DID YOU KNOW?

• ULM is the last team to beat Alabama in Bryant-Denny Stadium -- a streak of 16 straight wins for Alabama. The Warhawks defeated the Crimson Tide 21-14 on Nov. 17, 2007

• ULM allowed just nine rushing plays of 20 or more yards last season -- 18th best in the NCAA. The Warhawks had 65 plays of 20 or more yards last season compared to 47 by its opponents. In the season opener, Arkansas did not have one rush of over 20 yards

• ULM has held 10 of its last 12 opponents to under its season rushing average including Arkansas last week

• The Warhawk defense has forced three turnovers in three of its last four games against teams from automatic qualifying conferences -- Texas, Kentucky, Arkansas

• Luther Ambrose is the third fastest man in college athletics and the second fastest in college football. Ambrose finished third at the 2010 NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 100m dash with a time of 10.12 -- Florida's Jeff Demps finished first

• In addition to the nine true freshmen that saw the field against Arkansas, 15 other ULM players saw their first-ever action in a Warhawk jersey last weekend

• Three of ULM's assistant coaches played for head coach Todd Berry during their collegiate careers. Steve Farmer (Illinois State), Jason Nichols (East Carolina) and Adam Waugh (Army)

• Running back Frank Goodin, who is within striking distance of the ULM school record for rushing yards and rushing touchdowns, was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List which is presented annually to the nation's top running back

