Year and an SBC Newcomer of the Year.

GAMEDAY BIRTHDAY: ASU Head Coach Steve Roberts' birthday is Oct. 13, falling on the day of the Red Wolves game against ULM. Roberts has coached two other games at ASU on his birthday, a 52-21 home victory over Louisiana-Lafayette in 2007 and a 39-36 home win over the Ragin' Cajuns in 2005 as well.

ROBERTS CLIMBING VICTORIES LADDER:

In his first eight seasons as the Red Wolves head coach, **Steve Roberts** already has the fifth most victories among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches with 38 wins. Larry Lacewell (1979-89) holds the record for victories with 69 and is followed by Bennie Ellender (1963-70) with 52 wins, Bill Davidson (1971-78) with 51 and Forrest England (1946-53) with 49.

ROBERTS AND ASU STADIUM: Arkansas State head coach **Steve Roberts** has led the Red Wolves to a 27-9 record at ASU Stadium over the last seven years for .750 winning percentage. Not only that, the Red Wolves are 18-4 at ASU Stadium over the last five seasons.

ROBERTS IN CLOSE GAMES: Eighth-year skipper **Steve Roberts** has seen numerous close games during his tenure with the Red Wolves, holding a 21-14 record in games decided by eight points or less (40 percent of all his games). Roberts' teams hold a 19-11 record in their last 30 games that ended under those circumstances. Following is his record in close games:

17 AND UNDER: Arkansas State holds an 18-3 record under head coach **Steve Roberts** when holding its opponents to 17 points or less. The Red Wolves have won 15 of their last 16 games when holding their opponent to 17 or fewer points and have won 27 straight games when holding their opponents to 10 or

fewer points.

TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD: The Arkansas State football team has won the Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Award five of the past six years.

THE ARKANSAS STATE-ULM SERIES: ASU has played ULM 30 times, which is the fifth most in school history among all opponents. ULM leads the all-time series with Arkansas State 16-14 since the first meeting in 1959. As Sun Belt foes, ASU leads the series 5-3 after winning 37-29 last season at ASU Stadium. ASU has won five of the seven meetings with ULM under head coach Steve Roberts, the only two setbacks over the last seven years coming 27-31 at ULM in 2005 and 30-13 at ULM in 2007. The home team has won the game the last four seasons.

ARKANSAS STATE vs. THE SUN BELT CONFERENCE: Arkansas State is 56-55-1 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. Since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, the Red Wolves are 27-28 against all opponents that have been a member of the league. Against current members of the conference, ASU is 22-24 since 2001. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Lafayette with 17, while its most victories against a Sun Belt opponent since 2001 is Louisiana-Monroe with five. The Red Wolves have defeated every team in the Sun Belt Conference since the football league was formed in 2001.

ELITE EIGHT: After rushing for over 1,000 yards each of his first three seasons, senior **Reggie Arnold** can become the eighth player in NCAA history to hit the rushing mark all four years of his career. The seven players who have currently achieved the feat are Tony Dorsett of Pitt (1973-76), Amos Lawrence of North Carolina (1977-80), Dennis Manns of New Mexico State (1996-99), Cedric Benson of Texas (2002-05), Ron Dayne of Wisconsin (1996-99), DonTrell Moore of New Mexico (2002-05) and Tyrell Fenroy of Louisiana-Lafayette (2005-08).

BACK-2-BACK: ASU is playing back-to-back nationally televised games for the first time in school history. The Red Wolves faced then-ranked No. 13 Iowa last Saturday on ESPN2 and they now catch UL Monroe on Tuesday, Oct. 13 in another game televised on ESPN2.

GAMEDAY SHOWCASES MUSE STORY: Freshman wide receiver Allen Muse's story of his courageous path to the football field with the Red Wolves went national last Saturday when ESPN's College GameDay showcased his story. . . Prior to signing with ASU, Muse was a survivor of Hurricane Katrina and a record-setting pass catcher at Leesville, La., High School - where he had wound up after the storm. After signing with the Red Wolves, a physical followed by further tests uncovered a problem with Muse's heart. Extra tissue was

restricting blood flow and making the heart work harder than it should. . . On Sept. 11, 2008 Muse went into major surgery not knowing if he would be able to play football again, but six months later he was working out with the ASU football team during its spring camp. Now fully recovered, Muse has played in all three games this season as a true freshman and is playing a major role on the team as a key receiver.

