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STORY LINES

- Baylor plays its final non-conference game of the season by hosting ULM on Saturday at 3 p.m. on FS1.
- Baylor currently owns a 6-game winning streak and has not lost since Nov. 10, 2012, at Oklahoma.
- Baylor has won 10 straight non-conference games, the last loss was in the 2010 Texas Bowl vs. Illinois. The Bears are 15-3 vs. non-Big 12 opponents over the last 5 seasons (13-2 excluding bowl games).
- Baylor leads the country in total offense, averaging 736.5 yards per game. In two games this season, BU has notched the 4th-most vs. Wofford (692) and the most yards in program history vs. Buffalo (781).
- Baylor is second in the country in total defense, surrendering only 8.0 points per game. BU has not allowed a point after halftime this season.
- Baylor is playing its 64th and final season at historic Floyd Casey Stadium. BU moves to the \$260 million riverfront Baylor Stadium in 2014.
- Baylor moved up to No. 20 in the AP Top 25 and No. 19 in the USA Today Coaches poll, after its off week. The Bears have now been ranked in 4 straight seasons for the 1st time since being ranked in 5 straight years in 1953-57.
- Baylor has posted at least 400 yards offense in 29 straight games and is averaging 590.9 per game since 2011. Both marks lead the nation.
- Baylor's offense has topped 600 yards in 4 of the last 5 games (5-0 in that span).
- **Phil Bennett's** defense has forced 2 or more turnovers in 8 of its last 9 games (Baylor's record is 7-2 in that span). BU is 17-2 when forcing 2+ turnovers during **Bennett's** 2+ seasons.
- Baylor's defense has tallied 14 sacks over its last 3 games (2 vs. Buffalo, 6 against Wofford and 6 in Holiday Bowl win over UCLA). BU is 18-4 over the past 3+ years when having 2 or more sacks in a game.
- Baylor has won 5 straight at home and has not lost at "The Case" since Oct. 13, 2012, vs. TCU.
- In home games, Baylor is 14-1 since 2011, 18-3 over the last 3+ seasons and 24-10 in the **Art Briles** era.
- Baylor leads the country in scoring offense with 69.5 points per game. The Bears have set a Floyd Casey Stadium record for points in each of the first 2 games with 69 vs. Wofford and 70 vs. Buffalo.
- Baylor has scored 30+ points in 20 of its last 22 games and 40+ points in 16 of those contests.
- Baylor leads the country in tackles for loss with 13.0 per game.

STORYLINES CONTINUED...

- Baylor leads the country in team passing efficiency with a 253.38 rating.
- Baylor has scored in the 1st quarter in 18 of its last 19 games dating back to Nov. 19, 2011.
- Baylor has scored in all 8 quarters this season and has now scored in 32 of its last 33 quarters played.
- Baylor is 14-4 in September games under **Briles**.
- Baylor is 1-0 all-time vs. ULM and 1-0 vs. the Warhawks under **Briles**. BU is 9-0 vs. Sun Belt schools.
- Baylor is 3rd in the country in passing offense, averaging 431.5 yards per game through the air.
- Baylor has converted 14 of 23 (61%) of 3rd downs this year. That mark is 9th best in the country and leads the Big 12.
- Baylor is 3rd in the country and 1st in the Big 12 by averaging 20.55 yards per completion this season.
- Baylor's rushing offense (305 ypg.) is 8th-best in the NCAA and 1st in the Big 12.
- Baylor has outscored its opponent 94-13 in the first half of its two games this season.
- Baylor has completed 8 passes for 40 yards or longer this season, including 6 for TDs.
- Baylor's combined 139 points scored in the first 2 games are the most over any 2-game stretch in school history and more points than BU scored in the entire seasons of 1946, '47, '57, '59, '67, '69-'71, and '97.
- Baylor has now scored in 76 straight games, the 2nd longest streak in school history (89, 1979-87).
- Baylor's game will be nationally televised for the 27th time in the last 28 games and the 20th straight.

