DID YOU KNOW?

• ULM is the last team to beat Alabama in Bryant-Denny Stadium -- a streak of 15 straight wins for Alabama. The Warhawks defeated the Crimson Tide 21-14 on Nov. 17, 2007

• ULM allowed just nine rushing plays of 20 or more yards last season -- 18th best in the NCAA. The Warhawks had 65 plays of 20 or more yards last season compared to 47 by its opponents

• Three of ULM's assistant coaches played for head coach Todd Berry during their collegiate careers. Steve Farmer (Illinois State), Jason Nichols (East Carolina) and Adam Waugh (Army)

	No. 14/15 Arkansas Sept. 11 Little Rock, Ark. 6 p.m. FSN	<i>The Warhawks will be looking for their first victory over Arkansas as the teams met for the ninth time. ULM came as close to a victory over the Razorbacks as they ever had the last time the two schools met in Little Rock (2008) -- the Warhawks led 27-14 early in the fourth quarter, but saw Arkansas score 14-unanswered points to take a 28-27 lead with 1:22 to play. ULM had a chance to win at the end, but a 45-yard field goal missed its mark.</i>
	at Arkansas State Sept. 18 Jonesboro, Ark. 7 p.m. Sun Belt Network	<i>The Warhawks open Sun Belt Conference action in their second game of the season for the first time in school history -- the Sept. 18 date is also the earliest SBC opener for the Warhawks. The last time ULM opened its conference slate this early was in 1992 when it opened the season at Nicholls State on Sept. 5. The home team has won five straight games in the series and ULM has not won in Jonesboro since a 16-7 victory in 2001.</i>
	SE Louisiana Sept. 25 Monroe, La. 6 p.m. Warhawks All*Access	<i>ULM will look to continue an impressive run of victories in its Malone Stadium opener. The Warhawks are 25-7 all-time in such contests and have won three of their past four home openers by an average score of 40-7. The visit by the Lions will be the first meeting between the old rivals since 1985. The teams have played 35 games since 1951 and met every year from 1951 to 1985. ULM won three of the final four meetings in the series after SLU won eight of nine.</i>
	at Auburn Oct. 2 Auburn, Ala. TBA SEC Network	<i>ULM travels to Auburn, Ala., for the eighth time since 1994 and will be looking to buck an unpleasant trend -- the Warhawks have been shutout in their last two trips to Jordan-Hare Stadium (34-0, 2008; 31-0, 2004). ULM held Auburn to just 85 yards passing when the two teams met to open the 2008 season -- it was the lowest passing output by the Tigers since Georgia held Auburn to 35 yards passing in 2006.</i>
	Florida Atlantic Oct. 9 Monroe, La. 6 p.m. Warhawks All*Access	<i>The brief series between ULM and Florida Atlantic has been anything but normal. The visitor has won all six meetings between the two schools and all six games have been decided by a combined 19 points -- 3.2 points/game. The Warhawks looked as if they were going to end the run of visitor domination in the series in 2008 as they opened up a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter. However, FAU battled back and scored with 20 seconds remaining to claim a 29-28 victory.</i>
	at Western Kentucky Oct. 16 Bowling Green, Ky. 6 p.m. Warhawks All*Access	<i>ULM will make its first trip to Bowling Green, Ky., since 1954 when they travel north to take on the Hilltoppers for the sixth time in school history and just the second time since 1955. The Warhawks defeated WKU 21-18 last season in the first meeting between the two schools as conference opponents. Frank Goodin rushed for a career-high 169 yards on 19 carries (8.9 ypc) as the Warhawks churned up 290 rushing yards in the game.</i>
	at Middle Tennessee Oct. 23 Murfreesboro, Tenn. 3:30 p.m.	<i>It will seem like deja vu for the Warhawks when they travel to Middle Tennessee on Oct. 23. ULM will stay in the same hotel in Nashville, Tenn., that they did the week before when they played Western Kentucky. The Warhawks will be looking for their first victory in Murfreesboro since 2005 and will be trying to shake the Blue Raider monkey off their back -- MTSU is 8-2 all-time against the Warhawks. Three of the past five games have been decided by three points (34-31, 2005; 43-40, 2007; 24-21, 2008)</i>
	Troy Oct. 30 Monroe, La. 2:30 p.m. Sun Belt Network	<i>It's no secret that Troy does not like coming to Malone Stadium. The Warhawks have won the last two meetings between the two schools in Monroe, including a thrilling 31-30 contest two seasons ago which spoiled Troy's run at a perfect SBC record. Trey Revell led the Warhawks on a 72-yard game-winning drive and the Trojans had a desperation field goal attempt hit off the crossbar as time expired. The Trojans lead the all-time series 8-3-1, but two of ULM's three victories have come in the last two games at Malone Stadium.</i>
	at FIU Nov. 6 Miami, Fla. TBA TBA	<i>ULM and the state of Florida have got along very well since the Warhawks joined the Sun Belt in 2001. ULM is a perfect 6-0 in Sun Belt Conference games played in the Sunshine State -- 4-0 at Florida Atlantic and 2-0 at FIU. ULM totaled 577 yards of total offense (304 rushing, 273 passing) last season in a 48-35 victory over the Golden Panthers. Frank Goodin rushed for 163 yards and three touchdowns. ULM leads the all-time series 5-1 and have scored at least 31 points in both games in Miami.</i>
	LSU Nov. 13 Baton Rouge, La. TBA SEC Network	<i>The in-state meeting between ULM and LSU will be just the second between the two schools on the football field. The Tigers won the initial contest 49-7 back in 2003 in a game that was scoreless until the 6:37 mark of the second quarter. LSU's November non-conference opponents have put a scare into the Tigers each of the past two seasons -- Troy led LSU 31-27 late in the fourth quarter in 2008 and Louisiana Tech held a 13-10 halftime lead last season.</i>
	North Texas Nov. 20 Monroe, La. TBA TBA	<i>ULM has won four of the past five meetings between the two schools and six of the last seven in Malone Stadium. UNT entered last season's contest on an offensive high after scoring 69 points against WKU the week before and having averaged 42.3 points over its previous four games -- ULM quickly ended that good feeling as they held UNT to just 268 yards of offense in a 33-6 victory. Greg James became the Sun Belt's and ULM's all-time leader in interceptions after picking off three passes in the game.</i>
	UL-Lafayette Nov. 27 Monroe, La. TBA TBA	<i>The 46th meeting between in-state rivals falls on Thanksgiving weekend in 2010. The Warhawks will be looking to reassert their dominance in the series -- ULM had won five of the previous six game and eight of the previous 11 games before ULL escaped with a pair of victories the past two seasons. The Warhawks lead the all-time series by a slim 23-22 margin and hold a 10-8 advantage in games played in Monroe.</i>

TEAM NOTES

THE SERIES

ULM and Arkansas meet for the ninth time and for the fifth time in Little Rock. All of the eight previous meetings have come since 1996 and the teams have played each other at least every other year since 2004.

The Warhawks are 0-8 all-time against the Razorbacks, but came within one point of their first victory the last time the teams met back in 2008. ULM led 27-14 early in the fourth quarter, but Arkansas scored 14-unanswered points to take a 28-27 lead with 1:22 to play. ULM had a chance to win at the end, but a 45-yard field goal missed its mark.

The teams are scheduled to meet again in 2013.

ARKANSAS WARHAWKS

Despite the close proximity to Arkansas, the ULM roster only features one player from the Natural State -- freshman cornerback Justin Criswell from Morrilton. Senior linebacker Freddy Burton is the lone Razorback from Morrilton.

A LOOK AT ULM'S 2010 SIGNING CLASS

The ULM coaching staff did not have much time to put their first recruiting class together, but looking at the result you wouldn't know.

Six of ULM's signees were nationally ranked at their position by Scout.com -- Josh Allen (OL), Ray Stovall (DE), Cordero Smith (S), Jon Fisher (OL), Centarius Donald (RB) and Je'Ron Hamm (WR).

Allen was rated as the seventh best center in the nation by ESPN.

The Warhawks hit the Lone Star State hard signing 10 players from Texas. The remainder of the class came from Louisiana (3), Oklahoma (3), Arkansas (1), Mississippi (1) and Kansas (1).

The priority was along both lines as ULM signed six players on both the offensive and defensive line.

BERRY ONE OF NINE TO COACH A POSITION

ULM head coach Todd Berry is one of just nine head coaches in the country to coach a position group on either offense or defense. Berry works with the Warhawks' quarterbacks in addition to his role as the head coach.

YOUTHFUL DEPTH CHART

ULM’s depth chart (offense/defense) features 23 players that are either freshmen or sophomores. The offense features 12 freshmen and sophomores on the 2-deep and the defense features 11 freshmen or sophomores.

MORE ON ULM’S YOUTH

The ULM roster features 50 players that are either in their first or second year with the program. ULM has just 13 seniors and 21 juniors on the 2010 roster.

