DID YOU KNOW?

• ULM is the last team to beat Alabama in Bryant-Denny Stadium -- a streak of 20 straight wins for Alabama. The Warhawks defeated the Crimson Tide 21-14 on Nov. 17, 2007

• Ten of ULM's starting 22 on offense and defense are freshmen and sophomores. The Warhawks will start six freshmen and four sophomores against UL-Lafayette on Saturday

• The Warhawks have forced at least one turnover in 20-of-23 games under defensive coordinator Troy Reffett -- ULM has forced 40 turnovers in those 20 games

• Kolton Browning completed 13-of-14 passes for 171 yards and three touchdowns in the second half against North Texas

• ULM will return 20 of 22 starters on offense & defense next season; the only two starters who will not return are Alex Ibe (H) and Theo Smith (LB)

• ULM has won 14 of its last 18 home games dating back to the 2007 season

• Kolton Browning has two of the top six total offense totals in ULM's Sun Belt era -- 350 at Arkansas State (6th) and 409 at FIU (3rd)

• Luther Ambrose is the third fastest man in college athletics and the second fastest in college football. Ambrose finished third at the 2010 NCAA Outdoor Championships in the 100m dash with a time of 10.12 -- Florida's Jeff Demps finished first

• Four of ULM's assistant coaches played for head coach Todd Berry during their collegiate careers. Steve Farmer (Illinois State), Jason Nichols (East Carolina), Vance Vice (Oklahoma State), Adam Waugh (Illinois State)

	No. 14/15 Arkansas Sept. 11 Little Rock, Ark. L, 7-31 FSN	Ryan Mallett threw for 400 yards and Arkansas used a strong second half to pull away from the Warhawks. ULM held Arkansas to just seven first-half points and limited the Razorbacks to just 99 yards rushing. Jason Edwards paced the defense with a career-high 11 stops while Khairi Usher added 10 tackles and Robert Nelson finished with nine. Luther Ambrose caught his sixth career touchdown pass in the fourth quarter -- it was the first career TD pass by Kolton Browning.
	at Arkansas State Sept. 18 Jonesboro, Ark. L, 20-34 Sun Belt Network	Arkansas State jumped out to a 21-0 lead and held off a late ULM charge to down the Warhawks 34-20. Kolton Browning totaled 350 yards of total offense for the Warhawks -- the most since Kinsmon Lancaster's game against Middle Tennessee. Jason Edwards led the ULM defense with 13 tackles, while Luther Ambrose had seven catches for 84 yards and a touchdown.
	SE Louisiana Sept. 25 Monroe, La. W, 21-20 Warhawks All*Access	Kolton Browning accounted for three touchdowns and 324 yards of total offense as the Warhawks picked up their first victory of the season. Browning completed 23-of-34 passes for 249 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while rushing for 75 yards and a score. It was the third straight victory for ULM in its home opener. Anthony McCall caught a game-high and career-high eight passes, while Cameron Blakes led the ULM defense with his first career sack and interception.
	at #10/11 Auburn Oct. 2 Auburn, Ala. L, 3-52 ESPNU	Auburn scored touchdowns on the second play of its opening two drives and never looked back. ULM quarterback Kolton Browning continued to put up impressive numbers as he became the first Warhawk to throw for over 200 yards in three straight games since Steven Jyles in 2005. Browning threw passes to 10 different receivers (a first since 2004). Radi Jabour booted his first field goal of the season -- it was ULM's first points against Auburn in three meetings.
	Florida Atlantic Oct. 9 Monroe, La. W, 20-17 Warhawks All*Access	ULM made history as it became the first home team to win a game in the series between the Warhawks and the Owls (seven games). The Warhawks lit up FAU for 418 total yards and Kolton Browning threw for 282 yards to bring his season total to 1,075 -- the most by a ULM quarterback since Robert Cobb in 1993. Ken Dorsey had 1.5 sacks and a safety to lead the ULM defense, while Jyruss Edwards scored from five yards out for his first career rushing touchdown and the game-winning score.
	at Western Kentucky Oct. 16 Bowling Green, Ky. W, 35-30 Warhawks All*Access	The Warhawks won for the third time in four weeks after rallying from down 24-7 entering the fourth quarter. Luther Ambrose, Frank Goodin, Jyruss Edwards and Robert Nelson all scored touchdowns in the fourth quarter to lead the comeback. Nelson's was a 55-yard interception return for a score, which earned him Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week honors. Edwards scored twice in the game and Kolton Browning extended his streak of 200-yard passing games out to five in a row with 208 in the air.
	at Middle Tennessee Oct. 23 Murfreesboro, Tenn. L, 10-38 ESPN3	Middle Tennessee took control of the game with 21 points over a five-minute period in the second quarter. ULM quarterback Kolton Browning extended his 200-yard passing game streak to six games after throwing for 232 yards and a touchdown. Luther Ambrose hauled in a career-high nine passes for 66 yards and his fourth touchdown of the season. Defensive end Keavon Milton picked off his first career pass, while Theo Smith had eight tackles and a sack.
	Troy Oct. 30 Monroe, La. W, 28-14 Sun Belt Network	ULM dominated the four-time defending conference champion for four quarters to end Troy's 13-game Sun Belt Conference win streak. Kolton Browning extended his consecutive game streak with 200 yards passing to seven games -- he threw a touchdown pass and ran for two. Darius Prelow was named Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week after recording six tackles and an interception. ULM held Troy to just 285 yards of total offense and 167 yards through the air -- 184.3 yards and 137.2 yards less than its season average, respectively.
	at FIU Nov. 6 Miami, Fla. L, 35-42 (2OT) Sun Belt Network	ULM rallied from a 21-10 second-half deficit to send the game into overtime, but FIU was able to survive and hand the Warhawks their first ever Sun Belt Conference loss in the state of Florida, 42-35, in double overtime. Kolton Browning completed 27-of-38 pass attempts for 339 yards and three touchdowns -- he also ran for 70 yards. Frank Goodin scored for the second time this season to move into fifth place on the ULM career scoring list with 162 career points.
	LSU Nov. 13 Baton Rouge, La. L, 0-51 PPV	The ULM defense held LSU to just 90 yards in the first half and 251 yards for the game, but the No. 5 Tigers were able to take advantage of four ULM turnovers and a short field to hand the Warhawks a 51-0 loss. Ken Dorsey recorded a ULM season-high 2.0 sacks in the game, while Darius Prelow had a career-high 11 tackles. Jyruss Edwards led the Warhawks with 49 yards on five carries while Luther Ambrose hauled in his 100th career reception.
	North Texas Nov. 20 Monroe, La. W, 49-37 Warhawks All*Access	ULM rallied from a six-point halftime deficit thanks to a remarkable second half by quarterback Kolton Browning to defeat North Texas 49-37. Browning completed 13-of-14 passes for 171 yards and three touchdown passes in the second half to lead the Warhawks to 28 points over the final 30 minutes. Luther Ambrose had seven catches for 140 yards -- five catches for 121 yards in the second half -- and Frank Goodin rushed for a season-high 75 yards and a touchdown on 17 carries.
	UL-Lafayette Nov. 27 Monroe, La. 2:30 p.m. Warhawks All*Access	The 46th meeting between in-state rivals falls on Thanksgiving weekend in 2010. The Warhawks will be looking to reassert their dominance in the series -- ULM had won five of the previous six game and eight of the previous 11 games before ULL escaped with a pair of victories the past two seasons. The Warhawks lead the all-time series by a slim 23-22 margin and hold a 10-8 advantage in games played in Monroe.

TEAM NOTES

THE SERIES

ULM and UL-Lafayette renew its in-state rivalry this weekend. The Warhawks lead the overall series 23-22 and have won five of the last eight meetings, but are looking to snap a two-game losing skid.

The Warhawks are 10-8 all-time against the Ragin' Cajuns in Monroe. The Nov. 27 date is the fourth latest date for a game between the two schools and the latest since a meeting on Dec. 2 back in 2006; a game ULM won 39-20. This will be the second time in the last four years that a ULM win over ULL will make the Warhawks bowl eligible.