QUICK HITS

OFFENSE

- QB **Bryce Petty** leads the country with a passing efficiency rating of 249.5. He is also 12th nationally and 2nd in the Big 12 with 325.0 passing yards per game. He leads the NCAA with 20.31 yards per completion. In each of his two starts this season, Petty has thrown for at least 300 yards and two TDs.
- Baylor is 1 of only 2 schools in the country with 2 receivers in the top 20 for receiving yards per game. Senior **Tevin Reese** is 12th in the FBS and leads the Big 12 with 113.5 per contest, while junior **Antwan Goodley** is 20th and 2nd in the conference with 107.0 per game.
- **Reese** ranks 7th in receptions (158), 5th in yards (2,462) and 5th in TDs (18) in BU history. He had 5 catches for 97 yards and 1 TD in week 1 and then had 4 catches for 130 yards and a TD vs. Buffalo.
- **Reese**, a Biletnikoff watch list member, has scored 16 of his 18 career TD receptions from 40+ yards. He averages 51.9 yards per career TD reception.
- **Goodley** tied a career-high with 5 catches and had 90 receiving yards against the Terriers, while racking up 124 yards on 4 receptions with a TD against Buffalo.
- RB **Lache Seastrunk** is 13th nationally and 1st in the Big 12 with 130.5 rushing yards per game. He is also second in the NCAA and leads the Big 12 in scoring with 15.0 points per game.
- **Seastrunk** has rushed for 100+ yards in a school-record 6 straight contests & is averaging 9.17 yards per carry in that stretch (98 rushes for 899 yards). He had 111 yards and 2 TDs vs. Wofford and 17 carries for 150 yards and 3 TDs against Buffalo.
- RB **Glasco Martin** had 15 rushing TDs in 2012, the 2nd-most in BU history. He has 19 for his career, which is tied for 7th all-time at BU.
- PK **Aaron Jones** is 18-for-18 on PATs to start the year. He is BU's all-time leader in scoring with 348 points and career leader in FG made (46).
- **Jones** currently leads the nation among active players with 125 consecutive PATs converted. That is a school record with Jones not having missed a PAT since Nov. 5, 2011. He has 210 career PATs made and is only 43 from breaking the NCAA all-time record (Art Carmody, Louisville, 253).
- WR **Levi Norwood** has caught a pass in 16 consecutive games.

DEFENSE

- DE **Shawn Oakman** leads the country with 2.8 TFLs per game.
- DE **Chris McAllister** sparked BU's defense early vs. Wofford returning an interception 25 yards for a TD. He also had 4 tackles and a sack in the game, after leading the Bears with 6 sacks a year ago. Against Buffalo, McAllister produced 5 tackles and 1.0 TFL. He tied for ninth on the Baylor career sacks list with 9.5.
- LB **Bryce Hager** had a 91-yard fumble return TD in the 2nd quarter vs. Buffalo, the 2nd-longest fumble return in program history. Last season, Hager led the Big 12 in tackles (9.5 per game). His father, Britt, is former Texas All-American and Philadelphia Eagle.
- NB **Sam Holl** is 10th in the country and leads the Big 12 with 1.3 sacks per game. Holl is also 9th in the NCAA with 2.0 TFLs per game. That mark is second in the Big 12.
- Over the last 2-plus seasons, CB **Joe Williams** has 26 PBUs; the rest of the defense has a combined 37.
- S **Ahmad Dixon** transitioned back to his original position, after serving as a nickelback in 2012 and had 8 tackles and 1.0 TFL vs. Wofford. The Thorpe Award candidate posted five tackles and one blocked PAT against Buffalo.
- DE **Terrance Lloyd** picked up a sack vs. Buffalo and is now only .5 sacks away from cracking BU's top 10 list with 8.5.
- CB **Avian Edwards** is 20th in the country and 3rd in the Big 12 with 1.8 TFLs per game.
- DE **Jamal Palmer** filled up the stat sheet vs. Wofford with 5 tackles, 1 sack, 1.5 TFLs, 1 forced fumble and 2 fumble recoveries.

BRILES' SYSTEM IS AMERICA'S TOP OFFENSE

Baylor leads the country in total offense (736.5 ypp.), scoring offense (69.5 ppg.) and passing efficiency (253.38). The Bears are the only team in the country to be ranked in the top 10 for both passing (3rd, 431.5) and rushing offense (8th, 305.0). Baylor's offensive machine has ranked among the nation's top two offenses in each of the past three seasons, the only school to achieve the feat...

