

Topper Tidbits

- ► Saturday's game will mark the first visit by Louisiana-Monroe to Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium. In fact, ULM has not visited Bowling Green since the 1954 season when they were known as Northeast Louisiana.
- ▶ This week's game begins a stretch in which WKU will play three of its next four games at home.
- ▶ The WKU and Louisiana-Monroe programs share one common thread a former head coach. **Dave Robert** guided the Hilltoppers for five seasons between 1984-88, finishing with winning records in each of his final two campaigns (7-4 in 1987 and 9-4 in 1988), getting WKU to the I-AA playoffs each year. Following the '88 campaign, he left the Hill for Monroe, where he coached ULM for the next five seasons (1989-93), making three more playoff appearances.
- ▶ The Hilltoppers are 5-5 all time in games played on Oct. 16.

About Louisiana-Monroe

The Warhawks enter Saturday's game coming off a dramatic 20-17 win over Florida Atlantic last weekend. After leading 12-0 at halftime, ULM saw the Owls score 17 unanswered points to take a 17-12 five-point lead early in the fourth quarter. After recovering a fumble near midfield, the Warhawks marched 55 yards and took the lead on a **Jyruss Edwards** five yard touchdown run with 2:43 to play. After a two-point conversion made it a three-point lead, ULM was able to stop FAU and run out the clock to secure its second win of the season. While last week's game-winning score came on the ground, a majority of the Warhawks' offensive production this season has come through the air. ULM is completing 63 percent of its passes, with **Kolton Browning** completing 99 of 157 passes for 1,075 yards and six touchdowns through five games. Browning is also leading the ground attack for first-year head coach **Todd Berry**, averaging 35.6 yards per game. **Luther Ambrose** has been Browning's main target through the air, catching 23 passes for 279 yards and a pair of touchdowns. The Warhawks are gaining 326 yards per game on the ground, but are surrendering 405 yards and 30.8 points per game. **Jason Edwards** is leading the defense with 41 total tackles, **Ken Dorsey** has registered three of ULM's nine sacks on the year. The Warhawks have also recorded four interceptions on the year.

WKU News and Notes

Young Plays Like Veteran — Making just his second career start at FIU, redshirt freshman safety Kiante Young played like a seasoned veteran, collecting a game-high 13 tackles against the Panthers. That was 10 more stops than his previous high this season, and actually was six more stops than he had recorded in the first four games combined. That performance came one game after Young recorded his first career interception at South Florida. His 13 tackles were the most by a Hilltopper this season, and the most since Orlando Misaalefua also had 13 stops against Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 17, 2009.

Air Assault — After WKU's first four touchdowns of the season came either via the run game or special teams, five of the last six — and six of the last nine — scores have come through the air. WKU had just 11 passing touchdowns in all of 2009. For different Hilltoppers have caught WKU's six touchdowns, including two each from Marcus Vasquez and Jack Doyle. Dexter Haynes caught his first career touchdown at FIU — a 53-yard pass. It was WKU's longest touchdown reception since David Wolke hooked up with Jake Gaebler on a 62-yard scoring pass against North Texas on Nov. 1, 2008.

Defense Getting Off The Field — After struggling on third down through the first three games, the Hilltopper defense has done a much better job getting on the field in the last two contests. Opponents converted 67.6 percent of their third-down opportunities (23 of 34). However, both South Florida and Florida International combined to go just 6-for-19 on third-down chances.

D In Control In Second Half — After surrendering 243 yards and 21 points to Florida International in the first half of last Saturday's game, the WKU defense turned things around after half-time. That also included just one scoring drive that spanned 33 yards after a WKU turnover.

Rainey Passes 600 Yards — Thanks to his 94 rushing yards on 28 carries at FIU, junior running back Bobby Rainey went over 600 rushing yards for the season, entering this week's contest with 602 yards on the ground through five games — an average of 120.4 yards per game. That ranks 10th nationally and best in the Sun Belt Conference. He also enters this week's game with an even 1,800 career rushing yards.

So Close — While it has not come out on top, WKU has found itself within striking distance of a win in each of its last four Sun Belt Conference games dating back to last season. In fact, the average point differential in each of those four contests is just five points. Prior to last Saturday's seven-point loss at FIU, the Toppers closed the 2009 league schedule with a three-point setback at ULM, a six-point loss at Florida Atlantic and a four-point home loss at Arkansas State.