WHAT GIVES: Statistically, the Arkansas State-ULM game pits the league's top scoring offense (ULM, 33.4 ppg) against its top scoring defense (ASU, 23.0 ppg) and the conference's top total offense (ULM, 418.6 ypg) against its top total defense (ASU, 372.5 ypg). Additionally, ULM is ranked No. 1 in rushing offense (208.6 ypg) and ASU No. 1 in rushing defense (106.0 ypg). At the same time, ASU is ranked No. 2 in rushing offense (162.8 ypg) and ULM No. 2 in rushing defense (108.0 ypg).

AIRING IT OUT: ASU finished with 216 passing yards, its second most of the season, against an Iowa defense that was giving up an average of 171.5 passing yards per game and was ranked 32nd in the nation in pass defense heading into the game.

REACHING THE END ZONE: ASU's 21 points scored were the most allowed by Iowa this season. Iowa's opponents were averaging just 11.5 points per game, ranking Iowa 8th in the nation in scoring defense at the start of the game.

LEONARD NOTABLES: **Corey Leonard** threw his third and fourth TD passes of the season against Iowa and now has 44 for his career, leaving him four shy of tying the school record. Leonard completed a season-high 22 passes (3 short of his career high), topping his previous season high of 12 set against Troy the week prior. Leonard threw his first interception of the season, ending his streak of consecutive passes without an interception at 79. He threw for a season-high 216 yards as well, giving him 6,569 yards for his career and moving him past Brian Lindgren (Idaho, 2001-03) for the fourth most yards in Sun Belt Conference history.

NOTING THOMPSONS: **Brandon Thompkins** recorded his second TD reception of the season against Iowa. Both of his TD's came over the last two games and he now has five for his career. Thompkins set a new career high for receptions with eight. He now has 12 receptions for 158 yards and 2 TD's over last two games. Thompkins also went over 100 all-purpose yards for the second straight game and third time this season, finishing with 135 yards.

STRINGING IT TOGETHER: Arkansas State's first scoring drive of the Iowa game that covered 89 yards was the longest of the season for the Red Wolves. The Red Wolves sec-

ond scoring drive covered a season-high 17 plays.

CLEMENTS HAS CAREER DAY: Taylor Clements finished the Iowa game with a career-tying four receptions (tied his four set the previous against Troy) and a career-high 69 receiving yards against Iowa. His 8 receptions and 105 receiving yards for the last two games combined tops his totals for all of last season (7 receptions for 74 in 2008).

MOVE THE CHAINS: ASU posted a season-high seven third-down conversions against the Hawkeyes, which equaled its total for its first three games combined.

ON THE DEFENSE: Bryan Hall, who entered the Iowa game with a team-high 3.5 TFL, recorded a career-best 3.0 stops behind the line of scrimmage. He has now posted at least one TFL in three of ASU's four games this season and also finished the game with a career-high six total tackles . . . ASU posted its first two interceptions of the season, a pick by Daylan Walker that was the second of his career and a 75-yard return for a touchdown by Demario Davis on the first INT of his career. The 75-yard return by Davis was the first INT returned for a TD by ASU since Darius Glover scored on a pick against Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 18, 2008. The 75-yard return also tied the seventh longest in school history . . . Cordarius Mingo recorded a career-high eight tackles, topping his previous high of seven set the previous two weeks against Nebraska and Troy.

THOMPKINS TOPS 2,000: With 230 kickoff return yards this season, senior Brandon Thompkins now has 2,136 yards and became the first player in school history and second player in SBC history surpass the 2,000-yard mark. Thompkins, already the school record holder in kickoff return yards, needs 210 more yards to break the SBC record. Thompkins has posted over 100 kickoff return yards in a game eight time times during his career at ASU.

