TONIGHT'S GAME – FIU opens its 2009 conference schedule on the road as they travel to Monroe for a matchup with the ULM Warhawks. FIU will look to avenge a 31-27 home loss in 2008 at the hands of the Warhawks. In that game, FIU quarterback Paul McCall threw for 239 yards and a pair of scores, those coming on connections with Hilton and Greg Ellingson. The Panthers will also be looking for their first-ever victory over the Warhawks as FIU has fallen short in four previous attempts.

FIU will look to build on a strong offensive showing in the second half of their game against Toledo. The Panthers scored 24 points after the break and amassed 251 yards.

LAST WEEK:

The Panthers were once again victimized by a slow start as Toledo avenged FIU's 2008 victory in Toledo by beating the Panthers 41-31 at FIU Stadium. The Rockets' high-octane offense got off to a fast start, putting up 17 points before FIU was able to get on the scoreboard with a second quarter field goal. The Panthers' offense came alive in the second half, putting up 28 points, but the defense couldn't contain Toledo as the rockets pulled away with the victory.

T.Y. DOING WHAT T.Y. DOES - Sophomore sensation T.Y. Hilton caught the attention of Alabama head coach Nick Saban even before their game three weeks ago, as Saban called Hilton one of the best players in the nation. The All-American then caught the attention of not just Saban and his staff, but 92,102 rabid Crimson Tide fans as he took a kickoff 96 yards for FIU's first score of the game. The return came on T.Y.'s first touch of the game, making it two years in a row that the speedster scores on his first touch of the season. The 96 yard return is the longest of his already storied career, and is the third-longest in FIU history. With the 61 kick return yards he had against Rutgers, Hilton now has 1,023 kickoff return yards in his career, good for second on FIU's all-time list (Lionell Singleton - 1,613). He has passed Greg Moss, who had 878.

HILTON'S STREAKS - With a reception in the first quarter against Toledo, T.Y. Hilton has now caught a pass in 14 consecutive games after not having a reception in his collegiate debut. With his touchdown grab in the fourth quarter, T.Y. Hilton, who tied his career-best nine catches, has now scored or thrown a touchdown in eight consecutive games. The last time he didn't score a touchdown was in FIU's 33-23 loss at Troy on October, 18 2008.

GROUND GAME FINDS TRACTION

Despite the loss to Toledo, the FIU running game finally got on track last week. Against Rockets, the Panthers amassed 148 yards on the ground led by Darriet Perry who carried the ball 16 times for 60 yards. Freshman Darrian Mallary added 31 yards to go along with his first collegiate touchdown.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS - Hilton's return against Alabama made it five years in a row that FIU has had a kickoff return for touchdown. Hilton did it last year, and before that Lionell Singleton did it in 2007 and 2006, and Greg Moss did it in 2005. On the other hand, FIU has never allowed a kickoff return for a score.

NOT A ONE MAN SHOW - Going into '09, T.Y. Hilton isn't sneaking up on anyone. For that reason, other WR need to step up this year and already two have done so. Against Alabama, Greg Ellingson had eight catches for 113 yards and a score. Two weeks against Rutgers, Ty Frierson set a new career-high for receptions with seven.

THE NEW "KILLER B"

Senior linebacker Scott Bryant Bryant has surpassed current Baltimore Raven Antwan Barnes for fifth place on FIU's all-time tackles list with 242. Barnes had 224 in his decorated FIU career. Keyonvis Bouie is the all-time leader with 299.

In 2007, Bryant led FIU with 91 tackles and 2008 was no different with the junior leading the way for FIU with 89 tackles. Already in '09 he is up to his old tricks as he leads the squad with 29 tackles. He is also second the SBC with 9.7 tackles per game.

FOOTBALLPERFORMANCE.COM PERFORMERS OF THE WEEK

After returning a kickoff 96 yards for a score against No.4 Alabama, T.Y. Hilton was honored by FootballPerformance.com as its Kickoff Returner Performer of the Week. Linebacker Toronto Smith joined Hilton as a FootballPerformance.com Performer of the Week after recording 10 tackles, including three for loss against Toledo.