	No. 14/15 Arkansas Sept. 11 Little Rock, Ark. L, 7-31 FSN	Ryan Mallett threw for 400 yards and Arkansas used a strong second half to pull away from the Warhawks. ULM held Arkansas to just seven first-half points and limited the Razorbacks to just 99 yards rushing. Jason Edwards paced the defense with a career-high 11 stops while Khairi Usher added 10 tackles and Robert Nelson finished with nine. Luther Ambrose caught his sixth career touchdown pass in the fourth quarter -- it was the first career TD pass by Kolton Browning.
	at Arkansas State Sept. 18 Jonesboro, Ark. 7 p.m. Sun Belt Network	The Warhawks open Sun Belt Conference action in their second game of the season for the first time in school history -- the Sept. 18 date is also the earliest SBC opener for the Warhawks. The last time ULM opened its conference slate this early was in 1992 when it opened the season at Nicholls State on Sept. 5. The home team has won five straight games in the series and ULM has not won in Jonesboro since a 16-7 victory in 2001.
	SE Louisiana Sept. 25 Monroe, La. 6 p.m. Warhawks All*Access	ULM will look to continue an impressive run of victories in its Malone Stadium opener. The Warhawks are 25-7 all-time in such contests and have won three of their past four home openers by an average score of 40-7. The visit by the Lions will be the first meeting between the old rivals since 1985. The teams have played 35 games since 1951 and met every year from 1951 to 1985. ULM won three of the final four meetings in the series after SLU won eight of nine.
	at Auburn Oct. 2 Auburn, Ala. TBA SEC Network	ULM travels to Auburn, Ala., for the eighth time since 1994 and will be looking to buck an unpleasant trend -- the Warhawks have been shutout in their last two trips to Jordan-Hare Stadium (34-0, 2008; 31-0, 2004). ULM held Auburn to just 85 yards passing when the two teams met to open the 2008 season -- it was the lowest passing output by the Tigers since Georgia held Auburn to 35 yards passing in 2006.
	Florida Atlantic Oct. 9 Monroe, La. 6 p.m. Warhawks All*Access	The brief series between ULM and Florida Atlantic has been anything but normal. The visitor has won all six meetings between the two schools and all six games have been decided by a combined 19 points -- 3.2 points/game. The Warhawks looked as if they were going to end the run of visitor domination in the series in 2008 as they opened up a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter. However, FAU battled back and scored with 20 seconds remaining to claim a 29-28 victory.
	at Western Kentucky Oct. 16 Bowling Green, Ky. 6 p.m. Warhawks All*Access	ULM will make its first trip to Bowling Green, Ky., since 1954 when they travel north to take on the Hilltoppers for the sixth time in school history and just the second time since 1955. The Warhawks defeated WKU 21-18 last season in the first meeting between the two schools as conference opponents. Frank Goodin rushed for a career-high 169 yards on 19 carries (8.9 ypc) as the Warhawks churned up 290 rushing yards in the game.
	at Middle Tennessee Oct. 23 Murfreesboro, Tenn. 3:30 p.m.	It will seem like deja vu for the Warhawks when they travel to Middle Tennessee on Oct. 23. ULM will stay in the same hotel in Nashville, Tenn., that they did the week before when they played Western Kentucky. The Warhawks will be looking for their first victory in Murfreesboro since 2005 and will be trying to shake the Blue Raider monkey off their back -- MTSU is 8-2 all-time against the Warhawks. Three of the past five games have been decided by three points (34-31, 2005; 43-40, 2007; 24-21, 2008).
	Troy Oct. 30 Monroe, La. 2:30 p.m. Sun Belt Network	It's no secret that Troy does not like coming to Malone Stadium. The Warhawks have won the last two meetings between the two schools in Monroe, including a thrilling 31-30 contest two seasons ago which spoiled Troy's run at a perfect SBC record. Trey Revell led the Warhawks on a 72-yard game-winning drive and the Trojans had a desperation field goal attempt hit off the crossbar as time expired. The Trojans lead the all-time series 8-3-1, but two of ULM's three victories have come in the last two games at Malone Stadium.
	at FIU Nov. 6 Miami, Fla. TBA TBA	ULM and the state of Florida have got along very well since the Warhawks joined the Sun Belt in 2001. ULM is a perfect 6-0 in Sun Belt Conference games played in the Sunshine State -- 4-0 at Florida Atlantic and 2-0 at FIU. ULM totaled 577 yards of total offense (304 rushing, 273 passing) last season in a 48-35 victory over the Golden Panthers. Frank Goodin rushed for 163 yards and three touchdowns. ULM leads the all-time series 5-1 and have scored at least 31 points in both games in Miami.
	LSU Nov. 13 Baton Rouge, La. TBA SEC Network	The in-state meeting between ULM and LSU will be just the second between the two schools on the football field. The Tigers won the initial contest 49-7 back in 2003 in a game that was scoreless until the 6:37 mark of the second quarter. LSU's November non-conference opponents have put a scare into the Tigers each of the past two seasons -- Troy led LSU 31-27 late in the fourth quarter in 2008 and Louisiana Tech held a 13-10 halftime lead last season.
	North Texas Nov. 20 Monroe, La. TBA TBA	ULM has won four of the past five meetings between the two schools and six of the last seven in Malone Stadium. UNT entered last season's contest on an offensive high after scoring 69 points against WKU the week before and having averaged 42.3 points over its previous four games -- ULM quickly ended that good feeling as they held UNT to just 268 yards of offense in a 33-6 victory. Greg James became the Sun Belt's and ULM's all-time leader in interceptions after picking off three passes in the game.
	UL-Lafayette Nov. 27 Monroe, La. TBA TBA	The 46th meeting between in-state rivals falls on Thanksgiving weekend in 2010. The Warhawks will be looking to reassert their dominance in the series -- ULM had won five of the previous six game and eight of the previous 11 games before ULL escaped with a pair of victories the past two seasons. The Warhawks lead the all-time series by a slim 23-22 margin and hold a 10-8 advantage in games played in Monroe.

TEAM NOTES

THE SERIES

ULM and Arkansas State meet for the 32nd time overall and for the 10th time as Sun Belt Conference foes. The home team has won each of the past five contests and the Warhawks will be in search of their first victory in the state of Arkansas since a 16-7 victory over ASU back in 2001.

The last two contests in Jonesboro have been decided by a combined 12 points and nine of the past 10 games have been decided by 12 points or less -- 10 of the last 14 meetings have been one possession games.

ULM is 5-10 all-time in Jonesboro.

ARKANSAS WARHAWKS

Despite the close proximity to Arkansas, the ULM roster only features one player from the Natural State -- freshman cornerback Justin Criswell from Morrilton. Arkansas State has four players from the state of Louisiana on its roster.

A LOOK AT ULM'S 2010 SIGNING CLASS

The ULM coaching staff did not have much time to put their first recruiting class together, but looking at the result you wouldn't know.

Six of ULM's signees were nationally ranked at their position by Scout.com -- Josh Allen (OL), Ray Stovall (DE), Cordero Smith (S), Jon Fisher (OL), Centarius Donald (RB) and Je'Ron Hamm (WR).

Allen was rated as the seventh best center in the nation by ESPN.

The Warhawks hit the Lone Star State hard signing 10 players from Texas. The remainder of the class came from Louisiana (3), Oklahoma (3), Arkansas (1), Mississippi (1) and Kansas (1).