RED ZONE SUCCESS: ASU's streak of 12 consecutive scores in the red zone was snapped last game at Iowa, but the Red Wolves are still 13-of-14 in scoring opportunities inside the opponent's 20-yard line. The Red Wolves rank first in the Sun Belt Conference and 18th in the nation in red zone offense.

TOUCHDOWN TIME: Senior running back Reggie Arnold has rushed for seven touchdowns through ASU's first three games. Arnold is ranked 13th in the nation in points scored, averaging 10.5 per game. Arnold now needs just five more touchdowns to tie the sixth most in school history for a single season. Arnold's 28 career rushing touchdowns leaves him five shy of tying the second most in school history and two short of the sixth most in SBC history.

GROWING CROWDS: With a crowd of 21,056 on hand for the MVSU game 23, 641 at the Troy game, ASU has now drawn a crowd of over

20,000 in 15 games all-time at ASU Stadium and six of those have come over the last seven games. Of those 15 games, 11 have been played with Steve Roberts as head coach. The crowd of 23,641 for the Troy game was the seventh largest in ASU Stadium history.

GAINING GROUND: With 3,493 career rushing yards, junior running back **Reggie Arnold** is ranked second among the career rushing leaders in ASU history. Arnold has rushed for at least 100 yards in a game 15 times for his career to tie the second most in school history. Arnold needs 455 more yards to pass Richie Woit as ASU's all-time rushing leader.

A NEW LEADER: Senior quarterback **Corey Leonard** became ASU's all-time leader in total offense this season, finishing the MVSU game with a combined 136 rushing and passing yards to push his total to 7,433 career yards. After four games, he now has 8,001 yards to his credit. Leonard passed former ASU stand-out and now NFL quarterback Cleo Lemon for the record. Lemon piled up 7,309 yards of total offense from 1997-00.

BIG AUDIENCE: The crowd of 85,035 for the ASU-Nebraska game was the fifth largest to ever watch an Arkansas State game, while the crowd of 67,989 in attendance for the ASU-Iowa game was the 13th largest. The largest crowd is 102,368, set at Tennessee in 2007. Four of the top five ASU games with the largest crowds have now been played under head coach Steve Roberts

UNBUCKLE THE BELT: ASU is now 7-2 all-time and 6-2 under head coach Steve Roberts in Sun Belt Conference openers after falling 30-27 against Troy in its first league game this year. The Red Wolves have dropped a Sun Belt Conference opener at ASU Stadium for the first time, now standing 4-1 in those games

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Arkansas State is 12-3 in home conference games since 2005, its only setbacks coming against Troy in 2007 and 2009 and Middle Tennessee in 2006. The Red Wolves are 18-7 in home conference games all-time under Roberts.

THE SHUTOUT: With its 61-0 victory over Mississippi Valley State, ASU shutout an opponent for the first time since defeating Florida Atlantic 3-0 in three overtimes in 2005, a span of 41 games.

A LARGE MARGIN: ASU'S 61-point victory over Mississippi Valley State tied the seventh largest margin of victory in school history. ASU also picked up a 61-point win when it defeated St. Mary (Kan.) 68-7 in 1963. The largest margin of victory in school history was a 101-0 win over Central Arkansas in 1917.

CHANGING THE RECORD BOOKS: ASU changed a number of ASU and Sun Belt Conference records during its game against the Delta Devils. ASU's 21 rushing first downs

tied the second most in Sun Belt Conference history. It scored nine touchdowns, tying the third most and fifth most in SBC and ASU history, respectively. The Red Wolves' eight rushing touchdowns tied their own SBC record, previously set against Tennessee-Martin in 2003. The eight rushing touchdowns also tied the third most in school history and were just three shy of the school record.

STINGY DEFENSE: ASU held MVSU to just 69 yards of total offense, which is the second fewest allowed in Sun Belt Conference history and the lowest total ever allowed by ASU under head coach Steve Roberts. ASU gave up just 1.6 yards per play, which is the second lowest in SBC history as well.

