DID YOU KNOW?

- ULM has the second best conference record among Football Bowl Subdivision teams in the state of Louisiana over the past five seasons
LSU (28-12, .700)
ULM (19-16, .543)
Louisiana-Lafayette (18-17, .514)
Louisiana Tech (21-20, .512)
Tulane (10-30, .250)

- ULM has been the only Sun Belt Conference team to defeat the league champion in each of the past two seasons -- 2007, Florida Atlantic (33-30); 2008, Troy (31-30).

- ULM ranked seventh in the nation last season with just 14 turnovers. The Warhawks lost just five fumbles on the year to rank fifth in the NCAA and threw just nine interceptions to rank 23rd in the NCAA.

- Texas is the highest ranked team that ULM has played to open a season. This will mark the second time that ULM has played a team ranked No. 2 in the polls, ULM played at No. 2 Florida in 2001. This will be the seventh top 10 team that the Warhawks have played since moving to Division I-A in 1994.

- The Warhawks will play three teams for the first time in school history, and they are the first three games of the season. ULM's meetings with Texas, Texas Southern and Arizona State will all be firsts for the Warhawks. ULM's meeting with Sun Belt newcomer Western Kentucky will be just the fifth meeting between the schools and first since 1955.

The matchup pits the Warhawks against their highest ranked opponent in a season opener and marks the second time that the Warhawks will have played the No. 2 team in the country. ULM will be looking for its first victory against a team from the Big 12 -- the Warhawks are 0-10 all-time against teams from the conference.</p> |
|  | <p>Texas Southern Sept. 12 Monroe, La. 6 p.m. Warhawks All*Access</p> | <p>It will be another first-time meeting for the Warhawks when they welcome Texas Southern to Malone Stadium for the home opener. The Tigers are the fourth SWAC team to visit Monroe in the past four seasons (Alcorn State, Grambling State, Alabama A&M). ULM has outscored its SWAC opponents 167-62 in its three previous meetings. The Warhawks are 24-7 in Malone Stadium openers and have won two of the last three home openers.</p> |
|  | <p>at Arizona State Sept. 19 Tempe, Ariz. 9 p.m. FSN Arizona</p> | <p>The last of three-straight games against first-time opponents sends the Warhawks out west to take on the Sun Devils. It will be the third meeting for ULM against a Pac 10 team -- the Warhawks played at UCLA in 1996 (L, 0-44) and at Arizona in 1998 (L, 7-45).</p> |
|  | <p>at Florida Atlantic Sept. 26 Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. 3 p.m.</p> | <p>The Warhawks open the 2009 Sun Belt Conference schedule in a place where they have enjoyed tremendous success. ULM is 5-0 all-time in the state of Florida in SBC games -- 3-0 at FAU and 2-0 at FIU. ULM won a thrilling 33-30 3OT game the last time the teams met in Ft. Lauderdale. The Owls got some revenge last season rallying from a 21-0 deficit to win 29-28.</p> |
|  | <p>Florida International Oct. 3 Monroe, La. 2:30 p.m. Sun Belt Network</p> | <p>Homecoming at ULM is early this season due to the setup of the conference schedule. The game will be the first for ULM on the newly formed Sun Belt Network. The Warhawks have won three straight in the series and have won four of the five all-time meetings. Frank Goodin ran for 92 yards and a touchdown and the Warhawks ended the season on a high note with a 31-27 victory in Miami last season.</p> |
|  | <p>Arkansas State Oct. 13 Monroe, La. 7 p.m. ESPN2</p> | <p>The national spotlight will be on Malone Stadium as ESPN2 comes to town for the second time in three years. The Warhawks have had success against the Red Wolves at home recently winning the last two meetings in Malone Stadium. Darrell McNeal has enjoyed tremendous success against ASU the past two seasons with five catches for 72 yards and two TDs in 2007 and eight catches for 149 yards a touchdown last year.</p> |
|  | <p>at Kentucky Oct. 24 Lexington, Ky. TBA TBA</p> | <p>The trip to Kentucky keeps a streak alive for the Warhawks as they have played a team from the SEC every year since 1994 (first year in D1). The last time the two teams met ULM gave the Wildcats a huge scare in a 42-40 loss back in 2006. ULM went for two with 54 seconds remaining in the game to tie the score but came up just short. ULM has three victories over SEC schools in its history with one coming at Kentucky in 1994 (21-14).</p> |
|  | <p>at Troy Oct. 31 Troy, Ala. 6 p.m. Warhawks All-Access</p> | <p>As the only SBC team to beat the Trojans last season, 31-30, the Warhawks will sure draw extra attention from Troy in 2009. Troy has had ULM's number over the years winning seven of the 11 meetings (one tie) including all five games in Troy. Then backup quarterback Trey Revell led the Warhawks on a 9-play, 72-yard game-winning drive last season. He was a perfect 4-for-4 on the drive and also rushed for 29 yards to lead the Warhawks to victory.</p> |
|  | <p>at North Texas Nov. 7 Denton, Texas 3 p.m. Warhawks All-Access</p> | <p>After winning six games in a row against North Texas from 1990-01, the series has played nearly even over the last seven games with UNT holding a slim 4-3 advantage. The Warhawks took care of business last season winning 35-23, but still have a bad taste in their mouth from their last visit to Denton in 2007. ULM fell behind 21-0 thanks to two interception returns for touchdowns in the opening half, but outgained UNT 421-373 for the game.</p> |
|  | <p>Western Kentucky Nov. 14 Malone Stadium 3 p.m. Warhawks All-Access</p> | <p>The newest member of the Sun Belt Conference makes a visit to Monroe as ULM and Western Kentucky meet for the first time since 1955. The two schools played four consecutive years from 1952-55 with WKU winning three of the four contests.</p> |
|  | <p>at UL-Lafayette Nov. 21 Lafayette, La. 6 p.m. Warhawks All-Access</p> | <p>The Warhawks travel to Lafayette for the 45th meeting with their in-state rival UL-Lafayette. ULM has had the upper hand in the series recently winning five of the last seven meetings, including five of the last six in Lafayette. ULM will be looking to erase the image of last year as ULL rushed for 556 yards against the Warhawks. Last time ULM visited the Ragin' Cajuns, it left town with its first-ever bowl eligible season with a 17-11 win in 2007.</p> |
|  | <p>Middle Tennessee Nov. 28 Monroe, La. 3:30 p.m. Sun Belt Network</p> | <p>In a series with never a dull moment, the Warhawks wrap up the regular season with a visit from MTSU. ULM will be looking to reverse its fortunes against the Blue Raiders as MTSU holds a 7-2 series advantage. Last season the Warhawks were on the wrong end of a 24-21 game with three missed field goals in the contest and in 2007 MTSU returned a kickoff 89 yards with 49 seconds left to pull out a 43-40 victory.</p> |