MALONE IS HOME FOR 33 YEARS

The 2009 season marks the 33rd consecutive year that the Warhawks have called Malone Stadium on the campus of ULM home. Dedicated to legendary football head coach James L. Malone (1934-52) on Sept. 27, 1980, Malone Stadium has seen ULM teams post a combined 104-54-1 (.657) record.

The grounds of Malone Stadium have been the home to ULM’s National Championship team in 1987, four Southland Conference Championships, and most recently a Sun Belt Conference Championship in 2005.

80 YEARS STRONG

ULM begins its 80th season of college football this season and ninth as a member of the Sun Belt Conference. The Warhawks began playing in 1931 as a junior college and won the first of the school’s two national championships with an 8-0 record in 1935. ULM became a senior college in 1951 and joined the NAIA where it stayed until 1975 when the Warhawks became a Division I independent. The Warhawks joined Division I-AA in 1982 and won the school’s second national championship in 1987, going 13-2. ULM made the final step to college football’s top stage in 1994 as a I-A independent and then joined the Sun Belt in 2001.

WARHAWKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

ULM is 0-17 all-time against ranked opponents (since 1994) and 0-5 in season openers against a ranked opponent. The Warhawks closest upset bid against a ranked foe came at No. 22 Auburn in a 28-24 loss in 1996.

The Warhawks have played four ranked teams the past three seasons. In 2007, ULM played No. 25 Clemson and No. 15 Texas A&M in back-to-back weeks. Last year, the Warhawks opened the season at No. 10 Auburn. ULM opened the 2009 season at No. 2 Texas.

The Warhawks have played the No. 2 team in the country twice -- Florida in 2001 and Texas in 2009.

The Warhawks have opened the season five times against a ranked foe: 1994 at #8 Colorado (L, 13-48), 2003 at #13 LSU (L, 7-49), 2004 at #17 Auburn (L, 0-31), 2008 at #10 Auburn (L, 0-34), 2009 at #2 Texas (L, 20-59).

WHAT’S IN A NAME?

There is something missing from the Warhawks’ uniforms this season as the players’ last names have been removed from the back of the jerseys for the second straight season.

The coaching staff has told the players the names will be returned to the jerseys upon receiving a bowl game invitation.

TEXAS TWO-STEP

The Warhawks have 24 players on the active roster from the state of Texas, the most of any state other than Louisiana (37).

Twelve of the Texans are on the Warhawks two-deep heading into the game against Arkansas.

SUNSHINE STATE DOMINATION

The Warhawks continued their domination of the Sunshine State last season. With ULM’s victory at Florida Atlantic on Sept. 26, it improved to 6-0 all-time in Sun Belt games in the state of Florida. The following week ULM defeated FIU at home to give the Warhawks a 9-3 all-time record against the SBC Florida teams. The Warhawks travel to FIU this season and host Florida Atlantic.

WARHAWKS IN FRONT OF BIG CROWDS

The 2009 season opener at Texas saw 101,096 fans watch the Warhawks and Longhorns play -- the second largest crowd to ever watch a ULM game. The Warhawks set the Malone Stadium record in 2007 as 30,101 packed the stadium to watch the game against Grambling State -- the crowd was also the fifth largest for an on-campus game in Sun Belt history at the time.

Three of the top eight Malone Stadium crowds have come in the past five seasons and six of the top seven all-time crowds to watch a ULM game have come in the past seven seasons.

SEC STREAK CONTINUES

With ULM’s game against Arkansas on Sept. 11, the Warhawks streak of playing a team from the South-eastern Conference ever year will extended.

ULM has played an SEC team every year since moving to Division I-A in 1994.

The streak appears to be headed to an end next season as the Warhawks do not have a game against an SEC opponent scheduled. ULM is scheduled to open the 2011 season at Florida State and then play at Iowa later in the season. The Warhawks still have two other non-conference games to fill.

2010 marks the 11th time since 1994 that ULM has played at least two SEC teams in a season -- the Warhawks have played three SEC teams in a season five times (1994, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2008).

STATE-OF-THE-ART PLAYING SURFACE

The latest addition to Malone Stadium features a ProPlay monofilament fiber "grass" with a shock and drain pad and Envirofill clear coated sand infill. In addition to looking more like natural grass, ULM's new playing surface has measures in place to help prevent injuries and drain water at a rate of 10 inches per hour. The clear-coated sand used has obvious benefits over its predecessor (ground-up black rubber) in that it does not absorb as much heat, does not compact over time, and does not migrate during use. The first game played on the new surface was the 2007 season opener against Tulsa on ESPN2HD.

MALONE STADIUM OPENERS

ULM has traditionally been tough on opponents in its home openers, posting a 25-7 (.781) record in such contests over the last 32 years. ULM picked up victories in their home opener in 22 of the first 23 seasons at Malone Stadium.

ULM IN SEASON OPENERS

The Warhawks are 15-20-1 in season openers since 1975 (first year in NCAA) and 5-11 in season openers since moving to I-A in 1994.

MALONE HOME TO TV

Malone Stadium will host at least one televised game in 2010 with the possibility for two more.

The Warhawks hosted Arkansas State last season on ESPN2HD. It was the second time in three years that ULM welcomed ESPN2 to campus. ULM opened the 2007 season against Tulsa on the Worldwide Leader.

The newly formed Sun Belt Network televised ULM's home games against FIU and Middle Tennessee last season. The SBN will televise ULM's game against Troy on Oct. 30, while the games against North Texas and UL-Lafayette in November could also be televised.

OFFENSE NOTES

200-YARD RUSHING GAMES -- PAST FIVE SEASONS

ULM prides itself on its ability to run the football. Over the past five seasons, the Warhawks have rushed for over 200 yards as a team 17 times. ULM topped the 200-yard mark four times in 2009 and 2008.

The ULM offensive line held the Texas defense without a sack in the season opener (only happened twice in previous 40 games), allowed just 1.3 sacks per game (28th in the NCAA) and paved the way for ULM to average 183.9 yards per game on the ground (31st in the NCAA).

FINDING THE END ZONE

The Warhawks had an incredible streak of 18 consecutive scoring drives that resulted in a touchdown in 2008. The streak ended with a Radi Jabour 48-yard field goal against Troy.

It was the second straight season that the Warhawks had pieced together such a streak. In 2007, ULM scored touchdowns on 24-of-27 scoring drives to end the season. ULM ended 2008 scoring touchdowns on 26 of its final 28 scoring drives.

ULM scored touchdowns on 39 of their 51 scoring drives last season. The Warhawks had a string of 11 straight scoring drives that resulted in a touchdown until a Jabour 28-yard field goal on ULM's opening drive at Florida Atlantic.

GOING DEEP

Trey Revell and Luther Ambrose hooked up for a 75-yard touchdown pass and catch in the second quarter against Texas last season. It was the longest play against the Texas defense since Sept. 23, 2003, and it was ULM's longest offensive play since a 77-yard touchdown pass from Steve Jyles to Drouzon Quillen against Florida International in 2004.

SECOND FASTEST MAN IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

Junior wide receiver Luther Ambrose is the second fastest man in college football entering the 2010 season.

The speedster, who has been electronically timed at 4.28 in the 40-yard dash, finished third at the 2010 NCAA Outdoor Championship in the 100m dash with a time of 10.12 seconds. Florida running back Jeff Demps won the individual title, while a non-football player from Kentucky finished second.

The 2007 Louisiana 2A State 100 meter champion (beat USC's Joe McKnight), Ambrose finished second at the 2009 Sun Belt Outdoor Championships in the long jump (25-02.75) and the 100m (10.44) despite limited practice time on the track due to spring football practice.

Ambrose also qualified for the 2010 NCAA Regionals in the 200m and long jump. He won the Sun Belt 200m dash and was named the Outstanding Men's Track Performer and the Top Scorer at the outdoor meet.

NUMBERS ON THE BOARD

ULM has scored in 88-of-91 games dating back to Sept. 14, 2002, against McNeese State. The Warhawks were shutout 34-0 in the 2008 season opener at No. 10 Auburn snapping a streak of 32 straight games of recording at least one score. A 59-0 loss to Ole Miss later in the season marked the first time that ULM had been shutout multiple times in the same season since 2000 -- Memphis (28-0), Middle Tennessee (38-0) and Central Florida (55-0).

WARHAWKS GETTING IN DONE ON THE GROUND

The Warhawks averaged 183.9 yards per game on the ground last season which ranked 31st in the nation. The most that a ULM team has averaged on the ground was 254.5 yards back in 1951. The 2007 squad averaged 209.0 yards per game on the ground.

GOODIN MOVING UP THE CHARTS

Frank Goodin has moved into second place on the ULM career rushing touchdown list with 22 after running for 13 last season -- his 13 breaks the career-high five he set in 2008.

Calvin Dawson, who Goodin ran behind as a freshman, holds the ULM school record with 30 rushing touchdowns and 3,378 yards.

FRESHMAN UNDER CENTER

It will mark the third time in the last four seasons that a freshman has started a game at quarterback -- Trey

Revell (2007 vs. FIU), Cody Wells (2009 at Kentucky, at Troy) and Kolton Browning (2010).

The last freshman to start at quarterback in a season opener for ULM was Andy Chance in the 1999 opener against Nicholls State.

