THE SERIES

■ Saturday's football game between Middle Tennessee and Louisiana-Monroe will be the 10th meeting on the gridiron between the two schools. The series, which began in 1999, is led by MT, 7-2. ULM opened the series with a 10-0 win over the Blue Raiders in 1999 then it was all Middle Tennessee as the Blue Raiders won four straight, including a shutout in 2000. The Warhawks got back into the win column in 2005 with a 34-31 win over MT in Murfreesboro before the Blue Raiders bounced back with a 35-21 decision in Monroe in 2006. MT won in dramatic fashion in 2007 as Bradley Robinson returned a kickoff 89 yards with :45 left to provide the winning margin. It was Robinson's first career kickoff return. The Blue Raiders won last year in Murfreesboro, 24-21, for their third straight win in the series. MT is 3-1 in Monroe and has won three straight.

BLUE RAIDERS OWN MOST LEAGUE WINS IN SBC HISTORY

■ Middle Tennessee has an overall mark of 37-25 in Sun Belt action all-time, including a 23-9 mark at home and a 14-16 record on the road. Middle Tennessee is 19-9 in league games under Rick Stockstill and 8-6 on the road. The 37 league wins rank as the most victories in Sun Belt history with Troy second with 33 followed by North Texas with 31 and UL with 30 and ASU 28.

MT-ULM NOTES

- The team to score first has won every game in the series.
- Middle Tennessee has outscored the Warhawks in the third quarter by a combined score of 63-28 in the series.
- Series Turnover Story: ULM 16, MT 13
- Middle Tennessee has 23 sacks in the series compared to 13 by ULM. MT has 10 sacks the last three meetings.
- Three of the last four meetings have been decided by exactly three points.
- Middle Tennessee has averaged 256.1 yards through the air against ULM in the series while the Warhawks have passed for an average of 210.8 yards.
- Middle Tennessee's first Sun Belt Conference game was against ULM in 2001. MT won the game, 38-20.

REGULAR SEASON FINALES

■ The Blue Raiders have a mark of 45-40-6 in regular season finales and have won just 19 of their last 30. Under Head Coach Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders are 0-3 in the final regular season game. Overall, Middle Tennessee has lost five straight season finales with the last win coming at Arkansas State in 2003.

THE SEASON TO DATE

■ Middle Tennessee enters the 2009 regular season finale with an 8-3 overall record, a 6-1 conference mark and riding a five-game winning streak. The eight wins are the most since MT went 8-3 in 2001 and the six Sun Belt Conference wins equals the most in school history. The last time MT won nine regular season games was 1992 when the Blue Raiders finished 10-3. As for the winning streak, the five straight victories are the most under Rick Stockstill and the most by the Blue Raiders since 2001 when that team opened the year with a 5-0 mark. The last time MT won six consecutive games in the same season was 1990 when that squad won six straight (MT did win 8 in a row from end of 2000 to beginning of 2001).

RUSHING GAME HAS ARRIVED

■ Thanks to a resurgence the past five games, Middle Tennessee's rushing game is performing at its best since the 2002 campaign. The Blue Raiders are churning up 180.5 yards a game which is their best average since finishing the 2002 season with 208.7 yards a game on the ground. Over the last five games, Middle Tennessee has accounted for 1,304 yards on the ground which is more than they had all of last season (1,283 yards). The recent five-game upswing has moved the Blue Raiders from 99th nationally in rushing to 36th this week. The Blue Raiders rushed for over 200 yards in four straight games against WKU, FIU, FAU, and UL for the first time since joining the FBS ranks in 1999.

OFFENSE SHINING

■ The addition of offensive coordinator Tony Franklin has definitely made an impact on the Blue Raiders as the 2009 offense is having its best year since 2001. Franklin's first Blue Raider unit has amassed 4,726 yards of offense to rank 25th nationally (4th most at MT) for an average of 429.6 yards a game which are the highest totals since the 2001 team totaled a school record 5,295 yards and a per game average of 481.4 yards. The 2009 offense is also scoring at a 30.5 per game clip to rank 34th nationally and it's the highest scoring average since the 2001 squad set a school mark with 37.1 points per contest. Only eight teams in school history have averaged more than 30 points per game. Following is a breakdown of how the Blue Raider offense has performed in wins, losses, at home and on the road:

BLOCK RAIDERS

■ Middle Tennessee added to its FBS record in blocked kicks this season when Brandon Perry rejected a field goal against Arkansas State last week. The Blue Raiders have now blocked eight kicks this season to better the previous best in the I-A era of five set in 2002 and six of this year's blocks have come over the past four games. The Blue Raiders have blocked five field goals and three punts this season and the five blocked field goals are the most in the FBS era. Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have now blocked 14 kicks (6 punts, 7 FGs, 1 PAT) and the Blue Raiders have 34 total blocks in the FBS era (14 FGs, 12 punts, 8 PATs).

SACK, TFL RECORD IN REACH

■ Middle Tennessee prides itself on an attacking and blitzing type of defense and it's within reach of having the best year in school history. The Blue Raiders are closing in on the single-season school record for both quarterback sacks and tackles for loss. MT enters the ULM game with 34.0 sacks and 94 tackles for loss. MT enters the ULM game with 34.0 sacks and 94 tackles for loss and both figures rank second all-time at Middle Tennessee. The school record in sacks is 36.0 set by the 2006 team while the TFL record is 105 also established by the 2006 squad.

"D" BEST IN THE BELT

■ Middle Tennessee's defense enters the final regular season game ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference in total defense giving up 349.9 yards a game. The unit also leads the league in pass defense, pass defense efficiency, sacks, TFLs, third and fourth down conversions, and turnovers gained. The Blue Raider defense is also second in scoring defense, red zone defense, and interceptions. Nationally, the MT defense ranks 2nd in tackles for loss, 7th in sacks, 9th in turnovers gained, 20th in interceptions, and 25th in pass defense efficiency.

DEFENSE STRONG IN WIN STREAK

■ During Middle Tennessee's current five-game winning streak, the defense has allowed just 313.0 yards per game and allowed only 19.2 points per contest. The unit has also forced 14 turnovers, collected 22 sacks, 49 tackles for loss, 8 interceptions and six blocked kicks.

KYLES IN A GROOVE

■ Sophomore running back D.D. Kyles has turned it up a notch the past five games en route to a career year for the Blue Raiders. Kyles, who had three straight 100-yard rushing games recently, has 570 yards on 76 carries for a 7.5 yard per attempt average the past five games. Kyles turned in a career-best 177-yard effort against Louisiana-Lafayette and prior to that he put up 140 yards against FIU and 110 at FAU. For the season, Kyles has rushed for 755 yards and three touchdowns.

Floyd Stadium has undergone numerous renovations to make it one of the top facilities in the Sun Belt Conference and the region. New synthetic turf was installed during the summer of 2006 and the most recent addition was a state-of-the-art video board that was erected in 2007 to go along with new outdoor suites in the north endzone.

The Blue Raiders own an overall record of 262-103-13 at Floyd stadium and have won 22 of their last 29 in the facility.

DASHER HAVING CAREER YEAR

Quarterback Dwight Dasher, who earlier this year became the first Blue Raider to pass for 2,000 yards and rush for 500 yards in the same season, is having one of the best years of any signal-caller in school history. Dasher, a threat with his arm and feet, has set single-season marks in total offense, total plays, and rushing yards by a quarterback and is on the verge of a few more. The Folkston, Ga., native enters the ULM game ranked fifth nationally in total offense and has accounted for 71 percent of the team's total yards this season. Following is a list where Dasher ranks in various single-season categories:

DASHER TRYING TO JOIN ELITE GROUP

Only six times in the history of college football has a player gained 2,000 yards passing and 1,000 yards rushing in a single-season and Middle Tennessee's Dwight Dasher is trying to join this elite club. Dasher enters the ULM game with 2,511 passing yards and 865 rushing yards. In 2001, Clemson's Woody Dantzler was the first player to accomplish the feat (2,360 passing, 1,004 rushing), then Missouri's Brad Smith did it in 2002 and again in 2005. Texas' Vince Young added his name to the list in 2005 and Central Michigan's Dan LeFevour did it in 2007. Nevada's Colin Kaepernick joined the club in 2008. (note: UAB's Joe Webb and Nevada's Kaepernick are also on the verge of this record this season)

DASHER TOPS 1,000, CHASING COLLIER

Dwight Dasher became the first quarterback at Middle Tennessee to top the career 1,000-yard rushing mark since Marvin Collier in 1988 when he tallied 53 yards on the ground at Troy. Dasher, who is the third leading rusher among quarterbacks nationally and ranks fourth overall in the SBC, now has 1,588 career rushing yards. Collier (1985-88) owns the most rushing yards by a quarterback in school history with 1,652 yards and also owns the most 100-yard games by a signal-caller with four. Dasher has three 100-yard games.