GRIECO NAMED NATION'S TOP STRENGTH COACH

ULM strength and conditioning head coach John Grieco was named the Professional Football Strength and Conditioning Coaches Society Collegiate Coach of the Year for 2009. Grieco joined the ULM staff in January after four seasons as the director of strength and conditioning at UNLV. He has also worked at East Carolina and Florida.

The Warhawks began playing in 1931 as a junior college and won the first of the school's two national championships with an 8-0 record in 1935. ULM became a senior college in 1951 and joined the NAIA where it stayed until 1975 when the Warhawks became a Division I independent. The Warhawks joined Division I-AA in 1982 and won the school's second national championship in 1987, going 13-2. ULM made the final step to college football's top stage in 1994 as a I-A independent and then joined the Sun Belt in 2001.

WARHAWKS vs. RANKED OPPONENTS

ULM is 0-20 all-time against ranked opponents (since 1994) and 0-6 in season openers against a ranked opponent. The Warhawks closest upset bid against a ranked foe came at No. 22 Auburn in a 28-24 loss in 1996.

The Warhawks have played seven ranked teams the past four seasons. In 2007, ULM played No. 25 Clemson and No. 15 Texas A&M in back-to-back weeks. In 2008, the Warhawks opened the season at No. 10 Auburn. ULM opened the 2009 season at No. 2 Texas and opened the 2010 season against No. 14 Arkansas. The Warhawks played at No. 10 Auburn on Oct. 2 and at No. 5 LSU on Nov. 13.

The Warhawks have played the No. 2 team in the country twice -- Florida in 2001 and Texas in 2009.

The Warhawks have opened the season six times against a ranked foe: 1994 at #8 Colorado (L, 13-48), 2003 at #13 LSU (L, 7-49), 2004 at #17 Auburn (L, 0-31), 2008 at #10 Auburn (L, 0-34), 2009 at #2 Texas (L, 20-59), 2010 vs. #14 Arkansas (L, 7-31).

YOUTHFUL DEPTH CHART

SEC STREAK CONTINUES

With ULM's game against Arkansas to open the season, the Warhawks streak of playing a team from the South-eastern Conference extended.

ULM has played an SEC team every year since moving to Division I-A in 1994.

The streak appears to be headed to an end next season as the Warhawks do not have a game against an SEC opponent scheduled. ULM is scheduled to open the 2011 season at Florida State and then play at Iowa later in the season. The Warhawks still have two other non-conference games to fill.

2010 marks the 11th time since 1994 that ULM has played at least two SEC teams in a season -- the Warhawks have played three SEC teams in a season five times (1994, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2008).

WARHAWKS IN FRONT OF BIG CROWDS

The 2009 season opener at Texas saw 101,096 fans watch the Warhawks and Longhorns play -- the second largest crowd to ever watch a ULM game. The Warhawks set the Malone Stadium record in 2007 as 30,101 packed the stadium to watch the game against Grambling State -- the crowd was also the fifth largest for an on-campus game in Sun Belt history at the time.

Three of the top eight Malone Stadium crowds have come in the past five seasons and seven of the top eight all-time crowds to watch a ULM game have come in the past eight seasons.

MORE ON ULM's YOUTH

The ULM roster features 50 players that are either in their first or second year with the program. ULM has just 13 seniors and 21 juniors on the 2010 roster.

STATE-OF-THE-ART PLAYING SURFACE

The latest addition to Malone Stadium features a ProPlay monofilament fiber "grass" with a shock and drain pad and Envirofill clear coated sand infill. In addition to looking more like natural grass, ULM's new playing surface has measures in place to help prevent injuries and drain water at a rate of 10 inches per hour. The clear-coated sand used has obvious benefits over its predecessor (ground-up black rubber) in that it does not absorb as much heat, does not compact over time, and does not migrate during use. The first game played on the new surface was the 2007 season opener against Tulsa on ESPN2HD.

MALONE STADIUM OPENERS

ULM has traditionally been tough on opponents in its home openers, posting a 26-7 (.788) record in such contests over the last 32 years. ULM picked up victories in their home opener in 22 of the first 23 seasons at Malone Stadium.

ULM IN SEASON OPENERS

The Warhawks are 15-21-1 in season openers since 1975 (first year in NCAA) and 5-12 in season openers since moving to I-A in 1994.

MALONE HOME TO TV

Malone Stadium hosted one televised game in 2010 with the possibility for two more.

The Warhawks hosted Arkansas State last season on ESPN2HD. It was the second time in three years that ULM welcomed ESPN2 to campus. ULM opened the 2007 season against Tulsa on the Worldwide Leader.

The newly formed Sun Belt Network televised ULM's home games against FIU and Middle Tennessee last season. The SBN televised ULM's game against Troy on Oct. 30.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

There is something missing from the Warhawks' uniforms this season as the players' last names have been removed from the back of the jerseys for the second straight season.

The coaching staff has told the players the names will be returned to the jerseys upon receiving a bowl game invitation.

MALONE IS HOME FOR 33 YEARS

The 2009 season marks the 33rd consecutive year that the Warhawks have called Malone Stadium on the campus of ULM home. Dedicated to legendary football head coach James L. Malone (1934-52) on Sept. 27, 1980, Malone Stadium has seen ULM teams post a combined 108-54-1 (.666) record.

The grounds of Malone Stadium have been the home to ULM's National Championship team in 1987, four Southland Conference Championships, and most recently a Sun Belt Conference Championship in 2005.

A LOOK AT ULM'S 2010 SIGNING CLASS

The ULM coaching staff did not have much time to put their first recruiting class together, but looking at the result you wouldn't know.

Six of ULM's signees were nationally ranked at their position by Scout.com -- Josh Allen (OL), Ray Stovall (DE), Cordero Smith (S), Jon Fisher (OL), Centarius Donald (RB) and Je'Ron Hamm (WR).

Allen was rated as the seventh best center in the nation by ESPN.

The Warhawks hit the Lone Star State hard signing 10 players from Texas. The remainder of the class came from Louisiana (3), Oklahoma (3), Arkansas (1), Mississippi (1) and Kansas (1).

The priority was along both lines as ULM signed six players on both the offensive and defensive line.

FARMER IN ELITE COMPANY

ULM offensive coordinator Steve Farmer is the 10th youngest coordinator at the FBS level. Among the top 10, Farmer has the most experience at the Division I level as a coordinator with three years (Wyoming's OC Marcus Arroyo also has three years experience).

TROJAN HORSE

ULM ended Troy's 13-game Sun Belt Conference win streak with a 28-14 victory on Oct. 30. Below are some facts from the game:

- Troy has lost just three of its last 20 SBC games -- two losses have come at the hands of ULM

- ULM has now won three straight games against Troy in Malone Stadium

- ULM held Troy to 285 yards of total offense, its lowest offensive output since Florida held it to 139 yards in the second game of 2009. It was the Trojans lowest offensive output in an SBC game since Oct. 2006 against North Texas (243 yards). The 285 yards were 184.3 yards below Troy's season average

- ULM held Troy to just 167 passing yards, its lowest passing output since Florida held Troy to 66 yards passing in 2009. The 167 yards were 137.2 yards below the Trojans season average

- ULM kept one of the nation's top offensive threats in Jerrel Jernigan in check. BROWNING COMES OF AGE

In just his second career start, redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning put together one of the best games of ULM's Sun Belt era.

Browning totaled 350 yards of total offense (267 passing, 83 rushing) in addition to throwing a pair of touchdown strikes. It was the most by a ULM player since 2007 and the fifth most since the Warhawks joined the Sun Belt in 2001.

Even more impressive and a true sign that the freshman began to feel more comfortable was that 349 of those yards came in the final three quarters of the game.

Finding the End Zone

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Kolton Browning completed passes to 10 different receivers in back-to-back games against Auburn and Florida Atlantic. It marked the first time since 2004 against FIU that 10 different receivers caught a pass in a game.

BIG PLAY THREAT

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Tavares Maye is turning into one of the top big-play threats in the Sun Belt Conference.

Maye has scored four touchdowns this season (three receiving and one rushing) with three coming from at least 43 yards out. Maye's touchdowns have come from an average of 41.0 yards out. He also has an 82-yard reception to his credit -- the sixth longest in ULM history.

PICKING UP THE THIRD DOWN

ULM wide receiver Luther Ambrose is for first in the Sun Belt with 12 first-down receptions on third down. Ambrose has 17 receptions on third down for 153 yards.