POINTS ON THE RISE

For the fifth straight season the Warhawks scored more points than the year before. ULM's 25.6 point-per-game in 2009 were the most since the 1993 squad averaged 39.2 points per game in ULM's final season as a member of the FCS (I-AA).

NEW PASS CATCHERS

The Warhawks receiving corp will have a new look to it this season as LaGregory Sapp and Darrell McNeal have moved on from the program. Sapp ranks sixth and McNeal ranks eighth all-time in ULM history in career receiving yards. McNeal also ranks sixth in school history with 16 career touchdown receptions.

Heading into the season juniors Luther Ambrose, Anthony McCall and Tim Taylor were listed as the three starters. Taylor suffered a minor injury in ULM's final scrimmage which pushed redshirt freshman Tavares Maye into a starting role against Arkansas.

McCall set a ULM freshman record with six touchdown receptions (including two against Arkansas) in 2008, Ambrose finished third at the 2010 NCAA Outdoor 100m dash finals and Maye helped lead Petal High School to the Mississippi 4-5A championship with a 10-1 record in 2008.

LIMITING THE BIG PLAY

A lot of ULM's defensive success last season came because of its ability to limit the opposing offense's ability to get the big play.

The ULM defense allowed just 47 plays of 20 yards or more last season and just nine rushing plays of 20 yards or more. That was 3.9 plays of 20+ yards and 0.75 rushing plays of 20+ yards per game. The nine rushing plays of over 20 yards ranked 18th best in the NCAA.

The previous year saw the ULM defense allow 65 plays of 20+ yards or 5.42 per game and 28 rushing plays of 20+ yards or 2.33 per game.

RETURNING STARTERS NOT SO PLENTY

Heading into the season opener at Texas last season the Warhawk defensive starters had a combined 187 starts between them.

This season, ULM's 11 defensive starters have a combined 54 starts between them (four of which came by Keavon Milton at tight end).

THE BIG GOOSE EGG

The shutout pitched by the ULM defense against Texas Southern last season was the first by ULM since Nov. 11, 2006, against FIU.

It was just the second shutout since Nov. 6, 1999, and the 14th of the NCAA era (1975-pr.)

HIDDEN YARDAGE

The Warhawk defense won the hidden yardage battle last season.

ULM had 27 sacks for a loss of 181 yards compared to just 16 sacks for a loss of 98 yards by its opponents. Despite the fact that its opponents had more tackles for loss than ULM (74.0-68.0), ULM's tackle for loss yard total was more (261-238).

The Warhawk defense averaged 21.8 negative yards a game, while opponent defenses averaged 19.8 negative yards per game.

ULM averaged 15.1 sack yards per game, while allowing just 8.2 sack yards per game.

NOWHERE TO RUN

ULM held six teams to under 100 yards rushing last season and held nine teams under its season rushing total.

PRELOW IN PRIMETIME

Junior safety Darius Prelow came on strong at the end of the 2008 recording 14 tackles over the final four contests.

He picked up where he left off in the season opener last season at Texas, Prelow led the Warhawks with 10 tackles and also had a pass breakup. He recorded a career-high 11 stops, including his first tackle for loss in ULM's victory over Arkansas State.

He finished the season second in the Sun Belt and 26th in the NCAA averaging 1.09 pass break ups per game.

BREAKING UP IS HARD TO DO

The Warhawk defenders broke up passes at a feverish rate last season. Against FIU, ULM recorded 10 pass break ups and then against Arkansas State ULM had nine pass break ups.

WELCOME BACK MR. GLENN

The Warhawks received a nice surprise at the start of fall camp when nose tackle Bryan Glenn was granted a sixth year of eligibility. Glenn missed spring ball and summer workouts because of the uncertainty about his eligibility.

SWITCHING SIDES

Sophomore Keavon Milton and redshirt freshman Emanuel Jefferies both moved over to defensive end from tight end. Jefferies moved during the spring and Milton made the switch right before the start of fall camp.

Milton, who started four games and caught two touchdown passes last season, impressed so much during camp that he was named a starter heading into the season opener.

ULM HEAD COACH TODD BERRY

(29-60; 9TH OVERALL SEASON / 0-0; 1ST SEASON AT ULM)



Highly regarded as an offensive mastermind, Todd Berry returns to ULM as the program's 14th head coach.

Berry, a 27-year coaching veteran, was ULM's offensive coordinator from 2004-05, where he helped guide the Warhawks to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and quarterback Steven Jyles to Sun Belt Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year honors.

"Todd Berry is the right man at the right time for ULM," ULM Director of Athletics Bobby Staub said. "He's here to build a winning program both on and off the field and with the support of the entire Warhawk family, I'm quite confident he'll be successful in doing just that."

Berry has diligently displayed a "championship" mentality and approach which he has infused into his players, staff, administrators and supporters, all with an eye for competing

for a Sun Belt Conference championship as soon as possible.

In fact, it was that same mentality that Berry used to resurrect Illinois State's football program. The day he was named the Redbirds' head football coach in 1996, he began talking about ISU teams playing for national championships. This for an institution that had experienced little success on the gridiron and had been on the verge of dropping the sport due to its checkered past. Just four years later, Berry had completed one of the most amazing turnarounds in Division I-AA history, guiding his revamped Illinois State program all the way to the national semifinals in 1999.

During a three-year tenure as the offensive coordinator at UNLV, Berry developed the top quarterback duo in the Mountain West Conference with record-setters Omar Clayton and Mike Clausen. The pair combined to throw for 2,693 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2009. Clayton is UNLV's career leader in completion percentage and is the only player in Rebel history to have thrown for over 300 yards and rushed for over 100 yards in a game.

Clausen set a UNLV freshman record with 119 consecutive pass attempts without an interception in 2008 - a mark that fell just 19 attempts short of the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision record. Clayton threw 18 touchdown passes in 2008 - the fourth most in UNLV history and most since 1996 - and set the UNLV school record by attempting 173 passes without an interception. The duo combined for just six interceptions during the 2008 season to tie the school record.

Despite coaching in Nevada, Berry continued to recruit two areas that ULM relies heavily on every year - Florida and Texas. ULM had 27 players on its roster in 2009 from those two states.

Berry split his stints at ULM and UNLV with one season as the quarterbacks coach at the University of Miami in 2006.

His first stop in Monroe followed a four-year run, 2000-03, as the head coach at Army. Berry's teams set 25 Academy records during his tenure and he is the last Army coach to defeat Navy (26-17, 2001). He was a member of the Board of Trustees of the American Football Coaches Association from 2001-03 -- Berry was reappointed to the Board during the spring of 2010.

His tenure at Army followed a four-year stint at Illinois State (1996-99) where Berry presided over one of the most remarkable turnarounds in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) history. The team had not won a conference title since 1950, but under Berry the Redbirds advanced to the NCAA FCS Playoffs in his third season and finished in the FCS top 20.

The following year, ISU became just the third team to ever run through its Gateway Conference schedule unblemished as they advanced to the FCS semifinals.

Todd Berry was introduced as ULM's 14th head coach on December 16, 2009

Under Berry's direction, Illinois State established or equaled 100 individual and team records on a game, season and career levels. The Redbirds were listed in the top 25 ranking for 19 consecutive weeks. In addition, his players captured 73 postseason awards including four Academic All-America honors and six All-America distinctions.

He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the top collegiate head coach at the Division I-AA level, each of his last two years at ISU. In addition, he was a two-time Gateway Conference Coach of the Year honoree and the 1999 GTE Region 4 Coach of the Year.

Before arriving at ISU, Berry spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at East Carolina University under head coach Steve Logan. He played a vital role on the Pirate teams that reached the Liberty Bowl in 1994 and 1995.

"I want to be aggressive in all facets of the game" Berry has said in the past. "I know that you win with defense first and I appreciate that. Most of my background is on offense, but to be an effective offensive coordinator you have to understand defense."

A 1983 graduate of the University of Tulsa, Berry has worked for some well-known head coaches during his career, holding down assistant positions on the staffs of Logan at East Carolina, John Cooper at the University of Tulsa, and Johnny Majors at the University of Tennessee.

While in high school, Berry was an all-state selection at football (quarterback) and track and field at Miami (Okla.) High School. At Tulsa, he played quarterback for the Golden Hurricane from 1979 to 1981 before suffering a career-ending knee injury.

"Coming out of high school, football was significant to me, but I also wanted to attend a school that possessed a good mix of academics-that was the reason I was going to college, first and foremost. I turned down some more traditional 'Top 10 football' programs in order to attend a school with a nice blend of academics and athletics."

Berry began his coaching career as an undergraduate at Tulsa with Cooper before moving to Tennessee as a graduate assistant and tight ends coach in 1983 when the Volunteers advanced to the Florida Citrus Bowl at year's end.

Following a one-year return to his alma mater as receivers coach in 1984, Berry headed to Oklahoma State in 1985, where he worked with the likes of future National Football League standout Thurman Thomas. He then served a three-year stint as the offensive coordinator at the Tennessee-Martin, holding that position from 1986 through 1988.