TEAM NOTES

THE SERIES

This is the first-ever meeting between ULM and Texas and the 10th meeting for the Warhawks against a member of the Big 12. ULM's last contest against one of the Longhorns' league foes came back in 2007 when Texas A&M defeated ULM 54-14.

The Warhawks gave Big 12 member Kansas a scare back in 2006 in a 21-19 game in week two of the season. ULM is 0-10 all-time against the Big 12.

TEAM CAPTAINS SELECTED

The Warhawks selected their team captains for the 2009 season with a representative from the offense, defense and special teams. Punter Scott Love and hawk James Truxillo are captains for the second straight season, while quarterback Trey Revell and linebacker Josh Thomas are first-year leaders for the Warhawks.

WARHAWKS IN FRONT OF BIG CROWDS

The 2008 season opener at Auburn saw 87,451 fans watch the Warhawks and Tigers play -- the sixth largest crowd to ever watch a ULM game. The Warhawks set the Malone Stadium record in 2007 as 30,101 packed the stadium to watch the game against Grambling State -- the crowd was also the fifth largest for an on-campus game in Sun Belt history.

Three of the top eight Malone Stadium crowds have come in the past three seasons and five of the top six all-time crowds to watch a ULM game have come in the past six seasons.

TEAM NOTES

79 YEARS STRONG

ULM begins its 79th season of college football this season and ninth as a member of the Sun Belt Conference. The Warhawks began playing in 1931 as a junior college and won the first of the school's two national championships with an 8-0 record in 1935. ULM became a senior college in 1951 and joined the NAIA where it stayed until 1975 when the Warhawks became a Division I independent. The Warhawks joined Division I-AA in 1982 and won the school's second national championship in 1987, going 13-2. ULM made the final step to college football's top stage in 1994 as a I-A independent and then joined the Sun Belt in 2001.

WARHAWKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

ULM is 0-16 all-time against ranked opponents (since 1994) and 0-3 in season openers against a ranked opponent. The Warhawks closest upset bid against a ranked foe came at No. 22 Auburn in a 28-24 loss in 1996.

The Warhawks have played three ranked teams the past two seasons. In 2007, ULM played No. 25 Clemson and No. 15 Texas A&M in back-to-back weeks. Last year, the Warhawks opened the season at No. 10 Auburn.

The highest ranked team that ULM has ever squared off against was No. 2 Florida in 2001.

The Warhawks have opened the season four times against a ranked foe: 1994 at #8 Colorado (L, 13-48), 2003 at #13 LSU (L, 7-49), 2004 at #17 Auburn (L, 0-31), 2008 at #10 Auburn (L, 0-34).

MALONE IS HOME FOR 32 YEARS

The 2009 season marks the 32nd consecutive year that the Warhawks have called Malone Stadium on the campus of ULM home. Dedicated to legendary football head coach James L. Malone (1934-52) on Sept. 27, 1980, Malone Stadium has seen ULM teams post a combined 100-53-1 (.653) record.

The grounds of Malone Stadium have been the home to ULM's National Championship team in 1987, four Southland Conference Championships, and most recently a Sun Belt Conference Championship in 2005.

ULM IN SEASON OPENERS

The Warhawks are 15-19-1 in season openers since 1975 (first year in NCAA) and 5-10 in season openers since moving to I-A in 1994.

ULM will be looking to reverse a recent trend as it has lost eight of its last nine season openers -- five of those games have come against a school from a Big Six Conference.

UNDEFEATED IN OVERTIME

ULM's overtime game at Florida Atlantic in 2007 was its first game to go into extra time since 2002. The Warhawks are now 5-0 all-time in overtime games, with three of the five going to multiple overtime periods.

STATE-OF-THE-ART PLAYING SURFACE

The latest addition to Malone Stadium features a ProPlay monofilament fiber "grass" with a shock and drain pad and Envirofill clear coated sand infill. In addition to looking more like natural grass, ULM's new playing surface has measures in place to help prevent injuries and drain water at a rate of 10 inches per hour. The clear-coated sand used has obvious benefits over its predecessor (ground-up black rubber) in that it does not absorb as much heat, does not compact over time, and does not migrate during use. The first game played on the new surface was the 2007 season opener against Tulsa on ESPN2HD.

PRESEASON PRAISE

Four Warhawks were named to the Sun Belt Preseason All-Conference Team, which was voted on by the league's nine head coaches and select members of the media.

Joseph, who is a recent graduate of LSU, was named 2007's Miss Louisiana.

Marshall, Boston College and Washington are the other three.

SEC STREAK CONTINUES

With ULM's game at Kentucky in October, the Warhawks streak of playing a team from the Southeastern Conference every year continues.

ULM has played an SEC team every year since moving to Division I-A in 1994.

With games scheduled against Arkansas and Auburn in 2010, Alabama in 2011 and Arkansas in 2012, the streak will continue out at least three more years.

CW MOVING UP THE WINS LIST

Head coach Charlie Weatherbie continues to move up ULM career coaching wins list. With six victories in 2009, Weatherbie will tie Dixie B. White (1964-71) with 31 victories for third place (Senior college era).

Pat Collins holds the all-time senior college record with 57 victories, 20 more than Dave Roberts. James Malone has 95 career victories at ULM with 83 coming during the junior college years (1934-50).