LEONARD IS GO-TO ON FOURTH DOWN

Sophomore wide receiver Brent Leonard is tied for second in the NCAA with four receptions for a first-down on fourth down this season. Leonard has four catches for 32 yards on fourth down.

FORCING THE D TO PLAY FOUR DOWNS

If you stop the Warhawks on third down, it's no guarantee that you will get the ball back. ULM has gone for it on fourth down 30 times this season -- the second most in the NCAA (Georgia Tech 34).

ULM's 15 fourth-down conversions rank eighth and its 50 percent success rate ranks 8th among schools with at least 24 attempts.

NUMBERS ON THE BOARD

ULM has scored in 98-of-102 games dating back to Sept. 14, 2002, against McNeese State. The Warhawks were shutout 34-0 in the 2008 season opener at No. 10 Auburn snapping a streak of 32 straight games of recording at least one score. A 59-0 loss to Ole Miss later in the season marked the first time that ULM had been shutout multiple times in the same season since 2000 -- Memphis (28-0), Middle Tennessee (38-0) and Central Florida (55-0).

FASTER START

The Warhawks had scored just six points in the first quarter through the first seven games of the season (field goals at Auburn and Middle Tennessee).

ULM scored 31 points in the first quarter in its past three Sun Belt games and became the first team to score a first quarter touchdown against FIU (game nine).

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MORE ON TURNOVERS

The Warhawks have forced at least one turnover in 19 of 22 games under defensive coordinator Troy Reffett and have intercepted a pass in eight of 10 games (Ark. State & LSU) this season.

BIG SECOND HALF

The ULM defense came up huge in ULM's 17-point rally at Western Kentucky.

In the second half, the ULM defense --

- Held WKU to just 121 total yards
- Held WKU to just 52 rushing yards
- Held WKU to just 69 passing yards
- Held WKU to just six points
- Held WKU to just 3.5 yards per play
- Had two sacks for a loss of 11 yards

LIMITING THE BIG PLAY

A lot of ULM's defensive success last season came because of its ability to limit the opposing offense's ability to get the big play.

The Warhawks have allowed 47 plays of over 20 yards through the first 11 games this season (4.3 per game)

The ULM defense allowed just 47 plays of 20 yards or more last season and just nine rushing plays of 20 yards or more. That was 3.9 plays of 20+ yards and 0.75 rushing plays of 20+ yards per game. The nine rushing plays of over 20 yards ranked 18th best in the NCAA.

In 2008, the ULM defense allow 65 plays of 20+ yards or 5.42 per game and 28 rushing plays of 20+ yards or 2.33 per game.

WHAT AN IMPROVEMENT

In the first season running the 3-3-5 defense under new coordinator Troy Reffett, the Warhawks put together the second best turnaround in the NCAA as a unit. After allowing 444.7 yards of total offense a game in 2008, the Warhawks held opponents to just 347.0 yards last season -- an improvement of 97.7 yards per game.

NELSON TAKES IT TO THE HOUSE

Robert Nelson clinched the Warhawks 35-30 come-from-behind victory over Western Kentucky with a 55-yard interception return for a touchdown. It was the 19th longest interception return in ULM history and the 14th longest return for a touchdown.

It was the first pick six since Greg James took one to the house against UL-Lafayette -- also from 55 yards out.

Nelson was named the Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

THE BIG GOOSE EGG

The shutout pitched by the ULM defense against Texas Southern last season was the first by ULM since Nov. 11, 2006, against FIU.

It was just the second shutout since Nov. 6, 1999, and the 14th of the NCAA era (1975-pr.)

WELCOME BACK MR. GLENN

The Warhawks received a nice surprise at the start of fall camp when nose tackle Bryan Glenn was granted a sixth year of eligibility. Glenn missed spring ball and summer workouts because of the uncertainty about his eligibility.

PRELOW IN PRIMETIME

Junior safety Darius Prelow came on strong at the end of the 2008 recording 14 tackles over the final four contests.

He picked up where he left off in the season opener last season at Texas, Prelow led the Warhawks with 10 tackles and also had a pass breakup. He recorded a career-high 11 stops, including his first tackle for loss in ULM's victory over Arkansas State.

He finished the season second in the Sun Belt and 26th

in the NCAA averaging 1.09 pass break ups per game.

Prelow ranks sixth in the Sun Belt this season with eight passes defended, sixth with sixth pass break ups and sixth averaging 0.73 passes defended per game.

He was named the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week after recording six tackles and intercepting a pass in ULM's 28-14 victory over Troy.

TAMING THE TIGERS

While the final score doesn't indicate it, the ULM defense played well against No. 5 LSU.

- Held LSU to just 90 yards (56 rushing, 34 passing) in the first half
- Held LSU to just 173 yards (89 rushing, 84 passing) through three quarters
- Held LSU to 0-for-8 on third down in the first half
- Held LSU to 2-for-12 on third down for the game
- LSU scored two touchdowns on defense and scored 24 points off ULM turnovers; got the ball inside the ULM 35-yard line on four turnovers
- Held Jordan Jefferson and Jarrett Lee to a combined 8-for-22 for 95 yards through the air

SWITCHING SIDES

Sophomore Keavon Milton and redshirt freshman Emanuel Jefferies both moved over to defensive end from tight end. Jefferies moved during the spring and Milton made the switch right before the start of fall camp. Otis Peterson moved from wide receiver to cornerback and Isaiah Newsome moved from running back to safety. All four are now starters on defense.

Milton, who started four games and caught two touchdown passes last season, impressed so much during camp that he was named a starter heading into the season opener.

NO QUARTERBACK IS SAFE

The Warhawks tallied 27 sacks last season, more than doubling their total from the previous year. Some new faces will have to step up this season for that number to continue to increase. Gone are Aaron Morgan (9.0), Josh Thomas (3.0), Cardia Jackson (2.0), DaCorris Ford (1.0), Jameson Jordan (1.0) and Trez Lockhart (1.0) -- also, Troy Evans (3.5) missed the first eight games of the season before returning at FIU.

The Warhawks are on pace for 26 sacks this regular season through 11 games. ULM recorded a season-high five sacks at WKU.

LOVE BACK AS STUDENT COACH

A two-time preseason All-Sun Belt selection and the first team All-Sun Belt punter in 2007, Scott Love returns as a student coach this season to help groom the young Warhawk punters.

Love, who used all of his eligibility in four years, is helping the Warhawks this season as he finishes his degree.

Love ranks fifth all-time in ULM history with a 40.1 career punting average. He is the single-season leader with 23 punts inside the 20-yard line (2007) and the single-game leader in the category as he placed five kicks inside the 20-yard line in ULM's 21-14 victory over Alabama in 2007.

NEW FACES

ULM had to look to the wide receiver corp to find its punter and deep snapper for 2010. The Warhawks lost both of their projected starters at the positions late due to academics and were forced to scramble to fill the void.

Aaron Munoz, who was moved from quarterback to wide receiver in the spring, will handle the punting duties, and Madison Tharp will handle the deep snapping duties.

SKIPPING CLASS

Short snapper Alex Chace is listed as a senior on the roster this year despite the fact that he has two years of eligibility remaining. Chace, who is interning in the ULM media relations office this semester, is scheduled to graduate after the spring semester.

EDWARDS EXPLODES ON KICK RETURNS

Jyruss Edwards took over the kick return duties in the Florida Atlantic game and has quickly risen up the ranks in the NCAA.

Edwards entered the game at FIU ranked 13th in the NCAA averaging 28.2 yards per return; following that game he slipped to 41st due to a 0-yard return following a fumble and then fell to 51st following the LSU game.

He has returns of 54, 37, 36, 35, 34, 34, 31, 29, 29, 28, 27, 25, 24, 23, 22, 19, 19, 19, 17, 16, 16, 14, 0 yards this season.

ULM HEAD COACH TODD BERRY

(34-66; 9TH OVERALL SEASON / 5-6; 1ST SEASON AT ULM)



Highly regarded as an offensive mastermind, Todd Berry returns to ULM as the program's 14th head coach.

Berry, a 27-year coaching veteran, was ULM's offensive coordinator from 2004-05, where he helped guide the Warhawks to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and quarterback Steven Jyles to Sun Belt Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year honors.