While at UT-Martin, Berry coached the Pacers to a top-five finish in Division II passing offense, total offense, and scoring offense. In his final season, all four receivers, the running back and quarterback signed professional contracts.

He also enjoyed a two-year tour at Mississippi State, coaching wide receivers, and one campaign with at Southeast Missouri State, as offensive coordinator, before joining Logan's staff at ECU.

Berry is the son of the late Rueben Berry, a former Canadian Football League head coach and longtime mentor of the Saskatchewan Rough Riders.

The 49-year old Berry and his wife, Lisa have two daughters: Jordan, 23, and Ryleigh, 8.

AUSTIN, Texas - Heisman Trophy finalist Colt McCoy threw for 317 yards and two touchdowns to lead No. 2 Texas past ULM 59-20 in both teams' season opener in front of a Texas Memorial Stadium record crowd of 101,096.

Cody Johnson scored the first three touchdowns of the night for the Longhorns (1-0) on 1-yard runs. Texas became the highest-ranked team that the Warhawks (0-1) have squared off against in a season opener.

McCoy, who finished second behind Oklahoma quarterback Sam Bradford for the Heisman Trophy in 2008, completed 21-of-29 passes on the night.

In his third career start and first as ULM's number one quarterback, junior Trey Revell completed 14-of-30 passes for 197 yards and one touchdown. Sophomore wide receiver Luther Ambrose showed his big-play capability with a 75-yard touchdown reception, 25 rushing yards and 105 kick return yards.

ULM's new 3-3-5 defense was tested by the high-powered Texas offense, but came up with some big plays. Otis Stamps intercepted McCoy in the second quarter and the Warhawks forced a trio of fumbles and recovered two. Two of Texas' touchdowns came on a short field due to ULM turnovers.

The Warhawks gave Texas the one thing it didn't need, a short field on its first possession of the game. After a bad snap led to a fumble on ULM's second play of the game, Johnson found the end zone four plays later.

Following Johnson's second touchdown of the game and a ULM three-and-out, the Warhawk defense gave ULM its first scoring opportunity of the night. Jordan Landry forced a Vondrell McGee fumble and Josh Thomas ran it back 29 yards to the Longhorns' 8-yard line.

Radi Jabour gave the Warhawks their first points of the season four plays later connecting on a 24-yard field goal with 4:23 to play in the opening quarter. He would later add a 21-yard field goal in the fourth quarter.

Johnson, who finished the game with 27 yards on 11 carries, scored his third touchdown of the night with 11:02 to play in the opening half to stretch the Texas lead out to 21-3.

On the ensuing possession, Revell and Ambrose hooked up for a 75-yard touchdown pass down the ULM sideline - the longest play for ULM since 2004 and the longest against a Texas defense since 2003.

D.J. Moore quickly killed any momentum ULM had built up taking the following kickoff back 89 yards for a touchdown and a 28-10 Texas lead.

The Warhawks had a prime opportunity to get back into the game after Stamps' interception, which he returned to the Texas 39-yard line, with just over nine minutes to play in the opening half. However, ULM was not able to capitalize on the turnover as the Longhorns forced a punt.

McCoy quickly atoned for his interception as he completed a 14-yard pass on a third-and-long from Texas' 8-yard line and then found Jordan Shipley for a 78-yard touchdown on the very next play. Hunter Lawrence added a 32-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter to give Texas a 38-10 lead at the break.

McCoy moved over the 10,000-yard mark for his career with a 14-yard touchdown pass to John Chiles on the Longhorns opening drive of the second half. McGee tacked on a 4-yard touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter to extend the lead out to 52-10.

The ULM offense found its groove in the fourth quarter putting together a pair of nine-play, 60-plus yard drives. Jabour's second field goal of the night capped the first drive and a 13-yard run by Frank Goodin was the final score of the night.

MONROE, La.-ULM scored on its first three possessions of the game and rolled to a 58-0 victory over Texas Southern in the Warhawks' home opener at Malone Stadium.

ULM quarterback Trey Revell completed his first 12 pass attempts of the game and finished the night 17-of-19 for 238 yards and two touchdowns - his 89.5 completion percentage broke Doug Pederson's school record of 88.3 percent (16-of-18) set in 1990.

Revell's 12 straight completions to open tonight's game, combined with his final three passes at No. 2 Texas last week, set a ULM school record for consecutive completions. His 15 consecutive completions broke Wendell Lowery's record of 11 straight set

in 1991.

True backfield companion running back Frank Goodin rushed for 105 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, despite a heavy rain that battered the Monroe area most of the night.

Goodin's three touchdowns tied him for the most in head coach Charlie Weatherbie's seven seasons and were just one shy of the school record - he accomplished all of this despite taking only two snaps in the second half.

True freshman running back Isaiah Newsome carried the ball 22 times for 158 yards to give the Warhawks two players with over 100 yards rushing. It marked the first time two Warhawks went over the century mark in the same game since Nov. 3, 2007, when Calvin Dawson and Kinsmon Lancaster ran wild against Middle Tennessee.

ULM (1-1) held Texas Southern to 103 yards of total offense and just six yards on the ground, while the Warhawks churned up 345 yards on the ground and 247 through the air for 592 total yards. The shutout pitched by the ULM defense was the first since a 35-0 victory at Florida International in 2006.

The 58-point margin of victory was the second largest in ULM history, trailing just a 66-0 victory over Ouachita Baptist in 1951. The 55 points scored by ULM were the most by the Warhawks since a 55-18 victory over Nicholls State in 1981.

The Warhawks took the opening drive 59 yards with a heavy dose of the yardage coming from Goodin, who carried the ball on five of the eight plays. Luther Ambrose capped the drive with the first rushing touchdown of his career from 16 yards out.

Following a three-and-out by the ULM defense, Goodin scored his first touchdown of the night from three yards out. On the scoring drive, a 38-yard strike from Revell to LaGregory Sapp pulled the Warhawks out of a 2nd-and-23 hole and gave them a 1st-and-goal from the 10-yard line.

Another three-and-out by the ULM defense gave the Warhawks excellent field position on their 41-yard line. Revell and Sapp hooked up on another big play, this one for 29 yards, to put the Warhawks in prime scoring position. Rodney Lovett found the end zone five plays later for the second rushing touchdown of his career and a 21-0 ULM lead.

The Tigers (0-2) forced the Warhawks to punt for the first time on their next possession, but ULM responded punching it into the end zone on its next two drives on touchdown runs of three and 10 yards by Goodin to give ULM a 35-0 lead.

Texas Southern didn't pick up a first down without the help of a ULM penalty until the four-minute mark of the second quarter. The Warhawks held Texas Southern to just 27 yards of offense in the opening half and just one yard on the ground. In comparison, the Warhawks put up 379 yards in the first half with a balanced attack - 186 on the ground and 193 through the air.

Redshirt freshman tight end Keavon Milton hauled in his first career touchdown reception with just under five minutes to play in the third quarter. The 7-yard strike was the final pass of the night for Revell as he gave way to redshirt freshman Cody Wells for the remainder of the game.

ULM scored for the final time with just under a minute to play in the game when Wells connected with Alvin Jordan on a 7-yard touchdown pass. The touchdown pass marked the first career touchdowns for both Jordan and Wells.

TEMPE, Ariz.—Arizona State took advantage of a short field and ULM mistakes to defeat the Warhawks 38-14 in front of 43,780 fans at Sun Devil Stadium.

The Warhawks committed three turnovers on the night and Arizona State (2-0) had four scoring drives of less than 60 yards. The combination was too much for ULM to overcome against the Pac-10 Sun Devils.

Arizona State opened the game with a bang as Omar Bolden returned the opening kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown. The Sun Devils then got a short field taking possession on the ULM 40 thanks to a three-and-out and a 16-yard punt by the Warhawks.

Nine plays later ASU took a 14-0 lead on a 1-yard touchdown run by Dimitri Nance. The score came after a controversial catch at the 1-yard line that was upheld by the replay official.

Nance finished the game with 82 yards on 17 carries and two touchdowns, while quarterback Danny Sullivan was 19-for-31 for a career-high 220 yards and a touchdown pass.

ULM running back Frank Goodin moved into eighth place on the Warhawks' career rushing list with 1,606 yards passing Bobby Scafield, Cisco Richard and Marquis Williams. He finished the night with 62 yards on 15 carries.

One week after setting ULM records for consecutive completions (15) and single-game completion percentage (89.5), quarterback Trey Revell was not quite as sharp against the attacking ASU defense. He finished the night 10-of-23 for 126 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions.

For the second time this season against a Big Six Conference school, the ULM offensive line did not allow a sack. The Warhawks entered the game ranked 13th in the nation having allowed just one sack all season. ULM also out rushed the Sun Devils 136 to 107 on the game.

ULM defensive end Aaron Morgan had another monster night finishing with a game-high eight tackles and three sacks. Through three games he has six sacks and eight tackles for loss – he finished last season with six sacks and 13 tackles for loss.