Controlling The Clock — The Hilltoppers have won the time-of-possession battle in three of their five games so far this season, including holding the ball for a season-high 34:37 last week at FIU. WKU had the ball for 30 minutes or more just five times in the entire 2009 season. On the year, the Toppers are averaging 31:04 of offense per game.

WKU Football News and Notes

WKU To Play 900th Game Saturday — When the Hilltoppers take the field at home against Louisiana-Monroe on Saturday, it will mark the 900th game in the history of WKU football. Entering the game, the Toppers hold a 511-354-31 all-time record (scores are not available for three games played during the 1916 campaign). Those 900 games have come against 132 different opponents dating back to the first game in 1913.

Streak reached 100 — Despite the Hilltoppers' recent struggles, an impressive streak has remained intact for the ninth season in 2010. WKU has not been held scoreless in a game since a 14-0 home loss to Western Illinois on Sept. 14, 2002. The streak reached 100 games last Saturday when Kawaun Jakes and Jack Doyle hooked up on a six-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. That is also the longest streak without being shut out of any team in the Sun Belt Conference. The previous record for consecutive games scoring was 88, set between the 1965 and 1973 seasons. After being blanked by the Leathernecks, the Hilltoppers dropped just one more game in that '02 campaign as they went on to capture the I-AA National Championship.

Road Warriors — The Hilltoppers join Florida Atlantic, Navy and Northern Illinois as the only four teams of the 120 member Football Bowl Subdivision to open the 2010 season by playing four of their first five games on the road. The reverse of that trend begins this week, however, as WKU plays three of the next four at home.

Thrown In The Fire — A total of 69 players have seen action for the Hilltoppers in at least one game so far in 2010. Of those, 24 are either true or redshirt freshmen. With 12 true freshman seeing action for WKU, it means only seven teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have played more first-year freshman through the first six weeks of the season.

Michael Named 49ers QB Coach — Former quarterback Jason Michael — who helped guide WKU to the 2002 I-AA National Champions was named quarterback coach for the San Francisco 49ers on Sept. 27. He is in his second season on the 49ers staff. Michael previously served as the tight ends coach at the University of Tennessee during the 2008 season, after spending the previous two years as a member of the New York Jets coaching staff. During his first year with the Jets in 2006, Michael served as the team's quality control coach. The following season, he was assigned to tight ends coach for the team. Prior to joining the Jets, Michael served as an offensive quality control coach and video assistant for the Oakland Raiders in 2005.

Near-Record Home Crowd Sees Opener — A total of 20,772 fans were in attendance at Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium on Sept. 18 for the home opener against Indiana. That ranked as the second-largest crowd in stadium history. The record was set against Murray State on Sept. 20, 2008 when 22,297 fans saw the first game in the renovated stadium. WKU has now recorded a home crowd of over 20,000 in three straight seasons — 20,568 fans saw last year's home game with South Florida.

Returning the Favor — WKU's four nonconference games in 2010 all came against teams from BCS automatic qualifier conferences. However, just one of those games — the season opener at Nebraska — is a "guarantee game". Each of the other three are part of home-and-home series. The game at Kentucky on Sept. 11 is the beginning of a new four-year deal, with WKU's home game being played at L.P. Field in Nashville in 2011 and 2013. The home opener against Indiana is a return game as the Toppers opened the 2008 campaign in Bloomington, and WKU will travel to Tampa, Fla. to take on South Florida on Sept. 25 after the Bulls visited Bowling Green last season.

Phil Steele Honors Seven Toppers — Seven different Hilltoppers were named to Phil Steele's preseason all-Sun Belt team released earlier in the summer. Offensively, junior Bobby Rainey was a second-team selection as both a running back and kickoff returner, while sophomore tight end Jack Doyle and junior offensive lineman Wes Jeffries earned third-team honors. Senior linebacker Thomas Majors was the only Topper to earn first-team honors, while fellow linebacker Chris Bullard and defensive lineman Kenny Martin were fourth-team picks. Junior kicker Casey Tinius was also selected as a third-team placekicker.

Rainey Named to Paul Hornung Watch List — Junior running back Bobby Rainey was one of 48 players named to the watch list for the inaugural Paul Hornung Award, which will be given annually to the most versatile player in major college football. Rainey set a school record in 2009 with 1,050 kickoff return yards to go along with 939 yards rushing. He also averaged a leaguebest 175.1 all-purpose yards per game - the eighth best average in the nation. Rainey will get a chance to take the field against seven other members of the watch list this season - Niles Paul (Nebraska), Randall Cobb and Derrick Locke (Kentucky), Tandon Doss (Indiana), T.Y. Hilton (Florida International), Dwight Dasher (Middle Tennessee) and Jerrel Jernigan (Troy).