MALONE HOME TO TV

Malone Stadium will host three televised games in 2009, including a nationally televised contest.

The Warhawks host Arkansas State on Oct. 13 on ESPN2HD. It marks the second time in three years that ULM has welcomed ESPN2 to campus. ULM opened the 2007 season against Tulsa on the Worldwide Leader.

The newly formed Sun Belt Network will televise ULM's home games against Florida International on Oct. 3 and Middle Tennessee on Nov. 28.

TURKEY WITH THE WARHAWKS

ULM's home contest against Middle Tennessee on Nov. 28 is the Saturday following Thanksgiving.

The game is the latest regular season home game in ULM history. The Warhawks played home games in December in 1987, but those contests were D-IAA playoff games.

LOADS OF EXPERIENCE

The Warhawks open the 2009 season with 23 players who are in their fourth or fifth years with the program.

ULM returns eight starters on offense, 10 starters on defense and its returning punter and kicker.

NUMBERS ON THE BOARD

ULM has scored in 76-of-80 games dating back to Sept. 14, 2002, against McNeese State. The Warhawks were shutout 34-0 in the 2008 season opener at No. 10 Auburn snapping a streak of 32 straight games of recording at least one score. A 59-0 loss to Ole Miss later in the season marked the first time that ULM had been shutout multiple times in the same season since 2000 -- Memphis (28-0), Middle Tennessee (38-0) and Central Florida (55-0).

Prior to the Auburn game, the last time the Warhawks were shutout came on Sept. 10, 2005, at Wyoming. The only other time during the streak came in a season-opening loss at Auburn 31-0 in 2004.

The 32-game streak passed the previous best mark of 22 which was set from Sept. 14, 2002-Nov. 22, 2003. The next milestone was 82 games; ULM was not shutout from Sept. 9, 1989-Nov. 4, 1995 -- the streak ended at Louisville on Nov. 11, 1995 in a 39-0 defeat.

OFFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

Over the past two seasons the Warhawks have averaged their highest point output of their I-A era. ULM averaged 23.5 points per game in 2007 and then followed that up with a 23.7 per game average last season. If you take out ULM's two shutout losses last season (Auburn & Ole Miss), the Warhawks averaged 28.4 points per game.

SAPP IS BACK

After sitting out last season due to academics, senior All-Sun Belt wide receiver LaGregory Sapp is back for the Warhawks. Checking in at 6-foot-3 and 209 pounds, Sapp has proven to be a game-changing receiver.

He caught 43 passes for a team-high 796 yards his sophomore year and has six touchdown receptions in his two-plus years of action. Sapp made SportCenter's Top 10 Plays after an acrobatic touchdown reception in the 2007 season opener against Tulsa.

SHOULDER PADS TO COLLARED SHIRTS

ULM's newest assistant coach, Marty Humphrey, is not even one full year removed from his playing days with the Warhawks. A former walk-on for the Warhawks, Humphrey will be remembered by ULM fans for years to come as the player who caught the game-winning touchdown pass in ULM's 21-14 victory at Alabama.

Humphrey, who completed his eligibility last season, finished his ULM career with 45 receptions for over 600 yards.

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for the Warhawks in the spring and summer before being promoted to the wide receivers coach on July 23.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

MAC ATTACK

The ULM wide receiver corps last season was turned into the Mac Attack show as the Warhawks top three wide receivers all shared the common Mc prefix in their last name.

Darrell McNeal, Anthony McCall and J.J. McCoy accounted for 1,171 of the 1,397 (83.8%) receiving yards by the ULM wideouts. The trio accounted for 12 of ULM's 20 receiving touchdowns.

D-MAC IS THE NEW SLASH

You might as well just call ULM wide receiver Darrell McNeal "Slash" from now on.

Last season the senior from Monroe led the Warhawks in receptions and receiving yards, rushed for four touchdowns and also threw a touchdown pass.

His four rushing touchdowns were a ULM record by a wide receiver.

McNeal's 10 catches at Middle Tennessee tied him for the most during Charlie Weatherbie's tenure at ULM. His 149 yards receiving at Arkansas State rank as the most since Mack Vincent had 166 in 2003 against Louisiana-Lafayette. Both games were in 2008.

FINDING THE END ZONE

The Warhawks had an incredible streak of 18 consecutive scoring drives that resulted in a touchdown last season. The streak ended with a Radi Jabour 48-yard field goal against Troy.

It was the second straight season that the Warhawks had pieced together such a streak. In 2007, ULM scored touchdowns on 24-of-27 scoring drives to end the season. ULM ended 2008 scoring touchdowns on 26 of its final 28 scoring drives.

MCCALL SETS FRESHMAN MARK

Anthony McCall set the ULM freshman record with his six touchdown receptions last season.

He had touchdown catches against Arkansas (2), Alabama A&M, Florida Atlantic, Middle Tennessee and Florida International. He finished the year ranked eighth among all freshmen in the NCAA with his six touchdown receptions.

BALL SECURITY

ULM ranked seventh in the nation last season with just 14 turnovers on the year. The Warhawks lost just five fumbles on the year to rank fifth in the NCAA and threw just nine interceptions to rank 23rd in the NCAA.

IT'S TREY'S TURN

After serving for two seasons as Kinsmon Lancaster's backup, redshirt-junior Trey Revell gets his chance to be the full-time starter at quarterback for the Warhawks. Revell has made one start each of the past two seasons and has played in 14 games during his career.

The defining moments of his career the past two seasons came at North Texas in 2007 and against Troy last season.

Against the Mean Green, he threw three touchdown passes in the second half as he tried to rally the Warhawks from an early 21-0 deficit.

In the game against Troy, Revell led the Warhawks on a 7-play game-winning drive late in the fourth quarter.

EIGHT-DEEP

The Warhawks feel that they can go eight-deep at the wide receiver position in 2009. Luther Ambrose, Julian Griffin, Brent Leonard, Anthony McCall, J.J. McCoy, Darrel McNeal, LaGregory Sapp and Tim Taylor are all expected to be big contributors this season.