On the Sun Devils possession following their second touchdown, the Warhawks held on fourth down and then drove down to the ASU 11-yard line thanks to three plays of 13 yards or more. However, the drive stalled as Bolden intercepted Revell on the ULM 1-yard line with just seconds to play in the opening quarter.

The Warhawk defense held following the interception and the offense answered driving 61 yards on seven plays to make it a one-possession game, 14-7. Darrell McNeal had a pair of third-down catches on the drive – the first one, a 19-yard strike, extended his consecutive games streak with a catch to 25 games and his second was a 14-yard touchdown reception. McNeal finished the game with four catches for 50 yards.

ASU quickly answered the ULM (1-2) score thanks to another big kickoff return. Keelan Johnson returned the Grant Clayton kick 44 yards out to the ASU 49-yard line. Four plays later, Chris McGaha made a circus catch in the end zone on a 9-yard strike from Sullivan for the score.

Faced with another short field, the Warhawk defense made a big stand at the end of the first half. Travis Goethel intercepted Revell on a tipped ball and returned it all the way to the ULM 9-yard line. Troy Evans sacked Sullivan for an 8-yard loss on first down and the Warhawks held ASU to a 24-yard field goal by Bobby Wenzig. The Sun Devils took a 24-7 lead into the half.

The Warhawk defense came up with a big stop on ASU's opening possession of the second half forcing a punt from ASU's 12-yard line, but McNeal muffed the punt return and the Sun Devils recovered to keep their drive alive. They would capitalize eight plays later on Nance's second 1-yard touchdown run of the night.

Sullivan extended the Sun Devil lead out to 38-7 with a 1-yard plunge at the end of the third quarter. The drive was kept alive by a pass interference call against the Warhawks on a 4th-and-12 from the ULM 32-yard line.

After setting a ULM freshman record with six touchdown receptions a year ago, Anthony McCall caught his first of 2009 on a 4-yard slant pass from Revell late in the fourth quarter.

FT. LAUDERDALE, Fla.—Trey Revell completed a career-high 18 passes for 207 yards and rushed for a pair of touchdowns to lead ULM to a 27-25 victory at Florida Atlantic in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both schools.

The series, which was just five games old prior to tonight's installment, has always had a flair for the dramatic. Neither team had won by more than a touchdown, the average margin of victory was 3.4 points and the visitor had won each game.

This game played no different as the Warhawks (2-2, 1-0 Sun Belt) won their first conference opener since, ironically, they beat Florida Atlantic in Ft. Lauderdale in 2005 – the Warhawks went on to claim a share of the Sun Belt title that season. ULM now improves to 6-0 in the state of Florida in Sun Belt Conference games.

Revell finished the night with 48 yards on the ground on 11 carries. His favorite target was LaGregory Sapp, who caught a season-high seven passes for 96 yards. Darrell McNeal extended his consecutive games with a reception streak to 26 games and finished with five grabs for 51 yards.

Frank Goodin moved into sixth place on the ULM career rushing list with 1,677 after rushing for 71 yards on 18 carries. His 14-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter was his fifth of the season to tie his career high. The touchdown also moved him into a tie for eighth place all-time in ULM history with 14 rushing scores.

FAU pulled with two, 20-18, with a 33-yard Ross Gornall field goal on the opening play of the fourth quarter. The Warhawks answered FAU's three points with seven points of their own. Revell completed a pair of passes on the drive and Goodin tip-toed the sideline for a 14-yard score and 27-18 ULM lead with 12:04 to play in the game.

FAU (0-3, 0-1) pulled with the final two-point margin on a 5-yard touchdown pass from Rusty Smith to Darian Williams with 3:05 to play in the game. The Warhawks then milked the clock down to the two minute mark after recovering the onside kick. Smith finished the night 30-of-50 for 347 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Following a delay of game penalty on 4th-and-1, Scott Love angled a perfect punt out-of-bounds at the Florida Atlantic 6-yard line. The Owls were forced to go the length of the field with no timeouts remaining. The Warhawk defense came up with their biggest stop of the night not allowing Florida Atlantic past its own 25-yard line until the final play against an extreme prevent defense.

After the ULM defense held FAU on the game's first possession, the Warhawks marched down the field with a chunk of the yardage coming on a 31-yard reception by Sapp. However, the drive stalled on the 11-yard line and Radi Jabour booted a 28-yard field goal to give the Warhawks an early 3-0 lead – the field goal snapped a streak of 11 straight scoring drives by ULM that resulted in a touchdown.

FAU responded with a methodical 10-play drive kept alive by a pair of third-down receptions by tight end Jason Harmon of 14 and 19 yards. Alfred Morris capped the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run, but Gornall missed the extra point attempt. Morris finished his night with 122 yards on 23 carries.

Revell wasted no time putting the Warhawks back on top on the Warhawks next drive. The junior signal caller hooked up with McNeal for 16 yards and Sapp for 22 yards before scoring from seven yards out for his first career rushing touchdown.

After a stop by the ULM defense, Mickey Groody booted a 46-yard punt that the Owls downed on ULM's 1-yard line. On the Warhawks first play of the drive, Daniel Joseph and Michael Lockley stopped Goodin in the end zone for a safety.

The ULM offense, which tallied 222 total yards in the opening half, marched 66 yards down the field on 10 plays. Revell put the Warhawks up 17-8 with his second rushing touchdown – a 7-yard run up the middle – in the second quarter.

A heavy dose of Morris and two big pass plays by Smith pulled the Owls within two, 17-15, at the half. Morris ran five times for 29 yards on the drive and Smith had a pair of 18-yard completions, including one to Chris Bonner for a touchdown on 1:25 to play in the opening half.

Revell completed back-to-back passes of 13 yards and 17 yards to McNeal and Sapp, respectively, before Jabour booted a season-high 39-yard field goal as time expired to give the Warhawks a 20-15 lead at the break.

MONROE, La. - Junior running back Frank Goodin ran for a career-high 163 yards and three touchdowns and junior quarterback Trey Revell threw for a career-best 273 yards with a career-high 19 completions and two touchdowns as ULM defeated FIU, 48-35, at Malone Stadium.

After a slow start offensively that saw the Warhawks earn just one first down in their first four possessions, the ULM offense hit its stride, piling up 577 yards of total offense. Senior wide receiver Darrell McNeal finished the day with six catches for 108 yards and two touchdowns.

With the victory, ULM (3-2, 2-0 Sun Belt) earned its first 2-0 start in conference play since 2005. The Warhawks' 45 points is the most

they have ever scored in a Sun Belt victory.

Each team opened the contest with a three-and-out before FIU (0-4, 0-1) created a turnover on ULM's second possession of the contest. Scott Bryant intercepted a tipped Revell pass and returned the interception nine yards to the Warhawk 21-yard line. On the first play following the interception, FIU took the lead as Paul McCall found Greg Ellingson in the back corner of the end zone for a touchdown.

ULM tied the score with a 68-yard touchdown drive, capped by a 9-yard Revell touchdown run. Facing a 3rd-and-7 at the FIU 24, ULM kept the drive alive as Revell connected with sophomore wide receiver Luther Ambrose for eight yards and a first down. ULM picked up seven yards on a first down pass before Revell's 9-yard quarterback keeper up the middle got the Warhawks in the end zone.

ULM took its first lead of the contest on its next possession as the Warhawks marched 94 yards in 11 plays, capped by a 9-yard touchdown run by Goodin. Backed up on its own 6-yard line to begin the drive, ULM got out of the shadow of its own end zone with a 52-yard reception by senior wide receiver LaGregory Sapp on the second play of the drive. Seven plays later, the ULM drive stayed alive as the result of a FIU pass interference penalty on a 3rd-and-18. After the penalty gave the Warhawks a 1st-and-goal, Goodin found the end zone on third down to give ULM a 14-7 lead.

FIU wasted little time coming back to tie the game, 14-14, as the Panthers marched 66 yards on just six plays in 1:46. Darriert Perry finished off the drive for FIU with an 8-yard touchdown scamper.

A 26-yard pass from Revell to McNeal and a 20-yard pass from Revell to junior tight end Alvin Jordan had the Warhawks quickly knocking on the door once again, putting ULM at the FIU 8-yard line just three plays into the ensuing drive. Junior running back Rodney Lovett gained four yards on 1st-and-goal before Revell hooked up with McNeal again for a touchdown. McNeal made a diving catch in the back of the end zone to once again give the Warhawks the lead.

An interception by senior defensive back James Truxillo on FIU's next drive gave ULM the chance to increase its lead before the intermission. The Warhawks moved the ball 42 yards before sophomore kicker Radi Jabour connected on a 34-yard field goal with 12 seconds remaining in the half to give ULM a 24-14 advantage going into the break.

FIU got the ball to start the second half and moved 59 yards in eight plays for a touchdown to trim the ULM lead back to three, 24-21. The Panthers scored on a 27-yard pass from McCall to T.Y. Hilton.

The Warhawks answered right back as Ambrose returned the kickoff 54 yards to the FIU 41-yard line. On the second play from scrimmage, Goodin went 35 yards around the left end for a touchdown to push the ULM lead back to 10, 31-21, with 11:26 to play in the third quarter.