DASHER GOES WILD

Dwight Dasher turned in one of the top performances in Blue Raider history in the win over WKU when he rang up 421 total yards of offense, including a career-best 355 passing yards. The 421 yards went down as the fifth-best single-

QUICK STRIKE RAIDERS

■ Middle Tennessee enters this week's game second nationally behind Houston in scoring touchdowns and field goals within two minutes. Houston owns 33 scores (27 TDs, 6 FGs) while Middle Tennessee has 31 (21 TDs, 10 FGs) within two minutes. Tulsa is third with 27 followed by Troy with 26 and Arkansas with 25. The Blue Raiders are tied for seventh nationally in touchdown scoring drives of two minutes or less with 21.

TWO TOP 100 MARK ... AGAIN

■ For the first time in the FBS era, Middle Tennessee put two players over the 100-yard rushing mark in consecutive games. Both Dwight Dasher and D.D. Kyles topped the 100-yard rushing mark in back-to-back games against FAU and FIU. Kyles had 140 yards at FAU then came back with 110 yards on the ground in the win over FIU. Dasher registered 108 yards at FAU and followed that with 178 yards against FIU. Prior to these two outings, the only other time the Blue Raiders had two players go over 100 yards rushing in a game occurred in 2002 (Dwone Hicks and ReShard Lee).

UDELL ON A ROLL; TIED FOR 3RD NATIONALLY

■ Senior Marcus Udell, a backup cornerback, might be the hottest defensive back in the country. Udell has turned in six interceptions over the past five games to give him a team and conference leading seven for the season. The Tallahassee, Fla., native is tied for third nationally in interceptions and his seven picks are the second most in school history for a single-season and ties for the third most in SBC history. Middle Tennessee's single-season record is eight picks by James Griffin in 1982. In his last four games, Udell has five picks and a blocked FG.

THE YEAR OF THE WALK-ON

■ Middle Tennessee has played 10 walk-ons this season and three have scored touchdowns for a total of five on the year. Add Sherman Neal as the latest non-scholarship player to come up with a big play. Neal, who plays primarily on the punt block team, picked up a blocked kick by SaCoby Carter against FAU and took it 29 yards for his first career touchdown and first career touch of the pigskin. Other walk-ons to reach paydirt this season are Harold Turner and Shane Blissard. Turner owns three scores on a total of 14 receptions while Blissard has one touchdown and 14 total catches.

CARMICHAEL OWNS CAREER RECORD

■ Senior linebacker Danny Carmichael was credited with two forced fumbles in the win over FIU to give him six on the season and nine for his career. Carmichael, who is second nationally in forced fumbles, is now the Blue Raiders' single-season and career leader in that category. He broke the single-season mark of four set by Sean Mosley in 2006 and surpassed Mike Caldwell's career mark of seven established from 1989-92. Among active players nationally, Carmichael's nine career forced fumbles is tied for the second most.

SUN BELT VS BIG SIX

■ Since the Sun Belt Conference added football in 2001, the league has picked up 12 wins against teams from the Big Six conferences. The league has had at least one win against the Big Six in every year except 2006 and had two wins in 2008 (MT over Maryland, ASU over Texas A&M) and 2009. Middle Tennessee owns five of those wins to lead the league.

KELLEM GOES BACK-TO-BACK

■ Junior Jeremy Kellem recorded blocked kicks in back-to-back games against FAU and FIU for the first time in his career. Kellem now has four career blocked kicks and all four have been punts. The four blocked punts ties Markee Tate for the most blocked punts in school history while the four blocked kicks is also tied for the most at MT with Tate and Kareem Bland (1 FG, 3 PATs).

HONEYCUTT OVER 100; 4TH ON ALL-TIME LIST

■ Senior Patrick Honeycutt, who went over the 100-catch mark in the win over WKU, is just the 10th player in school history to reach triple figures in receptions. Honeycutt is currently fourth on the all-time career list at MT with 111 catches. Honeycutt, who leads the Blue Raiders with 32 receptions this year, likely will not catch third place Kerry Wright. Wright owns 167 career catches.

CARMICHAEL TOPS 200, EYEING TOP 10

■ Danny Carmichael, who has started 32 games at linebacker, had eight tackles at Troy to become the first Blue Raider to top the 200-tackle mark since LB Keith Pauldo had 205 in his career (1997-00). Carmichael enters the ULM game with 247 career stops and needs 23 more to tie for ninth on the all-time tackles list. The Woodstock, Ga., native also owns 31.0 career TFLs which is fifth on the all-time list, and his 11.0 sacks is tied for 5th all-time and one more will move him into a tie for fourth.

GENDREAU OWNS SHARE OF FIELD GOAL RECORD

■ Sophomore PK Alan Gendreau, who is tied for 13th nationally in field goals made per game, grabbed a share of the single-season record for three-pointers with his 17th in the win over ASU last week. Gendreau, who earlier this year set a school mark by hitting 12 straight three-pointers, has made 17 of 19 field goals to tie Matt Crews' record of 17 set in 1990. Overall, Gendreau has hit 25 of his last 28 field goals dating back to last season and has 152 career points to rank seventh on the all-time points scored by a kicker list. Gendreau needs 25 more points to surpass Joe Lisle for sixth.

GENDREAU IS CLUTCH AND ACCURATE

■ Sophomore place-kicker Alan Gendreau, a finalist for the 2009 Lou Groza Award, must have ice in his veins because he has proven to be quite a cool customer during key moments for the Blue Raiders. Last year, he provided the dramatic game-winning point following a "Hail Mary" against FAU with no time remaining then earlier this year he nailed a 19-yard field goal with no time left to give the Blue Raiders an upset of Maryland on the road. The Apopka, Fla., product has connected on 27 of 33 career field goals and has made 71 of 72 extra points, and needs three more made three-pointers to tie Colby Smith for sixth on the all-time list at MT. Gendreau's field goal made percentage of 81.8 is currently the best mark in school history over Brian Kelly's 78.4 percent (40 of 51).

GENDREAU SETS SCORING RECORD

■ Alan Gendreau broke the single-season scoring record for kickers at Middle Tennessee when he registered eight

SMALL SENIOR CLASS ... AGAIN

■ Last year, Middle Tennessee joined Alabama as having the fewest number of scholarship seniors in the country with nine and the Blue Raiders are in the same conversation in 2009. The Blue Raiders are tied for ninth nationally with just 13 seniors (6 offense, 6 defense, 1 special teams) and have the fewest in the SBC.

LONG SCORING DRIVES

■ Middle Tennessee's 12 play, 98-yard scoring drive against North Texas went down as the second longest under Rick Stockstill. Since Stockstill took the reins in 2006, the Blue Raiders have put together six scoring drives of 90 or more yards with two coming in 2007, one in 2008, and now three this year. In 2007, the Blue Raiders had a 99-yard scoring drive at ULM and then a 91 yarder in the same game before putting together a 91-yard drive at Louisville. The 96 yarder against Memphis earlier this year went down as the longest under Stockstill at home and third longest overall.

MCCOY LEADS SBC, 7TH NATIONALLY

■ Senior Chris McCoy, who is enjoying a career year for the Blue Raiders, moved into third place on the single-season tackles for loss list at Middle Tennessee when he recorded 2.0 TFLs against ASU. McCoy ran his season total to 17.5 which currently leads the SBC and ranks 7th nationally. For the year, McCoy has a personal-best 54 tackles, 17.5 TFLs, 6.0 sacks, three hurries, and three pass breakups.

GEE CLIMBS UP ALL-PURPOSE YARDS LIST

■ Senior Desmond Gee, a two-time all-conference performer, has been the ultimate all-purpose player during his career at Middle Tennessee and it shows in his statistics. The Greenville, Fla., product has seen time as a running

back, wide receiver, punt returner, and kickoff returner on his way to 4,054 career all-purpose yards to rank 3rd all-time at MT. Gee, who registered 127 all-purpose yards at Clemson, 123 at FAU, 119 against WKU, 109 at Maryland, and 106 at Troy, needs 254 more all-purpose yards to surpass Dwone Hicks for 2nd place all-time. The all-time leader at Middle Tennessee is Joe Campbell who had 4,551 yards from 1988 to 1991.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

■ Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have excelled in the always important turnover margin department. In 47 games of the Stockstill era, MT is +31 in turnover margin. The Blue Raiders ranked 12th nationally in 2007 with a +11 margin while recording a +7 margin in 2006. The Blue Raiders were +3 last year to rank 43rd nationally. Over the last 28 games combined, the Blue Raiders are +26 in turnover margin. MT is +10 after 11 games in 2009 to rank 12th nationally.