The 85 yards against Auburn, 33 of which came on one pass play, was the third fewest allowed by a ULM defense under Charlie Weatherbie and the fewest for Auburn since 2006 when Georgia held the Tigers to just 35 yards.

TOUGH AS A TRUX

Senior Hawk James Truxillo returns for his senior season after missing the majority of last season due to an ACL injury.

Truxillo (trucks-ill-o) went down in the second quarter against Arkansas in the second game of the season.

One of the true leaders on the team, Truxillo continued to honor his captain responsibilities traveling with the team the remainder of the season and going out for the opening coin toss.

QUICK OFF THE EDGE

Senior defensive end Aaron Morgan broke onto the scene last season with six sacks and 13 tackles for loss.

His sack total ranked third best in the Sun Belt Conference and was the most by a Warhawk since 2005.

With the new defensive scheme in place, look for Morgan's numbers to increase this season.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

ULM players earned defensive player of the week honors four times last season.

Cardia Jackson was a two-time Louisiana Player of the Week, Nate Brown earned one Louisiana Player of the Week honor and Josh Thompson was named Sun Belt Player of the Week once.

ULM HEAD COACH CHARLIE WEATHERBIE



Charlie Weatherbie begins his seventh season at the helm of the ULM football program.

Weatherbie led the Warhawks to one of their most memorable seasons in the program's history in 2007. The 2007 season marked the first year that ULM was bowl eligible since it made the jump to Division I-A in 1994. The Warhawks won five of their last six games on the season including one of the biggest upsets in all of college football, knocking off Alabama 21-14 in Tuscaloosa, Ala., on Nov. 17.

Weatherbie guided 10 players to All-Sun Belt Conference honors that year and oversaw ULM running back Calvin Dawson's climb to greatness as he set the ULM career rushing record. Dawson and the rest of the Warhawk offense posted the highest per game

scoring average in the ULM Division I-A era.

Last year the Warhawks defeated Troy 31-30 marking the second straight season that ULM was the lone Sun Belt Conference team to defeat the eventual conference champion. The Weatherbie led Warhawks also came within one point of defeating Arkansas (28-27) in Little Rock, Ark.

The Warhawks came within five points of finishing 7-5 on the season and becoming bowl eligible -- two one-point losses and a three-point loss.

Seven players earned All-Sun Belt Conference honors in 2008 including Cardia Jackson and Zeek Zacharie, who were tabbed to the first team.

Under his direction, the Warhawk football program has made significant strides improving from winning one game in 2003 to winning the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship in just three seasons.

Weatherbie, ULM's 13th head coach, took over the program a little less than three months before kicking off the 2003 season.

The 2006 Warhawks finished the season by winning three of their last four games, including a win over Louisiana-Lafayette for the fourth time in five years, and coming close to upsetting bowl-bound Kentucky. Quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster and Dawson created a high-powered offense for ULM with a league-leading 350.7 yards per game. It was the first time a Warhawk had rushed for over 1,000 yards in the Weatherbie era. Dawson and safety Kevin Payne joined the growing list of all-Sun Belt first team members during Weatherbie's tenure.

The 2005 squad made its mark by winning ULM's first conference title since 1992. The Warhawks finished the season with a 5-2 Sun Belt record and had 10 players receive all-Sun Belt honors, including Sun Belt Player of the Year Steven Jyles. Jyles re-wrote the ULM passing and total offense record books and has gone on to play for the Edmonton Eskimos and Saskatchewan Rough Riders in the Canadian Football League.

The 2004 squad won five of their last seven games, including four wins in Sun Belt play. ULM's 4-3 Sun Belt record put Weatherbie's squad in a tie for third place. The season also saw ULM beat intrastate rival Louisiana-Lafayette for the third season in a row.

In 2003, his first season at the helm, ULM lost seven games by seven points or less and highlighted the season with a win over Louisiana-Lafayette.

Weatherbie continues to be excited about the challenge of winning Sun Belt Conference championships at ULM and representing the league in a bowl game.

When asked at his first ULM press conference on May 7, 2003 whether he was an "offensive-minded" or "defensive-minded" coach, Weatherbie responded, "I'm a win-minded coach".

The enthusiasm that Weatherbie brings to a community has been continually shown at each of his stops. Since Weatherbie arrived on the ULM campus, attendance at Warhawk games has seen a significant increase of over 10,000 fans per game.

Weatherbie has twice proven that he can take over sub .500 football programs and transform them into winning teams. At Utah State University, he inherited a program that had not had a winning season in 12 years and took the Aggies to their first Big West Conference championship in 15 years, their first bowl game in 32 years and their first bowl victory ever, after beating Ball State 42-33 in the 1993 Las Vegas Bowl. He was 12-11 in his first two seasons, 1992-93, leaving after the third season to take the same position at the United States Naval Academy. The Aggies' 1993 win over Brigham Young still stands as Utah State's only win in the last 18 meetings with their in-state rival.

At Navy, Weatherbie had similar success. He took the Midshipmen, who had suffered through 12 consecutive losing seasons prior to his arrival, to a 9-3 record and the championship of the 1996 Aloha Bowl in his second season. The nine wins were the most by a Navy team in 18 years. At the time, he was just the third coach in academy history to win a bowl game.

In 1997, Weatherbie led Navy to a 7-4 mark, the first time since the 1981-82 seasons that the Midshipmen had compiled back-to-back winning seasons. The 16 wins over two years tied for the third most in academy history. He was named ECAC Coach of the Year and was the head defensive coach at the Kelly Tire Blue/Gray Classic.

Weatherbie's first team at Annapolis went 5-6 in 1995, after Navy had won just nine games the previous four seasons combined.

Weatherbie entered the coaching ranks in 1977 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oklahoma State.

After three years playing professionally, Weatherbie was hired as an assistant coach at Wyoming. Serving as the quarterbacks coach, Wyoming led the nation in fewest interceptions in 1981.