"Todd Berry is the right man at the right time for ULM," ULM Director of Athletics Bobby Staub said. "He's here to build a winning program both on and off the field and with the support of the entire Warhawk family, I'm quite confident he'll be successful in doing just that."

Berry has diligently displayed a "championship" mentality and approach which he has infused into his players, staff, administrators and supporters, all with an eye for competing

for a Sun Belt Conference championship as soon as possible.

In fact, it was that same mentality that Berry used to resurrect Illinois State's football program. The day he was named the Redbirds' head football coach in 1996, he began talking about ISU teams playing for national championships. This for an institution that had experienced little success on the gridiron and had been on the verge of dropping the sport due to its checkered past. Just four years later, Berry had completed one of the most amazing turnarounds in Division I-AA history, guiding his revamped Illinois State program all the way to the national semifinals in 1999.

During a three-year tenure as the offensive coordinator at UNLV, Berry developed the top quarterback duo in the Mountain West Conference with record-setters Omar Clayton and Mike Clausen. The pair combined to throw for 2,693 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2009. Clayton is UNLV's career leader in completion percentage and is the only player in Rebel history to have thrown for over 300 yards and rushed for over 100 yards in a game.

Clausen set a UNLV freshman record with 119 consecutive pass attempts without an interception in 2008 - a mark that fell just 19 attempts short of the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision record. Clayton threw 18 touchdown passes in 2008 - the fourth most in UNLV history and most since 1996 - and set the UNLV school record by attempting 173 passes without an interception. The duo combined for just six interceptions during the 2008 season to tie the school record.

Despite coaching in Nevada, Berry continued to recruit two areas that ULM relies heavily on every year - Florida and Texas. ULM had 27 players on its roster in 2009 from those two states.

Berry split his stints at ULM and UNLV with one season as the quarterbacks coach at the University of Miami in 2006.

His first stop in Monroe followed a four-year run, 2000-03, as the head coach at Army. Berry's teams set 25 Academy records during his tenure and he is the last Army coach to defeat Navy (26-17, 2001). He was a member of the Board of Trustees of the American Football Coaches Association from 2001-03 -- Berry was reappointed to the Board during the spring of 2010.

His tenure at Army followed a four-year stint at Illinois State (1996-99) where Berry presided over one of the most remarkable turnarounds in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) history. The team had not won a conference title since 1950, but under Berry the Redbirds advanced to the NCAA FCS Playoffs in his third season and finished in the FCS top 20.

The following year, ISU became just the third team to ever run through its Gateway Conference schedule unblemished as they advanced to the FCS semifinals.

Todd Berry was introduced as ULM's 14th head coach on December 16, 2009

Under Berry's direction, Illinois State established or equaled 100 individual and team records on a game, season and career levels. The Redbirds were listed in the top 25 ranking for 19 consecutive weeks. In addition, his players captured 73 postseason awards including four Academic All-America honors and six All-America distinctions.

He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the top collegiate head coach at the Division I-AA level, each of his last two years at ISU. In addition, he was a two-time Gateway Conference Coach of the Year honoree and the 1999 GTE Region 4 Coach of the Year.

Before arriving at ISU, Berry spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at East Carolina University under head coach Steve Logan. He played a vital role on the Pirate teams that reached the Liberty Bowl in 1994 and 1995.

"I want to be aggressive in all facets of the game" Berry has said in the past. "I know that you win with defense first and I appreciate that. Most of my background is on offense, but to be an effective offensive coordinator you have to understand defense."

A 1983 graduate of the University of Tulsa, Berry has worked for some well-known head coaches during his career, holding down assistant positions on the staffs of Logan at East Carolina, John Cooper at the University of Tulsa, and Johnny Majors at the University of Tennessee.

While in high school, Berry was an all-state selection at football (quarterback) and track and field at Miami (Okla.) High School. At Tulsa, he played quarterback for the Golden Hurricane from 1979 to 1981 before suffering a career-ending knee injury.

"Coming out of high school, football was significant to me, but I also wanted to attend a school that possessed a good mix of academics-that was the reason I was going to college, first and foremost. I turned down some more traditional 'Top 10 football' programs in order to attend a school with a nice blend of academics and athletics."

Berry began his coaching career as an undergraduate at Tulsa with Cooper before moving to Tennessee as a graduate assistant and tight ends coach in 1983 when the Volunteers advanced to the Florida Citrus Bowl at years end.

Following a one-year return to his alma mater as receivers coach in 1984, Berry headed to Oklahoma State in 1985, where he worked with the likes of future National Football League standout Thurman Thomas. He then served a three-year stint as the offensive coordinator at the Tennessee-Martin, holding that position from 1986 through 1988.

While at UT-Martin, Berry coached the Pacers to a top-five finish in Division II passing offense, total offense, and scoring offense. In his final season, all four receivers, the running back and quarterback signed professional contracts.

He also enjoyed a two-year tour at Mississippi State, coaching wide receivers, and one campaign with at Southeast Missouri State, as offensive coordinator, before joining Logan's staff at ECU.

Berry is the son of the late Rueben Berry, a former Canadian Football League head coach and longtime mentor of the Saskatchewan Rough Riders.

The 49-year old Berry and his wife, Lisa have two daughters: Jordan, 23, and Ryleigh, 8.

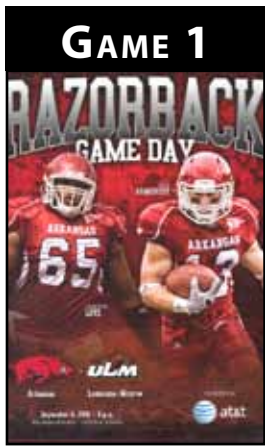

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. – Arkansas quarterback Ryan Mallett threw for 400 yards as the No. 14 Razorbacks defeated ULM, 31-7, in the season opener for the Warhawks. Arkansas led by just seven at the half before increasing its advantage after the break.

The Warhawks and Razorbacks traded possessions early in the contest, with ULM punting on a pair of occasions and an Arkansas drive stalling when ULM junior defensive end Ken Dorsey caused and recovered a fumble from Mallett.

Arkansas opened the scoring on its second possession as Mallett found Greg Childs in the end zone for a 19-yard touchdown pass with 5:48 to play in the first quarter. The score capped a seven-play, 74-yard drive for the Razorbacks.

The ULM offense began moving the ball on its first possession of the second quarter, a five-yard run by senior Zach Rhodes on a fake punt helped to keep the drive alive. On the next play, redshirt freshman running back Jyruss Edwards gained 17 yards to get the Warhawks to the Arkansas 39-yard line, but the ULM drive stalled after a sack, forcing the Warhawks to punt.

On its final drive of the half, the Razorbacks moved into ULM territory before Mallett threw an interception to senior safety Alex Ibe at the 32-yard line. Ibe returned it 20 yards to the Arkansas 48, just 1:03 before the intermission.

At the break, Arkansas held a 217-58 advantage in total offense, but the Razorbacks also committed a pair of turnovers to none by ULM.

Arkansas and ULM traded punts on the first two possessions of the second half before the Razorbacks found the end zone on their second possession.

With a short field, Arkansas went 33 yards in seven plays, capped by a Mallett one-yard sneak across the goal line to increase the Razorbacks advantage to 14-0 with 6:12 remaining in the third quarter. Arkansas increased its advantage with a 26-yard field goal from Zach Hocker with 12:53 to play in the fourth quarter.

Mallett hooked-up with Childs for a second time from 18 yards out, giving the Razorbacks a 24-0 lead with 8:46 to play.

Following Mallett's second touchdown pass, ULM got on the board with a nine-play, 77-yard touchdown drive. Redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning made runs of 13, 11 and nine yards on the drive to put the Warhawks in scoring position. Browning finished the drive off by finding junior wide receiver Luther Ambrose over the middle for 25 yards and a Warhawk touchdown.

Browning finished the night 7-of-17 through the air for 74 yards and a touchdown, while his counterpart Mallett went 28-of-43 for 400 yards and three touchdowns. Greg Childs caught 12 passes for the Razorbacks for 146 yards to lead all receivers.

Senior running back Frank Goodin led ULM on the ground with 44 yards on 12 carries. Broderick Green was Arkansas' leading rusher with 45 yards on 12 carries.