Kentucky Mr. Football Joins Toppers — The 2009 Mr. Football from Kentucky has joined the WKU roster. Fort Campbell's Antonio Andrews joins the Hilltoppers as a running back after helping lead Fort Campbell High to a 2A state championship last season as a quarterback. Andrews originally signed to play at Air Force. A threat in the running game, Andrews rushed for 1,597 yards and 29 touchdowns last season as a senior. He becomes the first Mr. Football from Kentucky to play at WKU.

Big Crowds Nothing New — The announced crowd of 85,555 at Nebraska's Memorial Stadium on Sept. 4 was the fifth-largest crowd ever to see a WKU team play. Since 2003, WKU has played in front of six crowds exceeding 80,000 — all coming at SEC schools. In fact, three of the top 10 crowds to see a Topper team came in 2008 — at Alabama (2nd - 92,138), at Kentucky (7th - 70,730) and at Virginia Tech (8th - 66,233). The 98,761 fans that saw the 2009 season opener at Tennessee is the largest crowd a Hilltopper team has ever played in front of.

A Strong Tradition On And Off The Field — While this is WKU's second year as a full Football Bowl Subdivision member, the football program has 91 seasons of success. WKU's 511-349-31 all-time record equates to a .591 winning percentage, ranking 26th among all 120 Division I FBS schools and making the Hilltoppers the winningest program in the Sun Belt Conference. WKU's 948 APR in football is also higher than all other Sun Belt Conference programs.

Championship Effort — WKU's only team National Championship was in football (2002 I-AA). WKU also has 12 conference championships, 10 playoff appearances, and has had 64 players earn All-American honors in its 91-season history.

WKU Remains On the Rise — The enrollment at Western Kentucky University has increased for the 13th consecutive year, and WKU has set a new record with a projected enrollment of 20,855 students for the fall, 2010 semester. WKU has shown an increase in enrollment every year since 1998, when there were 14,882 students registered for the fall semester.

The Hilltoppers In OT — Since the 1996 season, the Hilltoppers have played an overtime contest six times, compiling a 5-1 mark in those games. The first two overtime games in the program's history both came against Murray State in 1996 and 1997. Each went multiple overtimes, with WKU winning 44-41 in two extra frames in '96, then following it up a year later with a 52-50 win in three OTs. The last time a Topper team played an overtime contest was also the only loss— a 23-20 setback to Northern Iowa on Nov. 5, 2005.

2010 Strength of Schedule

Entering the week, the Hilltoppers hold the 38th toughest strength of schedule in the nation, and the toughest in the Sun Belt Conference. Ratings are based on the Jeff Sagarin ratings from *USA Today* on Sunday, Oct. 10.

What Is WKU Football?

ACADEMIC SUPERIORITY

WKU's Academic Progress Report Rate of 948 is the highest of the Sun Belt's nine football members, and WKU is one of only five Sun Belt Conference schools to exceed the NCAA required 925 APR in every men's and women's sport (19 total).

WKU had a league-high 34 players honored by the Sun Belt Conference for posting a 3.0 or higher grade point average in 2009-10, including 12 with a GPA of 3.5 or higher.

A total of 24 WKU football players graduated with degrees in 14 separate majors in 2009-10.

RICH TRADITION

The 2010 season marks WKU's 92nd season of football.

WKU's I-AA National Championship in 2002 is the university's only national title in a team sport. WKU has 12 conference championships, 10 playoff appearances and 511 all-time wins. WKU's .591 all-time winning percentage is the highest among all Sun Belt Conference football members.

FIRST CLASS FACILITIES

Almost \$50 million has been spent in the renovation and expansion of Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium including new locker rooms, meeting rooms, weight rooms and training rooms.

Seating capacity has expanded to nearly 25,000, and the stadium also features club seats, a \$1.5 million video replay scoreboard and a state-of-the-art playing surface.

WKU's Carol and Denny Wedge Student-Athlete Success Center opened in January of 2009. The 10,000 square foot complex features numerous computer labs along with break out rooms for WKU student-athletes to study, work on school projects, and receive tutorial assistance and academic advising.

DEVELOPING PROGRAM

WKU still has a young and developing program: the 2011 season will mark the first time the Hilltoppers will take the field with every player on the roster being signed after the decision was made to go to Division I-A (Board of Regents approved move to I-A on Nov. 2, 2006).