He left Wyoming after the 1983 season to be an assistant coach at the United States Air Force Academy. During his six seasons on legendary head coach Fisher DeBerry's staff, Air Force was an overall 48-25-1 and participated in four bowl games. The Falcons had five winning seasons during his tenure, finishing 8-4 and winning the Independence Bowl in 1984. The next season the Falcons went 12-1, finished the year ranked No. 5 nationally and were Bluebonnet Bowl champions.

The University of Arkansas would be the next stop on Weatherbie's coaching journey. He spent two seasons on the Razorback staff before being named the head coach at Utah State in 1992.

During Weatherbie's years as a head coach, he has had numerous current NCAA Bowl Subdivision head coaches and NFL coaches work under his tutelage, including Gary Patterson (TCU), Brent Guy (Utah State), Paul Johnson (Naval Academy), and Jim Zorn (Seattle Seahawks).







AUBURN, Ala.—No. 10 Auburn scored touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams to defeat ULM 34-0 in front of 87,451 fans in Jordan-Hare Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

Both defenses dominated the opening half of play with the teams combining for only 245 yards of total offense. Auburn (1-0) finished sixth in the nation in 2007 in both overall and scoring defense, while the Warhawks

(0-1) led the Sun Belt in rush defense.

ULM held Auburn without an offensive touchdown in the first half; however the Tigers were able to find the end zone twice in the first quarter on a nine-yard fumble return by Michael Goggins and a 66-yard punt return by Robert Dunn – Auburn's first punt return for a touchdown since 1996.

The strong defensive play for both teams carried into the second half with the only touchdown of the third quarter coming after ULM fumbled the opening kickoff of half. Brad Lester scored from three yards out after the Tigers started the possession on the ULM 30-yard line.

The Warhawks held Auburn to just 85 passing yards -- the third fewest allowed by a ULM defense under head coach Charlie Weatherbie.

ULM tight end Zeek Zacharie caught a career-high eight passes for 61 yards to lead the offensive attack. Sophomore Frank Goodin carried the ball 15 times for 39 yards in his first start.

Quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster completed 20-of-32 for 136 yards moving into sixth place all-time on the ULM pass attempts list passing Super Bowl quarterback Stan Humphries with 606.

Auburn's pair of quarterbacks struggled in their first game in the spread offense as Chris Todd completed 9-of-18 for just 70 yards and Cody Burns completed only 4-of-9 for 15 yards. Ben Tate rushed for 115 yards on 13 carries.



LITTLE ROCK, Ark.—D.J. Williams scored with just over one minute remaining to lift Arkansas to a 28-27 comeback victory over upset-minded ULM in front of 55,048 fans at War Memorial Stadium in Little Rock, Ark.

In search of its second victory over a Southeastern Conference opponent in four games, ULM took a 24-6 lead with 6:11 remaining in the third quarter on a one-yard plunge by Gray Frazier – the first touchdown of his career.

Arkansas (2-0) scored three touchdowns, including two by Williams, over the final 17 minutes of the game to complete its second comeback win in as many weeks.

Casey Dick found Williams from eight yards out for the game winner. The touchdown capped an 11-play 79-yard drive that included a dramatic fourth-down conversion that would have ended the game.

After Williams scored the eventual game winner, the Warhawks (0-2) had a chance to win the game, but a 45-yard field goal attempt by Jeremy Gener sailed wide right to preserve the victory for the Razorbacks.

ULM redshirt freshman receiver Anthony McCall caught a pair of touchdown passes and finished the game with six receptions for 125 yards, while Kinsmon Lancaster finished the game 23-of-39 for 270 yards and the pair of touchdown strikes.

Williams led Arkansas with five catches for 124 yards, while Dick was 22-of-34 for 323 yards and two touchdowns. Back from a suspension, Michael Smith carried the ball 22 times for 157 yards and a pair of scores.

McCall also got into the action on special teams by blocking a punt on the possession following his first touchdown catch.

Arkansas opened the scoring with a Smith touchdown run early in the second quarter, but Alex Tejada missed the extra point, after missing two field goals earlier.

Gener made field goals of 20 and 40 yards in the second and four quarter, respectively.

Nate Brown had a game-high 12 tackles for the Warhawks and also had a sack – ULM finished the game with four sacks as a team.



MONROE, La. – Senior quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster did it through the air and on the ground in ULM's 37-15 win over Alabama A&M at Malone Stadium in the 2008 home opener.

The game was moved to Friday night earlier in the day as Hurricane Ike prepared to make landfall. It is the first Friday night game for ULM since at least 1979.

Lancaster connected on three touchdown passes and rushed for another to account for nearly 300 yards of total offense. The Shreveport, La., native connected with junior receiver Darrell McNeal eight times for a total of 131 yards and a pair of scores.

ULM (1-2) opened the scoring quickly when Lancaster connected with McNeal for the combo's first score following the opening kickoff. The seven play drive took 3:07 off the clock.

Alabama A&M (0-3) would get on the scoreboard early in the second quarter after a 37-yard drive stalled and Jeremy Licea converted on a 24-yard field goal.

The Warhawks would extend their lead on the next drive after Lancaster hit freshman Anthony McCall in the corner of the end zone for a 20-yard touchdown. His only catch of the game, the score for McCall marked his third touchdown over the last two games.

The Bulldogs would not go away as Ulysses Banks rushed for a three-yard touchdown with 6:38 remaining in the half to make it a 14-10 game.

Lancaster would strike again, barreling over the defenders and rushing into the end zone for his third touchdown of the game. The 22-yard scamper extended the lead to 21-10.

In the second half it was more of Lancaster to McNeal as the duo combined on a 25 yard touchdown on a wide receiver screen to make it a 28-13 lead.

Sophomore Frank Goodin added a 21-yard run up the gut to give the Warhawks a 35-13 advantage. Goodin finished with 17 carries for 114 yards. Lancaster added 81 yards on nine carries.

The Bulldogs lone points of the second half came at the beginning of the fourth quarter when an errant snap sailed through the back of the end zone for a safety. The Warhawks would get the two points back when sophomore Theo Smith recorded a safety with 5:12 remaining in the game for the final tally of the contest.