The priority was along both lines as ULM signed six players on both the offensive and defensive line.

BERRY ONE OF NINE TO COACH A POSITION

ULM head coach Todd Berry is one of just nine head coaches in the country to coach a position group on either offense or defense. Berry works with the Warhawks' quarterbacks in addition to his role as the head coach.

MORE ON ULM’S YOUTH

The ULM roster features 50 players that are either in their first or second year with the program. ULM has just 13 seniors and 21 juniors on the 2010 roster.

MALONE IS HOME FOR 33 YEARS

The 2009 season marks the 33rd consecutive year that the Warhawks have called Malone Stadium on the campus of ULM home. Dedicated to legendary football head coach James L. Malone (1934-52) on Sept. 27, 1980, Malone Stadium has seen ULM teams post a combined 104-54-1 (.657) record.

The grounds of Malone Stadium have been the home to ULM’s National Championship team in 1987, four Southland Conference Championships, and most recently a Sun Belt Conference Championship in 2005.

80 YEARS STRONG

ULM begins its 80th season of college football this season and ninth as a member of the Sun Belt Conference. The Warhawks began playing in 1931 as a junior college and won the first of the school’s two national championships with an 8-0 record in 1935. ULM became a senior college in 1951 and joined the NAIA where it stayed until 1975 when the Warhawks became a Division I independent. The Warhawks joined Division I-AA in 1982 and won the school’s second national championship in 1987, going 13-2. ULM made the final step to college football’s top stage in 1994 as a I-A independent and then joined the Sun Belt in 2001.

WARHAWKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

ULM is 0-18 all-time against ranked opponents (since 1994) and 0-6 in season openers against a ranked opponent. The Warhawks closest upset bid against a ranked foe came at No. 22 Auburn in a 28-24 loss in 1996.

The Warhawks have played five ranked teams the past four seasons. In 2007, ULM played No. 25 Clemson and No. 15 Texas A&M in back-to-back weeks. In 2008, the Warhawks opened the season at No. 10 Auburn. ULM opened the 2009 season at No. 2 Texas and opened the 2010 season against No. 14 Arkansas.

The Warhawks have played the No. 2 team in the country twice -- Florida in 2001 and Texas in 2009.

The Warhawks have opened the season six times against a ranked foe: 1994 at #8 Colorado (L, 13-48), 2003 at #13 LSU (L, 7-49), 2004 at #17 Auburn (L, 0-31), 2008 at #10 Auburn (L, 0-34), 2009 at #2 Texas (L, 20-59), 2010 vs. #14 Arkansas (L, 7-31).

WHAT’S IN A NAME?

There is something missing from the Warhawks’ uniforms this season as the players’ last names have been removed from the back of the jerseys for the second straight season.

The coaching staff has told the players the names will be returned to the jerseys upon receiving a bowl game invitation.

TEXAS TWO-STEP

The Warhawks have 24 players on the active roster from the state of Texas, the most of any state other than Louisiana (37).

Twelve of the Texans are on the Warhawks two-deep heading into the game against Arkansas State.

SUNSHINE STATE DOMINATION

The Warhawks continued their domination of the Sunshine State last season. With ULM’s victory at Florida Atlantic on Sept. 26, it improved to 6-0 all-time in Sun Belt games in the state of Florida. The following week ULM defeated FIU at home to give the Warhawks a 9-3 all-time record against the SBC Florida teams. The Warhawks travel to FIU this season and host Florida Atlantic.

WARHAWKS IN FRONT OF BIG CROWDS

The 2009 season opener at Texas saw 101,096 fans watch the Warhawks and Longhorns play -- the second largest crowd to ever watch a ULM game. The Warhawks set the Malone Stadium record in 2007 as 30,101 packed the stadium to watch the game against Grambling State -- the crowd was also the fifth largest for an on-campus game in Sun Belt history at the time.

Three of the top eight Malone Stadium crowds have come in the past five seasons and six of the top seven all-time crowds to watch a ULM game have come in the past seven seasons.

SEC STREAK CONTINUES

With ULM’s game against Arkansas to open the season, the Warhawks streak of playing a team from the Southeastern Conference extended.

ULM has played an SEC team every year since moving to Division I-A in 1994.

The streak appears to be headed to an end next season as the Warhawks do not have a game against an SEC opponent scheduled. ULM is scheduled to open the 2011 season at Florida State and then play at Iowa later in the season. The Warhawks still have two other non-conference games to fill.