WKU's 2010 recruiting class was rated as the Sun Belt Conference's best by *Rivals.com*.

WKU's 103 current players on the roster come from 10 states — the most players come from Kentucky (33), followed by Florida (23), Georgia (20) and Tennessee (14).

The class breakdown is as follows: seniors (12), juniors (18), sophomores (27), redshirt freshman (19) and true freshman (27), meaning 71 percent of the roster are freshman or sophomores.

The 2009 team, while going 0-12, had the lead in 8 games and had a half-time lead in 3 games.

The 2010 season opener at 8th ranked Nebraska was the second highest ranked team WKU has ever played – only 3rd ranked Florida in 2007 (lost 49-3 in season opener) was ranked higher.

STRONG LEADERSHIP

Head Coach Willie Taggart previously served as running backs coach at Stanford from 2007-09 and helped Toby Gerhart finish second in balloting for the Heisman Trophy and win the Doak Walker award given to the nation's top running back

Taggart worked as an assistant coach at WKU from 1999-2006 and served as co-offensive co-ordinator for WKU's 2002 I-AA National Championship team. A standout player at quarterback who set 11 school records for the Hilltoppers from 1995-98, Taggart is one of only four players in WKU's 91-year football history to have his jersey retired.

WKU's 10 coaches have a total of 112 years of coaching experience.

Prior to joining WKU, defensive coordinator **Clint Bowen** coached at Kansas the previous 12 years and was the Jayhawks defensive coordinator the last four years. He helped Kansas post a 3-1 bowl record during his tenure, including a 24-21 win over Virginia Tech in the 2008 Orange Bowl. Kansas finished the 2007 season with a 12-1 record and No. 7 national ranking in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today coaches polls.

Mike Sanford, WKU's passing game coordinator/quarterbacks coach, is a former collegiate quarterback who played on four bowl teams during his five-year career at Boise State. With Sanford, the Broncos compiled a 54-9 record. He was a two-year letterman at quarterback, helping the Broncos to a 13-1 record in 2003, an 11-1 mark in 2004 and the WAC championship each season. His father, Mike, a longtime veteran of the collegiate and professional coaching ranks, currently is the Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at Louisville.

Karl Maslowski, WKU's linebackers coach and special teams coordinator, was a four-year letterman for the Hilltoppers (2000-03) who started the final nine games for the 2002 I-AA National Championship team and ranked third on the team in both total tackles (95) and solo tackles (60). He was named team MVP as a senior in 2003.

Eric Mathies helped WKU earn the conference's top rated recruiting class by Rivals.com this past February in his first season as the Hilltoppers recruiting coordinator. He also coaches WKU's defensive tackles.

Wide receivers coach **Terry Obee** spent eight years in the National Football League as a wide receiver with the Seattle Seahawks (1990-91), Minnesota Vikings (1991-93) and Chicago Bears (1993-97); defensive backs coach **Clayton White** played professionally with the New York Giants (2001-02) and Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2003), and defensive ends coach **Raymond Woodie** played for the Canadian Football League's British Columbia Lions in 1996.

Prior to joining the WKU staff, Woodie served as the head football coach at two Tampa area high schools from 1996-2009 and helped develop 43 student-athletes who signed full athletic scholarships

Offensive tackles/tight ends coach **A.J. Pratt** was named the Mid-American Conference's 2009 recruiter of the year by *Rivals.com* while serving as Kent State's recruiting coordinator.

Offensive centers/guards coach **Walt Wells** has the longest tenure of any WKU coach, having served in a variety of capacities on the Hilltopper staff since 2003.

AUGUST 22, 2010 — WKU freshman students arrive on campus, and the entire football team and coaching staff helped them move into their new homes – everyone pitched in and assisted with the entire process of unloading cars and vans and loading up various dormitories.

WILLIE TAGGART — Played under Jack Harbaugh, was recruited to WKU by Jack's son, Jim, then a quarterback with the Indianapolis Colts, who was certified by the NCAA as a volunteer coach making him eligible to assist in recruiting efforts — when Jim later was named head coach at Stanford, he hired Taggart as his running backs coach.

AVERY HIBBITT – Started career at WKU in defensive backfield but moved to running back prior to 2010 season – currently holds career rushing record at Bowling Green High School (3,652 yards).