DASHER TOPS 3,000

■ Junior Dwight Dasher is in elite company at Middle Tennessee being one of just 14 players all-time to reach the 3,000-yard passing plateau and in reach of being just the eighth 4,000-yard passer. Dasher enters the ULM game with 3,815 career passing yards to rank 8th all-time and needs just 197 more yards to overtake Joe Craddock for 7th place.

GEE IS ALL-TIME LEADER

■ Middle Tennessee senior Desmond Gee is the all-time leader for the Blue Raiders in kickoff returns and kickoff return yards. The Greenville, Fla., product now owns 102 career returns for a total of 2,093 yards. Gee's 102 returns currently ranks seventh all-time among active players nationally while his 2,093 yards is 11th on that list.

KELLEM HAS A NOSE FOR THE BALL

■ Junior safety Jeremy Kellem has a knack for always being around the football. In 2009, Kellem has two interceptions, a fumble recovery, two forced fumbles, and two blocked punts. For his career, Kellem has been responsible for 22 turnovers in 35 games played (seven interceptions, four fumble recoveries, seven forced fumbles, and four blocked punts).

THE FLORIDA SECONDARY

■ One of the most experienced and strongest areas on the 2009 Blue Raiders is in the secondary where all four starters hail from the state of Florida. Alex Suber (Tampa), Kevin Brown (Tampa), Rod Issac (Miami), and Jeremy Kellem (North Lauderdale) own a combined 105 starts with Suber (33) and Kellem (28) accounting for 61. The group,

which has started together for 16 straight games, owns 17 total interceptions and 44 pass breakups.

HERE'S TO YOU MR. ROBINSON

■ Senior Cam Robinson is truly making the most of his first and last opportunity as a Blue Raider. The Bridgeport, Ala., native entered the 2009 season having never started a game and all he has done is lead MT in tackles with 94 while adding 11.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks. The 94 stops are the most by a Blue Raider since Will Martin had 100 in 2003. With six more tackles, Robinson can become just the third triple figure tackler in MT's FBS era.

100 YARDS IS THE KEY

■ Being able to run the football is paramount, especially at Middle Tennessee. During its history, Middle Tennessee owns an impressive 132-48-1 (.732) record when a back gains 100 or more yards rushing. Under Rick Stockstill, a Blue Raider has reached the 100-yard mark eight times and the team has a 7-1 mark in those games.

GIVE ME 30

■ Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders are virtually a lock for victory if they put up 30 points or more. MT is 17-1 under Stockstill when scoring 30 points, including a perfect 7-0 this season. The lone loss came at Louisville in 2007 when the Blue Raiders fell, 58-52.

THE "DASHER DRIVE"

■ Even though he would prefer it be called "the Blue Raider Drive", there's no doubt who was in command of Middle Tennessee's stunning game-winning drive on the road against Maryland. Needing a field goal to win, quarterback Dwight Dasher took the Blue Raiders 73 yards in eight plays with no timeouts to set up Alan Gendreau's game-clinching three-pointer. Dasher was a perfect 4-for-4 through the air for 65 yards, including a beautiful 35-yard strike to Chris McClover along the left sideline to key the come-from-behind win.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS UNDER STOCKSTILL

■ Since his arrival, Rick Stockstill has put a huge emphasis on academics and it is clearly showing. In what is regarded as one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football, Stockstill has taken the Blue Raiders' APR (Academic Progress Rate) from 892 to 990 in just three years. That ranks as the biggest jump of any school in the country. The Blue Raiders have also brought home the SBC Team Academic Award two years under Stockstill (2006-07, 2007-08). Also, Nick Coleman, David DeFatta, Gene Delle Donne, Alex Suber, and Mark Thompson will

be playing the 2009 season with a degree.

GOING OVERTIME

■ Middle Tennessee enters the ULM game having competed in four overtime games as a member of I-A (FBS) and is 2-2 in those contests. The Blue Raiders had one overtime contest in 2000 and played three in 2003. In 2003, the Blue Raiders lost in one overtime at No. 23 Missouri, then bounced back to take an overtime win at Idaho before losing a four overtime game at home against UL-Lafayette. The four overtime loss to ULL was the longest game in the history of MT football and was the longest in the history of the SBC at the time.

BLUE RAIDERS SET ATTENDANCE RECORD

■ Middle Tennessee drew 28,105 in its home opener against Memphis to set a new Floyd Stadium record. The Blue Raiders broke the previous record of 27,568 set on Sept. 5, 1998 against Tennessee State. Under Rick Stockstill, six of the top 10 single-game attendance marks have been established with all six coming since 2007.

RAIDER ROUNDUP

■ Defensive end Jamari Lattimore recorded his first career interception in the second quarter against Louisiana and returned it 20 yards for a touchdown. It was Lattimore's first career score and the third score by the defense this season. The last time Middle Tennessee returned an interception for a touchdown was last year at Louisville when Jeremy Kellem picked one off and went 14 yards for the score. It was also the seventh touchdown by the defense under Rick Stockstill.

■ The Blue Raiders donned a black ribbon on the back of their helmets against Mississippi State in honor of Emmett Kennon who passed away at the age of 94 on Oct. 16 (1915-2009). Kennon is a MT graduate and former student-athlete for the Blue Raiders and the Hall of Fame building bears his name. The team will wear the ribbon the rest of the season.

■ Senior Mark Thompson has played in 48 career games to break Trevor Jenkins' record of 47 for the most in the FBS era.

■ Middle Tennessee's starting offensive line enters the ULM game with a combined 119 starts.

■ Middle Tennessee failed to score a touchdown against MSU which is the first time it has been kept out of the end zone since being blanked by LSU in 2007 - a span of 27 games.

■ Patrick Honeycutt's 47-yard punt return against FIU went down as the longest of his career and the longest by the Blue Raiders since Kerry Wright went 75 yards for a touchdown against Akron in 2004.

■ Middle Tennessee's two-point conversion by Dwight Dasher against FIU in 2008 was the first under

Rick Stockstill and the first by the Blue Raiders since Kerry Wright hauled in a pass from Andrico Hines at Idaho in 2003.

■ The top scoring quarter in the Rick Stockstill era is the fourth quarter. Here is a combined total for each quarter: 1st - 311 points; 2nd - 373 points; 3rd - 219 points; 4th - 311 points.

■ When both teams are held under 20 points, the Blue Raiders are 2-0 under Rick Stockstill.

■ Desmond Gee has 16 career touchdowns and five of them have been 42 yards or longer.

■ The Blue Raiders' safety against FIU in 2007 was the first in the FBS era for MT.

■ Head Coach Rick Stockstill directed two shutouts in 2006 to become the first rookie coach at MT to accomplish that feat since Charles Murphy in 1947.

■ As a FBS (I-A) member (127 games), the Blue Raiders have scored 50 or more points 11 times.

■ The Blue Raiders are 46-8 in the I-A era when leading at the half and are 50-8 when leading a game entering the 4th quarter during that time.

■ When trailing at the half, the Blue Raiders are just 11-56 in the FBS (I-A) era.

■ The Blue Raiders have scored in 153 of their last 157 games and broke a string of scoring in 69 straight when they were shutout at Oklahoma in 2006. The other three miscues were a 10-0 shutout on the road against UL-Monroe in 1999, a 55-0 loss in 2000 at Florida, and a 44-0 setback at LSU in 2007. MT has scored in 71 straight home games and in 32 overall.

■ In the FBS (I-A) era, the Blue Raiders are 26-17 on turf, 12-35 on natural grass (14 of the losses came on road to SEC teams) and 21-16 on synthetic surfaces.

■ Largest Margin of Victory in the I-A era: 56 points vs UConn 11/4/00 (66-10) ... Largest Margin of Defeat in the I-A era: 59 points vs Oklahoma 9/23/06 (59-0) ... Largest Margin of Victory in an SBC game: 48 vs ASU in 2001.

Clemson 37, Middle Tennessee 14

Sept. 5, 2009 □ Death Valley □ Clemson, SC

CLEMSON, S.C. - On the opening night of the season, MTSU's special teams weren't particularly special.

The Blue Raiders surrendered first-half kickoff and punt returns for touchdowns and never recovered, falling 37-14 to Clemson at Memorial Stadium.

Heisman trophy candidate C.J. Spiller lived up to the hype and needed just 14 seconds to make his mark on the game. Clemson's senior tailback took the opening kickoff and raced 96 yards around the right side for an early 7-0 Tiger lead.