2010 marks the 11th time since 1994 that ULM has played at least two SEC teams in a season -- the Warhawks have played three SEC teams in a season five times (1994, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2008).

STATE-OF-THE-ART PLAYING SURFACE

The latest addition to Malone Stadium features a ProPlay monofilament fiber "grass" with a shock and drain pad and Envirofill clear coated sand infill. In addition to looking more like natural grass, ULM's new playing surface has measures in place to help prevent injuries and drain water at a rate of 10 inches per hour. The clear-coated sand used has obvious benefits over its predecessor (ground-up black rubber) in that it does not absorb as much heat, does not compact over time, and does not migrate during use. The first game played on the new surface was the 2007 season opener against Tulsa on ESPN2HD.

MALONE STADIUM OPENERS

ULM has traditionally been tough on opponents in its home openers, posting a 25-7 (.781) record in such contests over the last 32 years. ULM picked up victories in their home opener in 22 of the first 23 seasons at Malone Stadium.

ULM IN SEASON OPENERS

The Warhawks are 15-21-1 in season openers since 1975 (first year in NCAA) and 5-12 in season openers since moving to I-A in 1994.

MALONE HOME TO TV

Malone Stadium will host at least one televised game in 2010 with the possibility for two more.

The Warhawks hosted Arkansas State last season on ESPN2HD. It was the second time in three years that ULM welcomed ESPN2 to campus. ULM opened the 2007 season against Tulsa on the Worldwide Leader.

The newly formed Sun Belt Network televised ULM's home games against FIU and Middle Tennessee last season. The SBN will televise ULM's game against Troy on Oct. 30, while the games against North Texas and UL-Lafayette in November could also be televised.

OFFENSE NOTES

200-YARD RUSHING GAMES -- PAST SIX SEASONS

ULM prides itself on its ability to run the football. Over the past six seasons, the Warhawks have rushed for over 200 yards as a team 17 times. ULM topped the 200-yard mark four times in 2009 and 2008.

The ULM offensive line held the Texas defense without a sack in the season opener (only happened twice in previous 40 games), allowed just 1.3 sacks per game (28th in the NCAA) and paved the way for ULM to average 183.9 yards per game on the ground (31st in the NCAA).

FINDING THE END ZONE

The Warhawks had an incredible streak of 18 consecutive scoring drives that resulted in a touchdown in 2008. The streak ended with a Radi Jabour 48-yard field goal against Troy.

It was the second straight season that the Warhawks had pieced together such a streak. In 2007, ULM scored touchdowns on 24-of-27 scoring drives to end the season. ULM ended 2008 scoring touchdowns on 26 of its final 28 scoring drives.

ULM scored touchdowns on 39 of their 51 scoring drives last season. The Warhawks had a string of 11 straight scoring drives that resulted in a touchdown until a Jabour 28-yard field goal on ULM's opening drive at Florida Atlantic.

GOING DEEP

Trey Revell and Luther Ambrose hooked up for a 75-yard touchdown pass and catch in the second quarter against Texas last season. It was the longest play against the Texas defense since Sept. 23, 2003, and it was ULM's longest offensive play since a 77-yard touchdown pass from Steve Jyles to Drouzon Quillen against FIU in 2004.

SECOND FASTEST MAN IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

Junior wide receiver Luther Ambrose is the second fastest man in college football entering the 2010 season.

The speedster, who has been electronically timed at 4.28 in the 40-yard dash, finished third at the 2010 NCAA Outdoor Championship in the 100m dash with a time of 10.12 seconds. Florida running back Jeff Dumps won the individual title, while a non-football player from Kentucky finished second.

The 2007 Louisiana 2A State 100 meter champion (beat New York Jets running back Joe McKnight), Ambrose finished second at the 2009 Sun Belt Outdoor Championships in the long jump (25-02.75) and the 100m (10.44) despite limited practice time on the track due to spring football practice.

Ambrose also qualified for the 2010 NCAA Regionals in the 200m and long jump. He won the Sun Belt 200m dash and was named the Outstanding Men's Track Performer and the Top Scorer at the outdoor meet.

NUMBERS ON THE BOARD

ULM has scored in 89-of-92 games dating back to Sept. 14, 2002, against McNeese State. The Warhawks were shutout 34-0 in the 2008 season opener at No. 10 Auburn snapping a streak of 32 straight games of recording at least one score. A 59-0 loss to Ole Miss later in the season marked the first time that ULM had been shutout multiple times in the same season since 2000 -- Memphis (28-0), Middle Tennessee (38-0) and Central Florida (55-0).