CASEY TINIUS – Father, Joe, is Superintendant of Bowling Green City Schools, ran cross country and track at WKU and was a member of the school's 1974 cross country team that was second in the nation ... mother, Katy, played tennis at WKU and is a member of the WKU Athletic Hall of Fame ... older brother Chris played soccer at WKU and is currently a women's soccer assistant coach at WKU ... sister, Kelly, was a member of the school's inaugural women's soccer team ... uncle, Jim, lettered in football for the Hilltoppers in 1976 and later was on the WKU coaching staff.

CHRIS BULLARD — Was drafted by the Los Angels Angels in the 45th round of the 2007 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft out of Harris County High School, but elected to attend WKU to play football. Bullard suited up for the Hilltopper baseball team this past spring, seeing action in 19 games, mostly in a reserve role. Bullard was WKU's representative in the home run derby prior to the 2010 Sun Belt Tournament in Murfreesboro, Tenn.

Head Coach Willie Taggart



Willie Taggart was named football head coach at Western Kentucky University on November 23. Taggart spent the last three seasons as running backs coach at Stanford. He previously spent

eight seasons as an assistant coach at WKU from 1999-2006 and served as co-offensive co-ordinator for WKU's 2002 I-AA National Championship team. A standout player at quarterback who set 11 school records for the Hilltoppers from 1995-98, Taggart is one of only four players in WKU's 91-year football history to have his jersey retired. He becomes WKU's 17th head football coach, but only the seventh since 1948.

Taggart, who joined the Stanford coaching staff following a 1-11 season in 2006, was instrumental in the development of the Cardinal offense and running game. Stanford, ranked as high as 14th in the nation by the Associated Press in 2009, posted an 8-4 overall record with wins over nationally ranked Southern Cal and Oregon. Stanford led the Pac 10 in total offense (441.4 ypg.) while ranking second in the conference and 11th in the nation in rushing offense (224.3 ypg.). Stanford's 2,692 rushing yards in 2009 broke the school's single-season rushing yardage mark that has stood since 1949 (2,481). The Cardinal were led by senior running back Toby Gerhart, who under Taggart's tutelage ranked second in the nation in rushing (144.7 ypg.). One of 10 semifinalists for the Doak Walker Award, Gerhart carried a cumulative 3.25 grade point average as a management, science and technology major. He also rushed for a Stanford single-season record 1,736 yards and 26 touchdowns in 12 games in 2009, breaking his own single-season rushing record of 1,136 yards set in 2008, and was one of only five players invited to New York City for the 2009 Heisman Trophy Award presentation. The Cardinal's Sun Bowl appearance in 2009 was the school's first since 2001.

Taggart was at the helm of the Cardinal running game that finished second in the Pac-10 Conference in rushing offense in 2008, averaging 199.6 yards a game on the ground. Stanford's season rushing total of 2,395 yards was the third-highest mark in school history. In addition, Taggart's work with Gerhart helped the junior rush for a then single-season school record of 1,136 yards, as Gerhart became just the fifth running back in school history to go over the 1,000-yard mark. Gerhart had one career start prior to the 2008 season. A tireless recruiter, Taggart was responsible for recruiting Florida, Georgia and Kentucky for the Cardinal along with Riverside County. California.

Prior to his arrival at Stanford, Taggart spent the previous eight seasons on the WKU coaching staff (1999-2006) and helped guide the Hill-toppers to eight consecutive winning campaigns during the stretch. He worked with current Stanford head coach Jim Harbaugh in his first three

seasons of coaching from 1999-2001. Taggart started his coaching career as WKU's wide receivers coach in 1999 before working with the quarterbacks from 2000-06. He was also the cooffensive coordinator in 2001 and 2002, helping lead the Hilltoppers to the Division I-AA national championship in 2002, and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2003.

Under Taggart's guidance from 2003-06, quarterback Justin Haddix set school career records with 8,890 yards of total offense, a 57.1 completion percentage, 50 touchdowns and a 137.28 pass efficiency rating. Haddix also finished his career ranked second all-time on the Hill with 541 completions and 7,929 yards passing.

Taggart helped coach an offensive unit that set school records for points (432), total yards (5,479) and first downs (263) en route to the 2002 NCAA Division I-AA national championship. The Hilltoppers ranked second in the nation in pass efficiency and sixth in rushing, and averaged 38.8 points per contest in four playoff victories.

In Taggart's first year calling plays in 2000, WKU ran for 293.4 yards per contest, leading the Gateway Football Conference and ranking second in the country in the category as WKU claimed the league title and advanced to the quarterfinals of the I-AA playoffs. In his first season in 1999, WKU ranked eighth in the nation and first in the conference in rushing.