Not to be outdone, teammate Jacoby Ford got into the act in the second quarter, taking a David DeFatta punt down the left sideline for a 61-yard touchdown.

"Obviously, I thought in the first half, we shot ourselves in the foot several times," said MTSU coach Rick Stockstill, who spent 14 years as an assistant coach at Clemson. "We got killed in the kicking game in the first half.

"Our plan was to kick it out of bounds on punts and sky kick it on kickoffs, and we didn't do a very good job on that, but they are explosive."

The MTSU offense, in new coordinator Tony Franklin's debut, fired out of the gate on its first two plays, but fizzled the rest of the first half. A 28-yard pass to Phillip Tanner on the Blue Raiders' first play from scrimmage and a 12-yard pass to Shane Blissard on the next netted 40 total yards, but MTSU netted just 22 yards the rest of the half.

Junior quarterback Dwight Dasher completed 20-of-42 passes for 204 yards for the game — including 4-of-4 for 73 yards and a touchdown to Chris McClover on MTSU's first drive of the second half — but was also victimized by three interceptions, including one on the Blue Raiders' third play from scrimmage on a screen pass that was picked off by Clemson's DeAndre McDaniel.

Dasher also ran 19 times for 61 yards, but the Blue Raider running attack was limited to just 92 yards on 37 carries.

"I thought Dwight played well," said Stockstill. "I know if you look at his stats, there's three interceptions, but I thought he played well. I thought he ran the ball well and showed a lot of leadership and toughness and hung in there against a pretty fierce pass rush and pretty good defense."

Sophomore receiver Shane Blissard led MTSU in receiving, finishing with four catches for 68 yards. In all, 10 players caught passes for the Blue Raiders, but other than Blissard, none had more than 28 yards receiving.

For Clemson, redshirt freshman quarterback Kyle Parker made the most of his first career start, throwing

for 159 yards and a pair of touchdowns while not committing a turnover.

While Spiller was limited to just 12 yards rushing on four carries and did not return in the second half, sophomore Jamie Harper and freshman Andre Ellington carried the load, combining to rush for 147 yards on 24 carries as Clemson finished with 361 yards of total offense.

"The goal was to win tonight," said Clemson coach Dabo Swinney, in his first game as head coach for the Tigers after coaching the last seven games of 2008 as the interim coach. "We achieved that win.

"Our kids had a solid game. Our defense was solid tonight until the end of the game and special teams showed up as well."

The MTSU defense wasn't as fortunate. Backed into its own end for the entire first quarter, the Blue Raider defense held time and time again, giving up just 43 yards and one Richard Jackson field goal. Down 10-0 early in the second quarter, it was the MTSU defense which got the Blue Raiders on the board first when Chris McCoy picked up a Willy Korn fumble and returned it 68 yards for a touchdown to cut the deficit to 10-7.


It was as close as the Blue Raiders would come.

On Clemson's ensuing possession, the Tigers drove 57 yards in 11 plays, capped by Richard Jackson's 19-yard field goal his second of the night. A three-and-out led to Ford's punt return touchdown, and after MTSU's next drive stalled out at its own 18, Parker needed just one play to find Ford for a 43-yard touchdown pass to push the advantage to 27-7 with 2:55 left in the first half.

"It's frustrating," said senior linebacker Danny Carmichael of the two special teams touchdowns. "If you're not frustrated by giving up points like that, then you shouldn't be playing."

MTSU briefly rallied in the second half, as Dasher's 18-yard touchdown pass to McClover narrowed the Clemson lead to 30-14. The Blue Raiders racked up 237 of offense in the second half, but failed to capitalize on two fourth-quarter trips inside the Clemson 25, turning the ball over on downs each time.

"In the first half, we were awful," said Dasher. "We just made too many mistakes. In the second half, everyone got together and we were a lot better. We know where went wrong and we know what went right. We just have to get better."

Middle Tennessee 31, Memphis 14

Sept. 12, 2009 □ Floyd Stadium □ Murfreesboro, TN

MURFREESBORO, TN - MTSU's Blackout put the lights out for Memphis.

Wearing solid black uniforms and before a black-clad, record crowd of 28,105, MTSU dominated the final three quarters and routed the visiting Tigers 31-14 at Floyd Stadium.

"It was great," said MTSU coach Rick Stockstill, whose team needed a final-play Hail Mary to defeat Florida Atlantic 14-13 in the 2008 Blackout game.

"I've said this all along. Our fans keep getting better. It was loud, it was almost a packed house. It was a great atmosphere and we can make this a great home field advantage with the way we play and how enthusiastic our fans are."

Dwight Dasher passed for 231 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and gained 89 more on the ground as the Blue Raiders defeated Memphis for the second time in three years. He did not commit a turnover.

It was the second straight standout game against Memphis for the junior quarterback, who racked up 410 yards of total offense in a 21-7 win at the Liberty Bowl in 2007.

However, it was Dasher's first home game as the program's undisputed starting quarterback and offensive leader.

"I've felt like this was my team since fall camp," said Dasher, who completed 18-of-26 passes on the night. "So it's my job to just push and push and push everybody to make sure we can be the best we can be and get to a bowl."

The Blue Raiders (1-1) looked every bit the part of a bowl team against Memphis, limiting the Tigers to just 219 yards of offense. MTSU outscored Memphis (0-2) 17-0 in the second and third quarters, turning what had been a 7-7 contest after the first 15 minutes into a blow-out heading into the final period.

"We wanted to keep pressing," said MTSU senior wide receiver Patrick Honeycutt, who finished with five catches for 71 yards, including a 24-yard touchdown to put the Blue Raiders up 24-7 with 2:44 left in the third quarter. "We knew the game was close and they could come back. We just wanted to keep going and keep going and put as many points on the board as we could."

The Blue Raider offense gashed Memphis for 436 total yards, including 164 on the ground. Tailback Phillip Tanner rushed for 47 yard on eight carries, including a four-yard touchdown in the first quarter which gave MTSU a 7-0 lead. However, the senior left the game early in the third quarter with an injury to his right knee. In his stead, backup D.D. Kyles ran for 32 yards on just five carries,

including a seven-yard TD scamper which put MTSU up 31-7 with 14:15 remaining in the game.

MTSU fired out of the gate, forcing a Tiger three-and-out on its first possession.

Malcolm Beyah's 41-yard strike to Garrett Andrews on a double pass set up Tanner's score to cap a nine-play, 96-yard drive to put the Blue Raiders ahead 7-0 just 4:30 into the game.

However, Memphis responded with a drive of its own, going 69 yards in nine plays, as Curtis Steele darted 12 yards to knot the score 7-7.

From there, though, it was all MTSU. Freshman Kenneth Gilstrap forced and recovered a D.A. Griffin fumble on a punt to set up Dasher's 40-yard touchdown strike to Shane Blissard and Alan Gendreau's 28-yard field goal put MTSU up 17-7.

Memphis' best scoring chance before its final drive of the night in mop-up time was late in the second quarter after a Tanner fumble gave the

Tigers the ball at the MTSU 42 with 2:54 left until half-time.

However, Danny Carmichael and Chris McCoy came up with two sacks pushing Memphis out of field goal range and forcing Tiger quarterback Arkelon Hall to try a Hail Mary to end the half. Blue Raider safety Kevin Brown picked off the pass at the goal line to end the threat.

"We're just going to be relentless," said McCoy, who finished with 2.5 tackles-for-loss and a sack. "That's what we do. We keep the pressure up and tonight the defense dominated."

Hall finished the game completing 13-of-22 passes for just 93 yards and the interception. T.J. Pitts led the Tigers in rushing carrying nine times for 40 yards.

Steele, the starter, left the game with an injury in the second quarter and did not return after rushing for 29 yards on five carries and a touchdown.

"It was a great win for us," said Stockstill, whose team won its fifth straight home game. "I thought our team played extremely hard and our coaches did a good job of preparing our team."

"I thought we made improvements in a lot of areas and I was very proud of our team and the effort and the passion and the toughness they played with against Memphis."

COLLEGE PARK, MD - The sequel was even better than the original.

MTSU upset Maryland 32-31 on Alan Gendreau's 19-yard game-winning field goal on the last play at Byrd Stadium, capping a classic that at least rivaled the Blue Raiders' win over Maryland in Murfreesboro a year ago — which was regarded as the program's all-time best win.

"That was a great win," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "I would think this is the biggest win ever for our program on the road. To come into an ACC stadium and beat a good team like Maryland is tremendous for our football team."

MTSU (2-1) covered 73 yards in eight plays in the final 1:30 to set up Gendreau's game-winning kick.