WARHAWKS GETTING IN DONE ON THE GROUND

The Warhawks averaged 183.9 yards per game on the ground last season which ranked 31st in the nation. The most that a ULM team has averaged on the ground was 254.5 yards back in 1951. The 2007 squad averaged 209.0 yards per game on the ground.

GOODIN MOVING UP THE CHARTS

Frank Goodin has moved into second place on the ULM career rushing touchdown list with 22 after running for 13 last season -- his 13 breaks the career-high five he set in 2008.

Calvin Dawson, who Goodin ran behind as a freshman, holds the ULM school record with 30 rushing touchdowns and 3,378 yards.

FRESHMAN UNDER CENTER

Redshirt freshman Kolton Browning started under center for the Warhawks against Arkansas.

It marked the third time in the last four seasons that a freshman has started a game at quarterback -- Trey Revell (2007 vs. FIU), Cody Wells (2009 at Kentucky, at

Troy) and Kolton Browning (2010).

The last freshman to start at quarterback in a season opener for ULM before Browning was Andy Chance in the 1999 opener against Nicholls State.

POINTS ON THE RISE

For the fifth straight season the Warhawks scored more points than the year before. ULM's 25.6 point-per-game average in 2009 were the most since the 1993 squad averaged 39.2 points per game in ULM's final season as a member of the FCS (I-AA).

NEW PASS CATCHERS

The Warhawks receiving corp will have a new look to it this season as LaGregory Sapp and Darrell McNeal have moved on from the program. Sapp ranks sixth and McNeal ranks eighth all-time in ULM history in career receiving yards. McNeal also ranks sixth in school history with 16 career touchdown receptions.

Heading into the season juniors Luther Ambrose, Anthony McCall and Tim Taylor were listed as the three starters. Taylor suffered a minor injury in ULM's final scrimmage which pushed redshirt freshman Tavares Maye into a starting role against Arkansas.

McCall set a ULM freshman record with six touchdown receptions (including two against Arkansas) in 2008, Ambrose finished third at the 2010 NCAA Outdoor 100m dash finals and Maye helped lead Petal High School to the Mississippi 4-5A championship with a 10-1 record in 2008.

ULM had to look to the wide receiver corp to find its punter and deep snapper for 2010. The Warhawks lost both of their projected starters at the positions late due to academics and were forced to scramble to fill the void.

Aaron Munoz, who was moved from quarterback to wide receiver in the spring, will handle the punting duties, and Madison Tharp will handle the deep snapping duties.

MUNOZ IMPRESSES IN DEBUT

When Aaron Munoz stepped on the field as ULM's starting punter against Arkansas it marked the first time he had punted in a game since he was in eighth grade -- he boomed his first kick 60 yards and finished the game with a 41.6 yards-per-punt average over nine kicks.

A two-time preseason All-Sun Belt selection and the first team All-Sun Belt punter in 2007, Scott Love returns as a student coach this season to help groom the young Warhawk punters.

Love, who used all of his eligibility in four years, is help-

ing the Warhawks this season as he finishes his degree.

Love ranks fifth all-time in ULM history with a 40.1 career punting average. He is the single-season leader with 23 punts inside the 20-yard line (2007) and the single-game leader in the category as he placed five kicks inside the 20-yard line in ULM's 21-14 victory over Alabama in 2007.

DEFENSE NOTES

DORSEY ON THE MOVE

Junior Ken Dorsey was forced to evacuate his home not once, but twice due to hurricanes.

He was first forced out of his New Orleans home by Hurricane Katrina. His family was staying in Lake Charles, La., when, not even a month later, Hurricane Rita blew threw Louisiana and forced the Dorseys to move once again.

Ken and his father loaded up the car and drove until they found a hotel with a vacancy. That happened to be

in Homewood, Ala., (suburb of Birmingham) where Ken and his dad watched the Homewood Patriots pound Shades Valley 40-2 on local television. Ken turned to his dad and said this is where I want to go to school.

His moving was not limited to off the football field, during fall camp last season he was moved from linebacker to defensive end.

Dorsey started his first career game last weekend against Arkansas and finished with five tackles, two tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

ENDING DRIVES

ULM held Arkansas to just seven points in the first half of the season opener thanks in part to holding the Razorbacks to a combined 1-for-9 on third and fourth down. UA was 1-for-6 in the first half on third down and 0-for-3 on fourth down.