BAYLOR SCORING AT LIGHTNING PACE

The Bears have scored 16 of their 17 offensive TDs this season in under two minutes, including seven in under one minute. BU is averaging five plays per TD drive in 2013 with an average length of 64 yards and an average time of 1:11. Baylor's lone touchdown drive over two minutes was seven seconds over at 2:07.

THE NATION'S MOST BALANCED OFFENSE

Despite scoring quick touchdowns in its first two games, Baylor has continued to establish its run game in order to set up the pass play. The Bears have 99 rushes on the season and only 53 passes. Baylor is the nation's only team to rank among the Top 25 in both rushing and passing in each of the last four years.

400 YARDS - COMMONPLACE FOR BAYLOR OFFENSE

Baylor has racked up over 400 yards of offense in 29 straight games. That is currently the nation's longest active streak and 14 more than the next closest school (Texas A&M, 15). The last time BU failed to reach the 400-yard plateau was Nov. 20, 2010 vs. Oklahoma (361). Under Briles, Baylor has had more than 400 yards of offense in 45 of 65 games. Since the start of the 2011 season, the Bears have had 28 games with over 400 yards of total offense, which is tied with Oklahoma State for the most in the country in that time period.

BAYLOR'S DISRUPTING D

Baylor's defense ranks first nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 13.0 per game, while individually Shawn Oakman leads the country with 2.8 TFLs per game. The Bears have totaled 26 stops behind the line of scrimmage for 66 yards in total losses – including eight sacks for -32 yards, which ranks third nationally and tops in the Big 12 Conference. Sam Holl leads the squad with 2.5 sacks through two games.

OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSE

Baylor's defense under coordinator Phil Bennett has demonstrated a knack for making big plays at key moments to contribute to the Bears winning ways over the past three seasons. In two-plus years under defensive coordinator Phil Bennett, Baylor's D has recorded at least one takeaway in 18 of 23 games – a total of 44 takeaways (24 interceptions, 20 fumbles recovered). Thirty-three of those 44 takeaways have come over the last 15 games, an average 2.2 per game (Baylor is 12-2 during that stretch). Overall under Bennett, Baylor is 17-2 when recording two or more takeaways.

BAYLOR'S RETURN TO PROMINENCE UNDER BRILES

It's no secret that Art Briles has completely rebuilt Baylor's football program back to its former winning ways, but most impressive is how speedy and pronounced the transformation has been. Briles is tied for fifth on the BU career wins list and four victories away from moving into the fourth spot. The chart below shows the marked change in Baylor's football success in five-plus years under Briles compared to the previous 12 seasons since the start of the Big 12.

BUFFALO GAME BULLETS

Baylor dominated Buffalo 70-13 to move to 2-0 on the season on Sept. 7. For a second-straight game, BU posted record-breaking numbers.

- BU scored 60+ points for the 13th time in program history (5th time in Briles era) and 70+ points for the 4th time (first since 1929 vs. Stephen F. Austin).
- Baylor's 70 points broke the school record (set in the season opener at 69) for most in the modern era (4th-most all-time, most since 1929).
- Baylor's 781 yards of total offense were the most in program history.
- Baylor topped 600 yards of total offense for the 22nd time in program history (17 times in Briles era) and 700+ yards for the 3rd time (all in Briles era).
- Baylor's 452 passing yards were the 3rd-most in program history.
- Baylor had 300+ rushing yards (329) and 300+ passing yards (452) in the same game for the 3rd time in program history.
- Baylor's 10 touchdown drives under two minutes tied for the most in an FBS game in the last 10 seasons (2012, Oklahoma State), according to ESPN Stats & Info.
- Baylor had 301 total yards and 28 points in the 1st quarter.
- Baylor's 28 points in both the 1st and 2nd quarters marked the 3rd and 4th times in the first six quarters this season that the Bears scored 28+ points -- the Bears scored 28+ points in a quarter just seven times in program history entering the season.
- Baylor's 28 1st-quarter points and 28 2nd-quarter points tied the 3rd-most in any quarter in program history (10th and 11th times scoring 28+ in a quarter in program history).
- BU's 28 1st-quarter points and 28 2nd-quarter points tied the most in any quarter in Floyd Casey Stadium history (7th and 8th times overall, 3rd and 4th times this year).
- Baylor became the nation's first team to score 28+ in the 1st quarter of consecutive games since Oklahoma in 2008, according to Stats, Inc.
- Baylor's 56 points in the 1st half were the most by Baylor in a half in the modern era (passing 43 vs. Washington in 2011 Alamo Bowl) and the most in a half in Floyd Casey Stadium's 64-year history (previous record was 41 vs. Northwestern State in 2009).