Quarterback Dwight Dasher completed four straight passes for a combined 65 yards on the first four plays, including a 35-yarder to Chris McClover to the Maryland 10-yard line. D.D. Kyles had two runs that took the ball to the 2-yard line as the clock ticked down.

With no timeouts, Dasher rushed the team to the line of scrimmage and spiked the ball to kill the clock with two seconds remaining.

Gendreau, a sophomore, nailed the field goal just inside the left upright to silence a red-clad crowd of 43,167.

"I had a lousy celebration the last time I hit one to win it on the last play," said Gendreau, who made the game-winning extra-point kick against Florida Atlantic last season. "So I wanted to have a better celebration this time. I took off running to the center of the field, and my team rushed the field. That felt really good."

With Maryland (1-2) leading 31-29, Dasher threw an interception with 4:52 remaining.

But the MTSU defense halted the Terps from putting the game away, and Maryland missed a 42-yard field goal to keep the lead at two points.

MTSU followed with its lightning-quick drive.

"I kept telling myself and everybody else, 'We got to get it down there,'" Dasher said. "We got it down there, and that's all it took."

The game was a back-and-forth battle, mostly changing directions on turnovers.

Maryland took a 14-13 halftime lead by converting an MTSU fumble into a touchdown late in the second quarter.

But the Terps committed four turnovers, which MTSU converted into two touchdowns and a field goal.

"When (your offense) capitalizes on turnovers, you can't ask for much more than that," MTSU linebacker Danny Carmichael said. "That's why we won the game."

Despite tossing two interceptions, Dasher was poised

in key moments.

He completed a 36-yard pass to junior college transfer Garrett Andrews down the sideline on second-and-21 early in the fourth quarter. Four plays later, Dasher darted a short pass to Andrews on a fourth-and-1 play, and Andrews broke two tackles en route to a 32-yard touchdown to put MTSU ahead 29-28.

"Being my first year here, I don't even realize how big that was," said Andrews of his first career touchdown. "Maybe late tonight when I'm in the dark, I'll say, 'Wow, did that really happen?'"

Dasher finished 27-of-44 passing for a career-high 324 yards and two touchdowns and added a rushing touchdown.

Senior Chris McClover had seven receptions for 110 yards, both career highs.

MTSU's first two scores were set up by turnovers at the Maryland 29-yard line.

Derrick Crumpton picked off a Maryland pass at the 29, and Dasher converted it into a 3-yard touchdown run early in the second quarter. Gendreau's extra-point kick was blocked.

On the next play from scrimmage, Maryland running back Da'Rel Scott was stripped by Carmichael and Chris McCoy recovered the ball at the 29.

For McCoy, it was one highlight of a monster game. The senior defensive end had nine tackles, four tackles for loss, one sack, a fumble recovery, a blocked field goal and a pass breakup.

Carmichael had a team-high 10 tackles and two forced fumbles. Defensive end Jamari Lattimore recorded three sacks.

McCoy's fumble recovery was converted into Dasher's 7-yard touchdown pass to Sancho McDonald in the second quarter.


"It was a very disappointing loss. I really wanted us to win the football game," Maryland coach Ralph Friedgen said. "Our guys didn't seem that into it. ... The problem was that we turned it over. That's what killed us."

Desmond Gee added a 6-yard touchdown run, and Gendreau hit a 27-yard field goal in the third quarter to keep pace with Maryland.

The win marked MTSU's fourth road victory over a BCS major conference opponent in program history, with the other three coming at Vanderbilt.

Maryland dropped to 40-13 at Byrd Stadium under Friedgen.

"That first win (over Maryland) was great because our fans were so loud," Suber said. "But it was quieter here. Those 40,000 or so fans aren't quite what they say they are."

DENTON, TX - MTSU coach Rick Stockstill smiles over any win, even if his team does not.

The Blue Raiders beat North Texas 37-21 in the Sun Belt Conference opener.

Stockstill said his team was left wanting more. He was satisfied just with a road win to improve to 3-1.

"Our team came into the locker room (after the game) kind of down, but I told them that I'm thrilled to death," Stockstill said. "It's hard to win conference games on the road, whether you're in the SEC or Sun Belt.

"I thought it was a great win. Who's going to complain about 37-21?"

MTSU will face three-time defending Sun Belt champion Troy next on Oct. 6. Though a much improved team from recent seasons, UNT dropped to 1-3 after suffering its 12th straight conference loss.

"We're not here to just get close to people," UNT quarterback Riley Dodge said. "We are here to help turn this program around. I'm getting sick talking about moral victories."

MTSU did not commit a turnover and force UNT into five turnovers, which both helped the Blue Raiders pull far ahead and close out the victory.

After nearly squandering a 30-7 lead, MTSU pulled away with much needed 24-yard touchdown pass from Dwight Dasher to Desmond Gee in the fourth quarter.

"We were in a deep spot, a pretty bad spot right there," Gee said. "That gave us a boost when we needed it."

Dasher finished 21-of-43 passing for 269 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. He also rushed for 75 yards and two scores.

MTSU delivered a dagger in the second quarter to take early control.

Already leading 20-7 and picking up steam, the Blue Raiders marched 98 yards in 12 plays in a three-minute drive that turned the game's tide until late in the third quarter.

Freshman Ben Cunningham had back-to-back runs of 11 and 27 yards, and Dasher finished it with a 2-yard TD run.

Alan Gendreau added a career-long 48-yard field goal just before halftime to put the Blue Raiders ahead 30-7, and the game seemed to be out of reach.

But MTSU's offense stalled in the third quarter, and its defense grew tired against a rejuvenated UNT offense.

The Mean Green scored back-to-back touchdowns in the third quarter on impressive drives of 62 and 74 yards. Dodge capped the first drive with a 4-yard TD run, and running back Lance Dunbar finished the second with an 18-yard scoring run to trim MTSU's lead to 30-21.

"We had in our mind to come out in the second half and score more and more like we did in the first half, but we were a little stale," Dasher said. "We missed some balls

and I threw some bad balls. We finally put it together in the fourth quarter, and I hit Des on the big touchdown."

MTSU finally answered with a four-play, 52-yard scoring drive that included Wes Caldwell's third-down pivotal catch and an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on each team as the game grew heated.

When Gee pulled in the over-the-shoulder catch that put the game away, he clapped at some scattered fans in the Fouts Fields end zone stands. UNT's rally lost momentum from there.

MTSU safeties Jeremy Kellem and Kevin Brown picked off UNT passes on back-to-back fourth-quarter drives in the final four minutes to seal the victory. Brown had two interceptions in the game.

MTSU's defense held firm early on, and for the second straight week aided the offense by forcing turnovers.

UNT returned the opening kickoff 73 yards, but MTSU's defense held it to three-and-out and Rod Issac blocked a Mean Green field goal.

MTSU answered with a six-play, 80-yard drive that only took 1:43 of game clock. It ended when Cunningham snagged a short Dasher swing pass and rumbled 50 yards for a touchdown on his first career reception.


"I need to pull the rope for my teammates, and I really needed to make a play like that," Cunningham said.

UNT fumbled on its ensuing possession when line-backer Danny Carmichael rocked Mean Green wide receiver Jamaal Jackson, and Kellem recovered. MTSU converted the turnover into a 20-yard Gendreau field goal.

Gendreau added a 31-yard field goal on a drive that featured Sancho McDonald's 35-yard catch.

Brown picked off a Dodge pass on the ensuing drive and returned it to the 6-yard line, where Dasher ran in from the score three plays later to put the Blue Raiders ahead 20-7 midway through the second quarter.

UNT scored on Dunbar's 66-yard run in the first quarter. Dunbar finished with 101 yards on five carries. Dodge was 35-of-54 passing for 313 yards and three interceptions.

Troy 31, Middle Tennessee 7

TROY, AL - Tuesday night's game had the setup for a shootout, but MTSU fired mostly blanks.

MTSU lost 31-7 to Troy, the three-time defending Sun Belt champion, in a battle of the league's top two passing offenses.

Troy's offense was efficient, but MTSU's floundered in an ESPN2 national TV game that likely carried major implications in the conference race.

"We struggled up front, and Troy dominated us," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "That was the problem early on, and we really didn't play well anyway. We just never got anything going. Their front seven was just too good for us."

Troy, which has defeated two of the Sun Belt's top contenders in Arkansas State and MTSU, improved to 3-2, 2-0 in league play. MTSU fell to 3-2 overall and 1-1 in Sun Belt play heading into its Oct. 17 home game against Mississippi State.

"For me personally, this was one game I really wanted," said MTSU senior linebacker Danny Carmichael, whose team suffered a fourth straight loss to Troy. "This one really hurts."

Seven points matched the lowest points MTSU has scored in a Sun Belt game, including a 45-7 loss in the Blue Raiders' last trip to Troy in 2007.