In the second half, UA scored 24 points and was 4-for-7 on third and fourth down.

LIMITING THE BIG PLAY

A lot of ULM's defensive success last season came because of its ability to limit the opposing offense's ability to get the big play.

The ULM defense allowed just 47 plays of 20 yards or more last season and just nine rushing plays of 20 yards or more. That was 3.9 plays of 20+ yards and 0.75 rushing plays of 20+ yards per game. The nine rushing plays of over 20 yards ranked 18th best in the NCAA.

In the season opener against Arkansas, the defense did not allow a rushing play over 20 yards or more and allowed six pass plays of 20 yards or more.

In 2008, the ULM defense allow 65 plays of 20+ yards or 5.42 per game and 28 rushing plays of 20+ yards or 2.33 per game.

RETURNING STARTERS NOT SO PLENTY

Heading into the season opener at Texas last season the Warhawk defensive starters had a combined 187 starts between them.

This season, ULM's 11 defensive starters had a combined 54 starts between them (four of which came by Keavon Milton at tight end) heading into the season.

NEW STARTERS STEPPING UP

ULM's top three tacklers were all newcomers to the starting lineup this season. Jason Edwards (11), Khairi Usher (10) and Robert Nelson (9) all earned their first career starts against Arkansas.

HIDDEN YARDAGE

The Warhawk defense won the hidden yardage battle last season.

ULM had 27 sacks for a loss of 181 yards compared to just 16 sacks for a loss of 98 yards by its opponents. Despite the fact that its opponents had more tackles for loss than ULM (74.0-68.0), ULM's tackle for loss yard total was more (261-238).

The Warhawk defense averaged 21.8 negative yards a game, while opponent defenses averaged 19.8 negative yards per game.

ULM averaged 15.1 sack yards per game, while allowing just 8.2 sack yards per game.

Just one game into the 2010 season, the Warhawks are averaging 20.0 negative yards per game and their opponents are averaging 30.0 negative yards per game.

PRELOW IN PRIMETIME

Junior safety Darius Prelow came on strong at the end of the 2008 recording 14 tackles over the final four contests.

He picked up where he left off in the season opener last season at Texas, Prelow led the Warhawks with 10 tackles and also had a pass breakup. He recorded a career-high 11 stops, including his first tackle for loss in ULM's victory over Arkansas State.

He finished the season second in the Sun Belt and 26th in the NCAA averaging 1.09 pass break ups per game.

Prelow had seven tackles in the season opener against Arkansas.

BREAKING UP IS HARD TO DO

The Warhawk defenders broke up passes at a feverish rate last season. Against FIU, ULM recorded 10 pass break ups and then against Arkansas State ULM had nine pass break ups.

ULM's 53 pass break ups ranked 16th in the country, while the 66 passes defended (PBU+INT) ranked 22nd and its 5.5 passes defended per game ranked 12th.

The Warhawks had five pass break ups in the season opener against Arkansas.

WELCOME BACK MR. GLENN

The Warhawks received a nice surprise at the start of fall camp when nose tackle Bryan Glenn was granted a sixth year of eligibility. Glenn missed spring ball and summer workouts because of the uncertainty about his eligibility.

Glenn had four tackles and a quarterback hurry against Arkansas.

SWITCHING SIDES

Sophomore Keavon Milton and redshirt freshman Emanuel Jefferies both moved over to defensive end from tight end. Jefferies moved during the spring and Milton made the switch right before the start of fall camp.

Milton, who started four games and caught two touch-down passes last season, impressed so much during camp that he was named a starter heading into the season opener.

Milton had five tackles against Arkansas.

DEFENSIVE POINTS ALLOWED

While the Warhawks allowed 27.3 points per game as a team last season, the ULM defense allowed opponents to score just 23.7 points per game (two kick returns, three interception returns, a punt return and a safety).

THE BIG GOOSE EGG

The shutout pitched by the ULM defense against Texas Southern last season was the first by ULM since Nov. 11, 2006, against FIU.

It was just the second shutout since Nov. 6, 1999, and the 14th of the NCAA era (1975-pr.)

ULM HEAD COACH TODD BERRY

(29-61; 9TH OVERALL SEASON / 0-1; 1ST SEASON AT ULM)



Highly regarded as an offensive mastermind, Todd Berry returns to ULM as the program's 14th head coach.