After allowing 262 yards of offense in the first half, the ULM defense buckled down and limited Alabama A&M to 71 in the second stanza.

NEW ORLEANS—Tulane jumped out to an early lead and used a solid defensive effort to hold off visiting ULM 24-10 in front of an announced crowd of 23,419 in the Louisiana Superdome.

The Green Wave (1-2) scored a pair of first quarter touchdowns on runs of nine yards by Andre Anderson and 37 yards by Jeremy Williams.

The Green Wave controlled the ball for nearly 36 minutes and ran 33 more plays than the Warhawks keeping an already short handed ULM defense on the field for the majority of the game. ULM's 42 offensive plays was the fewest under head coach Charlie Weatherbie.

Tulane converted on 11-of-18 third down attempts and held the Warhawks (1-3) to just 1-of-10 on third down leading to the discrepancy in plays and time of possession.

ULM linebacker Cardia Jackson recorded a game-high and career-high 17 stops, including 14 solo tackles. The 14 solo stops is tied for the seventh most in Warhawk history.

Anderson finished the game with 157 yards on 38 carries, while his counterpart Frank Goodin rushed for 87 yards on 14 carries for the Warhawks.

Kevin Moore completed 19-of-32 passes for 272 yards and a 19-yard touchdown pass to Williams for Tulane.

ULM's Kinsmon Lancaster finished the game 13-for-18 for 118 yards. The senior signal caller broke the ULM record for pass attempts without an interception reaching 173 consecutive passes before a third quarter interception by Charles Harris ended the streak.

Radi Jabour put the Warhawks on the board with a 47-yard field goal midway through the third quarter. It was the first career field goal for the redshirt freshman and is tied for the 23rd longest in ULM history.

Darrell McNeal scored his third touchdown over a two-game stretch running in from four yards out after lining up as the quarterback late in the fourth quarter.



MONROE, La.—Tyrell Fenroy rushed for a school-record 297 yards and Louisiana-Lafayette took advantage of the big play in a 44-35 victory over ULM at Malone Stadium in the Sun Belt opener for both clubs.

The Ragin' Cajuns had six touchdowns of 52 yards or more and finished the game with 728 yards of total offense. Fenroy had touchdown runs of 89, 80 and 52 yards, Jason Chery ran for an 89-yard score and caught a 74-yard

touchdown pass, and Michael Desomeaux ran in a 64-yard touchdown.

ULL (2-3, 1-0 Sun Belt) finished game with 556 yards on the ground on 37 carries for a 15.0 yards-per-carry average. The Warhawks ran for 241 yards on 40 carries and finished the game with 383 yards of total offense.

The Warhawks did not turn the ball over in the game and ended the day with just three on the season, which led the nation. ULM entered the game tied with Florida, Oklahoma and UNLV for the fewest in the NCAA, but all three other teams had at least one turnover on the day.

The crowd was the seventh-largest in Malone Stadium history and the largest crowd for a Sun Belt Conference game in stadium history.

After falling behind 34-16 midway through the third quarter, ULM mounted a furious rally to get within two, 37-35, late in the fourth quarter. Greg James jump-started the charge with a 55-yard interception return for a touchdown – his second pick of the game. The junior safety now ranks third on the ULM career list and fourth on the Sun Belt career chart with 13 picks.

Drew Edmiston pushed the lead out to 37-29 with a 25-yard field goal two possessions later.

Frank Goodin pulled the Warhawks within a two-point conversion of tying the game with his second touchdown of the game, but Trey Revell's pass to Zeek Zacharie in the end zone was just out of reach.

On ULL's next possession, Fenroy went straight up the middle on the first play of the drive for 80 yards and his third score of the game.



JONESBORO, Ark.—Arkansas State jumped out to a big second-half lead and held off a late ULM rally to defeat the Warhawks 37-29 at ASU Stadium.

The Red Wolves (4-2, 2-0 Sun Belt) took a 37-14 lead on the first play of the fourth quarter, but the Warhawks charged back with 15-unanswered points and had the ball at midfield late in the fourth quarter before coming up just short on a fourth-down conversion.

Arkansas State forced ULM into uncharacteristic mistakes throughout the game. The Warhawks turned the ball over three times, which led to 13 ASU points, and committed seven penalties for 77 yards. ULM (1-5, 0-2) entered the game leading the conference in fewest penalty yards per game and leading the nation with just three turnovers on the season.

ULM quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster threw for 303 yards and three touchdowns on the night. His go-to target was Darrell McNeal, who hauled in eight catches for 149 yards – including a 29-yard score in the first quarter.

Lancaster also had touchdown strikes to Frank Goodin (25 yards) and Zeek Zacharie (one yard) pushing his career total to 28.

Alex Carrington delivered what appeared to be a knockout blow after sacking Lancaster and forcing a fumble which Marcus Brown scooped up and ran back 71 yards for a touchdown with just over five minutes to play in the third quarter.

The Warhawks had just picked up a first down on the Red Wolves' 24-yard line after moving the ball 51 yards in just six plays.

On the ensuing possession, ULM took the ball back into Arkansas State territory, but another Warhawk fumble led to three more Red Wolves points.

The Warhawk defense buckled down in the second half and held Arkansas State to just 122 yards after ASU accumulated 269 yards in the opening half of play.

ASU quarterback Corey Leonard completed just seven passes for 129 yards on the night. The seven completions are tied with New Mexico in 2003 for the fewest in a game by a ULM opponent.

Arkansas State entered the game with the Sun Belt's best rush defense allowing just 134.8 yards per game and improved on those numbers after holding the Warhawks to just 87 yards on the ground.

ULM true freshman Luther Ambrose showed off his much heralded speed after returning a kickoff 91 yards down the sideline for a touchdown midway through the second quarter pulling the Warhawks within three, 17-14.



MONROE, La.—ULM hit on three big play touchdowns in the first quarter and scored 28-answered points to open the game in a 35-23 victory over North Texas in Sun Belt Conference action at Malone Stadium.