FOUR SCORE: Senior running back Reggie Arnold scored a career-high four rushing touchdowns against MVSU that tied the third most in school history and second most in Sun Belt history. Arnold also posted his 15th career 100-yard rushing game, tying the second most in school history.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST: ASU posted 496 yards of total offense against MVSU, its most since piling up 670 yards in last season's home opener against Texas Southern. Dating back to last season, ASU has now posted at least 350 yards of total offense in 10 of its last 14 games.

RED WOLVES PARTICIPATE IN AFCA/NCAA RESPECT WEEKEND: In cooperation with the NCAA and the American Football Coaches Association, Arkansas State University participated in the AFCA/NCAA Respect Weekend when the Red Wolves kicked off the season last Saturday against Mississippi Valley State University. Prior to kickoff, the teams, head coaches and administrators from both schools met at midfield to shake hands, illustrating and emphasizing respect for the opponent.

RED WOLVES TAKE TIME TO SHOW APPRECIATION TO LOCAL BUSINESSES: While their fall camp was in full swing, members of the Arkansas State football team and head coach Steve Roberts took some time away from the meeting rooms and practice fields to visit local businesses and thank them for their support of the Red Wolves. A number of the players and coach Roberts divided up into groups early on the morning of Aug. 20 and left the ASU Football Complex with not only orange juice, doughnuts and gift bags in hand, but also looking forward to the opportunity to show their appreciation for all the ways area businesses have backed the program.

BOWL ELIGIBLE: Arkansas State's 6-6 record last year made it bowl eligible for the third time over the last four seasons. The Red Wolves have made eight bowl appearances all-time, the last being the 2005 New Orleans Bowl. The 2005 New Orleans Bowl is the Red Wolves only appearance in a bowl game as an

NCAA FBS member.

TEAM CAPTAINS: ASU's senior class will alternate throughout the year as team captains. The team will vote on permanent captains at the end of the year.

95th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 95th season of football in 2009. ASU holds a 409-437-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and has played in seven bowl games.

SEASON OPENERS: With its victory over Mississippi Valley State, the Red Wolves have now won three of their last four season openers, including the last two in a row. ASU defeated Texas A&M 18-14 last season and Army 14-6 in 2006, but dropped a tough 21-13 decision to then-ranked No. 4 Texas to open the 2007 season. ASU is 45-44-6 all-time in season openers.

STARTING AT HOME: ASU opened its season at ASU Stadium for the first time since the 2006 campaign when it defeated Army 14-6. ASU has started just three of the last 14 seasons with a game at ASU Stadium, including 2009.

HOME OPENERS: Arkansas State improved to 7-1 in home openers at ASU Stadium under head coach Steve Roberts, who has led the Red Wolves to a 27-8 record on their home field, with its 61-0 victory over MVSU. ASU has now won its last five home openers. The last time ASU dropped a home opener was in 2004, when it fell 47-35 to then-ranked No. 25 Memphis. In addition to MVSU, ASU also won home openers over Texas Southern (83-10 in 2008), SMU (45-28 in 2007), Tulsa (21-19 in 2002), Tennessee-Martin (63-6 in 2003 and 56-7 in 2005) and Army (14-6 in 2006) during the last five seasons.

PRESEASON ALL-SBC ACCOLADES: Five Arkansas State football players were tabbed Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference, including Co-Offensive Player of the Year **Corey Leonard (Covington, La.)** and Defensive Player of the Year **Alex Carrington (Tupelo, Miss.)**. Joining Leonard and Carrington on the all-conference team are **Reggie Arnold (Little Rock, Ark.)**, **Josh Arauco (Grand Prairie, Texas)** and **Drew Hilton (Batesville, Ark.)**.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS: The Red Wolves are predicted to finish second in the conference according to the league's 2009 preseason coaches poll, announced July 20 as part of the Sun Belt Conference Media Days. ASU received 69 points, just three fewer than defending Sun Belt champion Troy.