Berry, a 27-year coaching veteran, was ULM's offensive coordinator from 2004-05, where he helped guide the Warhawks to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and quarterback Steven Jyles to Sun Belt Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year honors.

"Todd Berry is the right man at the right time for ULM," ULM Director of Athletics Bobby Staub said. "He's here to build a winning program both on and off the field and with the support of the entire Warhawk family, I'm quite confident he'll be successful in doing just that."

Berry has diligently displayed a "championship" mentality and approach which he has infused into his players, staff, administrators and supporters, all with an eye for competing

for a Sun Belt Conference championship as soon as possible.

In fact, it was that same mentality that Berry used to resurrect Illinois State's football program. The day he was named the Redbirds' head football coach in 1996, he began talking about ISU teams playing for national championships. This for an institution that had experienced little success on the gridiron and had been on the verge of dropping the sport due to its checkered past. Just four years later, Berry had completed one of the most amazing turnarounds in Division I-AA history, guiding his revamped Illinois State program all the way to the national semifinals in 1999.

During a three-year tenure as the offensive coordinator at UNLV, Berry developed the top quarterback duo in the Mountain West Conference with record-setters Omar Clayton and Mike Clausen. The pair combined to throw for 2,693 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2009. Clayton is UNLV's career leader in completion percentage and is the only player in Rebel history to have thrown for over 300 yards and rushed for over 100 yards in a game.

Clausen set a UNLV freshman record with 119 consecutive pass attempts without an interception in 2008 - a mark that fell just 19 attempts short of the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision record. Clayton threw 18 touchdown passes in 2008 - the fourth most in UNLV history and most since 1996 - and set the UNLV school record by attempting 173 passes without an interception. The duo combined for just six interceptions during the 2008 season to tie the school record.

Despite coaching in Nevada, Berry continued to recruit two areas that ULM relies heavily on every year - Florida and Texas. ULM had 27 players on its roster in 2009 from those two states.

Berry split his stints at ULM and UNLV with one season as the quarterbacks coach at the University of Miami in 2006.

His first stop in Monroe followed a four-year run, 2000-03, as the head coach at Army. Berry's teams set 25 Academy records during his tenure and he is the last Army coach to defeat Navy (26-17, 2001). He was a member of the Board of Trustees of the American Football Coaches Association from 2001-03 -- Berry was reappointed to the Board during the spring of 2010.

His tenure at Army followed a four-year stint at Illinois State (1996-99) where Berry presided over one of the most remarkable turnarounds in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) history. The team had not won a conference title since 1950, but under Berry the Redbirds advanced to the NCAA FCS Playoffs in his third season and finished in the FCS top 20.

The following year, ISU became just the third team to ever run through its Gateway Conference schedule unblemished as they advanced to the FCS semifinals.

Todd Berry was introduced as ULM's 14th head coach on December 16, 2009

Under Berry's direction, Illinois State established or equaled 100 individual and team records on a game, season and career levels. The Redbirds were listed in the top 25 ranking for 19 consecutive weeks. In addition, his players captured 73 postseason awards including four Academic All-America honors and six All-America distinctions.

He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the top collegiate head coach at the Division I-AA level, each of his last two years at ISU. In addition, he was a two-time Gateway Conference Coach of the Year honoree and the 1999 GTE Region 4 Coach of the Year.

Before arriving at ISU, Berry spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at East Carolina University under head coach Steve Logan. He played a vital role on the Pirate teams that reached the Liberty Bowl in 1994 and 1995.

"I want to be aggressive in all facets of the game" Berry has said in the past. "I know that you win with defense first and I appreciate that. Most of my background is on offense, but to be an effective offensive coordinator you have to understand defense."

A 1983 graduate of the University of Tulsa, Berry has worked for some well-known head coaches during his career, holding down assistant positions on the staffs of Logan at East Carolina, John Cooper at the University of Tulsa, and Johnny Majors at the University of Tennessee.

While in high school, Berry was an all-state selection at football (quarterback) and track and field at Miami (Okla.) High School. At Tulsa, he played quarterback for the Golden Hurricane from 1979 to 1981 before suffering a career-ending knee injury.

"Coming out of high school, football was significant to me, but I also wanted to attend a school that possessed a good mix of academics-that was the reason I was going to college, first and foremost. I turned down some more traditional 'Top 10 football' programs in order to attend a school with a nice blend of academics and athletics."