STARTING OFFENSE NEARLY UNSTOPPABLE

Quarterback Bryce Petty and Baylor's starting offense have only played three total series after halftime through the first two games (played two drives vs. Wofford and one vs. Buffalo). In total, the starting offense has had 17 drives that have resulted in 14 touchdowns, 1 field goal and 2 fumbles (one End Of Half and 2 defensive TDs not included). The average offensive scoring drive has been 1:16.

- Baylor is averaging 11.91 yards per play in that scenario, totaling 536 yards on 45 plays. The Bears scored 63 total points with a time of possession of 5:01.
- Bryce Petty is 15 of 18 (83.3 percent) for 359 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions in that scenario. He's averaging an eye-popping 19.9 yards per attempt.
- The Bears score once every five plays (20 percent of the time) and gain a first down 48.8 percent of the time, essentially every other play in that scenario.
- BU has converted 5 of 6 third-down conversion attempts in that scenario.
- The Bears have scored five touchdowns in five red-zone attempts, undoubtedly helped by Lache Seastrunk's 14 red-zone carries for 114 yards (8.14 yards per carry) and two touchdowns.

BEARS ALMOST PERFECT IN RED ZONE

During its past three games, Baylor has been to the red zone 15 times and has scored on 14 of those occasions. This season, BU is 10 for 11 inside the 20-yard with nine touchdowns and one field goal.

PETTY EFFICIENT IN FIRST TWO STARTS

In his first two starts, **Bryce Petty** (Midlothian, Texas) has made the transition to starter very effectively. Against Wofford, he threw for 312 yards and two touchdowns on 19 of 24 passing. He then completed 13 of 16 passes for 338 yards and two TDs against Buffalo. For that performance, Petty earned a rating of 99.7 out of a 100 in ESPN's Total QBR system. That is the highest single-game performance for any QB this season. Petty also owns the season lead in the ratings system at 98.3. Petty served as the backup to Robert Griffin III and Nick Florence the past two seasons. The junior had thrown just 14 passes in 11 career games played entering 2013, but has been through three seasons and four spring drills at Baylor since signing in 2009 and enrolling in January 2010. BU was one of just seven FBS programs that entered 2013 with no QB on its roster who has started a game. Petty was tabbed as a preseason All-Big 12 first-team performer by *Phil Steele*.

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK

Baylor upped its win streak to six with the historic victory over Buffalo. The Bears won the final three regular-season games in 2012 as well as a decisive 49-26 victory over No. 17 UCLA in the Holiday Bowl. Three of the six wins in the streak have come over Top 25 teams (No. 1 Kansas State, No. 24 Oklahoma State and No. 17 UCLA). Baylor last ran off six straight wins in 2011-12 when it combined for nine in a row. The streak is tied for the 3rd-longest nationally.

SUCCESS AT HOME IN 'THE CASE'

Baylor has compiled an 18-3 record at home in Floyd Casey Stadium over the past three seasons (including having won 14 of its last 15 games the last two years). The 2013 season is Baylor's 64th and final playing at The Case; in 2014 the Bears will move into the brand new Baylor Stadium on the banks of the Brazos River. Baylor plays seven home games during Floyd Casey's curtain-call season in 2013.

SPEAKING OF RANKINGS

Baylor has made a steady rise in the AP Top 25 and the *USA Today* Coaches Poll, after only receiving votes in both polls to open the season. This week, Baylor sits at No. 20 in the AP and No. 19 in the coaches poll. BU broke into the AP poll at No. 23 after its week one win vs. Wofford and then moved up to No. 22 following the win over Buffalo. The Bears debuted at No. 22 in the coaches poll, after the win over Buffalo. Baylor has now been ranked in both polls at least once in four consecutive seasons for the first time since being ranked in five straight years in 1953-57. Prior to be ranked in 2010, BU had gone 16 years without making it into the polls. Several media outlets did include the Bears among their preseason top 25 rankings, including *Sports Illustrated* (17th), *Sporting News* (17th), *CBSSports* (19th), *Lindy's* (19th) and *ESPN the Magazine* (25th).