TELEVISION TIME: Arkansas State will play in its first nationally televised game since the 2005 New Orleans Bowl when it faces Iowa at Kinnick Stadium on Oct. 13. The Red Wolves have a school-record seven televised games this season, including the Nebraska (Fox

Sports Net PPV), Troy (Sun Belt Network), Iowa (ESPN2), Louisiana-Monroe (ESPN2), Louisiana-Lafayette (Sun Belt Network), Middle Tennessee (ESPN Game Plan) and Western Kentucky (Sun Belt Network) games.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER BACK FROM RECORD-BREAKING TEAM: ASU returns its top passer, top three rushers and top two receivers from last year's team that piled up 4,786 yards last season to break the 57-year old school record for total offense. ASU posted 4,722 yards of total offense in 1951 for the previous record.

CARRINGTON WATCH LIST: Senior defensive end **Alex Carrington** is not only the pre-season Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year, he is currently on three prestigious watch lists. Carrington is on the Lombardi Award, Lott Trophy and Ted Hendricks watch lists.

ARNOLD ON DOAK WALKER AWARD WATCH LIST: Senior running back **Reggie Arnold** has been named to the list of candidates for the 2009 Doak Walker Award, released by the Guaranty Bank SMU Athletic Forum. Arnold, one of 45 players on the list, is the first player in ASU history to be named a candidate for the award three different seasons.

LEONARD ON JOHNNY UNITAS AWARD WATCH LIST: Senior quarterback Corey Leonard is one of 21 candidates listed on the 2009 Johnny Unitas Award Watch List. The award is given to the top senior quarterback in the nation.

ASU'S ARAUCO NAMED TO LOU GROZA AWARD WATCH LIST: Arkansas State senior kicker Josh Arauco has been named to the 2009 Lou Groza Award Watch List, announced by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission. Arauco, a 2008 finalist for the award, is one of 30 players that have been named to the watch list for the top place kicker in college football's FBS division.

BUTTERFIELD HELPS USA TO IFAF JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP: Arkansas State freshman quarterback Phillip Butterfield completed 11-of-18 passes for 128 yards and a touchdown to help the United States to a 41-3 victory over top-seeded Canada in the gold medal game of the International Federation of American Football Junior World Championship Saturday at Fawcett Stadium. For the tournament, Butterfield completed 30-of-45 passes for 353 yards and two touchdowns. The incoming freshman from Hot Springs (Lake Hamilton HS), Ark. was one of 45 graduating high school seniors to be selected to play on the United States' first national team comprised of players ages 19 and under.

ASU EXTENDS RADIO CONTRACT WITH EAB: The Arkansas State University Athletic

Department recently announced it has extended its radio contract with East Arkansas Broadcasters. ASU teamed up with EAB last year to make KFIN 107.9 FM, a 100,000-watt radio station located in Jonesboro, the new flagship station and home of Red Wolves' football broadcasts. Along with affiliate station KABF 88.3 FM in Little Rock, the Red Wolves will have two 100,000-watt anchor stations broadcasting the games in 2009.

ASU ANNOUNCES FOOTBALL GAME REPLAY PACKAGE: ASU has reached deals with several cable providers, which have a total subscriber count of over 100,000 households and businesses, to replay its football games in 2009. The replays will be televised on the ASU campus and in over 110 towns and cities across northeast and central Arkansas as well as Missouri. ASU replays could only be seen in Jonesboro, Bay and on campus last year, marking an increase of over 100 towns and cities in 2009.

Not long after leading Arkansas State to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference championship and New Orleans Bowl, head coach Steve Roberts continues to make ASU a dominant force in the Sun Belt Conference and has ASU on track for continued success in the upcoming years.

When the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year took over the program in December 2001, he impressed everyone with his wide-eyed enthusiasm and limitless energy. And, most of all, they believed that Roberts would bring success to the ASU football program. Roberts has been the driving force behind ASU's recent success, leading the football program to its most victories over a seven-year span since 1985-91.