MTSU's offense put up 354 total yards, but most of them came with the game already decided.

Quarterback Dwight Dasher was 24-of-44 passing for 245 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions. He took the blame for the poor start.

"I wasn't clicking early. I just got nothing going," said Dasher, who completed only 6-of-21 passes in the first half. "It wasn't the offense's fault. It was my fault. This one is on me."

It took nearly three quarters before MTSU's offense showed any life, but even then it wasn't enough to challenge Troy.

Trailing 24-0, MTSU drove 70 yards on a third-quarter drive, but Dasher was stopped cold on a run on fourth-and-goal at the 2-yard line to turn it over on downs.

On the next possession, Dasher connected with freshman wideout Tavarres Jefferson, a former Ensworth High quarterback, for a 35-yard TD pass — the first scoring catch of his career.

"Dwight put it right on the money, and I tried to make a play," Jefferson said. "Our whole offense is based on getting into rhythm, but we couldn't do it."

MTSU's offense spun its tires early on.

The Blue Raiders went three-plays-and-out on seven of their first 11 possessions, including the first four series of the night.

MTSU had only one first down and 26 yards in the first quarter, and it failed to score on three second-quar-

ter possessions that started in Troy territory. The most frustrating failure came when Carmichael forced Troy to fumble, and Jamari Lattimore recovered it at the Trojans' 38-yard line.

But MTSU's offense stalled, gaining only three yards on one rushing attempt and two incomplete passes before punting with no points and a major missed opportunity.

MTSU punted 11 times, one shy of the Sun Belt single-game record.

Troy led the Blue Raiders 14-0 at halftime, despite MTSU's defense mostly holding the Trojans in check early on.

After MTSU's offense went three-and-out and was backed up to its own 1-yard line, it punted to give Troy the ball on the Blue Raiders' 33-yard line. Troy then marched to the end zone in five plays, capped by freshman running back Shawn Southward's 7-yard TD run — the first score of his career.

The Trojans delivered a dagger just before halftime when they raced 80 yards in seven plays in 2:18. Troy quarterback Levi Brown, a Mt. Juliet native, connected with wideout Chip Reeves on a 52-yard TD pass between MTSU cornerback Marcus Udell and safety Jeremy Kellem, who were slow to react down the sideline. It put Troy ahead 14-0 with 20 seconds remaining in the first half.

"They used some tempo with us, and things starting going fast," Kellem said. "They hurried it up, and they caught us with a busted coverage. They got us good, and it took a big blow out of us with that one."

Troy scored on its first two possessions of the second half to widen its lead. Dantavious Parker, temporarily filling in at quarterback, scampered 46 yards to the 2-yard line. He ran it in for a 1-yard score three plays later.

Michael Taylor added a 26-yard field goal to stretch Troy's advantage to 24-0 in the third quarter. Parker later broke free for a 28-yard TD run for a 31-7 lead early in the fourth quarter.

Mississippi State 27, Middle Tennessee 6

MURFREESBORO, TN - A gray sky and lackluster play yielded a drab day for MTSU in a 27-6 loss to Mississippi State.

MTSU never reached the end zone and lacked pop in a much-anticipated matchup with the first Southeastern Conference team to visit Floyd Stadium.

"This was a chance to play another good football team from the best conference in America," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "They played better than us. But I'm not going to look at this game like 'Woe is me.'

"There will be other chances. We'll play other SEC teams and other ACC teams. I'm mad because we didn't win the game. I'm not looking at it that we peed away an opportunity. We just peed away a game."

MTSU fell to 3-3 overall with its second straight loss. Mississippi State improved to 3-4 by snapping a three-game losing streak. The game drew a crowd of 23,882, the fifth largest in Floyd Stadium history.

Twice MTSU reached inside the 10-yard line early in the game, but settled for field goals. And four fourth-quarter interceptions drove a dull spike through MTSU's heart.

Defensively, MTSU held its own for most of the day. But Mississippi State's ground game was too powerful, as the Bulldogs rushed for 178 yards.

Senior running back Anthony Dixon rushed for 135 yards and two touchdowns on 27 carries, breaking the Mississippi State career record for rushing yards. His 57-yard TD run in the second quarter broke the all-time mark.

"I gave Anthony a big hug after that long touchdown," Mississippi State coach Dan Mullen said. "I told him I didn't know if he had the record, but I figured he got it on that play. I congratulated him and told him he better hang on to the ball for the rest of the game."

Mississippi State committed no turnovers.

On the flip side, four fourth-quarter interceptions by Mississippi State ended any hopes of an MTSU rally and sealed the outcome.

Trailing 20-6, Dasher tossed a 36-yard TD pass to Chris McClover early in the fourth quarter, but it was negated by an offensive pass interference penalty. Dasher threw an interception to Mississippi State cornerback Corey Broomfield on the next play.

After Mississippi State went three-and-out on its ensuing possession, MTSU's offense moved the ball to its own 43-yard line, but Dasher was again picked off by Broomfield.

After another Mississippi State three-and-out, Dasher was picked off by Bulldogs safety Jonathan Banks.

"I don't know if it was a bad day for everybody. I know it was bad day for me," said Dasher, who was 11-of-22 passing for 129 yards and three interceptions.

Wide receiver Sancho McDonald's deep pass off a lateral was also intercepted by Banks for the fourth pick of the fourth quarter.

Other chances to keep the game close were missed in the first half.

MTSU marched 62 yards to set up first-and-goal from the 1-yard line, but it could not move an inch on three plays. Instead, Alan Gendreau kicked an 18-yard field goal.

MTSU again drove to the 7-yard line later in the second quarter, but it settled for a 24-yard field goal by Gendreau, who tied his own school record with eight consecutive made field goals this season.

"We ended up kicking field goals, and if we could've punched those in, it could've made a difference," Stockstill said. "You can't settle for kicking field goals against an SEC team and expect to have a chance to win."

MTSU had an abbreviated lineup.

Three players arrested last weekend for alcohol offense were suspended for the game, including leading wide receiver Patrick Honeycutt and linebacker Gorby Loreus.

Starting running back D.D. Kyles sat out with a knee injury. Wide receiver Malcolm Beyah did not play due to a thumb injury, and wideout Tavarres Jefferson missed the last three quarters with a foot injury.

Dasher and starting center Mark Thompson both sat out the first quarter as punishment for missing a conditioning workout.

With Dasher on the bench, MTSU's offense did little. Not much changed with him on the field, though.

MTSU amassed only 248 yards of offense, including 42 rushing yards.

Mississippi State quarterback Tyson Lee passed for 155 yards and broke a career-long 39-yard TD run.

MURFREESBORO, TN - MTSU came to Floyd Stadium for a rivalry. It left with a rout.

The Blue Raiders lit up Western Kentucky 62-24 in the former Ohio Valley Conference rivals' first meeting as Sun Belt Conference foes.

MTSU never let off the gas. The Blue Raiders' 62 points marked the most since a 70-58 record-breaking win over Idaho in 2001, and their 646 yards was the third-most in school history.

"I felt good about the situation we were in because we were coming off two losses, and we really wanted to win," MTSU quarterback Dwight Dasher said. "I thought it was going to be a closer game because this is a rivalry. It felt great watching the time run out in the fourth quarter, and we're up 38."

MTSU was coming off two lackluster losses to Troy and Mississippi State, but Saturday's win lifted the team to 4-3 overall and 2-1 in Sun Belt play.

WKU fell to 0-7 overall and 0-3 in Sun Belt play with its 15th straight loss, the longest losing streak in the nation.

After a three-interception dud against Mississippi State the week before, Dasher put together the best performance of his career.

Dasher had 355 passing yards, three touchdown passes, two touchdown runs and 421 yards of total offense — all four career highs.

"I felt good about this day," Dasher said. "We were tired of losing and we had to come out with a win. I wouldn't say it was frustration, but this was the day we had to do this."

MTSU wide receiver Chris McClover had career highs of 149 receiving yards and two TD catches. Filling in for injured wide receivers Malcolm Beyah and Tavarres Jefferson, walk-on Harold Turner had the first two TD catches of his career.

MTSU pulled away by scoring 28 unanswered points in the second quarter, tied for the most in a single quarter in the Rick Stockstill coaching era.

Dasher tossed TD passes on three consecutive possessions, including two to McClover, and ran for a fourth score just in the second quarter.

Dasher connected with McClover on a 23-yard TD pass to go ahead 10-3 just 20 seconds into the second.

WKU's offense went three-and-out for the first of four consecutive possessions in the second quarter, and MTSU again struck quickly.