AHEAD OF HIS ALL-AMERICAN PACE

Last season, T.Y. Hilton racked up 2,163 all-purpose yards on his way to being named a Freshman All-American. After three games in '08, Hilton had 410 all-purpose yards. After three games this season, T.Y. is off to a better start as he has amassed 505 all-purpose yards.

PANTHERS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

T.Y. Hilton is currently ranked 13th in the country in kickoff return average with an average of 33.17. He is also 14th in all-purpose yardage per game with 168.33 ypg and 11th in receptions per game with 7.67 per contest. Punter Carlos Munera's 43.73 yards per kick place him 19th in the country.

On defense, Toronto Smith is tied for 58th in the country with .67 sacks per game and tied for 10th with 2 tackles for loss per game. Senior linebacker Scott Bryant's 9.67 tackles per game are tied for 29th.

McCALL EARNS SBC MALE SPORTING BEHAVIOR AWARD

McCall was also the recipient of the Sun Belt Conference's Male Sporting Behavior Award, He has been named to the Dean's List on multiple occasions and was a the recipient of the Bruce Allen Frieburger Memorial Engineering Scholarship.

With a 3.556 GPA in Electrical Engineering, McCall specializes in bio-engineering, communications, and power systems. He is currently pursuing a master's degree.

LARGE CROWDS THE NORM: FIU opened the 2008 football season playing in front of some of the largest crowds in their brief history. The Panthers opened the campaign playing before 52,112 at the University of Kansas--a then-record number for 88-year old Memorial Stadium and then performed in front of 70,585 the next week at Iowa. On Nov. 1 at Louisiana-Lafayette, the crowd of 29,031 was the largest ever to view a Sun Belt Conference regular-season contest. Already in 2009, FIU played in front of the second largest crowd to see an FIU game as 92,012 fans packed Bryant-Denny Stadium, and then played in front of 45, 273 at Rutgers Stadium

T.Y. HILTON'S FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

T.Y. Hilton, The Sun Belt Conference's Freshman of the Year broke multiple FIU freshman and all-time records in his first season.

HILTON HEAVE - Maybe his best game or moment of the year came on what is now called the "**Hilton Heave**", when T.Y. set a new school record with 199 receiving yards and recorded his fourth-straight game of 200-plus all-purpose yards against Arkansas State. But the Coup De Gras for Hilton against the Red Wolves was his 38-yard touch-down pass that clinched a 22-21 FIU victory. Afterwards, he not only earned Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week accolades, but he also was given an ESPN.com Helmet Sticker.

1,000 YARDS - On Dec. 6, 2008 at home against Western Kentucky, Hilton surpassed 1,000 yards receiving to become the first player in FIU history to achieve that feat. Hilton ended the year with 41 catches for 1,013 yards and seven receiving TD's.

NATIONALLY RANKED - Hilton ended the season ranked among the nation's elite, finishing third in the nation in all-purpose yards per game (180.25), ninth in punt return yards per game (14.78), 33rd in total receiving yards (1,013) and 26th in receiving yards per game (84.42).

MR. DO-IT-ALL. Last year T.Y. Hilton became the only player this decade to score a TD in five different ways (Reception, Pass, Rush, Kick Return and Punt Return). The first time Hilton touched the ball in his freshman year at Kansas (8/30/08), he returned a punt 74 yards for a TD. He returned a kick off 90 yards for a TD at Louisiana-Lafayette (11/1/08) and he threw for a TD against Arkansas State (11/8/08). He then rushed for a TD against FAU (11/29/09). He also had seven receptions for TD.

P.O.W. Honors - After being named the Sun Belt Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week on September 29, freshman **T.Y. Hilton** took it out on North Texas on October 4 in Denton. Hilton scored on touchdown passes of 65 and 73 yards, becoming the 21st 100-yard receiver for FIU, and his 145 receiving yards for the game ranked third most in school history.