Berry began his coaching career as an undergraduate at Tulsa with Cooper before moving to Tennessee as a graduate assistant and tight ends coach in 1983 when the Volunteers advanced to the Florida Citrus Bowl at year's end.

Following a one-year return to his alma mater as receivers coach in 1984, Berry headed to Oklahoma State in 1985, where he worked with the likes of future National Football League standout Thurman Thomas. He then served a three-year stint as the offensive coordinator at the Tennessee-Martin, holding that position from 1986 through 1988.

While at UT-Martin, Berry coached the Pacers to a top-five finish in Division II passing offense, total offense, and scoring offense. In his final season, all four receivers, the running back and quarterback signed professional contracts.

He also enjoyed a two-year tour at Mississippi State, coaching wide receivers, and one campaign with at Southeast Missouri State, as offensive coordinator, before joining Logan's staff at ECU.

Berry is the son of the late Rueben Berry, a former Canadian Football League head coach and longtime mentor of the Saskatchewan Rough Riders.

The 49-year old Berry and his wife, Lisa have two daughters: Jordan, 23, and Ryleigh, 8.

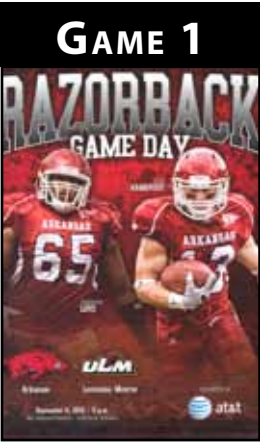

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. – Arkansas quarterback Ryan Mallett threw for 400 yards as the No. 14 Razorbacks defeated ULM, 31-7, in the season opener for the Warhawks. Arkansas led by just seven at the half before increasing its advantage after the break.

The Warhawks and Razorbacks traded possessions early in the contest, with ULM punting on a pair of occasions and an Arkansas drive stalling when ULM junior defensive end Ken Dorsey caused and recovered a fumble from Mallett.

Arkansas opened the scoring on its second possession as Mallett found Greg Childs in the end zone for a 19-yard touchdown pass with 5:48 to play in the first quarter. The score capped a seven-play, 74-yard

drive for the Razorbacks.

The ULM offense began moving the ball on its first possession of the second quarter, a five-yard run by senior Zach Rhodes on a fake punt helped to keep the drive alive. On the next play, redshirt freshman running back Jyruss Edwards gained 17 yards to get the Warhawks to the Arkansas 39-yard line, but the ULM drive stalled after a sack, forcing the Warhawks to punt.

On its final drive of the half, the Razorbacks moved into ULM territory before Mallett threw an interception to senior safety Alex Ibe at the 32-yard line. Ibe returned it 20 yards to the Arkansas 48, just 1:03 before the intermission.

At the break, Arkansas held a 217-58 advantage in total offense, but the Razorbacks also committed a pair of turnovers to none by ULM.

Arkansas and ULM traded punts on the first two possessions of the second half before the Razorbacks found the end zone on their second possession.

With a short field, Arkansas went 33 yards in seven plays, capped by a Mallett one-yard sneak across the goal line to increase the Razorbacks advantage to 14-0 with 6:12 remaining in the third quarter. Arkansas increased its advantage with a 26-yard field goal from Zach Hocker with 12:53 to play in the fourth quarter.

Mallett hooked-up with Childs for a second time from 18 yards out, giving the Razorbacks a 24-0 lead with 8:46 to play.

Following Mallett's second touchdown pass, ULM got on the board with a nine-play, 77-yard touchdown drive. Redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning made runs of 13, 11 and nine yards on the drive to put the Warhawks in scoring position. Browning finished the drive off by finding junior wide receiver Luther Ambrose over the middle for 25 yards and a Warhawk touchdown.

Browning finished the night 7-of-17 through the air for 74 yards and a touchdown, while his counterpart Mallett went 28-of-43 for 400 yards and three touchdowns. Greg Childs caught 12 passes for the Razorbacks for 146 yards to lead all receivers.

Senior running back Frank Goodin led ULM on the ground with 44 yards on 12 carries. Broderick Green was Arkansas' leading rusher with 45 yards on 12 carries.

The Warhawks held Arkansas to 99 total rushing yards, ULM has held seven of its last 12 opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jason Edwards had 11 total tackles, including nine solos, and sophomore safety Khairi Usher made 10 tackles.