The Warhawks held Arkansas to 99 total rushing yards, ULM has held seven of its last 12 opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jason Edwards had 11 total tackles, including nine solos, and sophomore safety Khairi Usher made 10 tackles.

JONESBORO, Ark. – ULM quarterback Kolton Browning accounted for 350 yards of total offense but it wasn't enough as ULM fell at Arkansas State, 34-20, on Saturday night in its Sun Belt Conference opener. Browning was 19-of-32 through the air for 267 yards and amassed 83 yards rushing on 18 carries.

Arkansas State quarterback Ryan Aplin passed for 243 yards and rushed for a team-high 75 yards.

Arkansas State (1-2, 1-1 Sun Belt) opened the scoring on its second drive of the night as Aplin found the end zone and Browning found Anthony McCall in the left corner of the end zone to bring the Warhawks within seven.

from four yards out on a quarterback keeper. Aplin's score finished off a 13-play, 70-yard drive for the Red Wolves that took 4:26.

Following a ULM punt, the Red Wolves struck again with 1:08 to play in the first quarter with an eight-play, 70-yard scoring drive. Derek Lawson finished the drive with a 12-yard run off left tackle for the Arkansas State touchdown. The key play of the drive for the Red Wolves was a 42-yard completion from Aplin to Carlos McCants on a third and five at its own 35-yard line.

After ULM (0-2, 0-1 Sun Belt) missed a 30-yard field goal, Arkansas State went 80 yards in 10 plays for its third touchdown of the night. Aplin capped the drive with a 34-yard connection to Dwayne Frampton for the score.

ULM found the end zone on the ensuing drive as Browning hit Brent Leonard from 33 yards out for the score 4:59 before the half. The Warhawks marched 77 yards in just seven plays over 2:52 on the drive. Browning hit Luther Ambrose for 25 yards on the play just before the touchdown. The extra point was blocked as the Warhawks cut the Red Wolves lead to 21-6.

Arkansas State took the 13-point lead into the intermission.

The Warhawks cut the Red Wolves lead to one score with a touchdown on the first possession of the second half. ULM went 80 yards in 10 plays, capped by a four-yard touchdown on a direct snap to Zach Rhodes. The key play of the drive was a Browning to Leonard 29-yard pass on a third and six to keep the drive alive for the Warhawks. 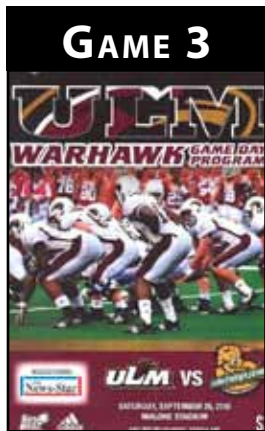
With 9:31 remaining in the fourth quarter, Arkansas State increased its lead to 31-14 with a 37-yard field goal from Bobby Zalud.

MONROE, La. -- Redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning threw for 249 yards as ULM picked up its first win of the season, 21-20, over Southeastern Louisiana. Browning also gained 75 yards rushing and helped account for all three Warhawk touchdowns, two passing and one rushing.

Following a ULM (1-2) punt to begin the contest, Southeastern Louisiana (1-3) struck first with a seven-play, 71-yard touchdown drive. Tyler Beatty found Simmie Yarborough on a crossing pattern from five yards out for the score with

11:03 to play in the first quarter.

The Warhawks and Lions exchanged a pair of punts before ULM knotted the score with a 19-play, 89-yard touchdown march, capped by a 10-yard run by Browning. The Warhawks converted on 4-of-5 third downs on the drive and also picked up a first down on a fourth-and-six with an eight-yard pass from Browning to sophomore Brent Leonard on the 14th play of the drive.

The ULM scoring drive began with 8:40 remaining in the first quarter and ended on the first play of the second quarter.

The Warhawks took a 14-7 lead with 6:45 remaining in the second quarter as junior wide receiver Anthony McCall jumped on a fumble in the end zone. The score capped a six-play, 60-yard drive for ULM that took just over two minutes. On the scoring play, junior wide receiver Luther Ambrose caught a pass from Browning and gained 39 yards before fumbling the ball forward at the 16-yard line, the fumble was recovered in the end zone by McCall for a ULM touchdown.

McCall caught a career-high eight passes for 69 yards.

ULM took the seven-point lead into the intermission.

Southeastern Louisiana took advantage of a ULM turnover to tie the contest, 14-14, with 11:18 to play in the third quarter. The Lions took over on the Warhawk 14-yard line and scored on the first play of the drive as Beatty found Yarborough for their second touchdown connection of the contest.

Beatty was 20-of-41 in the contest for 212 yards and two touchdowns. Yarborough caught seven passes for 95 yards.

The Lions regained a seven-point advantage with a two-yard touchdown run by Zeke Jones. Southeastern Louisiana went 75 yards in nine plays in 4:03 to take a 20-14 lead with 2:08 to play in the third quarter. The Southeastern Louisiana extra point was no good.

After the Warhawks defense forced a punt and gave the offense possession on the Lions' 47-yard line, ULM struck right away with a 47-yard touchdown pass from Browning to redshirt freshman Tavarise Maye on the first play of the drive. Maye out-jumped a Southeastern Louisiana defender in the end zone to tie the score, junior Radi Jabour's extra point gave ULM a 21-20 lead with 14:34 to play in the contest.

The Warhawks punted the ball to Southeastern Louisiana with 2:20 remaining, giving the Lions possession on their own nine-yard line. After Southeastern Louisiana picked up eight yards on its first three downs, sophomore linebacker Cameron Blakes sealed the ULM victory with an interception on fourth down.

Southeastern Louisiana linebacker Mark Newbill had a game-high 17 tackles, which tied his career-best.

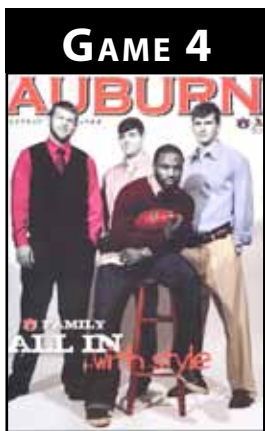

AUBURN, Ala. -- Redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning completed a career-high 25 passes as ULM fell 52-3 at 10th-ranked Auburn. Browning finished the day 25-for-33 through the air for 203 yards, the third-straight game in which he has thrown for more than 200 yards.

Auburn quarterback Cam Newton was 14-for-19 passing for 245 yards and three touchdowns.

Auburn took the kickoff to open the contest and scored on its first drive to take an early 7-0 advantage. The Tigers went 65 yards in two plays, capped by a 50-yard touchdown run by Onterio McCalebb.

After ULM's first drive stalled on the Auburn 44-yard line, Aaron Munoz's punt was downed by the ULM special teams at the Auburn three. The Tigers struck quickly again as Newton hit Emory Blake for a 94-yard touchdown pass on the second play of the drive.

ULM answered with a 61-yard, 14-play scoring drive. Junior Radi Jabour capped the drive with a 35-yard field with 4:31 to play in the first quarter to cut the Auburn lead to 14-3. Browning was 7-for-9 through the air on the drive for 56 yards.

Auburn responded on its next possession with a 19-yard field goal to regain a 14-point advantage, 17-3, with 2:09 to play in the first quarter.

The Warhawks once again moved into Tiger territory, reaching the 23-yard line before lining up for a 41-yard field goal. ULM attempted a fake and did not convert as its pass attempt was intercepted. Auburn then went 66 yards for a score as Michael Dyer found the end zone from three yards out.

The Tigers scored again before the half to take a 31-3 lead into the intermission.

ULM had 10 different players catch passes in the contest, the most in a game since 2005 when 10 Warhawks caught passes against FIU. Sophomore Luther Ambrose led ULM in receiving with seven catches for 56 yards.

Auburn's Mario Fannin was the game's leading rusher with 89 yards on 10 carries and one touchdown. Four different Tigers had rushing touchdowns in the contest.