Roberts came to Arkansas State University and brought with him a fresh enthusiasm, energy, and an "I Will" philosophy that has been adopted by everyone associated with the program.

"I Will" became the rallying cry as Roberts and his staff charged ahead through a grueling 13-game schedule in 13 weeks with no open date in his inaugural season and came within 11 points of winning the Sun Belt Conference championship and playing in the Sun Belt Conference prize—the New Orleans Bowl.

ASU ended the season with a record of 6-7 and finished third in the league rankings. That tied the most wins since rejoining Division I-A in 1992. The Red Wolves finished in the top ten turnarounds by Division I-A football schools for improving football records after finishing 2-9 in 2001. Also, attendance increased significantly in 2002.

The 2003 season saw a lot of success as well. Among ASU's many achievements was another increase in attendance, two defensive linemen ending up in the National Football League and the team winning the Sun Belt Conference Academic Award.

Under Roberts' direction, ASU continues to add to the achievements that began upon his arrival. The 2006, 2007 and 2008 ASU teams backed up the 2005 Sun Belt championship with non-conference wins over teams such as Army, Memphis, SMU and Texas A&M. The 2006 squad knocked off New Orleans Bowl champion Troy and the 2007 team fell to then-ranked No. 4 Texas by just eight points and pushed New Orleans Bowl champion Florida Atlantic to the final minutes. Last year's victory over the Aggies was one of the biggest wins in school history as ASU picked up its first victory over a BCS conference school since joining the FBS.

The 2006 team posted six wins for the second consecutive year, marking the first time since the 1986 and 1987 seasons that the Red Wolves had recorded at least six victories in back-to-back seasons.

The 2007 team won the Sun Belt Conference Academic Award, marking the fourth time in the last five years ASU had earned the honor. The 2007 squad posted the second most yards of total offense in school history only to see the 2008 team break the 57-year old record. The 2007 and 2008 ASU defense also ranked No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the Sun Belt Conference.

Roberts already holds the fifth most wins among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches and has led the Red Wolves to a 27-9 record at ASU Stadium, which included a 4-1 record in 2008.


During his tenure, ASU has upgraded its facilities with a new training room, weight room, locker room, recruiting room and state-of-the-art ProGreen turf on the field.

Roberts was named Arkansas State's 26th head football coach on December 21, 2001, to bring full circle his coaching odyssey from his home state through Louisiana and back. But, the trek has been a successful one, including an 8-4 record and national ranking in Division I-AA in 2000 at Northwestern (La.) State.

Roberts spent two seasons at NSU, where he and his staff and team took on a tough schedule which included a 27-24 overtime upset at TCU. While at NSU, Roberts was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award. Prior to going to NSU, Roberts served as the head coach and defensive coordinator at Southern Arkansas University in Magnolia from 1994-99. While there, his 1997 team won the Gulf South Championship, earning him Gulf South Coach of the Year honors. The Muleriders finished with a cumulative record of 26-5 from 1997-99, including 9-1 in 1999, 8-2 in 1998 and 9-2 in 1997.

During that span, his teams enjoyed top conference rankings in scoring offense, scoring defense, total offense and total defense. At SAU, he also served as the defensive secondary coach and recruiting coordinator from 1990-94 before being named head coach. Academically, his program ranked first in academic achievements in the Gulf South Conference three seasons.

Roberts, an avid fisherman, graduated from Robinson High School in Little Rock. A 1987 graduate of Ouachita Baptist University, where he was an Academic All-American, Roberts received his masters from SAU in 1989. He and his wife Sherri have one daughter – Abby (15).

ROBERTS' ASU HIGHLIGHTS

- Roberts has led Arkansas State to its most victories over a seven-year span since 1985-91.
- Already holds the fifth most wins among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches.
- 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year.

September 5, Jonesboro, AR (ASU Stadium - 21,056) - Arkansas State 61, Mississippi Valley State 0

JONESBORO, Ark. (9/5/09) – Senior tailback Reggie Arnold rushed for 126 yards and four touchdowns and senior quarterback Corey Leonard became the Arkansas State all-time yardage leader as the Red Wolves rolled to 61-0 victory over the Mississippi Valley State Delta Devils in the season opener at ASU Stadium.