Kinsmon Lancaster opened the barrage of points after keeping the ball on an option and taking it 54 yards to the end zone. On the Warhawks (2-5, 1-2 Sun Belt) next possession, Luther Ambrose caught a screen pass from

Lancaster and went 69 yards for the score.

The play at the time was the longest of the season for the Warhawks and the freshman's second score in the past two games – he returned a kickoff 91 yards the previous week at Arkansas State.

Lancaster finished the game 12-for-21 for 171 yards through the air and carried the ball 10 times for 95 yards with a pair of scores. Frank Goodin rushed 18 times for 95 yards pushing himself past the 1,000 yard mark for his career – he has 1,037.

ULM kept the foot on the accelerator on its next drive as Rodney Lovett ran right up the middle of the defense for 49 yards and his first career touchdown. Facing a third-and-nine on the Warhawks next possession, Lancaster hit Anthony McCall on a 40-yard strike to set up his five-yard touchdown run three plays later.

A 27-yard field goal by Jeremy Knott put North Texas (0-7, 0-3) on the board before ULM wide receiver Darrell McNeal's touchdown pass made it a 35-3 Warhawk advantage. McNeal took a pitch from Lancaster, darted towards the sideline and threw it to a streaking J.J. McCoy for the 46-yard score.

ULM carried a 35-6 lead into halftime only to see North Texas score 17-unanswered points in the second half – two coming on Giovanni Vizza touchdown passes. Vizza finished the game 37-for-61 for 362 yards – his 37 completions set a new Malone Stadium record.

Josh Thompson recorded a game-high 20 tackles for the Warhawks – the 11th most all-time in ULM history and the most in the Charlie Weatherbie era. Cardia Jackson finished the game with 10 stops to mark the fourth straight game he tallied double-digit tackles.

North Texas ran 92 plays on the game to the Warhawks 55, but the teams had nearly identical total yards (ULM – 461, UNT – 463) and time of possession (ULM – 28:51, UNT – 31:09).



MONROE, La.—Rusty Smith hit Cortez Gent in the middle of the end zone from 22 yards out with 20 seconds to play to lift Florida Atlantic to a 29-28 come-from-behind victory over ULM at Malone Stadium.

Smith completed seven-of-eight passes for 72 yards on the game-winning drive after ULM missed a 45-yard field goal that would have given the Warhawks an eight-point lead with just under two minutes to play.

The Warhawks (2-6, 1-3 Sun Belt) jumped out to a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter, but Florida Atlantic (3-5, 1-2) stormed back with 20-unanswered points.

Kinsmon Lancaster gave ULM a 28-20 lead with just under 12 minutes to play in the game with his third touchdown pass of the night – an eight-yard strike to Zeek Zacharie.

Lancaster finished the game 22-of-28 for 216 yards and the three touchdowns. He moved into sole possession of fifth place on the ULM career touchdown passes list with 32, just one behind Doug Pederson for fourth. He also carried the ball 14 times for 86 yards.

Smith completed 28-of-39 for 267 yards and a pair of scores. Gent finished the game with five catches for 73 yards and two touchdowns.

The Owls began their fourth-quarter comeback with a Warley Leroy 22-yard field goal with 5:41 remaining in the game.

On the ensuing possession, the Warhawks marched the ball 50 yards on nine plays, but a holding call on a second-down play on the Florida Atlantic 30-yard line pushed ULM back to the 36. After a one-yard loss, Lancaster hit Darrell McNeal for a nine-yard completion on third down to set up the 45-yard field goal attempt, which sailed wide left.

ULM found the end zone twice in the first quarter on a six-yard touchdown pass from Lancaster to Anthony McCall and a four-yard run by McNeal. In the opening minutes of the second quarter, Lancaster hit McNeal for a 13-yard touchdown to push the lead to 21-0.

Smith put the Owls on the board with a one-yard run with just under two minutes left in the second quarter. Following an interception on ULM's next possession, Smith threw a 13-yard score to Gent in the waning seconds of the first half.

ULM had an early opportunity in the second half to extend its lead back out to 14, but a fumble on the Florida Atlantic 13-yard line halted the drive. The Owls took advantage of the mistake four minutes later with a 37-yard field goal by Leroy.

Following a ULM three-and-out, Leroy capped an 11-play drive with a 36-yard field goal to pull the Owls within 21-20.



MONROE, La.—ULM backup quarterback Trey Revell threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to J.J. McCoy with 34 seconds left in the game to lift the Warhawks past Troy 31-30 in Malone Stadium to knock the Trojans from the ranks of the unbeaten in Sun Belt Conference play.

Revell, in the game in place of an injured Kinsmon Lancaster, rushed for 29 yards on the drive and went 4-for-4 passing for 41 yards. He finished the game 5-for-5 for 44 yards.

Troy returned the ensuing kickoff to its 49-yard line and a five-yard ULM penalty pushed the ball across midfield to the Warhawk 46-yard line.

Levi Brown completed 1-of-3 attempts on the drive to set up a Sam Glusman 56-yard field goal attempt to win the game. The kick, which caught the entire stadium off guard, bounced off the crossbar and fell just short to preserve the Warhawk victory.

The game was a wild back-and-forth affair that featured seven lead changes, five of which came in the final 19 minutes of the game.

After the Trojans (5-3, 4-1 Sun Belt) rattled off 17 unanswered points to close out the first half, ULM (3-6, 2-3) stormed back with a pair of Lancaster touchdown passes. He struck first on a five-yard pass to tight end Mitch Doyle and then found running back Frank Goodin from 13-yards out – the senior signal caller now has 34 career touchdown passes, fourth best in school history.

Lancaster was 15-for-26 for 125 yards before suffering an injury around the 10-minute mark of the fourth quarter.

This was ULM's third game this season decided by one point. The Warhawks suffered heartbreaking losses to Arkansas (28-27) and Florida Atlantic (29-28).