On the second play of the ensuing possession, Dasher hit Turner on a short pass, and Turner split two defenders to break it for a 52-yard TD.

MTSU got the ball back less than two minutes later, and Dasher completed four passes and added a 15-yard run on a third TD drive. Dasher again connected with McClover, this time for a 34-yard TD pass on fourth-and-4.

McClover was a popular target. He also caught a 32-yarder that set up Dasher's 1-yard TD run late in the second quarter. That capped a 10-play, 74-yard drive to stretch MTSU's lead to 31-3 with 1:08 remaining in the first half.

"After that first touchdown, something came over me," McClover said. "I was ready for some more. I wanted the next ball and the next ball and the next ball."

WKU finally reached paydirt on the last play of the first half on a Hail Mary TD toss from Kawaun Jakes to Jake Gaebler, who caught the ball after it was tipped three times in the end zone.

Gaebler also caught a 16-yard TD pass from Brandon Smith in the fourth quarter. But WKU had only 250 total yards and committed four turnovers.

"They just beat us," WKU coach David Elson said. "Our guys fought until the bitter end, but the score says it well enough."

Dasher finished 22-of-35 passing for 355 yards, three TD passes and no interceptions. He also led MTSU with 66 rushing yards and two TDs on 10 carries.

D.D. Kyles scored on a 1-yard run, and true freshman Kenneth Gilstrap added a lightning-quick 49-yard TD run on a reverse in the third quarter.

At one point last year, Gilstrap, a Lithonia, Ga. native, owned the nation's fastest 100-meter and 200-meter times in high school track. His run Saturday offered a rare glimpse of his breakaway ability with the football.

"I was really eager to show my speed," Gilstrap said. "I wanted people to see it."

MTSU kicker Alan Gendreau made field goals from 29 and 38 yards, making him 10-for-10 on the season. Ten straight field goals marks the longest streak in school history.

MTSU has a winning record at the latest point in the season since its 2006 Sun Belt co-championship year.

"We wanted to play better than we had the last couple of weeks," Stockstill said. "But I can't tell you how good of a week of practice that we had. It was a phenomenal week of practice, and you could tell they had an air of confidence in themselves because of how they prepared this week."

FT. LAUDERDALE, FL - With its offense struggling and its defense gasping for air, MTSU's special teams decided to throw a block party.

The Blue Raiders blocked three Florida Atlantic kicks, and outscored the Owls 14-3 in the second half to escape Lockhart Stadium with a 27-20 victory Saturday night.

"I thought it was a great win," said MTSU coach Rick Stockstill. "It was a win that showed a tremendous amount of character, a tremendous amount of fight, a tremendous amount of fight from our football team."

MTSU trailed the majority of the game, not taking its first lead until quarterback Dwight Dasher sprinted 74 yards for a touchdown with 5:31 remaining. The Blue Raiders trailed by as many as 10 in the first half, and seven in the second, but dominated the fourth quarter to get the win.

Sophomore tailback D.D. Kyles ran for a career-high 140 yards, including an 8-yard run in the fourth quarter to knot the score at 20. Dasher, meanwhile, went over 100 yards rushing for the second time in his career, gaining 108 on 14 carries.

"It was fun," said Kyles. "Every day, I go out to practice and try to do the right things and try and get better. This week it finally happened for me."

FAU dominated the first half, outgaining MTSU 260-73 and racking up 17 offensive points. Kyles' 43-yard run — his only carry of the first half — late in the second quarter accounted for more than half of MTSU's total offense in the first 30 minutes, and Dasher completed just 3-of-13 passes for 24 yards.

Dasher's first-quarter fumble, which was returned 28 yards by FAU defensive lineman Josh Savidge, set up the Owls' first touchdown of the game and put FAU ahead 10-0.

However, the MTSU special teams gave the Blue Raiders a chance.

MTSU blocked two punts and a field goal — the first time the Blue Raiders have had multiple blocks since they had three against North Texas in 2002.

"You never think you're going to block three kicks," said Stockstill. "You never think that's going to happen, but we're not surprised that it did. We worked hard on it this week, we thought we could exploit them in some areas, and we did."

The first block, a blocked punt by sophomore defensive lineman SaCoby Carter, was returned 29 yards for a touchdown by junior cornerback Sherman Neal.

Marcus Udell blocked a field goal in the second quarter, and Jeremy Kellem added a blocked punt in the third.

"We went into this game knowing what we were capable of doing and it was just about executing," said Neal. "Luckily for me, my teammates did their jobs and I was in

the right place at the right time."

MTSU's offense didn't find its stride until the fourth quarter, when the Blue Raiders racked up 183 yards of total offense and its only two offensive touchdowns. Dasher's 42-yard completion to Shane Blissard set up Kyles' 8-yard scoring run. After MTSU stopped FAU on fourth-and-four at the MTSU 26, two players later Dasher broke down the left hash for the winning touchdown.

"I give it all to the offensive line," said Dasher, who completed just 7-of-21 passes for 90 yards. "They kept the pressure off and they opened holes when they needed to. This one's on them."

MTSU rushed for 239 yards on 34 carries for an average of seven yards per carry. It was the second straight game the Blue Raiders have rushed for more than 200 yards as a team.

Defensively, MTSU limited the Owls to just 101 yards on the ground and held running back Alfred Morris — who entered the game as the Sun Belt Conference's leading rusher — to just 93 yards on 25

carries.

FAU quarterback Rusty Smith completed 23-of-45 passes for 304 yards and two touchdowns, but was picked off twice by MTSU senior Marcus Udell.

The first interception, late in the second quarter, set up an MTSU field goal and ended Smith's streak of 186 straight passes without an interception. The 2007 Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year was knocked out of the game with just over six minutes remaining, hit by MTSU linebacker Danny Carmichael on a failed fourth-down conversion attempt.

FAU backup Jeff VanCamp played the final drive for the Owls due Smith suffering a shoulder injury. He completed 5-of-9 passes for 73 yards, including a conversion on fourth-and-six from his own 34. However, his fourth-down attempt to Cortez Gent was ruled out of bounds inside the MTSU 10 with 59 seconds remaining.

"The offense played well and probably played well enough to win," said FAU coach Howard Schnellenberger, whose team outgained MTSU 478-329. "Unfortunately, our field goal and punt protection unit gave (MTSU) enough gifts to let them win.

"That's a shortcoming of mine and the assistant coaches that work with those teams. We'll have to get that figured out."

MURFREESBORO, TN - MTSU enjoyed its best rushing day in more than a decade, as it ran over Florida International 48-21.

The Blue Raiders rushed for 385 yards, the most in its Football Bowl Subdivision era and fourth-most in program history.

Meanwhile, MTSU (6-3, 4-1 Sun Belt) reached bowl eligibility for the first time since 2006, when it went to the Motor City Bowl.

The Blue Raiders have won three straight games, including its last two home games by a combined score of 110-45.

"We're playing at a different level, but we can go to another level," MTSU senior defensive end Chris McCoy said. "We're playing real good, but we can do a whole lot more."

Quarterback Dwight Dasher put up 360 yards of total offense and five touchdowns. He broke Marvin Collier's record for most single-season rushing yards by a quarterback with 703 yards.

Dasher's 178 rushing yards against FIU finished only two yards shy of his own record for most rushing yards in a game by a Blue Raider quarterback. He had a career-high three rushing TDs. Running back D.D. Kyles added 110 rushing yards.

"There's nothing more satisfying to a team than being able to run the ball," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "When you can run the ball for more than 300 yards, your defense gets inspired by that, too."

MTSU took a 34-0 lead late in the second quarter and weathered FIU's 21-point rally in the third quarter. The Blue Raiders ultimately put the game away with 14 unanswered points in the fourth quarter.

It was a complete win.

Offensively, MTSU racked up 587 total yards. Defensively, the Blue Raiders forced four FIU turnovers and posted six sacks and 12 tackles for loss. On special teams, MTSU blocked two kicks.

MTSU put on an offensive show in the first half, stocked full of trick plays, long gains and improvisation. FIU could merely stand, stare and suffer through it until its rally tightened the score.

"I felt like we were really playing good, and we just tried to keep it up as long as we could," said Dasher, who also passed for 182 yards, two TDs and three interceptions. "I knew we would hit some long runs, and we did. I got loose for a few, and I just saw open field."

On MTSU's third offensive play, Dasher skipped though the FIU defense and burst into the open for a 70-yard TD run.

On FIU's ensuing possession, Jeremy Kellem partially blocked the Golden Panthers' punt. It was Kellem's fourth punt block in three seasons, tying former Blue Raider Markee Tate's program record for punt blocks in a career.

MTSU junior Dwight Smith blocked an FIU field goal in the second quarter, giving the Blue Raiders five blocked kicks in the last two games.