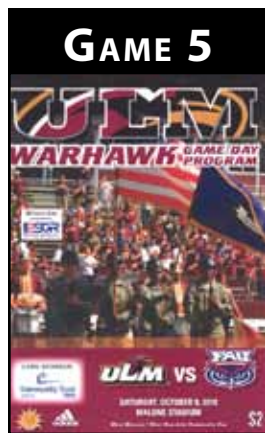

MONROE, La. – Redshirt freshman running back Jyruss Edwards scored from five yards out with less than three minutes to play as ULM earned a 20-17 victory over Florida Atlantic at Malone Stadium. The Warhawks held a 12-point halftime lead before the Owls scored 17-straight in the second half to take a lead before Edwards' game-winning score.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning completed 25-of-41 passes for 282 yards and a touchdown. Junior Luther Ambrose had a team-best six catches for 61 yards and junior Anthony McCall had 96 yards on five catches.

Alfred Morris rushed for a game-high 153 yards on 30 carries for Florida Atlantic.

Florida Atlantic (1-4, 0-2 Sun Belt) moved down to the ULM 10-yard line on its first possession of the contest before senior linebacker Theo Smith intercepted a pass by Jeff Van Camp on the one-yard line to extinguish the Owls threat.

Following the interception, ULM (2-3, 1-1 Sun Belt) put together a 12-play, 93-yard drive, moving down to the Florida Atlantic six-yard line. The key play on the drive was a 52-yard pass from Browning to McCall to get the Warhawks in the red zone. ULM came away with no points however as junior Radi Jabour's 23-yard field goal attempt hit the left upright.

On its next possession, the Warhawks used a 54-yard pass from redshirt freshman punter Aaron Munoz to senior Zach Rhodes on a fake punt on a fourth-and-nine to again move into scoring position. The Owls once again denied the Warhawks points as Browning was sacked and fumbled, giving the ball back to Florida Atlantic on its own 19.

A bad snap on its first play of the drive pushed the Owls back to their own one-yard line and ULM scored on the next play as junior defensive end Ken Dorsey sacked the Van Camp for a safety on the first play of the second quarter.

On the ensuing possession, ULM increased its advantage to 9-0 as Browning found sophomore Brent Leonard in the back of the end zone from seven yards out with 9:01 to play in the second quarter. The key play of the scoring drive for ULM was a fourth-and-11 connection from Browning to Ambrose for 19 yards. The scoring drive went 13 plays and 65 yards in 5:47.

Just before halftime, ULM increased its lead to 12-0 as Jabour made a 30-yard field goal to cap a 36-yard drive.

At the intermission, the Warhawks had 289 yards of total offense while holding the Owls to just 73 yards.

Florida Atlantic trimmed the ULM lead to nine points, 12-3, on the first drive of the second half. The Owls went 55 yards on the drive before scoring their first points on a 30-yard field goal by Ross Gornall with 10:47 left in the third quarter.

ULM punted on its first possession of the second half and Florida Atlantic drew within two, 12-10, with a touchdown on its next possession. The Owls went 66 yards in nine plays, culminated by a Morris touchdown plunge from a yard out with 5:10 to play in the third quarter.

The Owls took their first lead of the night with 10:26 remaining as Morris found the end zone for the second time. The three-yard touchdown run capped a six-play, 26-yard drive for the Owls as they took a 17-12 lead.

Florida Atlantic had the ball again with less than five minutes to play before a turnover gave the ball back to ULM, setting up the game-winning touchdown drive.

The Warhawks went 55 yards in nine plays on the drive capped by the Edwards touchdown to take an 18-17 lead. Browning found Leonard on the two-point play to give the Warhawks a 20-17 lead with 2:43 left.

Florida Atlantic picked up one first down on its final drive before turning the ball over on downs to preserve the ULM victory.

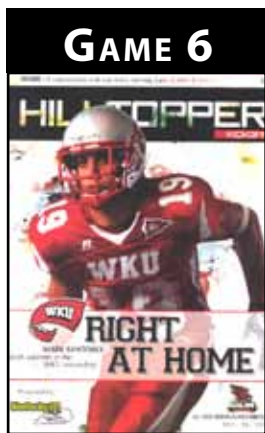

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. – ULM rallied from a 17-point deficit in the fourth quarter to defeat Western Kentucky 35-30 Saturday night at L.T. Smith Stadium. Robert Nelson sealed the victory with a 55-yard interception return for a touchdown after Jyruss Edwards put the Warhawks up 28-24 with a 6-yard touchdown run with just over three minutes to play.

The rally started with a 10-play, 60-yard drive capped off by a Kolton Browning 26-yard touchdown strike to Luther Ambrose early in the fourth quarter.

Browning finished the game 20-of-33 for 209 yards and the one score -- he has now thrown for over 200 yards in five straight games; the most since Steven Jyles had five straight in 2004. The redshirt freshman's 1,284 passing yards are the most through six games by a ULM quarterback since Robert Cobb in 1993.

Frank Goodin, who converted a pair of fourth-down conversions on the drive, pulled the Warhawks with three, 24-21, with a 2-yard touchdown run with 7:45 to play in the game. The score moved Goodin into sole possession of second place on the ULM career rushing touchdown list with 23 and into sixth place on the ULM career scoring chart with 156 points.

The Warhawks, who have won three of their last four games, improved to 3-3 on the season and 2-1 in the Sun Belt Conference.

Edwards led the ULM rushing attack with 60 yards and two touchdowns on 12 carries, while Browning carried the ball nine times for 52 yards and Goodin had 20 yards on eight carries. Ambrose finished with 77 yards on five catches. Edwards also averaged 29.3 yards on four kickoff returns.

WKU's Bobby Rainey, who entered the game leading the Sun Belt in rushing, carried the ball a career-high 32 times for 169 yards and two touchdowns. Kawaun Jakes completed 12-of-21 passes for 127 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. Marcus Vasquez caught six passes for 84 yards and a touchdown.

WKU jumped out to a 17-0 lead midway through the second quarter before the Warhawks broke through. Casey Tinius capped a 7-play drive to open the game for the Hilltoppers with a 25-yard field goal and Vasquez hauled in a 13-yard pass from Jakes on the first play of the second quarter to stretch the lead to 10-0.

The Hilltoppers (0-6, 0-2) made the Warhawks pay for their first mistake of the night. After a dropped snap on a punt gave WKU the ball of the ULM 25-yard line, the Hilltoppers extended their lead to 17-0 four plays later on a 3-yard touchdown run by Rainey.

ULM responded on its ensuing possession after 36-yard kickoff return by Centarius Donald sparked the drive. Facing a 4th-and-1, Edwards went straight up the middle for a 33-yard touchdown run. The Warhawks entered the weekend 14th in the NCAA in fourth-down conversions (among schools with at least 10 attempts).

Rainey scored for the second time, this time from two yards out, to give WKU a 24-7 lead with 1:21 to play in the third quarter after the Hilltoppers took over possession on the ULM 31-yard line following a failed fake punt attempt.

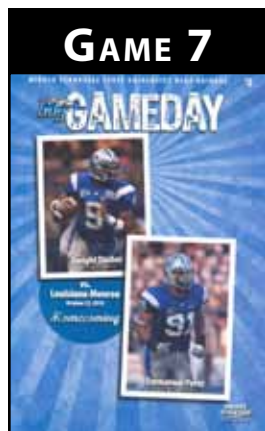

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. -- Redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning threw for 232 yards, but it wasn't enough as ULM fell at Middle Tennessee, 38-10, on Saturday (Oct. 23) at Floyd Stadium. Middle Tennessee scored 21 points in a five-minute stretch in the first half that proved to be the difference for the Blue Raiders. Browning finished the game 25-of-43 with one touchdown.

Browning has thrown for 200-or-more yards in six-straight games, the longest stretch since Raymond Philyaw had a six-game streak in 1995. Browning has also thrown for the

most yards by a ULM quarterback through seven games since Philyaw in 1996.

Middle Tennessee quarterback Dwight Dasher was 11-of-19 through the air for 219 yards and two touchdowns; Dasher also had 66 rushing yards on 14 carries. Phillip Tanner had a game-high 73 rushing yards on 15 carries and a touchdown for Middle Tennessee.

Junior receiver Luther Ambrose had a career-best nine receptions for 66 yards and a touchdown.

After missing a field goal on the first drive of the game, Middle Tennessee (3-4, 2-1 Sun Belt) opened the scoring with a 70-yard interception return for a touchdown. Rod Issac stepped in front of a Browning pass along the sideline and went all the way to give the Blue Raiders the early 7-0 lead.