Jarvis Wilson returned a ULM fumble to the Warhawk 15-yard line to set up the Panthers with great field position. FIU cashed in on the third play from scrimmage following the fumble as McCall hooked up with Dudley LaPorte for a 14-yard score.

The Warhawks answered the FIU score once again as ULM registered an eight-play, 59-yard drive to push the ULM lead back to 10 points. Facing a 3rd-and-16, ULM picked up a first down via a personal foul penalty to FIU to keep the drive alive at the Golden Panther 31-yard line. Three plays after the penalty, Revell found McNeal for their second scoring hookup of the day from 18 yards out.

ULM increased its lead to 13 with a career-long-tying 48-yard field goal by Jabour. The field goal capped an 11-play, 45-yard drive that took 6:26 and gave the Warhawks a 41-28 advantage with 4:41 to play.

Goodin scored his third touchdown of the day with a 23-yard scoring run, giving ULM a 48-28 lead with 1:37 to play before Perry capped the scoring for FIU with a 2-yard touchdown run.

MONROE, La. - ULM overcame Arkansas State and the elements for a 16-10 victory over the Red Wolves on ESPN2 at Malone Stadium. Junior running back Frank Goodin ran for 97 yards on 27 carries with a touchdown. With the win, ULM improves to 4-2, 3-0 in conference, marking just the second time in school history that the Warhawks have won their first three Sun Belt contests.

With 4:49 to play in the contest, the Red Wolves took over on their own 20-yard line trailing by six. Arkansas State (1-4, 0-2) moved the ball down to the ULM 20, but that would be as close as they would get to the end zone.

An illegal participation penalty backed the Red Wolves up to the Warhawk 25-yard line before back-to-back sacks by sophomore defensive end Troy Evans pushed ASU back to the ULM 43. Facing a 4th-and-33 with 30 seconds remaining, Arkansas State's desperation Hail Mary fell incomplete and the Warhawks held on for the win.

Despite a driving rainstorm that lasted through most of the first half, ULM took the lead through the air just 56 seconds into the contest as junior quarterback Trey Revell found senior wide receiver LaGregory Sapp over the top of the Arkansas State defense for a 48-yard touchdown pass on the second play from scrimmage. The play was the third-longest of the season for the Warhawks and the second-longest scoring play.

Following a pair of punts by both teams, ULM forced a turnover deep in Arkansas State territory. ASU quarterback Corey Leonard lost control of the football and the ball was recovered by ULM senior defense tackle Aaron Williams on the Arkansas State 9-yard line.

The Warhawks cashed in on the turnover with a 20-yard field goal by sophomore kicker Radi Jabour to increase the ULM lead to 10-0 with 1:45 to play in the first quarter.

The ULM defense held Arkansas State to -9 yards on 11 plays in the first quarter.

Early in the second quarter with ULM knocking on the door again, Revell was intercepted in the end zone by Kelcie McCray. Revell also injured his hand on the play and did not return; he finished the contest 3-of-8 through the air for 83 yards with a touchdown and an interception and gained nine yards on four rushes.

The Warhawks increased their lead further when they converted another Arkansas State turnover into points. Sophomore defensive back Nate Brown intercepted a Leonard pass to setup ULM on its own 47-yard line with 6:49 to play in the second quarter. On a 3rd-and-9, redshirt freshman backup quarterback Cody Wells hit sophomore wide receiver Luther Ambrose for a 39-yard completion to the Arkansas State 1-yard line. On 1st-and-goal, Goodin leaped over the pile to for a touchdown, Jabour's extra-point kick was blocked. The Warhawks took the 16-0 lead into halftime.

Arkansas State scored of the first possession of the second half, marching 61 yards in 10 plays, using 4:02. Leonard hooked up with Brandon Thompkins from 14 yards out for the score.

After a pair of punts by ULM, sandwiched around a punt by Arkansas State, the Red Wolves cut the Warhawk lead to six on a 49-yard field goal by Ryan Wilbourne. The Red Wolves moved the ball to the ULM 24-yard line before penalties backed ASU up to the ULM 32-yard line. Wilbourne then converted the field goal to trim the ULM lead to 16-10 with 2:32 to play in the third quarter.

On its first drive of the fourth quarter, ULM drove 77 yards in 17 plays, using 8:45, but came up empty on the drive as a 25-yard field goal attempt by Jabour hit the left upright.

The missed field goal setup Arkansas State's dramatic final drive that was stymied by the pair of sacks by Evans.

Wells finished the game 5-of-9 for 67 yards in relief of Revell, Leonard ended the night 20-of-39 for 234 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions.

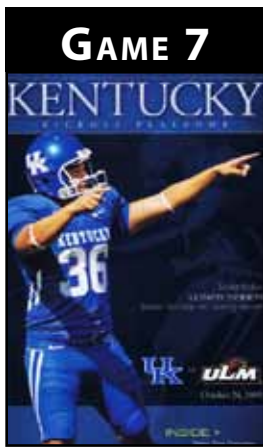

LEXINGTON, Ky.-Kentucky extended its non-conference win streak to 17 games with a 36-13 victory over visiting ULM at Commonwealth Stadium.

Making the first start of his collegiate career, ULM redshirt freshman Cody Wells completed 21-of-44 pass attempts for 267 yards and a touchdown. Wells was playing in place of Trey Revell who suffered a broken thumb in ULM's victory over Arkansas State on Oct. 13. The 44 pass attempts by Wells were the most by a ULM quarterback since Steven Jyles threw 49 passes against Florida International on Nov. 5, 2005.

LaGregory Sapp caught seven passes for a season-high 121 yards in the loss for the Warhawks, while Frank Goodin rushed for 55 yards on 16 carries.

The Warhawks outgained Kentucky 377-330 for the game, but big plays by the Wildcats (4-3, 1-3 SEC) and missed opportunities by ULM (4-3, 3-0 Sun Belt) proved to be the difference in the game.

Three players took snaps at quarterback for the Wildcats led by Will Fidler who was 8-for-13 for 82 yards. The Warhawk defense held Kentucky without a point in the second half and allowed just 21 of the 36 points scored in the game. ULM held the SEC's leader in all-purpose yards Derrick Locke to just 36 yards on 10 carries.

The Wildcats took a 7-0 lead on their first possession of the game after forcing ULM into a three-and-out on its opening drive. John Conner scored from 1-yard out two plays after he broke a 39-yard run through the middle of the Warhawk defense.

Following another ULM three-and-out, Randall Cobb returned Scott Love's punt 73 yards for his first career punt return for a touchdown. Kentucky's last punt return for a touchdown came against ULM when the teams last met in 2006.

The Warhawks had an opportunity to get on the board late in the first quarter following Nate Brown's second interception in as many games for ULM. After driving down to the Kentucky 6-yard line, a penalty and a pair of incomplete passes forced a ULM 27-yard field goal attempt. Wells, who is also ULM's holder, couldn't handle a high snap and was forced to throw the ball into the end zone instead of Radi Jabour attempting the field goal.

Cobb continued his personal assault on the Warhawks scoring from 11 yards out with 11:00 minutes to play in the opening half to push the Kentucky lead out to 21-0. Cobb, who entered the game ranked fifth in the Southeastern Conference in all-purpose yards per game (129.5), also had an 11-yard reception and a 28-yard run on the scoring drive.

Wells put the Warhawks on the board with 10-yard touchdown pass to Luther Ambrose with 4:52 remaining in the half - Ambrose finished with four catches for 50 yards and also rushed for 34 yards on four carries. Wells was 4-for-5 through the air on the drive including completing three third-down passes for 54 yards - he opened the game completing seven of his first nine attempts on third down.

It only took the Wildcats four plays to extend their lead back out to 21 points. Cobb hooked up with Chris Matthews for a 37-yard gain to the ULM 25-yard line and then on the next play Fidler found Conner down the sideline for a touchdown.

ULM was denied a chance to score at the end of the half as the game clock hit zero despite a heavy protest by the Warhawk coaching staff. The Warhawks drove down to the Kentucky 4-yard line and with seven seconds remaining on the clock threw the ball into the end zone. The officials ruled that the clock expired on the incomplection which denied ULM a field goal attempt right before the break.

The Warhawks held Kentucky on its opening drive of the second half and took the ensuing possession down to the Wildcats 14-yard line. The drive stalled and a 31-yard field goal attempt by Jabour sailed wide left. ULM pulled within 15, 28-13, on a 3-yard touchdown run by Goodin in the final minute of the third quarter. The score was the 19th of his career moving him into a tie for fourth place in ULM history with Joe Profit.

Kentucky pulled away early in the fourth quarter picking up a safety after ULM's Otis Stamps intercepted Fidler on the Kentucky 3-yard line. Randall Burden extended the Wildcat lead out to 36-13 with a 50-yard interception return for a touchdown.

TROY, Ala.-Levi Brown threw for 378 yards and Jerrel Jernigan caught 13 passes for 203 yards and a touchdown to lead Troy to a 42-21 victory over ULM in a battle of Sun Belt Conference unbeaten at Movie Gallery Stadium.