Kellem's block set up Dasher's 27-yard TD pass to Sancho McDonald to put MTSU ahead 14-0 less than five minutes into the game.

Alan Gendreau added a 33-yard field goal, and then MTSU got creative in the second quarter.

With 13:42 remaining in the second, Desmond Gee took a handoff from Dasher and ran right toward the sideline, and then he turned and tossed a lateral to Dasher, who followed a half-dozen blockers to the end zone for a 67-yard TD run.

Linebacker Cam Robinson recovered FIU's fumbled snap on the ensuing series, which led to MTSU's 62-yard scoring drive that included an impromptu play by Dasher.


With two FIU defenders dragging Dasher toward the ground for a sack, the quarterback flipped the ball to Kyles, who raced for a 30-yard gain.

Three plays later, Dasher hit wide-open Patrick Honeycutt for a 9-yard TD pass.

Gendreau added a 21-yard field goal to end MTSU's 34-0 scoring spree.

FIU's Kendall Berry scored on a 2-yard run just before halftime, and the Golden Panthers capitalized off three Dasher interceptions in the third quarter to add two more TDs to cut the Blue Raiders' lead to 34-21.

But MTSU picked off three passes in the fourth quarter (two by Marcus Udell, one by Kellem) to seal the victory. Dasher scored on a 1-yard TD run, and Ben Cunningham capped off the rout with a 42-yard scoring run.

MURFREESBORO, TN - It did not take a fire and brimstone speech from MTSU coach Rick Stockstill at halftime — only a challenge.

And his Blue Raiders responded with a 34-17 win over Louisiana-Lafayette, outscoring the Ragin' Cajuns 20-0 in the second half.

"I challenged them at halftime to man up and prove who the tougher team was," Stockstill said. " ... And to me, we dominated them on both sides of the ball and in the kicking game in the second half. We just dominated them. I don't know what the stats say, but it was an impressive second half."

MTSU (7-3, 5-1 Sun Belt) outgained ULL 335 yards to 75 in a lopsided second half where the Blue Raiders secured their seventh win — an important mark because it would earn priority over six-win teams for at-large bowl bids.

"We know seven wins means a lot more than six," junior safety Jeremy Kellem said. "That can give us a better chance of getting into a bowl. But we don't want to stop here."

MTSU trailed 17-14 at halftime after the Cajuns (5-5, 3-3 Sun Belt) scored a touchdown with nine seconds remaining in the first half. But the Blue Raiders turned the game quickly, taking back the lead in two plays to start the second half.

MTSU quarterback Dwight Dasher broke a 46-yard run on the first snap after halftime, and he hit Garrett Andrews for a 19-yard TD pass on the next play.

Alan Gendreau added a pair of 30-yard field goals, one in each of the third and fourth quarters.

And running back D.D. Kyles broke a 52-yard run, which set up Desmond Gee's 8-yard TD run to put the Cajuns away with 13:16 remaining in the game.

Kyles finished with a career-high 177 yards on 20 carries for his third straight 100-yard rushing game.

"I could feel myself getting warmer and warmer as the game was going on," Kyles said.

Dasher had a very controlled day behind center. He completed 16-of-25 passes for 219 yards, two TD tosses and no interceptions. He also rushed for 89 yards.

MTSU racked up 506 yards of offense with no turnovers.

Defensively, the Blue Raiders registered five sacks against ULL, which had only allowed a national-low four sacks on the season.

"When you're going against a team that's the best at something, that is a challenge," said Kellem, who had two sacks and a forced fumble. "They were the best in the nation at preventing sacks. As a defense, we say, 'They're not going to stop us.'"


MTSU scored twice in the first half.

Dasher hit a wide-open Patrick Honeycutt for an 18-yard TD pass on MTSU's opening drive, which took less

than two minutes to counter ULL's first score.

MTSU drove 57 yards to the ULL 18-yard line midway through the second quarter, but Gendreau's 35-yard field goal was blocked.

On the next play, defensive end Jamari Lattimore jumped in front of ULL's pass on an inside receiver screen, picked off Masson's pass and returned it 20 yards for a TD.



"We ran the same defense in practice last week, and I recognized it from film," Lattimore said. "When they came out with big splits, I did not go up field and rush the quarterback. I just stayed in the crease and the ball came to me. Then I found my way into the end zone."

ULL had three scoring drives of more than 70 yards in the first half.

The Cajuns marched 79 yards in 14 plays to start the game, and quarterback Chris Masson scored on a 3-yard run to go ahead 7-0. It marked the first time this season an MTSU

opening drive.

ULL's nine-play, 83-yard drive in the second quarter ended with Tyler Albrecht's 24-yard field goal.

Trailing 14-10, the Cajuns drove 72 yards in 1:03 to steal the lead just before halftime. Masson completed five straight passes for a combined 61 yards, including a 7-yard TD strike to Vernon Wolfe with nine seconds remaining to put ULL ahead 17-14 at halftime.

Masson passed for 220 yards, one TD and one interception. The Cajuns rushed for only 73 yards for a 2.3 yards-per-carry average.

MURFREESBORO, TN - Just in time for Thanksgiving, MTSU is playing for gravy.

The Blue Raiders (8-3) basted Arkansas State 38-14 to increase their chances at a bowl bid, having already hit the seven-win mark that earns priority for at-large bowl spots in the previous week.

"Each win is that much better. Each one is gravy for us," MTSU junior safety Jeremy Kellem said. "We knew six wins probably wouldn't get us into a bowl. Then seven puts us above 6-6 teams. But now eight gives us an even more legitimate shot at a bowl."

"But I'm still hoping for a chance at that conference championship and that ninth win."

MTSU (6-1 in Sun Belt) trails Troy (7-0) in the conference race. The Blue Raiders play their regular-season finale at Louisiana-Monroe.

MTSU's eighth victory Saturday equaled the 2001 squad for the most single-season wins during the Football Bowl Subdivision era. The Blue Raiders won their fifth straight game, also evening the win streak eight years earlier.

Like the previous four straight wins, MTSU played well in all three phases.

On offense, the Blue Raiders had a balanced attack that racked up 427 yards. They scored a touchdown on defense and allowed ASU (2-8, 1-5) to gain only 220 yards. And on special teams, MTSU blocked a field goal.

"I thought it was a dominating performance in all three phases," MTSU coach Rick Stockstill said. "When you're playing as well as we are in all three phases, we're a pretty dang good team."

MTSU quarterback Dwight Dasher was 15-of-26 passing for 263 yards, a career-high four touchdown passes and one interception. He also rushed for 73 yards.

MTSU ran away with the game before the Red Wolves got settled in Floyd Stadium. The Blue Raiders scored three times in the first quarter, with all three drives taking less than three minutes of game clock.

"Every game we want to start fast, try to take them out of the game, bring their pride down and show them we're not here to play around with them," Dasher said. "We took control of the game, and we knew our defense wasn't going to give up too many points."

On MTSU's second offensive play, Dasher connected on a screen pass to D.D. Kyles, who broke free behind a Mark Fisher block en route to an 80-yard TD.

ASU was stopped cold on its next possession, and MTSU answered with a 58-yard drive that spent only 1:37. It was capped by Alan Gendreau's 39-yard field goal.

After an ASU three-and-out series, MTSU marched 66 yards in only eight plays and 2:54. Dasher completed a pass to Sancho McDonald to convert a third-down play

and keep the drive alive. Two plays later, Dasher perfectly placed a 12-yard TD pass to Chris McClover on a fade route.

Dasher had two more TD tosses to finish lengthy scoring drives. His 32-yard TD throw to Harold Turner capped an 86-yard drive in the second quarter, and Dasher's 7-yard scoring pass to Garrett Andrews ended a nine-play, 91-yard march in the third quarter.

But the play of the day belonged to MTSU defensive end Jamari Lattimore and Kellem.


With 40 seconds remaining in the third quarter, Lattimore scooped up an ASU fumble at the 42-yard line, returned it to the 11, and then made a no-look lateral pass to Kellem, who returned it the rest of the way for a TD to put MTSU ahead 38-7.

"I was running beside him yelling, 'Pitch, pitch, pitch!'" Kellem said. "I thought he was going to be stingy and not pitch it, but then at the last second while he was going down, he pitched it and that was a great

feeling to get that ball."

ASU scored two TDs on Reggie Arnold's 2-yard run in the second quarter and Ryan Aplin's 24-yard pass to Jahbari McLennan in the fourth.

ASU rushed for only 44 yards on 36 carries, and quarterback Corey Leonard (Preseason Sun Belt co-Offensive Player of the Year) injured his knee in the third quarter and did not return to the game.