BAYLOR RISING

Baylor has won 27 games over the course of the last three-plus seasons, marking just the 10th time in program history it has won at least that many games over any four-year span. BU is chasing the best four-year periods in school history when the Bears won 30 games in both 1983-86 and 1985-88.

BAYLOR SPORTING NEW NIKE UNIFORMS

New to the Bears' 2013 wardrobe will be a black matte helmet, a chrome gold helmet and black and gold cleats, along with redesigned jerseys and pants that incorporate Baylor-specific graphics. In total, BU will now have five helmet choices (black matte, chrome gold, gold, green and white), three jersey colors (black, green and white) and four pant options (black, gold, green and white) for a total of 60 different uniform combinations. Specifically new to the Baylor jerseys are updated Bear claw markings on the shoulder pads and on the front of the neckline, while the piping on each set of pants has been modernized. The phrase "SIC'EM" has been added to the back neckline of each jersey. Both the numerals and lettering for the jerseys have been given a crisp, updated typeface.

BAYLOR QBS EXCEL ACADEMICALLY

Each of the last three seasons Baylor has been led by quarterbacks with degrees in hand, Robert Griffin III in 2011, Nick Florence in 2012 and **Bryce Petty** in 2013, all played having previously earned their undergraduate degrees from Baylor. Petty continues another impressive distinction, as BU boasts three straight QBs who have all achieved first-team Academic All-Big 12 honors. Petty, a 2012 first-teamer in the classroom, joined predecessors Florence (2009 and 2012 first-teamer) and Griffin (2010 and 2011 first-teamer). Florence (first team) and Griffin (second team) also earned Academic All-America honors.

ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 2013

Baylor is the in the midst of playing seven games at Floyd Casey Stadium in 2013. That ties the school record for most home games in a single season set in 2011. The Bears will once again face a daunting schedule, one that features nine games vs. 2012 bowl teams: Iowa St. (Liberty), Kansas St. (Fiesta), Oklahoma (Cotton), Oklahoma St. (H.O.D.), TCU (BWW), Texas (Alamo), Texas Tech (Texas), West Virginia (Pinstripe) and ULM (Independence). The Bears home schedule includes hosting Texas, Oklahoma, West Virginia and Iowa St. (Homecoming), as well as ULM, Buffalo and Wofford in non-conference. Additionally, Baylor hosts Texas Tech in the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Shootout at Cowboys Stadium.

PREP ALL-AMERICANS DOT BAYLOR'S ROSTER

Baylor's 2013 roster boasts five players who are former high school All-Americans. Senior NB **Prince Kent** was a 2009 Under Armour All-American and rated the nation's No. 52 overall recruit on the 2008 ESPNU Top 150. Senior S **Ahmad Dixon** was a 2010 Under Armour and U.S. Army All-American and rated the nation's No. 15 overall recruit in the 2009 ESPN Top 150. Junior RB **Lache Seastrunk** was a 2010 U.S. Army All-American and *USA Today* All-USA honoree and rated the nation's No. 2 overall recruit by *MaxPreps.com* and the No. 4 overall recruit by *Sporting News*. Sophomore DT **Javonte Magee** was a 2011 *SuperPrep* All-American and U.S. Army All-American and rated the nation's No. 18 overall recruit by *247Sports.com* (No. 65 by *Rivals.com* and No. 69 by *Athlon*). True freshman LB **Brian Nance** was a 2011 *SuperPrep* All-American and U.S. Army All-American and rated the nation's No. 84 overall recruit by *247Sports.com*.

BAYLOR ADDS WESTERN TRANSFERS RETURNING TO HOME STATE

Baylor's roster includes a trio of transfers from Pac-12 schools, all three native Texans who returned to their home state after one season out of state. Senior starting tight end **Jordan Najvar**, from Spring, Texas, spent the 2009 season as a redshirt at Stanford before transferring to Baylor prior to the 2010 season. Junior running back **Lache Seastrunk**, a prep All-American from nearby Temple, Texas, spent the 2010 season as a redshirt at Oregon before transferring to BU prior to the 2011 season. A third transfer, cornerback and returner **Demetri Goodson** (also a native Texan from Spring, Texas), transferred from a Western university, Gonzaga, after playing three seasons of basketball for the nationally ranked Bulldogs.