Leonard passed for 129 yards and a touchdown and rushed for seven more to finish the night with 7,433 career yards, surpassing Cleo Lemon's mark of 7,309 set from 1997-2000.

Arkansas State piled up 496 yards on the night while holding the Delta Devils to 69 yards of total offense. The shutout was the Red Wolves' first since a 3-0 overtime victory over Florida Atlantic during the 2005 season.

The Red Wolves led 20-0 at the end of the first quarter, getting on the board with a 3-yard touchdown run from Arnold with 9:38 remaining in the period. Arnold found the end zone again on a 20-yard run just over five minutes later, and freshman tailback Don Jones scored on a 25-yard pass from Leonard to wrap up the scoring in the opening quarter.

Sophomore tailback Derek Lawson scored from 15-yards out midway through the second quarter to extend the Arkansas State lead to 27-0. Arnold added a 26-yard touchdown run and Jones scored from 12 yards out to complete the first-half scoring and give the Red Wolves a 40-0 advantage at the break.

Arnold added a two-yard touchdown run early in the third quarter and freshman quarterback Ryan Aplin scored on a 1-yard run later in the period to put the Red Wolves up 54-0 heading into the final quarter.

Sophomore fullback Jermaine Robertson scored on a two-yard run early in the fourth quarter and senior placekicker Josh Arauco added his seventh extra point to set the final score at 61-0.

Junior linebacker Javon McKinnon led the ASU defense with five tackles and one forced fumble. Twenty-six players on the Arkansas State defense recorded tackles in the game, with 10 of those players recording tackles for loss.

September 12, Lincoln, NE (Memorial Stadium - 85,035) - No. 18 Nebraska, Arkansas State 9

LINCOLN, Neb. (09/12/09) - The Arkansas State Red Wolves slipped to 1-1 on the season with a 38-9 loss to the 18th-ranked Nebraska Cornhuskers before a Memorial Stadium crowd of 85,035 in Lincoln. Saturday's attendance was the fifth-largest crowd to ever witness an Arkansas State football game.

Arkansas State senior tailback Reggie Arnold rushed for 83 yards and a touchdown, senior wideout Jahbari McLennan hauled in a career-high seven passes for 69 yards and senior quarterback Corey Leonard accounted for 153 yards of total offense on the day.

Defensively, the Red Wolves were led by a career-high 10 tackles from sophomore linebacker Demario Davis and seven stops from senior defensive back Cordarious Mingo, also a career high.

Junior quarterback Zac Lee completed 27-of-35 passes for 340 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Cornhuskers.

Nebraska scored on both of its possessions in the first quarter to open up an early 14-0 lead. Lee threw a pair of touchdown passes in the opening quarter, connecting with fullback Tyler Legate from three yards out with 11:40 to play in the period before hooking up with tight end Mike McNeill on a 13-yard strike with 1:15 remaining in the quarter.

Nebraska added a 30-yard touchdown run on a reverse from wide receiver Niles Paul early in the second quarter to take a 21-0 lead before the Red Wolves got on the board with a 1-yard touchdown run from Arnold with 5:30 to play in the first half.

Arnold's touchdown completed a 6-play, 32-yard drive, but placekicker Josh Arauco's extra-point was off the mark.

The Cornhuskers added a 26-yard field goal from Alex Henery with nine seconds remaining in the half to take a 24-6 lead into the locker room at the break.

A 32-yard touchdown pass from Lee to McNeill with 9:47 remaining in the third extended the Cornhusker lead to 31-6, but the Red Wolves answered with a 42-yard field goal from Arauco with 12:05 to play to trim the Nebraska advantage to 31-9.

The Cornhuskers completed the scoring when Lee found Paul in the end zone from two yards out with 8:14 remaining to set the final score at 38-9.