DuJuan Harris broke off a 45-yard touchdown run in the waning minutes of the third quarter to give the Trojans a 24-22 advantage.

The Warhawks came right back down the field and regained the lead on a career-long 48-yard field goal by Radi Jabour.

After each team failed to score on their next possession, Troy marched the ball 84 yards on nine plays to take a 30-25 lead on a Brown 29-yard touchdown pass to Harris. Brown's two-point conversion attempt was intercepted by Greg James leaving the margin at five and setting up Revell's heroics.



MURFREESBORO, Tenn.—ULM quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster put the Warhawks on his back over the final three quarters of the game, but Middle Tennessee built a big enough lead to survive for a 24-21 victory in Sun Belt Conference action at Floyd Stadium.

After sitting out the first quarter, Lancaster completed 16-of-25 attempts for 202 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran the ball 14 times for 126 yards – taking out five sacks, Lancaster would have totaled 149 yards on the

ground.

Trailing 17-14, ULM (3-7, 2-4 Sun Belt) had a chance to tie the game with a 32-yard field goal with 9:19 remaining in the third quarter, but a high snap led to a miss and spoiled a 74-yard run by Lancaster – tied for the 13th longest in ULM history.

The Blue Raiders (3-6, 2-4) took advantage of the miscue nine plays later on a 4-yard touchdown run by Phillip Tanner to stretch their lead to 24-14.

Lancaster responded on ULM's next possession by leading the Warhawks on 12-play, 72-yard drive culminating with a 17-yard touchdown pass to Zeek Zacharie to pull the Warhawks within three, 24-21, with just under six minutes remaining in the game.

Zacharie finished the game with 5 catches for 77 yards and a touchdown – he put his name on the career receptions list by moving into 10th place with 106 career receptions.

Middle Tennessee jumped out to a 17-0 lead over the first 18 minutes of the game. Joe Craddock and Dwight Dasher had touchdown passes and Alan Gendreau hit a 44-yard field goal. Craddock was 13-of-20 for 216 yards on the game.

ULM began its comeback with a 15-yard touchdown run by Frank Goodin with just under five minutes to play in the half. The Warhawks had a chance to pull within 17-10 at the half, but Radi Jabour missed a 35-yard field goal in the final seconds.

The Warhawks outgained the Blue Raiders 448-368 in the game, including a dominating 236-90 on the ground.

The Warhawks had a promising drive to open the second half driving the ball to MTSU's 43-yard line, but Darrell McNeal bobbled a Lancaster pass and Brandon Perry finally came up with the ball for the Blue Raiders for the interception.

McNeal moved into sixth place on the ULM career receptions list passing Drouzon Quillen with 128. Lancaster moved into fourth place on the career pass completions list passing Raymond Philyaw with 490.



OXFORD, Miss.--Jevan Snead threw three touchdown passes and rushed for two more as Ole Miss became bowl eligible for the first time since 2003 with a 59-0 victory over ULM at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Snead finished the game 6-for-12 for 170 yards with touchdown passes of 3, 22 and 23 yards. He scored on touchdown runs of 1 and 9 yards as the Rebels finished the game with 350 yards on the ground on 53 carries.

Ole Miss (6-4, 3-3 SEC) wasted no time putting its mark on the game taking the opening possession 72 yards on nine plays for a score capped by Cordera Eason's 17-yard touchdown run.

Eason finished the game with 106 yards on 14 carries, while Dexter McCluster ran for 78 yards on seven carries, including a 25-yard touchdown run.

Ole Miss dominated the opening half of play totaling 341 yards of total offense and holding ULM (3-8, 2-4 Sun Belt) to just 63 yards. The Rebels carried a 38-0 lead into the locker room.

ULM struggled to get any offensive rhythm going in the game tallying just 131 yards, while Ole Miss finished the game with 520 yards of total offense.

Warhawk quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster completed 5-of-9 pass attempts for 30 yards before leaving the game with an injury. Frank Goodin led the Warhawk ground attack with 41 yards on 12 carries.



MIAMI—Kinsmon Lancaster threw a pair of touchdown passes and ran for another to lead ULM to a 31-27 victory over Florida International at FIU Stadium.

Lancaster completed 14-of-25 pass attempts for 156 yards and his two touchdown passes moved him into a tie for fourth place with Stan Humphries on the ULM single-season list at 18.

ULM concluded its season with a 4-8 overall record and a 3-4 mark in Sun Belt play, while FIU fell to 4-6 overall and 3-3 in conference play. The Warhawks improved to 5-0 all-time in Sun Belt games in the state of Florida.

With the game on the line, the ULM defense left little doubt how it would finish. On the Golden Panthers' final possession, Aaron Morgan and Cardia Jackson recorded the game's only two sacks as the Warhawks held FIU to -13 yards on the drive.

Following a dormant first quarter, the Warhawks exploded for 153 yards and 21 points in the second quarter to take a 21-3 lead into the locker room.

Lancaster put the Warhawks on the board with a 16-yard run back up the middle with 12:23 to play in the half. Following a 34-yard punt return by Darrell McNeal, ULM's longest in four years, Frank Goodin extended the lead out to 14-3 with a 2-yard run.

Goodin finished the game with 93 yards on 23 carries, while Lancaster carried the ball 13 times for 71 yards.

Tight end Zeek Zacharie caught four passes for 47 yards in the Warhawks second-quarter outburst, including a 7-yard touchdown with just 23 seconds remaining before the break. The touchdown was his fourth of the season and 12th of his career, tying him for 10th all-time in ULM history with Jackie Harris and Cisco Richard.

Zacharie hauled in five passes for 59 yards in the final game of his ULM career. Both teams came out firing in the second half combining for 21 points in the first eight minutes of the third quarter.

Paul McCall hit Greg Ellingson for a 21-yard touchdown pulling the Golden Panthers within 21-10 just four minutes into the half.

McCall finished the game completing 13-of-31 attempts for 239 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The Warhawks answered less than three minutes later when Anthony McCall made an acrobatic catch in the corner of the end zone on a 19-yard pass from Lancaster.