Taggart's efforts helped WKU quarterbacks earn all-conference mention in three consecutive seasons - Jason Johnson (2000), Donte Pimpleton (2001) and Jason Michael (2002).

Taggart also spent his collegiate playing days at WKU (1995-98) and was only the third WKU athlete in the past half-century to hold down the quarterback slot for the Hilltoppers for four straight years. Taggart - who set 11 WKU school records - had his jersey retired on October 23, 1999. He currently is WKU's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns (47), ranks second in scoring (286 points), pass efficiency rating (127.71) and rushing yards (3,997), is tied for third in most 100-yard rushing games (17), and is tied for fourth in touchdown passes (30). His rushing yards were the most in NCAA Division I history at the time for a quarterback.

In each of his last two collegiate seasons, he was a finalist for the prestigious Walter Payton Award which is an honor given annually to the top offensive player in I-AA football. Taggart finished fourth in the balloting in 1997 and seventh as a senior the following year. An All-American as a senior, he was also the 1998 I-AA Independents' Offensive Player of the Year. Taggart was recruited to WKU by Jim Harbaugh to play for his father, Jack.

Taggart graduated from WKU with a bachelor's degree in social sciences in 1998.

As a prep standout at Manatee (Fla.) High School, he was a first team all-state and all-conference selection as a senior after guiding the Hurricanes to the state 5A Championship game. He led MHS to the state title his junior season and helped the school post a 26-4 record during that two-year span while recording more than 3,000 yards passing and 975 yards on the ground.

Taggart and his wife Taneshia have two children, Willie Jr. and Jackson.

Lincoln, Neb. — Taylor Martinez ran for 127 yards and three touchdowns and passed for 136 yards in a sensational debut that led No. 8 Nebraska to a 49-10 win over WKU on Saturday night.

The redshirt freshman's performance fea-

tured elusive and tough running along with sudden bursts of speed, the likes of which Nebraska hasn't seen for a while from its quarterbacks. He also showed he could pass a little.

Martinez led Nebraska to touchdowns on his first two series and on four of his eight. Green led the Huskers to touchdowns on his two series. Lee, who entered in the middle of the fourth quarter, handed off twice on a short touchdown drive and then ran out the last four minutes.

Martinez overshadowed a Nebraska defense that Pelini called an "embarrassment" against a WKU.

WKU's Bobby Rainey rushed 30 times for a career-high 155 yards and a TD against a unit that was ninth nationally against the run last season.

The Hilltoppers, who crossed midfield once in the first half — and then only because of a Nebraska penalty — dented the Huskers' defense in the second half, when they generated 219 of their 299 yards.

Casey Tinius kicked a 25-yard field goal and Rainey had a 5-yard touchdown run for WKU. Rainey almost had another touchdown, but DeJones Gomes stripped the ball just as he was about to cross the goal line to finish a 47-yard run. Eric Hagg recovered in the end zone for a touchback.

"That hurt from a momentum standpoint," said first-year WKU coach Willie Taggart. "You make a play like that and you get your guys fired up, then you fumble and just that quick 'Uncle Mo' jumps back on Nebraska's side."

Lexington, Ky. — Randell Cobb caught a score, threw for another and returned a punt 50 yards to the end zone as the Kentucky (2-0) defeatede WKU 63-28 to post its 17th straight regular season nonconference win.

Quarterback Mike Hartline completed 16 of 20 passes for 213 yards and tied a career-high

with three touchdowns. Derrick Locke ran for 102 yards and a score as Kentucky overpowered the Hilltoppers when it mattered.

Bobby Rainey ran for 184 yards and two touchdowns for Western Kentucky but couldn't stop the Hilltoppers from dropping to 0-2 to start the season.

Though WKU played much better than it did in a 41-3 loss at Commonwealth Stadium two years ago, the program, which is in its second season as a full-fledged member of the BCS, couldn't match Kentucky's depth.

Yet the Wildcats were hardly perfect. Rainey became the first WKU back in 11 years to top 150 yards in consecutive weeks. He put up 155 yards in a loss to Nebraska in the season-opener and was even better against Kentucky.


He darted down the sideline on the game's third play for a 59-yard score and never really stopped. He later added a 1-yard plunge as the Hilltoppers continued to fight despite a nightmarish stretch in the first half when they allowed the Wildcats to reel off 35 straight points.

Kentucky allowed WKU to put together a pair of 80-yard scoring drives in the second half

WKUmanaged only 197 total yards the rest of the game.