HILTON AND SERINI RECEIVE PRESEASON HONORS: During the preseason, T.Y. Hilton was recognized as one of the very best receivers in the nation when he was named to the Belitnikoff Award Watchlist. Center Brad Serini was named to the Rimmington Award Preseason Watchlist. Also, cornerback Anthony Gaitor was included on the College Football Performance's 2009 watch list as one of the nation's top defensive backs.

POST SEASON ACCOLADES

FIU Football won five games in 2008, one shy of being bowl eligible. It tied the most wins in school history. Following the turn-around season for FIU, the Golden Panthers were rewarded with multiple post-season awards.

FIU MEDIA RELATIONS POLICIES

General Statement: Credentials for FIU home football games are for working media only. Spouses, dates, children under 18 and other non-workers are not permitted in working media areas in compliance with the working codes of the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

Press Policies: Working space in the press box is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Credentials will be issued according to the following criteria:

- 1.) Local and state newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area and student newspapers from FIU and opponent's schools.
- 2.) Other daily newspapers with preference to those that regularly cover FIU.
- 3.) Radio and television personnel not broadcasting but considered reporting (seats may be provided in the stands).
- 4.) Non-daily newspapers with preference to those that regularly cover FIU.
- 5.) Scouts.

Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be requested as verification of a writer's status.

Photo credentials will be issued on a game-by-game basis. FIU adheres to all NCAA guidelines regarding sideline photography that limits shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard line.

Practice Attendance: Working media may only attend the first 20 minutes of week-day practice sessions. During the season, the team's day off is Monday. Media planning on attending practices should first check in with Assistant Athletic Director/Media Relations Rich Kelch. THE FIU LOCKER AND ATHLETIC TRAINING ROOMS ARE OFF LIMITS TO THE MEDIA.

Mario Cristobal Interviews: Head coach Mario Cristobal is available for on-field interviews at the end of practices (approximately 6:00 p.m. ET), Tuesday through Thursday. HEAD COACH MARIO CRISTOBAL (Miami, Fla., 1993) begins his third season as head football coach at FIU with a 6-18 career record...Prior to his appointment at FIU, Cristobal spent three seasons as tight ends/offensive line coach at the University of Miami (Fla.) where the Hurricanes compiled a 24-12 record and appeared in the 2004 and '05 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and the 2006 Micron PC Bowl...Cristobal spent the prior three years as an assistant at Rutgers, helping turn the Scarlet Knights into one of the top programs in the BCS...He was a four-year letterwinner and member of the UM football team from 1988-92, earning All-Big East honors as an offensive tackle in 1992...Cristobal signed with the Denver Broncos as an undrafted rookie in 1994 and played for the Amsterdam Admirals in NFL Europe in 1995 and '06 before beginning his coaching career...Cristobal is the third-youngest head coach at the Football Bowl Subdivision level. Only Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald (34) and Western Kentucky University's David Elson (38) are younger than Cristobal who turns 39 on September 24.

Here is a quick look at the FIU assistant coaches:

- Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks - **Bill Legg** (2nd season): coached five seasons at Purdue and was co-offensive coordinator for the last two...Last year, the Boilermakers led the Big Ten in total offense (435.92 yards per game) and scoring offense (34.31 points per game)...A four-year starting center at West Virginia University from 1981-84, and was head coach Don Nehlen's first recruit with the Mountaineers...Legg was drafted by the Birmingham Stallions of the United States Football League and subsequently had a brief stint with the Washington Redskins in 1985.
- Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers - **Phil Galiano** (3rd season): A four-year member of the Rutgers staff working with the defensive ends for two seasons, coaching the linebackers in 2004 and working with the defensive line in 2003.
- Special Teams Coordinator - **Apollo Wright** (3rd season): Helped FIU to finish third among Sun Belt Conference teams in kick-off returns, punt returns and punting...Spent six seasons at Villanova as the running backs coach and special teams coordinator and helped with the development of Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro Brian Westbrook.
- Recruiting Coordinator/Running Backs - **Mike Cassano** (3rd season): Sent three years at the University of Miami as a volunteer coach and offensive graduate assistant, coaching in the 2004 and '05 Peach Bowls and 2006 Micron PC Bowl with the Hurricanes.
- Defensive Line - **Cary Godette** (1st season): First started coaching in 1977 as a defensive line coach at his alma mater East Carolina and since then, has joined the staffs of such well-known college programs as Cincinnati, Georgia Tech, North Carolina State and Rutgers as well as a trio of NFL teams.
- Offensive Line - **Greg Laffere** (3rd season): Spent two season at FCS power Illinois State where his offensive line paved the way for Redbird All-American running back Pierre Rembert in 2006 set the ISU record for rushing in a season with 1,743 yards and 16 rushing touchdowns.
- Tight Ends - **Alex Mirabel** (3rd season): Coached on the South Florida high school scene for 13 years prior to joining the FIU staff...Helped Miami Christopher Columbus High School to three district championships in four years as the Explorers offensive line coach and run game coordinator.
- Wide Receivers - **Frank Ponce** (3rd season): Another local career high school head coach, and FIU alumnus, who was a five-time assistant coach in the Miami-Dade/Broward All-Star Game and an assistant on the USA Team of the 2007 NFL Junior Global Football Tournament.
- Defensive Backs - **Jeff Popovich** (3rd season): A two-year defensive graduate assistant at the University of Miami, working primarily with the secondary and assisting with special teams...letter four years after walking on at UM.

HOMEGROWN TALENT: Of the 111 players listed on the most updated FIU football roster, 82 (74-percent) come from the home state of Florida.

R. KIRK LANDON FIELDHOUSE ADDED TO FIU STADIUM

A new era for FIU Football began on September 20, 2008 when the Golden Panthers hosted the then-No. 12-ranked University of South Florida Bulls in the brand-new FIU Stadium on the Modesto A. Maidique Campus.

"This stadium is the crown jewel of FIU Athletics," said Director Garcia. "It will be the vehicle that takes our athletic department to the next level."

The stadium's first phase includes a capacity of 18,000 and features 1,440 club seats, a 6,500 square foot Stadium Club, an upper concourse and 19 premium suites. Seating includes both chair back and bench seating with backrests for fan convenience. Additional future phases of construction will include a student support complex and seating expansion to approximately 45,000.

Adjacent to the stadium in the west end zone is the R. Kirk Landon Fieldhouse, the new headquarters for FIU Football. Named in honor of the FIU Trustee for his financial generosity towards the program, the 50,000 square foot, two-story facility opened in time for 2009 fall training camp.

The highlight of the fieldhouse is a 14,000 square foot, clear-span weight room that will be used by all FIU student-athletes for strength and conditioning.

The first floor also houses an equipment room, full-service athletic training facility, ticket office, merchandise area and 8,500-square-feet of locker rooms for student-athletes and coaches. The reception area will include an Athletics Hall of Fame.

The fieldhouse's second floor includes coaches' offices, a theater-style team meeting room and six breakout rooms overlooking the field. These rooms also open to an outdoor deck that will be used for recruiting and game-day suites.

"This is just the latest example of Mr. Landon's contributions to FIU and its athletic programs," Garcia said. "His leadership and financial support have helped us take FIU to Division I status and build a successful athletics program. We thank him for helping make the fieldhouse a reality."



Nearly two-thirds of the stadium project was funded from existing revenue sources like athletic fees, game guarantees, donations and existing vendor contributions. In addition, ticket sales will be applied toward financing improvements.

The new stadium complex also opens the door to other sources of revenue like corporate sponsorship packages and naming rights, along with concerts, non-intercollegiate sporting events and other community activities that will take place in the stadium.

"This is a win-win: business-wise and student-experience wise," said FIU Board of Trustee member Albert Dotson, who is also the chair of the board's athletics committee. "The stadium is an important step that speaks directly to university objectives such as creating affinity, developing the FIU brand and adding to the student experience. This will be a venue that will bring alumni back and help build FIU traditions."

Future phases for the stadium include an adjacent 100,000 square foot student center that will house undergraduate advising, admissions, financial aid and an alumni welcome center. Most of these services have been located on campus in the Charles Perry Building.