POSITION CHANGES

A few Baylor players made position changes of note during the spring and fall, most notably a swap between third-year starters **Ahmad Dixon** and **Sam Holl**. Dixon, after two seasons playing the "Bear"/nickelback position, will return to safety and Holl, after starting the past two seasons at safety, will move up to the "Bear" position. Corner back Darius Jones moved back to wide receiver, after spending 2012 on the defensive side of the ball.

- Baylor's dangerously quick offense scored nine touchdowns on one-play scoring drives and totaled 16 TD drives of three plays or fewer. The BU offense's average scoring drive was 2:01 on the season and it totaled 20 drives resulting in TDs of one minute or less and 42 TD drives of two minutes or less.

All games are broadcast by the "Voice of the Bears" John Morris and former Baylor standouts J.J. Joe (analyst) and Ricky Thompson (sideline reporter). Morris is in his 27th year in the Baylor broadcast booth, while Thompson and Joe are in their 14th and 10th years, respectively. The radio call from all of Baylor's games can be heard free of charge live on the Internet at BaylorBears.com. Houston-area listeners can catch the games on Newstalk 1070 AM, KNTH. Lache Seastrunk ran for 111 yards and two touchdowns, Bryce Petty threw for 290 yards and two scores in his first start and Baylor scored its most points since 1929 in a 69-3 victory over Wofford.

The Bears celebrated the opening of their final season at Floyd Casey Stadium by taking a 28-0 lead in the first quarter. Petty, a junior, needed just 10 plays and 2:05 combined on game-opening drives of 70 and 65 yards for a 14-0 lead.

Wofford, one of the best running teams in FCS, struggled in its first game without all-time rushing leader Eric Breitenstein. Playing their first game in Texas, the Terriers needed 60 carries to get 173 rushing yards, 2.9 yards per run.

The game-time temperature was 102, but the heat didn't bother the Bears, who surpassed what the school calls the modern era scoring record -- a 68-13 victory against Northwestern State in 2009, the second season under coach Art Briles.

It was the most points for Baylor since an 88-0 victory against Stephen F. Austin in 1929.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 692 yards of offense ranks third in program single-game history.
- Baylor topped 600 yards of total offense for the 21st time in program history (16 times in Briles era).
- Baylor scored 28 points in both the 1st and 3rd quarters -- the Bears had scored 28+ points in a quarter just seven times in program history entering the game.
- The attendance of 44,989 was the 2nd-largest opening day crowd in Floyd Casey Stadium history, trailing only 46,000 vs. Oklahoma in 1973.
- Baylor's 69 points were the 4th-most in program history, most in Floyd Casey Stadium history and most in the Briles era.
- Baylor's 66-point margin of victory was the 5th-highest in program history.

Bryce Petty threw for 338 yards and two touchdowns, Lache Seastrunk ran for 150 yards with three scores and Baylor's first-team offense had 576 total yards in only 11 minutes with the ball as the 23rd-ranked Bears beat Buffalo 70-13.

The starters for the Bears (2-0) had eight touchdowns in their nine drives. The only non-scoring driving was when they had the ball at the end of the first half.

Baylor finished with a school-record 781 total yards and topped the 69 points scored a week earlier in what had been the most for the Bears since 1929.

Petty completed 13 of 16 passes, and two of his incompletions were balls caught but ruled out of bounds. He also ran for a score.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 70 points broke the school record (set last week at 69) for most in the modern era (4th-most all-time, most since 1929).
- Baylor's 781 yards of total offense were the most in program history.
- Baylor's 452 passing yards were the 3rd-most in program history.
- Baylor had 300+ rushing yards (329) and 300+ passing yards (452) in the same game for the 3rd time in program history.
- Baylor became the nation's first team to score 28+ in the 1st quarter of consecutive games since Oklahoma in 2008, according to Stats, Inc.
- Baylor's 56 points in the 1st half were the most by Baylor in a half in the modern era (passing 43 vs. Washington in 2011 Alamo Bowl) and the most in a half in Floyd Casey Stadium's 64-year history (previous record was 41 vs. Northwestern State in 2009).
- LB Bryce Hager had a 91-yard fumble return TD in the 2nd quarter, the 2nd-longest fumble return in program history (Charles McClanahan, 96 vs. Missouri on 9/21/74).