ULM (3-4, 2-2 Sun Belt) scored its first points of the contest following a Middle Tennessee turnover. Junior linebacker Jason Edwards recovered a fumble for the Warhawks on their own 45-yard line and ULM cashed in with a 20-yard Radi Jabour field goal. Browning found senior running back Frank Goodin for 28 yards on a swing pass on the key play of the drive to get ULM into scoring position.

Middle Tennessee answered the ULM field goal with three touchdowns in quick succession. Dasher found Garrett Andrews from 18 yards out for the first of the three scores with 13:22 left in the third quarter. He then hit Tyler Mason on a 53-yard completion for a score before Tanner capped the scoring outburst by the Blue Raiders with a 25-yard run to give Middle Tennessee a 28-3 lead with 8:22 remaining in the second quarter.

The Blue Raiders took that 25-point advantage into halftime. Middle Tennessee outgained ULM in the first half, 268-163. Dasher was 7-of-11 for 124 yards and two touchdowns in the first half; he was also the game's leading rusher with 67 yards on 10 carries. Sophomore Brent Leonard and Ambrose each had four receptions in the first half for ULM, Leonard gained 42 yards on his four receptions and Ambrose gained 40 yards.

The second half began with five consecutive drives resulting in punts before Middle Tennessee added a field goal with 3:18 to play in the third quarter. Dasher found Tanner for 75 yards on a screen pass on the first play of the drive to set up the Blue Raider score.

ULM found the end zone with 9:01 remaining in the fourth quarter as Browning found Ambrose from eight yards out. Browning was 2-of-3 through the air on the drive, including a 31-yard completion to junior Anthony McCall to move the Warhawks to the Middle Tennessee 11-yard line.

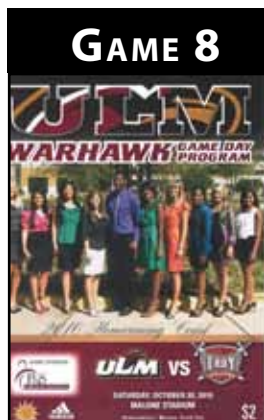

MONROE, La. -- ULM held Troy to its lowest scoring output in a conference game since 2006 as the Warhawks earned a 28-14 victory over the Trojans on Saturday (Oct. 30) afternoon at Malone Stadium. Redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning was 20-of-30 passing for 226 yards and a touchdown, Browning also had 26 rushing yards on 19 carries with a pair of touchdowns.

Browning outdueled Troy's freshman quarterback Corey Robinson who was 16-of-38 passing for 167 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions.

Browning has now thrown for 200-or-more yards in seven-straight games, the longest streak at ULM since Robert Cobb had a seven-game streak in 1993. Browning has 1,741 passing yards this season, the most for a ULM quarterback through eight games since 1996 when Raymond Philyaw had 1,762 yards through eight games.

Troy's 14 points were its fewest in a Sun Belt game since Oct. 28, 2006, when the Trojans defeated North Texas, 14-6.

Sophomore Luther Ambrose had seven catches for 73 yards and redshirt freshman Tavares Maye made four catches for 77 yards and a touchdown. Senior running back Frank Goodin had a game-high 66 yards rushing on 15 carries.

Troy capitalized on a ULM fumble on the first possession of the game to take an early 7-0 lead. The Trojans took over on the Warhawks 48-yard line and scored on the third play of the drive as Robinson found Jamel Johnson from 28 yards out to take the lead.

ULM responded immediately, going 54 yards in three plays to tie the score with 11:24 remaining in the first quarter. Junior Ty Kittle returned the kick to the ULM 46-yard line to give the Warhawks good field position before Browning found Maye down the left sideline for 48 yards to even the contest.

Following a Troy punt, ULM took its first lead of the afternoon on a 1-yard run by Browning. The Warhawks went 80 yards in 12 plays to take a 14-7 lead with 5:38 left in the first quarter. Browning found sophomore Brent Leonard for 14 yards on a 4th-and-5 at the Troy 29-yard line to keep the ULM drive alive. Browning was 5-of-5 through the air on the drive for 50 yards.

The Trojans evened the contest, 14-14, as Jerrel Jernigan capped an 80-yard drive with a 16-yard touchdown run. Troy needed just five plays to go 80 yards, aided by a trio of penalties by ULM.

Just as it did following Troy's first touchdown, ULM responded right away to regain the lead. The Warhawks used a 4-play, 59-yard drive to take a 21-14 advantage. Maye went 43 yards on a sweep around left end for the final score before the intermission.

To begin the second half, Troy punted twice, sandwiched around a ULM punt, before the Warhawks increased their lead to 14 points with 4:37 remaining in the third quarter. Browning went up the middle from nine yards out to find the end zone and give ULM a 28-14 lead. Browning's second rushing touchdown of the afternoon capped a 9-play, 60-yard drive.

With just under 10 minutes to play in the contest, the Trojans found itself with good field position, starting a drive at the ULM 31. After moving to the Warhawk 4-yard line, the ULM defense slowed Troy to force a 4th-and-goal. On the fourth down, Theo Smith got a hand on the pass and Robert Nelson came up with the interception to turn back the Trojans.

That would be as close as Troy would come as ULM handed the Trojans their first conference loss since Nov. 1, 2008, when the Warhawks beat the Trojans 31-30 at Malone Stadium, snapping a streak of 13-straight conference wins.

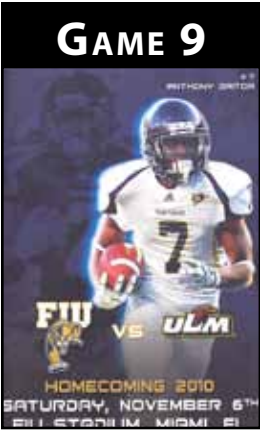

MIAMI -- Kolton Browning continued to put an assault on the ULM record book as he completed 27-of-38 passes for 339 yards and three touchdowns, but FIU was able to overcome an inexcusable interception in the final seconds of the game to defeat the Warhawks 42-35 in double-overtime Saturday at FIU Stadium.

Facing a 2nd-and-8 from the ULM 16-yard line, FIU opted to pass instead of run and set up the potential game-winning field goal. Defensive end Ken Dorsey intercepted the Wesley Carroll pass and returned it 56 yards to the FIU 36-yard line with just 15 seconds to play.

Browning completed a quick strike to Brent Leonard for six yards, but was intercepted by Winston Fraser on a deflected pass to end regulation and send the game into overtime.

The Warhawks (4-5, 3-3 Sun Belt) wasted no time finding the end zone on their first possession of extra time as Browning hooked up with Anthony McCall on a fade route from the 3-yard line on the fourth play of the drive -- McCall finished the game with six catches for 88 yards.

Browning added 70 yards on the ground to his impressive passing total to finish the game with 409 yards of total offense -- the third highest total in ULM's Sun Belt history. His 339 yards through the air were the 26th most in school history and the most since Kinsmon Lancaster threw for 377 yards at Kansas in 2006.

The redshirt freshman signal caller moved into a seventh-place tie with Bubby Brister on the ULM single-season completions list with 191. He also tied Stan Humphries for the ULM school record with his eighth straight 200-yard or better passing game. Browning also moved within 238 yards of the ULM top 10 for single-season passing yards with at least three games remaining.

The Panthers (3-5, 3-1) needed just one play to send the game into a second overtime as T.Y. Hilton took a reverse 25 yards for the score on the first play. Hilton finished the game with four total touchdowns and 291 all-purpose yards as he returned a kickoff for a score and caught a pair of touchdown passes.

FIU struck quickly in the second overtime as it needed just two plays -- both runs by Darriet Perry -- to find the end zone. Perry finished the game with 112 yards on 20 carries. The Warhawks moved down to the FIU 14-yard line on its second-overtime possession, but a sack on second down made them play behind the sticks on third and fourth down.

ULM outgained FIU 482-469 in the game with the teams accumulating their yards in two different ways. The Warhawks passed for 336 yards and ran for 116, while the Golden Panthers passed for 227 and rushed for 242.