September 26, Jonesboro, AR (ASU Stadium - 23,641) - Troy 30, Arkansas State 27

JONESBORO, Ark. (09/26/09) – Troy wide receiver Cornelius Williams hauled in an 8-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Levi Brown with 7:53 to play for the go-ahead score, and the Trojans kept the ball away from Arkansas State over the final 5:52 to secure a 30-27 victory over the Red Wolves in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams at ASU Stadium.

Williams' score came on the heels of an Arkansas State fumble following a Troy punt, and the Red Wolves' miscue set the Trojans up with just 25 yards to go for what proved to be the winning touchdown.

The Troy touchdown wiped out an Arkansas State rally that saw the Red Wolves bounce back from a 23-10 second-half deficit to take a 27-23 advantage.

Following Williams' touchdown, the Troy defense held the ASU offense without a first down on the next Red Wolves possession, and when Arkansas State punted with 5:52 to play, the Trojans held the ball for the remainder of the game.

Brown completed 33-of-46 passes for 355 yards and two touchdowns, while ASU senior quarterback Corey Leonard connected on 12-of-24 attempts for 190 yards and a score. Wideout Brandon Thompkins added 206 all-purpose yards and a touchdown for the Red Wolves.

Troy and Arkansas State went into the game as the 1-2 picks, respectively, in most SBC preseason polls.

Arkansas State put points on the board on the Red Wolves' first two possessions to jump out to an early 10-0 lead. Following Arnold's 1-yard scoring run with 7:12 remaining in the opening quarter, Troy went to work, reeling off 20 unanswered points before halftime.

Glusman added his third field goal of the afternoon with 13:02 remaining in the third, sending the ball through the uprights from 21-yards out to lift the Trojan lead to 23-10.

Arkansas State countered with a 17-point outburst to take a 27-23 lead that held until Williams scored to put the Trojans back on top.

Sophomore Jaquan Kilcrease led the ASU defense with a career-high 12 tackles, including one behind the line of scrimmage.

Oct. 3, Iowa City, IA (Kinnick Stadium - 67,989) - No. 13 Iowa 24, Arkansas State 21

IOWA CITY, IA (10/3/09) – A late Arkansas State rally fell short as the 13th-ranked Iowa Hawkeyes held on for a 24-21 victory over the Red Wolves at Kennick Stadium.

Trailing 24-14 following a 20-yard field goal from Iowa's Daniel Murray with 10 minutes remaining, the Red Wolves (1-3) cut the Hawkeye lead to 24-21 on a four-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Corey Leonard to tight end Trevor Gillott with 2:01 to play, but time ran out on ASU as Iowa held on for the win.

The Red Wolves' defense held the Hawkeyes without a first down after Iowa recovered an ASU onside kick attempt following Gillott's touchdown, but just 10 seconds remained on the clock when Arkansas State got the ball back at its own 18. Two deep pass attempts from Leonard were incomplete, allowing Iowa to escape with the win.

Iowa jumped out to a 14-0 first quarter lead behind a pair of touchdown passes from quarterback Ricky Stanzi before Arkansas State got on the board just before halftime on a 12-yard touchdown pass from Leonard to wide receiver Brandon Thompkins. Thompkins crossed the goal line with 44 seconds remaining in the half, and placekicker Josh Arauco added the point-after to cut the Hawkeye lead to 14-7 at the break.

Iowa used a 43-yard scoring strike from Stanzi to wideout Marvin McNutt to take a 21-7 lead with 13:16 remaining in the third, but Arkansas State cut the lead to a touchdown when linebacker Demario Davis picked off a Stanzi pass and returned it 75 yards for a touchdown with 14:41 remaining in the game.

Iowa answered with Murray's 20-yard field goal to give the Hawkeyes a 10-point cushion.

Leonard completed a season-high 22 passes on 40 attempts for 216 yards and two touchdowns, while Thompkins caught a career-high eight passes for 76 yards and a score to lead the ASU offense. Cornerbacks Daylan Walker and Cordarius Mingo each recorded eight tackles, including seven unassisted for Walker, to lead the Red Wolves' defensive effort.