Troy (6-2, 5-0 Sun Belt), who extended its win streak to six games, scored 14-unanswered points at the beginning of the first and third quarters to pull away from the Warhawks (4-4, 3-1).

Brown completed 28-of-41 passes and threw for four touchdowns, while ULM's Cody Wells completed 23-of-36 passes for a career-high 279 yards and a career-high three touchdowns in just his second collegiate start. Wells' favorite target of the night was

LaGregory Sapp who caught seven passes for 107 yards - his second straight game with over 100 yards receiving. Wells threw touchdown strikes to Darrell McNeal and one to Alvin Jordan.

The story of the game for ULM was similar to the one at Kentucky last week. The Warhawks were able to move the ball on the Trojan defense, but were unable to take advantage of its scoring opportunities. ULM had the ball on the Troy side of the field eight times on the night and was able to score on just three of those chances. Last week at Kentucky the Warhawks were 2-of-5 inside the red zone.

The total yardage for both clubs was near even with the Trojans holding a slight 428-396 advantage, however the Warhawks turned the ball over four times to just one by Troy.

The opening quarter played out like a nightmare for the Warhawks as they squandered a pair of scoring opportunities and the Trojans jumped out to a 14-0 lead.

Troy scored on its first two possessions of the game totaling 166 yards in the process. DuJuan Harris scored the first touchdown on a 2-yard run and Brown hooked up with Josh Jarboe for a 16-yard touchdown strike for the second score.

On their third possession of the game the Warhawks marched down to Troy's 25-yard line, but Wells was intercepted by Bryan Willis in the end zone to kill the drive. The Warhawks next possession reached the Troy 8-yard line, but Radi Jabour missed a 27-yard field goal as time expired in the opening quarter.

ULM found the end zone for the first time as Wells and McNeal hooked up for a 7-yard touchdown pass with just under eight minutes to play in the half. Frank Goodin set up the scoring drive with a 38-yard run down to the Troy 12-yard line on the first play of the drive - Goodin finished the game with 94 yards on 20 carries.

After being held to just seven yards on its three possessions following its opening two scoring drives, Troy was forced to dig deep into the playbook to pull out a flea-flicker which resulted in a 33-yard touchdown pass from Brown to Chip Reeves. The drive was set up by a Jernigan 41-yard kickoff return to the ULM 49-yard line.

Momentum took a huge swing going into the break as the Warhawks scored right before the half on a 3-yard touchdown pass by Wells to Jordan. The score capped a five-play drive after a special teams mishap by the Trojans gave the Warhawks the ball on the Troy 33-yard line with 1:46 to play in the half.

After being stopped on three straight plays at the 50-yard line, Troy punter Will Goggans could not handle the snap from Wes Henry and in his attempt to make a play he threw the ball forward and was intercepted by Aaron Morgan.

The Warhawks opened the second half with a promising drive that reached the Troy 37-yard line, but two incomplete passes and a 1-yard gain stalled the drive. Troy killed any halftime momentum the Warhawks had with a 7-play, 87-yard drive capped by a 22-yard touchdown pass from Brown to Andrew Davis.

ULM again drove the ball into Troy territory reaching the 29-yard line after converting on a 4th-and-4 thanks to a Wells to Sapp completion. However, the Warhawks lost 15 yards on the first-down play and were unable to recover.

The Trojans extended their lead to 35-14 thanks to a little luck on the ensuing drive. Facing a 3rd-and-5, Brown threw a ball that was tipped by a ULM defender, but Jernigan was in the right place at the right time and hauled in the free ball and took it 41 yards for a score.

The Warhawks answered as Wells completed all four of his pass attempts on the next drive, including a 21-yard completion to Jordan that was ruled incomplete on the field but overturned by replay. On the next play, Wells threw his second touchdown pass of the night to McNeal, this one from 26 yards out.

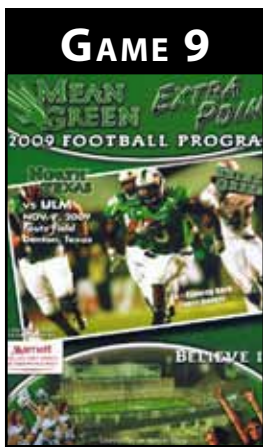

DENTON, Texas—ULM held the Sun Belt Conference's top scoring and rushing offense in check in a 33-6 victory over North Texas at Fouts Field.

North Texas entered the game leading the Sun Belt averaging 30.8 points and 197.9 rushing yards per game. The Warhawks (5-4, 4-1 Sun Belt) held the Mean Green to 79 yards on the ground and limited the nation's ninth-leading rusher, Lance Dunbar, to just 40 yards on 15 carries— 80 yards below his season average.

ULM safety Greg James made history picking off three Riley Dodge passes on Saturday. He became the Sun Belt Conference's and ULM's all-time interception leader and regained the lead

among active players in the NCAA with 16 career interceptions. James had gone 15 games without an interception before today's game.

The ULM defense sacked North Texas quarterback Riley Dodge three times on the game after the Mean Green ended the game ranked fifth in the NCAA having allowed just five sacks all season long.

Frank Goodin scored a pair of rushing touchdowns to move into a tie for third on the ULM single-season rushing touchdown list with 12 and a tie for third on the ULM career rushing list with 21. He finished the game with 102 yards on 19 carries— his third 100-yard rushing game of the season.

Making his first start since breaking his thumb against Arkansas State on Oct. 13, ULM quarterback Trey Revell connected on 14-of-22 attempts for a career-high 282 yards and a pair of touchdown strikes. His favorite target was LaGregory Sapp who had seven catches for a career-high 187 yards and a pair of touchdowns – it was the most receiving yards by a Warhawk player since Mack Vincent had 166 yards against Louisiana-Lafayette in 2003.

Sapp has gone over the 100-yard mark in each of the Warhawks last three games and has 31 catches for 630 yards over ULM's past six games – 105 yards per game.

Revell led the Warhawks on an 11-play, 86-yard opening drive capped by a 1-yard touchdown run by Goodin. Revell was 2-for-3 through the air on the drive, including a 46-yard strike to Sapp on the second play of the game.

The Mean Green (2-7, 1-4) scored their lone points of the opening half on a 30-yard field goal by Jeremy Knott following a 9-play, 50-yard drive.

The three points scored by North Texas were the third fewest allowed by the Warhawks in an opening half this season – ULM held Arkansas State and Texas Southern scoreless.

The Warhawks ended the half with 10-unanswered points thanks to a 43-yard field goal by Radi Jabour – his second longest of the season – and a 12-yard touchdown pass from Revell to Sapp.

After a sack by Darius Prelow halted North Texas' opening drive of the second half, Revell and Sapp continued to pick apart the Mean Green defense.

On the first play of the ensuing drive they connected for a 52-yard pass and catch over the middle of the field. Four plays later Sapp hauled in his second touchdown reception of the game to give the Warhawks a 23-3 lead midway through the third quarter.

Knott booted his second field goal of the game, a 36-yard kick, to pull North Texas within 23-6 with 4:02 to play in the third quarter.

Luther Ambrose returned the ensuing kickoff 63 yards to the North Texas 28-yard line and the Warhawks cashed in a few plays later on Jabour's second 43-yard field goal of the game – he is now 6-for-7 in his career from 40-49 yards out.

Goodin scored his second touchdown of the contest with 2:38 remaining in the game after busting through the left side for a 25-yard score to give ULM the final 33-6 advantage.

MONROE, La. - The ULM football team reach bowl eligibility for the second time in three years with a 21-18 victory over Western Kentucky at Malone Stadium. Junior running back Frank Goodin rushed for a career-best 169 yards and a touchdown for the victorious Warhawks.

Trailing for the majority of the second half, ULM scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to seal the victory. The game-winning score came with 5:09 to play as junior running back Rodney Lovett scored from three yards out.

WKU received the opening kickoff and the ULM defense forced a three-and-out, but the Hilltoppers got a second life as the punt was

fumbled and recovered by WKU. With the second chance, WKU had an opportunity to open the scoring, but its 46-yard field goal was missed wide left.

ULM was knocking on the door on its second possession of the first quarter before an interception by Korentheus Bailey halted the Warhawk drive. Back-to-back 23-yard gains on a Trey Revell-to-Goodin screen pass and a Goodin rush put ULM in position to take the lead before the turnover.

The Warhawks opened the scoring on the second play of the second quarter; Revell capped an 80-yard drive with a nine-yard touchdown run. On the seven-play drive that took up 3:09, Revell was 4-of-4 through the air, hooking up with senior wide receiver LaGregory Sapp for 24 yards, sophomore wide receiver Luther Ambrose for completions of 17 and 16 yards and senior wide receiver Darrell McNeal for 17 yards.

WKU answered the ULM score with a 43-yard field goal by Casey Tinius. The field goal capped a six-play, 37-yard drive for the Hilltoppers.

Another turnover by the Warhawks put WKU right back in position to score. Trent Calhoun intercepted a Revell pass and returned it 29 yards to the ULM 18-yard line. Despite gaining no yards, the Hilltoppers were able to convert a 35-yard field goal to cut the ULM lead to one, 7-6, with 11:43 to play in the second quarter.