This complex will achieve several objectives that will help enhance the student experience at FIU. For example, the administrative portion of the complex will assist in spreading traffic and pedestrian patterns more evenly around campus.

- Frank Goodin moved into sixth place on the ULM career rushing list with 1,677 after rushing for 71 yards on 18 carries. His 14-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter was his fifth of the season to tie his career high.
- Defensively, the Warhawks are led by Aaron Morgan, who has recorded seven tackles for loss and five sacks. Cardia Jackson leads the team in tackles with 26.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (AP) -Greg McElroy completed a school-record 14 straight passes, freshman Trent Richardson rushed for a pair of second-half touchdowns and No. 4 Alabama pulled away for a 40-14 victory over FIU Saturday night.

T.Y. Hilton did what he does best, taking a first quarter kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown, giving FIU its first score. It marked the second-straight year that Hilton took his first kick return of the season back for a score. In the second quarter, Paul McCall found Greg Ellingson for a nine-yard touchdown, giving FIU a 14-13 lead.

McCall finished 16-32 for 189 yards and one touchdown. Ellingson led all receivers with five catches, racking up 92 yards in the process. Hilton caught four balls for 40 yards.

Defensively, Scott Bryant led the way for FIU (0-1) with nine tackles, while Anthony Gaitor added seven solo stops.

The Crimson Tide (2-0) couldn't shake the 33-point underdog Panthers (0-1) until Richardson scored from 9 and 35 yards in the final 19 minutes. Terry Grant added a 42-yard TD run.

The Panthers made it interesting late, as Paul McCall found T.Y. Hilton for an eight yard touchdown and a 14 yard touchdown, followed by a two-point conversion with 37 seconds left in the game. However, FIU couldn't recover the ensuing onside kick as Rutgers held on for a 23-15 victory, Saturday night at Rutgers Stadium.

Paul McCall finished the game 24-37 for 197 yards and two touchdowns to go along with two interceptions. T.Y. Hilton set a new career-best mark with nine receptions. He finished with 80 yards and two scores.

FIU's defense was stout for most of the game, holding Rutgers to just 13 points in the first half. However, a fourth quarter 38-yard interception return for touchdown by Rutgers' Ryan D'Impeiro proved to be the difference in the game.

Defensively for FIU, Scott Bryant led the way with 12 tackles. Thatcher Starling recorded a sack and a half while Winston Fraser also recorded his first-career sack and Toronto Smith also added a sack.

"Obviously, it was a hard fought game and we got it going too late.," said FIU Head Coach Mario Cristobal. "You have to credit Rutgers for that as they did a good job stopping us early defensively. We would like to have another quarter to play to play football.

"That's a tough locker room scene and it should be. You don't go on the road and play that well defensively early on and not produce as much as you can offensively. You want to lose as a football team and the bottom line is you have to score one more point than the other team does and we didn't."

MIAMI (AP) -Aaron Opelt threw for 343 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for another as Toledo defeated Florida International 41-31 on Saturday night.

FIU defeated the Rockets 35-16 on the road last year. But this time around, the visiting Rockets' 566 yards of total offense in the game - 223 of those rushing - led to five Toledo touchdowns.

Opelt, who was 18-for-32 with one interception, had a part in three of those.

The quarterback helped the Rockets (2-2) take a 7-0 lead on the opening drive when he scored on a 2-yard run with 11:05 left in the first quarter. He threw a 37-yard touchdown to Eric Page to put the Rockets ahead 38-17 with 8:50 left in the game.

Opelt and Page also hooked up in the third quarter on a 41-yard passing score.

Paul McCall was 19-for-42 with 224 yards and a score for FIU (0-3). T.Y. Hilton tied a career-high with nine receptions for 126 yards and one score.

FIU closed to within 24-17 on a McCall 1-yard run with 2:26 remaining in the third quarter, but Toledo scored two unanswered touchdowns in its first two possessions of the fourth quarter to put the game away.

FIU returns to action next week as they travel to Monroe, La. for a meeting with the ULM Warhawks.