Tavarese Maye, who finished the game with seven catches for a career-high 146 yards, started a ULM rally with a 26-yard touchdown reception from Browning with just over 11 minutes to play in the third quarter. The score pulled the Warhawks within four, 21-17, after FIU took a 21-10 lead into the half.

Radi Jabour closed the gap to one, 21-20, with his second field goal of the game, this one from 37 yards out with just under five minutes to play in the third quarter.

Hilton extended the FIU lead out to 28-20 after he hauled in a 67-yard pass from Carroll with just under 12 minutes to play in the game. Carroll finished the game 17-of-27 for 227 yards with three scores and a pair of interceptions.

The Warhawks tied the game on a 17-yard touchdown pass from Browning to Leonard less than a minute later -- Browning found Leonard again on the two-point conversion to tie the game. The touchdown pass followed an 82-yard completion from Browning to Maye that was reviewed for over 10 minutes -- it went down as the sixth longest reception in school history.

Frank Goodin put the Warhawks on the board with a 3-yard run on their first possession of the game. The score was the first touchdown allowed by FIU in the first quarter this season and moved the senior running back into fifth place on the ULM career scoring list with 162 career points.

Greg Ellingson caught an 18-yard touchdown pass on FIU's opening possession to give the Golden Panthers an early 7-0 lead. Hilton returned the kickoff following Goodin's touchdown 95 yards to push the lead back out to seven, 14-7.

Jabour nailed a 42-yard field goal in the closing minutes of the first quarter to close the gap to 14-10, but Hilton caught a 20-yard touchdown pass from Carroll with just over two minutes to play before the half to give the Golden Panthers the 21-10 lead at the break.

BATON ROUGE -- The ULM defense held No. 5 LSU to just 90 yards in the first half, but the Tigers took advantage of a short field to stake a 23-0 halftime lead en route to a 51-0 victory at Tiger Stadium in just the second meeting between the two schools.

The ULM defense set the tone early forcing LSU into a three-and-out and just nine combined yards on its first two possessions of the game. However, Ron Brooks took the first of two interceptions by LSU in the first half 32 yards for a touchdown on ULM's second drive of the game.

LSU had four scoring drives of less than 20 yards in the game and two others that were 58 and 50 yards. ULM held LSU to just 173 total yards through three quarters and 251 total yards for the game.

Josh Jasper put the Tigers (9-1, 5-1 SEC) up 13-0 with field goals of 52 yards and 45 yards on back-to-back possessions at the end of the first quarter. A 1-yard run by Stevan Ridley followed an 85-yard interception return by Patrick Peterson which set the Tigers up on the ULM 12-yard line.

The Warhawks (4-6, 3-3 Sun Belt) had their deepest penetration of the half on the ensuing possession as they took the ball down to the LSU 28-yard line before turning the ball over on downs. Following another three-and-out by the ULM defense, LSU recovered a Warhawk fumble on the ULM 23-yard line. After gaining only two yards, Jasper connected on a 29-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 23-0 lead at the break.

ULM quarterback Kolton Browning saw his consecutive game streak with at least 200 yards passing come to an end at eight games after finishing 8-for-17 for 61 yards before leaving the game late in the third quarter. His eight-game streak tied Stan Humphries for the ULM school record. The redshirt freshman moved into sixth place on the ULM single-season completions list (199) on the night.

Jyruss Edwards led the Warhawks on the ground rushing for 49 yards on five carries, while Luther Ambrose had a pair of catches for 21 yards -- his second catch of the night was the 100th of his career.

LSU put the game out of reach with two touchdowns over a 15-second span in the third quarter. Ridley scored from seven yards out and Lavar Edwards returned a ULM fumble 29 yards for a touchdown on ULM's first play of the ensuing drive to push the LSU lead out to 37-0.

LSU's two-quarterback system of Jarrett Lee and Jordan Jefferson combined to complete 8-of-22 passes for only 95 yards. Ridley led the Tigers on the ground with 67 yards on 14 carries.

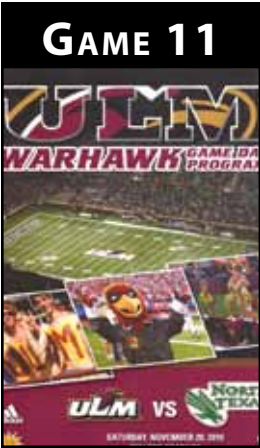

MONROE, La. – Redshirt freshman quarterback Kolton Browning threw for a school-record five touchdown passes as ULM defeated North Texas, 49-37, on Saturday afternoon (Nov. 20) at Malone Stadium. Browning finished 18-of-23 for 247 yards passing and also had 73 rushing yards as the Warhawks have now won nine of their last 10 home games.

Senior running back Frank Goodin led the Warhawks with 75 rushing yards on 17 carries and a touchdown. Redshirt freshman Jyruss Edwards rushed 13 times for 63 yards and a touchdown.

Junior Luther Ambrose had a game-high 140 yards receiving on seven catches with a pair of touchdowns as the Warhawks have a chance next week to become bowl eligible for the third time in four seasons.

North Texas received the opening kickoff and took an early three-point lead on a 22-yard field goal by Zach Olen. The Mean Green went 62 yards in 12 plays on the opening drive of the game, taking 5:24 off the clock.

Following a ULM turnover, North Texas increased its lead to 6-0 with another Olen field goal. The Mean Green took over on the Warhawk 34-yard line and moved down to the 6-yard line before the drive stalled and North Texas had to settle for another field goal.

ULM answered on the ensuing drive as Browning found freshman Je’Ron Hamm for 48 yards down the middle for a touchdown to give the Warhawks a lead on the final play of the first quarter. The touchdown reception was the first for Hamm in his career.

North Texas regained the lead on the first play from scrimmage as Lance Dunbar went 83 yards off the left side of the line for a Mean Green touchdown.

A 54-yard kick return by Edwards set the Warhawks up with good field position on the following drive. ULM needed just five plays to go 40 yards to regain the lead, 14-13, with 12:48 to play in the second quarter. Goodin capped the scoring drive with an 8-yard touchdown run up the middle.

The Warhawks increased their advantage following a Mean Green punt, going 59 yards in 13 plays for a touchdown. Browning found Ambrose on a crossing pattern from 10 yards out for the score.

The 8-point lead was short lived as Brelan Chancellor took the ensuing kickoff back 91 yards for a North Texas touchdown to trim the ULM lead back to 21-20.

North Texas scored again 20 seconds before the intermission to regain the lead. Riley Dodge found Jamaal Jackson in the end zone from 10 yards out to give the Mean Green a 27-21 lead at halftime. A would-be North Texas fourth down was averted when a ULM penalty caused a third down replay and kept the Mean Green drive alive.

On the opening drive of the second half, ULM claimed the lead back as Browning found Goodin for a 3-yard touchdown. The key play on the 13-play, 67-yard drive was a 23-yard scramble for a first down by Browning on a 4th-and-2 at the North Texas 31-yard line. The play was the second fourth down conversion of the drive.

Both offenses slowed for most of the remained of the quarter before a North Texas turnover set-up ULM with good field position.

ULM capitalized on the North Texas fumble to take an eight-point lead early in the fourth quarter. The Mean Green fumble gave the Warhawks the ball on the North Texas 47-yard line. Edwards capped the 47-yard drive with the score from a yard out to give ULM a 35-27 advantage.

A 45-yard field goal by Olen on the next Mean Green possession cut the Warhawks led to five, 35-30, with 9:23 to play in the fourth quarter.

The Warhawks struck back just three plays later when Browning connected with Ambrose for 53 yards and a score to push the lead to 12. The 3-play, 71-yard drive took just 85 seconds.

Less than a minute later, North Texas responded with a 41-yard screen pass for a touchdown from Dodge to Darius Carey, cutting the ULM lead to 42-37 with just over seven minutes to play.

ULM again answered the North Texas score as Browning hooked up with senior Rodney Lovett for his fifth touchdown pass of the day. The score gave the Warhawks a 49-37 lead with 2:52 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Senior safety Alex Ibe sealed the victory for ULM with an interception on the next drive for North Texas as the Warhawks improved to 4-0 this season at Malone Stadium.

Dunbar ran for a game-high 134 yards on 19 carries for North Texas while Dodge was 14-of-26 passing for 164 yards and a pair of touchdowns.