After a ULM punt, WKU took its first lead of the contest on Tinius' third field goal of the game. The key play on the drive was a 48-yard reception by Jake Gaebler on a third down to keep the drive alive. Tinius connected on a 39-yard field goal with 4:54 to play in the half to give WKU a 9-7 lead.

Just before the intermission, Tinius made his fourth field goal of the half, a 41-yard effort, to extend the WKU lead to 12-7.

Tinius' four field goals in the game tied for the second-most made by a WKU kicker in a single-game with Chrin Pino (10/2/93) and Steve Donisi (9/29/90).

ULM outgained WKU, 111-74, in the first half, but three Warhawk turnovers helped the Hilltoppers hold a five-point advantage at the break.

On the first possession of the second half, the Warhawks put together a 12-play, 54-yard drive before stalling at the WKU 19-yard line. Sophomore kicker Radi Jabour's 36-yard field goal attempt was blocked.

The Warhawks started the fourth quarter with field position inside WKU territory after Ambrose returned a WKU punt 33 yards to the 48-yard line. The return was the longest of the season for ULM.

On the first play of the ensuing drive, Goodin scampered 48 yards to the end zone. With the Jabour extra point, ULM took a 14-12 lead.

WKU immediately regained the lead with a nine-play, 80-yard drive capped by a Brandon Smith one-yard touchdown run. Bobby Rainey had a 49-yard rush to set up the Hilltoppers inside the ULM five-yard line on the drive. The Hilltoppers two-point conversion attempt failed and WKU led 18-14 with 10:49 to play.

ULM then took the lead for good on Lovett's three-yard touchdown plunge. The score gave the Warhawks a 21-18 lead with 5:09 remaining in the contest. ULM marched 58 yards in 11 plays on the drive, all on the ground.

WKU moved down to the ULM 15-yard line where Tinius lined up for a 32-yard field goal with just over a minute to play, but Tinius' try was missed wide right and the Warhawks held on for the victory.

Revell finished the game 10-of-19 through the air for 151 yards and two interceptions. Senior linebacker Cardia Jackson finished the contest with 15 tackles, giving him 365 in his career, a new Sun Belt record.

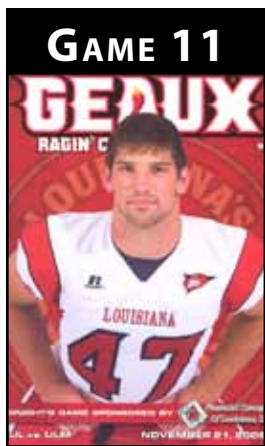

LAFAYETTE, La.-UL-Lafayette took advantage of ULM miscues to win a back-and-forth game, 21-17, on a cold and rainy night at Cajun Field.

ULM held the Ragin Cajuns to just 314 yards of total offense; however the Warhawks turned the ball over three times and missed a 27-yard field goal. ULL (6-5, 4-3 Sun Belt) rushed for just 62 yards, but scored three 1-yard rushing touchdowns for all of its points in the game.

Brad McGuire, ULL's back-up quarterback, scored two of the touchdowns and Yobes Walker ran in the other. McGuire's second score of the night proved to be the game-winner with 7:16 to play

in the game.

The Warhawks (6-5, 5-2) took the ball down to the ULL 37-yard line on the following possession and were faced with a 4th-and-1. ULM was flagged for a false start forcing a punt from Scott Love which went downed at the UL-Lafayette 6-yard line.

The Ragin Cajuns were able to pick up one first down and move the ball out to the 21-yard line before the ULM defense forced a punt with 1:26 to play in the game. Luther Ambrose couldn't handle the rolling punt and Grant Fleming fell on the ball to end any ULM comeback hopes.

Chris Masson completed 16-of-27 passes for 252 yards to lead the ULL attack. His favorite target was tight end Ladarious Green who caught seven passes for 131 yards.

ULM quarterback Trey Revell could never get in a rhythm completing 8-of-12 attempts for just 91 yards. He threw his 11th touchdown pass of the season, but also threw a pair of interceptions.

Warhawk running back Frank Goodin topped the 100-yard mark for the third consecutive game and fifth time of the season with 108 yards on 22 carries. He moved into sixth place on the ULM single-season rushing list with 1,086 yards.

ULL needed only three minutes to crack the scoreboard as Walker capped an 8-play opening drive with his 1-yard touchdown run.

The Ragin Cajuns looked like they were going to extend the lead on their next drive with first down on the ULM 23-yard line. However, the ULM defense stood firm with three straight negative plays to force a punt.

The ULM offense responded with a 12-play, 89-yard touchdown drive to tie the game at 7-7. J.J. McCoy kept the drive alive pulling down a 19-yard strike from Revell on a 3rd-and-13 on the ULL 40-yard line. Four plays later Revell scored from four yards out for his fifth rushing touchdown of the season - the most by a ULM quarterback since Kinsmon Lancaster had the same number in 2006.

The Warhawks appeared to take a 14-7 lead just before halftime on a 9-yard touchdown pass from Revell to Anthony McCall. However, the officials took the points off the board as the replay official ruled there was indisputable video evidence to reverse the call by saying McCall dropped the ball.

Radi Jabour then came out and booted a 32-yard field goal to give the Warhawks a 10-7 lead with 3:21 to play before the break.

ULL regained the lead with 12 seconds to play before halftime on McGuire's first score of the night. ULL converted a 4th-and-1 on its own 42-yard line to keep the drive alive and on the next play Masson hit Green for 52 yards down to the ULM 4-yard line. McGuire's touchdown run came three plays later.

Keavon Milton put the Warhawks back on top, 17-14, with an 11-yard touchdown reception from Revell. It was Milton's second reception of the season and both have gone for touchdowns.

The Warhawks missed a prime opportunity to extend their lead with 1st-and-goal on the ULL 7-yard line. Following a 3-yard run, Revell couldn't handle the second-down snap and threw an incomplete pass on third down. Jabour then missed a 27-yard field wide left to keep the score 17-14 in ULM's favor with 11:51 to play in the game.

Following the missed field goal, ULL drove 80 yards on 12 plays capped by McGuire's game-winner to snap ULM's three-game win streak at Cajun Field.

Aaron Morgan moved into second place all-time in Sun Belt history and fourth all-time in ULM history with 22 career sacks after dropping Masson on ULL's first possession of the game.

MONROE, La.-Dwight Dasher threw a pair of touchdown passes and rushed for two more as Middle Tennessee won its sixth-straight game with a 38-19 victory over ULM at Malone Stadium.

Dasher completed 10-of-18 pass attempts for 116 yards and rushed for 88 yards on 18 carries. The Warhawk defense intercepted Dasher twice on the night including one by Greg James which he returned 78 yards. It was the fifth longest interception return in ULM history and the longest that did not result in a touchdown.

ULM held Middle Tennessee to just 306 yards of total offense (113.6 yards below its season average). The Warhawks limited the Blue Raiders to just four first downs and 89 yards in the second half.

The Warhawks (6-6, 5-3 Sun Belt) took the opening possession of the game in for a touchdown as Trey Revell and Luther Ambrose hooked up for an acrobatic 37-yard pass and catch. Ambrose finished the game with seven catches for 107 yards and a pair of touchdowns - all three were career highs. It marked the fourth time in five games that a ULM receiver had over 100 yards receiving.

ULM's six victories this season matches the 2007 total for the highest mark during the Warhawks' Football Bowl Subdivision era.

That would be the only touchdown that Middle Tennessee would allow until late in the fourth quarter. The Blue Raiders held ULM to just a pair of Radi Jabour field goals until a late 25-yard touchdown reception by Ambrose closed out the scoring on the night.

Revell finished the night 8-of-17 for 91 yards before suffering an injury at the end of the third quarter. Cody Wells finished the game under center for the Warhawks and completed 13-of-22 attempts for 140 yards and a score.

Dasher put the Blue Raiders (9-3, 7-1) on the board with a 3-yard run late in the first quarter. Following Jabour's first field goal, Dasher threw touchdown passes on back-to-back drives to give Middle Tennessee a 21-10 lead at the half.

Jabour pulled the Warhawks within one score, 21-13, with a 37-yard field goal with 6:13 to play in the third quarter. The momentum carried over to the defensive side of the ball as the Warhawks forced a three-and-out from the Blue Raiders.

However, on the ensuing possession Alex Suber intercepted Revell on the first play and returned it 56 yards to the ULM 9-yard line. Dasher scored two plays later to extend the Middle Tennessee lead out to 28-10 with 4:10 to play in the third quarter.

Alan Gendreau made it a three-possession game with a 40-yard field goal in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter. Jeremy Kellern erased any hopes of a ULM comeback with a 58-yard interception return for a touchdown. It was the third interception of the night by Middle Tennessee, who entered the game ranked 20th in the NCAA in interceptions and 12th in turnover margin.

The Warhawks conclude the regular season bowl eligible for the second time in three years.
